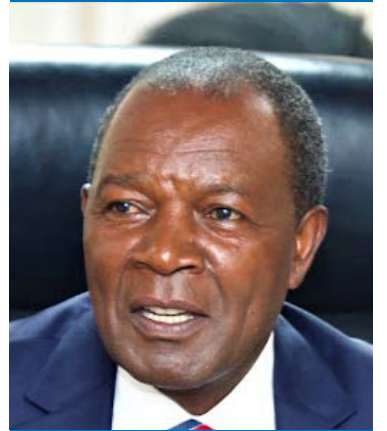

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Kisumu County launches seamless payment platform with Safaricom

The Kisumu County Government has partnered with leading mobile telco Safaricom, to unveil a new Integrated County Revenue Management System (ICRMS), offering a one-stop platform for residents to access and pay for various county services.

Governor Prof. Anyang Nyong'o noted that the bold decision to embrace the new, integrated, and automated system would not only enhance accessibility and transparency but also tremendously boost its Own Source Resource (OSR) collection regime.

"With this innovative approach, and if well man-

aged, we hope to collect the county's potential target of Sh2.2 billion and build on that next year. We have co-created this platform with Safaricom to provide a seamless and user-friendly experience for Kisumu residents and county officials to contribute to the overall efficiency of revenue management," Prof. Nyong'o

said during the launch at City Hall.

He added that the new revenue collection system is purely cashless and has been made available on several channels to support seamless revenue collection, including the Safaricom App, Mobile App, and WhatsApp platforms.

Thanking the Kisumu

County Revenue Board and Safaricom for their tedious work in putting the new system in place, Prof. Nyong'o noted that the revenue collectors have undergone adequate training on how to use and monitor the new platforms.

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Government to distribute 15.3m mosquito nets to combat Malaria

PS State Department for Public Health and Professional Standards, Mary Muthoni Muriuki, says LLINs stand as a highly effective tool in malaria prevention and control programmes

The Government has embarked on the distribution of 15.3 million long-lasting insecticidal nets (LLINs) in 22 high-burden counties to reduce cases of malaria in the country.

The Principal Secretary (PS) of the State Department for Public Health and Professional Standards, Mary Muthoni Muriuki, stated that LLINs stand as a highly effective tool in malaria prevention and control programmes.

The distribution of LLINs to households has shown tremendous progress in the fight against malaria, with a sig-



nificant drop in malaria prevalence from eight percent to six percent nationally, as indicated by the Kenya Malaria Indicator Survey in 2015 and 2020, respectively.

Ms. Muriuki explained that the 2023/2024 mass net distribution campaign was launched in Homabay County

on November 15, 2023, issuing 830,862 nets, covering 91 per cent of registered households.

"Kisii county's distribution is commencing on Wednesday, January 24, 2024, where 941,368 nets will be issued, and Nyamira County's distribution will commence

on January 31, 2024, issuing 449,974 nets.

"We extend our gratitude to the County Governments of Homabay, Kisii, and Nyamira for taking the lead in this campaign to combat malaria in these targeted counties," the PS said.

According to Ms Muriuki, the first mass distribution campaign for universal coverage took place in 2006, where 3.4 million nets were distributed, integrated with measles vaccination.

This was followed by the 2011/12 campaign with the distribution of 10.6 million LLINs to populations in malaria endemic and epidemic regions.

She explained that replacement distribution in 2014/15 involved 13.1 million nets, followed by the distribution of 15.1 million nets in 2017/2018 to safeguard the vulnerable population in the same regions.

The 2020/21 campaign, conducted amid the challenges of Covid-19, saw the distribution of approximately 16.2 million nets across 27 counties.

To sustain the gains achieved and contribute further to effective malaria vector control

ification of transactions and payments which has been made possible using secure unique identifiers including QR codes.

In addition, the system ensures real-time reporting of all revenue transactions across all departments in the county.

The County boss also revealed that the county is introducing the Ushuru Centre; which is both a contact and call center from where the county revenue staff would be able to assist and resolve issues related to revenue from the citizens.

“The system has GIS Data Integration Capability which is intended to help the county government map all its revenue sources and resources to ensure enhanced service delivery and to make revenue collection easy and more organized, especially for the structured revenue streams,” he assured.

Notably, the smartphones being used are installed with new technology and capability to be used by the

officers for revenue collection, and they can both work online and offline. The system passed the credibility tests upon undergoing the pilot testing for the Unstructured Revenue Streams which began on December 18, 2023.

The already rolled-out streams include: Markets, Town Parking, Bus Park, Cess, and Stock Rings, among others. Mooted plans are also underway to include in the new system the Unified Business Permit, Advertisements, Plan

Approvals, and Rates.

Safaricom's Chief Enterprise Business Officer Cynthia Kropac pointed out that the ICRMS would address the county's challenges in optimizing revenue collection, administration, and reporting.

“The innovative platform will support various revenue services, including parking, cess, markets, advertising, property rates, and approvals, among other revenue services reducing queues and wait times at the county offices,” she affirmed.

Kropac emphasized that the ICRMS is designed to enhance citizen satisfaction by providing convenient payment options for services where residents can pay through various channels, including USSD (*427#), WhatsApp, the MyKisumu App, and a web self-service portal.

“The system, which is Kenyan and locally made, ensures real-time integration with payment channels like M-Pesa and banks for accurate reporting and reconciliation of transactions. This will ensure enhanced visibility and control are provided through dashboards accessible to executives, enabling effective monitoring of revenue performance and operations,” she said.

“At Safaricom, we are committed to leveraging our technological capabilities to drive positive change in communities across Kenya. The implementation of the ICRMS system in Kisumu County reflects our com-

mitment to driving digital transformation for efficient service delivery, making services more accessible and convenient for all, and furthering our mission to connect, empower, and improve the lives of Kenyans,” Kropac said.

The ICRMS also incorporates transparency features, providing real-time updates on revenue collection and usage and fostering accountability and trust between citizens and the county government. Its implementation is aligned with Safaricom and #39's broader mission to empower businesses and government entities through digital solutions.

The ICRMS utilizes Safaricom and #39's technological expertise to streamline and modernize revenue collection processes, facilitating convenient payment for county services through multiple channels, thus enhancing accessibility and transparency.

Kropac further revealed that to enable end-to-end support, the East Africa Device Assembly Kenya Limited has come on board to provide smartphones required to run the revenue application used by dedicated revenue collectors.

Nairobi to host 2024 network of African Data Protection Authorities AGM conference

The Government has achieved key milestones by ensuring the integration and adherence to data privacy principles in corporates and communities throughout the country.

Information, Communication, and the Digital Economy Cabinet Secretary Eliud Owalo say that Kenya is also making a mark on the Continental platform as it gears up to host the 2024 Network of African Data Protection Authorities (NADPA) AGM Conference in Nairobi from 6th to 9th May this year.

Speaking during the commemoration of International Data Privacy Day 2024 in Kisumu County, Owalo appreciated the efforts made by the Office of the Data Protection Commissioner (ODPC) in advocating for the fostering of a culture of data privacy and safeguarding the personal information of citizens.

The CS also launched the Kisumu ODPC Regional Of-

fice and the ODPC Chatbot, which will play a crucial role in enhancing user experience and accessibility to information.

CS Owalo emphasized the importance of appreciating Data Privacy Day as a catalyst for change.

“This is a day to reaffirm our commitment to fostering a culture of data privacy that resonates across our society. As we embrace the opportunities presented by the digital age, let us do so with a steadfast determination to protect the rights and privacy of our citizens,” Owalo noted.

The CS said that last year, Kenya, through the ODPC, was elected as the First Vice Chair of NADPA during the Annual General Meeting (AGM) held in Burkina Faso in May 2023. Furthermore, Kenya won the bid to host the 2024 NADPA AGM conference in Nairobi.

“This signifies the country’s strategic regional leadership on matters relating to Personal Data Protection

and enhances the country’s position at the international level,” the CS said.

The CS acknowledged that the ODPC holds a unique position in facilitating both government and private sector entities to achieve the strategic goals outlined in the Government’s Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA), and, in particular, the Digital Superhighway initiative. CS Owalo said that in this age of unprecedented connectivity and information exchange, fostering a culture of data privacy is paramount.

“As we navigate the intricate web of data-driven advancements, upholding the principles that safeguard the personal information of our citizens becomes imperative,” Owalo said.

The CS further said that adopting strong data privacy safeguards is not only critical for protecting individuals’ rights but also ensuring a secure and ethical business environment, which requires a multi-pronged ap-

REGISTRATION OF CORPORATE TRUSTEES UNDER THE RETIREMENT BENEFITS ACT

The Retirement Benefits (Corporate Trustees) Regulations, 2023 (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”) were gazetted on **21st July 2023** vide Kenya Gazette Supplement No. 119 as **Legal Notice 103 of 2023**. The Commencement date of the said Regulations is 3rd July 2023.

Regulation 24 provides: -

“Each corporate trustee in operation on the date of the commencement of these Regulations shall comply with the provision of these Regulations within twelve months after commencement of these Regulations.

For avoidance of doubt, a Corporate Trustee as defined under Section 2 of the Retirement Benefits Act means: -

“a limited liability company incorporated under the Companies Act, 2015, which is for the time being, empowered under any written law, its charter, memorandum of association, deed of settlement or other instrument constituting it or defining its powers to mainly undertake trusts, and includes a trust corporation.”

In light of the above, **ALL** existing Corporate Trustees of Retirement Benefits Scheme are required to comply with the provisions of the said Regulations by **3rd July 2024**. Further, any other person who wishes to offer services to a Retirement Benefits Scheme as a Corporate Trustee will also be required to apply for registration. A copy of the Regulation and the application form can be downloaded from our website (www.rba.go.ke)

Please take note that no person will be allowed to offer services to a Retirement Benefits Scheme as a Corporate Trustee if they are not registered in accordance with the RB Act and the Corporate Trustee Regulations.

REGISTRATION OF INCOME DRAWDOWN FUNDS UNDER THE RETIREMENT BENEFITS ACT

The Retirement Benefits (Income Drawdown Funds) Regulations, 2023 (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”) were gazetted on **10th November 2023** vide Kenya Gazette Supplement No. 217 as **Legal Notice No. 187 of 2023**. The Commencement date of the said Regulations is 31st October 2023.

Regulation 43 provides: -

“Any registered income drawdown funds in existence on the date of commencement of these Regulations shall, within twelve months after commencement of these regulations, amend its income drawdown fund rules to comply with the provisions of the Act and these regulations”

Regulation 44 further states: -

“Any income drawdown arrangement established as a special fund within a retirement benefits scheme in existence on the date of the commencement of these Regulations, shall be required to register within three years after the date of the commencement of these Regulations and operate solely as an income drawdown fund.”

In light of the above, **ALL** existing registered Income Drawdown Funds are required to comply with the provisions of the said Regulations by **31st October 2024** and any retirement schemes operating a special fund, to ensure registration of the income drawdown fund as soon as possible but not later than **31st October 2026**. Please take note that failure to comply within the stipulated timelines may lead to deregistration of the income drawdown fund.

The CEO of MCSK, Ezekiel Mutua, emphasized the organization's commitment to supporting and empowering artists, ensuring the fair distribution of royalties to safeguard their livelihoods.

Mrs Rigathi calls for urgent action to save abandoned boy child

The spouse of the Deputy President, Pastor Dorcas Rigathi, has called for collaboration among stakeholders to ensure a dignified future for young men in the country.

Mrs. Rigathi noted that the boy child had been abandoned in the community, prompting them to engage in alcoholism, drug abuse, and street life. Speaking during a medical camp at Kisii Primary School grounds in Kisii town, she urged the national

and county governments to work together in rehabilitating the young men whose lives had been ruined through drug addiction.

"A generation is about to be wiped out, and we need to change the course and take care of the future of our children, especially the boy child, so that our families may thrive," she said.

Mrs. Rigathi cautioned parents against condemning their children who are addicted to alcohol and drugs and instead encouraged them to help the young men

in seeking assistance from rehabilitation centers.

In addition, she said parental guidance is key at every stage of the boy child's life, adding that most parents are too busy and out of touch with their children's social well-being. Pastor Rigathi decried the high number of young men in prison within the county, saying that most of them had committed various offenses under the influence of alcohol and drugs. Notably, she pointed out that the boy-child had resorted

to the risky informal transport commonly referred to as boda boda and conducted the business while drunk, thereby rendering them vulnerable to accidents.

As a remedy, Mrs. Rigathi expressed her willingness to join hands with Kisii County to support young men through a rehabilitation program that would involve seeking medical help, joining a vocational institution for training, and ultimately, securing a job for a better future for themselves and their families.

Sh100m cold room project set to enhance fish storage and processing

BY MABEL KEYA-SHIKUKU (KNA)

The Government will construct a Sh100 million fishing landing site on Lake Naivasha to accommodate a cold room for processing fish and assist fisherfolk in storing their catch at the correct temperature.

Making the announcement in Naivasha, Cabinet Secretary for Mining, Blue Economy, and Maritime Affairs, Salim Mvurya, said the landing site is intended to ensure that the fish caught by fishermen remains in good condition for a longer time, allowing it to reach the market.

Mvurya was accompanied by Blue Economy and Marine Fisheries Affairs Principal Secretary, Ms. Betsy Muthoni Njagi, and her counterpart in the State Department for Mining, Mr. Elijah Mwangi. The project

is part of a larger plan announced by the government last year, where Sh900 million was allocated for the construction of modern landing sites in various parts of the country to improve fish catches and meet the growing demand for fish.

During the event, Mvurya also handed over a patrol boat worth Sh50,000 to the lake patrol team to enhance security and help combat illegal fishing on the lake.

It is one of six boats that his ministry purchased at a total cost of Sh306 million to patrol the fishing waters in the country.


The CS noted that, to boost fish production in the country, centers of excellence have been established to address the issue of the high cost of fish feed and to facilitate the production of high-quality fish fingerlings in the country.

“As part of the government’s commitment in enhancing the aquaculture value chain in the country, we have established Sh1 billion Kabonyo Fisheries

Aquaculture Service and Training Centre of Excellence in Kisumu County which will supply about seven million fish seed (fingerlings) to the farmers,” Mvurya said.

He observed that this is in line with the President’s directive released last year banning the importation of tilapia variety of fish so that the country can be self-sustaining as far as Tilapia fish production is concerned.

“We should export and not import tilapia because we have enough of it if properly harnessed,” Mvurya added.

How a mechanic's YouTube inspiration led to profitable eco-friendly stoves

BY WANGARI MWANGI AND SAMUEL MAINA (KNA)

When we eventually arrive at Jacob Mwangi's temporary workshop on the outskirts of Gaikanja Shopping Center in Nyeri County, the first thing that greets us is the aroma of freshly cooked ugali.

We are soon informed that the accompanying stew, a mixture of kale and spinach, will be ready in less than 15 minutes.

The lunchtime meal is being prepared on a dummy of an oil-burning stove, which has been in the works for the past week.

The stove is made using old steel pipes, but one of its most peculiar features is that it runs on used engine oil. At first glance, the cooker can

pass for commercial burners found in appliance shops, but on closer inspection, one notices a few variations; the entire structure is made from old steel pipes.

There are two mini fans on one end of the frame, and the most peculiar difference is that the stove has a cylinder suspended adjacent to the burners. It is this canister from a used mini-LPG cylinder that stores the oil which feeds the burner.

There are also two taps at the bottom of the suspended cylinder, which, when turned on, dispense fuel into two funnels connected to two pipes. The two pipes eventually lead your eyes to two burners from where one cooks.

"That viscous black liquid is old engine oil, which

we have drained from a car engine at the garage. It is the main component in this innovation since it powers the stove," says Mwangi, who is assisted by four technicians.

Mwangi, a mechanic, adopted the idea after watching a video on YouTube by Creative Inventions LMTN (an American self-made craft).

Nairobi's slum dwellers rally behind ongoing Affordable Housing programme

The affordable housing programme has received a major endorsement from residents living in the fourteen informal settlements in Nairobi County.

These settlements include Majengo in Pumwani, City Carton in Buruburu, Matopeni in Kayole, and Muungano wa Kijiji Cha Grogon in

Mathare, among others.

The dwellers described the program as a solution to the perennial problems they face, including a lack of social amenities such as infrastructure, modern housing, as well as clean water.

“We are so glad about the affordable housing scheme because it will enable us to stay in a safe, clean, and secure environment,” said the City Carton Village Settlement Executive Committee

(SEC) Chairperson, Alexander Waweru.

However, Waweru, at the same time, urged the government to rescind the 10 percent deposit requirement, saying it will lock out the majority of slum dwellers from homeownership. He told the government that it was impossible for such a class of people to raise the amount due to their low-income levels.

The chairperson made the

remarks while submitting views on affordable housing scheme to the Kenya Informal Settlement Improvement Project (KISP 2) officers.

In their presentations, most residents were in support of the programme owing to the benefits they will accrue from it.

“As mothers, we can sell food and other commodities to the workforce at the construction sites. This

will enable us to raise some funds for ourselves and the family”, said Anne Ngugi, a member of the City Carton SEC. Similarly Matopeni SEC chairperson Job Ogalo said the programme will offer job opportunities to the youth, thus solving the rate of unemployment in the country.

Tea sector reforms boost farmers' incomes and education opportunities

Reforms in the tea sub-sector are yielding positive results, with tea farmers praising the government's efforts to increase their earnings from this cash crop.

Notably, farmers no longer need to resort to borrowing expensive loans to educate their children, as they now have sufficient funds for their education.

For small-scale tea farmer Collins Kirui, the reopening of schools in January no longer means borrowing from banks and Savings and Credit Cooperative Societies (SACCOs) to pay fees.

The father of one secondary school learner and two undergraduate students has already cleared their fees due to the high bonus received in October from tea in the 2022/2023 financial year.

"In 2024, I have school fees ready. No more loans; this bonus has helped me

clear an outstanding loan I owed to the SACCO," said Mr. Kirui, a farmer with 4,016 tea bushes in Kericho County at the Momul Tea Factory.

Having attended the Kericho Tea Reform Conference in July 2023 hosted by Deputy President Rigathi Gachagua, Mr. Kirui was initially unsure of the success of the reforms. However, he now asserts that the reforms spearheaded by the Deputy President have led to better pay.

Ms. Lucy Too, another farmer from the same factory, has also managed to clear the secondary school fees balance for her two children. "I have bought two heifers. We want the bonus alone to reach KSh60 per kilogram next year," she said.

In the 2022/2023 period, the factory paid farmers KSh20 per kilo every month and KSh44.80 in bonuses per kilo, totaling KSh64.80

per kilo of green leaf. However, Mr. Isaiah Langat, the Chairman of Momul Tea Factory, highlighted that various charges in installation, production, and other operational costs reduce the overall pay. He appeals to the government to consider eliminating these charges.

Ms. Grace Ogutu, a farmer at Nyankoba Tea Factory in Nyamira County, acknowledges that the bonus has helped her clear debts.

"We appreciate that the reforms are working. We implore the government to root out cartels in the marketing of tea. That is how we will earn more money," she said.

Ms. Joyce Abira observes that the reforms are restoring confidence in tea farming, and in better earnings, the cash crop is restoring the dignity of farmers. This sentiment is shared by Mr. George Mosoti.

Another farmer, Peter Momanyi from Nyamira

County, emphasizes the need for the Deputy President to continue protecting the interests of farmers.

"The government promised that money from cash crops will go back to the rightful owner—the farmer. We have seen it this year. If this is sustained, the life of my family will be better," he said.

Mokaya Ogero, another farmer, is building a permanent house with the support of improved earnings.

In the year under review, Nyankoba tea farmers earned KSh20 per kilo of green leaf monthly and a bonus of KSh35.

This marked a 37% increment from the 2021/2022 earnings, making it the

most improved factory. The farmers attribute the improved bonuses directly to the reforms.

Deputy President Rigathi Gachagua has been actively engaging various stakeholders in streamlining the tea subsector.

Nyankoba tea farmers credit visits to factories with consistently good results, such as Imenti and Gitugi, for increasing their capacity in quality production.

Joash Mokamba, the factory unit manager, emphasizes that high returns will not be delivered by reforms alone; there is a corresponding effort to improve quality through extension officers.

Gideon Mutwiri of Imenti Tea Factory in Meru County

points out that the application of sufficient fertilizer contributes to quality. The government has reduced the cost of fertilizer from KSh7,000 to KSh2,500 per 50-kilogram bag through a subsidy.

"The high cost of fertilizer negatively impacts quality and earnings. We ask the government to sustain the provision of cheap fertilizer.

This will lower the cost of production and increase the quality of the harvest," says Mr. Mutwiri.

Imenti Tea Factory farmers earned KSh21 per kilo of green leaf in monthly pay, while the bonus reached KSh52.10. The factory paid the second-highest bonus in 2022/2023.

For Gitugi Tea Factory in Nyeri County, Unit Manager Patrick Karanja mentions that tea extension services officers have been training farmers since 2017 on organic manure to supplement synthetic fertilizer and cut production costs. Organic manure improves soil texture, water retention, among other benefits.

The factory paid farmers Sh21 per kilo of green leaf per month and a bonus of Sh57.30, totaling Sh78.30. This was the highest payment nationwide.

MoH launches strategic tool to combat Tuberculosis crisis

The Ministry of Health (MoH) has launched a strategic tool to end the devastating impact of tuberculosis (TB) in Kenya.

The Ministry launched the National Strategic Plan for Tuberculosis (TB), Leprosy, and Lung Health, the National TB Laboratory Operational Plan, the National Quality Management framework for TB diagnostic laboratories, and the pediatric TB shorter-term treatment regimen in Nairobi.

Presiding over the event, Public Health and Professional Standards Principal Secretary Ms. Mary Muthoni Muriuki stated that Tuberculosis (TB) remains a major public health concern, not only in Kenya but across the globe.

"It stands as a leading cause of death attributable to a single infectious agent, and the havoc it wreaks on both the social and economic facets of our societies is immeasurable," stressed Ms. Muthoni.

She further added that in 2022, Kenya recorded approximately 90,841 TB cases, a significant increase from the 77,854 cases reported in 2021.

"Alarming as this figure is, it represents only 68 per cent of the estimated 133,000 TB cases that were likely to emerge that year, leaving 32 per cent undiagnosed and untreated," added Muthoni.

She cited the emergence of drug-resistant TB cases, totaling 756 in the same period, highlighting the urgent need for a comprehensive and coordinated response.

"Today, we gather here for the launch of a critical tool in our fight against TB, the TB Strategic Plan 2023/24- 2027/28," said Muthoni.

The PS noted that the

2023/24-2027/28 plan is a testament to the commitment of the Ministry of Health and the stakeholders towards putting an end to the devastating impact of TB in the community.

She further observed that the launch coincides with Kenya's introduction of a community-centered Universal Health Coverage (UHC) initiative that has seen the recruitment, kitting, and deployment of 100,000 Community Health Promoters (CHPs).

According to Muthoni, the CHPs will play a pivotal role in timely tuberculosis detection at the grassroots level to ensure proactive household screenings and bolstering the government's fight against the disease.

She disclosed that the plan was developed using a people-centered approach, reflecting a bottom-up strategy championed by the government, ensuring that all stakeholders and the affected communities play a crucial role in policy design and implementation.

in the country, Ms. Muriuki said the State Department of Public Health and Professional Standards has embarked on a relentless journey in the fight against malaria, recognizing it as a global and local public health concern.

"In Kenya, malaria has imposed a heavy burden on the people, with about 6.7 million clinical cases and 4,000 deaths reported in 2022. Children under five years and pregnant mothers continue to bear the brunt of this preventable disease," she said.

Ms. Muriuki said the National Steering Committee and National Malaria Control Programme had embarked on preparing the next six counties for distribution.

The PS said the campaign, scheduled to run from January 22nd to February 3rd, 2024, targets Kisumu, Siaya, Migori (in the Lake endemic region), Kwale, Mombasa, and Taita Taveta (in the Coast Endemic region), uti-

lizing lessons learned from past experiences.

"The exercise commenced on Monday January 22nd with data validation, county, and sub-county sensitization, training of health care workers, and training of community health workers (CHPs) and village elders," the PS said.

She said this will be followed by validation and social mobilization for household registration, aligning with the government's agenda of bottom-up economic transformation aimed at empowering people at households to own and control determinants of their health matters and health-seeking behavior, as a key pillar of our universal health coverage or Afya Nyumbani.

Ms. Muriuki said that a total of 4,290,101 LLINs will be distributed in six counties: Taita Taveta, Kwale, Mombasa Siaya, Kisumu, and Migori covering a targeted population of 6,687,628.

Turkana boosts community health with 2,454 kits, tablets and phones

BY PETER GITONGA (KNA)

Turkana County has received 2,454 kits and 2,454 tablets to cover the 225 active community health units in the devolved unit.

The kits contain various items that will facilitate Community Health Promoters (CHPs) in addressing minor ailments in the community.

Additionally, the county has also received 2,454 phones for distribution to CHPs across the county for digital reporting.

During the launch of CHPs kits and tablets, County Deputy Governor Dr. John Erus described CHPs as the engine in the provision of community health services.

At the same time, Dr. Erus recognized the collaborative strategic partnership between the county government and health partners that has led to improved healthcare services at the community level. He said the partnership is on its way to achieving the governor's health agenda.

The deputy governor also called for the integration of national and county government health structures to deliver quality healthcare services to all county resi-

dents.

"Healthcare stability being a priority agenda in our county, we are committed to ensuring alignment of CHPs tools of work rhyme with their workloads, such as airtime for the tablets and a monthly stipend," he said.

On his part, the County Commissioner, Jacob Ouma, urged the CHPs to promote and encourage the utilization of latrines in every household to reduce the spread of hygiene-related diseases.

He also commended the efforts of national and county health officials and other partners for advancing healthcare in Turkana County.

"County officials will be the watchdogs of development programs within the county. Tracking and assessing partner projects should be mandatory as it ensures the satisfactory delivery of their commitments," Ouma said.

The County Chief Officer (CCO) for Preventive and Promotive Health, Peter Lomorukai, said the launch of the kits marked the commencement of household registration to strengthen health services at the community level.

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County distributes modern fishing vessels to boost artisanal fisheries

Fisherfolk in the coastal county of Kwale have received a major boost after the county government distributed 18 state-of-the-art fishing boats and other equipment in a bid to enhance artisanal fisheries.

The modern, high-tech fishing vessels made of fiberglass, which have a higher level of endurance than wood, were provided by Governor Fatuma Achani at an elaborate ceremony held at the Shimoni fishing village in Lunga Lunga Sub-County.

The Governor, accompanied by Lunga Lunga MP Mangale Chiforomodo, presented the outboard motors, which have an eight-crew and 1.5-ton capacity, along with other fishing equipment to 18 Beach Management Units (BMUs) active along the South Coast.

At the same event, the Governor also issued certificates to 76 trained coxswains (persons who steer

a boat), including four women.

The coastal county boss has expressed hope that the new fishing equipment would increase the production of fish in the region.

She said the devolved unit will work with all the stakeholders in the maritime sector to uplift the lives of fishing communities and generate revenues for the county.

Before handing over the fiberglass boats to the beneficiaries, Achani stressed that the initiative was part of her administration's ef-

forts to boost youth employment and food and nutrition security.

Governor Achani said with the modern boats and diving kits, local fishermen would feel safer in stormy weather thus improving their daily catches.

Achani says Kwale County Government wants its fishermen to venture into the country's Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) by equipping them with the latest deep-sea vessels.

"With these fiberglass boats, safety gears, and fish handling equipment,

our fishermen can now undertake their fishing activities in deep waters, hence increasing their daily catches," Achani said.

The acquisition of the new modern fishing equipment was made under the Kenya Marine Fisheries and Socio-Economic Development (KEMFSED) program.

The KEMFSED project is implemented by the national government through the State Department for Blue Economy and Fisheries with support from the World Bank.

Governor Achani said the donations are expected to increase income, enhance the standard of living in the artisanal fishing communities, and make fishing attractive and seamless to youths and women.

She said other plans are afoot to improve the industry such as provision of cold room facilities and equipment for processing sardines to reduce post-harvest losses which have been experienced by many fishing communities in the area.

Nakuru County's journey to fluoride-free drinking water

Residents of Nakuru County will benefit from an ongoing World Bank-funded water treatment and defluoridation plant, which will supply fluoride-free drinking water to the city and its environs.

County Executive Committee Member (CECM) for Lands, Physical Planning, Housing, and Urban Development, Mr. John Kihagi, stated that the initiative, part of the Second Phase of the World Bank-funded Kenya Informal Settlement Improvement Project (KISIP), encompasses various components.

These include the backfilling and installation of 7.8 kilometers of water pipes, two treatment plants, and the renovation of an elevated steel tank.

The CECM regretted that over-reliance by residents, particularly in parts of Gilgil and Naivasha counties, on

underground water sources had exposed them to the risks of dental fluorosis and crippling skeletal deformities.

Mr. Kihagi said there were plans to increase the number of alternative fluoride-free water sources in the devolved unit, noting that there were high concentrations of fluoride in the county's boreholes, sometimes exceeding the 1.5 milligrams per liter allowed by the World Health Organization (WHO).

"Our experts have been working round the clock in all the eleven sub-counties to identify fluoride-free areas that will see more boreholes established to help meet rising water demand," stated Kihagi.

He was speaking during a consultative meeting between engineers tasked with the installation of defluoridation units, the Settlement Executive Committee (SEC) and Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) at the County headquarters.

Employers Support Establishment of a Seafarers Wages Council

Ship owners and shipping agents have lauded the government initiative to establish a Seafarers Wages Council to champion the improvement of terms and working conditions of Kenyan seafarers.

The establishment of the Seafarers Wages Council follows a series of consultative meetings between the Ministry of Labour and Social Protection which is spearheading the process through the National Labour Board and representatives of various stakeholders in the maritime and shipping industry.

The National Labour Board led by its Chairman, Mr. David Siele, agreed that there was merit and justification

for the establishment and operationalization of the Wages Council after receiving views and submissions from a string of main actors in the industry.

These players included the Kenya Maritime Authority, International Trade Federation and the Seafarers Union of Kenya during a meeting held at the Kenya Maritime Authority offices in Mombasa.

The Board further appointed a select committee which held a two days consultative meeting with ship owners and shipping agents to appraise them on the planned establishment of the Council.

“Employers are key stakeholders whose insights and perspectives are necessary as we embark on this process,” the Board noted.

Representatives of the employers who attended the meeting acknowledged and welcomed the formation of the proposed Wages Council saying there is an urgent need to have a functional Wage Council to govern the sector and ensure better pay and working conditions of seafarers.

“There has been a missing link between the seafarers, ship agents, and ship owners in relation to fighting for the seafarers wages and the Wage Council is the right entity which will implement this mandate effectively,” Mr. Juma Tellah, the Chief Executive Officer of the Kenya Shipping Agents Associations said.

Ms. Naomi Torerei, representing both the East African Deep Fishing Limited and East African Shipping Management contended

that employers were faced with challenges of setting the wages for seafarers due to lack of established salary structures.

“A functional wage council will work for the best interest of ship owners and the seafarers since there will be agreed laws and regulations to govern the hiring and firing of seafarers,” Ms Torerei said.

The Institute of Chattered Ship Brokers also made their presentations.

The Chair of the select

Committee Mr. Areba Samba thanked the employers for their candid contribution during the two days meeting.

“Our meeting has been consultative and aims at ensuring that the establishment of the Seafarers Wages Council is a collaborative effort, tripartite in nature and that it incorporates the perspective of all relevant stakeholders,” Mr. Areba said.

“Well motivated seafarers will lead to a more productive workforce in the Kenyan maritime and shipping sec-

tor. Similarly, a fair and well-regulated maritime sector will attract and retain skilled seafarers, boosting Kenya’s maritime competitiveness on the global stage,” noted the select committee at the end of the meeting.

The proposed Council will be composed of representation from the Central Organization of Trade Unions (COTU), Federation of Kenya Employers (FKE), the Kenya Maritime Authority and the Ministry of Labour and Social protection.

Ministry to position Kenya as Africa’s ICT Hub by 2027–Owalo

The Ministry of Information, Communications and the Digital Economy has expressed its commitment to position Kenya as the ICT Hub of Africa by 2027.

Speaking during a media interview, Cabinet Secretary Eliud Owalo expressed optimism that his ministry will have rolled out the 100,000 kilometres of fiber optic cable, established and operationalized the 25,000 free Wi-Fi hotspots country-wide and set up and fully op-

erationalize the 1,450 digital hubs in the country by 2027.

Owalo further noted that by the same year, the ministry will have digitalized all the government services besides digitizing all the government records.

“With that infrastructure, and affordable mobile phone handsets, we will be running a paperless government, leveraging on technology,” the CS noted.

He emphasized that digital transformation is key in ensuring the public can access services from the confines of their physical location thus

requiring minimal physical interaction.

The CS further said digital hubs will create digital jobs for the youth and reduce the human traffic to government offices.

Importantly, he noted that it will be possible to collect adequate resources, internally within the Kenyan economy “to finance not just payment for our external debt but have adequate resources to facilitate our domestic public expenditure and also recurrent expenditure and an internally sustainable economy.”

Government's milk cooler initiative brings smiles to dairy farmers

Dairy farmers have a reason to smile following the government's pledge to install milk coolers in the modernization program of Kenya Co-operative Creameries (KCC) facilities in all wards countrywide.

The State has announced that the move has been motivated by the need to eliminate middlemen who buy milk at throwaway prices in the rural areas and later make profits by selling the commodity at higher prices

in the upper market.

Cooperatives and Micro and Small Enterprise Cabinet Secretary Mr. Simon Chelugui acknowledged that dairy farmers struggle with challenges such as storage, preservation of milk, the high cost of feed, and access to markets.

He said the government has taken immediate steps to reinstate the stalled milk coolers' program, and the distribution of 650 milk coolers is on course.

"In our plan, we have identified the dairy and livestock economy as sub-

sectors with the quickest economic turnaround time, and they will become key drivers in improving food security, creating jobs and boosting exports," he said.

Chelugui revealed that the government was working on plans to establish a milk price-stabilizing fund of close to Sh3 billion.

The milk fund is scheduled to be implemented by the New Kenya Cooperative Creameries which is 100 per cent owned by the government.

He said the funds will be used to mop up excess milk

from farmers and convert the milk into long-life products to be stored in the Strategic Food Reserve. This is among the many interventions aimed at ensuring a stable and prosperous dairy subsector. "The government will mop up the milk, convert it into powder milk, package it and store it in the Strategic Food Reserve. Even the private processors will be free to buy the same dry milk at a price the regulator will provide," Chelugui said. He spoke when he met dairy and coffee farmers from Bahati Sub-County in

Nakuru. The funds will be used to stabilize the price of the commodity in the market and ensure that all the milk is collected from farmers.

"The Stabilization Fund is an intervention the government takes to absorb extra milk. It does not take away the respective dairy process of milk," Chelugui said.

Currently, milk production has gone up because of the good weather the country is enjoying. The CS said mopping up of excess milk is an activity the government has done before.

Department, US Agency to improve mental health for prison officers

The State Department for Correctional Services has partnered with the US Department of State Bureau of International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs (INL) to train senior prison officers on mental health and well-being, which will be cascaded to all staff and inmates.

Speaking during the opening of a three-day mental health workshop at Prison Staff Training College Ruiru, Kiambu County, the Principal Secretary for Correctional Services Dr Salome Muhia Beacco said the training would bring out a healthier State Department where the psychological needs of staff and inmates including the most vulnerable are well taken care of.

"I believe that with this initiative, we will bring mental health issues to the spotlight and stop mental health problems from being

considered a taboo in the government," the PS said.


Dr Beaco noted that mental health is a global pandemic and called upon all the stakeholders to come together and find solutions.

The Principal Secretary acknowledged that some of the Correctional Services staff have been affected by mental health which has led to officers committing suicide.

To address mental health challenges, the PS said the State Department is committed to empowering staff and inmates to take good care of themselves and their loved ones.

"We are going to take a comprehensive and holistic approach which begins with prevention and early interventions," said the PS.

Dr Beaco pointed out that prevention includes building up resilience in staff and inmates and providing them with an environment which will nurture their mental health and well-being.

'Red eye' disease — State acts

Ministry of Health advises the public to maintain high standards of hygiene and self-isolate in case of infections as cases spike at the Coast

BY AGENDA KENYA WRITER

The government has recommended several precautionary measures in response to the recent surge in cases of conjunctivitis, a viral eye infection spreading in areas around Mombasa and Kilifi. These include thorough hand hygiene with soap and clean water or use of sanitisers before touching one's eyes, along with maintaining high standards of overall hygiene and sanitation.

The Ministry of Health has advised the public to self-isolate in case of infections and visit health facility for treatment if one

suspects they are infected. Conjunctivitis is listed in the National Infection Prevention and Control Guidelines for Health Care Services as one of the most contagious diseases alongside scabies and herpes zoster. Health practitioners as well as the public should, thus, avoid contact with the infected.

In addition to standard precautions, health care workers must observe contact precautions with patients who are known or suspected to have the illness as it is easily transmitted by direct patient contact

or by contact with items in the patient's environment and patient-care equipment. Contact precautions are effective in preventing infection from patients with wet or draining infections that might be contagious, such as draining abscesses, herpes zoster, impetigo, conjunctivitis, scabies, lice, and wound infections; and other illnesses.

Mary Muthoni, the Principal Secretary for Public Health, emphasised the contagious nature of the disease, urging the public to take necessary precautions to prevent its transmission.

With mass movement of people in and out of Mombasa every day, the government issued the alert in a bid to curb the spread of the disease that was recently detected in Tanzania, where close to 1,000 cases were reported.

"The cases are very contagious and are presenting with red eyes (conjunctivitis), eye swelling, eye discharge and itchiness. The definitive cause has not yet been established but laboratory testing is pending," PS Muthoni said.

Conjunctivitis, also known as pink eye or red eye, can be caused by viruses, bacteria,

or allergens. Children, in particular, seem to be the most affected demographic in the reported cases, prompting health officials to advise parents against sending symptomatic children to schools or madrassas.

"We ask parents not to take their children to school or madrassa in the event they notice symptoms of disease because most of the cases have been reported there," said Dr Salma Swaleh, the Mombasa County Director of Public Health and Disease Prevention. Dr Swaleh also noted that children are more susceptible and are the most affected of the 150 cases reported in the county.

INFOBOX

Red Eye: The Facts

- Over 1,000 cases have been reported in Tanzania with some cases reported in Mombasa and Kilifi
- Children are often disproportionately affected by conjunctivitis, with outbreaks commonly reported in schools and other educational institutions
- Treatment might require a dose of antibiotics and prevention is managed through proper hygiene
- Locally referred to as 'macho macho' it is highly contagious and those who suspect they are infected should self-isolate
- There is a scientific argument on seasonality of conjunctivitis as the disease is more common in dryer seasons compared to wetter seasons.

According to the US Centre for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), viral or bacterial conjunctivitis is spread by coming into contact with an infected person. For instance, a person with the disease rubs their itchy eyes and touches a surface like stair rails or an object like a pen or switch. Then an uninfected person will touch the same surface, thereby, picking up the virus and get infected if they rub their eyes without washing their hands.

While mild cases of pink eye may resolve on their own, bacterial infections may require antibiotics if accompanied by symptoms such as pain, swelling, or excessive discharge. Allergic conjunctivitis, on the other hand, occurs when the eye reacts to irritants like pollen, dust, or certain cosmetics.

In both Kenya and Tanzania, health authorities are closely monitoring the situation, emphasising the importance of hygiene practices in combating the disease.

The Ministry of Health in Tanzania has said it was closely monitoring the situation even as cases spike in Dar es Salaam. "Hygiene is important to tackle the disease although the symptoms go away in about a week even without treatment," Prof Paschal Ruggajo, a Tanzanian health ministry official noted. ■

Government and IFAD offer \$250 million to support 10 Counties

TEN COUNTIES IN the country are set to benefit from a \$250 million US dollars (Sh40.9 billion) programme from the government, in collaboration with the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD). The programme aims to enable said communities manage their natural resources.

The programme, which is still at design stage, will leverage on incentives for communities to encourage them manage their resources and improve their livelihoods at the same time.

"Depletion of resources is due to over exploitation. The communities believe that the resources are their only way to earn a living. You cannot tell people to manage their natural resources if you don't give them alternatives, those are things they can do as they manage the resources," noted Ms Mariatu Kamara, the IFAD Country Director.

The funds are a collaborative contribution from IFAD and its partners and the central and county governments. One of the counties set to benefit is Elgeyo Marakwet, which was selected due to its high poverty index rate.

According to the Elgeyo Marakwet County Department for Finance and Planning Report, 57 per cent of residents live below the poverty line compared to the national average of 46 per cent.

Despite the high poverty levels, Elgeyo Marakwet is strategically positioned as it offers a critical source of water for

neighbouring counties. "Its advantageous position allows the county to start irrigation projects, which will increase agricultural productivity, thus increasing food and nutritional security," noted Ms Kamara. To encourage ownership of the project, IFAD will first engage with local leaders before going to the community to discuss the challenges faced, the opportunities available and how all can work together in providing solutions. Elgeyo Marakwet Governor, Wisley Rotich, also assured that the county government will also go to the grassroots and engage the community, to ensure that whatever is being implemented is in line with their concerns. "Among the things they will be emphasising, is how to harvest water at the household level, have water pans, plant fruit trees and conserve the environment at the same time," he noted. ■

Education PS Belio Kipsang urges more accountability in bursary disbursement TO ENSURE A smooth and seamless transition for students moving from one level to another and in need of financial support, the State Department of Basic Education will revamp the Jomo Kenyatta Foundation (JKF) to better coordinate and regulate the issuance of scholarships and bursaries in the country.

The revamp will enhance the Foundation's capacity to coordinate bursary allocation. "We will also build a database of all beneficiaries so that there is no double dipping. A child does not have to benefit simultaneously from CDF, the County Government, and the Elimu Scholarship," Education PS Belio Kipsang noted.

A key change in the Foundation is that the finalisation of the awarding of bursaries will be done before students report to school. This will make the process efficient and will allow all students to start school at the same time.

"Some children remain at home in anticipation of either getting a CDF bursary or a County Government bursary and it takes time. So, they lag behind. This has to change and bursaries disbursed before schools open," noted the PS. ■

Counties bank on land registration to resolve perennial conflict

The exercise has been fronted as a possible solution to disputes and insecurity in arid and semi-arid counties

Counties that make up the Kerio Valley namely, Turkana, Elgeyo Marakwet, West Pokot, Samburu and Baringo have been hard hit by banditry and cattle rustling over the last few years. The shared culture of pastoralism and raiding has made it easier for other security-related crimes to also thrive in the areas.

“Land disputes are common in some regions in Kenya and this is due to the fact that many of our communities, for example, here in Elgeyo Marakwet, do not actually own the land,” noted Wisley Rotich, Governor of Elgeyo Marakwet. His sentiments are affirmed by Governor Benson Cheboi of Baringo

who notes, “The terms land ownership and pastoralism do not go hand in hand in the traditional sense. Because pastoralists have to move from one place to another. So, when you tell them about boundaries, it conflicts with their way of life. However, we cannot ignore the fact that raiding and cattle rustling have caused so much insecurity in the area. That is why we support the concept of community land that is owned by all adults in the community as long as they are over 18 years old.”

It is no surprise, therefore, that the five counties have welcomed efforts from both the national government and development partners on ensuring security in the area.

Notably, the Food and Agriculture Organization has facilitated the counties to establish land registries that have a database of all community members. This has also allowed for women and youth to be part of the community land groups.

Backing their activities on the Community

Land Act of 2014, the management of the counties have kick-started the process with informative sessions aimed at enlightening residents and gathering crucial data essential for the impending adjudication procedure.

Communities residing within community land areas in Elgeyo Marakwet have been engaged and given vital information about the forthcoming land inventory. These gatherings were also intended to encourage active participation and address any concerns locals might have had about the process.

The governor promised that data collected during community sensitisation will form the basis for establishing a clear and organized system of land ownership, promoting responsible land use practices, and fostering sustainable development within Elgeyo Marakwet County.

Communities within the targeted areas expressed willingness to support the initiative, ensuring the comprehensive preparation of a Community Land Inventory. This collaborative effort is crucial for the success of the project, as community involvement and cooperation are key to accurately collecting comprehensive data.

Further, this comes amidst government’s proposal for the relocation of the Kenya Defence Forces Recruits Training Camp from Kamagut in Uasin Gishu to Kerio Valley. The move will allow for people in the affected area to feel secure and go ahead with their socio-economic activities, which are often hindered when there is conflict.

To show that the government is keen on dealing with the menace once and for all, the Cabinet Secretaries for Defence, Aden Duale and Interior, Prof. Kithure Kindiki, have toured the region and assured the residents of the national government’s support.

They also acknowledged that there are some ongoing land disputes that have to be resolved. Their sentiments were echoed by Governor Rotich who said, “I urge those who have issues to quickly resolve those amicably using elders so that we unlock the immense potential of Kerio Valley through sustainable land use.”

Among other measures that the government has put in place include the creation of two sub-counties in the area to ensure that all citizens are served quickly and that government services are devolved efficiently. Further, the government has set aside Sh. 700 million for agricultural activities in the valley.

As the land inventory exercise progresses, positive transformations are expected in the region, providing a solid framework for equitable land distribution, conflict reduction, and fostering long-term sustainable development in Kerio Valley.

It is expected that communities will be able to plan what to do with their lands, including an uptake in agricultural activities. Land owners, including women, will therefore have alternative sources of livelihood and stop depending on pastoralism and raiding. ■

Huduma Kenya, Judiciary partner to deepen access to justice

Over the years, while he has also played football for Ulinzi Stars, coached division one teams and sold timber in Gikomba, Nairobi, his first love has remained dogs. He is one of the top dog breeders in the country as his animals are highly sought after by corporate clients like G4S and Brinks Security. According to him, one can never live a dog’s life if he engages in the business, which has seen his children through school – to the university level. Maina breaks it down

Your love story with dogs goes how far...

Yes, as far as 1976 actually when I was a small boy living in Nyahururu. A priest at Nyahururu Catholic Church known as Fr Lewis noticed the interest I had in dogs and gave me a German shepherd puppy. That ignited my passion.

How many dogs do you have?

There are 42 mature dogs currently at my home. They were more but I have sold some and leased out others.

Describe your typical day....

My day starts at 5am with an inspection to confirm that all the dogs are well. Then I prepare a schedule for the day, including their meals and walks in the neighbourhood. The schedule guides my two workers on what to do. The workers are trained on first aid so that they attend to emergencies in case they arise. Most of the time I leave my home at 9am to train dogs at people’s homes or institutions

How much does one need to start such a business?

With Sh20,000, one is good to go but it’s good to have some knowledge about the business and have passion for it.

Tell us about dog breeding...

In breeding dogs, you work with what is known as “working line”. These are dogs with stronger qualities such as powerful muscles and are purposely selected for breeding. This means the breeder should know their animals well.

Some people say it’s hard knowing when a female dog (bitch) is on heat...

It can be if one does not know how to detect the heat signs. The obvious sign is bleeding from the vulva and others licking the back end more than usual or being over friendly to other dogs. I mate the dogs once I detect blood. Three to six mating sessions are enough to make the female pregnant.

How does a quality working line look like?

In the case of German shepherds, a good quality working line will have medium-sized animals, with good quality fur, temperament and body structure. These are the ones I use for breeding purposes. To avoid inbreeding, I change males every two years.

Digital opportunities beckon as Thika's ICT Hub take shape

Plans are underway to construct an Information, Communication, and Technology (ICT) hub in Thika town, Kiambu County, bringing hope to hundreds of youths aiming to take online jobs.

The center, set to be built at the Public Works Grounds, will be equipped with computers, laptops, and internet connectivity, able to accommodate between 300 and 500 people. Public Works Principal Secretary Joel Arumonyang, during an assessment tour of the premises accompanied by area Member of Parliament (MP) Alice Ng'ang'a, mentioned that the project is a partnership with the State Department for ICT and Parliament, intending to have such centers in every constituency.

Arumonyang stated that the Ministry of Information, Communication, and the Digital Economy would play a vital role in enabling internet connectivity and training the youth on programs where they can access online jobs, including Ajira.

He also mentioned that the government is making progress in ensuring ICT hubs are constructed across the country and called on the youth to embrace the opportunity. The PS said the world has

become a digital village and the government has invested heavily in vibrant internet connectivity across the country, to create opportunities for its citizens to earn a living.

The PS added that besides the ICT hubs, the Public Works State Department will go to all the counties to support the ongoing government projects, including construction of affordable houses in every constituency and offer technical support.

Nyamira County's dairy sector gets a boost with Artificial Insemination drive

Nyamira County Governor Amos Nyaribo has launched a revamped artificial insemination (AI) program in Nyamira to boost dairy farming through superior breeds, aiming to increase milk production in the area.

During the launch at Canaan Market in Nyamira North Sub-County, Governor Nyaribo revealed that the county produces 22.4 million liters of milk annually, far below the potential of 240 million liters. This deficiency is attributed to the fact that 70 percent of dairy breeds reared by farmers are inferior indigenous ones.

"The indigenous, inferior dairy cows reared by most farmers barely produce an average of two to three liters of milk per cow in a day when my county has the po-

tential to produce six to ten liters per cow a day by the year 2026. It is against this backdrop that I have taken decisive action to revitalize artificial insemination (AI) and further castrate inferior

bulls," Governor Nyaribo stated.

He confirmed that his county has employed twenty inseminators, one in each ward, and adequately equipped them with fully

fueled and serviced motorcycles, as well as semen for superior bulls. They will, therefore, have the convenience of moving from one homestead to another to provide AI services to dairy farmers at a cost of Sh500 for the first service and free of charge for repeat service.

Nyaribo notified farmers to report any inseminator who will ask for extra charges for the AI services, transport or demand other charges so that legal action is taken against such rogue officers.

Moreover, he divulged that his government is in the process of setting up a call centre for dairy farmers to get real-time services at the same time establishing a livestock breeding unit (LBU) to act as a link between the county government and farmers to promote the AI program and consequently boost their economic venture.
