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Kenya's justice system paperless with integrated digital platform

The Kenyan justice system has gone paperless after the Judiciary and the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (ODPP) launched an integrated digital system for

Kenyan to access justice. Prosecutors can now file, track, report, and disclose cases after the launch of a nationwide e-filing system, data system dashboard, and a cause list portal. Speaking at the event, Chief Justice (CJ) Martha Koome said the initiative, a journey that

began 20 years ago, is meant to ease service delivery and enhance the transition of the justice system from the manual to digital system.

"It is a momentous occasion that marks a giant leap in commitment to transform how we deliver through strategic use of

technology in alignment with the vision of the Judiciary of Social Transformation through the Access to Justice blueprint," Koome said.

She said the Judicial vision is to enhance productivity, automate processes, digitalize services, and establish a paperless

environment, making justice more accessible and reducing the geographical barriers to accessing justice.

Koome reiterated that there should be no impediment when people must seek a remedy

CS for Information, Communications, and the Digital Economy, Eliud Owalo says the Strategic Plan will ensure key priority projects in the Bottom-up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA), are implemented as planned

The Ministry of Information, Communications, and the Digital Economy has launched its 2023-2027 Strategic Plan, a policy blueprint intended to guide the ministry in delivering its mandate.

"This Strategy will establish a national addressing system, revitalize Postal Corporation of Kenya, Kenya Broadcasting Corporation, and the Kenya News Agency, as well as roll out broadband connectivity to the ward level," Owalo said.

The Strategy will also oversee the installation of free public WiFi, digitization of government services, strengthening of data protection and cybersecurity, as well as setting targets for annual work

ICT Cabinet Secretary Eliud Owalo with Principal Secretaries: Edward Kisianga'ni (State Department for Broadcasting & Telecommunications) and Eng. John Tanui (State Department for ICT & Digital Economy) officially launched the Strategic Plan 2023-2027

adequate information to hold the Ministry accountable.

It identifies seven key result areas: policy, legal, and institutional frameworks; digital super-highway and telecommunications infrastructure; digital government services and products; universal access to information; business process outsourcing/IT enabled services and local content development; governance, finance, and human capital development; and cybersecurity, data governance, and emerging technologies.

Speaking during the docu-

ment's launch at a Nairobi hotel, the Cabinet Secretary for Information, Communications, and the Digital Economy, Eliud Owalo, emphasized that the blueprint and roadmap would guide the Ministry in implementing its activities, projects, and programs over four years.

"This Plan ensures that the Ministry's Vision of 'an informed and digitally empowered Kenyan Society' is aligned with the Government's Transformative Agenda,

Security concerns prompt indefinite closure of gold mines in Marsabit County

The booming gold mines of Hillo in Moyale Sub-County, Marsabit County, have been closed indefinitely over security concerns.

Interior Cabinet Secretary (CS), Prof Kithure Kindiki, has directed the closure of the thirteen mining sites in Dabel Location which he said has led to insecurity in the area.

Prof. Kindiki also ordered a one-week rapid assessment in the affected county, to ascertain if there are other areas with mineral deposits and which could cause a problem akin to that in Dabel.

The CS, who toured the area after issuing a gazette notice declaring the mining area as dangerous, said Kenya is a country governed by the rule of law and advised that every investment be carried out as per the Constitution.

He noted with satisfaction that the local county security teams had managed to clear the affected area, popularly known as

Hillo, of the thousands of illegal artisanal miners, the majority of whom are immigrants from neighbouring countries.

Prof Kindiki directed the County Police Commander, Nyambu Mwakio, to ensure that the affected area is not accessed by any person including public servants

and ensure it remains an operation area as stated.

“We have no room for any security breach”, he said, adding that it is mind boggling how foreigners ended-up there.

The mining sites declared security zones are Hilo Karray, Hillo Hudda, Hillo Qoranjido, Hillo Irress Shindia, Hillo Ra-

baalee and Hillo Godde Haroessa. Others include Hillo Gorgora, Hillo Orofa, Hillo Walkite, Hillo Tanzania, Hillo Iress Abamartile, Hillo Gootu and Hillo Tesum Qalicha.

The CS, however, asked the county security team headed by County Commissioner Nobert Komora to allow miners with ma-

chinery like crushing units on the ground to move them away.

Prof. Kindiki made it clear that no other government agency would be allowed into the remedying and restoration of the area, which has also been subjected to huge environmental degradation.

Mr. Komora expressed

the government’s concern that hatred inclined to tribalism had crept into the mining sites claiming six lives and injuring scores of others.

Two gold miners from two different ethnic groups from a neighbouring country disagreed over discovery of a substantial amount of gold which resulted in a fight before degenerating into a clash between the two groups.

The county commissioner pointed out that the mining activities had caused a lot of environmental degradation and people were living under poor sanitary conditions which posed a risk of outbreak of diseases like cholera. During the visit it was established that people were trading in uncustomed imported goods like alcoholic and soft drinks, sugar, powdered milk, cooking oil and rice.

He asked the mining community, which he accused of engaging in crime during the holy month of Ramadhan, to ensure they are out of the area before the expiry of the notice else they will live to regret their decision.

The informal mining activities have been robbing the government revenue and wealth as most dealers are unlicensed, he said.

since justice cuts across everyone. The CJ added that the system will help the Judiciary to be more efficient and more accessible as it will simplify case filing and tracking the records. She revealed that the Judiciary will stop the use of printing papers from desks, desktops, and laptops.

"Data tracking dashboard is a platform that monitors case processing through courts and tribunals through e-filing which will also de-

tect and analyze case adjournments from different courts thus it is a critical tool for evidence tracking," Koome explained.

In a press statement, the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (ODPP) said it had developed and operationalized a digital platform dubbed 'Uadilifu Case Management System' to enhance access to justice and streamline service delivery in the country.

The Uadilifu Case Management System is a digital platform that comprises five modules which include e-filing, document tracking, case

tracking, e-reporting, and e-disclosure.

The e-filing module, according to the statement, allows court users to file court documents such as charge sheets, miscellaneous applications, additional documents, submissions, replying affidavits, and preliminary objections among others, electronically.

ODPP says there is a need for efficiency and transparency in the daily operations within the country's criminal justice system hence the need for public entities to be innovative and customer-centric.

Kisumu county multi-billion water and sanitation upgrade to benefit thousands

Kisumu will benefit from a Sh2.9 billion sewerage and water expansion program to address long-standing challenges in water and sanitation in the area.

The initiative, funded by the French Development Agency (AFD), the European Investment Bank (EIB), the European Union (EU), and the Government of Kenya, targets the western corridor of Kisumu city, which is currently underserved.

Consequently, the water supply pipeline will be extended by 155 kilometers to the rapidly developing satellite towns of Maseno, Otonglo, Kisan, Kisan, and Kiboswa at a cost of Sh2.1 billion and is expected to

serve over 120,000 people.

The initiative will also see a new Sh800 million sewerage treatment plant constructed at Otonglo to collect and treat 8,000m3 of wastewater per day.

The Lake Victoria South Water Works Development Agency (LVSWWDA), which is implementing the initiative, has embarked on public participation and technical study ahead of the commissioning of the project.

LVSWWDA Head of Sanitation Eng. Daniel Oronje said once the project is completed, water supply in Kisumu City will improve from 66 per cent to 90 per cent, while sewerage coverage will increase to 40 per cent up from 16 per cent.

Speaking during a pub-

lic participation meeting at Korando in Kisumu West Sub-County, Oronje said the agency has commenced a technical study

for the project which is expected to be completed in June next year.

“Once we have devel-

oped the designs we shall come back to the people and explain to them what we intend to do before we proceed to the procurement stage,” he said.

The agency, he said, is working closely with the Kisumu West Leaders Forum and the community to address all the concerns and ensure the project takes off as scheduled.

Kisumu West Senior Deputy County Commissioner (DCC) Nalianya Wanyonyi asked the community to embrace the project which once completed will transform the area. Wanyonyi, who also chairs the Kisumu West Leaders Forum, said all relevant state agencies have been brought on board to ensure that the project is implemented


fully. Those who will be displaced within the project area, he added, will be fully compensated by the government.

“It has taken us three years to agree but now I am glad that we have a way forward. I want to assure you that all landowners in the project area will be compensated.

“We have brought on board the National Lands Commission (NLC) and the county government to ensure that we support this program to fruition,” he said.

Kisumu County Executive Committee Member (CECM) in charge of Water and Environment Marylene Agwa asked the community to support the project which she said was at the center of transforming Kisumu city.

A thorough environmental and social impact study, she said, would be carried out to ensure that the community benefits from the project.

CS warns land officers of prosecution for fraud and forgery of titles, leases

Interior and National Administration Cabinet Secretary Professor Kithure Kindiki has put land officers aiding land fraud and forgery of land titles and land leases in Nakuru County on notice that they will be prosecuted.

Kindiki noted that land disputes and encroachment issues will be dealt with amicably, and he regretted that land officials had compromised the integrity of documents, stating that they would be prosecuted.

“We do not want cases of people encroaching on private lands and refusing to move or accessing land through fraudulent means. Officers in the Ministry of Lands, Survey, and other public officers aiding forgery are criminals like any other criminals in the country, and we are going to be very merciless with them,” Kindiki cautioned.

Nakuru is entangled in a land tussle with the directors of Nakuru War Memorial Hospital, with the proprietors said to have fraudulently acquired a 50-year extension on its lease for the 25-acre parcel of land that the hospital sits on. The case is before the Nakuru Environment and Lands Court. Kindiki, while stressing the impending transfer of police officers for abating illicit liquor sale and consumption, noted that the war was for law enforcement agencies to

deal with, and politicians should give them space to work.

Kindiki noted that public officers who had their interests conflicting with the fight against illicit substances and liquor across the country had compromised the efforts, urging them to stop the businesses or leave public service.

“Organized criminals who are peddling drugs and selling poisons to Kenyans, we will deal with you. Our aim is not to destroy legitimate businesses, we are destroying the infrastructure that is used to manufacture, sell, and distribute and even consume narcotic drugs, illicit killer brews which are a threat to our national security,” warned Kindiki.

The CS noted that about 42,500 police officers who had overstayed in their stations will be transferred without fail, to avert compromising the law enforcement efforts.

Kenya Pipeline Company, KFS join forces to protect forests and pipelines

(NGOs), highlighting the collective effort towards a greener, more sustainable future. Sang noted that the partnership aims

“The benefits of mangroves are immense in the Jomvu Creek, attracting fish, honey harvesting, and job creation and are just but a few of what mangroves benefit the community,” Sang said.

He added that their ‘Adopt-a-Forest’ initiative has enabled them to adopt 250 hectares of forest nationwide for rehabilitation as they target to achieve the ambitious 30 per cent tree cover by 2032 as was set by the President.

Marsabit County receives Sh2.7 billion to mitigate livestock losses

BY MUTURI MWANGI (KNA)

The government has allocated Sh2.7 billion for an animal feedlot project in Marsabit County to cushion pastoral communities from the ravages of perennial drought in the Arid and Semi-Arid Areas (ASALs).

The Principal Secretary of ASALs and Regional Development, Kello Harsama, announced during the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in Marsabit that the funds are a

relief to livestock keepers who have lost more than 2.5 million herds of cattle over the past five years.

“The livestock we have been relying on have been severely affected by drought in the past five years. Drought has killed more than 2.5 million herds of cattle, and 90 percent of these fatalities have been reported in ASAL areas,” said Harsama.

He pointed out that the feedlot would be a game-changer for pastoralist



communities, as they would be economically empowered, and the loss of livestock due to drought would be a thing of the past.

“It is a way to empower pastoralists through what they go through every time, the struggles brought about by climate change. That is why the

President directed that we introduce feedlot in 31 counties to ensure that we do not hear of the death of livestock in these areas,” the PS noted.

“The issue of feedlot will further empower since the project comes with a lot of benefits including marketing and breed improvement, something that has never been done before,” revealed the PS.

Marsabit County Governor Ali Mohamud Mohamed lauded the feedlot project noting that live-

stock breeding would ensure pastoralists fetch good money in the market as opposed to now and revert the trend of livestock death during dry seasons.

“This is a great opportunity since in the last severe drought, in Marsabit, we lost over 70 percent of our livestock, the only possession we have. Those who lost their cattle are now living in poverty and changing their way of life by introducing feedlots, doing irrigation,” the county boss said.

PS calls for establishment of seed bank to address counterfeiting

The Principal Secretary for the State Department for Crop Development, Dr. Paul Kiprono Rono, has called for the establishment of a seed bank and strengthening of agricultural policies to ensure quality seed availability while simultaneously helping to eradicate counterfeit seeds in the country.

Rono spoke during his presiding over a consultative meeting with over a hundred seed growers in the country, sponsored by the Kenya Seed Company in Eldoret, Uasin Gishu. The meeting aimed to deliberate on strategies to ensure the country has sufficient quality seeds for both the long and short rainy seasons, thereby boosting production and ensuring food security.

The PS indicated that the department has recognized the need to examine the seed system in all value chains in the country. Acknowledging that agriculture is the government's top priority agenda in achieving the Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA), Dr. Rono stated that the Ministry is diligently overseeing each step to ensure that all plans and activities intended to achieve the

BETA strategies are accomplished promptly, cost-effectively, and with high quality.

"As you are aware, the government's fertilizer subsidy program is ongoing, and part of it is to ensure farmers receive the right farm inputs, including seeds, enabling them to grow essential food for this country and for export markets," he said.

He revealed that the seed growers need an additional 125,000 acres of land to produce 100 million kilos of maize seeds for next year's long and short rainy seasons.

The consultative meet-

ing with stakeholders, seed growers and the team of experts, has come-up with a solution that there is a need to look at the Policy as a government, to deliberate on the pricing model for seed farmers to give them the most competitive prices, so that they can produce quality seeds in variety and quantity. Noting that seed growers have been faced with challenges of land sub-division, the team agreed there is a need to look at the idle land in government institutions to provide additional land to produce enough seeds for next year.

The PS hinted at distributing farm inputs as one package where farmers access all inputs in one depot to save them from the cost of traveling to get them from different places. "There is a need for all of us as seed growers and the government, to have a one-stop shop for all farm inputs, possibly inwards and last mile distribution centres, so that when farmers collect fertilizers, they also get quality seeds from the same place," Dr. Rono noted.

"As we continue to open last mile centres for fertilizers, we will incorporate seed inputs also, so that farmers collect all their farm inputs as one package from one place. It will reduce the cost of production and at the same time improve efficiency of distribution of farm inputs and farmers also feel facilitated by the government," he added.

The PS put on notice people distributing fake seeds that they will face the law. He ordered them to immediately stop, noting that the government through KePHIS is going around to inspect and verify seeds from seed growers, and if faked, the culprits will be apprehended and fined not less than a million shillings, six months imprisonment, or both.

Governor calls for solidarity in preserving journalism's traditional role in democracy

Kisumu Governor Anyang' Nyong'o has called upon media institutions to fortify their structures and push for greater press freedom in the face of mounting threats to journalistic integrity and independence.

Prof Nyong'o lamented that journalists and media organizations often encounter formidable challenges in their quest to report truthfully and hold power to account.

Speaking during the launch of the Kisumu Media Hub and the Digital Content Production Centre, the Governor noted that despite many chal-

lenges, media organizations can continue to fulfill their vital role as guardians of democracy by fostering a culture of resilience and solidarity.

"Because journalism is a fundamental tool for development, we must not get discouraged by the challenges but look at them as opportunities and avenues to become more resilient and creative," the County boss stated.

Commenting on the current state of the media landscape, Prof Nyong'o stated, "It is deeply concerning, as traditional media faces unprecedented disruptions. Media houses are grappling with harsh economic realities, lead-

ing to widespread layoffs and downsizing as they struggle to adapt to rapidly changing consumer behavior."

The rise of digital news platforms, he added, has further exacerbated the situation, with traditional news reporting being overshadowed by the immediacy and accessibility of online sources. He stressed the need to address the challenges even as the media landscape continues to evolve to safeguard the vital role of journalism in informing and engaging society.

Sh21 billion Thika 3A Dam to boost water reserves in Kiambu area

BY FLORENCE KINYUA(KNA)

The construction of the Sh21-billion Thika 3A dam is poised to boost the region's water reserves to address the challenges of water scarcity and inadequate sanitation in Thika and Githunguri townships in Kiambu County.

The Thika and Githunguri Water and Sanitation project is being implemented by the Athi Water Works Development Agency (AWWDA) with support from the National Government and the DANIDA Sustainable Infrastructure Finance (DSIF).

Speaking in Thika during a stakeholder's consultative forum to discuss the project, AWWDA Acting CEO Eng. Joseph Kamau observed that the dam, to be constructed at the Gatanga and Kandara boundaries in Murang'a County, is ready for implementation and would be ready for commission-

ing and operation by July 2027.

"Environmental and social impact assessment of the project began in 2018, and we now expect the contractor to commence the works by February 2025 as we are at the financing closure stage," he said, adding that the implementation period for the project would be 30 months, ending in July 2027. "This project will add 70,000m3 of

water per day to Thika, thus meeting the water demand requirement for Thika's urban area up to the year 2027. We anticipate that by the ultimate end, we shall meet the projected population of about 1.2 million people," Eng. Kamau stated.

The current situation's efficient delivery is crippled by challenges like high production energy costs, high operational and maintenance costs,

and high non-revenue water of 38 per cent.

Thika Water and Sanitation Company's (THI-WASCO) current capacity meets approximately 64 per cent of the 2023 demand and 18 per cent of the 2047 demand.

"In the short term, approximately 500 people in Thika urban area and Gatanga will benefit from this project," he added.

Moreover, the project implementation will improve the health and safety status, especially for the women and youth, increase productive time for the household, and create employment and income-generating opportunities during and after post project implementation phases.

On her part, Thika town Member of Parliament Alice Ng'ang'a noted that the Thika and Githunguri Water and Sanitation Project would increase the water supply and sanitation in the area leading to a transformative impact.

"We will be able to combat waterborne diseases and foster health communities even as we stimulate economic growth through the job creation and training opportunities that the implementation of the project will create," she noted.

Kenya commits to long-term low emissions plan, aims for net zero by 2050

Kenya has increased its national commitment to reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 32 percent from 30 percent in its strategy to cope with global warming. Environment and Climate Change Principal Secretary Eng. Festus Ngeno says the state has submitted the ambitious revised Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC), adding that the country has also completed a long-term low GHG emissions development strategy (LTS) up to the year 2050, with an eye on the net zero target.

Eng. Ngeno said measures set out by the country to address climate action included an undertaking to conserve and restore 10.6 million hectares of degraded landscapes and ecosystems, through planting and nurturing 15 billion

trees by 2032.

Speaking during a training for climate change units' personnel drawn from government ministries, departments, and agencies (MDAs) in Naivasha, Eng. Ngeno said efforts to tackle climate action call for an "all hands on deck" approach that encompasses the participation of government entities at the national and county level, as well as private sector actors and the entire citizenry.

Illustrating the huge financial outlay required for climate action, the PS cited implementation of the updated NDC, which he said, required an estimated US dollars 62 billion in funding of which 87 percent would be taken up by donors, adding as well that the long-term low emissions strategy (LTS), would cost an estimated USD170 billion to achieve.

tee on Lands earlier this month that the Ministry is in the preparation stages of digitizing Machakos Township, Mavoko Block, Athiriver, and Syokimau.

The PS briefed the members of Parliament, led by North Mugirango MP Joash Nyamoko, in Mombasa on several land issues, including land digitization and settlement.

"So far, we have scanned and verified 269,694 parcels, and the Murang'a registry is projected to be on the digital platform by the end of March 2024," the PS said.

During the briefing, PS Korir also explained the digitization process to the committee and why it is a lengthy process.

Korir explained that the first step involves scanning the manual records in the Departments of Physical Planning, Survey, Administration and Land Registration into Electronic Document Management System (EDMS).

EDMS is a sub-system for the storage and retrieval of digital images of scanned manual land records.

The second step, the PS said, is the development of a cadastre through georeferencing of the spatial data. A cadaster is a digital map that utilizes the latest survey and mapping technology where parcels are identified with their respective GPS coordinates and other identifying attributes.

Then lastly, the PS noted, is the transaction module of the system that integrates processes

from technical departments within the Ministry which has resulted in automation of services in land registration, administration, valuation, physical planning, survey, and mapping.

The PS noted the challenges faced during the process including and not limited to inadequate budgetary allocation, poor quality of data and paper records, inadequate technical skills, and competencies especially in system development and cyber security among the ministry staff.

Korir reiterated the Government's effort to digitize land records nationwide. The National Land Policy Sessional Paper No.3 of 2009 recommended devolution of National Land Information System to cure rampant vices such as fraud, missing records, incomplete and inaccurate data, double titling, revenue leakage and inordinate delays in service delivery.

NLIMS is a digital platform that facilitates land administration and management. Further it is a useful tool for legal, administrative, and economic decision making due to the accuracy and reliability of

the data, thus aiding in planning for sustainable growth and development.

A rigorous process of data cleaning, barcoding scanning and digitalizing of land records preceded deployment of Ardhisasa.

Ardhisasa is a digital interface that integrates datasets from technical departments within the Ministry.

This has resulted in automation of services such as application of searches, registration of transfers, charges, and valuation as they are anchored in the system as different modules.

Kenya and Egypt mark diplomatic relations with strategic agreements

Kenya and Egypt have signed four memoranda of understanding aimed at enhancing the growth of industrial and technological capacity, job creation, and attainment of sustainable development for the two countries.

The memoranda were signed during the Seventh Session of the Kenya-Egypt Joint Commission for Cooperation in Nairobi.

Prime Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Secretary for Foreign and Diaspora Affairs, Musalia Mudavadi, and Sameh Shoukry, the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Arab Republic of Egypt, signed the memoranda of understanding on maritime affairs, veterinary services, renewable energy, and fine arts.

In a joint communique, the two countries reaffirmed their commitment to deepening bilateral cooperation in the fields of trade and investments, agriculture, tourism, energy, and infrastructure development.



Prime Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Secretary for Foreign and Diaspora Affairs Musalia Mudavadi and Sameh Shoukry, Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Arab Republic of Egypt signed the Joint Communique on the Occasion of the signing of agreed minutes and closing of the Business Forum at the 7th Session of the Kenya Egypt Joint Commission for Cooperation in Nairobi.

Additionally, they have pledged to enhance the sharing of knowledge and best practices towards agricultural development, water conservation, the development of arid and semi-arid lands, and the advancement of maritime economy. Kenya and Egypt have had a strategic framework of cooperation dating back several years, with the recent signing by the respective Ministers for Foreign Affairs coinciding with the 60th Anniversary since the establishment of diplomatic

relations between the two countries.

On Maritime Affairs, the two countries continue to exchange advanced knowledge on fisheries and aquaculture research as well as advance the transfer of African agricultural technologies. Regarding renewable energy, the two nations have reached a mutual agreement to share insights and experiences regarding energy conservation and efficiency; collaborate on the development of a wind atlas and conduct

collaborative research on the environmental impact assessment of electrical energy in the country.

They also commit to lending technical assistance for the development and maintenance of electrifying power systems, transmission and distribution networks and electrical interconnection networks. The ministers committed to promote the uptake of renewable energy sources and advance sustainable development in the continent.

To enhance trade in

livestock commodities, agro-processing, and value addition for all products, Kenya and Egypt will facilitate the exchange of genetic resources in livestock, support initiatives for livestock research and innovation, as well as lend technical support for agricultural engineering and mechanization. The two states have pledged to cooperate to establish forums or platforms for youth and creatives to enable the creation and exchange of knowledge and ideas, exchange of information and best practices and jointly host youth and creative economy trade fairs to exhibit innovations and talent while establishing market linkages.

The country agreements will encourage the design of structured youth and creative economy labor export programmes that foster financial inclusion, representation, environmental sustainability, volunteerism, counselling, and mentorship of youth from both countries.

The two states acknowledged the importance of

cultural diplomacy and made a commitment to strengthen initiatives promoting cultural exchange.

Further, they will fast-track the establishment of a Joint Business Council, a body that will offer support to venture capitalists seeking to explore investment opportunities in both countries.

By facilitating the exchange of trade delegations and encouraging the diversification of trading products, the newly established Business Council will augment trade volumes and value between the two countries.

Kenya Embassy in Cairo was opened in 1964, becoming the second Kenyan Mission abroad after London while the Egyptian Mission in Nairobi was accorded full diplomatic status on 12th April 1994.

Kenya currently commands a minimal market share in the Egyptian market with exports comprising a limited number of products dominated however by tea standing at 89 per cent of total exports to Egypt.

Kenya's total average exports to Egypt are valued at approximately Sh26.8 billion while imports from Egypt are valued at approximately Sh40.3 billion.

- To receive water permit applications for water abstraction, water use and recharge and determine, issue, vary water permits; and enforce the conditions of those permits;
- To collect water permit fees and water use charges, among other functions and powers

WRA ensures sustainable development and management of water resources by managed allocation through permitting process (licensing of use). Hence, it is a mandatory requirement for all water works to be authorized by the Authority and water uses to be permitted. Abstraction permits once issued runs for a period of five (5) years and the borehole owner is required to apply for abstraction permit renewal three (3) months to the expiry date.




Failure to adhere to the provision of the Water Act, 2016, the public is therefore notified that non-compliance will attract a fine of upto Kshs. 1,000,000 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years or to both as such a fine and imprisonment upon conviction.


Notice is hereby given to individuals and entities with expired permits or without a valid permit from WRA that they are required to visit designated WRA offices in their respective areas to initiate renewal and/or regularize their abstractions forthwith. Amounts payable to the Authority in respect of the respective categories of water uses may be accessed from the Authority’s website.

The Authority also reserves the powers to proceed with enforcement, including disconnection of the water abstraction points, prosecution and to meet enforcement costs recoverable at the expense of the offending party.

Education Cabinet Secretary Ezekiel Machogu says that the adoption of the Dual Training System in Technical, Vocational Education and Training (TVET) institutions will combat poverty and bridge the skills gap among the youth in the country.

Macchogu said that the dual training system is a

new system that is aligned with the Competency-Based Education and Training (CBET) module for TVETs and is anchored in incorporating practical skills and knowledge from industries to trainees on top of the theories taught in the classrooms.

The CS said this in a speech read on his behalf by State Department for TVET Principal Secretary

Dr. Esther Muoria during the Fifth Graduation Ceremony at the Michuki Technical Training Institute in Murang'a County, where some 1,673 graduates were conferred with Diplomas and Certificates in various TVET disciplines.

Machogu said TVET skilling is one of the most significant tools in combating poverty and bridg-

ing the skills gaps adding that the implementation of CBET is a game changer for those pursuing technical and vocational education.

"In ensuring that the TVET trainees are fully skilled, the Ministry of Education has continued to ensure that the implementation of CBET takes root in the TVET institutes to address unemployment

and the skills gap among the youth," he said. Machogu said through

the curriculum reforms, graduates would largely be exposed to necessary skills, knowledge, and aptitudes required to make sure that they are best placed to join the job market rather than theory-based education.

The CS noted that the Government has partnered with industries and institutions to roll out the Dual Training System to ensure that students train 50 to 70 per cent of their time in industry to enable them to gain practical skills and industrial exposure.

Makueni County receives 3.5 metric tonnes of drought-resistant seeds

 The County Government of Makueni has received 3.5 metric tonnes of assorted certified seeds for sorghum, cowpeas, and green grams from the Ministry of Agriculture.

Governor Mutula Kilonzo Jnr said that farmers who will benefit are those living in areas that will receive low rainfall during the anticipated long rains period of March, April, and May 2024, adding that the seeds are

drought-resistant and will help boost food security. “The County has received assorted certified seeds from the Ministry of Agriculture, comprising of green grams (750), cowpeas (750), and sorghum (500) packets respectively, to be distributed to farmers to plant,” said Mutula during a County Steering Group (CSG) meeting Co-Chaired with the Makueni County Commissioner (CC), Mr. Henry Wafula in Wote.

Some of the areas where



farmers will benefit are Ukia, Kako, Waia, and Makindu who will receive cowpeas, Kalawa, Mtito Andei, and Masongaleni who will be given green grams, and Thange and

Ivingoni/Nzambani Wards where farmers will receive sorghum. A total of 2,000 farmers will benefit, each receiving a two-kilogram packet of either pulse suitable to

plant in a particular ward. The Governor also emphasized the need to find a lasting solution to the human/wildlife conflict in the area to avert the frequent loss of lives and property in the County. He criticized the Kenya Wildlife Service officers, accusing them of arbitrarily arresting women who go looking for firewood in the Chyulu National Park, saying this was creating enmity between the officers and the community. The Governor noted that

the National Government should set aside a part of the revenue earned from the park to trickle down to the community to improve relations and ensure the local people benefit. “It is bad to arrest women and even Members of the County Assembly. A way should be found to improve relations between KWS rangers and the community. Also, some money should be set aside to benefit the community,” Mutula Jnr said.

Water stakeholders now call for enhanced conservation measures

Water stakeholders in the country have called for better conservation of water and aquifers, as well as all other water resources, to ensure continued availability for future generations.

The team made these statements in Garissa during a validation workshop designed to prioritize Sub-Catchment Areas (SCAs) for the implementation of Managed Aquifer Recharge (MAR) infrastructure, conservation,

and livelihood activities in five counties.

The five counties where the Horn of Africa for Groundwater Resilience project initiative (HoAG-W4RO) will be implemented are Garissa, Wajir, Mandera, Marsabit, and Turkana.

Approximately 1.5 million rural residents from the mentioned counties will benefit from the WRA project development objectives aligned with the United Nations Goal 6, aiming to achieve universal access to safe drinking

water by 2030.

Water Resources Authority board chairperson Donald Murgor emphasized the need to conserve water to safeguard the country's future and improve catchment areas in rural parts of the country.

Murgor highlighted that access to water is essential for everything, including industrialization and production.

He warned that due to climate change, if water resources and groundwater aquifers are not adequately recharged, water

scarcity may become a significant crisis in the near future.

"For our future generations we must start now to ensure that we conserve our catchment areas to combat the severe climate change," Said Murgor

"We came to sensitize our people and we want to bring everybody on board, our youth, women and people living with disabilities, we want to move together in one direction as water is an important resource for the development of our country,"

Added Murgor.

WRA CEO Mohamed Shurie said that the project aims to increase sustainable access and management of groundwater in the Horn of Africa borderlands stretching through Djibouti, Ethiopia, Kenya, Somalia and Sudan. Shurie regretted that the country is currently grappling with water scarcity with only 443 cubic metres per capita of annual renewable fresh water supplies.

"Currently, 83 per cent of our land is classified as

arid or semi-arid lands (ASALs) where poverty levels highest are also high particularly in the north and northeast parts of the country," Shurie said.

"These are areas where groundwater is not just a resource but a critical life-line, playing an increasing role in our country's drought resilience," he added. The CEO revealed that the project will also include drilling of at least 60 exploratory boreholes, which if productive will be equipped for water supply.

African digital economy to grow with increased connectivity

BY MICHAEL OMONDI(KNA)

Increased connectivity and access to digital infrastructure are poised to drive the growth of the digital economy across the African continent.

ICT Authority Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Stanley Kamanguya stated that of the 38 African countries with access to the sea, 37 have one or more fiber optic cables connecting them to different global subsea fiber optic rings.

Despite the increased

connectivity, African countries still face challenges in accessing due to a growing infrastructure gap. According to Kamanguya, Africa has made significant strides in mobile device connectivity, helping to extend connectivity.

Using Kenya as an example, Kamanguya indicated that the number of mobile devices in Kenya is over 1.5 per cent of the population, with Kenyans owning between 70 and 80 million devices against

a population of 55 million people.

“That shows that there is a bit of traction in access from a mobile services perspective. However, when we look at internet penetration and access to broadband connectivity, we still have about half of our country in areas we call unserved or underserved.

It is worse for some of the other countries where we are looking at 18 per cent and 20 per cent inter-

net penetration. So by and large, we still have a long way to go to cover the digital divide,” he noted.

To bridge the gap, the CEO maintained that African governments would need to work together and partner with the private sector to foster collaboration and interconnectivity while harmonizing policies across the continent. East African countries are already in discussions to have Kenya, Tanzania, South Sudan, and Somalia


interconnected.

“We recently started discussions for us to be able to share the infrastructure that is already laid out in Kenya, to assist or to collaborate with some of the countries that don’t have undersea cables landing into their countries.

“And we believe the same will apply across all other African countries so that we can establish intra-country connectivity that is going to go a long way in supporting some of

the continental agendas,” Kamanguya revealed.

To scale interconnectivity, Kenya will in April this year host the Connected Africa Summit 2024 leveraging the convening power of African Heads of State and Ministers of ICT to bring together public sector representatives, private sector leaders, academia, foreign missions, development partners, and thought leaders to address the key issues ICT facing the continent’s ICT sector.

Governor Kihika unveils multi-billion water project to combat fluoride risks

Over 500,000 residents of Naivasha have a reason to smile as the Kenya Informal Settlement Improvement Project (KISIP2) and the County Government of Nakuru embark on a program to put in place a system to supply fluoride-free drinking water to them.

Governor Susan Kihika announced that she would launch the multi-billion water reticulation and de-fluoridation project, which would entail 7.8 kilometers of piping, backfilling, and field coating from Naivasha Law Courts to Karagita low-income settlements.

Kihika indicated that over-reliance on underground water sources by residents, particularly in Longonot and Maai Mahiu areas within the Sub-County, had exposed them to a high risk of suffering from dental fluorosis and crippling skeletal deformities.

The State Department of Housing and Urban Development, under the World Bank-funded program, has pumped Sh1 billion into upgrading informal settlements in Nakuru, under the Second Phase of the Kenya Informal Settlement Improvement Programme II (KISIP).

The program targets improving access to basic

services in the low-income settlements of Karagita slums in Naivasha and Kwa-Murogi, London, and Lake View within Nakuru town. Governor Kihika said there are plans to increase the number of alternative fluoride-free water sources in the devolved unit, noting that there are high concentrations of fluoride in the county's boreholes, sometimes way above the 1.5 milligrams per liter allowed by the World Health Organization (WHO).

"Residents of Naivasha will for the first time enjoy piped fluoride-free water from Malewa River. In the meantime, our experts have been working round

the clock in all the eleven sub-counties to identify fluoride-free areas that will see more boreholes established to help meet rising water demand," the Governor stated.

KISIP II is domiciled at the State Department for Housing and Urban Development and is implemented through 33 participating county governments.

The funding has been

given out by the World Bank (\$150 million or Sh24.1 billion) and the French Development Agency (43 million Euros or Sh7.6 billion) to address infrastructure, water, lighting, and social inclusion in 33 counties.


Underground water sources in Naivasha, Njoro, Nakuru Town West, Gilgil, Nakuru East and Bahati Sub-Counties have been singled out as having

high concentrations of fluoride in Nakuru.

The situation is worse in Naivasha where boreholes are the main source of water with a recent study done on the area's boreholes last year indicating that most of the private boreholes in Naivasha have fluoride levels way above the recommended 1.5 mg/litre.

According to the study commissioned by the County Government, fluoride levels range between 2.15mg/litre to as high as 6.5 mg/litre in the fifteen boreholes sampled during the analysis carried out at the water quality testing laboratory.

Kihika said that her administration is also committed to minimizing the impact of fluoride in all the sub-counties, by ensuring that Water Service Providers supply "blended water" to the residents which is within the recommended levels by WHO.

Community Health Services go Digital in seven counties for better services

 The Ministry of Health has made huge strides in the digitization of health services to ensure that Kenyans across the country receive better services. Quoting the latest status report, the Principal Secretary for the State Department of Public Health and Professional Standards, Ms. Mary Muthoni Muriuki, said the Department has developed and unveiled the Electronic Community Health Information System (e-CHIS) for use by Community Health Promoters (CHPs) to register people seeking health services. According to the PS, the e-CHIS system has already been scaled to seven counties countrywide. Ms. Muriuki said all Semi-Autonomous Government Agencies (SAGAs) in the

State Department have already been onboarded to the new e-citizen platform to streamline their

revenue collection. Ms. Muriuki also revealed that the Department has embraced e-learning, Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) online admission, and a digital repository at all the Kenya Medical Training

Colleges (KMTCs), which will automate all operations for overall efficiency at the institutions. The PS added that the Department has also established a call center for the Ministry of Health and pioneered the development of Health Information Education Communication (IEC) materials. Ms. Muriuki, further revealed that the Ministry of Health has drafted and developed a Primary Healthcare Bill, 2023 which will pave the way for the establishment of a comprehensive and sustainable healthcare system in Kenya. “To improve healthcare availability, accessibility, acceptability, and affordability, we have participated in legislative making including in-putting to the NHIF amendments and the Social Health

Insurance Fund (SHIF) which is a new Fund being established to provide financial assistance to poor and vulnerable Kenyans to access health care,” the PS said. In the status report titled, “Roadmap to Achieving Universal Healthcare by 2027”, Ms. Muriuki said that the Department has operationalized the Kenya Human Resource for Health Advisory Council (KHHRAC) to tackle pressing challenges faced by the health workforce. The Department, the PS added, is updating the Country Human Resource for Health Profile based on the National Health Workforce Accounts (NHWA) reports and established a working framework with health workers trade unions to reduce incidents of strikes in the sector.

Kenya’s PPB achieves milestone recognition in medical device auditing

The The Pharmacy and Poisons Board (PPB) has achieved official recognition as an affiliate member of the Medical Devices Single Audit Program (MDSAP). This acknowledgment was made during the International Medical Devices Regulators Forum (IMDRF) in Washington DC, which took place from March 11th to March 14th, 2024. Dr. Paulyne Wairimu, Chair of the African Medical Devices Forum, and PPB’s Medical Devices Lead, along with Dr. Kariuki Gachoki, Director of HPTs, represented PPB at the event. PPB is now empowered to conduct quality audits for medical devices

and diagnostics by joining a network of regulators, including the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, UK Medicines and Healthcare Products Regulatory Agency (MHRA), Health Canada, Japan’s Pharmaceuticals and Medical Devices Agency (PMDA), Australia’s Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA), and the Brazilian Health Regulatory Agency (ANVISA). The initiative aims to enhance regulatory standards in Kenya and align them with those of IMDRF member economies. PPB’s leadership in Africa is underscored by its commitment to implementing a robust regulatory system for medical devices.

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 4TH EDITION OF PROGRAMMING CODE FOR BROADCASTING SERVICES IN KENYA

The Communications Authority of Kenya (CA) is the regulatory agency for the ICT industry in Kenya with responsibilities in telecommunications, e-commerce, cyber security, broadcasting and postal/courier services. The CA is also responsible for managing the country’s numbering and frequency spectrum resources, administering the Universal Service Fund (USF) as well as protecting interests of users of ICT services.

The Authority is vested with the responsibility of promoting and facilitating the development of the broadcasting industry in Kenya. This includes setting standards for the time and manner of programmes to be broadcast by ALL licensees as provided for under Section 46H (1) of Kenya Information and Communications Act, 1998 (as amended).

The Act empowers the Authority to prescribe, review and ensure compliance with the Programming Code.

The dynamic nature of broadcasting necessitated the review of the Programming Code to incorporate the broadcasting content requirements for both free-to-air and subscription service providers. These provisions shall be applicable to ALL broadcasting licensees. The Programming Code will further be supported by Broadcasting Sector Guidelines based on industry needs and requirements.

The reviewed Programming Code was arrived at through a public consultation process and was gazetted on 8th March 2024 via Kenya Gazette notice No. 2726 in Kenya Gazette Vol. CXXVI No.29. The comments received informed the final 4th Edition of the Programming Code which is now available for free download on the Authority’s website <https://www.ca.go.ke/market-structure>.

ALL broadcasting licensees are therefore required to comply with the provisions of the Programming Code to ensure that as a public resource, broadcasting platforms at all times maintain a standard that is acceptable to all sections of the Kenyan community.

Further, broadcasting licensees are advised to ensure compliance with the said Programming Code as such compliance will form part of the basis for issuance of Annual Compliance Certificates and licence renewals.

New compensation scheme launched to address human-wildlife conflict in Kenya

The Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife has launched a strategy to address human-wildlife conflict, which affects people living in conservation areas, in addition to rolling out an improved, technology-driven com-

pensation scheme for those affected.

The Ministry, in collaboration with the Kenya Wildlife Service, Wildlife Research and Training Institute, and the Nature Conservancy, aims to increase space and connectivity for protected areas

and to recognize wildlife conservation land use options through appropriate policy in its Human-Wildlife Strategy (2024-2033).

Furthermore, the Ministry will increase funding for prevention, response, and compensation, while also improving commu-

nities' attitudes and perceptions by handling their conflict incidents better and sharing benefits to offset costs.

Tourism and Wildlife Cabinet Secretary Alfred Mutua noted that it is important to mitigate conflict not only by ensuring the safety of humans and wildlife but also by providing for those impacted.

Dr. Mutua disclosed that Kenya is among 10 mega-biodiverse nations, with over 35,000 species of flora and fauna, and that over 61 percent of wildlife in key landscapes has declined since the 1970s, emphasizing the urgency of effective intervention.

He admitted that conservation is facing challenges due to diminishing space, resulting in increasing human population pressure, climate change, loss of migration and dispersal areas, and pressure from many other human activities.

The CS declared that the Ministry is taking a keen interest in the mitigation of human-wildlife conflicts (HWC) since the challenges have increased and are affecting the wildlife conservation sector.

"We need to find ways of balancing human populations, development, and the spatial needs of wildlife, which is Kenya's

heritage and life," Dr. Mutua stressed.

He also insisted that his Ministry needs a strategic direction that incorporates new ideas and opportunities to address the issue of expansion of space for conservation to reduce human-wildlife conflicts.

Dr. Mutua added that the new strategy marks a critical step towards achieving balance, focusing on long-term strategies that address the root cause of HWCs and promoting harmonious co-existence between communities and wildlife.

In a speech read on his behalf by the State

Department for Wildlife Principal Secretary Silvia Museiya during the official opening of the Human-Conflict Strategic and the Human-Wildlife Conflict Compensation Scheme 2024-2033, the CS stated that the government is keen to promote sustainable collaboration with communities, partners, and stakeholders in conservation, including Ab Entheos, Minet, and Pula, who have played a critical role in strategic development.

"Wildlife plays a crucial role in the local and national economies with 80 per cent of tourism revenue coming from wildlife and employment creation, making it a vital sector," said Dr Mutua, affirming that the scheme will leverage technology and improve community involvement for efficient reporting, verification, and timely settlement of claims.

First Lady's Across Stitching project impacts 1,200 women, earns beneficiaries Sh25m

A cross-stitching project launched by First Lady Mama Rachael Ruto has earned the beneficiaries Sh25 million since its inception. Dubbed Carakana, the project, which has also been introduced in women's prisons, targets to equip women with the skills to make high-quality artifacts for sale to earn a living.

Mama Rachael said the initiative has so far seen 1,200 women trained, earning them Sh25 million, which has positively impacted the lives of 7,000 others within their households. The initiative, she added, has helped many women to live dig-

nified lives while earning respect within the family.

"The beneficiaries are now able to pay school fees for their children, and this has also contributed to their mental well-being," she said. Speaking during the launch of a workshop at Kisumu Women's Prison during celebrations to mark International Women's Day, Mama Rachael said her office is determined to scale up the program to reach more women.

At the correctional facilities, the stitching project, she said, will not only empower inmates with skills to earn a living but also help in their reintegration back into the community once they

complete their term.

The prisons, she added, have the potential to change the lives of the women for the better, calling for the strengthening of similar initiatives to mould the inmates into better members of the society.

The workshop, sponsored by Manu Chandaria Foundation, targets to equip the inmates with skills to assist them earn a living and rebuild their lives once they are out of prison.

Correctional Services Principal Secretary (PS) Salome Beacco lauded the stitching program saying it will help the inmates to get back on their feet once released from prison.

Ramadhan goodies for Muslims

The Government has begun distributing foodstuff worth over Sh124.5 million to vulnerable Muslim families in 19 counties for use during the month of Ramadhan.

The exercise which is being undertaken by the State Department for ASALs and Regional Development aims at providing food rations to needy members of the Muslim faith to enable them to observe the fasting season with ease.

Principal Secretary in-charge of ASALs and Regional Development Kello Harsama (pictured) said the food was made available by President William Ruto to ensure that vulnerable Muslim households have access to nutritious meals during the holy month regardless of their economic status.

The package which includes 240 tons of rice, 600 tons of beans, 190 cartons of vegetable oil, 28 boxes of sardines, 190 bales of pasta, and 95 cartons of corned beef will be issued out in Marsabit, Garissa, Mandera, Wajir, Mombasa, Lamu, Nakuru, Baringo and Isiolo Counties.

Other counties include Mombasa, Kitui, Nyeri, Uasin Gishu, Kakamega, Machakos, Taita Taveta, Kwale, Kilifi, and Nairobi.

Mr Harsama who oversaw the delivery of the consignment to Marsabit at the Sololo Sub-County headquarters after visiting victims of a rainstorm at Dambala-Fachana Shopping Centre said the in-



itiative which promotes religious observance also reduces financial strain on the lowly in society.

The allocation for Marsabit County consists of 16 tons of rice, 40 tons of beans, 10 bales of pasta, 10 cartons of corned beef, and 10 cartons of edible oil.

The foodstuffs worth Sh23,052,000 will enable vulnerable Muslims access nutritious meals to promote religious observance, reduce financial strain, encourage social inclusion, to demonstrate the government's dedication to fairness, empathy, and unity among all citizens, said Principal Secretary (PS) of Culture and Heritage Umami Bashir.

Speaking at the County Commissioner's Office in Wajir, PS Bashir said, "Food will never be enough, but the fact that we have thought of you as the government and made time to come and distribute this food is a very big message to the people of Wajir," she stated.

PS Bashir, who was accompanied by Wajir County Commissioner Karuku Ngumo and Wajir East MP Mr. Adan Daud, underscored the importance of assisting the needy and vulnerable.

She said, "For us as the government, these are people who mean a lot to us, and the fact that we have recognized them and supported them through Ramadhan is something worth noting."

County investment forum kicks off with big promise

Additionally, the conference provides a platform for local investors to connect with key stakeholders, access valuable resources and explore investment opportunities in the county. Mr Barasa said the county welcomed all investors, as it offered various incentives including streamlined regulatory processes, access to government support programmes and opportunities for collaboration with local enterprises.

KAIICO focuses on the following investment areas: Agriculture and value addition, health care, social development, natural resources and environment and climate change. Agriculture is one of the key priority areas of the county. The sector accounts for approximately 52.3 per cent of the Gross County Product,

presenting a wealth of opportunities for investors.

"Thanks to the county's favourable climate, fertile soils and administration's proactive agriculture-friendly policies, we've witnessed significant improvements in food production. Our focused interventions have already reduced food poverty from 47 per cent to 33 per cent, with further reductions expected by the time the bureau of statistics does its survey in 2025/2026," said the county boss.

The major crops are sugar cane, tea, coffee and groundnuts, as well as dairy. "Currently, farmers face challenges that include high transportation costs and food wastage due to limited preservation capabilities. Additionally, despite our investments in fish, dairy and apiculture, the lack of processing industries remains a notable gap," said Mr Barasa.

In terms of tourism, Kakamega is home to the only tropical rainforest in Kenya, offering a unique and diverse experience to tourism.

The Kakamega rain forest teems with White Columbus monkeys, over 400 bird species, snakes, butterflies, and exceptional historical trees, serving as a haven for nature enthusiasts and researchers alike.

Additionally, the forest's rich vegetation and pristine atmosphere make it an ideal destination for academic and scientific research.

Mr Barasa said the county government is committed to infrastructure growth to spur investment. "By mid-March, we would have built 600km of gravel roads, enhancing transport and communication in rural areas, crucial for agriculture and commerce. This momentum continues as outlined in the Kakamega County Integrated Development Plan 2022-2027," adding the county is also upgrading major roads to bitumen standards.

The county has teamed up with the national government to expand the Kakamega Airstrip into a full-fledged airport.

"By extending the runway by an additional 1.5 kilometres, we'll accommodate larger aircraft, making access easier and boosting tourism in the region. This upgrade will ensure smoother transportation of people and goods in and out of the county," said Mr Barasa.

The county's dependency ratio is expected to decline by 64.7 per cent by 2027, a move that the governor said would offer anyone investing in the devolved unit a substantial consumer base and a rising pool of skilled labour. "As

poverty levels decline, the quality of our workforce is on the rise, making Kakamega an increasingly attractive investment destination," he said.

To boost electricity access, the county has secured Sh3.6 billion from the national government to enhance penetration through last-mile connections.

Further, the Governor said they have a partnership with Hydrobox Kenya Limited, a private firm that offers sustainable and renewable energy solutions in a collaboration that will see the establishment of three power plants, each covering an 18-kilometre radius, thus, ensuring reliable electricity supply covers 97.6 per cent of the population.

"This initiative will not only address industrial, commercial, and domestic electricity needs but also provide a significant boost to businesses, making Kakamega even more attractive to potential investors," he said.

In the healthcare sector, the Kakamega Teaching and Referral Hospital, whose construction is in the final stages, will introduce numerous openings, including equipment placement services, sterile line manufacturing for hospital fluids, efficient medical waste management, and the production of pharmaceutical and non-pharmaceutical products.

The conference, which has attracted up to 3,000 delegates and at least 50 exhibitors, is being hosted in collaboration with KenInvest and other partners.

KenInvest has been a critical player at both national and county levels in regards to encouraging international investments, and has supported several investment forums such as the recently concluded Homa Bay International Investment Conference.

Strategic Plan seeks to put digital technology at the centre of the country's transformation

Kenyans should expect increased broadband connectivity, enhanced e-government initiatives, heightened war on cybercrime and strengthened entrepreneurship in the technology industry in the next five years. This is according to the Information, Communications and the Digital Economy Ministry Strategic Plan 2023-2027 that was launched last week in Nairobi.

The document outlines the roadmap for the ministry and the sector during the period, with CS Eliud Owalo noting that the bigger plan is to put digital technology at the centre of the country's transformation and boost its contribution to the economy.

During the period, the ministry will also foster digital literacy programmes, ensure that citizens have the necessary skills to participate in the digital economy, make e-commerce vibrant, deepen access to low-cost devices and universal access to information and internet services. Efforts to ensure that the public complies with the data protection laws will also be enhanced, according to the strategic plan.

"This plan ensures that the ministry's vision of an informed and digitally-empowered Kenyan society is aligned to the government's transformative agenda, Vision 2030, Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Africa Agenda 2063 and other national government priorities," the CS said. The document identifies seven key result areas namely policy, legal and

institutional frameworks, digital superhighway and telecommunications infrastructure, digital government services and products, universal access to information, Business Process Outsourcing (BPO) and local content development, governance, finance and human

capital development and cyber security, data governance and emerging technologies. "This plan is part of efforts to ensure that priority programmes and projects in the sector are implemented under the Bottom-up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA)," said Owalo.

The Principal Secretary, Broadcasting and Telecommunication, Prof Edward Kisiang'ani said that main agenda of the strategic plan is to ensure that the government speaks in one voice, to serve the people and ultimately ensure its key institution achieve their goals.

"The policy in government is that we must help our national institutions to operate by adequately availing the required resources. We must protect national institutions and give space for the private sector to operate freely," he said.

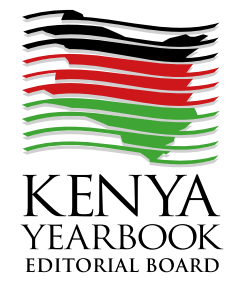
Eng John Tanui, the ICT and the Digital Economy PS, observed that the strategic plan prioritises the development of enabling infrastructure to ease the cost of doing business and expressed optimism in its success.

"I have no reservation that the Strategic Plan 2023-2027 will be a catalyst towards the future direction for the ICT sector, as well as spurring Economic Growth and Transformation," the PS remarked.

An estimated Sh456 billion would be needed for the effective implementation of the plan, according to the document. The bulk of the money, Sh314 billion, would be used in the creation of a digital superhighway and telecommunications infrastructure.

Business Process Outsourcing (BPO), IT Enabled Services (ITES) and local content development would need Sh38 billion, digital government services and products Sh37 billion and administrative costs Sh28 billion.

In the last one year, the ministry has expanded ICT services, including through the installation of 8,419km of fibre in partnership with private sector players, as part of the 100,000km five-year target, set up over 1,261 free public Wi-Fi hotspots and on-boarded 12,692 services fully to the E-Citizen platform. ■

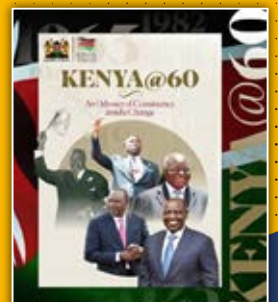
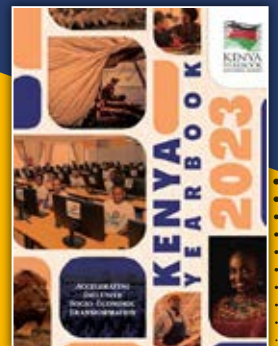

NG-CDF Board constructs police station, equips classrooms in Tharaka, Marsabit

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) has constructed and equipped classrooms, administration blocks, teachers houses and a police station in Tharaka Nithi and Marsabit counties respectively under its Corporate Social Responsibility policy dubbed “Best Practice Demonstration Programme”.

According to the NG-CDF CEO Mr. Yusuf Mbuno, the Board adopted the Best Practices Demonstration Programme (BPDP) to demonstrate its commitment to strengthening its corporate governance, operations and overall effectiveness by collaborating with communities to address social concerns.

Mr. Mbuno was speaking while launching three classrooms built and equipped at a cost of Sh6 million by the Board at Kianjuki Primary School through the National Government Affirmative Action Fund (NGAAF) in Maara constituency in Tharaka Nithi County under area Women Representative Ms Susan Mwindu.

The CEO said the NG-CDF NG-CDF is allocated at least 5% of the total National Government revenue share out of which 5% is set aside for administration and recurrent expenditure for the Board. Out of the 5%

the Board sets aside some monies to implement the BPDP

Mbuno noted that the BPDP operates on the premise of sustainable development, environmental sustainability, social inclusion, excellence in the quality of project implementation, adherence to pertinent laws, government policies and economic development across all regions within the country.

He revealed that the BPDP is designed to address special needs of communities in constituencies, rescue girls from Female Genital Mutilation (FGM), early marriages, address marginalisation of disadvantaged groups and bring those marginalised at par with their peers.

Mbuno who was accompanied by two NG-CDF Directors Mr. Abdiaziz Yarro and Ms Maria Lekoloto said under the Board’s CSR Programme, classrooms are

constructed and fully furnished to give learners a conducive environment to improve performance in national exams.

“Under the BPDP, classrooms are fitted with tiles, ceilings desks and other forms of equipment. The Board also ensures that the infrastructure has a disaster management component with fire extinguishers fitted in every unit. Toilets and classrooms are also compliant for use by Persons Living with Disabilities”, the CEO further said.

He further said that all projects funded and built under the Best Practices Demonstration Programme have a water harvesting component with buildings fitted with a 10,000 litre rainwater harvesting tank and urged constituencies country-wide to embrace this component in order to cater for the water needs of the learners and encourage tree planting and kitchen

gardening.

During his tour of Tharaka, Isiolo and Marsabit, the CEO and the directors inspected three classrooms at Loglogo Primary School in Laisamis Constituency built under the BPDP at a cost of Sh6million. The school has 530 pupils and has an integrated wing of 53 visually impaired learners.

The Board, the CEO added, has also built an administration block at Laisamis Primary school with a septic tank at a cost of Sh7.9million during the 2019/2020 Financial Year.

The Board, he noted, has also constructed a five roomed administration block, two units of staff houses and a double pit latrine at Segel Primary school and a gate in Saku constituency at a cost of Sh5.9million during the 2019/2020 Financial Year.

Under the BPDP programme, the CEO added, the Board has constructed a Sh5.8million police station at Forolle in North Horr constituency during the 2021/2022 Financial Year besides constructing and equipping a dormitory at Kalacha Girls High School at a cost of Sh7.6million during the 2019/2020 Financial Year.

During the tour, Mbuno and his team commissioned the construction of the NG-CDF Upper Eastern Regional Office in Isiolo county which will cost Sh19.9million.

KMPDC shuts down 80 health facilities in Kajiado

The Kenya Medical Practitioners and Dentist Council (KMPDC) has shut down 80 health facilities in Kajiado County due to non-compliance with licensing regulations, and an additional three facilities have been partially closed for failing to maintain stipulated standards. A total of 27 health practitioners operating at these facilities without proper licenses were also arrested in a crackdown conducted by both council officials and detectives from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI). Speaking in Kajiado town, KMPDC Chief Executive Officer David Kariuki revealed that 368 out of the 428 registered health facilities had already been inspected, and the exercise was ongoing to ensure compliance with set standards. “Some of the closed facilities were operating below the stipulated standards, others were either unregistered or unlicensed, while others had employed persons who were unregistered or unlicensed,” he said. Dr. Kariuki empha-

sized that KMPDC stands firm in its mission to regulate medical practitioners and facilities to ensure quality healthcare is accessible to all Kenyans.

He warned that legal action would be taken against health practitioners operating without valid licenses issued by the council. County Executive Committee Member for Health Alex Kilowua reiterated the county government’s commitment to providing quality and accessible healthcare.

Kilowua applauded KMPDC for conducting the inspection exercise adding that private health facilities operating without the required licenses and set standards were putting the lives of Kenyans at risk.

“We have seen many people masquerading as licensed health practitioners and putting the lives of Kenyans at risk. We are happy with the ongoing inspection and will be keen to ensure that legal action is taken against them to deter others,” he added.

commended the milestone, saying it signals a new era in malaria diagnosis for the region.

Speaking after holding a meeting with a multi-agency team preparing for the WRC Safari Rally led by the Secretary Administration for Sports, Ministry of Youth Affairs, Sports, and the Arts Mr. Evans Achoki and Safari Rally Kenya Chief Executive Officer Mr. Charles Gacheru, the Governor expressed delight that the event is expected to inject Sh7 billion into the Kenyan economy.
