# Serikali kuanzisha Huduma Centre katika Maeneo Bunge 290 nchini

Serikali, kupitia Wizara ya Utumishi wa Umma, inajandaa kuanzisha Vituo vya Huduma katika kila eneo bunge kama sehemu ya Ajenda ya Mabadiliko ya Chini Juu na Dira ya Kenya 2030. Akizungumza katika Kituo cha Huduma cha Machakos wakati wa uzinduzi wa Huduma za Taasisi ya Usimamizi wa Ugavi Kenya (KISM) katika Vituo 10 vya Huduma, Katibu wa Utumishi wa Umma, Amos Gathecha, alisisitiza dhamira ya serikali ya kuboresha utoaji wa huduma. Alibainisha kuwa Kenya kwa sasa ina Vituo 58 vya Huduma, lakini serikali inalenga kuanzisha kituo kimoja katika kila moja ya maeneo bunge 290 ili kusogeza huduma muhimu karibu na wananchi. “Chini ya Dira ya Kenya 2030, tuliweka ahadi ya kuwa na Kituo cha Huduma katika kila eneo bunge,” Gathecha alisema. Alieleza kuwa ujumuishaji wa huduma za KISM katika Vituo vya Huduma utarahisisha upati-

kanaji wa huduma kwa wataalamu wa ugavi, ambao awali walilazimika kusafiri hadi Nairobi kupata huduma hizo. Gathecha alihimiza KISM kutumia vyema ushirikiano huu kwa kupanua huduma zake katika Vituo vyote 58 vya Huduma. “Ushirikiano huu utaondoa hitaji la wataalamu wa ugavi kusafiri nchi nzima kutafuta huduma za KISM,” aliongeza. Aidha, alitambua Wakala wa Huduma wa Kila Mahali (Huduma Universal Agent) kama kiwezesaji muhimu wa mpango huu. Wakala huyu, ambaye ni mfanyakazi wa Huduma aliyepata mafunzo maalum, hutoa huduma

mbalimbali kwa niaba ya wizara, idara na mashirika mbalimbali ya serikali. “Wakala wa Huduma wa Kila Mahali ni ubunifu wa Huduma Kenya uliobuniwa kusaidia wale wanaokumbana na changamoto za kijiitaji katika kupata huduma mtandaoni,” Gathecha alifafanua. Afisa Mtendaji Mkuu wa KISM, Kenneth Matiba, alikaribisha mpango huo, akiuita hatua kubwa katika kuboresha upatikanaji wa huduma kwa wanachama wake. “Tunatambua umuhimu wa upatikanaji rahisi wa huduma. Uzinduzi huu unaonyesha dhamira yetu ya kukidhi mahitaji

yanayoendelea kubadilika ya wanachama wetu,” Matiba alisema. Alifichua kuwa ujumuishaji wa KISM katika Vituo vya Huduma utawapa watu binafsi na mashirika uwezo wa kufanikisha usajili na upya wa uana-chama, huduma za uthibitisho na leseni, pamoja na kupata taarifa kuhusu mipango ya maendeleo endelevu ya kitaaluma na masuala ya jumla. Matiba alihakikishia kuwa KISM itazingatia miongozo yote ya udhibiti na kudemisha weledi na uadilifu katika utoaji wa huduma. “Nawahimiza wadau wote kuukumbatia huu mwanzo mpya wa utoaji huduma kwa ari na azma ya kujenga taaluma madhubuti ya ugavi,” alielezea. Mpango wa Utoaji Huduma Kenya (HKSDP) ni Mradi wa Bendera wa Dira ya Kenya 2030 uliobuniwa kupitia Notisi ya Kenya Gazette Na. 2177 ya tarehe 4 Aprili, 2014. Mpango huu una mamala ya kubadilisha Utoaji wa Huduma za Umma ili kuhakikisha wananchi wanapata huduma bora na madhubuti.

Akizungumza pia katika hafla hiyo, Mkurugenzi wa Udhibiti wa Uchumi na Mkakati wa EPRA, Dkt. John Mutua, alibainisha maeneo muhimu ya kipaumbele, yakiwemo ununuzi wa bidhaa za petroli, gharama za usafirishaji, na bei ya rejareja. Dkt. Mutua alisisitiza kuwa utafiti huo ulipitia upya fomula iliyopo ya upangaji wa bei ya mafuta, ukichunguza usahihi wa vipengele mbalimbali vya gharama kuanzia uagizaji hadi usambazaji wa rejareja. Kwa mujibu wake, mjawapo ya matokeo muhimu yalikuwa athari za mabadiliko ya bei ya mafuta duniani na kutokuwa thabiti kwa viwango vya ubadilishaji wa fedha.

Alieleza kuwa mabadiliko kutoka Mfumo wa Zabuni ya Wazi (OTS) hadi mpango wa ununuzi wa serikali kwa serikali (G2G) na Kampuni ya Mafuta ya Kitaifa ya Abu Dhabi (ADNOC) pamoja na Kampuni ya Mafuta ya Kitaifa ya Emirates (ENOC) yamechangia katika kuleta utulivu wa usambazaji wa mafuta, lakini pia yameongeza gharama za bima ya usafirishaji. Aidha, alisema kuwa EPRA inafanya kazi kuboresha utabiri wa mahitaji, hasa kwa gesi ya mafuta ya kupikia (LPG) na mafuta ya taa, ambayo yamekumbwa na mabadiliko makubwa ya soko. Zaidi ya hayo, Dkt. Mutua alifichua kuwa mamlaka hiyo inazingatia kurekebisha gharama za usafirishaji, ambazo hazijabadilishwa tangu 2010 licha ya kuongezeka kwa gharama za mafuta na kazi.

## WATER SERVICES REGULATORY BOARD

### REGISTRATION OF ALL SMALL-SCALE WATER SERVICE PROVIDERS

Section 85(1) of the Water Act 2016 provides that a person shall not provide water services unless under the authority of a license issued by the Water Services Regulatory Board (WASREB). Pursuant to this section, notice is hereby given to ALL water services system operators who supply water services in all the 47 Counties in Kenya to register their operations with WASREB. This requirement applies to the following category of operators who have **NOT** registered with WASREB previously:

1. Community water projects
2. Gated community water providers/Housing Development Company Water Projects
3. Private/ Individual water operators
4. Public Benefit/ Non-Governmental Organization (PBOs/ NGO) water projects

# Walimu 229,000 wafunzwa serikali ikijiandaa kwa mpito wa Sekondari Kuu

Jumla ya walimu 229,292 kutoka taasisi za elimu za umma na kibinafsi wamepatiwa mafunzo maalumu ili kutekeleza kwa ufanisi mfumo wa Elimu ya Msingi kwa Umahiri (CBE). Hatua hii inajiri wakati ambapo serikali inajiandaa kwa mpito wa wanafunzi kutoka Sekondari ya Awali hadi Sekondari ya Juu mwaka ujao. Maendeleo haya yalian-gaziwa katika Mazungumzo ya Kitaifa kuhusu Uboara wa Elimu na Matokeo ya Kujifunza yaliyofanyika Kericho, ambapo pia ilifichuliwa kuwa walimu 60,642 wa Shule za Awali za Sekondari na wakufunzi 1,200 wa vyuo vya mafunzo ya ualimu walikamilisha mafunzo makali ili kuhakikisha utekelezaji mzuri wa mtaala mpya wa elimu. Akizungumza kwenye jukwaa hilo lililowaleta pamoja wadau mbalimbali, Mkurugenzi wa Elimu, Bw. John Ongosi, alisisitiza kuwa mtaala mpya unahitaji walimu kuwa na ujuzi

wa Teknolojia ya Habari na Mawasiliano (ICT) ili kuwezesha majukumu kama vile masomo ya mbali na vipindi vya moja kwa moja, hivyo kuruhusu walimu na wanafunzi kushirikiana kwa njia ya teknolojia. Aidha, alieleza kuwa serikali inapanga kuanzisha maabara za mtandaoni ili kusaia elimu ya Sayansi, Teknolojia, Uhandisi, na Hisabati (STEM) wakati wanafunzi wa Sekondari ya Awali watakapofika Ki-dato cha 10 mwaka 2026. Washiriki wa kongamano hilo walifahamishwa kuhusu miongozo mipya ya CBE, ikiwemo mchakato wa kuchagua, kupanga

na kujiunga na shule mbalimbali za sekondari za juu kote nchini. Wanafunzi wa Darasa la 9 watawekwa katika makundi kulingana na njia zao za kujifunza binafsi, ambazo zinalenga kuhudumia mahitaji, uwezo, kasi, na maslahi yao binafsi, badala ya kushikilia viwango vya umri au madaraja yaliyowekwa.

#### Wanafunzi kuamua kozi

Bwana Ongosi alieleza kuwa wanafunzi wa Shule ya Upili ya Juu watalazimika kuboea katika mojawapo ya njia tatu, ambazo ni Sanaa na Sayansi ya Michezo, Sayansi za

Jamii, na Sayansi, Teknolojia, Uhandisi na Hisabati (STEM). Mkurugenzi wa Elimu alihakikishia kuwa upan-gaji wa wanafunzi wa Daraja la 10 utafanywa kulingana na chaguo la mwanafunzi, ufaulu, mti-hani wa kisaikolojia, us-awa, na uwezo wa shule. "Kutakuwa na haki kwa wanafunzi wote, ambapo kila mmoja atap-ata fursa ya kuchagua mwelekeo wake. Ku-takuwa na Shule za Up-ili ya Juu zenye njia tatu, ambazo zitajikita katika STEM, Sanaa na Sayansi ya Michezo, na Sayansi za Jamii. Pia, kutakuwa na Shule za Upili ya Juu

zenye njia mbili, ambazo zitajikita katika STEM na Sanaa na Sayansi ya Michezo," alisema Ongosi.

Alieleza zaidi kuwa wanafunzi wa Shule ya Upili ya Juu katika Daraja la 10 hadi 12 watasoma masomo saba, manne yakiwa ya msingi, ambayo ni Kiingereza, Kiswahili, Mafunzo ya Huduma kwa Jamii, na Elimu ya Viungo, huku mengine matatu yakichaguliwa kulingana na njia na mwel-ekeo wa mwanafunzi. Washikadau pia wal-ihamasishwa kuhusu Tathmini ya Kulingana na Uwezo (CBA), ambayo ni mchakato wa makusudi,

wa kimfumo na wa kuen-delea wa kukusanya taa-rifa kutoka kwa vyanzo mbalimbali ili kufanya maamuzi kuhusu kile am-bacho mwanafunzi ana-jua, anapaswa kujifunza, amejifunza, na anaweza kufanya.

Bw. Ongosi alisema tathmini hizo hutumia aina mbalimbali za zana na hutoa fursa kwa wanafunzi, wenzao, walimu na wazazi kufuatilia maendeleo ya mwanafunzi kupitia mifumo ya mre-jesho wa wakati halisi. "Mbinu na zana za tath-mini zinatofautiana ili kukidhi mahitaji ya kuji-funza ya wanafunzi bin-afsi, zikiwemo mitihani, ratiba za uchunguzi, mas-wali na majibu, orodha za ukaguzi, majaribio, vi-wango vya tathmini, ma-jarida, miongozo ya kazi, wasifu wa wanafunzi, rekodi za matukio, mas-wali ya mdomo au ya kusikiliza, dodoso, mi-zani za tathmini na mi-radi," Ongosi alieleza. Wakati huo huo, Mkuru-genzi wa Elimu wa Kaunti ya Kericho, Bw. Julius Ngoneshi, alithibitisha kuwa jumla ya madarasa 55 mapya kwa wanafunzi wa Kidato cha 3 yameka-milika na yanafanya kazi, huku madarasa mengine 160 yakiwa karibu kuka-milika kwa asilimia 99.

### REPUBLISHING OF CONSUMER PROTECTION GUIDELINES AND CUSTOMER CARE STANDARDS IN ACCORDANCE WITH KENYA INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS ACT, 1998

The Communications Authority of Kenya (CA) is the regulatory agency for the ICT industry in Kenya with responsibilities in telecommunications, e-commerce, broadcasting, and postal/courier services. CA is also responsible for managing the country's numbering and frequency spectrum resources, administering the Universal Service Fund (USF) as well as safeguarding the interests of Consumers/Users of ICT services.

The Kenya Information and Communications Act, 1998 mandates the Authority to put in place guidelines for the protection of ICT consumers.

In this regard, the Authority on 16<sup>th</sup> August 2022 issued the *Consumer Protection Guidelines and Customer Care Standards for ICT in Kenya* in line with the Act. The Authority would like to re-issue the same guidelines to ensure that service providers observe certain minimum standards of service as envisaged in the law as a means of safeguarding consumer interests in the market.

The guidelines also seek to ensure that certain critical information is made available to consumers by licensed service providers and that complaints and disputes that arise between consumers and service providers are minimized to the greatest extent possible.

# How National Irrigation Sector Investment Plan aims to cut rice imports by 50pc

As the Ministry of Water, Sanitation and Irrigation prepares to launch the Sh600 billion National Irrigation Sector Investment Plan (NISIP) in Nairobi on 21st March 2025, the Principal Secretary of the State Department for Irrigation Ephantus Kimotho (pictured) explains to MyGov writer Yobesh Onwong'a how the framework aims to enhance and unlock the potential and opportunities of irrigation in the country.

## Q. What is the National Irrigation Sector Investment Plan (NISIP)?

It is a strategic framework that aims to enhance and unlock the potential and opportunities of irrigation in the country. In developing this plan, we engaged key stakeholders, including farmers, county governments, government ministries, departments and agencies (MDAs), development partners, and the private sector. This ten-year plan aims to transition the country from food deficiency to food security through irrigated agriculture. Our goal is to expand the equipped irrigation area by one million acres across the plan's five key pathways

## Q. What are the key tenets of the NISIP Plan?

Increased food security & economic prosperity: NISIP aims to enhance water use efficiency, modernize infrastructure, strengthen institutions, and promote climate adaptation, helping the country move towards sustainable food security and long-term economic growth.

The Plan seeks to enhance a value chain approach. The cumulative annual production of rice

is currently at 192 metric tonnes. We target to increase this to 440 metric tonnes by the Financial Year 2027/2028 which will reduce imports by 50 per cent.

The blended financing model is a sustainable way to fund farm activities for increased and sustainable food production. All stakeholders: government agencies, development partners and the private sector are encouraged to support this initiative.

## Q. What are the key objectives of the Investment Plan?

The key objectives are to enhance the strategic alignment of Government investments; optimize the allocation of resources; enhance co-ordinated action among multiple stakeholders; mitigate risks associated with complex development challenges; ensure evidence-based decision-making; broaden the opportunities for capacity building; prioritize investments that can generate long-term positive impact and enhance accountability and transparency in Government investments.

## Q. Elaborate the Investment Pathways of

## the Plan

There are five key complementary development areas that aim to promote, harmonize, and optimize irrigation spending. These are:

Farmer-led Irrigation Development (FLID): Invest in micro-irrigation systems to expand access to efficient irrigation, with a focus on facilitating irrigation uptake by individuals and small-scale farmers through community-based market access. In FLID, farmers manage the systems themselves while suppliers and financing institutions provide essential services. For farmers to maximize returns, the Plan will enable the farm activities to be market-driven, for example, banks and other development partners will create credit guarantee schemes to support farmers.

High performing public schemes: Investors can contribute to optimizing public irrigation schemes, ensuring better service delivery and maximizing efficiency in government-supported agriculture. This reduces the cost of operation and enhances production. The goal in this pathway is



## do you seek to raise in this Plan?

For us to achieve the above output, we need a total of Sh600 billion over the ten-year period. Out of this, Government contribution will be 40 per cent while that of the private sector investors is 60 per cent.

## Q. What are the policies and legal framework on which the plan is anchored on?

The policies and strategies related to irrigation involving different ministries and state agencies have been considered. The Constitution of Kenya, 2010 requires alignment and enhanced coordination of irrigation-sector development and management. The national government, county governments, and several regulatory institutions are responsible for regulating different aspects in the irrigation sector.

## Q. Your parting shot?

As we are preparing to launch the plan on 21st March 2025, I invite all our stakeholders; government agencies, farmers, private sector entities, non-governmental organizations and international partners to join us in this critical endeavor.

The success of this plan hinges on our collective efforts and shared commitment to a common goal: a sustainable and prosperous agricultural sector supported by effective and efficient irrigation systems.

The government is confident that the strategic direction and investor collaboration that is framed by the NISIP pathways will be the fastest and most cost-efficient way to achieve priority economic, climate-resilience, and agricultural water development goals.

## Q. Any specific measurable outputs that you intend to achieve?

We intend to expand the equipped irrigation area by a further one million acres involving all pathways. Expand fodder and rangeland production in ASAL areas with floodwater harvesting and innovative agricultural water management techniques on 40,000 acres of land. Optimize the output from existing irrigation assets that command 319,000 acres of irrigated land on public and community schemes.

## Q. How much funding

to improve governance, management and technology to achieve operational and financial stability through high performance irrigation and service delivery.

Enabled Corporate Agribusiness: Opportunities exist to scale up commercial investments in irrigated agriculture, benefiting from the growing demand for sustainable farming solutions.

Revitalized Irrigation in ASALs: Investors can tap into emerging markets by developing irrigation solutions for arid and semi-arid regions, driving food and fodder production in vulnerable communities. These include small and medium water storage and small-holder irrigation infrastructure such as sand dams along lagas.

Maximized Community Scheme Benefits: Support community-based irri-

# Government unveils draft petroleum policy to attract investors

The Government, through the Ministry of Energy and Petroleum, has drafted a policy that, among other key issues, aims to attract investors to oil and gas exploration in the country.

The Draft National Petroleum Policy (2024), which is currently at the public participation stage, focuses on the sustainable exploration, exploitation, utilization, and management of petroleum resources and products to contribute to Kenya's economic development.

Once implemented, the policy will ensure effective management of revenue collected from oil and gas, promote equitable sharing of petroleum benefits, and enhance the use of liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) in the country.

Petroleum resources, including crude oil and natural gas, are found in sedimentary basins. Kenya has four sedimentary basins—Lamu, Anza, Mandera, and Tertiary Rift—which cover approximately 490,000 km<sup>2</sup>.

Due to their vastness, which makes exploration by a single investor chal-

lenging, the sedimentary basins are subdivided

into petroleum blocks. These blocks are licensed to various investors for exploration, appraisal, development, and production of oil and gas resources.

By June 2024, only nine of the 63 petroleum blocks had been licensed to four investors for petroleum operations, while the rest were still open for investment.

Speaking to KNA after a public participation forum for the policy in Garissa, Petroleum Engineer at the State Department for Petroleum, Vincent Areri, said most investors and

international financiers have been shying away from fossil fuel projects, making it hard to procure finance for the exploration of the Kenyan blocks.

"One of the challenges we have is that there is little interest in our blocks so in this policy, we have come up with strategies that will help us promote them so that we attract more investors.

This will be a good thing for us as a country because more money will be coming in with these investments," Areri said.

Further, Areri revealed that, although there are

investors for some oil and gas blocks, it takes time due to the back-and-forth negotiations between the government and a potential contractor or an actual contractor to finalize, especially on the concept of the field development plan, thus delaying production.

"The primary objective of the government is to protect its people and its resources, so until it is satisfied that everything has been done, then the project will not continue," he said.

Wakati wanafunzi hawa walipohama, serikali ili-

Tunataka wizara ya elimu iwaangalie pia kwa mafunzo mapya ili waweze kuwahudumia watoto wetu vizuri katika elimu yao,” alisema. Mkurugenzi wa Baraza la Kitaifa la Watu Wanaoishi na Ulemavu katika Kaunti ya Busia, Metrine Wamalwa, alitoa ombi la kuzingatia mahitaji ya watu wenye ulemavu wakati wa mpito wa wanafunzi. Alieleza pia wasiwasi wake kuhusu upokeaji wa masomo kwa wanafunzi wenye ulemavu wa kusikia. “Wakati wanafunzi wa Darasa la 9 wanapohamia Darasa la 10, wale wenye ulemavu wanapaswa kupewa kipaumbele. Tumeambiwa kuhusu kutiririsha masomo kwa kutumia teknolojia, lakini wasiwasi wangu ni kuhusu yule mwanafunzi ambaye ni kiziwi” alisema.

Serikali inaongeza uzalishaji wa pamoja, muunganisho wa bio-ethanol, na ufikiaji wa nishati safi ifikapo 2030.

Waziri wa Kawi (CS) Opiyo Wandayi alisema serikali inatetea ubadilishanaji wa mseto wa nishati nchini Kenya ili kukidhi mahitaji yanayooongezeka ya nishati huku ikishughulikia maswala ya mabadiliko ya hali ya anga.

Uzalishaji wa pamoja—uzalishaji wa wakati huo huo wa umeme na joto muhimu—pamoja na bio-ethanol inayotokana na sekta ya sukari, imetambuliwa kuwa mojawapo ya njia mbadala endelevu zaidi za nishati ya kisukuku na biomasi.

Ili kufikia lengo hili, Idara ya Serikali ya Nishati, kwa ushirikiano na sekta ya sukari, imetekeleza hatua za kupanua uzalishaji wa ushirikiano na bio-ethanol ili kusaidia kuziba pengo la nishati.

Wandayi alibainisha kuwa licha ya kuzalisha lita milioni 11.3 za ethanol

kila mwaka, nchi inakabiliwa na mahitaji yanayooongezeka ya zaidi ya lita milioni 40 kwa mwaka, upungufu unaopatikana kwa sasa kupitia uagizaji wa bidhaa kutoka nje.

Aliongeza kuwa mahitaji yanatarajiwa kuongezeka mara tano ifikapo 2035, na hivyo kutoa changamoto na fursa kwa uzalishaji wa ndani.

Kulingana na Waziri, sekta ya sukari kwa sasa ina uwezo wa kuzalisha MW 196 za umeme, ambazo bado hazitumiki. Pamoja na uwekezaji wa

ziada, uwezo huu unaweza kuzidi MW 300, kutoa chanzo cha nishati thabiti na safi kusaikia lengo la Kenya la kufikia asilimia 100 ya nishati safi na ufikiaji wa umeme kwa wote ifikapo 2030.

Akizungumza mjini Kisumu wakati wa Kongamano la Co-generation na Bio-ethanol, Wandayi alisema mpango huo unaambatana na juhudi za nchi kufikia Lengo la 7 la Maendeleo Endelevu, ambalo linalenga kutoa suluhu za nishati ya kiasa kwa wote huku ikik

abilia na mabadiliko ya hali ya hewa.

“Tumeweka malengo ya kitaifa kuelekea lengo hili ikiwa ni pamoja na upatikanaji wa umeme na upishi safi kwa wote ifikapo 2030 ili kuleta mabadiliko ya kijamii na kiuchumi. Kwa njia hii pia tutakuwa tunafikia majukumu yetu ya kitaifa kwa mifumo ya kimataifa kama vile michango iliyoamuliwa kitaifa,” alisema.

Ili kuharakisha maendeleo ya sekta hizi, serikali tayari imetekeleza mipango kama vile Sera ya Malisho kwa Ushuru iliyoanzishwa mwaka wa 2018, kuhimiza uwekezaji katika nishati mbadala.

# Kenya Kwanza's economic agenda: Milestones in agriculture, infrastructure, and job creation under the Plan

wa kuinua wale walio katika tabaka la chini la mapato. pyramid. These priorities led us to five core sectors: Agriculture, the Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) economy, Housing and Settlement, Healthcare, the Digital Superhighway, and the Creative Economy.

As of March 12, 2025, the Kenya Kwanza Administration reaches the midpoint of its term in office. A mid-term review provides a comprehensive assessment of progress, challenges, and the effectiveness of policies implemented thus far. By analyzing key achievements, financial performance, policy impact, and socio-economic trends, this review ensures that strategies remain on track to deliver tangible benefits to citizens.

In the first half of the fifth administration's five-year term, the scorecard can be summarized into five thematic areas that align with the commitments made in The Plan. This article highlights progress and achievements in these areas: fostering macro-economic stability as a prerequisite, interventions in key value chains, job creation, social welfare and social enablers, and expanding infrastructure as an enabler.

## Economic Stability and Reducing the Cost of Living

The government dedicated its first two and a half years to laying a strong macro-economic foundation. A stable economy fosters business growth, attracts investments, and reduces the cost of living for citizens. One major intervention in economic stability was the reduction of fuel costs, a critical factor in transport and production expenses. Through strategic policy changes, demurrage costs were reduced by 77%, dropping from \$2,227,411.70 to \$496,382.53. This move significantly stabilized production and transportation costs.

Foreign exchange stability has also been a success story. In January 2024, the exchange rate stood at Ksh 160.8 per

USD, putting pressure on imports, debt servicing, and inflation. However, effective monetary policies and foreign exchange management have helped stabilize the exchange rate at Ksh 129.19 per USD by March 2025. This development has eased the cost burden on imported goods and strengthened Kenya's economic position.

The cost of living index has improved, with inflation dropping from 9.2% in September 2022 to 3.5% in February 2025. This decline can be attributed to fiscal discipline, targeted subsidies, and prudent monetary policies that have eased financial pressures on households.

Electricity costs, a key driver of economic performance, have also been addressed. Between 2022 and 2025, power generation increased from 3,076 MW to 3,243 MW, while transmission lines expanded by 27%, covering 9,954 km. These improvements enhanced connectivity, with household connections rising from 8.9 million to 9.85 million, thereby reducing electricity costs for businesses and consumers.

Interest rates were lowered to support investment, with the Central Bank Rate decreasing from 11.25% in December 2024 to 10.75% in February 2025. Additionally, the Kenya Mortgage Refinance Company reduced its rates by 6.2%, making homeownership more accessible and stimulating the real estate sector.

Managing government debt was another priority, with the fiscal deficit reducing from 6.2% to 5.2% of GDP. As a result, Kenya's credit rating improved, with Moody's upgrading the country's outlook from negative to positive in January 2025. Through enhanced revenue collection and strict expenditure controls, the government directed more resources toward infrastructure, healthcare, and education, rather than excessive debt servicing.

Foreign exchange reserves surpassed USD 10 billion in February 2025, strengthening the nation's ability to manage economic shocks and support imports. Meanwhile, prudent fiscal management contributed to the reduction of the fiscal deficit from 6.2% to 5.2% of GDP, earning Kenya a credit rating upgrade from Moody's in January 2025.

Trade performance has also improved significantly, with exports to the East African Community rising from KES 226.4 billion in 2022 to KES 305.8 billion in 2025. Kenya secured permanent tariff-free access to the European Union in July 2024, and a trade agreement

with the UAE, signed in January 2025, has created new opportunities for agricultural exports.

## Agriculture and Key Value Chains

Agriculture remains the backbone of Kenya's economy, contributing 50% of GDP and sustaining the livelihoods of two-thirds of the population. Recognizing the sector's potential to drive growth and job creation, the government has heavily invested in value chain development, farmer support programs, and agro-processing. A key intervention has been the fertilizer subsidy program, which reduced fertilizer prices by 67%, from KES 7,500 per 50kg bag in 2022 to KES 2,500 in 2025. A total of 53.6 million e-vouchers have been issued to farmers, ensuring access to essential inputs. These efforts have resulted in a 39% increase in maize production, with yields rising to 85.7 million bags. Rice production has surged by 32%, sugarcane acreage has expanded by 19%, and sugar production has increased by 76%. These efforts have also boosted tea and coffee yields, ensuring better returns for smallholder farmers.

As a result, the price of a 2kg bag of maize flour has dropped from approximately KES 230 in 2022 to an average of KES 140 in 2025, easing household food expenses, given that maize is Kenya's staple food crop. Similarly, sugar prices have stabilized due to increased local produc-

tion, reducing reliance on expensive imports. The reduced cost of staple foods has eased financial pressure on families, making essential goods more affordable and improving overall food security.

The livestock and dairy sectors have also seen significant growth, with milk production increasing by 13%, from 4.6 billion liters in 2022 to 5.2 billion liters in 2025. Dairy exports rose by 92%, reaching KES 9.4 billion, while the Guaranteed Minimum Return (GMR) for milk increased from KES 37 to KES 50 per liter. The livestock industry has expanded, with meat exports rising by 29%, supported by strategic investments in value addition and market access. The leather industry experienced a 110% rise in employment, with leather export value growing by 56%. Kenanie Leather Park, nearing completion in Athi River, Machakos County, is expected to inject KES 175 billion into the economy and create 25,000 jobs, providing a major boost to the livestock value chain.

Various strategic and policy interventions have also stabilized farmer earnings, with GMRs set for different crops. For example, a GMR of KES 5,300 per tonne for sugar, KES 5,300 per 90kg bag of wheat, and KES 100 per kg for macadamia. In the cotton sector, 56.6 metric tonnes of BT cotton seeds and 140 metric tonnes of OPV seeds were distributed, alongside 600 liters of pesticides, boosting production. The edible oils

sector expanded with a 90.6% increase in oil crop farming, driven by the distribution of 556 metric tonnes of sunflower seeds and 42,000 coconut seedlings.

Kenya's fishing and blue economy sectors have also experienced growth, with freshwater fish production rising by 12% to 121,357 metric tonnes and marine fish by 5% to 39,950 metric tonnes (YEAR). Eight new fish landing sites were completed, and 274 deep-sea fishing boats were distributed, boosting yields. The mining sector expanded with a KES 5.8 billion gold refinery in Kakamega, a KES 2.5 billion granite plant in Vihiga, and the revival of fluorspar mining in Elgeyo Marakwet. Licensing reforms processed 1,400 applications, attracting KES 169 billion in investments, while 228 artisanal mining cooperatives were established.

One of the key Kenya Kwanza manifesto commitments was job creation. This has remained a top priority over the last two and a half years, with the government implementing targeted programs across multiple sectors. The digital economy, labor migration, affordable housing projects, and agriculture have been key drivers of employment expansion.

The number of online workers under the Ajira and Jitume programs have surged exponentially from 41,382 in 2022 to 182,568 in 2025, marking a 323 percent increase in digital jobs and earnings while





the gig economy expanded through freelancing and e-commerce resulting from increased broadband and Wi-Fi connectivity countrywide. Skilled and non-skilled job placements abroad also grew by 1,279 percent, from 14,651 in 2022 to 202,125 in 2025, supported by new bilateral agreements with the United Kingdom, the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, Germany, and Austria. Skilled and unskilled labor migration has also expanded, with overseas job placements rising by 1,279%, from 14,651 in 2022 to 202,125 in 2025.

The housing sector also created an additional 188,256 new jobs between 2022 to 2025 through affordable housing projects, with 130,988 housing units under construction. KES 4.4 billion was allocated to Jua Kali artisans, and KES 63.5 billion was disbursed through the Hustler Fund, supporting small businesses and self-employment initiatives. Additional jobs were also created by establishment of eight new fish landing sites, and distribution of 274 deep-sea fishing boats as well as expansion in the Mining and Agriculture sectors. The sectoral reports on job creation are a clear indicator that the Kenya Kwanza Administration has made significant progress on the job creation promise.

Infrastructure is a key enabler of economic growth, social transformation, and sustainable development, playing a crucial role in achieving the BETA development goals. Investments in roads, water, energy, ICT, the blue economy, market construction, last-mile electricity connectivity, and housing have significantly improved access to critical services, driving progress for businesses and individuals. The main challenge in infrastructure development has been its high financial outlay, lengthy procurement procedures and prolonged implementation timeframes. However, good progress has been made and the government is on track to fulfil its infrastructure commitments.

A major milestone in Kenya's infrastructure development during the period in review is the completion of the Northern Collector Tunnel, a transformative project designed to improve water supply for Nairobi and its surrounding areas. The project is part of a comprehensive master plan to secure water access for Nairobi and thirteen surrounding satellite towns.



Before the project's completion, Nairobi faced a severe water deficit of approximately 125,000 cubic meters per day. The project has increased Nairobi's water storage capacity by 100 million cubic meters annually and is expected to benefit an estimated 1.2 million people.

Transportation infrastructure remains a priority in national development. Between 2022 and 2025, 6,000 kilometers of roads have been constructed while an additional 1,343 kilometers of blacktop roads have been added, improving both rural and urban mobility. The government has also undertaken maintenance of 94,322 kilometers. Air transport has seen improvements, with 14 airstrips rehabilitated. These developments have been instrumental in fostering economic growth by reducing travel time, increasing safety, and enhancing access to markets, schools, and healthcare facilities.

ICT infrastructure has also been expanded significantly. The government installed an additional 4,690 KMs of fiber optic cabling thereby expanding connectivity by 53 percent, from 8,900 km in 2022 to 13,590 km in 2025. The government also established 282 digital hubs and deployed 1,563 public Wi-Fi hotspots. Electricity access expanded through last-mile connectivity, with 5,843,258 new households connected, increasing national access from 72 percent in 2022 to 73 percent in 2025. New markets were developed in Garissa, Takaba, Banisa, Marsabit, Keraga, Lanet, Wanguru and Nanyuki, boosting market accessibility and commercial activity.

#### Progress On Social Enablers and Citizen Welfare

Beyond infrastructure and hardware, the government has also made

good progress on social welfare and social enabler initiatives. Social enablers are essential in fostering economic resilience, reducing inequalities, and improving the quality of life for citizens. They serve as the foundation for a thriving society by ensuring access to quality healthcare, education, housing, digital services, and social protection. By investing in these critical areas, the government strengthens the human capital, productivity, and overall well-being of its people, paving the way for sustainable national development.

The Inua Jamii program expanded significantly, increasing financial support for older persons by 66 percent, from 732,914 to 1,215,343 beneficiaries and thereby improving their livelihoods, dignity and quality of life. Support for orphans and vulnerable children grew by 65 percent, from 259,654 to 428,421, while assistance for persons with disabilities increased by 34 percent, from 44,603 to 59,637. Women's empowerment initiatives saw a major boost, with loan disbursements under the Women Enterprise Fund increasing by 92 percent. School retention for girls improved through the distribution of 18.3 million sanitary towels. The government also increased the number of households that received regular cash transfers from 118,803 in 2022 to 127,797 in 2025 through the Hunger Safety Net Programme (HSNP). It also increased the number of beneficiaries supported with relief food in ASAL counties from 300,000 in 2022 to 600,000 in 2025.

#### Expanding UHC to all Kenyans

The most significant intervention in Healthcare has been the transition from NHIF to SHIF necessitated by the need to address NHIF's inefficiencies and expand healthcare

access under Universal Health Coverage (UHC) to all Kenyans, a key promise under the Kenya Kwanza Manifesto. NHIF faced challenges such as limited coverage, focusing mainly on inpatient services while lacking comprehensive outpatient care, preventive treatments, and chronic disease management. It was also plagued by inefficiencies and corruption, leading to slow service delivery and financial mismanagement.

Additionally, NHIF contributions were costly, particularly for informal sector workers, while service quality remained inconsistent. SHIF has introduced broader healthcare coverage, including outpatient services, specialized treatments, chronic disease care, and preventive medicine. It is designed to enhance efficiency and accountability through digital solutions making health services and records universally available across multiple providers and automated systems, and decentralized healthcare delivery at county and community levels.

The operationalization of SHIF has had teething problems as would be expected at infancy for a project of this magnitude but is on track to providing universal healthcare for all citizens as envisioned. The SHIF has had an exponential 146.25 percent increase in membership from 8 million enrollees in 2022 under NHIF to 19.7 million in 2025 under SHIF. Additionally, the implementation of a state-of-the-art Integrated Health Information Management System (IHIMS) has significantly enhanced data-driven decision-making in Kenya's healthcare sector. The Health Information Exchange System (HIES) has been operationalized, ensuring real-time access to patient data across different healthcare providers, thereby improving

decision-making and reducing redundancies.

To support the system, 7,000 digital devices have been distributed to public healthcare facilities nationwide, enabling seamless data collection and management. As of 2025, 51% of all health facilities (8,587 out of 16,579) have been enrolled in HIES, facilitating improved data sharing and integration across the country. Additionally, all 47 counties now have Electronic Community Health Information System coverage, further strengthening healthcare service delivery and resource allocation.

The Government has significantly expanded Kenya's primary healthcare services through the Community Health Promoters (CHPs) program, ensuring better coverage and improved healthcare delivery at the grassroots level. Since 2022, the number of trained CHPs has surged by 99.6%, increasing from 0 to 106,542 in 2025. These health workers have been equipped with 100,000 essential kits, up from just 1,000 kits in 2022, ensuring they have the necessary tools to provide quality healthcare. The CHP program has made significant progress in household healthcare access, covering 8.5 million households, or 68% of the targeted 12.5 million homes. Through their work, 331,265 Kenyans were referred for diabetes management, 711,172 for hypertension assessment, and 134,271 pregnant women received antenatal care. Additionally, CHPs assessed 6.9 million children under five for illnesses such as malnutrition, diarrhea, malaria, and pneumonia, leading to timely medical interventions. The Linda Mama program also facilitated 134,271 maternal healthcare referrals, improving childbirth outcomes.

#### Increase In Education Enrollment and Improved Transition Rates

In the education sector, 76,000 teachers were recruited to address the rampant teacher shortages, thereby improving the teacher-student ratio and boosting instructional quality. The Competency-Based Curriculum (CBC) transition was supported by the construction of 16,000 new classrooms to accommodate Junior Secondary students, ensuring a smooth transition and reducing congestion in schools. The school feeding program expanded by 15.15%, increasing beneficiaries from 2,257,963 in 2022 to 2,600,000 in 2025, improving student nutrition and retention.

In Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET), enrolment grew by 42%, from 340,713 students in 2022 to 484,313 in 2025 thereby improving availability of technical skills and employability. TVET trainer numbers increased from 6,051 to 9,779, with 6,840 trainers trained on Competency-Based Education and Training (CBET). Higher education saw the establishment of the Open University of Kenya, enrolling 2,000 students and introducing eight new academic programs. University funding increased, with 113,140 students receiving scholarships worth KES 12.74 billion, and 112,741 students receiving loans worth KES 12.63 billion. In TVET, 52,452 students received scholarships worth KES 1.95 billion, while 151,933 students received loans worth KES 5.59 billion, enhancing accessibility to education.

Under the able leadership of President Dr. William Ruto, The Kenya Kwanza Administration has made remarkable progress in strengthening economic stability, expanding infrastructure, improving food security, creating jobs, and enhancing social welfare and is well on track towards delivering on its promises to Kenyans. Whereas implementation of the plan has also faced various challenges along the way, the achievements have laid a strong foundation for long-term economic growth, prosperity, and inclusivity, ensuring that Kenya continues on its path toward sustainable development and improved livelihoods for all citizens.

Kitengo hiki kilianzishwa kwa msaada wa Benki ya Dunia chini ya Mradi wa Maendeleo ya Mnyororo wa Thamani ya Kilimo Nchini (NAVDP), na kinakusudia kuwapa wakulima mafunzo muhimu kuhusu utunzaji wa baada ya mavuno, uhi-fadhi, na kuongeza muda wa maisha ya mazao yao. Akizungumza wakati wa Wiki ya Mkulima ya Kila Mwaka katika viwanja vya KALRO HRI, Dkt. Charity Gathambiri, mtafiti wa baada ya mavuno katika HRI, alisisitiza umuhimu wa kitengo cha baridi kisicho na nishati kama mojawapo ya uvumbuzi muhimu wa kupunguza hasara za baada ya mavuno. Gathambiri alieleza kuwa kitengo cha baridi kisicho na nishati, kilichotengenezwa kwa matofali na mchanga, hutumia uvukizi ili kudumisha joto la chini ndani. Alikitaja uvumbuzi huu

kuwa wa gharama nafuu. "Kwa ajili ya kitengo cha baridi kisicho na nishati, unajenga kuta mbili za matofali na kuweka mchanga katikati, kisha unanyunyiza mchanga kwa maji. Wakati mchanga unaponyun-iziwa maji na kufunikwa na kifaa kinachozuia joto, uvukizi hutokea, ambao husaidia kudumisha joto la chini ndani ikilinganishwa na joto la nje," alieleza mtafiti huyo. Aliongeza kuwa teknolojia ya kitengo cha baridi kisicho na nishati inapanua muda wa maisha ya mazao ya bustani kama matunda, mboga mboga na mengine kwa kipindi kirefu na aliwataka wakulima kuikubali. Gathambiri alieleza

kuwa wakulima wengi wa maembe na wale wa Kaunti ya Marsabit wamefanikiwa kutumia vifaa vinavyopatikana kienyeji kujenga vitengo vya baridi visivyo na nishati, ambavyo vinahifadhi mavuno yao na kupunguza hasara za baada ya mavuno. Kwa wale wasioweza kumudu kununua vitengo vya baridi, mtafiti alishauri kuhifadhi mazao yali-yovunwa chini ya kivuli cha miti na kuyafunika kwa gunia lenye unyevu kama mbadala. "Suluhisho lingine lenye ufanisi ni kuongeza thamani kupitia usindikaji wa kilimo. Hii ni pamoja na matumizi ya vifaa vya kavu ili kupunguza maudhui ya maji katika mazao," aliongeza.

Gathambiri alieleza kuwa KALRO kwa kushirikiana na Shirika la Ushirikiano la Kimataifa la Uturuki (TIKA) pia walitoa vifaa mbalimbali kwa ajili ya maabara ya baada ya mavuno na kitengo cha mafunzo, ambavyo vitakuwa na mchango mkubwa katika kuongeza thamani ya matunda na mboga mboga. Vifaa hivyo, alieleza, vitatumika kwa ajili ya kukaushia, usindikaji, na kuiva kwa matunda na mboga mboga, hivyo kuwezesha uzalishaji wa bidhaa kama jamu ya ndizi, juisi ya nyanya, crisps za plantain, na juisi za asili. Mboga kavu, aliongeza, zina muda mrefu wa kuhifadhiwa na zinaweza kumwondolea mkulima shinikizo la kuuza mazao mapya kwa hasara. Gathambiri aliwataka wakulima kote nchini kukumbatia teknolojia mpya za baada ya mavuno ili kupunguza zaidi hasara za mazao ya bustani na kuboresha uimara na faida ya mazao yao. Kwa upande wake, Mkurugenzi wa Taasisi, Dkt. Joseph Njuguna, alisisitiza umuhimu wa utunzaji bora wa baada ya mavuno ili kuimarisha usalama wa chakula na kuboresha mapato ya wakulima. Dkt. Njuguna alieleza kuwa changamoto kubwa katika kilimo cha bustani ni ubora wa mazao yanayoharibika haraka.

### CS apongeza Uasin Gishu kwa maendeleo ya miradi ya EPZ na Hifadhi za Viwanda

Waziri wa Uwekezaji, Biashara, na Viwanda, Lee Kinyanjui, amepongeza Serikali ya Kaunti ya Uasin Gishu kwa kujitolea kwake katika kuanzisha Mikoa ya Usindikaji wa Uzao wa Nje (EPZ) na Miji ya Kusanya na Viwanda (CAIP). Waziri alisema kwamba serikali imeipa kipaumbele CAIP 13 kati ya 18 zinazojengwa kitaifa, huku Uasin Gishu iki-shika nafasi ya nne katika maendeleo ya ujenzi. Zaidi ya hayo, serikali inajenga EPZ nne katika Eldoret (Kaunti ya Uasin Gishu), Murang'a, Kirinyaga, na Busia. CAIP zinajengwa kupitia ushirikiano kati ya serikali kuu na za kaunti, ambapo serikali ya kaunti inachangia Sh250 milioni na kutoa ardhi, wakati serikali kuu nayo inatoa Sh250 milioni. "Tathmini ya miradi miwili katika kaunti inaonyesha kuwa inaendelea kulingana na muda unaotarajiwa. Katika miezi moja hadi miwili ijayo, EPZ katika eneo la Cherunya

la Kapseret na CAIP katika Moiben zitakamilika," alisema Waziri. Akizungumza katika Eldoret wakati wa ziara ya kujifunza kuhusu miradi ya serikali kuu inayotekelezwa na wizara yake, Bwana Kinyanjui alisema Kaunti ya Uasin Gishu ina uwezo wa kuwa kituo kikuu cha viwanda kwa nchi na pia kwa eneo la Afrika Mashariki ukizingatia miundombinu iliyopo tayari kama vile Uwanja wa Ndege wa Kimataifa wa Eldoret, barabara inayounganisha eneo la Afrika Mashariki na reli, pamoja na kuwepo kwa Ofisi za Shirika la Viwango la Kenya (KEBS) na Mamlaka ya Mapato ya Kenya (KRA) katika eneo hilo. Kwa miundombinu na mazingira ya biashara yanayowezeshwa na serikali, Uasin Gishu inafaa kuwa mparki wa viwanda ndani ya Kenya na eneo la Afrika Mashariki, alisema Kinyanjui.

### Soko kwa vifaa vya mikono vya kina mama kupatikana

Hifadhi ya urithi wa kitamaduni wa jamii na uundaji wa masoko kwa wanawake wanaotengeneza bidhaa za jadi ni mahitaji muhimu. Naibu Gavana wa Nandi, Dkt. ya tamaduni na urithi. "Kama kaunti, tumeamua kuunga mkono tamaduni, kutoa umakini zaidi kuliko ilivyokuwa zamani, hivyo mbele tutakuwa tukiwafundisha vikundi vyetu vya ngoma za kitamaduni na tutakuwa na mashindano ya ngoma kabla ya siku yetu ya tamaduni mwishoni mwa mwaka," alisema. Dkt. Mitei alipendekeza kwamba ikiwa wanawake wengi watafikia nafasi za uongozi, jamii inayowajali watu wote itaweza kuundwa ambapo sauti za kila mmoja zitaskika. "Kipaumbele kiko katika kuongeza uwakilishi wa wanawake katika nafasi za uchaguzi ili kufikia sheria ya 'the two thirds', tukitumia fursa hii kujit challenge na kuwahimiza wanawake wengi kujitandikisha kwa ajili ya nafasi za uongozi," alisema. Wakati huo huo, wanawake mara nyingi hutazamwa kama chanzo cha tamaduni katika mazingira ya Kiafrika ya jadi, mbali na kuwa ni wahifadhi wa jamii.

## Taasisi ya Utafiti wa Mazao ya Mifugo kuongeza mara tatu uzalishaji wa malisho, idadi ya mifugo

Taasisi ya Utafiti wa Maziwa katika Naivasha, ambalo ni tawi la Shirika la Utafiti la Kilimo na Mifugo la Kenya (KALRO), imetangaza mipango ya kuongeza mara tatu uzalishaji wa lishe ya mifugo na mara mbili ya idadi ya mifugo katika miaka ijayo. Kama sehemu ya mpango huu, taasisi hiyo itaongeza kilimo cha lucerne kutoka ekari 165 za sasa hadi ekari 500 ili kukidhi mahitaji ya chakula ya mifugo inayokua katika shamba lake kubwa la ekari 3,000.

Kwa mujibu wa Mkurugenzi wa taasisi hiyo, Dkt. Samuel Mbuku, malengo haya yatafanikiwa kwa kuboresha na kupanua mfumo wa umwagiliaji wa shamba ili kuongeza uzalishaji wa lucerne, ambayo imebainika kuwa kipengele muhimu katika kuongeza uzalishaji wa mifugo. Akizungumza katika tukio la shambani huko Naivasha, Dkt. Mbuku alisema kuwa taasisi hiyo pia itatumia teknolojia ya ujazi wa bandia (AI) kuongeza idadi ya mifugo na kuboresha uzalishaji, ikilenga kuimarisha mapato ya

ndani kutokana na kupungua kwa fedha za serikali. "Katika miaka michache ijayo, tunapanga kuongeza mara tatu kilimo chetu cha lucerne kutoka ekari 165 hadi 500 na mara mbili ya idadi ya mifugo yetu ili kuongeza mapato yetu," alisema Dkt. Mbuku. Dkt. Mbuku aliongeza taasisi imekuwa ikionyesha teknolojia mbalimbali, uvumbuzi, na mbinu za usimamizi kwa maelfu ya wakulima, na kuwapatia maarifa ya kuboresha uzalishaji wa mifugo. Aliongeza kuwa wakulima pia wanategemea taa-

sisi kununua vifaa vya kupanda, rasilimali za kimaumbile za mifugo, na aina za mifugo, ikiwa ni pamoja na ng'ombe wa Sahiwal, ambao ume-pata umaarufu miongoni mwa wakulima wadogo kwa uzalishaji wake na uwezo wake wa kustahimili hali ya hewa ngumu. Hadi sasa, taasisi hiyo imetambuliwa kama kiongozi wa utafiti katika bara la Afrika katika maeneo yanayohusiana na mifugo kama vile ng'ombe, kuku wa asili wa KARLO, nguruwe na mbuzi miongoni mwa wengine.
