Ogamba alisema kuwa hii inatokana na maendeleo yaliyopatikana katika kuanadaa miongozo ya mpito na upangaji wa wanafunzi kwa ushirikiano na wadau wote. Waziri aliwaagiza wakuu wote wa shule za msingi za chini kuhakikisha walimu wa taaluma (career masters)

wanashirikiana na wazazi wa wanafunzi wa Darasa la 9 ili kuhakikisha wana habari sahihi za kuwaongoza kufanya maamuzi sahihi. Akizungumza wakati wa mahafali ya walimu 353 katika Chuo cha Ualimu cha Tambach, Kaunti ya Elgeyo Marakwet, Waziri alisema wizara inafurahishwa kuona kuwa mpito wa wanafunzi kutoka shule ya msingi ya chini kwenda sekondari mwakani unaendelea vizuri. Wizara yanunua dozi 6.2m za chanjo ya Polio na BCG ili kukabiliana na upungufu nchini

Wizara ya Afya imepata dozi milioni 3.2 za chanjo ya Polio pamoja na dozi milioni 3 za chanjo ya Bacillus Calmette-Guérin (BCG) ili kukabiliana na upungufu wa bidhaa unaoshuhudiwa nchini.

Akitoa tangazo hilo katika ofisi yake ya Afya House jijini Nairobi, Katibu wa Huduma za Matibabu, Dkt. Ouma Oluga amesema kwamba dozi milioni 3.2 za chanjo ya Polio zinaendelea kushughulikiwa katika Bandari ya

Mombasa huku chanjo za BCG zikitarajiwa kuwasili nchini mapema wiki hii.

“Tumepokea kwa kweli dozi milioni 3.2 za polio na tunatarajia kupata dozi zingine milioni 3 za chanjo ya BCG, kwa hivyo hakuna sababu ya kuwa na wasiwasi,” alisema.

Tangazo hili linakuja wakati ambapo kuna wasiwasi uliotolewa na baadhi ya vituo vya afya katika angalau kaunti 12 zilizoathirika kuhusu upungufu wa bidhaa hizi muhimu.

Malipo ya Sh600 milioni kwa waathiriwa wa Bwawa la Mwache kuanza wiki ijayo

Idara ya Jimbo ya Umwagiliaji, kupitia Tume ya Kitaifa ya Ardhi (NLC), imejipanga kuanza kulipa Sh600 milioni kwa Watu Wanaoathirika na Mradi wa Bwawa la Mwache Multi-Purpose (PAPs), huku mradi huu wa mabilioni ya shilingi ukikua kwa kasi. Shida ya fidia ilikuwa im-

ehatarisha kuzorotesha mradi wa Sh20 bilioni, ambao unalenga kuboresha usalama wa maji kwa njia endelevu, kujenga uwezo wa kukabiliana na mabadiliko ya tabianchi, kuongeza usambazaji mkubwa wa maji, na kupanua upatikanaji wa maji na usafi wa mazingira katika eneo la Pwani. Katibu Mkuu wa Umwagil-

iaji, Ephantus Kimotho, alikiri kuwa kulipa fidia zaidi ya PAP 4,000 ilikuwa changamoto kubwa mwanzoni mwa ujenzi wa bwawa, ambapo jumla ya Sh4.6 bilioni ilihitajika kwa fidia na uhamishaji makazi. Serikali ya awali ilitumia Sh1.6 bilioni, wakati serikali ya sasa ilitengeneza mpango kamili wa uhamishaji makazi kufanikisha

kulipa salio la Sh3 bilioni. “Shilingi bilioni 1 tayari zimetolewa, na watu wamepata fidia,” alisema PS Kimotho, akiongeza kuwa NLC imetolewa Sh600 milioni, ambazo zitalipwa kwa PAP wiki ijayo. “Kuanza mwezi Julai, salio la Sh1.4 bilioni litalipwa, na tunatarajia PAP wote

la kwanza chini ya mpango wa Mafunzo ya Ualimu Kulingana na Umahiri (CBTE), Ogamba alisema mafunzo yao yamekusudiwa kuandaa walimu ambao siyo tu wenye maarifa bali pia wenye ujuzi, wanaotafakari na kuweza kujibu mahitaji yanayobadilika ya wanafunzi wa karne ya 21. “Mpango wa Kimkakati wa Sekta ya Elimu Kitaifa (NESSP) 2023–2027 unatoa wito wa kuwapa mafunzo ya ziada wakufunzi wote ili kuwezesha utekelezaji wa mtaala wa CBTE kwa ufanisi,” alisema. Akisisitiza umuhimu wa walimu katika utekelezaji wa Elimu Kulingana na Umahiri, Waziri alisema wizara imejitolea

kuhakikisha kuwa taasisi zote za mafunzo ya walimu zina vifaa vya kutosha kutoa elimu ya ubora kwa walimu wanaofundishwa. Aliipongeza chuo kwa mafanikio yake katika shughuli mbalimbali za ziada za kielimu, akisema kuwa ni sehemu muhimu ya elimu kamili. Aliibainisha kuwa chini ya CBTE, ujifunzaji hauishii darasani pekee bali unajumuisha shughuli za ziada zinazojenga ustahimilivu na sifa muhimu katika taaluma ya ualimu. “Utofauti na ujumuishi wa maeneo ya ujifunzaji na shughuli za ziada chini ya CBTE unatoa fursa ya kukuza walimu wanaoweza kutambua na kutumia fursa za kutoa mtaala katika mazingira mbalimbali ya ujifunzaji,” alisema.

Akiwahakikishia msaada wa wizara katika maendeleo ya miundombinu ya chuo hicho, Waziri alitaka bodi ya chuo kushirikiana na serikali kwa kuanzisha shughuli za kujipatia mapato ambazo zinaweza kufadhili maeneo muhimu ya kipaumbele. Alihimiza bodi kuendelea kushirikiana na wadai na washirika kama NG-CDF, serikali ya kaunti, na wafadhili wengine ili kuboresha miundombinu. Akibainisha kuwa serikali imetoa jumla ya ruzuku ya Shilingi milioni 31.4 kwa chuo hicho katika miaka mitatu ya fedha, Ogamba alisisitiza jukumu muhimu la bodi katika kuhakikisha uwazi na uwajibikaji wa rasilimali za chuo.

walipwe kufikia Desemba 2025,” PS aliongeza wakati wa sherehe ya kuanzisha ujenzi wa Kituo cha Afya cha Mwache, sehemu ya mradi wa bwawa, pamoja na Gavana wa Kwale, Fatuma Achan. Mradi huu umebuniwa kujumuishwa bwawa kuu, bwawa la kudhibiti chini, na bwawa la kudhibiti juu. Bwawa kuu, lenye urefu wa mita 84 na urefu wa tundu la kilele la mita 526, litakuwa na uwezo wa kuhifadhi mita za ujazo milioni 127 za maji. Lita-chukua mtririko wa maji kutoka mto Mwache kwa ajili ya usambazaji wa maji ya nyumbani. PS alibainisha kuwa bwawa kuu limekamiliwa kwa asilimia 36.

Awali, mradi ulipoanza kupata changamoto, ulibaki kwenye asilimia 4, lakini kazi zinaendelea vizuri baada ya changamoto hizo kushughulikiwa kupitia ushirikiano kati ya Idara ya Umwagiliaji, kaunti na jamii. “Tumeweza kuona maendeleo makubwa kutoka asilimia 4 hadi 36, lakini katika sehemu moja ya mradi – bwawa la kudhibiti chini, tuko asilimia 59 na tunatarajia kukamilika kufikia Desemba,” PS alisema. Bwawa kuu, lenye uwezo wa kuhifadhi maji wa mita za ujazo milioni 136, litahudumia zaidi ya mita za ujazo 186,000 za maji kila siku kwa Mombasa, na kuondoa upungufu wa maji wa asilimia 75 katika jiji hilo la bandari.

Lakini Dkt. Oluga alitumia fursa hiyo kuwahakikishia wananchi kwamba Wizara ya Afya imeanzisha zoezi la kugawa upya bidhaa hizo, kuhakikisha kwamba kaunti zilizo na akiba zinashirikiana na zile ambazo zimeishiwa. “Kama tunavyozungumza sasa, kuna kaunti 35 ambazo bado zina

chanjo hizi na takribani kaunti 12 ambazo zimeishiwa, na tunachokifanya ni kugawa upya. Kwa mfano, tumechukua baadhi ya chanjo kutoka Garissa kurudisha Nairobi, kutoka Meru na Embu kupeleka kwenye kaunti zingine za Magharibi, na tunajaribu kuhakikisha kwamba tunashirikiana tulicho nacho katika wiki chache zijazo,” alisema.

ENGAGING UNLICENSED MEDICAL/ DENTAL PRACTITIONERS

The Kenya Medical Practitioners and Dentists Council is a body corporate established under Section 3 of the Medical Practitioners and Dentists Act (CAP 253) with the mandate to regulate the training and practice of medicine, dentistry and community oral health within the Republic of Kenya. The Council is also mandated by CAP 253 to regulate health facilities within the country.

The Council wishes to remind all health facility owners, administrators practitioners, and the public of the following:

- Section 22(1):** Any person practicing as a medical or dental practitioner without being duly registered and licensed by KMPDC commits an offence. Upon conviction, they face a fine of up to **Ksh 5,000,000**, imprisonment for up to **five years**, or both.
- Section 22(4):** Any person in charge of a health institution who employs or engages an unregistered or unlicensed medical practitioner, dentist, or community oral health practitioner commits an offence. Upon conviction, they face a fine of up to **Ksh 10,000,000**, imprisonment for up to **five years**, or both.
- Employing or engaging any medical, dental, or community oral health practitioner—whether a Kenyan citizen or a foreign national—who is not registered and licensed by KMPDC is a serious offence.
- Foreign practitioners should only practice in the location indicated on their license. Health institutions should always inform KMPDC before engaging a foreign practitioner regardless of their licensure status.
- All foreign practitioners including those undertaking post graduate studies in the country must register with KMPDC before engaging in work or studies for licensure assessment and issuance.
- Any unregistered or unlicensed practitioner currently working in your health facility must be reported to the Council immediately.

KMPDC is committed to upholding patient safety and quality healthcare by ensuring only qualified and licensed practitioners operate in Kenya. Non-compliance with these regulations undermines public trust and endangers lives. The Council is actively conducting inspections and audits, including the ongoing review of foreign medical practitioners, to enforce compliance.

Wakulima wa parachichi katika kaunti ya Murang'a wana matumaini ya kupata mapato zaidi baada ya uzinduzi wa kituo cha kisasa cha kupangilia madaraja ya matunda na nyumba ya kufungasha katika Wadi ya Nga'raria, eneo bunge la Kandara. Kituo hiki cha kukusanya na kufungasha parachichi, kili-chokamilika kwa kituo cha kuhifadhi baridi katika Ushirika wa Wakulima wa Parachichi wa Murang'a (MAVOC), kina wanachama 5,689 kutoka vyama vya ushirika 16 vya misingi katika maeneo ya ukulima wa parachichi kaunti hiyo. Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi wa kituo hicho, Gavana Irungu Kang'ata alisisitiza kwamba serikali yake imejitolea kuimarisha na kusaidia wakulima wa parachichi katika eneo hilo. Alisifu Ushirika wa Wakulima wa Parachichi wa Murang'a kwa kuwaunganisha wakulima wa eneo hilo na kuwawezesha kupata masoko ya uhakika, hivyo kupata bei bora kwa mazao yao. Aliongeza kuwa serikali ya kaunti itaendelea kusaidia wakulima kupitia kuboresha miundombinu

na kuwaunganisha na masoko.

"Kituo hiki si hatua tu kwa sekta ya kilimo ya Murang'a, bali pia ni fursa kubwa ya ajira kwa vijana wetu," alisema. "Aidha, kituo hiki kitalita thamani zaidi kwa parachichi zetu, hivyo kusaidia wakulima kupata bei ya juu kwa mazao yao," aliongeza. Kang'ata pia alidokeza mipango

ya kuongeza thamani zaidi kwa parachichi katika siku za usoni. Kituo hiki ambacho kinamilikiwa na kuendeshwa na wakulima wenyewe ni mwanzo mpya kwao kwani kitawezesha MAVOC kufikia viwango vya kimataifa kwa kutoa huduma za kupanga, kusafisha, kupangilia na kufungasha matunda, hivyo kuongeza soko na ufuatiliaji wa parachichi za Murang'a kimataifa.

Mbunge Mteule Sabina Chege ambaye pia ni mwanachama wa Kamati ya Kilimo ya Bunge la Kitaifa alisisitiza umuhimu wa kuweka miongozo thabiti ili kuwalinda wakulima dhidi ya wizi wa parachichi. "Sasa kwa kuwa tunayo kituo hiki, tunahitaji kanuni bora, zikiwemo ratiba za kuvuna na kusafirisha matunda ili kuhibiti wizi wa parachichi kutoka mashambani," alisema, huku akiwahimiza wakulima wengine kujiunga na vyama vya ushirika kwani ni kwa umoja na masoko yaliyopangwa ndipo wanaweza kunufaika ipasavyo kutokana na uwekezaji huu. Wakulima waliohudhuria uzinduzi huo walieleza matumaini kwamba kituo hiki kipya kitasaidia kuondoa changamoto ya upotevu wa mazao baada ya kuvuna. Walieleza kwamba kwa miaka mingi wamekuwa wakipata bei duni na kupoteza mazao baada ya kuvuna kutokana na ukosefu wa miundombinu bora ya kuhifadhi na masoko. Walikaribisha maendeleo hayo mapya wakisema ni mwanzo mpya katika safari yao ya kilimo cha parachichi. "Nimekuwa nikilima parachichi kwa zaidi ya miaka kumi na nina zaidi ya miti 100," alisema Purity Mwihaiki

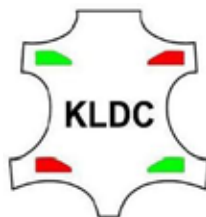

Serikali imeongeza samaki katika Bwawa la Turkwel kwa kuingiza vifaranga 80,000 vya samaki aina ya tilapia ili kuongeza idadi ya samaki na kudumisha uvuvi kama chanzo muhimu cha riziki. Akizungumza na wanahabari katika Bwawa la Turkwel, Ann Mokoro, mkurugenzi wa kanda kwa kaunti tano za eneo la North Rift—ikiwemo West

Pokot, Trans Nzoia, Elgeyo Marakwet, Turkana na Uasin Gishu—alisema kuwa utafiti wa hivi karibuni umebaini kupungua kwa idadi ya samaki katika bwawa hilo, hali iliyolazimu juhudi za kurejesha upya samaki. “Utafiti wa bwawa umeonyesha upungufu mkubwa wa idadi ya samaki, jambo linaloashiria umuhimu wa kurejesha upya samaki,” alisema Mokoro. Alieleza kwamba kupungua

kwa idadi ya samaki kume- waathiri wavuvi kwa kiasi kikubwa, kwani walikuwa wanapata samaki wachache kiasi cha kutoweza kutosheleza mahitaji yao ya lishe na kipato. Mokoro aliongeza kuwa kutokana na upungufu wa samaki, Huduma ya Uvuvi ya Kenya iliomba msaada kutoka kwa serikali kuu ili kurejesha upya samaki kwenye bwawa hilo, kuhakikisha wakazi wa eneo hilo

wanapata chakula cha kutosha. Alisisitiza umuhimu wa bwawa hilo kwa jamii, akieleza kuwa linatoa chanzo muhimu cha chakula na kipato kutokana na mauzo ya samaki, na linasaidia pia katika juhudi za uhifadhi wa mazingira. “Mapato yanayotokana na uvuvi yanawasaidia watu kumudu elimu ya watoto wao,” alisema Mokoro. Alifichua kuwa kuna utaratibu rasmi wa kuunda na kusajili BMU, ambao unasimamia usimamizi wa bwawa na kuhakikisha wavuvi pekee ndio wanufaika na msaada wa serikali, ikiwemo michango na rasilimali. Mokoro pia alisema kuwa idara ya Huduma ya Uvuvi ya Kenya inashirikiana na serikali ya kaunti ya West Pokot kuhamasisha jamii ya eneo hilo kuunda BMU. Alisema uundaji wa BMU unasaidia idara ya uvuvi kutambua wale wanaohusika na usimamizi wa bwawa, kuhakikisha wanapata manufaa ya msaada wa serikali. Alisema kutokana na ukubwa wa bwawa la Turkwel, usambazaji wa vifaranga hivyo umegawanywa katika mae- neo mawili: Kango’le-

Uchunguzi wa bwawa hilo ulionyesha kupungua kwa idadi ya samaki

tiang na Riting, kila moja likipokea vifaranga 40,000 ili kuongeza idadi ya samaki na kuhakikisha uvunaji endelevu. Mokoro alisisitiza umuhimu wa ushirikiano wa jamii, kanuni bora, na msaada wa serikali ili kudumisha uvuvi, kuboresha maisha ya watu, na kulinda usawa wa kiikolojia katika bwawa hilo. Aliwataka wanajamii kulinda samaki waliorudishwa bwawani na kuwakumbusha wale ambao hawajapata leseni za uvuvi kufanya hivyo. Katika hotuba yake, Samoei Kosgei, mkurugenzi wa idara ya uvuvi katika Kaunti ya West Pokot, alishukuru serikali kuu na Huduma ya Uvuvi ya Kenya kwa kutoa vifaranga vya hali ya juu kutoka Kituo cha Utafiti na Ufugaji wa Samaki cha Kitaifa cha Sagana. Alibainisha kuwa ilikuwa mara ya kwanza kwa serikali ya kaunti kupokea vifaranga kutoka Sagana, akisema hapo awali walikuwa wakivipata kutoka Kisumu na Chwele, Kaunti ya Bungoma. Kosgei aliwahimiza wakazi kuepuka kutumia nyavu haramu na kusisitiza umuhimu wa kutunza idadi ya samaki, jambo ambalo litanufaisha jamii. Aliwahimiza wavuvi kutumia mbinu bora za uvuvi, akiwataka kurudisha samaki wadogo waliwakamata kwenye bwawa. Alisema wavuvi wanapaswa kujisajili na Kitengo cha Usimamizi wa Fukwe ili kushiriki kwenye shughuli za uvuvi katika bwawa, akieleza kuwa msaada wa serikali siku za usoni, ikiwemo nyavu na boti, utatolewa tu kwa waliojisajili. Anton Mulegeni, mwenyekiti wa Kitengo cha Usimamizi wa Fukwe cha Kapsendu katika Bwawa la Turkwel, alishukuru serikali kwa juhudi zao za kurejesha upya samaki katika bwawa hilo.

Kwa nini hadithi ya Kenya inapaswa kusimuliwa upya

Ni jambo moja kuwa na maudhui ya kusimulia hadithi za kuvutia kuhusu mada yoyote, lakini ni jambo lingine kabisa kumudu sanaa ya kuunda simulizi zinazovutia kutoka kwa vipande vya thamani vinavyotolewa kwa urahisi na mandhari ya Kenya, tamaduni zake, vyakula vya ajabu, wanyamapori na watu wake. Hata hivyo, mara chache tunaunda hadithi za kuvutia kuhusu kwa nini Kenya inachukuliwa kuwa Shangri-La ya Afrika, ikijaa vito ambavyo havijachunguzwa vya kutosha na ambavyo vinaweza kuhamasisha mtafutaji wa mapenzi wa siku hizi kutokana na wingi wa ofa zetu za kipekee na za kweli. Kwa muda mrefu, Kenya imean-



galiwa kupitia mtazamo finyu, ikiwekwa ndani ya kile ambacho ziara za magari zinaweza kuelezea pekee. Ingawa ukuu wa simba wanaovizia nyasi za dhahabu au tembo walioko katika mandhari ya ajabu unasisimua nafsi, simulizi ya pori na pwani pekee haiwezi kabisa kunasa kwa ukamilifu ule mtiririko wa kina wa uzoefu unaofanya Kenya kuwa mahali pa kuvutia, ndiyo, lakini zaidi ya hapo kuwa kimbilio la roho ya mwanadamu. Kadri tunavyolenga kuvutia wageni milioni 5 kufikia mwaka 2027, tunapaswa pia kujitahidi kumudu sanaa ya usimulizi inay-

oweza kuelezea tena Kenya kama pahali ambapo hekima ya kale, usawa wa kiikolojia na mikutano ya kubadilisha maisha vinakutana. Hapa kuna njia tatu kati ya nyingi za kufikiria upya hadithi yetu. Kwanza, wakati umefika wa kuonyesha kwa makusudi na kwa fahari zaidi sifa ya kipekee ya Kenya kama nyumbani kwa asili ya mwanadamu, kama urithi wa asili usio na mfano. Baada ya yote, sayansi imethibitisha muda mrefu uliopita kwamba chini ya fukwe zinazopeperushwa na upepo wa Ziwa Turkana, kuna mabaki ya kale yanayofuatilia nyayo za Homo habilis, mababu

wa mwanadamu wa awali kabisa. Lakini wageni wachache wana-kumbushwa mara za kutosha kwamba wanatembea kwenye ardhi inayochukuliwa kuwa chimbuko la mwanadamu wanapokuwa Kenya. Labda tunapaswa kuanza kwa kukuza Mazungumzo ya Koobi Fora ambapo wanaakiolojia wa visukuku na wazee wa El Molo wanashirikiana kusimulia matoleo yao ya hadithi za asili ya mwanadamu huku wakichanganya ushahidi wa visukuku na hadithi za fasihi. Wageni wangepaidi sana kama kungekuwa na makumbusho yenye nakala za fuvu za kwanza zilizochapishwa kwa teknolojia ya 3D, huku wakisikiliza hadithi za jinsi nyota zilivyoongoza uhamiaji wa kale. Uzoefu huu ungenoga zaidi kama ungetekelezwa katika Tovuti ya Urithi wa Dunia ya UNESCO huko Turkana, nadhani. Na nani ajuaye, hadithi iliyosimuliwa upya ya jinsi mwanadamu alivyotokea pale ingevutia hija inayoweza kuvutia zaidi ya wageni 8,000 wa kila mwaka hadi idadi isiyoweza kufikirika. Hii hutokea Mecca, Bodhgaya, Varanasi, Jerusalem, Vatican City, Canterbury na maeneo mengi yenye mvuto wa kipekee. Kwa nini si kwenye chimbuko la mwanadamu? Pili, wakati mwingine najiuliza kama sisi Wakenya tunatambua jinsi tunavyoheshimiwa duniani kote kwa kuongoza uhifadhi wa wanyamapori licha ya pingamizi zinazokumba juhudi hizi, hasa kutokana na ongezeko la idadi ya watu na kupungua kwa makazi ya

wanyama. Mara nyingi tunapunguza suala la uhifadhi wa wanyamapori hadi takwimu pekee, badala ya kuangazia mienendo ya kina na inayostahili zaidi ya kuishi pamoja kati ya jamii na asili. Tunajua kuhusu jamii za Kenya ambazo ziko radhi kutambua muunganiko wa lazima kati ya mwanadamu na wanyamapori kwa kuwapachika watoto majina ya wanyama wa porini, sivyo? Tatu, baada ya kupata fursa ya kutembelea nchi kadhaa za Afrika, naamini vyakula vya Kenya ni siri iliyohifadhiwa vizuri zaidi ya Afrika, vikishindana tu na vyakula vya Kihabeshi na vya Kifaransa vya Morocco. Katika viwanja vya Lamu vinavyong'arishwa na mwezi, wapishi wa Kiswahili huchimbua asili ya biryani zenye nazi hadi safari za madau za Waarabu wa Omani katika karafuu na wavunaji wa Kisiwa cha Pate, kisha hupika pamoja na mabibi kwa kutumia majiko ya mawe ya matumbawe. Sasa fumba macho na fikiria: mushe-nye, obosontoto, kimanga, mukimo na kipenzi cha wengi nyama choma—hivyo basi una sababu ya kuwakaribisha wapenzi wa vyakula kwenye meza. Maoni yangu, hata hivyo, ni kwamba tumekuwa waoga katika kuunda hisia za kuvutia kuhusu urithi wetu wa vyakula kama chambo cha kuvutia wapishi na wapenzi wa ladha kutoka pande zote za dunia. *Miano ni Waziri wa Utalii na Wanyamapori*

Idadi ya punda Kenya yapungua pakubwa kutokana na biashara haramu

Idadi ya punda nchini Kenya inaporomoka kwa kasi ya kutisha, huku takwimu za hivi karibuni zikionyesha kupungua kwa zaidi ya asilimia 50 katika mungo mmoja uliopita. Kupungua huku kwa kasi kunachochewa sana na ongezeko la mahitaji ya ngozi za punda, hasa kwa ajili ya kusafirishwa kwenda China, hali ambayo imesababisha kuchinjwa na kusafirisha punda kinyume cha sheria. Shughuli hizi zinaweka hatari kubwa kwa maisha ya jamii zinazotegemea punda kwa usafirishaji na biashara. Kulingana na ripoti ya Ofisi ya Taifa ya Takwimu ya Kenya, idadi ya punda ilipungua kutoka milioni 1.8 mwaka wa 2009 hadi takribani milioni moja mwaka wa 2019.

Takwimu za hivi karibuni za mwaka wa 2024 zinaonyesha kupungua zaidi hadi chini ya 500,000, jambo linaloashiria hasara kubwa kwa taifa. Kichocheo kikuu cha mauaji haya ya punda kwa wingi ni soko

kubwa la dawa za jadi nchini China linalotumia ejiao, dawa inayotengenezwa kutokana na kolajeni inayopatikana kwenye ngozi za punda. Inasadikika kuwa ejiao inaboresha damu, inaongeza kinga ya mwili, na kupunguza kasi ya kuzeeka. Soko la ejiao limekua kwa kasi kubwa, likifikia thamani ya dola bilioni 7.8 za Marekani mwaka wa 2020, kutoka dola bilioni 3.2 mwaka wa 2013. Idadi ya punda wa China imepungua, na kuwalazimisha wafanyabiashara kutafuta ngozi hizo kutoka Afrika. Kenya, Ethiopia, na mataifa mengine ya Afrika yamekuwa wasambazaji wakuu licha ya marufuku na vizuizi. Thamani kubwa ya ngozi za punda, ambazo zinaweza kuuzwa hadi mamia ya dola kwa kila ngozi, imesababisha wizi mkubwa, uchinjaji haramu, na magendo. Mkurugenzi Mtendaji wa Mtandao wa Afrika wa Ustawi wa Wanyama (ANAW), Josiah Ojwang, alisisitiza haja ya haraka ya jitihada za pamoja kukabiliana na janga hili linaloongezeka.

Kenya's ambitious push to exploit Nuclear Power

This month's electricity bill is one pound? I just put it in the box below the shelf, and there is no interrupted power supply. How can it be this cheap? My housemate and I took turns to pay for the monthly electricity bill in our two bedrooomed rented apartment in England, as we both pursued our postgraduate degrees at the University of Leeds. What baffled us was that there were no black outs or what is called load-shedding in South Africa, a phenomenon that would at times see traffic lights go off, thus causing jams at various intersections of the busy streets of Johannesburg.

Kenya is a fast developing country and with the intentionality of the 5th administration in implementing its manifesto, the country's energy needs are bound to rise. It is true that we recently discovered oil in Turkana, and that we have boundless potential on solar, geothermal, wind, hydro, and other forms of energy. However, our country is punching below its weight, with only about 3,321 Mega Watts that include 940 MW from geothermal, and 614 from thermal, as the 2024 data.

As we purpose to implement THE BETA PLAN; the net effect will be increased industrialization especially through the value chains that will be connected to the Counties Aggregation Industrial Parks (CAIPs), and the Special Economic Zones (SEZs).



Our country needs more energy sources in order to leapfrog itself into the future. Nuclear energy is reliable because of its renewability and cleanliness. Most of the industrialized and therefore developed countries have nuclear energy to power their development. This fact is clearly evident when you look at the nuclear power footprint in Africa. Only South Africa has a nuclear power plant, followed by Egypt that is in the race to set up one. Kenya and Ghana come in third in this race to join the big club.

It's instructive to note that the South African Economy is more than 3 times our economy, and is the biggest, in Africa. Kenya is ranked 6th continentally, and 3rd in Sub-Saharan Africa.

There are fears associated with nuclear plants, especially after the 1986 Chernobyl accident in Russia. However, almost 40 years

later, a lot of lessons have been learnt from the incident, leading to better technology and greater safety.

In order to ready ourselves for the uptake as a country, the government set up the Nuclear Power & Energy Agency (NuPEA) led by the CEO, Mr. Justus Wabuyabo. The organization was established as the Kenya Nuclear Energy Board (KNEB), whose founder CEO was, Hon Ochillo Ayacko, the current governor of Migori, and a former Energy Minister in the 3rd administration.

Currently, Kenya is already using nuclear technology for treatment of cancer at the Kenyatta University Teaching, Research & Referral Hospital (KUTRRH), and in preserving foods, away from using pesticides that are harmful to human beings.

Some of the benefits include; renewability and cleanliness

since the energy produces virtually no greenhouse gas emission during operation, making it a powerful ally in the climate change action and justice since it will help us achieve our national carbon reduction target.

Secondly, a nuclear power plant operates 24/7, thus guaranteeing a stable and reliable supply of electricity that is critical to the development of the industries. This will lead to sustained economic growth by preventing load-shedding and power black outs. It is also true that upon establishment, a single nuclear plant shall generate about 10,000 jobs for our young people.

As a country, we need to do what it takes to attain this status, in order to guarantee our development into the future, if we are to maintain our status as an upcoming economic powerhouse in Africa and the world.

Kenya's program towards nuclear energy development has been planned into 3 phases as follows:

Phase 1 (2010-2021)

includes the considerations before a decision to launch a nuclear power programme is taken. Kenya has completed phase 1 in which the country has undertaken pre-feasibility studies, established the National Nuclear Regulator (Kenya Nuclear Regulatory Authority), commenced capacity building initiatives, and identified best and alternate sites for the nuclear power plants in Kilifi and Kwale respectively.

NuPEA has undertaken extensive national stakeholder engagement activities in the last decade. Our country undertook the IAEA Integrated Nuclear Infrastructure Review (INIR) mission in 2021 in which we were assessed by IAEA and met the criteria to advance to **phase two (2021 and 2027)**. This will entail preparatory work for the contracting and construction of a nuclear power plant, after a policy decision has been undertaken. This current phase involves the final preparations to commence construction of the nuclear power plant, including; detailed site characterization, Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), designation of Owner/Operator, according to the international conventions and treaties, and finally procurement. Nuclear power is thus expected to be connected to the electric grid in 2034.

The third and final phase will be after 2034, going forward, in which the country is expected to commission the 1st nuclear power plant, thus creating more than 9,000 short to medium term jobs, and over 1,000 permanent jobs for the operation and maintenance of the plant.

LAPFUND kusaka mabilioni kutoka kwa kaunti kuimarisha malipo ya wastaafu

Mfuko wa Hifadhi ya Hisa wa Mamlaka za Mitaa (LAPFUND) umezindua mpango mkakati wa miaka mitano wenye malengo makubwa ya kuongeza thamani ya mfuko hadi Sh116.8 bilioni. Mpango Mkakati (2024-2029), uliotangazwa Kisumu, unalenga kuwaleta wanachama wapya 250,000 na kuongeza ukusanyaji kwa kutafuta mabilioni ya fedha zilizobaki kutoka kwa serikali za kaunti na watoa huduma za maji. Mkurugenzi Mtendaji wa LAP-

FUND, Bernard Mbogo, alisema mfuko una deni la Sh27.83 bilioni kutoka kwa serikali mbalimbali za kaunti na mashirika ya huduma za maji—fedha hizo ni muhimu kwa kuhakikisha malipo kwa wakao wanaopata pensheni hufanyika kwa wakati. “Kaunti zinaendelea kutoa michango ya pensheni kutoka kwa wafanyakazi lakini hazifanyi malipo hayo kwa LAPFUND, hali inayotufanya tuko kwenye hali ngumu sana. Tuna wakao wanaosubiri malipo yao wakati mfuko una deni la mabilioni,” alisema Mbogo. Ili kuongeza ukusanyaji, mfuko unashirikiana na sekta isiyo

rasmi kupitia kampeni maalum zinazolenga kuhamasisha uanachama wa hiari na michango. Mbogo alibainisha kuwa juhudi hizo zinatarajiwa kuongeza michango ya LAPFUND kutoka Sh45 bilioni sasa hadi Sh64.2 bilioni ifikapo mwisho wa kipindi cha mpango mkakati, hivyo kuweka taa-sisi hiyo miongoni mwa mfuko ya kustaafu kinara nchini. Alisema mfuko pia unapanga kuongeza uwekezaji kwa asilimia 11.55 kupitia uto-fauti wa mali ikiwa ni pamoja na mali isiyohamishika, hisa za kibinafsi, na mali nyingine zenye faida kubwa.

Mradi mpya wa maji watatua shida za muda mrefu za wakazi wa Modogashe

Wakazi wa Modogashe katika Kaunti ya Garissa wana kila sababu ya kutabasamu baada ya serikali ya kaunti kuzindua mradi wa usambazaji maji ili kuboresha upatikanaji wa maji kwa zaidi ya watu 30,000. Mji huu umekuwa ukikumbwa na uhaba wa maji wa mara kwa mara, ambapo wakazi wamekuwa wakitegemea malori ya maji kutoka kwa viongozi wa eneo hilo na mashirika yasiyo ya kiserikali. Modogashe, moja ya makazi ya zamani kabisa Kaskazini mwa Kenya, kwa muda mrefu imekuwa ikitegemea visima vifupi vilivyokumbwa katika eneo la Laga ya Togweyn—mto wa msimu ambao ulikuwa msaada mkubwa wakati wa kiangazi. Visima hivi, ambavyo hukumbwa kwa mikono ndani ya mchanga wa mto, vilitoa maji ya ardhi lakini mara nyingi haviikuwa vya kuaminika na havi-kudumu, hasa wakati wa ukame wa muda mrefu ambapo kiwango cha maji kilishuka sana. Ukosefu wa maji katika maeeneo yanayozunguka mji huu pia umesababisha migogoro, hasa na wafugaji kutoka Kaunti ya Isiolo jirani, jambo ambalo wakati mwingine limepelekea vifo vya watu kadhaa. Mradi huu mpya unahusisha visima vinne vilivyochimbwa katika eneo la Qone Plains, takriban kilomita 45 kutoka Modogashe katika Lorian Swamp, na maji kusambazwa hadi Modogashe kupitia bomba jipya la usambazaji.



Gavana wa Garissa Nathif Jama, akijumuika na naibu wake Abdi Dagane kuzindua mradi wa maji wa Modogashe jana. Mradi utatoa huduma ya maji safi kwa zaidi ya 30,000 katika mji wa Modogashe na vijiji jirani.

Ili kuhakikisha usambazaji wa maji ulio thabiti, matangi mawili ya kuhifadhi maji yenye jumla ya lita 700,000 yamejengwa kama vituo vya usambazaji. Kwa mradi huu mpya, gavana wa Garissa Nathif Jama alisema kuwa mradi umeleta heshima na afya kwa kutoa maji safi. “Mradi huu umetuchukua karibu miaka miwili, lakini tunamshukuru Mungu kuwa umekamilika.

Leo hii, wakazi hapa wana maji majumbani mwao. Zaidi ya kaya 200 na taasisi zote za serikali hapa zimeunganishwa na maji,” Jama alisema.

“Aidha, tutahakikisha kaya nyingi zaidi zinahudumiwa na Shirika la Maji Safi na Usafi wa Mazingira la Vijijini la Garissa litachukua jukumu la kuhakikisha kuna usambazaji wa maji bila kukatika kwa wananchi wetu wa hapa,” aliongeza. Wakati huo huo, gavana aliwasihi wakazi wa Modogashe kulinda na kutunza miundombinu hiyo, akionya kuwa jaribio lolote la uharibifu litachukuliwa hatua za kisheria. Mbunge wa Lagdera Mohamed Hussein, akipongeza hatua hii muhimu, alitoa wito kwa serikali ya kaunti kuen-

deleza mradi huu hadi kwa watu wa Kaunti ya Isiolo jirani, hususan eneo la Sericho. Hussein alisema kuwa watu kutoka pande zote mbili wamekuwa wakiishi kwa amani, na licha ya visa vichache vya migogoro, wamekuwa wakishirikiana katika kutumia rasilimali za eneo hilo. “Tungependa maji haya yafikishwe hadi kwa majirani zetu wa Kaunti ya Isiolo.

Mara nyingi tumekuwa tukishirikiana nao; tumeishi pamoja kwa miaka 100 iliyopita na tunataka kushirikiana nao maji haya,” Hussein alisema.

huduma za upimaji wa HIV, ambapo kwa sasa tumefikia kiwango cha ufanisi cha asilimia 60,” alisema CECM. “Zaidi ya hayo, kaunti hivi karibuni iliajiri wauguzi 144 ili kuimarisha huduma za upimaji na ushauri wa HIV, hasa katika maeneo ya mbali,” aliongeza. Naibu Kamishna wa Kaunti (DCC) wa Wajir Mashariki,

Bw. George Onyango, ambaye alimwakilisha Kamishna wa Kaunti, alitoa onyo kali dhidi ya tamaduni zinazokwamisha haki kwa manusura wa GBV. Alilaani suluhisho zisizo rasmi za migogoro, zinazojulikana kama ‘sheria ya ndoa’ (martial law), akisema zinadhoofisha mifumo ya kisheria na kuwalinda wahalifu. “Utendaji huu haramu unaweka hatarini manusura na hatautumiliwa. Machifu na viongozi wa mitaa wameagizwa wazi kuelimisha jamii na kuhakikisha haki inatendeka,” alisema DCC. Kaimu Afisa Mkuu Mtendaji wa NSDCC, Bw. Douglas Bosire, alisifu juhudi za Kaunti ya Wajir, akisisitiza umuhimu wa mikakati inayozingatia jamii katika maeneo yenye kiwango kidogo cha maambukizi kama Wajir, Mandera, Garissa, na Turkana. “Kwa kuwa msaada wa wafadhili unapungua, tunapaswa kutumia mbinu shirikishi zinazohusisha wahudumu wa afya, vijana, wazee wa kitamaduni na viongozi wa dini. Ushiriki wa wanaume katika afya ya mama na mtoto ni muhimu pia ili kupunguza maambukizi ya HIV kutoka kwa mama kwenda kwa mtoto,” alisema Bosire.

Mashirika tofauti Wajir yashirikiana kukabiliana na Kalazar, mafuriko

Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi rasmi katika hoteli moja mjini Wajir, Naibu Gavana Ahmed Muhamed alikiri hali mbaya ya kibinadamu, akisisitiza haja ya ushirikiano kati ya mashirika mbalimbali ili kuzuia kuenea kwa ugonjwa huo na kupunguza mateso yanayoendelea kwa wakazi. “Leo tuko hapa kuzindua mpango wa kusaaidia takriban kaya elfu moja zilizoathiriwa na Kalazar na mafuriko ya ghafla ya Machi hadi Mei mwaka huu,” alisema Naibu Gavana. Mariba alisema kuwa Kinu cha Ushirika cha Luanda, kilichoko katika Tarafa ya Samia, ndicho kinu pekee kinachofanya kazi katika Kaunti ya Busia na kinawahudumia wakulima wa pamba katika sehemu za Kaunti jirani ya Siaya, akikitaja uwekezaji huu kama hatua kubwa katika kufufua kilimo cha pamba. “Kuboresha kituo hiki sio tu kuhusu mashine – ni kuhusu kuunda ajira, kusaidia wakulima wetu, na kufufua

Msajili wa Watu wa Kaunti Ndogo ya Kisumu Kati, Robina Orute, alitangaza kuanza kwa zoezi hili, ambalo linahusisha shule zote za sekondari. Ili kuhakikisha mafanikio ya zoezi hili, Ofisi ya Usajili wa Kitaifa ilifanya mkutano ya mashauriano na wakuu wa shule mbalim-

bali za sekondari na taasisi za elimu ya juu ndani ya Kisumu ili kuratibu mpango huu na ratiba za shule hizo. “Uwezo wa kubadilika ni jambo muhimu ili kuhakikisha mafanikio ya mpango huu. Baadhi ya wanafunzi watasajiliwa mwishoni mwa wiki ili kuepuka kuathiri shughuli za kawaida za shule,” alisema Orute. Kupitia ushirikiano na wakuu wa shule, wazazi wamehamasishwa kuhakikisha wanatoa nyaraka muhimu zitakazowezesha usajili huu. Orute alisisitiza umuhimu wa kushiriki-

sha wazazi mapema katika mchakato huu, hasa kwa wanafunzi wa bweni ambao huenda wakapata changamoto za kupata nakala za vitambulisho vya wazazi wao. “Nyaraka za wazazi ni muhimu kwa kuwa zinasaidia kuthibitisha bila shaka utambulisho wa mwanafunzi,” alibainisha. Upungufu wa magari ya kusafirisha maafisa wa usajili na vifaa kutoka shule moja hadi nyingine ulitambuliwa kama changamoto kubwa inayoweza kuchelewe-sha mchakato huu.

KDF yachukua jukumu la ujenzi wa Uwanja wa Olenguruone

Jeshi la Ulinzi la Kenya (KDF) limechukua rasmi ujenzi wa Uwanja wa Olenguruone Kaunti ya Nakuru, miaka kumi na tatu baada ya mradi huo kukwama. Naibu Gavana wa Nakuru David Kones alisema kuwa baada ya ukaguzi wa kina wa eneo, KDF itaendelea na taratibu zinazohitajika ili kuendeleza ujenzi wa kituo hicho. Aliongeza kuwa serikali ya kaunti inaunga mkono uingiliaji kati huo, akibainisha kuwa kukamilisha uwanja huo kutatia matumaini na kuwasha shauku miongoni mwa jamii zinazowazunguka, haswa vijana walio na hamu ya kushiriki katika michezo na ukuzaji vipaji. Ujenzi wa uwanja huo ulio katika Kaunti Ndogo ya Kuresoi Kusini, ulianza 2012 baada ya mwanakandarasi kupewa Sh73 milioni kati ya jumla ya kandarasi ya Sh290,643,600, kulingana na makubaliano ya

kandarasi. Akizungumza wakati wa ziara ya uchunguzi iliyoandaliwa kwa timu ya KDF inayoongozwa na Luteni Kanali Paul Githehu kabla ya kurejelewa kwa kazi hiyo, Naibu Gavana alipongeza hatua ya Rais Ruto kuingilia kati ujuzi wa wanajeshi ili kuhakikisha mradi huo unakamilika. Alieleza kuwa uwanja huo ulio katika Wadi ya Amalo, Jimbo la Kuresoi Kusini, umekabidhiwa rasmi kwa wanajeshi ili waupange upya na kuukamilisha. “Kazi ya ujenzi itanza tena chini ya muundo mpya, ambao utaona uwezo wa uwanja kuongezeka,” alisema Naibu Gavana. Kones alisema serikali ya kaunti imejitolea kuhakikisha kuwa kituo hicho kinakamilika na kuongeza kuwa mwanakandarasi ambaye atafanya kazi hiyo pamoja na Wanajeshi wa Ulinzi wa Kenya atambuliwa hivi karibuni ili kuhakikisha kuwa kazi hiyo inaanza hivi karibuni.

NACADA yafunga Kituo cha Ahadi kwa makosa ya kiafya

Mamlaka ya Kitaifa ya Kupambana na Matumizi ya Dawa za Kulevya na Pombe (NACADA) imetoa agizo la kufunga mara moja Kituo cha Ahadi cha Kutibu Wagonjwa wa Dawa za Kulevya kilichopo Githunguri, Kaunti ya Kiambu, kufuatia ukaguzi wa haraka uliogundua ukiukaji mkubwa wa afya na usalama. Ukaguzi uliofanywa kwa ghafla mwanzoni mwa wiki hii na timu ya NACADA ya Uzingatiaji na Utekelezaji ulibaini hali mbaya katika kituo hicho. Miongoni mwa matatizo makubwa yaliyotajwa ni pamoja na maeneo yasiyo safi ya maandalizi ya chakula, huduma duni za matibabu, na makazi yaliyopuuza. Wakaguzi walikuta baadhi ya wakazi wakiwa wagonjwa wazi na bila kupata matibabu ya kitaalamu. Aidha, kituo hicho kilikuwa kinaendesha shughuli zake bila leseni zinazohitajika na hakikufikia viwango vya chini kabisa vya usafi na usalama. “Hii si tu ubovu wa viwango; ni unyonyaji wa kin-yama wa Wakenya walioko katika hali dhaifu,” alisema Dkt. Anthony Omerikwa,

Mkurugenzi Mtendaji wa NACADA. “Hatuwezi kuvumilia vituo vinavyojiita vya kurekebisha lakini vinatumika kama maghala ya watu. Kuanzia sasa hivi, tunaanzisha ukaguzi wa kitaifa kuondoa vituo vyote haramu vinavyowadhuru familia masikini,” alisema. Kwa mujibu wa NACADA, wagonjwa waliishi katika vyumba vyenye mson-gamano mkubwa, havina hewa ya kutosha, na walilazimishwa kulala juu ya magodoro machafu, yaliyochakaa. Jikoni lilielezwa kuwa ni hatari kwa afya, likijaa mbu na vyombo visivyooshwa. “Inashangaza kwamba sehemu inayokusudiwa kuponya na kurejesha afya inaweza kuruhusiwa kufanya kazi kwa hali kama hii. Tulikuwa na imani nao kwa ajili ya wapendwa wetu, lakini tuligundua wanatendewa vibaya zaidi hata kuliko wafungwa,” alisema Peter Mwangi, mzazi ambaye mtoto wake alikumbwa na kuingizwa katika kituo hicho. Ingawa Kituo cha Ahadi kilijitangaza kama mahali pa msaada kwa watu wanaopambana na uraibu wa dawa za kulevya, wakazi wake wa zamani walieleza hali tofauti kabisa.
