Jumla ya wafungwa 10,000 wamesajiliwa chini ya Mamlaka ya Afya ya Jamii (SHA) na sasa wanaweza kupata huduma za afya za bei nafuu na zenye ubora. Katibu Mkuu wa Idara ya Huduma za Urekebishaji, Dkt. Salome Muhia, alisema serikali inalenga kusajili wafungwa wote 60,000 nchini kote chini ya SHA. "Wafungwa 10,000 tayari wamesajiliwa chini ya SHA, na tunatarajia kusakajili wafungwa wote 60,000 nchini Kenya kwa kuwa Kifungu cha 43 cha Katiba kinatoa haki ya kupata huduma za afya na haki hii inapaswa kutolewa pia kwa wafungwa," alisema katika Gereza Kuu la Machakos wakati wa zoezi la upandaji miti la kila mwezi la Greening Kenya. Aliongeza kuwa Wakenya wote, wakiwemo wafungwa magerezani na wale walio katika vituo vya uangalizi wa kijamii (probation centers), wana haki ya kupata huduma za afya za bei nafuu na zenye ubora. bayo kwa sasa ipo katika hatua ya majaribio katika mashamba ya serikali, itazinduliwa hivi karibuni katika kaunti hiyo. “Kila mnyama atakuwa na tagi yenye chipu. Wakati msimbo kutoka kwenye tagi hiyo utain-gizwa kwenye mfumo, utatoa maelezo kama jina la mmiliki, uzito wa mnyama, tarehe ya ku-zaliwa, uzalishaji wa maziwa, na rekodi za chanjo. Hii itarahisisha uuzaji na kusaidia kuboresha bei ya mifugo, hivyo kuongeza faida kwa wakulima,” alisema. Mueke aliongeza kuwa serikali imeweka mikakati ya kuhakikisha wakulima wanazalisha mifugo ya hali ya juu inayotoa bidhaa bora. “Uhitaji wa bidhaa zetu za mifugo ni mkubwa sokoni, lakini changamoto imekuwa ni uzalishaji mdogo. Tuna Mpango wa Kitaifa wa Kuboresha Mifugo kupitia upandikizaji wa mbegu (artificial insemination) na uhamisho wa viinitete. Hatua hizi zinatolewa kwa ru-zuku na serikali ili kusaidia kuboresha aina za mifugo kwa wakulima wetu. Hii pia itawasaidia kukidhi mahitaji ya soko kwa ubora na wingi,” alisema. Alisifu ubora wa soko jipya hilo, akiongeza kuwa lita-toa nafasi nyingi za ajira kwa watu katika kaunti hiyo. “Hili ni soko la kisasa, na ninaweza

kuthibitisha kwamba ubora wake ni wa hali ya juu. Lina eneo la karantini, sehemu za mauzo za ng'ombe na mbuzi, mabanda, vibanda vya biashara, na maafisa. Mradi huu utatoa ajira kwa vijana katika sekta mbalimbali kama usafirishaji, ulinzi, vibarua, na huduma za chakula. Hii ni miongoni mwa hatua ambazo serikali inatekeleza ili kuunda ajira kwa vijana katika nchi hii,” alisema. Soko la mifugo lilijengwa na serikali kuu kwa ushirikiano na Serikali ya Kaunti ya Busia chini ya mradi wa KeLCoP kwa

gharama ya Shilingi milioni 23. Mkurugenzi wa Uzalishaji wa Mifugo, Bishar Fille Elmi, alibainisha kuwa Kaunti ya Busia inajihusisha kwa kiwango kikubwa na ufugaji wa mifugo. “Katika Kaunti ya Busia, tuna kuku milioni 1.2. Pia tuna ng'ombe 217,000, mbuzi 197,000, na kondoo 112,000. Wanyama wanatibiwa kila mwaka katika kaunti hii; kwa mfano, mwaka jana, ng'ombe 72,000 walitibiwa, pamoja na kondoo 96,000, na kuku 100,000,” alisema.

Alifichua kwamba idara inatarajia kupanda miti 50,000 katika vituo vyote vya urekebishaji nchini. “Tunalenga kupanda zaidi ya miti 50,000 katika vituo vya urekebishaji nchini kote kufikia lengo la Greening Kenya ifikapo mwaka 2032,” alisema. Alisisitiza juhudi za wafungwa katika vituo vya urekebishaji, ambapo wanajifunza kilimo kama sehemu ya mafunzo ya ufundi stadi. Wafungwa hao humwagilia na

kutunza miti hiyo, hivyo kuchangia katika uendeleu wa mazingira na kusaidia kufanikisha agizo la Rais la kupanda miti bilioni 15 ifikapo mwaka 2032. Serikali za kaunti na wadau wengine wameunga mkono mpango huu kwa kuchimba visima vya maji ili kuongeza upatikanaji wa maji wakati wa msimu wa ukame. Maji hayo husaidia kudumisha miti iliyopandwa karibu na magereza na ofisi za uangalizi wa kijamii nchini. Maafisa hao walifanya ukaguzi katika ofisi za uangalizi wa kijamii za Machakos na gereza hilo ili kutathmini miradi inayoendelea na kufanya tathmini ya mahitaji.

The State Department for Trade is in the process of developing an e-commerce policy for Kenya to provide a structured framework to guide the development, growth, and regulation of e-commerce in the country. The policy seeks to enhance consumer protection, promote the development of digital infrastructure, bridge the digital divide, promote digital skills development, create a conducive environment for digital trade, develop a coherent policy framework, support micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), and respond to climate change and sustainable e-commerce.

A draft Kenya E-Commerce Policy has been developed by the State Department for Trade with input from various stakeholders drawn from key government Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs), the private sector, and academia.

In line with constitutional requirements and the need to build consensus nationally, the State Department for Trade hereby seeks to subject the draft policy to public participation so as to elicit the views of industry players, citizens, as well as other interested parties for consideration and incorporation into the final policy document.

Submission of views and comments on the draft Kenya E-Commerce Policy can be done through the email info@trade.go.ke on or before **21st July, 2025**. There shall be a hybrid public participation meeting to collate further views on the **23rd July, 2025** in Nairobi at a venue to be confirmed.

Mipango inaendelea kujenga makao makuu ya kisasa ya Wizara ya Habari, Mawasiliano na Uchumi wa Kidijitali katika mji wa kiteknolojia wa Konza, Kaunti ya Makueni. Makao hayo makuu yatakuwa na Idara ya Serikali ya Utangazaji na Mawasiliano ya Simu, mashirika ya serikali yakiwemo Kurugenzi ya Habari na Mawasiliano ya Umma, Idara ya Serikali ya TEHAMA na Uchumi wa Kidijitali, pamoja na Mamlaka ya TEHAMA. Akiongoza kamati ya kupanga mradi huo katika jengo la Teleposta Towers jijini Nairobi, Mkurugenzi wa Utawala wa Idara ya Serikali ya TEHAMA, Bw. Wesley Maritim, alisema ujenzi huo ni miongoni mwa miradi mikuu ya wizara kwani utaziweka idara zote pamoja katika eneo moja. Akitaja kwamba baadhi ya ofisi za idara kwa sasa zinafanya kazi katika majengo ya kupangisha ambapo zinatumiya gharama kubwa, Bw. Maritim alisema makao makuu hayo mapya yataokoa rasilimali nyingi na pia kurahisisha kazi za kiutawala. “Mradi huu utaokoa fedha nyingi, kwa sasa baadhi ya ofisi ziko kwenye majengo ya kupangisha na

katika maeneo tofauti,” alisema. Serikali, kupitia Mamlaka ya Maendeleo ya Konza Technopolis chini ya Wizara ya Habari, Mawasiliano na Uchumi wa Kidijitali, inalenga kuunganisha uwekezaji wa wavumbuzi, viwanda, taasisi za kitaaluma pamoja na teknolojia zinazoibukia. Pamoja na ujenzi wa makao makuu ya wizara, mradi huu pia utajumuisha makazi ya wafanyakazi. Mji wa Konza upo takriban kilomita 60 kusini mwa Nairobi na unashughulikia ekari 5,000 zilizopangwa kwa uangalifu ili kuendeleza sayansi, uvumbuzi, teknolojia na uwekezaji wa kibiashara. Mji huu unachukua jukumu muhimu katika ajenda ya maendeleo ya Kenya katika enzi ya kidijitali na kuchochea ukuaji wa uchumi sambamba na Ajenda ya Mabadiliko ya Uchumi wa Chini Kuenda Juu ya Kenya Kwanza. NATIONAL VALIDATION OF THE DRAFT POLICY FRAMEWORK FOR SUSTAINABLE FINANCING AND SUBSIDY MANAGEMENT IN AGRICULTURE AND THE DRAFT PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT (AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT FUND) REGULATIONS

The Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock Development through the State Department for Agriculture has developed the draft Policy Framework for Sustainable Financing and Subsidy Management in Agriculture and the draft Public Finance Management (Agricultural Development Fund) Regulations, 2025. The objective of the Policy and Regulation is to enhance agricultural productivity and food and nutrition security by increasing public and private sector investments in the agriculture sector through establishing a framework for sustainable financing and providing guidelines for effective agricultural subsidy management.

The Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and the Statutory Instruments Act, 2013 require the public to participate in the decision-making process through the submission of comments to the Ministry. The Ministry requests the general public and all interested persons to participate by submitting written comments or memoranda on the draft policy and regulations using the prescribed public comments form, to reach the undersigned not later than **fourteen (14) days** from the date of publication of this notice.

The State Department for Agriculture would like to inform members of the Public that the Sugar Development Levy is now in effect from 1st July, 2025.

The Levy is payable by every miller at the rate of four per cent of the ex-factory price for locally manufactured sugar sold and four per cent of cost, insurance and freight (CIF) value of each consignment of imported sugar. The Levy shall be remitted by the tenth day of the month immediately following the month when the domestic sugar is sold, and by the tenth day of the month immediately following the month when the sugar was imported.

The Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock Development has appointed the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) as the collection agent. KRA will issue a communication advising on the mode of collection.

kuwawezesha wananchi na kukuza ukuaji na maendeleo kuanzia ngazi ya chini.

Naibu Kamishna wa Kaunti ya Kajiado Kaskazini, Metrine Wafula aliongoza zoezi la usambazaji ambapo mbuzi 515 walisambazwa katika Wadi za Ngong, Olkeri, Ongata Rongai, Nkai-murunya na Oololua.

Akizungumza wakati wa zoezi hilo, Peter Mung'ayo kutoka Wizara ya Mifugo alisema serikali inarejesha hifadhi kwa

wakulima walioathiriwa na ukame na wale walio-poteza mifugo yao katika kipindi cha miaka mitatu iliyopita.

“Serikali imeingilia kati kusaidia familia zilizoathiriwa na ukame kujenga upya maisha yao kwa kusambaza mifugo ya kaya, hasa kondoo na mbuzi katika mikoa iliyoathirika vibaya,” alisema.

Maafisa hao walibaini kuwa uingiliaji kati unatarajiwa kuleta athari chanya kwa wafugaji.

Kampuni ya Maendeleo ya Nguvu za Jotoardhi (GDC) imefanikiwa kupata mvuke unaoweza kutumika kibishara katika eneo la Silali, hatua kubwa katika maendeleo ya nishati mbadala nchini Kenya. Eneo hilo linatarajiwa kutoa mvuke wa megawati 22. Silali ni moja ya maeneo matatu – pamoja na Korosi na Paka – yanayounda Mradi wa Jotoardhi wa Baringo-Silali-Paka, ambapo GDC imekuwa ikichimba visima kwa miaka saba iliyopita. Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Afisa Mtendaji Mkuu wa GDC, Bw. Paul Ngugi, alisema awamu ya kwanza ya mradi wa Baringo-Silali-Paka inalenga kuzalisha megawati 300 za umeme katika maeneo hayo matatu ya jotoardhi, kila eneo likitarajiwa kutoa megawati 100. Alibainisha kuwa mafanikio katika eneo la Silali ni msaada mkubwa kwa dhamira ya shirika hilo la serikali ya kutoa nishati nafuu na ya kuuminika kwa Wakenya. Aliongeza kuwa kisima cha

kwanza chenye mvuke unaofaa katika mradi wa Baringo-Silali-Paka kilipatikana katika eneo la Paka mwaka 2020. “Ufanisi wa eneo la jotoardhi la Silali utafungua enzi mpya ya nishati ya jotoardhi nchini Kenya,” alihakikishia Mkurugenzi Mkuu. Akitambua kuwa eneo la Silali ni lenye tija kubwa, Mkurugenzi Mkuu alisema kuwa kuwa na kisima kimoja kinachotoa mvuke wa megawati 22 ni sawa na kuchimba visima vinne vinavyotoa megawati 5 kila kimoja, akiongeza kuwa kampuni ya GDC ingeokoa kiasi kikubwa cha fedha ikizingatiwa kuwa kuchimba kisima kimoja hugarimu Shilingi milioni 700. Katika mahojiano na KNA, Bw. Ngugi alisema GDC imejitolea kuhakikisha miradi ya nishati mbadala inakamilika kwa wakati, hatua ambayo itasaidia pakubwa utekelezaji wa mpango na

dira ya maendeleo ya taifa. Mkurugenzi alisema eneo la Paka, ambako kazi nyingi zimefanyika, linatarajiwa kuanza kuzalisha megawati 100 za kwanza ifikapo mwaka 2028. Alifafanua kuwa GDC imechimba mvuke na hatua inayofuata ni ujenzi wa mitambo ya kuzalisha umeme, akiongeza kuwa kampuni hiyo inafanya upembuzi ya kinifu na baadaye itatafuta wawekezaji. Alisema mradi huo utaanza kufanya kazi katika kipindi cha miaka mitatu ijayo na kuingiza umeme kwenye gridi ya kitaifa. Kulingana na Mjumbe wa Kamati ya Utendaji ya Kaunti ya Kisumu (CECM) anayesimamia masuala ya Michezo, Bi Beatrice Odongo, sherehe ya uzinduzi wa ujenzi inatarajiwa kufanyika baadaye mwezi huu, na kufungua njia ya kuboresha kwa mabilioni ya pesa. “Tumejaliwa kuwa na timu iliyokuja kugagua eneo hili na kutoa ushauri juu ya kile bora kinaweza kufanyika kwa Kaunti ya Kisumu na uwanja huu. Tunatarajia kuona uwanja huu ukizinduliwa haraka iwezekanavyo,” alisema. Aliongeza kuwa uwanja huo utakapokamilika utaleta mageuzi makubwa kwenye sekta ya michezo katika eneo hilo, kwa

Kenya hosts Maritime Oil Spill simulation to bolster preparedness

The Government is leading efforts to strengthen regional readiness against maritime oil pollution.

Through the Maritime Search and Pollution Response Exercise (MASEPOLREX25) field training exercise, the training brought together stakeholders from across the region to assess and improve response mechanisms in the event of an oil spill in the Western Indian Ocean.

The simulation at the Bandari Maritime Academy in Mombasa coordinated by the Kenya Maritime Authority (KMA) in collaboration with the Kenya Navy and Kenya Ports Authority (KPA), aimed to evaluate national and regional preparedness, test emergency protocols, and foster cooperation among neighboring states.

Speaking at the opening of the exercise, KMA Director for Maritime Safety and Exercise Coordinator, Julius Koech, said the scenario simulated a collision between two oil tankers at the Kenya Tanzania maritime border, resulting in a major oil spill.

“We are testing the management of a large-

scale maritime crisis by activating the National Oil Spill Contingency Plan. This involves a multi-sectoral, multi-agency incident management team comprising both state and non-state actors,” Koech said.

The exercise included the deployment of offshore containment equipment and a simulated shoreline cleanup at Nyali Beach following the hypothetical drift of heavy fuel oil towards the Kenyan coast.

Participating vessels included KPA's Mwokozi, Tangelizi, and Duma, alongside the Kenya Navy Vessel Shupavu.

Koech emphasized that the government has invested significantly in oil spill preparedness, including training responders and establishing a cleanup fund.

“We have built capacity over the years and ensured that our partners, such as the Kenya Navy and KPA, have the necessary equipment and skills to manage such incidents,” he added.

Representing the Indian Ocean Commission (IOC), Raj Mohabeer commended Kenya's advanced level of preparedness, noting that many countries in the region are still in the early stages of developing marine pollution response frame-

works.

“Kenya has a well-structured national oil spill contingency plan, organized response systems, and appropriate equipment. One of the objectives of this exercise is to facilitate experience sharing so that other countries can replicate Kenya's model,” Mohabeer said.

He highlighted the importance of regional cooperation in addressing maritime pollution, referencing the 2020 Mauritius oil spill as an example of the need for collective response strategies.

“Marine pollution cannot be effectively tackled by a single country. That is why we are working under the Nairobi Convention to develop a regional contingency plan, which is expected to be finalized by August next year,” he added.

Kenya Navy Fleet Commander Brigadier Mohamed Shemote described the exercise as critical for regional maritime security, marking it as the second of its kind following a similar drill in 2023.

“Oil spills are transboundary by nature. A spill from Mombasa could affect Somalia or Tanzania. These joint operations help us identify and address gaps in our systems,” he said.

Mamlaka ya Kitaifa ya Ujenzi (NCA) imezindua Tuzo za Ubora wa Ujenzi kwa mara ya kwanza, kama sehemu ya mkakati wa Mkutano wa Wakontrakta wa Kila Mwaka, zikilenga kutambua, kuthamini, na kuendeleza ubora, usalama, na ubunifu katika sekta ya ujenzi nchini Kenya. Hafla hiyo iliwakusanya wakontrakta, wasimamizi, waeendelezaji miradi, na wadau muhimu kutoka kaunti zote 47, waliokusanyika kujadili mageuzi ya kubadilisha sekta chini ya Kanuni ya Kitaifa ya Majengo ya mwaka 2024. Akiongoza uzinduzi huo, Waziri wa Ardhi, Kazi za Umma, Nyumba na Maendeleo ya Miji, Alice Wahome, alisifu juhudi za NCA za kuoanisha sera na utekelezaji kupitia jukwaa hili la tuzo. “Ulinganifu huu wa udhibiti na utambuzi ndiyo msingi tunaohitaji ili kutimiza ajenda yetu ya maendeleo ya kitaifa. Wanaojenga kwa usahihi, wanajenga mustakabali,” alisisitiza Wahome. Waziri huyo alibainisha kwamba tangu Kanuni ya Kitaifa ya Majengo ya 2024 ilipoanza kutekelezwa mwezi Machi, visa vya majengo kuporomoka

vimepungua kwa kiasi kikubwa. Alikisia mafanikio haya kutokana na kuimarika kwa utekelezaji wa sheria, ushirikiano wa mashirika mbalimbali, idhini za kidijitali, na mifumo ya lazima ya kufuata kanuni kwa waendelezaji na wakontrakta. “Usalama wa umma ni kipaumbele cha huduma za umma. Kila jengo salama linapunguza janga kwa familia na usumbufu

kwa biashara,” alisema Wahome, akibainisha umuhimu wa kanuni hizo kwa maisha. Aidha, alitangaza uthibitishaji wa zaidi ya wafanyakazi 25,000 wa ujenzi waliobobea pamoja na wasimamizi wa maeneo ya ujenzi, matokeo ya moja kwa moja ya kuongezeka kwa ushirikiano, mafunzo, na uhamasishaji unaoendeshwa na serikali na NCA.

Juhudi hizi, kwa mujibu wa waziri, zinaunga mkono Mpango wa Nyumba Nafuu, ambao kwa sasa una zaidi ya nyumba 175,000 zinazojengwa, huku mpango wa ziada ukiwa na nyumba 450,000 zaidi. Waziri alibainisha kwamba Tuzo za Ubora wa Ujenzi zilizozinduliwa si za kiashiria tu, bali ni chombo cha kimkakati cha kuingiza Kanuni ya Kitaifa ya Majengo katika utendaji wa kila siku wa sekta hii. Wahome aliongeza kuwa wakontrakta na wataalamu watatambuliwa kwa kufuata kanuni, ubunifu, na viwango vya juu. “Tuzo hizi ni kituo cha kuhamasisha, wito wa kujifunza kwa wenzao, kujenga uwezo, na kuwekeza katika taaluma,” alisisitiza alipokuwa akizindua rasmi tuzo pamoja na Mkutano wa Wanakandara. Wahome alisema maombi ya kushiriki tuzo yatafunguliwa kwa siku 30, kisha mchakato wa uhakiki mkali utafanyika. Alisema kuanzia Julai 1, 2025, serikali imehamia kikamilifu katika ununuzi wa kielektroniki, hatua inayolenga kupunguza ufisadi na kuhakikisha uwazi katika michakato ya zabuni. Aliwaonya wakontrakta dhidi ya vitendo vya udanganyifu kama vile kutoa marejesho ya kodi ya uongo au

dhamana za benki bandia. “Kuanzia sasa, mchakato wa zabuni ni wa kidijitali na wa uwazi. Ukikosa zabuni, itakuwa kwa msingi wa haki, si kwa njama,” alisema waziri, akiongeza kuwa ni wakontrakta wanaozingatia masharti pekee watakaostahiki miradi ya baadaye. Aidha, aliwahimiza wakontrakta kukumbatia msaada wa kitaalamu, ikiwemo maafisa wa ununuzi na washauri wa kisheria, ili kuongeza ushindani wao katika sekta inayozidi kuwa ya viwango vya juu. Akisisitiza dhamira ya serikali ya kuwawezesha wazawa, Wahome alihakikisha kwamba miradi mingi ya nyumba na miundombinu inatekelezwa na wakontrakta wa Kenya na siyo makampuni ya kigeni. “Ikiwa kampuni za Kenya haziwezi kutekeleza mradi wa Shilingi bilioni moja, tutaweza kushindana duniani? Kazi hii ni ya Wakenya,” alihoji Wahome, akionya dhidi ya tabia zisizo za kimaadili kama kuchelewesha malipo kwa wakandarasi wadogo. Akizungumza kwenye hafla hiyo, Katibu wa Wizara ya Kazi za Umma, Joel Arumonyang, alisifu NCA kwa kuandaa jukwaa hilo, akisisitiza kuwa Kanuni ya Kitaifa ya Majengo ni chombo cha kitaifa cha kuhakikisha ujenzi salama, wa kisasa, na wa uwajibikaji zaidi.

Government makes policy changes to boost pyrethrum sector

The Government is reviving the pyrethrum industry through key environmental and agricultural policy shifts.

In the new dispensation, the government has implemented the ban on the use of over 77 harmful pesticides and restricted the use of 100 others in a bid to make Kenyan pyrethrum competitive in the global market.

This key environmental and agricultural policy shift creates an opportunity for Kenya to reclaim its position in the global pyrethrin value chain as well as modernize the sector to meet the market demands.

Pyrethrum farmers in Nakuru County, Kenya's leading pyrethrum producer, will therefore receive enhanced earnings following the renewed national government's initiative to fully revive the country's once thriving pyrethrum industry.

Agriculture and Livestock Development Cabinet Secretary Mutahi Kagwe made the remarks at the 2025 Nakuru National Agricultural Show, where he was accompa-

nied by Nakuru Deputy Governor David Kones.

The CS called upon local and international investors to source pyrethrin directly from Kenyan farmers as he advocated for local processing to generate employment and enhance farmers' incomes.

“We are working hard to make sure that we solve the challenges facing the pyrethrum farmers by also ensuring they are paid on time for their deliveries,” he stated.

The Cabinet Secretary further outlined additional interventions designed to support farmers across various agricultural value chains.

He revealed that dis-

cussions are underway to waive import duties on yellow maize and soya, two critical inputs for livestock feed manufacturing.

Kagwe said this measure is expected to significantly reduce production costs for farmers, subsequently leading to lower production costs, especially within the dairy sector and therefore translating into better returns for their investment.

In his remarks, the Deputy Governor said in order to support the pyrethrum sector, the county government has distributed certified seedlings and other planting materials worth Sh146,411,264 to 10,995 farmers in the last three years.

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Bwawa lilivyobadilisha maisha ya mgema na mustakabali wa kijiji

Kwa miaka mingi, Bi Leah Kiptarus kutoka kijiji cha Kapteren, eneobunge dogo la Keiyo Kas-kazini, alikuwa akijihusisha na ulevi haramu wa kutengen-eza chang'aa ili kuendesha maisha ya familia yake. “Maisha yalikuwa ya vurugu,” anasema, kwani alikuwa akigombana kila mara na vyombo vya sheria. Bi Kiptarus anakumbuka jinsi mapigano yalivyokuwa yaki-zuka nyumbani kwake mara kwa mara, huku wanaume na wanawake walevi waki-pigana, na sehemu kubwa ya pesa alizopata zikiishia kulipa faini kila alipokamatwa. za kienyeji, zinazojulikana kama managu, ambazo huza kwa wafanyabiashara kutoka kaunti jirani ya Uasin Gishu. “Eneo hili hukauka sana hasa miezi ya mwanzo wa mwaka, na bei za mboga hupanda sana. Kwa kutumia maji ya umwagiliaji kutoka bwawa, nilikuwa napata Shilingi 5,000 kila wiki kutokana na mauzo ya managu,” alieleza kwa fahari. Msimu huu wa upandaji, Bi Kiptarus ameingiza kilimo cha pilipili hoho (capsi-



cum), na anasema sasa yeye ni mfano wa kuigwa kijijini. “Nyumbani sasa kuna amani. Sihofii tena kukamatwa kwa sababu ya bwawa, na nina muda wa kushiriki shughuli za kijamii,” anasema huku akikimbilia kuungana na kina mama wengine kucheza mpira wa miguu. Edwin Tarus, mhitimu wa Shahada ya Elimu kutoka Chuo Kikuu cha Masinde Muliro, pia anatumia maji ya bwawa kulima kabichi, sukuma wiki na managu. Anasema anapata kati ya Shilingi 25,000 na 30,000 kila mwezi. “Hizi zinaweza kuonekana kama pesa kidogo kwa baadhi ya watu, lakini kumbuka kwamba siliipi kodi ya nyumba wala nauli, na chakula changu kingi kinatoka shambani,” alisema. Tarus, aliyehitimu mwaka 2019, anasema alikulia shambani, ambapo baba yake — mwalimu — alimfundisha kilimo. Anasema analifurahia sana kwani yeye ndiye bosi wake. Anawaalika vijana wenzake kuzingatia kilimo badala ya kusubiri ajira za ofisini ambazo hazipatikani kwa urahisi, akisema kilimo kinaweza kuleta mapato mazuri zaidi. Kwa Justus Kiplimo mwenye umri wa miaka 24, bwawa limekuja kwa wakati mwa-faka. Kiplimo, ambaye alifanya mtihamu wa KCSE mwaka 2021, alianzisha biashara ya bodaboda kama vijana wengi, lakini kutokana na ushindani mkubwa na changamoto kama kufanya kazi wakati wa baridi, aliaachana nayo na kugeukia kilimo. Sasa Kiplimo analima matunda ya passion (passion fruits) na anasema anaweza kukidhi mahitaji yake. Anavuna hadi kilo 50 za matunda hayo kila wiki, na kwa kilo moja kuuzwa kwa Shilingi 70, anapata takriban Shilingi 3,500 kila wiki.

Miradi mkuu ya kilimo ya Nandi kuinua hali ya maisha ya wenyeji

Serikali ya Kaunti ya Nandi inatumia miradi kuu ya kilimo ili kuongeza mapato ya wakulima na kuchochea ukuaji wa uchumi. Miradi hii inalenga kuwageza wakulima wadogo kuwa wajasiriamali wa kilimo, kuimarisha usalama wa chakula, na kuimarisha uchumi wa eneo. Kaunti inatekeleza programu za kuongeza thamani na kuwawezesha wakulima kushiriki katika shughuli zenye heshima, faida, na endelevu. “Ajenda yetu ni rahisi: kuhamia kutoka kwa kilimo cha kujikimu hadi biashara ya kilimo iliyo na mpangilio. Kila mradi mkuu unalenga kuongeza thamani, kuunda masoko, na kuboresha maisha,” alisema Gavana Stephen Sang. Alibainisha kuwa wadau wanauona Kiwanda cha Maziwa cha Kabiyet, ambacho ni cha kisasa na chenye uwezo wa kusindika zaidi ya lita 200,000 za

maziwa kwa siku, kama kibadilishaji mchezo katika sekta ya maziwa ya Kaunti ya Nandi. Kiwanda hicho kimeunda soko lenye mpangilio kwa maziwa kutoka kwa wakulima wadogo kote Mosop, Aldai, na Chesumei, na hivyo kuboresha uthabiti wa mapato na kupunguza hasara baada ya mavuno. “Wakulima sasa wanapata mapato zaidi, vyama vya ushirika vimeimarika, na vijana wana ajira katika usafirishaji na upakiaji,” alisema Mjumbe wa Kamati ya Utendaji ya Kaunti (CECM) wa Kilimo, Dkt. Kiplimo Lagat. “Hatuuzei tena maziwa yetu kwa madalali kwa bei duni. Kiwanda kinatulipa kwa wakati, na sasa tunapanua mifugo yetu na kuwekeza katika malisho bora kwa sababu tunajua soko ni la kuaminika,” alisema Mercy Chelangat, mkulima wa maziwa kutoka Kabiyet. Kituo cha Kukusanya na Kusindika Parachichi huko Mosoriot kinazingatia uzalishaji wa parachichi aina ya Hass kwa

ajili ya kuuza nje, kikihusisha wakulima wa eneo na masoko ya kimataifa. Kaunti imegawa zaidi ya miche 15,000 na kuwafunza wakulima kuhusu viwango vya kufuata kimataifa. Kipkorir Rotich, mkulima mnu-faika kutoka Emgwen, alisema, “Parachichi hukomaa baada ya miaka mitatu, na tupo karibu. Hii ndiyo mustakabali wetu.” Ujenzi wa kiwanda cha kuchinja na kusindika kuku mjini Kapsabet utakuwa msaada mkubwa kwa wakulima wa kuku. Kiwanda hicho kina uwezo wa kusindika zaidi ya kuku 3,000 kwa siku, kikiongeza thamani na kupanua upatikanaji wa soko. “Mradi huu mkuu utafungua mnyororo wa thamani wa kuku na kutoa mamia ya ajira, hasa kwa vijana na vikundi vya kina mama,” alisema Dkt. Lagat. Kiwanda hicho kitatumika kwa wakulima kote Nandi na kaunti jirani, kikirahisisha upatikanaji wa masoko ya hoteli, taasisi, na masoko ya kuuza nje kikanda.

Kenya secures global market

Kenya has secured a 46 per cent global gross domestic product (GDP) market access through various trade agreements.

Acting Director of External Trade Joseah Rotich has said the various trade agreements Kenya has entered into have opened vast markets globally.

He emphasized the need for Kenyan producers and manufacturers to leverage on these trade pacts to boost exports and drive economic growth.

“Now that we have secured these markets, we need to put in place

strategies to access them by increasing our production capacity and diversifying our products to enhance competitiveness,” he said in Nairobi when he officiated a two-day sensitization workshop for Kenya’s National Implementation Committee (NIC) on the AfCFTA implementation strategy.

These agreements include the Kenya-EU Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA), the Kenya-UK EPA, the Kenya-UAE Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA), the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA), the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA), the

Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) and the East African Community (EAC).

Rotich termed the AfCFTA as a landmark agreement with the potential to industrialize Africa, noting that a strong NIC is essential for effective implementation of the continental agreement.

“The AfCFTA implementation strategy is the first strategy tied to a particular agreement, and it will provide a road map on how Kenya can access the African market. For the strategy to succeed the NIC must be equipped with the necessary tools for implementation,” he added.

Hospitali ya Mafunzo ya Nakuru (NCTRH) inakamilisha ujenzi wa bunker ya radiotherapy yenye thamani ya Sh32 milioni, yenye lengo la kuboresha upatikanaji wa huduma za matibabu ya saratani katika maeneo ya Rift Valley Kusini na Kati. Mkurugenzi wa Huduma za Matibabu wa Kaunti,

Dkt. Daniel Wainaina, alisema kuwa ujenzi wa kituo hicho umekamilika kwa asilimia 65 na unatarajiwa kuanza kutoa huduma ndani ya miezi miwili. Aliongeza kuwa bunker hiyo mpya itakamilisha ile maalum ambayo tayari inafanya kazi tangu ilipozinduliwa mwaka wa 2024, hivyo kupanua huduma za radiotherapy. “Bunker hii mpya itaongezwa upatikanaji wa

huduma za radiotherapy kwa wagonjwa wa Nakuru na kaunti jirani 21, hivyo kupunguza haja ya kusafiri umbali mrefu kutafuta matibabu,” alisema wakati wa ziara ya ukaguzi akiwa pamoja na bodi ya hospitali inayooongozwa na Mwenyekiti Askofu Philip Nderitu. Bunker hii mpya ya radiotherapy itakuwa na mashine ya linear accelerator (LINAC) na vifaa vingine vya kisasa.

Ujenzi wa Kituo cha Uvuvi na Ufugaji wa Samaki cha Ubora wa Juu cha Kabonyo Kanyagwal, chenye thamani ya Shilingi bilioni 2.5 katika Kaunti ya Kisumu, umeanza tena baada ya kusimama kwa muda hali ambayo ilikuwa inatishia muda wa kukamilika kwa mradi huo. Hii inafuatia agizo la Rais William Ruto la kuharakisha kazi zilizokwama wakati wa kikao na viongozi wa Kaunti ya Kisumu. Mitambo mizito imetumwa katika eneo la mradi, na timu za ujenzi zimerudi kazi zini – ishara ya upya wa dhamira ya serikali kwa mradi huu wa mageuzi. Mradi huu, ambao ni sehemu ya juhudi za kufufua uchumi wa buluu wa Kenya, ni ushirikiano kati ya serikali ya Kenya na serikali ya Hungary. Mhandisi wa mradi, Vundi Mbwika, alisema ujenzi ambao kwa sasa umekamilika kwa asilimia 30, unaendelea vizuri. “Majengo matano ya kudumu yako kwenye ujenzi, na tumeanza kuhimba mfereji wa kuondoa maji yanayorudi

kutoka Ziwa Victoria na yale yanayotiririka kutoka Mto Nyando,” alisema. Aliongeza kuwa barabara ya upatikanaji yenye urefu wa mita 800 inajengwa ndani ya eneo hilo, pamoja na mfereji wa upana wa mita tatu wa kudhibiti mafuriko ili kulinda kituo dhidi ya kuongezeka kwa maji. Awamu ya kwanza ya mradi huo, alisema, inatarajiwa kukamilika ifikapo Juni 2026. “Baada ya kuanza kufanya kazi, kituo hiki kitazalisha vifaranga milioni 28 kwa mwaka kutoka mabwawa 20 ya samaki,” alisema. Pia kitakuwa na majengo ya utawala, mabweni, nyumba za wafanyakazi, kituo cha kuangua vifaranga, ghala la baridi, na vitengo vya uchakataji. Gavana wa Kisumu, Profesa Anyang’ Nyong’o, alimpongeza Rais kwa uingiliaji wake na kueleza kuridhishwa na maendeleo ya ujenzi. “Nataka kumshukuru Rais Ruto kwa kujitolea kwake. Alituhakikishia Ikulu kwamba mradi huu utatekelezwa, na sasa tunaona ahadi hiyo ikitimizwa,” alisema Prof. Nyong’o. Alisema kituo hiki kitahudumu kama eneo

la uzalishaji pamoja na kituo maalum cha mafunzo kwa wakulima na wadau wa sekta ya uvuvi, hatua itakayoinua sana ufugaji wa samaki katika eneo hilo. “Samaki watakao-fugwa katika kituo hiki watasambazwa kwa wakulima wadogo na pia kutumika kuongeza samaki kwenye Ziwa Victoria, ambapo kiwango cha samaki kimeshuka kwa kasi,” aliongeza. “Maelfu ya wakulima wadogo wa samaki watanufaika na mpango huu, unaolenga kuiimarisha usalama wa chakula na kuongeza kipato cha kaya katika eneo la ziwa,” alisema. Aidha, alisema mradi huu utazalisha nafasi nyingi za ajira za muda mfupi na mrefu kwa wahan-disi, mafundi, wasanifu majengo na wataalamu wengine, na hivyo kuchangia katika uchumi wa Kaunti ya Kisumu. Waziri wa Kaunti ya Kisumu (CECM) anayehusika na Kilimo, Uvuvi, Kenneth Onyango, alisema mradi huu utakuwa wa mageuzi kwa Wodi ya Kabonyo Kanyagwal, eneo ambalo kwa muda mrefu limekumbwa na mafuriko ya mara kwa mara.

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Wekeza katika sayansi kustawisha Afrika, Ogamba ahimiza viongozi

Waziri wa Elimu, Juilius N. Ogamba, ametoa wito wa kuimarisha tena juhudi barani Afrika katika kuwekeza katika sayansi na utafiti. Akizungumza katika kongamano la African Research Initiative for Scientific Excellence and Sustainable Development (ARISE-SD) lililofanyika nchini Ghana, alisema kwamba licha ya bara hili kuwa na uwezo mkubwa, uwekezaji katika utafiti na maendeleo (R&D) bado uko chini sana ya wastani wa kimataifa. “Tuliahidi kutumia asilimia moja ya Pato la Taifa (GDP) kwenye utafiti na maendeleo, lakini kwa sasa wastani wa bara zima ni asilimia 0.42 pekee, ukilinganishwa na wastani wa dunia wa asilimia 1.7. Tunapaswa kubadilisha mwenendo huu,” alisema Waziri Ogamba. Bw. Ogamba pia alisisitiza umuhimu wa ushirikiano wa ndani ya Afrika na ubia wa kimataifa ili kuongeza ubunifu, kushughulikia changamoto za pamoja, na kufanikisha ukuaji jumuishi. “Afrika ina hazina kubwa duniani: idadi kubwa ya vijana, ardhi yenye rutuba, na urithi wa viumbe hai – lakini hivi pekee havitoshi. Tunapaswa kuwekeza katika maarifa ya kitutendaji,” aliongeza. Waziri alithibitisha tena dhamira ya Kenya ya kuimarisha sayansi,

teknolojia, na ubunifu (STI) kama nguzo muhimu za maendeleo endelevu na mageuzi ya kiuchumi. Alibainisha juhudi mahsusi za nchi kuongeza uwekezaji kwenye STI, ikiwemo kuanzishwa kwa Idara Maalum ya Serikali kwa Sayansi, Utafiti, na Ubunifu, pamoja na azma ya serikali kuongeza ufadhili wa STI kutoka asilimia 0.7 ya sasa hadi asilimia moja inayopendekezwa na Umoja wa Afrika (AU). “Tumeona mafanikio ya uvumbuzi wa ndani nchini Kenya ambayo yameendeleza ujumuishaji wa kifedha, ujasiriamali wa kidijitali, kilimo kinachokabiliana na mabadiliko ya tabianchi, na usalama wa chakula. Hii ni ushahidi wazi kwamba kuwekeza katika STI kunaleta manufaa ya moja kwa moja,” alisema Bw. Ogamba. Akiwa anaonyesha uongozi wa Kenya katika STI, Waziri alieleza utayari wa nchi kuandaa kongamano

lijalo la ARISE-SD, jambo linalothibitisha imani yake katika ubora wa utafiti unaongozwa na Waafrika. “Tunapojadili mikakati ya bara, tunahimiza wadau wote kulinganisha juhudi zao na malengo ya Ajenda 2063 ya AU na Mkakati wa Sayansi, Teknolojia na Ubunifu wa Afrika (STISA) 2024-2034,” alisema Waziri. “Hebu tuunde mkataba wa ujasiri, unaomilikiwa na Waafrika, unaunganishwa na dunia, ukilenga vitendo, unaoendeshwa na sayansi, na unaozingatia utu na ustawi wa watu wetu,” alihitimisha. Sasa kwamba tuko katika Mwaka wa Kimataifa wa Vyama vya Ushirika, tunakusudia kutoa zawadi kwa harakati za ushirika kama kutambua kazi kubwa wanayofanya katika kusaidia ukuaji wa uchumi. “Tunaomba pia kaunti zipe kipaumbele vyama vya ushirika kwa sababu vinagusa maisha ya kila Mkenya alisema Marube.

Taka za plastiki zinaen-delea kuwa tishio kubwa kwa uhifadhi wa mazingira duniani kote, huku mamilioni ya tani zikiishia kwenye mazingira licha ya juhudi nyingi za kuchakata upya. Hata hivyo, juhudi bunifu za mhandisi mmoja kutoka Murang'a zinatoa suluhisho la kuahidi kwa janga hili linalozidi kuongezeka. James Muritu, ambaye ni mhandisi wa programu na vifaa vya kielektroniki kwa taaluma, amebuni mbinu ya kipekee ya kubadilisha taka za plastiki kuwa mafuta — haswa dizeli. Ubunifu wake, uliomhitaji kufanya utafiti kwa zaidi ya miaka miwili na kisha majaribio makali kwa miezi 18, tayari umeanza kutambulika kitaifa. “Kuanzisha mfumo huu kuli-kuwa na gharama kubwa kwa sababu nililazimika kufadhili utafiti na kujenga miundombinu ya uzalishaji mwenyewe. Mradi huu unahitaji mtaji mkubwa, na kutimiza masharti yote ya uthibitisho na vibali kulikuwa changamoto kubwa,” alieleza. Akiwa katika mji wa Kenol, Kaunti ya Murang'a, Muritu anasema alianza mradi wake wakati bei ya mafuta nchini Kenya ilikuwa juu sana. Kwake, hii ilikuwa chanzo mbadala cha nishati. “Baada ya kukamilisha mchakato wa kutengeneza mafuta, nilisajili kampuni yangu, Progreen, katika mwaka 2023 na nikaanza kuuza mwaka 2024 baada ya mchakato mrefu wa kupata vyeti,” aliongeza. Ingawa dizeli yake ime-uthibitishwa na Shirika la Viwango Kenya (KEBS), kwa sasa inatumika zaidi katika mitambo ya viwandani. “Nimetambua nafasi katika sekta ya viwanda ambapo gharama za mafuta ni kubwa, na wazalishaji wengi wameukaribisha ubunifu huu kama njia ya kupunguza gharama,” alisema.

Ubunifu wake ulimpatia tuzo kutoka KEBS mwaka 2024 kama “Bidhaa ya Dizeli Yenye Ubunifu Zaidi” ya mwaka huo. Kwa sasa, Muritu huzalisha takriban lita 4,000 za dizeli kila mwezi, ambazo anasambaza kwa mtengenezaji mmoja mkubwa. Kwa ufaadhili zaidi, anasema kiwanda

kinaweza kuongeza uzalishaji hadi lita 50,000 kwa mwezi, jambo ambalo litaongeza upatikanaji na athari chanya. Akizungumzia mipango ya baadaye, Muritu anasema ananui kuanza pia kuzalisha petroli. Kwa sasa anajaribu petroli na wateja 50, na baada ya kupata vyeti kamili, anapanga kulenga soko kubwa zaidi, ikiwemo wændesha boda boda na wakulima wadogo wanaotumia mitambo. Tangu kuanzisha mradi wa kuchakata taka, Muritu anakadiria kuwa ameshughulikizia zaidi ya tani 80,000 za taka za plastiki, hivyo kuzuia ziishie kwenye madampo au mito. “Ikibadilishwa kuwa kiwango cha kaboni, hii ni sawa na tani 200 za hewa ya kaboni. Hii ni taka ya plastiki ambayo ingeishia kwenye mito au kuchomwa wazi, na hivyo kutoa gesi chafu hatari. Badala yake, tunaipoleka kuwa kitu cha manufaa,” alibainisha. Ili kuhakikisha mchakato rafiki kwa mazingira, Muritu ameweka mfumo wa kusafisha gesi unaopunguza kabisa moshi kutoka kwenye uzalishaji, na hivyo kulinda hewa zaidi. Zaidi ya plastiki, Muritu pia anatomia taka za kikorganiki kutengeneza vitalu vya kupokotesha joto ambavyo ni rafiki kwa mazingira. Vitalu hivyo hutengenezwa kwa kusaga na kukausha mabaki ya avokado na taka za jikoni zinazokusanywa na wachukuzi wa taka, na kisha hutumika kama nishati ya kuendesha tanuri lake. Anatomia mabaki yanayobaki baada ya kubadilisha plastiki kama kiungio cha vitalu hivi. “Hivi sasa, natumia taka kutoka kiwanda cha kusindika avokado ambacho kinatoa mafuta na hakina njia nzuri ya kutupa mabaki. Wanatiletea na pia tunakausha, kusaga, na kuchanganya na taka nyingine za kikorganiki kutoka kwa wachukuzi wa taka ili kutengeneza vitalu,” alisema Muritu.

Nakuru yapanua huduma za Saratani kwa kununua mashine mpya ya mionzi

Kaunti ya Nakuru imenunua mashine yake ya pili ya linear accelerator (LINAC), ambayo itaimarisha huduma katika Hospitali ya Rufaa na Mafunzo ya Kaunti ya Nakuru (NCTRH). Kwa mujibu wa Mkurugenzi wa Huduma za Matibabu wa Kaunti hiyo, Dkt. Daniel Wainaina, mashine ya LINAC tayari ipo hospitalini na inasubiri baadhi ya vifaa vya mwisho, kuidhinishwa na kukabidhiwa rasmi. Dkt. - (x) certify that the names appearing in a party list are the names of members of the political party presenting the party list;

- (xiii) investigate complaints received under the Act; and
- (xiv) perform any such other functions as may be conferred by the Act or any other written law.

Stakeholders rally Africa to invest in research and innovation

The Cabinet Secretary (CS) for Education Julius Ogamba has called for a renewed commitment across Africa to invest in science and research.

Speaking at the African Research Initiative for Scientific Excellence and Sustainable Development (ARISE-SD) conference in Ghana, he noted that de-

spite the continent's vast potential, investment in research and development remains significantly below the global average.

"We committed to spending one per cent of our GDP on research and development, yet the current average across the continent stands at only 0.42 per cent, compared to the global average of 1.7 per cent. We must reverse this trend," the CS said.

Mr. Ogamba also em-

phasized the importance of intra-African cooperation and global partnerships to scale up innovation, tackle common challenges, and achieve inclusive growth.

"Africa holds some of the world's greatest endowments: youthful population, arable land, rich biodiversity – but these alone are not enough. We must invest in applied knowledge," he added.

The CS reaffirmed Ken-

ya's unwavering commitment to strengthening Science, Technology And Innovation (STI) as critical pillars for sustainable development and economic transformation.

He highlighted the country's deliberate efforts to increase STI investments, including the establishment of a full-fledged State Department for Science, Research and Innovation, and the government's commitment

to raise STI funding from the current 0.7 per cent to the AU-recommended one per cent of the GDP.

"Kenya's own experience with home-grown innovations that have advanced financial inclusion, digital entrepreneurship, climate-smart agriculture, and food security is clear proof that investing in STI delivers tangible benefits," Mr. Ogamba stated.

Underlining its lead-

ership in STI, Kenya expressed readiness to host the next ARISE-SD conference, further affirming its belief in African-led research excellence.

"As we deliberate on continental strategies, we urge all stakeholders to align their efforts with the aspirations of the AU Agenda 2063 and the Science, Technology and Innovation Strategy for Africa (STISA) 2024-2034," the CS said.

REQUIREMENT TO GRANT ACCESS TO PREMISES BY LICENSED COMMUNICATION SERVICE PROVIDERS TO SERVE CONSUMERS

The Communications Authority of Kenya (CA), established under the Kenya Information and Communications Act, 1998, is the regulatory agency for the ICT industry in Kenya with responsibilities in telecommunications, cyber security, e-commerce, broadcasting and postal/courier services. The CA is also responsible for managing the country's numbering and frequency spectrum resources, administering the Universal Service Fund (USF) as well as safeguarding the interests of users of ICT services.

It has come to the attention of the Authority that some private, public entities and landlords are denying access or limiting access or locking-in specific telecommunication service providers and services to their premises. It is important to note that consumers and users of communication services have a right to choose their service provider from among the licensed entities.

We wish to notify the public that denying access or limiting access or locking-in specific service providers in premises is in contravention to the Constitution of Kenya Chapter Four on Bill of Rights Articles 33, 34 & 35 that grant free access to information and communication systems of any nature by members of the public. The Kenya Information and Communications Act, 1998, further prohibits denial of access to communication services and requires provision of equal opportunity for access to the same type and quality of service to all customers.

We would like to make specific reference to the following sections of the Act for information.

84U. Denial of access *No licensee under this Act shall deny access or service to a customer except for delinquency of payment of dues or for any other just cause.*

84V. Anti-competitive practices and conduct *A licensee shall provide equal opportunity for access to the same type and quality of service to all customers in a given area at substantially the same tariff limiting variations to available or appropriate technologies required to serve specific customers.*

To this end, the Authority directs:

- Landlords, property owners and managers not to deny access, limit access or locking-in specific telecommunication service providers and services to their premises. All licensed service providers should be given equal treatment in terms of access to the premises, to give the consumers and users of communication services the right to determine and choose their service provider.
- Members of public, landlords, property owners and managers to procure communication services from duly licensed and compliant entities only. The register of licensed entities is always updated and posted routinely on the Authority's website vide the link <https://www.ca.go.ke/licensee-register>.
- That all premises and services deployed must be supported by a valid compliance certificate issued by the Authority which should be produced and be displayed in the contact office of the utilizing premise.
- Landlords, property owners and managers to guarantee safety and ensure no vandalism or compromise on installed communication systems and services within their premises.

ICT services are critical in powering the socio-economic development of our country and as such, the public is advised to desist from obtaining services from unlicensed or non-compliant licensees to ensure better quality of services and robust consumer protection.

Serikali kuu, kwa ushirikiano na serikali za kaunti, inaendesha kampeni za kitaifa za chanjo ili kudhibiti magonjwa ya mifugo na kuongeza biashara ya bidhaa za mifugo. Kama sehemu ya juhudi hizi, Idara ya Mifugo itatoa mbegu bora kwa bei nafuu ili kuboresha uzao wa mifugo ya kienyeji katika Kaunti ya Siaya. Red Cross, Turkana wazindua mradi mkubwa wa kujiandaa na majanga

Kaunti ya Turkana itajenga kituo cha kisasa cha kukabiliana na majanga ili kuhudumia jamii ya eneo hilo pamoja na majirani Uganda na Sudan Kusini. Mpango huu wa kihistoria ulifichuliwa wakati wa kikao cha ngazi ya juu kati ya serikali ya kaunti na Shirika la Msalaba Mwekundu la Kenya. Naibu Gavana, Dkt. John Erus, alieleza imani yake kwamba kituo hicho kitaimarisha maandalizi ya dharura na kutoa taarifa muhimu kwa ajili ya kufanya maamuzi kuhusu mipango ya kukabiliana na majanga siku zijazo. “Tunaweza kuthibitisha kuwa ekari kumi za ardhi zilizotolewa na Serikali ya Kaunti ya Turkana kwa Shirika la Msalaba Mwekundu zitakuwa makao ya kituo hiki cha kisasa,” alisema Dkt. Erus. Akitambua historia ndefu ya majanga yanayojirudia katika Turkana, Dkt. Erus alisema kaunti hiyo ni eneo la kimkakati kwa uwekezaji huu na kwamba changamoto za mabadiliko ya tabianchi zinaendelea

kuzidisha hali ya majanga. Naibu Katibu Mkuu wa Shirika la Msalaba Mwekundu la Kenya, Joe Mbalu, alisema kituo hicho kippya kitaongeza idadi ya vituo vilivyopo kufikia kumi na moja, kwani tayari kuna vituo kumi vinavyofanya kazi katika maeneo mengine. “Baada ya kukamilika, kituo hiki kitakuwa cha kipekee. Kimebuniwa kuhudumia maeneo yote ya Turkana, yakiwemo yale ambayo ni magumu kufikika, na pia kitafanya kazi kama rasilimali ya kimataifa ili kupunguza muda wa majibu kwa majanga katika nchi jirani za Uganda na Sudan Kusini,” alisema Mbalu. Pande hizo pia zilijadili masuala mbalimbali yakiwemo athari za upungufu wa ufadhili katika utoaji wa huduma, juhudi za pamoja za uhamasishaji wa rasilimali kwa ajili ya ujenzi wa bwawa la Sh6 bilioni katika Mto Tarach kwa ajili ya kuboresha upatikanaji wa maji, msaada wa kuimarisha ujumuishaji wa wakazi na wakimbizi, matumizi ya teknolojia ya droni kutathmini uharibifu
