The Judiciary, through the Ajira Digital Program, has successfully digitalized over 400 court stations, generating over 2,000 job opportunities for the youth as part of its digitalization pilot program.

Eng. John Tanui, the Permanent Secretary for ICT and Digital Economy, highlighted that this digitalization initiative has significantly enhanced efficiency

in public service delivery, providing a blueprint for national digitalization and opportunities for Public-Private Partnerships.

Speaking at a Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs) Digitalization Workshop held in Nairobi, PS Tanui, represented by ICT Deputy Director Ms. Jane Otoko, emphasized the government's commitment

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State to build 100 mega dams, reservoirs for stormwater harvesting

The Government plans to construct 100 mega dams and another 1,000 small water reservoirs as one way of harvesting stormwater.

Water, Sanitation, and Irrigation Cabinet Secretary Zachary Njeru says seven of the dams will be built in the Central region to cushion the area

against water scarcity during the dry season.

The CS, who was speaking in Nyeri ahead of a planned tour of various water projects in the county, said the government is partnering with both donors and international lenders to help in funding the ambitious program which has already been sanctioned by the Cabinet.

"The Government is committed to setting up water projects

which will mainly include dams. In this region (Central), we have about seven major dams that the government is committed to building and so we are sourcing for funds", said Njeru.

"As a government we are committed to ensuring rainwater does not cause havoc. The other day the Cabinet passed (a resolution) that the Ministry (of Water) come up with 100 mega dams and

1,000 smaller dams to ensure that we can harvest rainwater," Njeru said.

His sentiments come at a time when Kenya is confronted with devastating floods from the ongoing El Nino rains that have seen more than 100 people lose their lives and another 189,000 displaced from their homes.

Among the worst affected counties include

Tana River, Garissa, Mandera and Wajir that have seen hundreds of families cut off from the rest of the country after raging floods destroyed major roads, bridges and destroyed critical infrastructures like markets and communication installations.

The National El Nino Emergency and Disaster Response Command Center chaired by Interior PS Raymond Omollo listed Isiolo, Kwale, Homa Bay, Makueni, Tharaka Nithi, Lamu, Taita Taveta, Meru and Kisumu counties among areas likely to experience flooding.

To address the looming disaster, the PS said the Government has set up an information desk at Nyayo house to receive and respond to any emergency that may arise from the ongoing rains.

Njeru also said the Government is working with County Governments to address the flooding menace including assessing the extent of damage to existing water projects that have been destroyed by the

floods.

Njeru cited Garissa as one of the counties that has borne the brunt of destruction in terms of the number of bore holes that have been destroyed and said every effort is being taken to make sure they are rehabilitated once the rains subside.

"There are several counties that have been affected and we had so many boreholes that have already been submerged like in Garissa where our water pumping infrastructure has been submerged. So, we are working to see that

we work with the county government to rehabilitate the boreholes and other water infrastructure that have caused havoc in these areas," he added.

"We are working in close collaboration with all development partners to ensure that what the government has planned to do is achieved.

This is a collective responsibility between the government, the private sector, and development partners," the CS stated.

Also present were Nyeri Governor, Mutahi Kahiga.

to easy access, faster, and more convenient services through digitalization.

"The Judiciary has successfully digitalized its services through the Ajira Digital Program run by this Ministry. This not only enhances their public service delivery but also creates employment opportunities for young people in the online job space," said Eng. Tanui.

Over the years, the government has employed the Performance Contracting framework as a key tool to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of service delivery in the Public Service.

"For this purpose, the indicator 'Digitalization of Government Services' was introduced in the 20th cycle of performance contracting guidelines for the Financial Year 2023/2024," stated Eng. Tanui.

The PS pointed out that a committee is expected to create an enabling environment for a successful digitalization process, including establishing the

status of automation and digitization, providing a roadmap for digitalization, and ensuring a sustainable environment for the availability and utilization of digital services.

"The State Department for ICT and Digital Economy has been identified as a lead agency to assist in the operationalization of this performance indicator. The mandate of the committee may go further to oversee, track, and provide technical assistance to MDAs on the implementation of this indicator," said Tanui.

He further emphasized the need to train job seekers and young people entering the labor market to seize the opportunities linked to the creation of 25 million new jobs. The Ministry, in collaboration

with the National Government Constituency Development Fund, has been implementing the Constituency Innovation Hubs Project integrated with the Jitume Digital Hubs to promote sustainability.

Mr. Josphat Karanja, Judiciary ICT Deputy Director, noted that the digitization pilot program resulted in efficiency in court proceedings production, improved turnaround time in preparing records of appeals. "The young people involved in offering these digital services have become marketable in the digital space, accessing international and local transcription work opportunities," added Karanja.

As the first program of its kind in Africa, the Judiciary's digitization pilot program aimed to test whether the public sector could be a demand provider, creating substantial work for young people while using digital transformation to improve processes and service delivery, according to Karanja.

National Disaster Operations Center established to centralize flood response efforts

The government has established a Flood Emergency Multi-Agency team tasked with assessing and managing the current situation in the country resulting from heavy rains.

The National Disaster Operations Center (NDOC), under the Ministry of Interior and National Administration, was inaugurated to centralize and coordinate all government actions in responding to and managing the flood disaster.

In a media briefing, Interior and National Administration Principal Secretary Dr. Raymond Omollo stated that a Command Center for Emergency Response Communication and Information has since been established at Nyayo House, Nairobi, to host various relevant agencies and stakeholders, documenting and reporting all flood disaster information from across the country.

He added that the center will also provide early warning information, flood

alerts, flood preparedness, safety and emergency response information to stakeholders and the public, mobilize resources, and combine capacities

The Center will coordinate interventions, including rescue operations—Omollo

at all levels of government to respond to crises. At the same time, it will liaise with agencies in national and county governments to better respond to emergencies.

“The Center will coordinate interventions, including rescue operations, humanitarian aid, and infrastructure restoration to manage the different situations across the country,” the PS stressed.

Presently, Dr. Omollo revealed that five disciplined forces have been co-opted, including the Kenya Defense Forces, the National Police Service, the Kenya Wildlife Service, the Kenya Coast Guard, and the National Youth Service.

Further, he presented the ministries and their agencies which are also working in an all-government approach including the Ministries of Defence, Interior and National Administration, Roads and Transport, Health, Education, Water, Sanitation and Irrigation, Lands, Public Works, Housing and Urban Development, Agriculture and Livestock as well as Energy and Petroleum.

He additionally announced that the Council of Governors as well as the Kenya Red Cross Society and other humanitarian agencies have similarly been sanctioned to augment emergency response and interventions being implemented including road and aerial support in delivering essential aid.

“At the county level, Disaster Response and Security Committees have also been activated to coordinate interventions and address disaster situations in respective areas,” Dr. Omollo reiterated.

Pursuant to the provision of **KS 1515:2000 - Kenya Standard Code of Practice for Inspection of Road Vehicles, and Legal Notice No.78 of 28th April 2020 - The Verification of Conformity to Kenya Standards of Imports Order**, we wish to notify all importers of used / second-hand motor vehicles including returning residents, diplomatic staff and the general public that in observance of **clause 2.5 of KS 1515:2000** on the eight (8) year age limit requirement, only Right Hand Drive (RHD) motor vehicles whose Year of First Registration is from **1st January 2017** and later shall be allowed into the country effective **1st January 2024**.

Vehicles exported to Kenya shall be expected to comply with **KS 1515:2000 – Kenya Code of Practice for Inspection of Road Vehicles** while vehicles from countries where KEBS has an inspection agency (i.e. **Japan, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, Thailand, Singapore, and South Africa**) shall be accompanied with a Certificate of Roadworthiness (CoR) issued by **Quality Inspection Services Inc. Japan (QISJ)** which is an inspection company contracted by KEBS.

Further, the Certificates of Roadworthiness for vehicles whose year of first registration is 2016 will not be valid after **31st December 2023**. All vehicles issued with such certificates must arrive at the Port of Destination / Entry by **31st December 2023**. **Any vehicle registered in 2016 or earlier, arriving after 31st December 2023 will be deemed not compliant with KS 1515:2000 and shall be rejected at the importer's expense.**

Thousands of jobs up for grabs as Russian Federation opens doors for Kenyan workers

Thousands of Kenyan job seekers may soon have opportunities for employment in the Russian Federation's labor market, according to an announcement by the Ambassador of the Russian Federation to Kenya, Ambassador Dimitry Maksimychev.

This follows productive discussions with officials from the Kenyan Ministry of Labour, led by the Principal Secretary, State Department for Labour and Skills Development, Mr. Shadrack Mwadime.

Ambassador Maksimychev revealed that Russia is actively seeking to fill millions of job vacancies in its labor market and sees Kenya as a potential source of skilled and unskilled labor. He emphasized the importance of leveraging the strong diplomatic relations between the two countries to provide employment opportunities for Kenyan workers.

"Russia has a high demand for both skilled and unskilled labor, and Kenya

should take advantage of the existing cordial relations between the two countries to secure jobs for its unemployed workers," stated Ambassador Maksimychev during discussions with Kenyan officials. He led a team of investors to the Department to explore further collaboration on labor migration from Kenya to Russia.

The meeting was organ-

ized by the President of the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Dr. Eric Ruto who was also present during the discussions held at the NSSF building.

According to Amb. Maksimychev, there are scores of companies and manufacturing industries in his country that are currently scouting for workers from the Africa region-which

remains a big source of migrant workers.

"With a bulging age of

young unemployed youth, Kenya is well poised and should take the lead in grabbing these opportunities not only in the Russian Federation but also those emerging in other European labour markets.

The investors disclosed that there are hundreds of jobs up for grabs, mostly unskilled labour in online delivery sector and fish production industries in Russia.

"We have demands from fish companies requesting workers who can clean fish in the processing factories."

The Ambassador promised to fast-track the processing to Moscow of any initiative between the two governments that will assist in facilitating smooth labour migration to the Russian Federation.

PS Mwadime emphasized the important contribution played by migrant workers in the development of the host country and country of origin.

He said the Government recognizes Labour mobility as having a significant role and high potential to yield high benefits as remittances which will contribute to the foreign exchange for the country.

"Besides, migration is and will remain a key driver of integration not only within our region but also in Africa and the world as a whole", he noted.

He said the Government recognizes the youth as an important resource that should be exploited for the economic good of the country by facilitating them to engage in gainful activities that will create wealth.

"We are determined to ride on this opportunity for the good of the country", Mwadime said.

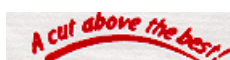

IMPLEMENTATION OF COMMERCIAL MIRAA TRANSPORTERS LICENCE

The Crops (Miraa) Regulations, 2023 was published on 5th April 2023 and it spells out the regulatory framework for the Miraa sub sector in Kenya. The regulation contains various provisions that are geared towards trade facilitation through registration and licensing of value chain players. The miraa sub-sector has improved tremendously in particular after the re-opening of the Somalia Market in July, 2022.

The implementation of the regulations began immediately after the publication of the regulations in April, 2023. The Authority appreciates the full compliance witnessed across the value chain including the miraa exporters and importers. The funds were distributed across constituencies, including Naivasha, Gilgil, Rongai, Subukia, Bahati, Nakuru Town East, Nakuru Town West, Njoro, and Kuresoi South.

Principal Secretary for the State Department of Micro Small and Medium Enterprises Development, Ms Susan Auma Mang'eni, alongside Members of Parliament serving as patrons of the Fund, oversaw the cheque issuance in Naivasha and Bahati constituencies.

The collaborative effort aimed to support local groups and entrepreneurs in their diverse initiatives.

Nakuru County has witnessed significant financial inflow from the Uwezo

the fund has grown to Shs 380,476,000. This substantial amount has been disbursed to 4,061 groups, making a tangible impact on 55,547 individuals, including women, youth, and persons with disabilities.

The Principal Secretary, joined by Naivasha MP Jane Kihara and Gilgil MP Martha Wangari, issued cheques totaling Shs 5,150,000 at Xavier Catholic Church in Naivasha. This

initiative underscores the commitment to ensuring that allocated funds reach and uplift the intended beneficiaries, contributing to sustainable local development.

In total, 23 groups made up of 20 women groups and 3 youth groups benefited from Uwezo funds, five women groups benefiting from the Fund at various levels as Endeleva or Refinanced Sh 1,340,000 and 18 groups Sh 1,650,000 for the first time known as Wezesha.

The beneficiaries highlighted success stories in particular, the Kahuruko Bodaboda chairman said the group started when they were young in 2010 and 2017 after guidance from the MP, they registered and have been benefitting from Uwezo the Fund.

Airstrip Youth Group started in 2009 and were funded with Sh.150,000 which they invested in table banking and in their second phase they were advanced with Sh. 200,000 which they have invested in various individual businesses including vegetable vending and kiosk business. "Personally I am a mechanic but now I am running a spare parts shop" said the chairperson.

ILO, counties unite to confront escalating child labour, exploitation

The International Labour Organization (ILO) has forged partnerships with five county governments grappling with a surge in child labour and sexual exploitation, aiming to expedite crucial interventions and policies to tackle the menace.

ILO has identified the counties of Kajiado, Nairobi, Bungoma, Mombasa, and Kwale as areas where instances of child labor and sexual exploitation have recently escalated, possibly linked to the unique economic characteristics of these regions.

For example, coastal counties such as Kwale and Mombasa are witnessing an increase in cases of children forced into commercial sex exploitation, and early marriages.

Conversely, agricultural-rich counties like Bungoma are experiencing a rise in child exploitation within sectors such as agriculture, quarrying, tea harvesting, tree growing, leading to elevated high

school dropout rates.

Grace Banya, the ILO Programme Manager, noted that Kajiado has been significantly affected due to the high prevalence of children involved in cross-border cattle herding.

Banya explained that ILO has intensified its collaborations with the affected counties to implement crucial interventions that address these challenges, including influencing the enactment of child-friendly protection laws.

ILO, Banya said is also influencing county budgetary processes to channel adequate funds towards enactment of laws, advocacy campaigns and ensuring enforcement measures to end child labor.

"Enactment and enforcement of child protection laws in the country is key towards achievement of Sustainable Development Goal Target Eight of eradicating child labour," Banya said during a press briefing in Naivasha.

KECOBO boss pushes for unity in collection efforts for better artist royalty

BY BERNARD MUNYAO AND PURITY MUGO (KNA)

The Kenya Copyright Board (KECOBO) has committed to consolidating the three bodies responsible for collecting royalties on behalf of artists, aiming to enhance efficiency and proper management of the sector.

Joshua Kutuny, KECOBO Chairman, emphasized the need for merging the three Collective Management Organizations (CMOs) - Kenya Association of Music Producers (KAMP), Music Copyright Society of Kenya (MCSK), and Performers Right Society of Kenya (PRISCK). This consolidation is envisioned to streamline operations and benefit artists across the board.

Kutuny highlighted concerns about the high operational costs of the three CMOs, asserting that these costs are significantly impacting artists' earnings. He emphasized the importance of working collec-

tively to reduce operational expenses, ultimately increasing returns for artists and musicians.

During a sensitization forum with artists and musicians in Murang'a,

KECOBO will partner with bodies which issue licenses to businesses that consume music

Kutuny mentioned that royalty collection from artists reached Sh650 million in 2019 but dropped to Sh150 million last year.

Proper management of the music industry, he emphasized, is crucial for collecting royalties from all music consumers and ensuring direct disbursement to artists.

"We are exploring various ways to see the music industry is well managed as there is also a proposal

that the three bodies are collapsed into one organ to handle collections on behalf of the artists to help them celebrate their work," Kutuny stated. He observed that currently poor coordination and management of CMOs has made those who play or consume music in various areas walk away without paying royalties.

"KECOBO seeks to partner with various entities including county governments through the Council of Governors, the NTSA among other bodies which issue licenses to businesses that consume music.

"This will ensure businesspeople, especially those who operate restaurants, eateries, and public service vehicles, get KECOBO permits before they are issued with operating licenses. This will increase earnings for music to more than Sh1 billion annually," the Chairman explained.

The money raised, Kutuny said, will be shared among the musicians and artists based on their performance.

The chairman further noted that KECOBO will work to ensure artists are paid directly by companies instead of through intermediaries to avoid exploitation.

Kenya and India join forces to grow textile sector through technology sharing

Kenya is set to boost its textile industry through a collaborative effort with India, focusing on the exchange of technological advancements.

In a bid to support the government's textile revival strategy, the India International Textile Machinery Exhibitions (ITME) Society hosted a textile technology exhibition from November 30th to December 2nd, 2023.

During the exhibition's opening ceremony in Meru town, State Department for Industry Principal Secretary (PS) Dr. Juma Mukhwana expressed the government's commitment to ensuring the textile sector generates maximum employment and addresses unemployment issues.

The collaboration aims to leverage India's expertise in textile technology to propel Kenya's apparel and textile sector.

"India, as a leading tex-

tile technology producer, will make Kenya a gateway for these technologies in Africa. The partnership is crucial for the revival of our vibrant textile sector," said Dr. Mukhwana.

He highlighted the historical significance of Kenya's textile industry, which faced challenges and closures post-1990.

Dr. Mukhwana provided updates on the growth of cotton acreage, operational ginneries, and increased buying prices to incentivize cotton farming. He emphasized ongoing negotiations for the extension of the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGO).

The PS revealed significant allocations, including Sh100 million for cotton seed purchases and Sh100 million from the Ministry of Agriculture, with 24 counties contributing Sh400 million for cotton cultivation. These efforts aim to reach the target of 100,000 acres of cotton.

The Commission on Administrative Justice (CAJ) is in the process of developing an app to simplify the public complaint filing process regarding unsatisfactory services in the public sector, allowing individuals to lodge complaints from the convenience of

their homes.

Commission Chairperson, Ms. Florence Kajju, announced that the Commission is collaborating with the Ministry of Public Service to enhance the complaints management system. The platform, named PASHA Ombudsman, will be hosted by the Commission on Administrative Justice.

Speaking at the Fourth

Huduma Ombudsman Award ceremony at KICC, Ms. Kajju highlighted the Commission's accomplishments since its establishment in 2011, noting substantial progress in complaint resolution, efficiency improvement, and the cultivation of a responsive culture within the public service. Over 920,000 complaints have been resolved

to date. Kajju emphasized that the Commission has played a crucial role in restructuring complaint-handling mechanisms within Government Ministries, Departments, Agencies, and County Governments (MDACs). This has been achieved through capacity-building seminars for public officers. Through the Wajibika initiative, MDAs will now be held accountable to the public. The Commission Chair reiterated the Office of the Ombudsman's mission to promote good govern-

ance, uphold the rule of law, and ensure accountability in the management of public affairs. She cited an instance of reported callous behavior by public servants, where a patient requiring surgery overseas was granted a passport while the donor was denied.

She commended public officers who have demonstrated diligence in their duties and cautioned them against dropping the ball adding that "through their exemplary service, their efforts will be appreciated".

PPB lauds Africa for ratifying formation of African Medicines Agency

The Pharmacy and Poisons Board (PPB) has hailed African countries for their decision to ratify the formation of an African Medicine Agency (AMA) which will ensure that their citizenry have access to quality, safe, and efficacious health products. The CEO Dr. Fred Siyoi noted that the decision to ratify the formation of an African Medicines Agency (AMA) will boost health product integrity, regional integration and align with the objectives of the Kenya Vision 2030.

Siyoi added that the ratification will also align with the Kenya National Health Policy and the Kenya Health Sector Strategic Plan besides helping Kenya to realize the objectives of the Kenya National Pharmaceutical Policy (KNPP).

Dr. Siyoi said this in a speech read on his behalf by Dr. Fred Ochieng, the Director of Pharmacy Practice at the PPB during celebrations to commemorate the ratification of the treaty establishing the African Medicines Agency (AMA) at a Nairobi hotel.

He said the AMA Treaty, which was initially adopted in February 2019 with a vision to ensure access to essential medical products and health technologies for all Africans, came into force in November 2021 following ratification by fifteen countries through their national parliaments.

The PPB CEO consequently emphasized that the operationalization of the AMA Treaty will stimulate local pharmaceutical manufacturing, eliminate duplication, ensure efficient resource utilization, and ultimately enhance access to safe and



Representatives from the Parliamentary Health Committee, PATH, USAID, United States Pharmacopeia PQM+, CHReAd Kenya, the Kenya Federation of Pharmaceutical Manufacturers (FKPM), and the Kenya Association of Pharmaceutical Industry (KAPI) convened to celebrate the ratification of the African Medicines Agency (AMA) treaty

efficient health products.

He underscored AMA's role in providing guidance to streamline and augment efforts of the Regional Economic Communities (RECs) and partner states through their National Regulatory Authorities and fostering regulatory framework harmonization.

Besides catalyzing growth

in vital health sectors, Dr. Siyoi underlined AMA's role in enhancing Kenya's Clinical Trials ecosystem, particularly in response to challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

He stressed the importance of strengthening manufacturing industries to meet global standards, regulating complex molecules such as

biotherapeutics, traditional medicines, medical devices, diagnostics, and ensuring the safety of health products in the continent.

He said AMA is poised to significantly contribute to the enhanced economic integration of the African continent.

"With the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) in effect since June 2020, AMA's implementation will further streamline health product registration processes, reducing fragmentation, and shortening timelines, thereby fostering increased trade and investment opportunities in the continent," the CEO noted.

On Kenya's pharmaceutical landscape, Dr. Siyoi noted that while the country hosts over 30 pharmaceutical manufacturing plants, it still imports approximately 70 per cent of the drugs consumed locally.

"This reliance extends

to imported raw materials for production, leading to smaller-scale production capacities and limited benefits from the economies of scale compared to America, Europe, and India's pharmaceutical sectors," Dr. Siyoi said.

He emphasized Kenya's prominence within the East African Community as a pharmaceutical hub, with an annual pharmaceutical expenditure of nearly Sh100 billion, constituting almost 50 per cent of the EAC market in 2017 and approximately eight per cent of Sub-Saharan Africa's total annual expenditure.

Dr. Siyoi also underscored the strides made by the Pharmacy and Poisons Board (PPB) by nearing Maturity Level III recognition by the World Health Organization (WHO) which underscores its global recognition in health product regulation and facilitating market access for local manufacturers.

Kenya enhances phytosanitary policy to safeguard food security and trade

BY WANGARI NDIRANGU (KNA)

The Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock Development has finalized the development of the Phytosanitary Policy in a bid to enhance food security and boost safe trade.

The Director for Plant Protection and Food Safety Directorate, Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock Development Collins Ma-

rangu in a speech read on his behalf by the Deputy Director Teresia Karanja said the recent introduction of pests such as the Maize Lethal Necrotic Disease (MLN), False Codling Moth, and Fall Army Worm and re-emergence of pests such as desert locust warranted a review of the phytosanitary capacity to identify areas that need to be strengthened.

“The impacts of plant

pests are widespread and affect agriculture, the environment and society in general. Some of these pests have the capacity to directly damage the agricultural crops, natural environment, and social amenities,” Marangu said in the speech during the closing of a validation workshop on Phytosanitary Capacity Evaluation (PCE) results for Kenya.

He added that rural communities are the most impacted due to the loss of earnings from low yields or destruction of crops due to pests, thus the driving force in evaluating the phytosanitary capacity of Kenya and proposing progressive solutions.

“This evaluation process is timely and with the diverse expertise input that has been provided, the outcome of the exercise will be a comprehensive reflection of challenges in the phytosanitary system in Kenya,” he said.

Marangu said the Ministry

of Agriculture is committed to supporting KEPHIS in the implementation of the identified action points or clear strategies that are required to be implemented to enhance the phytosanitary capacity of Kenya.

The Director thanked International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC) for supporting Kenya to evaluate its phytosanitary capacity and FAO for its continued support of various programmes, within the country including the management of fall army worm and locusts.

EAC achieves milestone as intra-regional trade tops Sh1.5 trillion

The Ministry of East African Community, ASALs, and Regional Development has celebrated the remarkable growth achieved in intra-East African Community (EAC) trade, surpassing the Sh1.5 trillion mark this year.

This achievement is deemed astronomical and a game-changer for the regional bloc, particularly since the recent admission of Somalia as its eighth member.

Peninnah Malonza, the EAC Cabinet Secretary, expressed her enthusiasm, highlighting that intra-EAC trade now stands at Sh1.5 trillion (10 billion dollars), signifying exceptional promise.

She attributed this growth to the establishment of the East African Community Customs Union, emphasizing the pivotal role of the single Customs Territory and one-stop border posts.

Ms. Malonza underscored the significance of one-stop

border posts (OSBs), functioning as integrated land border management systems. These OSBs facilitate collaboration among customs and other government agencies of neighboring partner states, streamlining clearance procedures upon entry into the respective countries.

The Community has achieved a lot in regard to joint infrastructure development

Speaking at the 24th East African Community Anniversary celebrations, Ms. Malonza also pointed to the establishment and adoption of regional mechanisms to address non-tariff barriers as another milestone contributing to the growth of intra-EAC trade.

The CS said the establishment of the EAC Common Market which guarantees the freedoms and rights such as free movement of labour, free movement of persons, free movement of capital, free movement of goods and services, and right of residence and right of establishment as other measures which have deepened intra-EAC trade, opened borders leading to mobility of labour, and co-operation in social and economic sectors.

"The Community has achieved a lot in regard to joint infrastructure development projects including major roads such as the Arusha-Namanga-Athi River road, and Arusha-Holili-Taveta-Voi Road.

"Further, the construction of the Standard Gauge

Railways on the Northern and Central Corridors is a major stride in our collective agenda, harmonization of the standards for goods produced in East Africa and reduction of national trade barriers," she said.

Other milestones by the EAC bloc are the implementation of preferential tariff discount; free movement of stocks, harmonization of operations of Ministries of Finance and Central Banks during national budget preparation and presentation; mutual recognition of health certificates issued by national bodies for goods traded in the East Africa; EAC, SADC and COMESA Tripartite Initiative, which was established in 2005, Ms Malonza noted.

She said the main benefit to be secured from the Tripartite Free Trade Area (FTA) is the establishment of a larger market with a single economic space comprising of 26 countries and over 527 million people and singled out the East African Jua Kali/ Nguvu Kazi exhibition which is held annually.

New bill proposal aims for 50-50 gender representation in Kenya's elective posts

The quest for gender parity in employment opportunities has gained momentum, with stakeholders expressing optimism that the two-thirds gender principle envisaged in the 2010 Constitution will be tackled in the country once and for all.

Speaking in Kakamega during a public participation organized by the Multi-Sectoral Working Group (MSWG), formed to bring into effect the provision of Article 227(8) of the Constitution, a member of the task force, Ann Nderitu, said a bill would be formulated for Parliament requiring that elective posts adhere to the quota rule.

Nderitu, who is the Registrar of Political Parties, stated that the rule would require that political seats be shared on a 50-50 basis. "A male governor must have a female deputy as a running mate and vice-versa, saying this will help bridge the gen-

der parity," she added.

Article 227(8) of the Constitution requires that the State shall take legislative and other measures to implement the principle that not more than two-thirds of the members of electoral or appointive bodies shall be of the same gender.

"We are about 15 years post the promulgation of the constitution, but still, Parliament and other institutions are yet to comply. Gender issues are not about women alone; men must support this move by giving their views so that we can have a more inclusive representation," she added.

"We now have goodwill at both the executive arm of government and Parliament.

We feel the time is now ripe for the implementation of the provision of the constitution. That is the only one yet to be implemented," added Ruth Makusu, a member of the task force. "Gender issues are not about women alone, men must support this move

by giving their views so that we can have a more inclusive representation," she added.

"We now have goodwill at both the executive arm of government and Parliament. We feel the time is now ripe for the implementation of the provision of the constitution. That is the only one yet to be implemented, added Ruth Makusu, a member of the task force.

Data on the number of elected parliamentarians (governors, senators, MPs, and members of the county assembly in Kakamega show gender parity is yet to be accomplished, with the county yet to produce a female governor, senator, or member of parliament.

Out of 60 wards in the county, there are only three elected female Members of the County Assembly (MCAs). At the forum, People Living with Disability (PLWD) complained that they have been left out of the political mainstream and in decision-making.

Government rolls out nationwide drive to boost public sector productivity

The Government has initiated a nationwide drive to enhance productivity in the public sector, aiming to improve service delivery and address the growing wage bill.

This initiative, directed at all Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs), is anticipated to boost productivity in the public sector, fostering efficiency in service delivery and ensuring greater accountability for public

funds.

Dr. Idris Dokota, Principal Secretary for the State Department for Cabinet Affairs, emphasized that the goal of this initiative is to align public expenditure with the quality of service and output, thereby guaranteeing optimal value for government spending.

The concerning issue of the ballooning wage bill, accounting for 46 percent of the country's ordinary revenue compared to the recommended 35 percent, was highlighted by

Dr. Dokota. He expressed that this level of expenditure, covering salaries and wages for approximately 963,200 public servants, is unsustainable and exerts significant pressure on government finances. Consequently, he emphasized the necessity of implementing productivity management in the government.

The primary focus of the initiative is on enhancing operational efficiency, labor efficiency, and customer satisfaction.

Speaking when he met elders from the Nubian community in Kenya in his office, the Director of Minority and Marginalized Af-

fairs Mr. Lowoi Lodeya said the Government has rolled out initiatives to address the challenges facing minority and marginalized communities in the country.

He said plans to develop a policy to recognize all minority and marginalized communities were on top gear, adding that the policy will be used to identify genuine minorities and the marginalized and ensure

"Plans to develop a national policy to help in recognizing minorities in Kenya are on course and the process will undergo public participation and all due procedures of law. He told the Nubian elders that following the declaration of the Nubi as one of the tribes of Kenya, the Government will ensure that the hurdles they face in the acquisition of identity cards and passports are urgently addressed.

On receiving a memorandum from the Secretary General of the Kenya Nubian Council of Elders Mr. Ibrahim Yunus, the Director said the formation of the Minorities and Marginalized Unit three months ago to deal with the affairs of minorities and marginalized communities in

Kenya was a clear testimony of the Government's commitment to addressing their challenges.


"I will follow up on your memorandum and respond to you in two weeks' time. Your enjoyment of your citizenship and rights should be implemented for example in the issuance of identity cards and passports by relaxing the stringent vetting process that disadvantages many of you", he said.


He challenged minorities and the marginalized to exploit the opportunities provided by the Government to pull them-

selves out of the indignity of stigma and stigmatization and avoid unnecessary squabbles and disunity while presenting their affairs to Government organs.

Mr Lodeya drummed up support for the forthcoming International Day for the rights of minorities and marginalized peoples whose festivities will be held at the Bomas of Kenya on December 18, 2023.

He urged all minority and marginalized communities in the country to take their rightful places to showcase their identity, culture and heritage during the fete.

Kenya's agenda, deals inked at COP28

Kenya clinches \$4.48 billion in green investments deals as it pushes for new climate financing framework

Kenya pushed for reforms to align development financing with countries' climate goals, concrete climate action, the honouring of the Paris Agreement as well as a new climate financing framework at the ongoing United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP28) in the United Arab Emirates (UAE).

And this seemed to pay off as the country clinched deals in green investments worth \$4.48 billion (Sh680 billion. President William

Ruto, who represented the country at the Africa Green Industrialisation Initiative event, held by the COP28 presidency, said the projects would be in geothermal energy, green data centres, green hydrogen, and climate-smart agriculture.

"The government through Konza Technopolis and Kengen are committed to develop an ICT data storage using green energy from geothermal. This investment sets Kenya to a

path of techno-industrialisation to decarbonisation of data management,” said President Ruto on the project that would be done in partnership with US investors.

“The initiative marks a concrete step towards the realisation of the Nairobi Declaration, activating private sector-led scaling up of green industrial clusters,” President Ruto told COP28 delegate.

Other projects are \$1.5 billion investment by Fortescue Future Industries (FFI) in a geothermal project to produce green ammonia and \$110 million investment by Globeq in a 35MW geothermal power project in Menengai, Nakuru County, among others.

President Ruto, who is also representing Africa as the chairman of the Committee of African Heads of State and Government on Climate Change (CAHOSS), has been vocal on the issues as he seeks to show the world that the continent has come with solutions, not a begging bowl.

Kenya and Africa, according to him,

possess massive natural resources, a growing workforce and untapped renewable energy potential, therefore, can contribute significantly to global climate action amid sustainable development.

Another solution is to establish Kenya and the continent as key hubs for green manufacturing to support the global decarbonisation agenda.

One of Africa’s goals at the summit was to see the actualisation of the Africa Green Industrialisation Initiative, a collaboration between UAE, Kenya and African states, with the key target being assisting African countries in developing green industries for economic growth.

The initiative is also expected to promote climate change mitigation and adaptation, while fostering economic development and job creation.

President Ruto has emerged as Africa’s “climate change activist” as he stands out as the continent’s voice on climate change and its impact, on among others agriculture, food

security, water resources and tourism.

At the Summit, the President highlighted the continent’s priorities, demands and proposals based on the Nairobi Declaration made during the Climate Summit in Kenya.

Various Heads of State and governments from the continent, and global leaders, who attended the inaugural Africa Climate Summit in Nairobi in August, endorsed the declaration.

“We are very confident of the future, starting from Nairobi to New York and to the UAE, our message on climate change will be clear,” said President Ruto.

In the declaration, the leaders asked the global community to act with urgency in reducing emissions, keep past promises, and support the continent in addressing climate change.

In particular, they called for the acceleration of all efforts to reduce emissions to align with goals set in the Paris Agreement; the honouring of the commitment to provide \$100 billion in annual climate finance, as promised 14 years ago at the Copenhagen conference;

upholding of the commitments to a fair and accelerated process of phasing down coal, and abolishment of all fossil fuel subsidies and the swift operationalisation of the “Loss and

Damage” funding agreed at COP27.

In addition, they called for increase in climate-positive investments that catalyse a growth trajectory, anchored in the industries poised to transform our planet and enabling African countries to achieve stable middle-income status by 2050.

They also asked global leaders to join Africa in accelerating de-carbonisation, while pursuing equality and shared prosperity.

At the Summit, African leaders committed to develop and implement policies, regulations and incentives aimed at attracting local, regional and global investment in green growth and inclusive economies.

Second, propel Africa’s economic growth and job creation in a manner that not only limits emissions, but also aids global de-carbonisation efforts.

Third, focus the continent’s economic development plans on climate-positive growth, including expansion of just energy transitions and renewable energy generation for industrial activity. ■

some 3,000 hospitals, according to the Ministry of Health.

And the country has witnessed a 68.5 per cent reduction in new infections and a 53 per cent drop in HIV-related deaths from 2013 to 2021.

These are some of the milestones that the ministry celebrated as the country joined the world in celebrating World Aids Day last Friday.

The theme of the day was, “Let communities lead,” which emphasised the pivotal role communities play in the fight against the disease.

Health CS Susan Nakhumicha noted that communities are the pulse of change in addressing the complexities of HIV/AIDS.

“Their collective knowledge, resil-

ience, and advocacy drive is crucial in advancement of prevention, treatment, and support systems. Empowering communities is a fundamental approach in shaping sustainable, inclusive responses,” she said.

Kenya has reduced HIV infections from over 100,000 in 2013 to some 22,000 annually in a decade, according to the National Syndemic Disease Council. Mother-to-child infections have declined to 8.6 percent in 2022. ■

Kengen to pay Sh2bn dividends

KENYA ELECTRICITY GENERATING Company (Kengen) will pay its shareholders Sh2 billion in dividends for the year ending June 30, one of the highest pay outs since the 2016 rights issue. This follows approval by shareholders during the 71st AGM held in Nairobi,

which ratified the company’s payment of Sh0.3 per share, adding up to the tune of Sh2 billion. The company made Sh5.2 billion profit after tax during the period. Board chairman Julius Ogamba attributed the performance to innovation and robust expansion strategy. He said Kengen would continue with its “Good-to-Great” strategy, which is anchored on geothermal development and revenue diversification. “Looking ahead, our plan to increase generation capacity by more than 154MW mostly drawn from pipeline projects in geothermal over the next two years reflect our dedication to meeting the ever-growing demand for clean energy in Kenya,” said Ogamba. CEO Peter Njenga said the firm has prioritised new technologies to generate more electricity using the existing power plants. ■ – KNA

State releases Sh2 billion for Inua Jamii beneficiaries

The government has kept its word to timely release the money every month to the millions of vulnerable members of society

The government has released over Sh2 billion for payment to beneficiaries of Inua Jamii programme, which include orphans, widows and the elderly.

The PS Social Protection and Senior Citizen Affairs Joseph Motari said Sh2.09 billion had been disbursed, and the beneficiaries were expected to start accessing the funds from yesterday.

"Payment would commence on December 4," said the PS, adding, "The funds were credited to the accounts of 1.04 million beneficiaries, with each getting Sh2,000 being payment for November."

INFOBOX

Social Safety Net

The government is pursuing economic transformation and social protection for the benefit of all Kenyans.

President William Ruto noted that social protection cannot wait until 2030 when the country is to be expected to have achieved its economic blueprint, the Kenya Vision 2030. "We must undertake both commitments simultaneously because the standard of social protection is a good measure of sustainability and the promise of shared prosperity," President Ruto said.



PS Social Protection and Senior Citizen Affairs Joseph Motari said. The government has allocated Sh.28 billion to support cash transfer programmes implemented by the State Department for Social Protection and Senior Citizen Affairs.

The PS noted that the department had further released Sh6.11 million for those enrolled under the Nutrition Improvement Cash and Health Education (NICHE), which complements Inua Jamii initiative.

The timely disbursement of funds follows a presidential directive in July that beneficiaries get their cash at the end of every month. Since then, the government has kept its word, with the social protection department monthly disbursing the cash to the over a million beneficiaries.

"Older citizens, orphans and vulnerable children, as well as people living with extreme disability, have a right to receive support now, and it is grossly unjust to wait even one moment, for any reason," the President said in April.

He added that the bottom-up economic transformation agenda stands on the foundation of creating sustainable capacities and viable opportunities for the empowerment of people at the base of the socioeconomic pyramid.

He explained that the government was simultaneously pursuing rapid economic transformation and social protection.

In September, the government kicked off the registration of new beneficiaries, targeting to enroll some 700,000 people.

With each beneficiary getting Sh2,000 every month, the monthly spending on the welfare programme is expected to rise by Sh1.4 billion to Sh3.49 billion as the government moves to cushion the vulnerable in the society.

Mr Motari said that through the Inua Jamii programme, the government is giving full support to vulnerable people in the society so that they live a decent life.

He said there is a relationship between disability, old age and poverty. "If we give money to old people, poverty decreases and, therefore, many of them will live many years because they will be able to buy food and medicine for themselves so that they can live with dignity in their old age," he said.

By now you must have noticed that the rains are increasingly erratic and droughts are common that it has become difficult for the country to produce enough food. The droughts and the erratic weather pattern are some of the effects of climate change, which have disrupted our ability as a country to produce food. One of the consequences of this is that food prices have risen making families dig deeper into their pockets. Therefore, this means that we must pay greater attention to climate change as individuals and as a nation. At the national level, the government is leading efforts to plant 15 billion trees to reverse the effects of climate change. And as an individual, you can also do a lot by adopting new ways of farming, cooking and transportation, for instance. In this edition of 'Quick InfoBytes', we tell you all you wanted to know on climate change and point out opportunities that come with the threat. Karibu.

What does the Kenyan constitution say about climate change?

The constitution recognises the right to a clean environment and it's sustenance for the benefit of posterity.

Are there specific laws to help manage climate change?

Yes, there is the Climate Change Act 2016, which requires the Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Environment, to formulate a National Climate Change Action Plan (NCCAP), which should be reviewed every five years. The current plan ran from 2018-2022.

What is the purpose of the Action Plan?

It provides a legal framework for Kenya to deliver on its climate change goals under various priority areas, including disaster risk management, blue economy, food security, forestry, housing, manufacturing, energy, transport and health.

Are there any other laws that protect the environment?

There is the Environment and Management Coordination Act 1999, Energy Act 2019 and The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and the Paris Agreement, which Kenya ratified.

Which bodies are involved in enforcing laws related to climate change?

We have the National Environment Management Authority (Nema), the Environment and Land Court, the National Environment Tribunal, National Climate Change Council, Climate Change Directorate and departments in county governments that all help in enforcement of climate and environment-related laws.

Talk about irrigation agriculture in relation to climate change

Climate change has significantly made rain-fed agriculture unsustainable. Therefore, use of irrigation helps to overcome climate risks like drought, enabling production of food all year round.

Where can I get information on climate change in my locality?

You can visit the Ministry of Environment or Nema officers at the county headquarters. They will guide you on what to do to help fight climate change in your community.

But irrigation is too expensive ...

You don't have to install drip lines, whose set up cost can be expensive. You can make your own drip system at home using recycled plastic bottles. Make holes on the bottles, fill with water and install at the base of the crops.

NG-CDF impacts positively on special, vulnerable groups nation-wide

The National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) has funded projects for special and marginalized groups in 190 constituencies through a programme dubbed, "Best Practice Demonstration Programme countrywide since the 2015/2016 Financial Year to date".

NG-CDF Board CEO Mr. Yusuf Mbuno stated that the Program, initiated in the 2015/2016 Financial Year, addresses principles of community participation, social inclusion, environmental sustainability, excellence in project implementation, and adherence to government policies and guidelines.

Mbuno who was speaking while handing over a 45-seater bus purchased for Mwakichuchu Secondary School in Voi Constituency, Taita Taveta County, said under the Program, projects targeting Persons with Disabilities, Orphans and Vulnerable Children, and marginalized groups are prioritized.

Under the same Programme, Mbuno added, the Board has bought three buses for Pangani Girls High

School in Starehe Constituency in Nairobi, Ematiha Mixed Secondary School in Navakholo Constituency in Busia County and Masongaleni Mixed Secondary School in Kibwezi East Constituency in Makueni county at a cost of Sh35.1 million.

The CEO revealed that the Best Practice Demonstration Programme is funded with 5 per cent of the 2.5 per cent of the National Government Share of Revenue allocated to the NG-CDF Board for administrative purposes.

The CEO further said that the Programme has disbursed Sh500.7 million to build classrooms in schools, Sh727.4 million to build sec-

ondary schools, Sh7.8 million to build special schools, Sh17.9 million to tertiary institutions and Sh77.4 million to build security installations.

Under the Best Practices Demonstration Programme, Mbuno revealed that the Board has distributed Sh 181.063 million during the 2015/2016 Financial Year, Sh 180.5 million during the 2016/2017 fiscal year, and 177.4 million, 226.7 million, Sh 196.2 million, Sh 150.5 million, and Sh 219.052 million during the 2017/2018, 2019/2020, 2020/2021, and the 2022/2023 financial years, respectively totalling Sh1.3billion

Mbuno cited the construction of the Sajiloni Primary School in Kajiado Central Constituency which the Programme built to rescue girls from early marriages and Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) and the construction of a dormitory at Illula Secondary School in Ainaabkoi constituency in Nandi County for students with albinism.

He said project components under the Best Practices Demonstration Programme include the installation of requisite accessories like equipment and safety installations like fire extinguishers, lightning arresters, emergency exits to facilitate immediate and safe use.

"To cater for the needs of all users including persons with special needs, we put up ramps for wheelchair users, separate sanitation for persons of all gender, under age persons and Persons with Disabilities", Mbuno noted.

He said the Programme helps marginalized groups to bring them at par with their peers and every project has an environmental conservation component through water harvesting and tree planting.

IGAD appoints first-ever youth ambassador for inclusive leadership

The Inter-Governmental Authority on Development (IGAD) has appointed its first youth envoy to enhance youth inclusion within the organization.

Speaking at the IGAD Governance 2023 conference in Mombasa, Dr. Workneh Gebeyehu, the organization's Executive Secretary, highlighted that the youth constitute approximately 70% of the region's total population. Recognizing their significance, IGAD has taken a deliberate step to actively involve and fully include the youth as essential stakeholders in the region's affairs.

"IGAD, as a regional organization, is dedicated to building the capacity of unique populations such as the youth and women in our region to get them on board in key matters affecting our region, including peace and security, climate change, and other pertinent issues," stated Gabayehu.

He further announced that IGAD is currently in the pro-

cess of formulating a youth policy and has urged member states to expedite this process. The Executive Director said as such, the new office of the youth envoy will be better placed to articulate the challenges, successes, and opportunities that cut across the region.

"We are institutionalizing the issues of youth inclusivity, member state governments and partner organizations should take the charge to spearhead the interests of youth to exploit their full potential," he added.

The three-day conference has drawn delegates and participants from member states and strategic partners to deliberate on key issues surrounding the region with a focus on the adoption of the IGAD regional gender strategy and IGAD regional action plan on women, peace, and security (WPS).

KenGen shareholders to earn record Sh2b dividend

The Kenya Electricity Generating Company PLC (KenGen) shareholders will receive a Sh2 billion dividend payout for the year ending June 30, 2023, one of the highest amounts the company has paid since the 2016 Rights Issue.

This follows approval by the NSE-listed company's shareholders during the 71st AGM held in Nairobi, paving the way for KenGen to pay a first and final dividend payment of Sh0.3 per share, totaling Sh2 billion. The dividend payout comes at a time when the company posted a Sh5.2 billion profit after tax, demonstrating its strong financial health and stability over the years.

Speaking in Nairobi during the AGM, KenGen Board Chairman Julius Ogamba noted that the company's strong business fundamentals, innovation culture, and robust expansion strategy have continued to propel the company to profitability, growing value for its shareholders year-on-year.

"Our financial results for the year paint a picture of growth and sustainability. Revenue increased by 14 per cent, reaching Sh53.96 billion, showcasing the financial health and robustness of the company," said Mr. Ogamba. The KenGen Chairman further said the company would

continue to push its ongoing Good-to-Great strategy, anchored on geothermal development and revenue diversification.

"Looking ahead, our initiatives to increase generation capacity by more than 154MW, mostly drawn from pipeline projects in geothermal over the next two years, reflect our dedication to meeting the ever-growing demand for clean energy in Kenya," Ogamba said.

On his part, KenGen Managing Director, and Chief Executive Officer Eng Peter Njenga, reiterated the company's 2024 priority focus areas, which he said will be on new technologies to generate more electricity using the existing power plants.

"We are on course with new initiatives to increase generation capacity by more than 154MW over the next two years through the rehabilitation and up-rating of existing assets, showcasing our commitment to meeting the rising demand for clean energy in Kenya," Eng. Njenga said.

NSDCC calls on communities to take an active role in the fight against HIV/AIDS

The National Symbiotic Diseases Control Council (NSDCC) is calling on communities across the country to play an active role in the ongoing battle against HIV/AIDS, focusing on both preventing new infections and combating stigmatization.

During a press conference in Meru town, where the national commemoration of this year's World AIDS Day took place, NSDCC Chief Executive Officer Ms. Ruth Laibon-Masha emphasized the crucial role communities play in addressing HIV-related stigma, discrimination, and providing education and interventions for prevention and treatment adherence.

Under the theme 'Let Communities Lead' for the 2023 World AIDS Day, Ms.

Masha stressed the need for stakeholders to invest in grassroots-level initiatives, ensuring a direct and effective approach to tackling the challenges associated with HIV/AIDS.

"While Kenya has made significant progress in combating its HIV epidemic, ranking seventh globally in terms of people living with HIV, stigma remains a barrier. It is essential for each sector to communicate its specific role in addressing this issue," said Ms. Masha.

Ms. Masha also highlighted the importance of engaging Kenyan men in conversations about HIV, as some contribute to infections in newborns and breastfeeding children through unprotected sex with infected partners.

Despite the achievements in increasing the number of people on lifelong antiretroviral treatment in Kenya, the country faces challenges, particularly with new HIV infections among children, adolescents, and young people. Ms. Masha noted

that Meru County, with a population of approximately 1,775,511, is of particular concern.

As of 2023, the county has 30,912 individuals living with HIV, with a prevalence rate of 2.4 per cent. The 'Triple Threat' in Meru County involves new HIV infections, teenage pregnancies, and sexual and gender-based violence among adolescents and young women aged 10 to 19.

NSDCC is committed to addressing this 'Triple Threat' in collaboration with local authorities, healthcare professionals, and communities by implementing evidence-based interventions and policies. Ms. Masha expressed confidence that with collective efforts, Meru County can overcome these challenges and build a brighter future.
