## Kenyans to have digital ID by October, says CS

### FIFA gifts schools with football equipment

The World Football governing body FIFA has launched the Football for Schools (F4S) programme, an initiative meant to benefit Kenyan primary schools.

The programme, a joint initiative with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) was launched in Kakamega on July 30, 2023.

Through the programme, FIFA aims at impacting over 700 million children, both boys and girls, across the globe.

The programme has been designed to promote targeted life skills and competencies through football and contribute to the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and other priorities.

In Kenya, it is set to directly benefit over 2,000 primary schools across the country.

"Youth and women's football remain key in FKF's football development agenda. Since children spend most of their time in school, we believe we can directly impact them through capacity building of our teachers with coaching education and the provision of football equipment," said Michael Amenga, FKF's Head

them how the project will be rolled out and the public's respective role in its implementation.

The CS noted that it is essential for Kenyans to understand the impact and end result of the digital identity.

"Once people confirm that the benefits outweigh the associated risks, everybody will migrate to the digital platform," said Owalo.

Speaking to various Heads of ICT from Ministries, Departments and Agencies during a workshop sponsored by German Agency GIZ, Owalo noted that the digital ID will also be a mechanism of verifying and authenticating those accessing government services.

He added that the digital identity will help in sealing all revenue leakages prevalent in government agencies and departments and bring in more Kenyans into the tax bracket.

"We will be able to collect more tax revenue at the current taxation rate without revising our fiscal policies besides being

able to collect adequate resources to pay off our debts and have some surplus to finance domestic, current and recurrent expenditures," Owalo revealed.

**We will collect more tax revenue at the current rate without revising our fiscal policies" CS**

In a bid to enable more Kenyans access online services, the government is partnering with the private sector to manufacture smart enabled and affordable phones in the country.

The Heads of ICT were also notified that the government will soon introduce digital signatures to eliminate brokers.

The CS said individuals will be able to sign off government processes and documentations on digital

platforms seamlessly.

Owalo further said the digitalisation process will also take place at the county government level.

"We are determined to turn Kenya into a digital economy and we want to have a paperless government at both levels of government, national and county government," he said

The CS further said that the Digital Superhighway is a stand-alone thematic

area and a critical enabler of other pillars stipulated in the government's Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA).

Speaking, ICT and The Digital Economy Principal Secretary Eng. John Tanui urged the Heads of ICT to be well versed with the dynamics of IT systems within their ministries and have a clear working mechanism with other leaders to avoid duplication of projects.

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# Government to automate services for increased efficiency, transparency

Automation of government services will enhance revenue collection, seal most leakages and ultimately secure government resources.

State Department for Immigration and Citizen Services Principal Secretary Julius Bitok said all government services will be digitized and automated in a bid to increase efficiency and seal corruption loopholes.

As such, Bitok said all online government services will be paid through just one paybill number.

The PS said by automation, the government services will be available even

in remote areas which will create opportunities for people and build trust in government, adding that 2,560 services have already been digitized end to end, with 5,000 services at various stages.

“New skills for data and new technology are fast changing, the central challenge for e-citizen is how to harness tech-

nological changes for the public good so that service delivery is enhanced,” he said.

Speaking during the closing ceremony of a two-day sensitization workshop on e-Citizen at a Machakos hotel, the PS said automation of government services will enhance revenue collection by sealing most leakages.

“This means that government services will undergo a re-evaluation of our approach to service delivery on development matters and citizen change of attitude on our services,” he said.

“The need for greater efficiency and continuous improvement is not just about

adding new skills or people or equipment, but also looking at how to re-prioritize and reduce work that is less relevant,” he said.

“We have a duty to continuously strive to deliver better value for money and demonstrate impact

through advanced evaluation and harness rapid technological changes for the public good,” he stated.

The e-Citizen Director General Amb Isaac Ochieng said the government will close down all over 1200 e-Citizen gateway pay bills

serving 2,560 services to one pay bill number 222 222, stating that they were expensive for the government and do not add value they were created for.

He assured Kenyans that they will enjoy government services as there will be no interruption of departmental service as all services will be online in the next six months.

Ochieng said the service will raise the bar on spending controls to be more assertive so as to improve the quality services in all government departments and agencies by December this year.

“The new service delivery will change the trends in revenue collection and make government visibility in one platform but not one server,” Ochieng said.

“Officers must be transparent in government services. Services are available at the convenience of the citizenry,” he added.

# Farmers in Gusii to enjoy easy access to subsidized fertilizer from Government

The Principal Secretary (PS) for the State Department for Crops Development, Mr. Kello Harsama has unveiled mini National Cereals and Produce Board (NCPB) depots in various sub-counties in Gusii land to distribute subsidized fertilizer to farmers.

The PS, while launching the subsidized fertilizer at Nyamira North Sub County, stated that the Crops Department made the decision of starting mini depots after farmers complained of the high transportation cost incurred when procuring their fertilizer from the one NCPB depots located in Nyansiongo and Kisii town for Nyamira and Kisii counties respectively.

"Many farmers in Gusii land were unable to access governments' subsidized fertilizer because of the high transportation cost and besides, the fertilizer was brought late when the ma-

majority of farmers had already planted their maize crops, the reason why my department, in consultation with your constituency leaders, decided to launch mini supplying depots in Gusii land for easy access of this fertilizer," PS Harsama said.

"The President has decided to reduce the cost of crop production for the common people so that it will eventually reduce the cost of flour and other food products courtesy of subsidizing fertilizer so that the

complaints about the high cost of basic food like flour will be reduced," the PS said. North Mugirango MP, Joash Nyamoko who had accompanied the PS, said the decision to open up new mini NCPB depots was very much welcome because most farmers were discouraged from using subsidized fertilizer due to unaffordable transportation costs and the challenge of delivering the fertilizer late when the majority of the farmers had already planted.

# National feed strategy aims to boost livestock resilience and productivity

The Government needs to marshal more than Sh. 460 billion within the next 10 years to implement the National Feed Strategy that seeks to address a livestock feed deficit of 33 million metric tonnes every year.

The strategy will address the shortage through the promotion of 14 animal feed value chains which have energy-rich sources, adequate minerals, and vitamin concentrates.

This comes after it emerged that Kenya has lost 2.5 million livestock in the last two years following a prolonged drought that also led to starvation of animals for lack of quality feed.

According to Stanley Mutua, the Head of Animal Feeds and Nutrition Services at the Ministry of Agriculture, Kenya requires 55 million metric tonnes of animal feed annually but produces 40 per cent leaving a huge supply gap of 33 million metric tonnes every year.

“The current animal feed deficit stands at 33 million metric tons and the government requires to inject Sh460 billion in the next 10 years to address the shortage by implementing the National Feeds Strategy,” said Dr. Mutua.

He said the Government, in collaboration with other non-state actors, will support investments in five key value chains to address the

gap including pasture, sorghum, sunflower, cotton, and maize silage.

Speaking in Naivasha during the African Union-backed Resilience African Feed and Fodder Systems project, Dr. Mutua said the government has instituted technical, policy actions, and institutional interventions to support and upscale the production of feeds for livestock which

millions of Kenyans depend on for a living.

The head of the animal feeds docket said the government’s national feed strategy will help to address animal feeds and water shortage for livestock, feed quality, costs, and weak policies and strengthen feed data and information systems to inform better and timely interventions.

In addition, Dr. Mutua said the national government is already implementing various projects for fodder commercialization in the counties to help cushion farmers and other actors in the livestock value chain from adverse effects of climate change such as pro-

longed droughts, and other global crises such as the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war.

Dr. Christopher Wanga, the Director of Livestock Policy Research and Regulations at the Agriculture Ministry said animal feeds take up to 70 per cent of all inputs required by farmers with the high costs driving the use of low-quality feeds, leading to low productivity.

“Some 2.5 million livestock have died in the last two years as a result of drought and subsequent starvation as farmers lacked timely, cost-friendly, and quality animal feeds. This resulted in loss of livelihoods to millions of families,” said Dr. Wanga.

Dr. Wanga said the livestock sector contributes 50 per cent to the total agricultural sector’s Gross Domestic Product (GDP), and there’s a need to undertake informed research and policy decisions to support the sector by addressing the current deficit of quality feeds.

The Director said the government is working on a livestock masterplan to build resilience, strengthen research capacity and upscale viable and innovative approaches to cushion the sector from external shocks.

The masterplan also aims at ensuring production of quality livestock products such as meat, milk, and eggs that meet the nutrition demands of the citizens.

# LVBC to get state-of-the-art headquarters in Kisumu

The East Africa Community (EAC) has allocated Sh355 million for the completion of the Lake Victoria Basin Commission (LVBC) headquarters in Kisumu.

LVBC Executive Secretary Dr Masinde Bwire said, the allocation which has been contributed by EAC member states will see the agency which is mandated to coordinate sustainable development and management of the Lake Victoria Basin move to the new building in February 2025.

Speaking after handing over the site for Phase Two of the project, Dr Bwire said the contractor - China Jiangxi International Kenya Limited has up to 80 weeks to complete the project.

LVBC, he said, has partnered with the State Department for Public Works to ensure that the project is completed on time

within the set budget.

Dr Bwire said the contractor was competitively sourced adding that the agency has put measures in place to ensure the works are done to the set standards.

“Our hope is that this place will be home to LVBC and add to the beautification of Kisumu city,” he said.

LVBC is the only EAC institution with headquarters in Kenya and the only diplomatic mission in the country located outside Nairobi.

The building, which is being constructed on the shores of Lake Victoria, is expected to aid in the smooth coordination of the agency’s services.

State Department for Public Works Deputy Chief Architect David Waititu expressed optimism that the project, which has taken a long time to complete, shall be done within the set timeframe.

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## Head of Public Service decries failure to exploit huge resources in Marsabit to generate wealth

The Chief of Staff and Head of the Public Service Mr. Felix Koskei has decried the failure to exploit resources abundant in Marsabit County that could generate wealth to transform the lives of local communities.

At the same time, Koskei assured residents of the county that the government will continue to initiate development projects geared towards their well-being and urged local communities to co-exist peacefully.

The Head of the Public Service, who spoke at Kari when he made a two-day tour of Loiyangalani Sub-County in Laisamis Con-

stituency to assess service needs of the locals, pointed out that the region was endowed with enormous resources which, if harnessed, could create jobs and generate wealth.

Reacting to calls by residents and leaders, who included area MP Mr. Joseph Elkton and Deputy governor Mr. Solomon Gobo, Koskei cited the existence of great potential in tourism, minerals, fisheries, livestock rearing and trade which, if tapped, could transform lives.

This, he noted, would be realized if there was an enabling environment for investment, and asked elders and leaders to build peace and trust among communities.

Koskei consequently challenged the local leadership to formulate development plans that would see exploitation of the existing

resources for the improvement of the living standards of the residents.

That would only be possible, he added, if the communities embraced education and directed the County Commissioner Mr. Norbert Komora to ensure that all school aged children are enrolled in school irrespective of gender.

"I would like the County Commissioner to ensure that relevant agents as well as parents and guardians perform their roles as expected because all children should access education without exception as a ba-

sic and legal right," he said.

Acknowledging that a lot is required to be done in virtually all sectors, Koskei said the government would consider the construction of school boarding facilities in Kargi Ward while the Hula-Hula Loiyangalani Road would be upgraded to bitumen standard.

On the prolonged drought which has made the majority of families to be food insecure, the Head of the Public Service said the government is scaling up the relief food rations to ensure that nobody is starved.

Dr Mukhwana said there is a need to develop a model that can have a self-sustaining industry for academia platform.

"This will drive open innovation models where the industries are able to post their challenges and invite the students innovating, as well as set them on a path of creating sustainable entrepreneurship pathways," Dr Mukhwana stated.

He at the same time noted that Kenya seeks to become globally competitive through the bottom-up economic transformation agenda by creating a sustainable pool of micro, small and

medium enterprises as per the Fourth Medium Term Plan 2023-2027.

The PS further underpinned the partnership between academia and the industry saying it will drive the innovations, new product development and industrial competitiveness.


"The world is at the point of a significant shift in how economies are organized and driven by two key megatrends, which is, the drive for sustainability through adopting green manufacturing known as Green and the 4th Industrial Revolution (industry 4.0) that advances the use of artificial intelligence,

robotics, 3D printing and genetic engineering."


World Bank representative Sameer Goyal said the World Bank started the project in 2019 but was slowed down by the Covid-19 pandemic.

"The country is still recovering from the pandemic that paralyzed this initiative that we started long ago but is now gaining momentum," Mr Goyal said.

He said students have fertile ideas that can transform into technology that will in turn make them innovators and entrepreneurs in this competitive world of business.

# Garissa – New Regional Implementation Coordination Committee to jumpstart monitoring and evaluation of projects

The newly formed North Eastern Regional Implementation Coordination Committee (RICMC) will play an expanded and crucial role in monitoring and evaluation of all government projects and programmes in the region.

Speaking in his boardroom during the launch of RICMC, North Eastern Regional Commissioner Mr. John Otieno said that after the operationalisation of the committee, government programmes and projects will have timelines that henceforth must be adhered to and should not compro-

mise on the quality of the work.

The RICMC membership, the Regional Commissioner said, comprise of all regional directors of government departments and Semi-Autonomous Government Agencies (SAGAs).

Mr Otieno as the RC is the chair while the Director in charge of the Government Delivery Services (GDS) formerly known as Presidential Delivery Services (PDU) in the previous administration is the secretary to the committee.

“All government programmes and programmes have scope, timelines, specifications that should be met. This committee will

strive to ensure that the projects in the region meet all the standards and delivered on time,” Otieno said.

“In order for seamless delivery of government programmes and projects, the heads of the departments and SAGAs must appraise themselves with projects and projects under them and report to the committee all issues impending them,” he added.

While acknowledging that security challenges facing the region have at times slowed down movement monitoring of projects, Otieno said ‘this should not be an excuse to deliver shoddy work’.

In his previous engage-

ment with the residents, the Regional Commissioner has stressed the need for the residents to volunteer any information to security agencies on those aiding the Somalia based Al-Shabaab terror group to carry out attacks.

The attacks are aimed at sabotaging government programmes and projects in the region. The government on its end has vowed not allow this to happen.

Otieno emphasized that the government is doing its level best to secure the region for seamless delivery of government services and projects.

Speaking, the GDS Senior Director Mahat Shalle in charge of Eastern and North Eastern region said that some

contractors have used insecurity as a scapegoat to abandon government project without even information the relevant authorities.

Mahat who is the Secretary to the Committee said that the committee is not there ‘to police’ government project but rather help unlock any impediment facing such projects.

“Government projects and programmes are meant to impact the lives of the people meant to benefit them. As a committee we are here to ensure that is what happens

at the end of any project and project,” Mahat said.

The senior director also stressed the need for proper public engagement through so that the priorities and opinions of the wananchi take center stage.

“The communities understand their needs and where for example a dam should be built. Don’t ignore them because those who have done so have paid a heavy price. Public participation is provided for in law and must be followed to the later,” Mahat noted.

Executive order No. 1 of 2023 mandates the State Department for Wildlife to develop a Sustainable Wildlife Biodiversity Economy in Kenya amongst other functions. Based on these legal mandates, the State Department for Wildlife with funding from the National Treasury Plans to develop a master physical plan for community eco-lodges in community conservancies in Kenya. The State Department plans to hire a consultant to undertake preparation of a model 30-bed eco-lodge physical plan including its associated infrastructure (roads network, power system and water system). The physical plan will form the basis for development of such eco-lodges in selected community conservancies in Kenya.

The preparation of the eco-lodge physical plan and associated infrastructure preparation will involve preparing drawings to show placement of eco-lodges and associated infrastructures in communities' conservancies in Kenya. The consultant will be expected to visit different conservancies in Kenya to identify the sites within the conservancies where the eco-lodges and associated infrastructures will be placed. The Kenya Kwanza Government Manifesto focuses on Bottoms-up economic transformation agenda to empower communities. Therefore, the idea of having the a physical plan for community eco-lodges is perfectly in line with this Government agenda as this will be an initial step for development of eco-lodges and associated infrastructure in conservancies. This will aim to empower local community and positively contribute to environmental conservation initiatives. It is for this reason that the State Department for Wildlife intends to support preparation of physical plan for 30 bed capacity visitors' eco-lodge in conservancies in Kenya. This will stimulate development of ecotourism activities to benefit local communities within the conservancies.

on policy and legislation, paving the way towards a brighter and more prosperous future for all Kenyans," she said.

Ms Rono said that the round table campaign which commenced on July 24, 2023, at the Prime Cabinet Secretary's offices at Kenya Railways headquarters, mark a historic event in the nation's governance.

She said that over the

course of a period of five weeks, presentations from ministries, state departments, and agencies will continue until August 28th 2023.

"This whole government approach" fosters seamless coordination and consultation with Party/Coalition Leaders in Parliament in order to align legislative initiatives with national priorities", Ms Rono asserted.

The Ps noted that at the core of the GLA roundtables

lies Executive Order No. 1 of 2023 on the Organization of the Government of the Republic of Kenya, empowering the Office of the Prime Cabinet Secretary (OPCS) to chair and co-ordinate the National Government Legislative Agenda (NGLA) across all ministries and state departments. This is a unified approach for effective governance and prioritization of national interests.

The Parliamentary Affairs PS also acknowledged

the historical challenges encountered while implementing the Government Legislative Agenda.

She cited issues arising from unco-ordinated legal reforms and separate funding for each MDA as some of the bottlenecks hampering implementation of the government legislative agenda.

To tackle these obstacles effectively, the PS noted, the GLA roundtables will incorporate continuous audits and assessments, streamlining

and optimizing future initiatives.

She noted that the roundtables transcend bureaucratic silos and facilitate collaboration, coordination, and transparency among government entities, ensuring collective efforts propel the nation towards shared goals.

"With clear priorities and a legal environment that supports sustainable growth and equitable prosperity, Kenya emerges stronger and more resilient as the government ad-

vances the BETA agenda.

Embracing a "whole government approach," Ms Rono said, the GLA roundtables represent a paradigm shift in Kenya's governance, enhanced coordination within the executive and efficient liaison to parliament foster a well-coordinated plan for the development of legislation and policy.

The Secretary Parliamentary Liaison and legislative affairs Mr. Nick Biketi said this is the first time such coordination of GLA is being done in Kenya.

## Kenya and Uganda seal SGR extension deal

Kenya and Uganda have agreed to collaborate in the construction of the Standard Gauge Railway (SGR).

In a joint communiqué signed at the Mombasa SGR terminus, Transport Cabinet Secretary, Kipchumba Murkomen and his Ugandan Counterpart General (Rtd) Katumba Wamala, said the construction will start in December this year depending on availability of funds.

The two said they were desirous of achieving a seamless railway transport from Mombasa to Kampala, to fully open-up the Northern Corridor and ensure its competitiveness.

The deal was signed after a lengthy meeting at the Mombasa Port where it was agreed that Kenya will ex-

tend the SGR line from Naivasha to Malaba, covering a distance of about 368 kilometers, while Uganda will do its part stretching 272 kilometers from the Malaba border to Kampala.

The two countries plan to raise resources from the Middle East, China and from other development partners as a team, to ensure that they start the SGR project as a team.

Murkomen said the plan was to extend the SGR line to the Democratic Republic of Congo and open-up the region for economic growth.

He said the East African Community (EAC) had agreed in 2014, to have the SGR extended to connect and open-up the region.

"We want to achieve seamless transportation of goods from Mombasa to Kampala by SGR. Kenya will

extend the SGR line from Naivasha to Malaba, while Uganda will construct the line from Malaba to Kampala," he said.

"It is of great benefit for both countries if we extend the SGR to Kampala, we are working as a team and we will ensure that goods are not stuck at the Malaba border," Murkomen said.

The two ministers said the project was undergoing a feasibility study that will inform the cost of construction.

Wamala said although Uganda had delayed the SGR project, it was now determined to implement it and achieve seamless movement of goods and services from Mombasa.

"We may have delayed but we are going to get it done. This project will also support tourism. We think it is viable," he said.

# Kenya gets boost in bid to end 'energy poverty'

The country has joined the International Energy Agency (IEA) alongside South Africa, Morocco, Egypt and Senegal as it seeks to tap all its electricity from renewable sources by 2030

Kenya is now a member of the International Energy Agency (IEA), which shapes global energy policies for sustainable development.

Only four other African countries, namely South Africa, Morocco, Egypt and Senegal, are members of the agency.

Kenya's unanimous admission as an association country was based on her sustained commitment to harnessing renewable energy, including wind, solar, hydroelectric power and geothermal for which it's a regional leader.

Other considerations were the robust energy sector with key drivers of power consumption being a growing economy and population marked by increased urbanisation.

From 6,000 gigawatts (GWh) in 2010, energy consumption grew to 12,000 GWh in 2021, the bulk of it electricity, which accounted for 60

per cent while other sources like petroleum, biomass and solar energy took 40 per cent, according to the Economic Survey 2022.

The IEA also considered Kenya's track record in implementing reforms and political will to advance energy sustainability.

Kenya has committed to 100 per cent transitioning to the use of renewable energy by 2030 by increasing power generation from clean sources.

While admitting Kenya, IEA Governing Board chairman Anders Hoffmann said Africa will be crucial in securing the future of world energy. And Kenya, in particular, will benefit the "IEA Family from deepened cooperation on energy security, access and climate issues".

The Cabinet Secretary for Energy and Petroleum, Mr Davis Chirchir, lauded the entry as a chance "to enhance our collaboration and experience in geothermal development, off-grid electrification, and access to clean cooking solutions."

"We will seek to enhance our collaboration and experience, especially in geothermal

development, off-grid electrification, and access to clean cooking solutions. We have to collectively make the world a better place by focusing on clean energy transition in the near future," he added.

The IEA, the world's leading authority on energy, was formed in 1974 to address oil supply disruptions, but over time, expanded to include sustainable energy.

Allowing entry of "emerging economies" began in 2015 and Kenya's membership has potential implications for the energy sector, economic growth and environmental sustainability.

More importantly, IEA will help Kenya in alleviating "energy poverty", which is lack of access to modern energy like electricity and clean cooking facilities due to limited reach, wanting infrastructure, high cost of grid expansion to remote regions and inadequate financing.

"Energy poverty" is rampant among rural and urban poor for whom it compromises quality of life and socio-economic progress.

"Energy poverty" has profound



implications: it restricts educational opportunities, hampers productivity and income-generating activities thus worsening poverty. Reliance on traditional, polluting fuels for cooking also contributes to increase in respiratory diseases.

So, how will IEA membership help Kenya address "energy poverty"?

Well, Kenya already has the Last Mile Connectivity Programme, which started in 2014 and prioritises electricity connection to underserved areas.

The project helped connect about 75 per

cent of the population to the national grid in five years to 2019, making Kenya record "one of the fastest increases in electrification rates within sub-Saharan Africa," notes IEA's Kenya Energy Outlook 2019.

The World Bank further notes that the Last Mile Project improved quality of life for millions of Kenyans as it powered businesses, created jobs, lit homes and appliances.

It not only made life more comfortable, but also productive as households connected to the grid increased their incomes by an average of 10 per cent. Electricity also powers

schools enabling night preps and access to online resources with improved educational outcomes comprising increased enrollment rates, particularly among girls, according to a study by the Kenya Institute for Public Policy Research and Analysis (Kippra).

Kenya is also part of the Sustainable Energy for All (SEforALL), a global programme for inclusive transition to affordable, reliable and clean energy by 2030.

SEforALL, which is key in addressing energy poverty, has impacted on environmental sustainability. By reducing use of kerosene and other fossil fuels, it helps to improve air quality, besides cutting greenhouse gas emissions, which also impact on health by decreasing the number of respiratory infections like pneumonia, according to another study by the University of Nairobi.

The Kenya National Electrification Strategy (KNES) was launched in 2018 to achieve universal access to electricity by 2022 using four main pillars: Grid extension in rural and peri-urban areas, off-grid solutions through solar home systems and mini-grids, renewable energy like solar and wind power and capacity building to implement KNES.

Key targets of the KNES include connecting five million new households to the grid by 2022, providing off-grid electricity solutions to two million households and increasing share of renewable energy in the electricity mix to 30 per cent by 2030.

There is also the Kenya Off-Grid Solar Market Development, a World Bank-funded project for use of off-grid solar systems and the Kenya Renewable Energy Project funded by the European Union-funded to support renewable energy projects in Kenya.

IEA membership will provide Kenya with its global network and partnerships, which can facilitate access to financial resources and public-private partnerships like the Global Off-Grid Lighting Association and the Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Partnership.

IEA membership will also provide the country with more knowledge, expertise, technical assistance, research and strategies implemented to combat effective policies, regulations and programmes to address specific energy poverty challenges related to energy systems and infrastructure.

Kenya is hosting the African Climate Action Summit this September in Nairobi, and the IEA is assisting with data and statistics, capacity building and clean energy transition policies.

Kenya can also use IEA as a platform to advocate for energy poverty reduction on an international scale through policymakers.

Enhanced visibility and credibility (and Kenya will co-host the IEA's 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Global Conference on Energy Efficiency next year) can also attract investment in energy infrastructure, renewable energy projects - like off-grid solar home systems and mini-grids to marginalised communities.

Another thing, IEA members have access to critical data and analysis on global energy markets, energy security and emerging technologies, which is vital for policymakers when making decisions. ■

"Our technical teams blocked the source IP address where requests were emanating from. For clarity, both the privacy and security of data were not compromised," said Mr Owalo.

He added that relevant government agencies were on high alert and had

enhanced the security of the e-Citizen portal and all government service sites. "We want to assure Kenyans that the government has put in place remedial measures to address the current challenge plus a long-term risk mitigation framework to ensure sustainable data privacy and security," he said. Besides government websites, banks, utility firms and mobile money service providers were among institutions that were targeted cyber attackers. ■

## Kenya in talks with South Korea on vaccine production

KENYA HAS STRENGTHENED its partnership with South Korea as it seeks to be the leading vaccine manufacturer in Africa.

Health CS Susan Nakhumicha said during a visit to the International

Vaccine Institute (IVI) in South Korea last week, that the two countries are cooperating in the production of vaccines, as she emphasized the government's commitment to promote preventive and promotive health measures.

Ms Nakhumicha appreciated the existing collaboration between Kenya and South Korea on Biovax, a Kenyan institution whose mandate is to manufacture, package and commercialise specialised health products and technologies including vaccines.

"We recognize the significant role that vaccines play in public health, and as a nation, we are determined to take steps towards manufacturing our own vaccines," CS Nakhumicha stated Kenya aims to become the regional hub for specialised health products, particularly vaccines for childhood, and maternal immunisation. ■





**What about developing and maintaining a Database of National Qualifications?**

KNQA, being the custodian of national qualifications, has developed a National Qualifications Management Information System (NAQMIS) that allows for the registration of Qualifications Awarding Institutions (QAIs). Their qualifications has been developed and operationalised. This provides a central database for all qualifications from Basic, TVET and university sectors and it will aid in identification of fraudulent certificates.

**How about the Kenya National Learners Records Database?**

The Kenya National Learners Records Database (KNLRD) has been established and registration of learners is on course. In establishing and maintaining the KNLRD, the authority works towards being the custodian of all qualifications conferred in the country, and as a result, securing valid qualifications and eliminating fraudulent qualifications. The KNLRD will provide a central database of all the graduates, with information on qualifications awarded, the Qualification Awarding Institution, and the level descriptor of the acquired qualification according to the KNQF.

**What is the authority's relationship with other stakeholders in the education sector?**

The authority continues to provide advisory, enhance capacity building and sensitisation of stakeholders to ensure that they all understand their role in implementation of the national qualification's framework. In the international space, the authority is aligning the Kenyan qualifications awarding process with those of other regions, including Southern Africa Development Cooperation (SADC), Inter Governmental Authority on Development (IGAD), The East Africa Community (EAC) and entire continent. KNQA is an active member of the African Quality Assurance Network and AQVN. KNQA is currently involved in development and implementation of the Africa Continental Qualifications Framework (ACQF) and IGAD Qualifications Framework (IGADQF), which will allow for transparency of qualifications and mutual trust between qualifications frameworks for lifelong learning in Africa.

**Any legislative and policy gaps?**

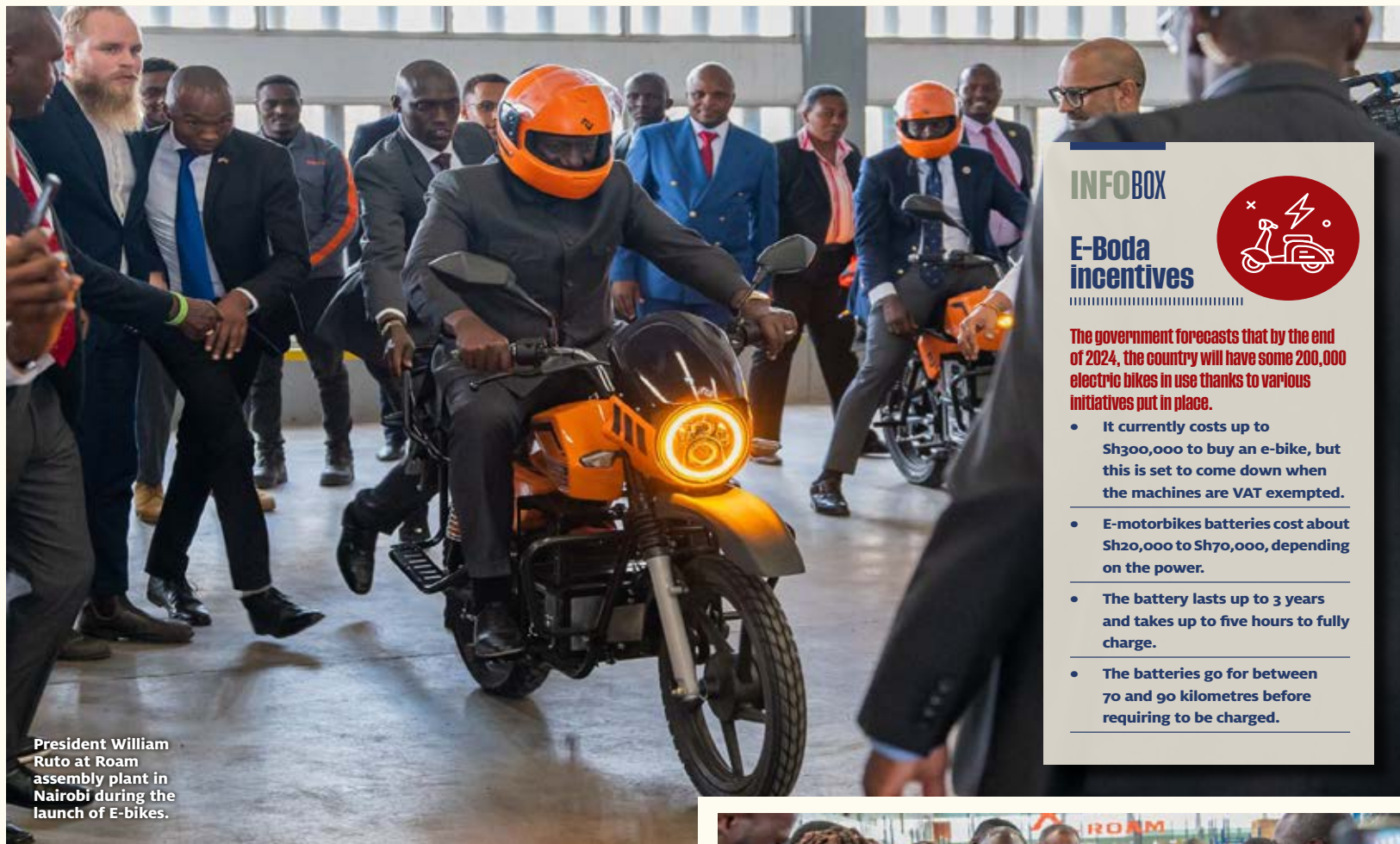
Yes, there are some gaps. The authority is currently implementing the framework, however, with the introduction of Competency Based Curriculum (CBC) in our education and training, this has occasioned various legislative and policy gaps in the laws. For instance, the Kenya National Qualifications Framework (KNQF) does not have a clear pathway to accommodate junior secondary school learners necessitating the need to review our KNQF Act, No. 22 of 2014. There is also lack of a policy to enforce full operationalisation of Section 5 (2) of the KNQF Act No. 22 of 2014.

**Does KNQA take part in the development of all curriculums for tertiary institutions in Kenya?**

In consultation with stakeholders, relevant institutions and agencies, KNQA has developed level descriptors and KNQF levels to support trainers in designing and packaging curriculum. KNQA also participates in providing advisory during curriculum development, standards for curriculum development and registering of the curriculum on the KNQF register of national qualification.

**What is the difference between aligning and validation of certificates?**

Alignment is the process used to evaluate or place qualifications against KNQF, while validation is evidence that qualifications are lawfully obtained and issued by a qualification awarding institution in conformity with section 5(1) and 30 of the KNQF Act No. 22 of 2014.

**E-Boda incentives**

The government forecasts that by the end of 2024, the country will have some 200,000 electric bikes in use thanks to various initiatives put in place.

- It currently costs up to Sh300,000 to buy an e-bike, but this is set to come down when the machines are VAT exempted.
- E-motorbikes batteries cost about Sh20,000 to Sh70,000, depending on the power.
- The battery lasts up to 3 years and takes up to five hours to fully charge.
- The batteries go for between 70 and 90 kilometres before requiring to be charged.

**States rides on e-bikes in quest to revamp boda boda industry**

Government is targeting to have 200,000 e-boda bodas in use by the end of 2024 in what is expected to transform transport sector

It is just a matter of time before the boda boda sector is transformed into a sustainable transport industry, as both the private sector and the government take steps to enhance the use of electric motorcycles.

Roam, a Swedish e-mobility firm, last week inaugurated East Africa's largest electric motorcycle assembly plant, in a ceremony

presided over by President William Ruto. The 50,000-capacity electric motorcycle plant puts Kenya in a good position to achieve zero emission in the sector that employs thousands of youth, with the machines spread in every corner of the country.

The launch of the plant falls in line with President Ruto's promise on June 1 that the government will work with other players to offer affordable electric motorbikes to boda boda operators.

"Our boda boda industry is about to experience inclusive transformation through the introduction of more efficient, affordable and clean vehicles. With this intervention, owning and operating a boda boda will become affordable, secure and profitable,"

President Ruto said in his Madaraka Day speech in Embu. During the launch, he noted that the motorcycle assembly plant would help Kenya move closer to attaining its goal of having zero emissions.

"This facility showcases Kenya's potential as a leader in clean transportation solutions in Africa. This initiative aligns perfectly with our national goals to reduce carbon emissions and promote clean energy alternatives," he said.

Adding that, the assembly plant will not only contribute to the country's environmental goals, but also foster economic growth by creating job opportunities and nurturing local talent in the automotive industry.

The government programme to transform the boda boda industry is expected to be

launched in September and would certainly rely on private players like Roam.

So, how would the e-boda bodas be a game-changer? First, they cut the cost of operation by up to 70 per cent, according to Albin Wilson, the Roam Electric Chief Product and Strategy Officer.

And the fact that one can charge the motorbikes' battery at home and ride for up to 90km makes the business sustainable.

The government has reduced several taxes on electric bicycles, including 16 per cent VAT, to make the machines affordable.

Spare parts, the chargeable battery as well as charging equipment, are exempted from VAT while users are expected to pay a lower electricity tariff at charging stations. ■

**Huduma Centres to start offering immigration services**

## KALRO scientists develop integrated approach to contain Fall Armyworms

Scientists from the Kenya Agricultural and Livestock Research Organisation (KALRO) have developed an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) to contain the invasive Fall Armyworm (FAW) in the country.

The pest poses a grave challenge to the economy, environment and food security in the country by causing crop damage, financial losses and subsequently increased the over-reliance on imports to bridge the domestic demand.

However, thanks to Government intervention, farmers have been trained by relevant agricultural agencies like KALRO on the latest environmentally friendly techniques to manage and control the spread of the fall armyworm.

Researchers from KALRO say through various measures under the IPM, farmers can access information from the surveillance and monitoring data on the trends of the invasion after undergoing training on recommended pesticides.

Led by Dr. Muuo Kasina, a pest specialist from KALRO, the researchers say, the IPM concept is a holistic approach that relies on a combination of various strategies to control pests, including biological, cultural, physi-

cal, and chemical methods and the new intervention is more sustainable and environmentally friendly

“The programme started with scouting, crop care, biological control- Dr Kasina

compared to solely relying on chemical pesticides.

Dr. Kasina, told KNA that the fall army worm has been a menace in the country since 2017 when the first major invasion was reported in maize plantations.

“The threat of fall army-worm invasion has caused farmers to grow maize with a lot of pesticides to avert attacks since without treating it can result to 100 per cent

crop failure,” she KALRO scientist said.

Kasina said in order to address the food security challenge posed by the pest, stakeholders in agriculture in 2019, through a partnership with Government of South Korea in an initiative dubbed KAFACI, in collaboration with Scientists from 14 African countries, developed the IPM programme to contain the menace.

“IPM incorporates different skills for crop care, good health practices, and nutrition for the plant and also considers surveillance reports on invasion trends through scouting and monitoring the buildup of the pest spread,” he said.

He explained that the five-year programme and research that stretched from 2020 to December 2022 was piloted in Machakos where the test of the IPM posted impressive results.

“The programme started with scouting, crop care, monitoring, and an increase in biological control. Although some biological control products against the pest could cause diseases in insects, it has no effect on humans,” he said.

Kasina expressed fears that preliminary findings indicated that the insect could easily develop resistance with the use of synthetic pesticides.

### Government promotes youth agribusiness to tackle unemployment

The Government will continue implementing policies and regulations to encourage the youth to venture into agribusiness as an alternative to formal employment.

This is through the establishment of private-public partnerships in which youths are being incentivized to take up agriculture which holds enormous potential to create jobs and spur the country's economic transformation.

The Cabinet Secretary for Cooperatives and Micro, Small and Medium Enterprise (MSMEs) Development Mr Simon Chelugui noted that with an estimated one million Kenyan youth joining the job market annually and limited white-collar jobs, smart agriculture is the next go-to opportunity. With the skyrocketing food prices, Mr Chelugui challenged the youth to venture into the sector and aid in incorporation of modern and sustainable practices aimed at reducing production costs.

“Most youth are tech savvy. It is a call to them to use their knowledge to address the challenges in the agriculture sector to optimize production and revolutionize the global food chains,” he said.

The Cabinet Secretary urged polytechnics, Technical Vocational Education Training (TVETs) and universities to establish agribusiness incubation and training centres to provide a platform for young entrepreneurs to acquire technical skills.

“To ensure youth-led MSMEs are not left behind in the bottom-up economic transformation, there is a need to foster an environment of innovation by establishing research centres and innovation hubs dedicated to youth entrepreneurs. Sector-wide skills strategy should ensure alignment of technical and capacity building support,” the Cabinet Secretary noted.

Indicating that the government has initiated various programs that create an enabling environment for youth in agribusiness, Mr Chelugui said Kenya's education system should encourage the youths to do agriculture.

“We should stop training our youth on theories and instead focus on practical and research that can be fully and easily implemented to help give an opportunity to every youth. By Jane Ngugi and Dennis Rasto (KNA)

### Bumper wheat harvest as farmers expect 1.2m bags

Wheat farmers in the country have received a very heavy harvest and the government is expecting slightly over 1.2 million bags from across the country.

State Department for Crop Development Principal Secretary (PS) Kello Harsama said the government has set the buying price for wheat to Sh5,200 for a bag of grade one wheat and Sh5,100 for grade two.

Speaking during the media launch of the African Conference on Agricultural Technologies (ACAT), the PS said under a programme which was agreed upon between the Treasury, the Ministry of Agriculture, Cereal Millers Association and wheat farmers, the Cereal Millers Association is supposed to mop up the entire local production of wheat before they are allowed to import.

“Under this programme, the importation duty is reduced from 35 per cent to 10 per cent and the local millers have agreed that they will first buy the whole harvest locally thus providing a good market for the farmers,” Harsama said.

He explained that after the millers have mopped up the local wheat, they will be allowed to import another two million bags from other countries to satisfy local demand of about three million bags per year.

“The developments between Russia and Ukraine where the exportation of wheat from Ukraine has been stopped is worrying because we used to get almost our entire wheat supply from Ukraine and those who are importing the wheat have to ensure that they get a sustainable supply of wheat from alternative sources,” the PS explained.

Harsama added that they also expect a good maize harvest of about 44 million bags, which is sufficient to feed the country.

“We have also started receiving maize from Tanzania and Uganda as we wait for our maize to mature. Due to that, the price of a bag of maize has decreased from Sh6,000 to Sh5,000 and we expect a significant decrease in the price of unga this week,” he said.

## World Bank allocates Sh. 105m to manage water resources in Nile region

The World Bank has allocated Sh105 million towards the implementation of the Nile Co-operation Climate Resistance Project.

The implementation will be undertaken in all seven East African partner states namely Kenya, Burundi, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda, the Democratic Republic of Congo, and Southern Sudan.

Lake Victoria Basin Commission Deputy Executive Secretary Eng. Colletha Ruhanya confirmed that the

bank has already committed to support the initiative whose aim is to improve mechanisms for cooperation on water resources management and development in the Nile Basin.

Eng. Ruhanya said through the funding, the commission will implement water quality in Lake Victoria sub-basin and policy harmonization and develop a strategy and action plan.

She said, “We appreciate the great support of the World Bank coming at a time a huge population of people living within the Nile Basin is facing major prob-

lems. This funding will go a long way in sorting out the existing challenges.”

Eng. Ruhanya said the activities will be covered in all the seven Nile Equatorial Lakes countries and the East African partner states.

She said the overall objective of the activity will be to harmonize and strengthen water quality policies that govern the sub-basin countries.

In addition, Eng. Ruhanya said the commission is in discussion with the World Bank on maritime issues and remote sensing for water quality and Lake

water level monitoring.

“The permanent secretaries from the seven partner states have committed to ensuring that they mobilize resources that will help in the smooth implementation of these projects,” she said.

The Nile Basin has been facing serious threats among them deforestation, overgrazing, and soil erosion due to poor agricultural practices within the lake catchment.

Lake Victoria, which is the second largest freshwater in the world, is also faced with pollution threatening both human and aquatic life.
