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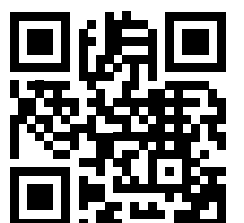


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KenGen kujenga kiwanda cha nyuklia

Kenya imepiga hatua muhimu katika kuongeza utofauti wa vyanzo vyake vya nishati baada ya kuiteua rasmi Kampuni ya Kuzalisha Umeme Kenya (KMhaen) kuwa mmiliki na mwendeshaaji wa kiwanda cha kwanza cha nishati ya nyuklia nchini. Kiwanda hicho cha uwezo wa megawati 2,000 kitaashiria mwanzo wa zama mpya za nishati ya nyuklia kwenye gridi ya umeme ya Kenya. Hatua hiyo ilikamilishwa jijini Nairobi kupitia Mkataba wa Makubaliano (MoU) uliosainiwa kati ya KMhaen na Mamlaka ya Nishati ya Nyuklia (NuPEA), chini ya uongozi wa Waziri wa Nishati na Petroli, Opiyo Wandayi. Akizungumza wakati wa hafla hiyo, Wandayi alisisitiza kuwa mradi huo unaendana na agizo la Rais William Ruto la kuongeza gigawati 10 (GW) kwenye gridi ya taifa katika kipindi cha miaka saba ijayo—IMhao la kishujaa linalolMhaa kuipeleka Kenya kwenye hadhi ya uchumi wa dunia ya kwanza. “Hii ni mwanzo wa enzi ya nishati ya nyuklia nchini Kenya. Kuipa KMhaen jukumu la umiliki na uendeshaaji kunahakikisha kuwa mpango huu unaegemea uwezo madhubuti wa kiufundi, uaminifu wa umma na maslahi ya taifa ya



muda mrefu,” alisema Wandayi. Aliongeza kuwa kiwanda cha kwanza cha nyuklia kitazalisha takribani megawati 2,000 (2GW), huku kukiwa na mipango ya kupanua hadi 6GW—mchango muhimu katika kufanikisha IMhao la Rais la 10GW. Wandayi pia alisema kuwa NuPEA tayari imetambua maeneo yanayoweza kufaa katika

kaunti za Kilifi, Kwale na Siaya. “Kenya ni kiongozi katika nishati jadidifu—si tu barani Afrika, bali duniani katika maendeleo ya nishati ya mvuke—na sasa tunachukua nafasi ya uongozi katika nishati ya nyuklia katika eneo hili. Huu ni ushindi mkubwa, na ni lazima tujivunie kama taifa,” alisema. Wakati huohuo, MoU hiyo in

aweka Mfumo wa Ushirikiano wa Pamoja utakaotoa mwongozo kuhusu utayari wa kitaifa kwa nishati ya nyuklia. Mkataba huo pia utaongoza moja ya mikakati pana zaidi ya uelimishaji na ushirikishwaji wa umma nchini, ukilMhaa mawasiliano ya wazi, usahihi wa kisayansi na ushirikiano wa wadau katika kaunti zote.

Kupitia mfumo huo, KMhaen na NuPEA wataunda Kikundi Kazi cha Pamoja kitakachotekeleza:

- kuandaa mkakati wa kitaifa wa mawasiliano na ushirikishwaji wa umma;
- kubaini wadau muhimu katika kaunti zote;
- kuendesha kampeni za kitaifa za uelimishaji wa umma na vyombo vya habari;
- kuitisha mijadala ya kiufundi na majadiliano ya wataalamu;
- kutoa mafunzo kwa wana-habari, maafisa wa kaunti, walimu na viongozi wa jamii kuhusu misingi ya nishati ya nyuklia; na
- kuanzisha mfumo wa maoni na usimamizi wa malalamiko unaoendana na viwango vya kimataifa. Mfumo huo pia utaunga mkono hatua za awali za uteuzi wa mae-neo na masuala yanayohusiana na ardhi, huku KMhaen ikichangia utaalamu wake wa miongo kadhaa katika utekelezaji wa miradi mikubwa ya miundombinu. Wandayi alitoa hakikisho kuwa taratibu zote za uteuzi wa mae-neo zitazingatia viwango madhubuti vya ushirikishwaji wa umma na uwazi wa kudumu. Mwenyekiti wa Bodi ya KMhaen, Alfred Agoi, alikaribisha hatua hiyo na kusisitiza kuwa kampuni hiyo iko tayari kuiongoza Kenya katika enzi

The Communications Authority of Kenya (CA), established under the Kenya Information and Communications Act, 1998, is the regulatory agency for the ICT industry in Kenya with responsibilities in telecommunications, cyber security, e-commerce, broadcasting and postal/courier services. The CA is also responsible for managing the country's numbering and frequency spectrum resources, administering the Universal Service Fund (USF) as well as safeguarding the interests of users of ICT services.

Pursuant to Section 24 (1) of the Kenya Information and Communications Act, 1998, the Authority is empowered to license entities operating within the ICT sector. The Authority currently implements a technology and service-neutral telecommunications market structure under the Unified Licensing Framework (ULF), which was last amended in 2014.

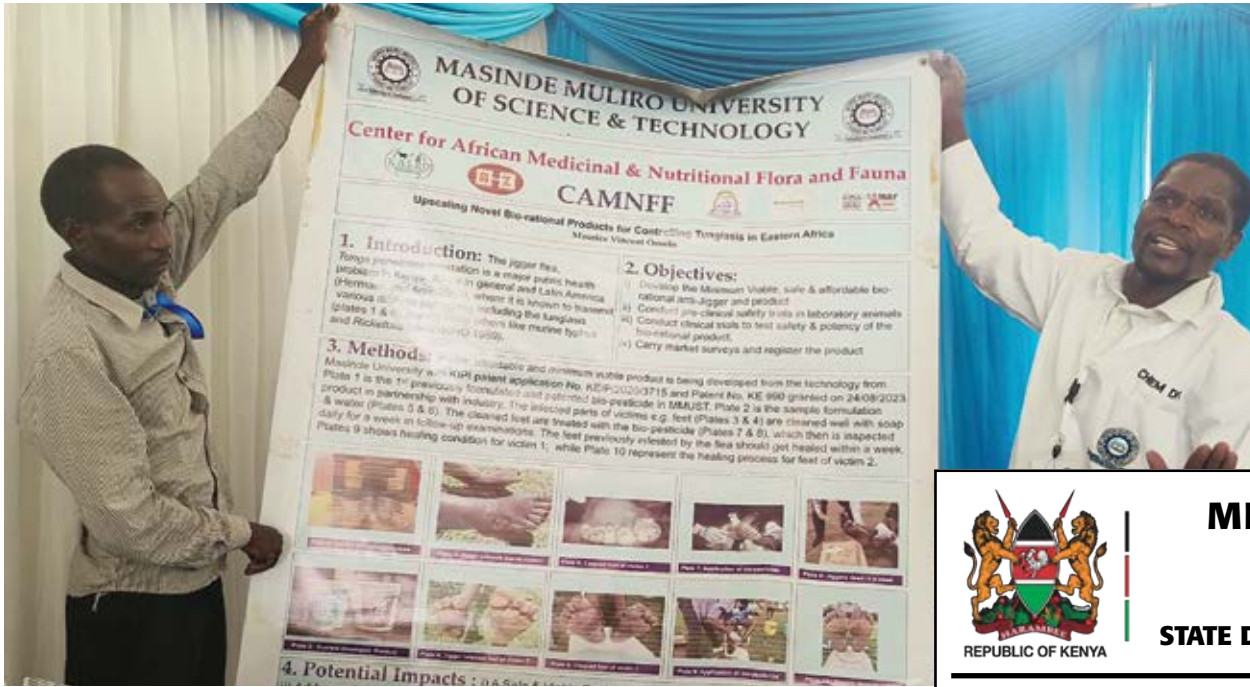

Profesa Maurice Vincent Omolo wa Chuo Kikuu cha Masinde Muliro cha Sayansi na Teknolojia (MMUST) ameunda bidhaa ya kibiolojia yenye mantiki (bio-rational) iitwayo Jigger Gel, inayotoa njia mbadala isiyo na maumivu ya kutibu maambukizi ya funza jigger. Alibainisha kuwa Jigger Gel ni matokeo ya utafiti wa miaka kadhaa chini ya mradi wa Upscaling Novel Bio-rational Products for Controlling Tunga in Eastern Africa, unaofadhiliwa na Bio-Innovate Africa. Mradi huo unaendeshwa katika Kituo cha Mimea na Wanyama wa Dawa na Lishe za Kiafrika

(CAMNFF), kilichoko katika Kituo cha Sayansi, Ubunifu na Ukuaji wa Biashara cha Chuo Kikuu cha Masinde Muliro. Utafiti huo ulifadhiliwa na Mfuko wa Kitaifa wa Utafiti (NRF) kwa kiasi cha Shilingi milioni 18. Kwa sasa, Jigger Gel inafanyiwa majaribio ya matumizi shambani katika baadhi ya maeneo ya magharibi mwa Kenya kabla ya kuanza kutumika rasmi na umma. Katika mradi huo, Prof. Omolo alishirikiana pia na Kituo cha Kimataifa cha Fiziolojia na Ikojia ya Wadudu (ICIPE) pamoja na Shirika la Utafiti wa Kilimo na Mifugo Kenya (KALRO). “Jigger bado ni tatizo kubwa siyo tu Magharibi mwa Kenya, bali pia katika kaunti za Siaya na Kwale, na hata katika nchi kadhaa za Afrika na Amerika ya Kusini,” alisema Prof. Omolo. Aliongeza kuwa ingawa potasiamu permaneneti na peroksidi ya hidrojeni zimetumika kwa muda mrefu kusafisha majaraha ya jigger, kemikali hizo ni vioksidishaji kali vina vyosababisha maumivu makali na vinaweza kuchelewesha uponaji. Omolo, ambaye ni Profesa wa Kemia Hai (Organic Chemistry), alisema utafiti wake uliMhaa kuchunguza mimea ya Magharibi mwa Kenya ili kubaini misombo ya asili inayoweza kudhibiti Tunga penatrans.

Tutaanzisha mtambo mdogo wa kuchakata Jigger Gel katika hali yake chafu, ili kunufaisha jamii.

Alisema Jigger Gel imesajiliwa na kupata hataza chini ya Shirika la Dunia la Hakimiliki (WIPO) na pia imepatiwa hataza na Taasisi ya Mali Bunifu ya Kenya (KIPI). Kwa msaada wa BioInnovate Africa na NRF, Jigger Gel imeboreshwa na kutMhaenezwa katika miundo mitatu: mchanganyiko kamili, nusu mchanganyiko na mchanganyiko mdogo. “Jigger Gel imejaribiwa kwa sungura na nguruwe wa majaribio ili kuthibitisha usalama wake kwa wanyama. Ta k r i b a n i wakulima 100 kutoka Kaunti ya Nyeri wamehitimu kutoka mpango wa kwanza kabisa ulio-lenga kukuza uzalishaji wa kuku wa broiler usiotegemea dawa, kwa lengo la kudhibiti usugu wa vimelea dhidi ya dawa (Antimicrobial Resistance - AMR). Mafunzo hayo ya miezi 11 yaliongozwa na Idara ya Huduma za Mifugo ya Kaunti kwa ushirikiano na Shirika la Chakula na Kilimo la Umoja wa Mataifa (FAO). Mafunzo hayo yalitekelezwa kupitia mfumo wa Shule ya Shamba la Wakulima (Farmers Field School), ambapo wakulima walitambulishwa kwa mfumo mbadala wa ufugaji wa kuku wa broiler usiotegemea matumizi ya kawaida ya antibiotiki. Kwa mujibu wa Mkurugenzi wa Huduma za Mifugo wa Kaunti, Dkt. Anthony Muguro, lengo kuu la mpango huo ni kubadilisha mfumo wa uzalishaji wa mifugo kwa kuwahimiza wakulima kutumia mbinu mbadala na salama za uzalishaji wa chakula. “Lengo la Shule hii ya Shamba la Wakulima lilikuwa kuwafundisha wakulima jinsi ya kufuga kuku wa broiler kwa kutumia mfumo mbadala. Badala ya kutegemea dawa, wakulima wanafundishwa kutekeleza hatua za usalama wa kibayolojia (biosecurity) zinazozuia kuenea au kuingizwa kwa magonjwa kwa kuku. Hatimaye, hii husababisha kuku wasiokuwa na mabaki ya dawa, hivyo kutusaidia kuepukisha tatizo la AMR,” alisema Dkt. Muguro. Alibainisha kuwa uf-

ugaji wa kawaida wa kuku wa broiler hutegemea pakubwa matumizi makubwa ya viaa vijasumu kwa udhibiti wa magonjwa, na kwamba dawa nyingi hutumia molekuli zilezile zinazotumika katikatibayabinadamu. Dkt. Muguro alionya kuwa iwapo dawa hizo zitatumia vibaya au kupita kiasi katika mifumo ya uzalishaji wa chakula, mabaki yake yanaweza kuingia mwilini mwa binadamu kupitia bidhaa za wanyama kama vile nyama, mayai na maziwa, jambo linalochochea AMR, ambayo alielezea kama janga la kimya kimya. “Kwa sasa, ufugaji wa kuku wa broiler unatumia sana dawa, hali inayochangia tatizo la usugu wa vimelea dhidi ya dawa katika jamii. Tunaita AMR janga la kimya kimya kwa sababu linaweza kufanya matibabu ya magonjwa kwa binadamu na wanyama kuwa ghali sana. Dawa tunazotumia kwa sasa huenda zisiwe na ufanisi tena, na kutengeneza dawa mpya huchukua muda mrefu na gharama kubwa,” alieleza. Dkt. Muguro alisema kuwa mpango huo, unaolenga kutokomeza ufugaji unaotegemea dawa, utapanuliwa hadi kwa minyororo mingine ya thamani ya chakula ikiwemo ufugaji wa ng’ombe wa maziwa na nguruwe ndani ya kaunti hiyo. Aliongeza kuwa sehemu ya lengo kuu ni kuwafanya wakulima waliopata

mafunzo kuwa mabalozi na wakufunzi wa wakulima wengine kuhusu umuhimu wa kuzingatia hatua za usalama wa kibayolojia katika mfumo wa uzalishaji wa chakula. “Wanatarajiwa kuwapatia wengine maarifa hayo ili tuweze kusambaza huduma za ugani, na hatimaye kuwa na watu wengi zaidi wanaotumia mbinu hizi, na kupata nyama bora na salama kwa matumizi ya binadamu,” alisema. Bi Julia Ndirangu, mmoja wa wanufaika wa mafunzo hayo, alielezea uzoefu huo kama wa kubadilisha maisha na uliobadilisha kabisa namna alivyokuwa akifuga kuku awali. Alisema kabla ya kujiunga na Shule ya Shamba la Wakulima wa Broiler, alikuwa akifuga kuku bila ujuzi wa ufugaji bora, hali iliyomgharimu pakubwa kutokana na milipuko ya mara kwa mara ya magonjwa. Hata hivyo, hali imebadilika baada ya kukamilisha mafunzo hayo, ambapo amejifunza mbinu bora za ufugaji wa wanyama, hususan kudemisha usafi wa kuku, jambo linalohakikisha usalama wa kiafya wa nyama yao. “Nilikuwa nafuga kuku bila kuzingatia ipasavyo kanuni za ufugaji kama vile usafi. Matokeo yake yalikuwa kuenea kwa magonjwa na vifo vya kuku wengi. L,” anasimulia.

Nimeweka tafakari zangu wakati wa warsha ya uthibitisho wa wadau wa Mpango Mkakati wa Ufadhili na Ujenzi wa Uwezo wa Utafiti Kenya (2026–2036) iliyofanyika jijini Nairobi tarehe 2 Desemba 2025. Watafiti wetu na taasisi zao wanaendelea kuonyesha

The proponent, Kenya Railways Corporation, proposes to regenerate and redevelop the Nairobi Central Station (NCS) site into a new iconic city Centre development that will improve accessibility and capacity of the railway for all passengers. The central station will entail the following facilities: 2 level buildings, Station entrance and exits, platforms and canopies, access foot bridges, associated facilities and amenities in Nairobi County.

The following are the anticipated impacts and proposed mitigation measures:

Rasilimali Asili ya Seneti, pamoja na wawakilishi wa jamii za wachimbaji madini kilichoandaliwa na Tume ya Haki za Binadamu Kenya (Kenya Human Rights Commission). Jamii za wachimbaji madini zilipewa uhakikisho kuwa Idara ya Serikali inaharakisha kukamilisha Kanuni za Utoaji Mapato ya Madini kwa kushirikiana na Ofisi ya Wakili Mkuu ili waweze kupokea sehemu yao inayostahiliwa. Katibu wa Idara ya Utangazaji na Mawasiliano, Stephen Isaboke, ameheshimiwa kwa kupokea tuzo mbili za kitaifa zinazoheshimiwa sana, zikithamini uongozi wake bora na uwajibikaji katika kuendeleza ajenda ya mageuzi ya huduma za umma nchini Kenya. Isaboke alipokea sifa hizo kwa Mafanikio ya Upitisho wa Ukaguzi Bila Marekebisha (Achievement of an Unmodified Audit Opinion) na Uongozi wa Mageuzi (Transformational Leadership) wakati wa Hafla ya Mwisho wa Mwaka wa Huduma za Umma na Warsha ya Kuandaa Ajenda ya 2025 iliyofanyika katika Tom Mboya Labour College, Kisumu. Tuzo hizo ziliangazia nafasi yake katika kuongoza utendakazi wa fedha, marekebisha ya taasisi, na ubora wa huduma ndani ya wizara yake. Upitisho wa ukaguzi bila marekebisha unaashiria

usimamizi makini wa rasilimali za umma, ukithibitisha kuwa fedha zinadhhibitiwa ipasavyo na mifumo inakidhi viwango vya juu vya uwajibikaji. Tuzo ya Uongozi wa Mageuzi inatambua jitihada zake za kuboresha uendeshaji, kuongeza ufanisi, na kuanzisha utamaduni unaoenga matokeo serikalini. Baada ya sherehe, Isaboke alieleza kutambuliwa kwake kama “uthibitisho wa unyenyekevu wa jitihada za pamoja za timu zilizojitolea kuhakikisha wananchi wanahisi manufaa ya programu za serikali.” Aliongeza kuwa tuzo hizo zinamzidishia azma ya kudumisha uwajibikaji na utoaji wa huduma zenye nidhamu katika mwaka 2026. Sherehe hiyo, iliyoongozwa na Mkuu wa Utumishi wa Umma, Felix Koskei, iliwakutanisha Mawaziri wa Wizara, Wakuu wa Idara, wabunge, na viongozi wa tume za kikatiba kujadili mafanikio ya mwaka 2025 na kuweka vipaumbele kwa mwaka ujao.

Shirika la Chakula na Kilimo la Umoja wa Mataifa (FAO) na Umoja wa Ulaya (EU) wameungana na wadau wa eneo hilo kuchukua hatua ya ramani ya ardhi katika Kaunti ya Turkana ili kurahisisha utaratibu wa nyaraka za ardhi kwa jamii. Mashirika haya ya kimataifa, kwa kushirikiana na Idara ya Ardhi, Mipango ya Mwili na Usimamizi wa Miji, yameanza zoezi la ramani ya ardhi ili kurekodi ardhi za umma na kuharakisha utoaji wa hati miliki. Kulingana na maafisa kutoka Tume ya Taifa ya Ardhi (NLC) na Idara ya Serikali ya Ardhi na Mipango ya Mwili, zoezi hilo litashughulikia maeneo ya Kaunti ya Loima, Lokiriana na Lokichoggio, ambapo umiliki wa ardhi kwa kiasi kikubwa uko chini ya mfumo wa ardhi za dhamana (trust land). Hata hivyo, Mwanachama wa Kamati Kuu ya Utendaji ya Turkana (CECM) kwa masuala ya Ardhi, Faith Aletea, alisema kuwa

ramani na upangaji wa hati miliki utalenga hasa miji ya Lorugum, Namoruputh na Lokiriana. Alisisitiza kuwa zoezi hili ni hatua muhimu ya kulinda ardhi za umma dhidi ya uvamizi na uwezekano wa kuibiwa na wawekezaji binafsi ambao wanaweza kunufaika kutokana na mfumo dhafu na usioeleweka wa umiliki wa ardhi unaoendeshwa kwa mfumo wa trust land. “Kupitia zoezi hili, haturekodi tu sehemu hizi za ardhi, bali tunahakikisha zinabaki kulindwa kwa mujibu wa mfumo wa usimamizi wa ardhi wa Kaunti,” alisema. Kulingana na Afisa Mkuu wa Ardhi, Leah Losiru, zoezi hilo litawawezesha kaunti kutoa huduma bora zaidi pale linapohusu kugawa ardhi kwa ajili ya huduma za umma kama shule, vituo vya afya na makao ya utawala. Mark Ewesit wa Tume ya Taifa ya Ardhi (NLC) Turkana aliongeza kuwa zoezi hilo litasaidia kupunguza migogoro inayotokana na mgongano wa umiliki wa ardhi.
