Mamlaka ya Uku-usanyaji Ushuru nchini Kenya (KRA) imevuka lengo lake la ukusanyaji mapato kwa mwaka wa kifedha 2024/2025, baada ya kukusanya jumla ya Shilingi trilioni 2.571 dhidi ya lengo la Shilingi trilioni 2.555. Hii ni ongezeko la asilimia 6.8 katika ukusanyaji wa mapato na kiwango cha utekelezaji wa asilimia 100.6, ikilinganishwa na Shilingi trilioni 2.407 zilizokusanywa katika mwaka wa kifedha uliopita.

Kulingana na Kamishna Mkuu wa KRA, Bw. Humphrey Wattanga, ufanisi huu wa mapato unaonyesha hali ya kiuchumi nchini, hasa kwa kuzingatia ukuaji wa Pato la Taifa (GDP) kwa asilimia 4.7 kama ilivyoripotiwa kwenye Ripoti ya Uchumi. Ukuaji mkubwa ulirekodiwa katika sekta kuu kama kilimo, misitu na uvuvi; shughuli za kifedha na bima; usafirishaji na uhifadhi; na sekta ya mali isiyohamishika. Aidha, mfumuko wa bei kwa ujumla ulipungua hadi wastani wa asilimia 3.6 katika

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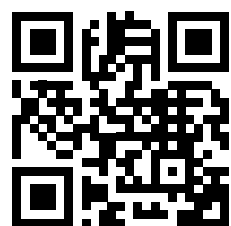

mwaka wa 2024/25, ikilinganishwa na asilimia 6.3 katika mwaka wa 2023/24. Kiwango cha ubadilishaji wa Shilingi ya Kenya dhidi ya Dola ya Marekani kiliongezeka, kwa wastani wa Sh129.35 kwa Dola moja, ikilinganishwa na Sh144.1 mwaka uliopita. Bei ya mafuta ya kimataifa kwa pipa ilishuka kwa asilimia 12.5, hali iliyochangia kupungua kwa bei ya mafuta katika vituo vya mafuta nchini: petroli kwa asilimia 11.8 na dizeli kwa asilimia 12.2. Hata hivyo, Bw. Wattanga alibainisha kuwa baadhi ya changamoto ziliathiri vibaya ukusanyaji wa mapato. Nusu ya kwanza ya mwaka wa kifedha 2024/25 ilikumbwa na changamoto mbalimbali za kiuchumi, ikiwemo kuahirishwa kwa Mswada wa Fedha wa 2024, viwango vya juu vya riba katika benki, vita vya ushuru vya kimataifa, na migogoro ya kimataifa inayoendelea. Hasa, thamani ya jumla ya uagizaji wa bidhaa kutoka nje iliongezeka kwa asilimia ndogo ya 0.04 pekee, kutokana na kupungua kwa thamani ya uagizaji wa mafuta na vilainishi (-16.4%) na chakula na vinywaji (-14.6%). Wakati huo huo, thamani ya mauzo ya bidhaa nje ya nchi ilipungua kwa asilimia 2.0, hasa kutokana na kupungua kwa mauzo ya mazao ya bustani (-2.5%) na chai (-15.4%).

Kamishna Mkuu aliongeza kuwa upatikanaji wa mikopo kwa sekta binafsi uliendelea kuwa mgumu kutokana na viwango vya juu vya riba kutoka kwa benki za biashara ikilinganishwa na mwaka uliopita. Hata hivyo, inatarajiwa kuwa viwango hivyo vitashuka kufuatia uamuzi wa Benki Kuu ya Kenya (CBK) kupunguza kiwango cha riba kuu hadi asilimia 9.75 mwezi Juni 2025. “Kwa hadi mwisho wa Desemba 2024, mikopo iliyotolewa na benki za biashara kwa serikali ya kitaifa ili-

kua kwa asilimia 13.9, huku mikopo kwa sekta binafsi ikishuka kwa asilimia 1.1,” aliripoti, akiongeza kuwa hali hii inakwamisha matarajio ya uwekezaji na upanuzi wa sekta kuu za uchumi. Licha ya changamoto hizo, Bw. Wattanga alisema kuwa mikakati madhubuti ya KRA ilisababisha mafanikio makubwa katika nusu ya pili ya mwaka wa kifedha, ambapo ukusanyaji wa mapato uliongezeka kwa asilimia 9.1, ikilinganishwa na asilimia 4.5 katika nusu ya kwanza.

Matumizi ya nishati yafikia rekodi ya juu

Kenya imefikia rekodi mpya ya mahitaji ya umeme, ikigonga megawati (MW) 2,362.28 – hatua muhimu katika matumizi ya nishati kitaifa, yakichochea na upanuzi wa viwanda, ongezeko la miji, na matumizi ya nyumbani yanayozidi kuongezeka. Afisa Mtendaji Mkuu wa Kampuni ya Kuzalisha Umeme Kenya (KenGen), Mhandisi Peter Njenga, alibainisha kuwa vyanzo vya nishati ya joto ardhi na maji vya KenGen vilichangia sehemu kubwa ya umeme kwenye gridi ya taifa. Kulingana na Mamlaka ya Udhhibiti wa Nishati na Petroli (EPRA), mitambo ya joto ardhi ya KenGen ilizalisha megawati-saa (MWh) 13,678.35, ambayo ni asilimia 31.85 ya uzalishaji wote, huku mitambo ya umeme wa maji ikizalisha MWh 10,915.93, sawa na asilimia 25.42 ya uzalishaji wa kitaifa. Kwa pamoja, vyanzo hivi viwili vilichangia asilimia 57.27 ya uzalishaji wa kila siku wa umeme nchini Kenya. Mkurugenzi huyo alisema kuwa mchango huo umechangia kwa kiasi kikubwa katika kudumisha uthabiti wa usambazaji wa umeme na kuzuia kukatika kwa umeme. “Wakati mahitaji ya jumla ya

nishati yalifikia MWh 42,943.11 – yakiwemo vyanzo vya mafuta, upepo na miunganisho ya kielektroniki kutoka Uganda na Ethiopia – tunafurahia kutambua kuwa ni usambazaji wa KenGen unaotegemewa kutoka kwa rasilimali asilia za nchini uliohakikisha uthabiti wa gridi,” alisema Bw. Njenga. Aliongeza kuwa mahitaji hayo yalitimizwa bila kuwepo kwa taarifa yoyote ya mgawo wa umeme, jambo linaloonyesha mwitikio madhubuti kutoka kwa waendeshaji wa mfumo. Mhandisi Njenga alieleza zaidi kuwa vituo vya umeme wa maji kama Kiambere vilizidi matarajio, kwa kuzalisha MWh 2,908 – asilimia 23.31 zaidi ya makadirio ya usambazaji.

Kenya, kwa ushirikiano na Benki ya Dunia, imetanzimwa rasmi Mpango wa Kitaifa wa Fursa kwa Vijana uitwao NYOTA (National Youth Opportunities Towards Advancement). Mpango huu ni hatua ya mageuzi yenye lengo la kuwawezesha vijana zaidi ya 200,000 kote nchini kwa kuwapa fursa za ajira, ujasiriamali, teknolojia ya kidijitali, na nafasi katika sekta ya ubunifu. Hafla ya uzinduzi iliyofanyika jijini Nairobi iliongozwa na Waziri wa Masuala ya Vijana, Uchumi wa Ubunifu na Michezo, Salim Mvurya, pamoja na Katibu wa Masuala ya Vijana na Uchumi wa Ubunifu, Fikirini Jacobs. Hafla hiyo iliwakutanisha viongozi wa vijana kutoka kaunti zote 47, washirika wa utekelezaji wa mradi, na wadau kutoka serikalini na sekta binafsi. Ili kuboresha upatikanaji wa huduma kwa vijana, Katibu huyo alitangaza kutengenezwa kwa “Youth Opportunity Passport” ya kidijitali, itakayojumuisha programu zote za serikali kwa vijana katika jukwaa moja. Alitoa wito kwa Baraza la Taifa la Vijana kuharakisha mchakato wa kidijitali ili kuwawezesha masasisho ya wakati halisi.

PROFICIENCY EXAMINATION FOR CLERICAL OFFICERS- SEPTEMBER, 2025

It is notified for general information that year 2025 Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officers will be held from Monday 22nd to Thursday 25th September 2025 at Machakos; Nyeri; Mombasa; Embu; Garissa; Kisumu; Nakuru; Kakamega and Eldoret examination centers. The actual venues will be notified to the candidates after registration.

ELIGIBILITY FOR REGISTRATION

To register for the Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officers, an officer must:

- Have passed the Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (K.C.S.E.) with a mean grade of C – (minus) or its equivalent;
- Be designated as a clerical officer in the Public Service; and
- Have served as a clerical officer for a minimum period of one (1) year.

REGISTRATION FORMS

1. REGISTRATION FORMS

- All candidates attempting the examination for the first time are required to complete registration FORM A while referred candidates should complete FORM B available on the Public Service Commission website www.publicservice.go.ke.
- The Candidate should submit the duly completed registration form, accompanied by the Government copy of the receipt generated from E-citizen platform to the Secretary/Chief Executive, Public Service Commission P. O. Box 30095-00100 NAIROBI so as to reach the Commission not later than **Friday, 22nd August, 2025**.

REGISTRATION FEES

Each candidate will be required to pay registration fees as per the revised rates in the circular Ref **PSC. EXAM/1/VOL.11 dated 3rd May 2018**.

Candidates are required to pay the registration fee through the E-Citizen platform using the following procedure:

- Log in to <https://psc.ecitizen.go.ke>;
- Select PSC Examinations;
- Click the apply now button;
- Log in to the e-citizen using your personal account;
- Read the requirements for registration and click the next button;
- The applicants details will be uploaded from your personal e-citizen account;
- Click the next button;
- Select whether registering for the first time or for a re-sit;
- Select the type of examination;
- For candidates who are re-sitting select the appropriate subjects;
- Select the examination center;
- Click the next button to preview the applicants details;
- Click the next button to preview the examination details;
- Click the next button and confirm that the information provided is accurate;
- Scroll to the bottom of the page and click the complete button;
- Await approval from the Public Service Commission;
- The approval status will be displayed on the applicant's E-citizen profile and communicated to their registered telephone number via SMS;
- Once approval is granted, scroll back to your profile and click on the awaiting payment button;
- Make the payment through one of the gateways provided; and
- Download the Government copy of the receipt and attach it to the duly filled registration form.

LATE REGISTRATION

A late registration fee of Kshs. 525 will be charged on all candidates who submit their registration forms after 22nd August, 2025. The deadline for late registration is **29th August, 2025**.

COLLECTION OF CERTIFICATES

The certificates for candidates who passed the Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officers held in September 2024 are ready for collection at the Public Service Commission House during official working hours. Officers are requested to carry their original identification document. Officers who passed promotional examinations administered by the Public Service Commission in earlier years and have not collected their certificates are requested to do so.

SHA yafikia usajili wa milioni 24.8 huku TAIFA Care ikizidi kushika kasi

Wakenya takriban milioni 24.8 wamejiandikisha katika Mamlaka ya Afya ya Jamii (SHA), hatua kubwa inayohusishwa na kampeni kabambe za usajili katika kila kaunti. Waziri wa Afya Aden Duale amepongeza mafanikio ya mageuzi ya SHA tangu kuzinduliwa kwa TAIFA Care mnamo Oktoba 1, 2024. “Tunaelekea Nakuru kuendeleza kasi hii ili kuhakikisha hakuna Mkenya anayeachwa nyuma,” alisema wakati wa mkutano na wanahabari, huku akisisitiza umuhimu wa michango kutolewa kwa wakati ili kudumisha Mfuko huo. Kulingana na Duale, Wakenya milioni 4.5 tayari wamepata matibabu kwa magonjwa ya kawaida na huduma za afya ya uzazi kupitia sehemu ya huduma za msingi, huku milioni 2.2 wakinu-faika na huduma maalum – wakiwemo wagonjwa 8,000 waliopata huduma ya usafishaji figo na 18,000 waliopokea matibabu ya saratani. Waziri huyo aliongeza kuwa huduma ya afya ya uzazi imesaidia zaidi ya akina mama 515,000 kujifungua tangu Oktoba 2024.

Hadi sasa, SHA ime-lipa Shilingi bilioni 6.8 kwa madaai ya huduma za afya ya msingi, huku Shilingi bilioni 1.5 zikiwa tayari kutolewa. “Tunalenga kuimarisha uthibitishaji na usindikaji wa madaai ili kuhakikisha fedha zinatumiwa kwa uwazi na madaai halali pekee ndiyo yanayolipwa,” alisisitiza. Waziri huyo aliwahimiza Wakenya kuripoti malipo haramu katika vituo vya serikali, akieleza kuwa Sh 13b zimetengwa kufadhili huduma za afya ya msingi bila malipo, hasa katika vituo vya kiwango cha Pili hadi cha Nne. Duale alifichua kuwa tayari amepokea ripoti kutoka kwa kamati huru inayochunguza upasuaji wa figo na ulanguzi wa viungo vya binadamu. “Ni hati ya umma, na

nawahimiza wanahabari kuichambua. Inazungumzia mapungufu ya kisheria, kiadili na kiafya, na pia inapendekeza mageuzi yanayoweza kutekelezwa,” alisema. Aliahidi kuwasilisha matokeo hayo kwa Bunge na Baraza la Mawaziri, na kuongeza kuwa ripoti hiyo itatekelezwa kikamilifu. Duale aliwahimiza Wakenya kuwa na subira kwa mchakato wa mageuzi unaoendelea. “Tunajenga mfumo unaoleta usawa, uwajibikaji na huduma za afya kwa wote. 2025 REMITTANCES HOUSEHOLD SURVEY

The Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (KNBS), in collaboration with the Central Bank of Kenya (CBK) and Financial Sector Deepening Kenya (FSD Kenya), is conducting the first ever Remittances Household Survey (RHS) from July to September 2025.

Remittances represent international transfers in monetary (cash), and non-monetary (non-cash/in-kind) form sent by family members, friends and relatives living abroad to households in Kenya (inward remittances) or sent by households in Kenya to family members, friends and relatives living abroad (outward remittances). The remittances can be transferred through formal channels such as the banking system, couriers, money transfer operators, and mobile money or informal channels such as physically carrying across borders.

Purpose

The purpose of the 2025 RHS is to collect qualitative and quantitative information on inward and outward remittances. The data collected will be used to improve national statistics for planning, research and policy formulation, including those related to supporting the remittance flows.

Objectives

The overall objective of the 2025 RHS is to collect information on the amount of inward and outward remittances in Kenya. Specifically, the survey seeks to:

- Collect information on the amount of inward and outward remittances in cash and in-kind/non-cash.
- Establish the channels for remitting the transfers, the costs incurred, and the challenges faced.
- Establish the uses of remittances received to estimate the impact on the livelihood of the recipients.
- The difficulties encountered in sending or receiving money or in-kind/non-cash transfers.
- Provide policy recommendations for improving the remittances market in Kenya.

Use of Data Collected

The 2025 RHS is expected to produce national estimates on the magnitude of remittance flows into Kenya and out of Kenya, both money and non-cash. The data collected from the 2025 RHS will be used for compilation of Balance of Payments statistics, monitoring Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), research and policy formulation.

Target Respondents

2025 RHS will be administered to households in Kenya who have received and/or sent remittances.

Authority

The Statistics Act, CAP 112 Laws of Kenya [Rev. 2022] empowers KNBS to collect Remittance Statistics in Kenya, among other statistics. Households are legally bound to provide the required information.

Confidentiality

Confidentiality of statistical information provided is guaranteed under the Statistics Act, CAP 112 Laws of Kenya [Rev. 2022] which can be accessed on the KNBS Website (www.knbs.or.ke). All the information provided will be treated with utmost confidentiality and will only be used for statistical purposes. The 2025 RHS personnel are under oath not to divulge information provided by the households to a third party.

Output

The findings will be published in aggregated form on the KNBS, CBK and FSD Kenya websites.

Appeal

The 2025 RHS Field Personnel will visit selected households during the survey period, which will be conducted, between **July and September 2025**. The Field Personnel will have identification badges. Given the importance of this exercise, we appeal to the selected households to cooperate and support the survey field staff.

We appreciate the continued cooperation and support in the production of official statistics.

Mukare Mpusia, mwenye umri wa miaka 43, ni mtu mwenye ulemavu. Alizaliwa akiwa na ulemavu wa kimwili ambao ulimzuia kushiriki katika kazi za vibarua. Alizaliwa Naroosura, Narok, eneo ambalo mara nyingi ulemavu

huonekana kama laana. Wazazi wake walimficha alipokuwa mtoto, na hivyo wakamnyima fursa ya kwenda shule. Alikua akimtegemea baba yake kwa mahitaji ya kila siku hadi alipofikisha miaka 20, ambapo ardhi ya familia yao iligawanywa na kwa bahati nzuri Mpusia akapewa

sehemu yake ya ekari 20.

Bw. Mpusia alianza kufuga mifugo wachache, lakini ilikuwa vigumu kupata mapato ya kutosha kuwahudumia wake zake wawili na watoto wao 13 waliomtegemea kikaamilifu. Watoto wake walikuwa wakirudishwa nyumbani mara

Wake zangu wawili wanaishi vizuri, na watoto wetu wote wanaishi pamoja kwa furaha. Kuna chakula cha kutosha kwa familia yangu yote

kwa mara kwa sababu ya kushindwa kulipa ada ya shule. Licha ya kumiliki kipande kikubwa cha ardhi, ilikuwa changamoto kubwa kupata chakula cha kila siku. Hali hiyo ilisababisha migogoro ya mara kwa mara katika familia yake, hasa kati yake na wake zake. Hata hivyo, maisha yake yalibadilika baada ya shirika la World Vision kumwalika kushiriki mafunzo ya Empowered World View (EWV), yaliyochochea fikra zake na kumfungulia macho kuhusu uwezo wake mkubwa licha ya ulemavu wake. Baada ya mafunzo hayo, alianza kuwathamini wake zake na watoto wake zaidi. Kwa pamoja, waliunda mpango wa kiu-chumi, wakipa kipaumbele kilimo cha mahindi na maharagwe pamoja na ufugaji wa mbuzi. “Nilianza kwa kupanda mahindi kwenye ekari moja na nikavuna magunia sita, ambayo niliuza kwa Sh65,000. Nilitumia pesa hizo kulipa ada ya shule ya watoto wangu. Fedha iliyobaki nilinunua mbuzi dume wawili, ambao niliwauza baada ya miezi miwili kwa Sh14,000. Kati ya hizo, Sh4,500 nilitumia kulima mahindi na maharagwe katika shamba langu la ekari moja,” alisema. Shughuli zake za kilimo zinangwa mkono na kikundi cha kujisaidia cha ‘Erasaroto Enkongu Enkare’, ambacho humwezesha kuweka akiba na kupata mikopo ya kupanua miradi yake ya kilimo. “Tangu nipate mafunzo ya EWV, familia yangu imekuwa na mshikamano na furaha zaidi. Wake zangu wawili wanaelewana vizuri, na watoto wetu wote wanaishi kwa amani. Chakula kinatosha kwa kila mtu katika familia,” alisema kwa furaha.

Mhandisi alivyogeukia uponyaji kupitia nyuki

Katika vilima vya Kandara, Kaunti ya Murang'a ambavyo kwa kawaida huwa na utulivu, ubunifu mpya unachipua kwa kasi. Ni alasiri ya joto isiyo ya kawaida mnamo mwezi Julai, wakati Shirika la Habari la Kenya (KNA) linapomtembelea Steven Kimani katika kituo chake cha ufugaji wa nyuki. Kutoka maeneo mbalimbali, wageni wanafika kituoni humo wakitafuta uponyaji kutoka kwa wakemia wa kale wa asili – nyuki wa asili. Nje ya hema lililojengwa kwa vifaa rahisi, wageni kadhaa wanasubiri kwa subira foleni yao ili kupata tiba ya kichungu lakini ya maajabu—kudungwa na nyuki. Mita chache kutoka hapo, kundi lingine la wateja linaingia na kutoka katika duka la shamba lililojaa bidhaa, likihudumiwa na wahudumu wanne walioko nyuma ya kaunta. Wengine walikuja kununua asali mbichi, wengine dondoo la propolis kutoka kwa nyuki, chavua, na bidhaa za urembo kutokana na asali, huku wengine wakija kunywa dawa—mchanganyiko wa asali unaojulikana kwa kutibu mafua na kuongeza kinga ya mwili. “Ninahitimu kwa shahada ya Uhandisi wa Ujenzi kutoka Chuo Kikuu cha Moi mnamo 2010, na baada ya kufanya kazi kwa muda, niliacha taaluma hiyo mwaka wa 2015 na kujitosa kwenye ujasiriamali,” anasema Kimani mwenye umri wa miaka 38, mwanzilishi na mmiliki wa Kituo cha Bella Apitherapy. Mwanzoni, alijaribu ufugaji wa ng'ombe wa maziwa lakini akagundua haraka kuwa haukuwa endelevu kwa sababu alihitaji kuwepo kila wakati. Badala yake, aliamua kupanda miti ya parachichi



kwani haikuhitaji kazi nyingi. “Siku moja niliona nyuki akichavusha mti wa parachichi na hapo ndipo nilianza kuvutiwa na ufugaji wa nyuki. Mawazo yangu ya kwanza yalikuwa kuuza asali tu,” asema. Ili kuongeza ujuzi wake kuhusu nyuki, alifanya kozi ya cheti katika ufugaji wa nyuki na hapo akafahamu kuhusu bidhaa nyingine nyingi zitokanazo na nyuki pamoja na faida zake. Alishangazwa kujua kwamba

wafugaji wa nyuki huwa haumwi mara kwa mara. “Hii iliniezea kuwa kuna kitu kuhusu sumu ya nyuki au bidhaa za nyuki. Hili liliamsha zaidi shauku yangu,” alisema. Baadaye, Kimani alijiunga na kozi ya Apitherapy nchini Romania, kisha akafanya kozi ya juu ya ufugaji wa nyuki kwa ushirikiano na kampuni moja ya Uholanzi. Akiwa na maarifa ya kiufundi na ari kubwa, alianzisha ofisi

Marsabit yakumbatia kilimo licha ya changamoto za mafuriko na ukame

NA SEBASTIAN MIRITI, KNA

Marsabit, kaunti ya pili kwa ukubwa nchini Kenya, mara nyingi inahusishwa na ukame, mafuriko na mmomonyoko wa udongo. Kuongezeka kwa maji katika Ziwa Turkana kumezidisha hali kuwa ngumu zaidi kwa wakazi wa kaunti hiyo, ambayo ni makazi ya maelfu ya wafugaji. Kwa muda, hali hii imewaacha wakazi wengi wakiwa katika hatari ya ukosefu wa chakula, huku viwango vya utapiamlo vikiripotiwa kuwa vya juu. Mabadiliko ya tabianchi yameathiri pakubwa wakazi wa eneo hilo, ambao hutegemea ufugaji na biashara ya mifugo kama njia yao kuu ya kujipa-

tia kipato. Ukame wa mara kwa mara huharibu mifugo yao na kuangamiza malisho. Hata hivyo, juhudi za kubadili mbinu za kujikimu zinaendelea, ambapo wakazi wameanza kufundishwa kilimo cha mazao. Serikali ya Kaunti ya Marsabit, kwa ushirikiano na wadau wa maendeleo, inatoa mbegu za bure za mazao yanayokua kwa haraka kama vile mahindi na maharagwe. Ingawa juhudi hizi bado hazijazaa matunda ya kuridhisha kutokana na mvua isiyotabirika na hali ya hewa isiyoeleweka, serikali ya kaunti kwa kushirikiana na Shirika la Mpango wa Chakula Duniani (WFP), imeanzisha ufugaji wa samaki katika maeneo matatu.

Aliwasiliana na Taasisi ya Utafiti wa Kilimo na Mifugo Kenya (KALRO) iliyoko karibu, ambayo ilimruhusu kuanzisha mzinga wa nyuki katika shamba lao. Hapo ameweka zaidi ya mizinga 150 ya nyuki ambayo humpatia asali na bidhaa nyingine kwa wingi na kwa wakati wote. “Bidhaa nyingine za nyuki ni pamoja na sumu ya nyuki, nta, propolis, asali, chavua, mkate wa nyuki (bee bread), royal jelly, lava wa nyuki wa dume, na hewa ya mzinga,” asema. Mbali na bidhaa hizo, eneo kuu la ujuzi wake limekuwa tiba ya nyuki (apitherapy)—tawi la tiba mbadala linalotumia bidhaa kutoka kwa nyuki kwa ajili ya uponyaji na afya bora. Mtaalamu huyo wa apitherapy anaeleza kuwa sumu ya nyuki imethibitishwa kusaidia kudhibiti hali kadhaa ikiwemo kupunguza maumivu na uvimbe, kuongeza kinga ya mwili, kuponya vidonda, na kupunguza matatizo ya ngozi kama vile eczema na psoriasis. “Mteja anapofika hapa kwa mara ya kwanza, tunamzunga nyuki mmoja mkononi kuangalia kama ana mzio wa chavua ya nyuki. Ikiwa ana mzio, tunampa dawa ya antihistamine na kusitisha matibabu,” anaongeza. “Mwili una maeneo 13 ya kutoboa kama sindano (acupuncture points), ambayo yakidungwa na sumu ya nyuki yanaweza kuponya viungo au maeneo maalum ya mwili,” anasema. Tiba ya sumu ya nyuki ina historia ya zamani na ilitumika Misri mwaka 2000 KK, Ugiriki ya kale mwaka 460 KK, na katika tiba ya jadi ya Kichina zaidi ya miaka 2,000 iliyopita kwa ajili ya kuponya maumivu ya viungo na uvimbe. Karne ya 19, watafiti walianza kusoma sumu ya nyuki kwa kina zaidi barani Ulaya, na miaka ya 1930 sindano za sumu ya nyuki zilianza kuwa maarufu. Leo hii, sumu ya nyuki hutumika katika tiba saidizi ya magonjwa ya viungo, maumivu ya kudumu, matatizo ya kinga ya mwili, hali za ngozi na magonjwa ya neva. Kwa mujibu wa Taasisi ya Kitaifa ya Afya (NIH) ya Marekani, taasisi ya serikali inayofadhili na kufanya utafiti wa tiba, karibu asilimia 90 ya Wakenya wamewahi kutumia tiba za jadi wakati fulani, huku zaidi ya asilimia 70 wakitegemea tiba za nyumbani kama chanzo chao cha kwanza cha dawa. Mmoja wa watu hao ni Mercy Wairimu, mwenye umri wa miaka 48. Alifika kituoni wakati sisi tunaingia na akasubiri kwa subira zamu yake ya kudungwa na nyuki. Alisafiri kutoka mtaa wa Githurai 45 katika Kaunti ya Kiambu kuja kupata tiba ya sumu ya nyuki katika kituo cha Bella Apitherapy kutokana na hali yake ya maumivu ya viungo miguuni.

Sekta ya Jua Kali katika Kaunti ya Garissa ita-nufaika pakubwa kwa kusambaza vifaa vya ujenzi kwa miradi ya nyumba nafuu katika kaunti hiyo. Kulingana na Mratibu wa Kanda ya Kaskazini Mashariki wa Nyumba Nafuu na Masoko, John Karanja, Kaunti ya Garissa itapokea Shilingi bilioni 1.03 kwa ajili ya miradi ya nyumba pekee. Miradi hiyo inajumuisha ujenzi wa nyumba 408, ambazo zimekamiliwa kwa asilimia 40, hosteli zenye uwezo wa kulaza wanafunzi 1,720 katika Chuo Kikuu cha Garissa, na soko la kisasa lin-alogharimu Shilingi milioni 288, miongoni mwa mingine. Akizungumza wakati wa kikao na wawakilishi wa sekta ya Jua Kali na wakandarasi wa ujenzi mjini Garissa, Karanja alisema wakandarasi wana jukumu la kushirikisha ngazi zote katika utekelezaji wa miradi hiyo, ikiwa ni pamoja na kupata vifaa kutoka kwa mafundi wa eneo hilo. “Kwenye miradi ya Nyumba

Nafuu, kuna vipengee 75 ambavyo vimetengewa sekta ya Jua Kali. Vipengee hivyo ni pamoja na madirisha, milango ya chuma, milango ya mbao, kazi za mandhari, pamoja na kazi za upakaji rangi,” Karanja alisema. “Tumefika hapa kuhakikisha mafundi wa Jua Kali wanaanza kushiriki kwenye kazi hizi. Huu ni mwafaka wa pande mbili kati ya mkandarasi na Jua Kali, lakini muhimu zaidi ni kwamba serikali imeweka wazi kuwa kipengee kilichotengewa sekta ya Jua Kali lazima kifanywe na mafundi wa Jua Kali,” aliongeza. Mbunge wa Garissa Township, Dekow Mohamed, aliwahi-miza vijana hasa mafundi wa mabomba, umeme, uchomeleaji na upakaji rangi kuchangamkia fursa hizo za ajira ili kuboresha maisha yao. “Nawahimiza mafundi wa Jua Kali wajitayarisha kwani tuna nyumba nyingine 2,000 ambazo zitajengwa na masoko mengine mawili yanayopangwa. Pia kuna miundomsingi mingine mingi itakayoweza fursa zaidi kwao,” Mohamed alisema. “Ndani ya mwaka huu, tutajenga



takribani nyumba 3,000, kwa hivyo unaweza kufikiria manufaa ya kiuchumi ambayo mradi huu utatuletea,” aliongeza. Mwenyekiti wa Muungano wa Jua Kali Garissa, Abubakar Mo-



hamed, alisema hawajawahi kupata fursa za thamani kama hizi, akibainisha kuwa wataongeza ukubwa wa karakana zao na kuboresha ubora wa bidhaa zao kupitia mtaji watakaoupata.

Waziri wa Masuala ya Vijana, Uchumi wa Ubunifu na Michezo, Salim Mvurya, alithibitisha kuwa Kenya iko tayari kuandaa mechi hizo baada ya kikao cha juu na ujumbe wa CAF. Ujumbe huo uliwajumuisha Katibu Mkuu wa Wizara ya Michezo Elijah Mwangi, Rais wa FKF Hussein Mohamed, na Mwenyekiti wa Kamati ya Maandalizi ya Mashindano hayo nchini, Nicholas Musonye. "Tuko tayari kuandaa CHAN 2024. Kila jambo lililotakiwa kutoka kwetu limefanyika, na CAF imethibitisha kuwa tuko kwenye njia nzuri," alisema Mvurya. Usalama umeimarishwa, huku Waziri huyo akisisitiza dhamira ya serikali kuhakikisha tukio hilo linafanyika kwa mafanikio makubwa. Kaunti kumi na moja zatunukiwa kwa kutanguliza afya katika bajeti na ununuzi

Mamlaka ya Ugavi wa Dawa Kenya (KEMSA) inashirikiana na Wafamasias wa Kaunti pamoja na Idara ya Bidhaa na Teknolojia za Afya (DHPT) ili kulinganisha vipaumbele vya ugavi wa dawa na mahitaji halisi ya afya kwa wakati. KEMSA iliandaa warsha ya kitaifa ya kimkakati mjini Naivasha kwa lengo la kuhararisha mageuzi katika mfumo wa afya uliogatuliwa nchini Kenya, kusherehekea kaunti ambazo zimefanya vizuri katika kupanga kwa mkakati ugavi wa dawa kama sehemu kuu ya utoaji huduma za afya, na kuweka msingi wa mnyororo wa usambazaji wa huduma za afya unaotegemea takwimu. Hafla hiyo ilionyesha kaunti ambazo zimeweka afya katikati ya mipango yao kwa kutenga bajeti maalum kwa ajili ya Bidhaa na Teknolojia za Afya (HPT), kulipa madeni yao kwa KEMSA kwa wakati, na kulinganisha ununuzi wao na mahitaji mbalimbali ya kiafya ya watu wao kwa wakati halisi. “Hii si mkutano mwingine tu – huu ni mwanzo mpya,” alisema Dkt. Waqo Ejersa, Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa KEMSA. “Tunabuni upya mifumo yetu, sera na ushirikiano ili kila shilingi ihesabiwe, kila bidhaa iwe na maana, na hakuna Mkenya abakie bila dawa anayohitaji. Enzi ya ununuzi wa kubahatisha imekwisha.” Kama sehemu ya kaulimbiu ya warsha hiyo, “Kutoa Huduma kwa Umoja,” KEMSA ilitunuku kaunti kumi na moja kwa utendaji bora katika usi-

Vivyo hivyo, Wafamasias wa Kaunti kumi na sita walitambuliwa binafsi kwa uongozi bora katika usi-

mamizi wa bidhaa za afya. Miongoni mwa waliotunukiwa ni Dkt. Alex Oindi (Machakos), Dkt. Beatrice Muia (Kitui), Dkt. Brian Muyokani (Turkana), Dkt. Jerusa Oluhano (Vihiga), Dkt. Kepher Mogere (Kisii), Dkt. Nancy Olunga (Siaya), na Dkt. Matthew Yegon (Bomet) kwa kujitolea kwao kuhakikisha ununuzi kwa wakati, usimamizi wa madeni, ushirikiano na wadau, na mikakati bunifu ya kuboresha matokeo ya usambazaji wa huduma za afya. ERP utabadilisha mrejesho kutoka vituo vya afya kuwa maa-rifa yanayoweza kutekelezwa. Hivi ndivyo tunavyokomesha upungufu wa dawa, kupunguza upotevu, na kurejesha imani katika mfumo wa afya wa umma.” Jukwaa hilo pia liliashiria hatua muhimu katika ajenda ya mabadiliko ya KEMSA, kufuatia wito wa Waziri wa Afya Aden Duale wa kuwa na mnyororo wa ugavi wa kisasa unaotegemea teknolojia. Dkt. Ejersa alibainisha kuwa kiini cha mabadiliko hayo ni uzinduzi wa mfumo mpya wa Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) unaokusanya data ya mahitaji kutoka kwa vituo vya afya kote nchini kwa wakati halisi na kuongoza ununuzi sahihi wa bidhaa. “Hii ni zaidi ya kuhamisha maboksi, mifumo na hisa. Hii ni kuhusu kuokoa na kubadili maisha,” alisisitiza Dkt. Ejersa. “Wakati Wafamasias wa Kaunti wanapotuambia wanachohitaji na tukachukua hatua haraka na kwa usahihi, tunawaokoa watu.” Dkt. Ejersa pia alizitaka kaunti zilizo na madeni kwa KEMSA kulipa salio lao ili kuhakikisha ugavi usioingiliwa wa bidhaa muhimu za matibabu. Alihimiza kaunti zote kutumia Mamlaka ya Afya ya Jamii (SHA) ili kupanua upatikanaji wa huduma bora za afya kwa wote. Akizingatia mtindo wa kibiasara wa KEMSA usio wa faida ambapo mapato yote yanawekezwa tena katika mfuko wa kitaifa wa mzunguko, Mkurugenzi Mkuu huyo alieleza kuwa changamoto za kifedha zimeilazimu Mamlaka kufikiria upya mtindo wake wa biashara kwa nia ya kuwa mnyumbufu, wa kisasa, na endelevu zaidi. “Tunabadilisha gia,” alisema. “Lengo letu ni kufikia kiwango cha zaidi ya asilimia 90 cha kujaza oda kwa haraka iwezekanavyo.”

Safari ya Miriam Chepchumba kutoka kijijini hadi kuwa mekanika tajika

NA GILBERT MUTAI NA JOYCE JEPKOSGEI, KNA

Akiwa na umri wa miaka 21 pekee, Miriam Chepchumba – mama wa mtoto mmoja na fundi magari aliyehitimu – anavunja mila na desturi zilizokita mizizi katika sekta ya magari inayotawaliwa na wanaume nchini Kenya. Mikono yake iliyokunjamana kwa kazi inaeleza hadithi ya ustahimilivu ambayo inaendelea kuwatia moyo wasichana wengi. Safari ya Chepchumba ilianza kwenye vilima vya Kericho, ambapo alipokuwa mtoto, alikuwa akitazama matrika yakipita kwenye barabara za mashamba zilizoteremka kwa mwinuko. “Wakati wengine walikuwa wakiziba masikio yao kutokana na kelele, mimi ningekaribia zaidi, nikivutiwa na

jinsi mashine hizi zilivyozeza kushinda vilima ambavyo watu walishindwa kuvipanda,” alikumbuka. Udadisi wake wa utotoni uligeuka kuwa ari ya kweli alipongalia kipindi cha runinga kuhusu fundi mwanamke huko Nairobi. “Makala ile ilipanda mbegu. Kwa mara ya kwanza, niliona ushahidi wa wazi kuwa injini siyo jambo la wanaume pekee,” Chepchumba alisema. Akiwa na miaka 17, akiwa hana chochote ila ari, alitembelea gereji za eneo lao akitafta mafunzo kwa njia ya uanagenzi – lakini majibu aliyopata yalivunja moyo. “Walinambia niende nikajifunze ususi badala yake,” alisimulia. Mmiliki mmoja wa gereji hatimaye alikubali, lakini badala ya kumpa vifaa vya kazi, alimkabidhi ufagio na kusema, “Fa-

gia kwanza, halafu tutaona.” Kwa miezi sita, Miriam alifagia sakafu, kupanga vifaa, na kutazama mafundi wakifanya kazi wakati wa mapumziko yake. Usiku, alisoma miongozo ya kutengeneza magari iliyotupwa kwa mwanga wa taa ya mafuta ya taa. Bidii yake ilizaa matunda wakati pikipiki ya jirani yao ilipohar-

ibika. Baada ya mafundi kadhaa kushindwa kuirekebisha, Miriam aliomba nafasi ya kuijaribu. “Wote walicheka hadi nilipoonyesha tatizo lilikuwa kwenye carburetor,” alisema. Ndani ya saa chache, injini ilikuwa inafanya kazi vizuri. Habari zilienea haraka katika jamii yao ya karibu, na muda si muda wakazi walikuwa wakim-

letea vifaa vyao vilivyoharibika na baiskeli kwa “msichana anayerekebisha vitu.” Hata hivyo, licha ya sifa zake kukua, Chepchumba alikumbana na changamoto nyingi ambazo wenzake wa kiume hawakuzipitia. Wasambazaji walimtoza bei za juu wakidhani hajui bei sahihi. Wateja pia walifika gereji yake wakitaka kuzungumza na ‘fundi halisi’ na wengine walikataa kabisa kumruhusu afanye kazi kwenye magari yao hadi alipoonyesha ujuzi wake. “Kulikuwa na siku nilitaka kuacha, lakini nilijua kukata tamaa kungethibitisha tu dhana zao potovu,” alikiri. Mabadiliko makubwa yalikuja wakati dereva wa lori alipompuzilia uwezo wake. “Alisema angesubiri ‘fundi wa kweli,’” alieleza. Miriam kwa utulivu alimuuliza shida ya lori lake, akatambua kuwa ni sindano ya mafuta (fuel injector) iliyokuwa na hitilafu, na akairekebisha ndani ya saa moja. Dereva huyo aliyeshangazwa si tu alimlipa mara mbili ya bei ya kawaida, bali pia aligeuka kuwa mteja wake wa kudumu.

EPRA yazindua rasimu ya kanuni kukuza sekta ya nishati ya mimea

NA JOANNE MORAA NA KENEDY OGADA (KNA)

Mamlaka ya Kudhibiti Nishati na Petroli (EPRA) imezindua rasimu ya kanuni mpya zinazolenga kuimarisha sekta ya nishati ya mimea (biofuels) inayokua kwa kasi nchini Kenya. Hatua hii ni sehemu ya juhudi za kufanikisha lengo la taifa la kufikia matumizi ya nishati safi kwa asilimia 100 ifikapo mwaka 2030. Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa EPRA, Daniel Kiptoo, kupitia hotuba iliyosomwa kwa niaba yake na Naibu Mkurugenzi wa Nishati Mbadala, Mhandisi Mungai Kihara, katika mkutano wa ushirikishwaji wa umma uliofanyika Kisumu, alisema kuwa Kanuni za Nishati (Biofuels) za mwaka 2025 zitatoa mwongozo wa kisheria kuhusu uzalishaji, uchanganyaji, usambazaji, na uuzaji wa nishati hiyo kote nchini Kenya. “Kanuni hizi zinalenga kukuza biashara yenye usawa, kuhakikisha ubora na usalama katika mnyororo mzima wa thamani wa nishati ya mimea, kusaidia katika uhifadhi wa mazingira, na kuwezesha ukusanyaji wa takwimu sahihi kwa ajili ya utungaji sera unaotegemea ushahidi,” alisema Kiptoo. Alibainisha kuwa rasimu hiyo ya kanuni imekuja wakati ambapo Kenya inazidisha juhudi za kupunguza utoaji wa gesi chafu na kupunguza utegemezi

wa mafuta ya kisukuku. Alitaja mafanikio kama mradi wa ENI katika Kaunti ya Makueni, ambapo kampuni ya mafuta kutoka Italia inatoa mafuta ya mimea kutoka kwa mbegu za mnyonyo kwa ajili ya kusafirishwa hadi kiwanda chao cha kusafishia mafuta nchini Italia. Aliongeza kuwa miradi ya

bioethanol inayohusishwa na sekta ya miwa nchini Kenya pia inapata kasi – hasa kwa matumizi ya kupikia kwa njia safi. Mkurugenzi Mkuu alisema kuwa kanuni zinazopendekezwa zitahusu mnyororo mzima wa usambazaji wa biofuels kuanzia uzalishaji na uagizaji hadi kwenye hifadhi, upaki-

aji, uchanganyaji, na uuzaji. Miongoni mwa masharti muhimu, Kiptoo alieleza kuwa ni pamoja na hitaji la kuchanganya bioethanol na petroli ili kuzalisha “gasohol”, na kuongeza kuwa biodiesel inayotokana na mafuta ya mimea na mafuta ya wanyama ni lazima ifuate viwango vilivy-

owekwa kabla ya kuchanganywa na dizeli ya magari. “Shughuli zote za uchanganyaji lazima zifanyike katika vituo vilivyopewa leseni na EPRA chini ya viwango madhubuti vya ubora, usalama na ulinzi wa mazingira. EPRA itafanya ukaguzi wa mara kwa mara ili kuhakikisha uzingatiaji kamili,” alisema. Kwa upande wake, Mhandisi Kihara alisisitiza umuhimu wa kanuni hizi katika kuleta mageuzi ya sekta ya nishati nchini Kenya. Alisema kuwa kanuni hizo ni muhimu katika kupanua mchanganyiko wa nishati nchini, kupunguza utoaji wa gesi chafu, na kuongeza upatikanaji wa huduma za kisasa za nishati. “Kanuni hizi si nyaraka tu za kiseri; ni mifumo muhimu ya kuwezesha mageuzi na uendeleu katika sekta ya nishati. Tunalenga kufikia asilimia 100 ya nishati safi ifikapo mwaka 2030,” alisema. Mhandisi Kihara alisema kuwa kanuni hizo zitahusu matumizi ya nyumbani na viwandani, yakiwemo ya usafiri. Aliongeza kuwa EPRA kwa kushirikiana na Wizara ya Nishati, wanafanya kazi na wakulima hasa katika maeeneo ya miwa ya Magharibi mwa Kenya ili kukuza uzalishaji wa ndani wa bioethanol. Naibu Mkurugenzi alisema kuwa mpango huo unatarajiwa kuongeza kipato kwa wakulima na kupunguza utegemezi wa mafuta ya jadi kama kuni na mkaa. “Tunahitaji kila familia iwe na njia safi ya kupikia, na ndiyo maana bioethanol ni muhimu sana,” alisema.

Serikali za kaunti zime-takiwa kutekeleza mikakati ya kuongeza thamani kwa mazao ya kilimo yanayolengwa kwa mauzo ya nje ili kuvutia bei ya juu kwa mazao ya Kenya katika masoko ya ndani na ya kimataifa. Katibu wa Wizara ya Uendelezaji wa Viwanda, Dkt. Juma Mukhwana, alisisitiza haja ya serikali za kaunti kuendeleza uwekezaji wa viwanda katika maeneo ya ukusanyaji wa mazao, uzalishaji viwandani, chapa, upakiaji, uwekaji wa lebo, na usafirishaji. Alisema juhudi hizo zitasaidia nchi kupunguza utegemezi wa bidhaa za nje. Hatua hiyo pia itachangia maendeleo ya kiuchumi na kusaidia kuanzishwa kwa bidhaa mpya zenye thamani iliyoongezwa zitakazoongeza mapato ya fedha za kigeni. Dkt. Mukhwana alielezea masikitiko yake kwamba

Kenya kwa muda mrefu imekuwa ikisafirisha bidhaa ghafi bila kuongeza thamani licha ya uwezo mkubwa wa nchi kushika sehemu kubwa ya masoko ya ndani na kimataifa. Alisisitiza umuhimu wa kuendeleza biashara ya bidhaa zilizoboreshwa. Akitambua kuwa bidhaa nyingi za kimataifa huongezewa mazao ya Kenya, Dkt. Mukhwana alisema serikali inashirikiana na serikali za kaunti pamoja na wadau wa serikali na wale wa mashirika yasiyo ya serikali kuandaa mfumo wa kuanzisha na kuendesha Mbuga za Kaunti za Ukusanyaji na Uendelezaji Viwanda (CAIPs). Alisema mbuga hizo zimeundwa kuendeleza ukuaji kupitia utofauti wa mauzo ya nje ya Kenya, kuongeza thamani, kuunda bidhaa mpya, na kufungua masoko mapya. Dkt. Mukhwana alisema kaunti zinapaswa kuanza maandalizi ya uanzishaji wa mbuga za viwanda kupitia miradi kama ujenzi wa vituo vya ukusanyaji

wa mazao ya kilimo vilivyo na miundombinu inayohitajika kwa ajili ya kuhifadhi baada ya mavuno kabla ya kupel-ekwa kusindikwa, pamoja na kuwaunganisha wakulima katika vikundi au ushirika kwa ajili ya masoko ya pamoja. Alizitaka kaunti kushirikiana na serikali kuu kuunda na kudumisha mazingira yatakayoweza ukuaji wa viwanda vinavyolenga kuuza nje bidhaa,

kwa kutumia faida za uchumi wa viwanda mkubwa, miundombinu ya pamoja, na upatikanaji wa masoko ya kimataifa. Ili kuanzisha CAIPs nchini Kenya, Katibu Mkuu alibainisha kuwa inahitajika mbinu jumuiishi inayolenga utambuzi wa bidhaa, uchambuzi wa soko, maendeleo ya miundombinu, na ujenzi wa uwezo. Alisema kaunti zinapaswa kwanza kubaini bidhaa zenye

ushindani mkubwa na mahitaji makubwa ya soko katika maeeneo yao, na kuhakikisha kuwepo kwa mnyororo ya ugavi ya kutosha, akiongeza kuwa miundombinu kama barabara, umeme, maji, mtandao wa intaneti na usafiri ni muhimu kwa ufanisi wa mbuga hizo. “Kaunti lazima ziware mafunzo wafanyakazi na zite msaada kwa Biashara Ndogo, za Kati na za Kati (MSMEs) kwa kuwa ni kiungo muhimu kwa mafanikio ya mbuga hizi,” aliongeza Katibu huyo. Dkt. Mukhwana alitoa matamshi hayo wakati wa kikao cha Kamati ya Kitaifa ya Utekezaji wa Kiufundi (NTIC) kuhusu CAIPs kilichofanyika katika Taasisi ya Mafunzo ya Viwanda Kenya (KITI) mjini Nakuru. Tukio hilo liliwaleta pamoja Maafisa Wakuu wa Kaunti kutoka Nakuru, Busia, Kakamega, Bungoma, Kwale na Kisii katika kujadili mfumo wa sera wa CAIPs. Linyiru aliongeza kuwa hatua hii inalenga kuwaunga mkono wakulima na wachakataji wa ndani kwa kuendeleza uchakataji wa ndani na ukuzaji wa viwanda vya hapa nchini. “Mwananchi yeyote au mdaunayetaka ufafanuzi wowote anaweza kuwasiliana na Mamlaka kupitia barua pepe info@afa.go.ke,” alisema.
