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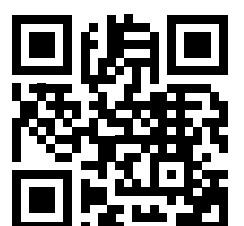


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Serikali karibu kujenga nyumba 200,000 kwa mwaka-waziri

NA WANGARI MWANGI NA DIANA ODIPO (KNA)

Wizara ya Ardhi, Makazi na Maendeleo ya Miji imo karibu kufikia lengo lake la kujenga nyumba 200,000 kwa mwaka, Waziri wa Kabineti wa Ardhi, Makazi na Maendeleo ya Miji, Alice Wahome, amethibitisha. Bi. Wahome alisema kuwa takriban nyumba 200,000 zinaweza kujengwa kote nchini, na kuongeza kuwa serikali inaeendelea kufuata mkondo sahihi wa kuwapatia Wakenya makazi nafuu.

Aliongeza kuwa kaunti zote 47 sasa zina Mpango wa Makazi Nafuu ambao ama unaendelea au uko karibu kukamilika. “Kwa mpango huu, nchi iko kwenye mkondo sahihi. Rais yuko kwenye mkondo sahihi, Idara ya Makazi na Maendeleo ya Miji iko kwenye mkondo sahihi, na tunawahakikishia Wakenya kwamba kila shilingi tunayokusanya kupitia ada hii inatumika ipasavyo. Kufikia mwaka

ujao, wale wote waliokuwa na mashaka watapata majibu yao — nyumba za makazi nafuu zitajieleza zenyewe,” alisema. Waziri huyo alisisitiza kuwa mpango huu ni sehemu ya mkakati mpana wa serikali wa kukabiliana na upungufu wa makazi huku ukichochea ukuaji wa uchumi na kuunda nafasi za ajira. Alifichua kuwa mpango huo tayari umeunda zaidi ya ajira za moja kwa moja 320,000 kwa vijana wanaofanya kazi katika nyadhifa mbalimbali, na wizara inapanga kuhusisha vijana zaidi, wakiwemo wahitimu wapya, katika ujenzi wa nyumba. Fursa zaidi pia zitatokana na ujenzi wa masoko ya Economic Stimulus Project katika kila eneo bunge. “Tunawahamasisha wahitimu wote wa fani za kiufundi ili kuhusishwa katika miradi hii. Tunawaajiri wasanifu majengo, wahandisi, wataalamu wa mandhari, na mafundi stadi, na tutatoa mafunzo ya miezi 12. Tuna bajeti tayari, hivyo wahitimu wote bila shaka watahusishwa,” alisema. Bi. Wahome aliongeza, “Masoko

haya yamelenga kufungua nafasi zaidi za ajira kwa kuunda mfumo tofauti wa kiuchumi unaounga mkono wafanyabiashara wadogo na vijana. Haya yote yatakuwa na athari kubwa kwa uchumi wetu.” Waziri huyo alizungumza katika Chuo cha Ualimu Kagumo, ambako alihudhuria mahafali ya 41 ya chuo hicho. Pia aliongoza uzinduzi wa ujenzi wa hosteli 680 zitakazojengwa chini ya Mpango wa Makazi Nafuu. Mradi huo, unaotarajiwa kuka-

milika ndani ya miezi 12, utalenga kutatua uhaba wa malazi kwa wanafunzi 1,211 wa chuo hicho.

Tunawahamasisha wahitimu wote wa fani za ufundi ili kuwashirikisha katika miradi hii. Tunashirikisha wasanifu, wahandisi, wasanifu wa ardhi

“Hiki ni mojawapo ya vyuo vina- vyokabiliwa na msongamano, wanafunzi wakiwa wanalazimika kuishi nje. Tunajenga hosteli kupitia mpango wetu, tutakazozita Kijiji cha Wanafunzi wa Kagumo, zikiweza kuhifadhi wanafunzi 680,” alisema. Bi. Wahome pia alitangaza ushirikiano na chuo hicho chenye umri wa zaidi ya miaka 100 kufufua jengo la kufundishia lililosimama kwa miaka 15 kutokana na ukosefu wa ufadhili.

Wawekezaji 19 waanza shughuli Ukanda Maalum wa Kiuchumi wa Naivasha Serikali ikilegeza kanuni

Hatua ya Serikali kupunguza kanuni na kupunguza ushuru na ada za umeme katika Eneo Maalum la Kiuchumi la Naivasha imevutia wawekezaji 19 ambao tayar wameanza shughuli zao. Eneo hilo, lililoko Mai Mahiu karibu na Kituo cha Makasha cha Bara, limepangiwa zaidi ya ekari 6,000 ili kuhudumia idadi inayoongezeka ya wawekezaji wanaotaka sehemu ya ardhi yake. Eneo hilo maalum ni mojawapo ya maeneo 38 nchini ambako serikali inalenga kuongeza uwekezaji wa ndani, kupunguza gharama za uagizaji, na kuunda nafasi za ajira kwa Wakenya. Kulingana na Waziri wa Uwekezaji, Biashara na Viwanda, Lee Kinyanjui, serikali inapanga kuhakikisha kwamba eneo hilo litakuwa limefikia asilimia 40 ya uendeshaji ifikapo mwisho wa mwaka ujao. Kinyanjui alisema eneo hilo, ambalo linatarajiwa kubadilishwa kuwa kitovu kikuu cha viwanda na biashara chenye makazi nafuu na huduma za kijamii, litaunda zaidi ya ajira 50,000 katika kipindi cha miaka 10 ijayo. Waziri huyo aliongeza kuwa seri-

kali inalenga kuunga mkono viwanda vizito na vyepesi katika eneo hilo ili kukuza uzalishaji wa ndani na kupunguza bili kubwa ya uagizaji bidhaa nchini. “Serikali inatumia mabilioni ya shilingi kuagiza bidhaa kutoka nje, na tunalenga kuunga mkono uwekezaji wa ndani ili kupunguza gharama hii na kuokoa fedha za kigeni,” alisema Kinyanjui. Aidha, Waziri huyo alikaribisha uwekezaji katika vituo vya data, magari ya umeme, minada ya magari yaliyotumika, na sekta ya dawa, akibainisha kuwa serikali inarekebisha sera zake ili kurahisisha shughuli zao. Alisema kuwa ukaribu wa eneo hilo na nishati ya uhakika na nafuu ya jotoardhi ya Olkaria, pamoja na muunganisho wa reli, kurahisisha gharama za uzalishaji na usafirishaji kwa wawekezaji. Kinyanjui aliongeza kuwa serikali inalenga kuunga mkono taasisi za TVET za ndani ili kuongeza uwezo wao na kuonisha mafunzo yao na mahitaji ya soko la ajira. Hata hivyo, alilalamikia urasimu wa kuchosha ambao hapo awali umekuwa ukikwamisha shughuli za wawekezaji, na akabainisha kuwa serikali imejitolea kutatua changamoto hiyo. “Tunaunga mkono kukamilika kwa miundombinu ya kuungani-

sha kama barabara, maji, umeme na huduma nyingine ambazo zitarahisisha shughuli katika eneo hili,” alisema Kinyanjui.

Kwa upande wake, Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Mamlaka ya Maeneo Maalum ya Kiuchumi, Dkt. Ken Chelule, alisema wameomba

zaidi ya shilingi bilioni moja kutoka hazina kuu ili kuharakisha kukamilika kwa miundombinu muhimu katika eneo hilo. Alisema ongezeko la mahitaji kutoka kwa wawekezaji kutaka kuanzisha viwanda katika eneo hilo lililazimu serikali kuongeza mgao wa ardhi kutoka ekari 1,000 za awali hadi ekari 6,000 za sasa. Alisema kuwa miongoni mwa wawekezaji watakuwa Shirika la Viwango la Kenya (KEBS), ambalo linatarajiwa kujenga kituo cha kikanda cha kupima magari yaliyotumika yanayoringizwa nchini kwa matumizi ya ndani na ya nchi jirani. Aidha, Chelule alisema kwamba mmoja wa wawekezaji amechukua zaidi ya ekari 2,000 ili kuanzisha mbuga jumuishi ya viwanda katika eneo hilo kwa ajili ya kuendeleza biashara. Alisema mara eneo hilo litakapokuwa kikamilifu, maelfu ya vijana watanufaika na nafasi za ajira na taifa kuvutia mabilioni ya dola katika uwekezaji, na kuongeza kuwa asilimia 40 ya wawekezaji ni Wakenya. Kulingana na Waziri wa Ardhi wa Kaunti ya Nakuru, John Kihagi, kaunti imepunguza mchakato wa kupatia wawekezaji vibali vya biashara ili kuharakisha shughuli zao.

Migori yapokea vifaranga 5,000 vilivyoboreshwa kutoka kwa Serikali kuu

Kaunti ya Migori kimepokea vifaranga vyenye thamani ya Sh500,000 kutoka kwa serikali ya kitaifa. Josaphat Simolo kutoka Idara ya Maendeleo ya Mifugo, alipokuwa akikabidhi vifaranga 5,000 vilivyoboreshwa kwa makundi 35 ya wakulima yaliyosambaa katika

wodi 40 za kaunti hiyo, alisema kuwa mradi huo unalenga kuboresha maisha ya walengwa. Aliongeza kuwa mpango huo, chini ya Ajenda ya Mageuzi ya Kiuchumi ya Chini-Juu (BETA), unalenga kuwawezesha jamii—hasa watu walio katika mazingira magumu, wanawake na vijana—kujipatia kipato. Alisema pia kuwa mradi

huo unalenga kuziba pengo katika sekta ya ufugaji kuku kwa madhumuni ya kupunguza uagizaji wa mayai na nyama kutoka nje. Afisa huyo alifafanua kwamba kwa kuwaunga mkono wakulima wa ndani, serikali inatarajia kukuza biashara za kilimo na kuunda nafasi za ajira kwa wanawake na vijana. Waziri wa Kilimo wa Kaunti ya Migori (CECM), Lucas Mosenda, alisema kuwa mpango huo unaendana na ajenda ya kaunti ya kuongeza mapato ya wakulima. Vifaranga

hivyo, vinavyojulikana kama “Kienyeji Bora,” hukumaa haraka, na kuanza kutaga ndani ya miezi minne na kutoa nyama ndani ya miezi 5. Maafisa wa kaunti pia walibainisha kuwa wataotoa chanjo kwa bei nafuu na wakaahidi kuwapatia walengwa chanjo za ziada za dharura. Mosenda alisisitiza umuhimu wa ufuatiliaji na tathmini ili kuhakikisha mradi unadumu, akiwa-taka walengwa kuwa vyanzo vya moja kwa moja vya taarifa ili kufuatilia maendeleo.

Serikali kutumia Sh3 bilioni kununua vifaa vya matibabu Makueni

Rais William Ruto ametangaza kuwa Serikali itatumia Sh3 bilioni kununua vifaa vya kisasa vya matibabu ili kuboresha huduma za afya katika Kaunti ya Makueni. Alisema fedha hizo zitatumika kununua vifaa kama vile mashine za X-ray za kidijitali, ultrasound, MRI, na vifaa vya maabara, kwa lengo la kuimarisha mfumo wa afya wa kaunti hiyo. Rais aliongeza kuwa vifaa hivyo vitasambazwa kwa vituo vyote vya afya, ikiwemo zahanati na vituo vya afya, ili kuleta huduma karibu na jamii. “Uwekezaji huu ni sehemu ya ajenda yetu ya kuhakikisha kila Mkenya anapata huduma za kiwango cha juu cha matibabu moja kwa moja katika ngazi ya jamii,” alisema Rais Ruto wakati wa ziara yake Kaunti ya Makueni.

Aidha, alifafanua kuwa gharama ya vifaa hivyo italipwa na SHA, na serikali ya kaunti haitatozwa chochote. Wakati wa hafla hiyo, Kiongozi wa Taifa alitangaza pia kuwa dawa kutoka Mamlaka ya Ugavi wa Dawa Kenya (KEMSA) sasa zitasambazwa moja kwa moja kwa vituo vyote vya afya nchini, tofauti na awali ambapo zilipelakwa kwanza kwa vituo vya afya vya kaunti. “Dawa kutoka KEMSA zitatumwa moja kwa moja kwa vituo vya afya ili kuhakikisha wananchi wanapata huduma bora,” alisema Rais. Rais Ruto alitoa wito kwa wakazi wa eneo hilo kujisajili na SHA ili kuwawezesha kupata huduma za afya bila malipo, akibainisha kuwa Wakenya milioni 27 tayari wamesajiliwa chini ya mpango huo. “Tunahitaji watu wajisajili ili tupate takwimu sahihi zitaka-

zotuwezesha kupanga, kujua tunahitaji madaktari wangapi, dawa kiasi gani na vifaa. Serikali inalenga kuongeza idadi ya Wakenya waliiojiandikisha katika SHA hadi milioni 30 kutoka milioni 27 ndani ya miezi 3 hadi 4 ijayo,” alisema Ruto alipohutubia wananchi katika miji ya Emali na Wote na soko la Kasikeu. Aliwakumbusha wananchi kuwa afya ni haki ya kikatiba kama ilivyoainishwa katika Ibara ya 43 ya Katiba ya Kenya. “Afya ni haki ya msingi kwa kila mwananchi wa Jamhuri ya Kenya, na ni wajibu wetu kuhakikisha inatimizwa,” alisema. Akizungumza katika hafla hiyo hiyo, Gavana wa Kaunti ya Makueni, Mutula Kilonzo Jr., alionmba serikali ya kitaifa kusaidia kujenga kituo cha kitaifa cha dharura katika hospitali ya Makindu ya Kaunti Ndogo.

Alisema kuwa shirika hilo sasa linaongeza matumizi ya teknolojia katika hatua nyingi za kilimo cha mpunga katika eneo hilo ili kupunguza gharama na kuongeza mavuno. “Matayarisho ya shamba, upulizaji wa dawa na ku-fukuza ndege bado vin-afanywa kwa mikono.

Unapotumia mashine, gharama ya uzalishaji inapungua kwa kiasi kikubwa. Tunakadiria kuwa gharama ya sasa ya takriban Sh70,000 kwa ekari inaweza kupungu-zwa hadi nusu,” alisema. Kupitia mpango huo, LBDA, alisema, inatumia droni, malori ya kupakia na mashine za kulainisha udongo (rota-vators) kuchukua nafasi ya kazi ya mikono inay-ogharimu kiasi kikubwa. Aidha, imeanza kutoa

mafunzo kwa wakulima kuhusu mbinu za kilimo himilivu na kuwaungan-isha na taasisi za kifedha binafsi zinazotoa pem-bejeo na kurejesha ghar-ama baada ya mavuno. “Mkulima anachohitaji ni kutoa ardhi. Kila kitu kingine kinashu-ghulikiwa, na bado wakulima wanapata ki-pato. Viwango vya ufa-dhili ni nafuu kuliko vile ambavyo wakulima wamekuwa waki-pata,” alisema Ochiaga.

(Conflict of Interest Act, 2025 and Administrative Procedures for the Declaration of Income, Assets and Liabilities, 2016- Legal Notice No.53)

It is hereby notified for general information to the public officers that, pursuant to the Conflict of Interest Act, 2025 which came into operation on 19th August 2025 and the advisory issued by Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission on the same (Daily Nation Wednesday 12th November, 2025), the two-year declaration of income, assets and liabilities for the year 2025 will be filed between 1st November, 2025 and 31st December, 2025. The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (“EACC”) which is mandated to administer and oversight implementation of requirements under the Conflict of Interest Act, 2025 (including development of regulations and procedures on the implementation process) as guided that responsible Commissions administer the process as provided under section 52(1) of the Conflict of Interest Act, 2025.

Contents and Scope of a Declaration

The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission as further guided that other than the requirement for State and public officers to fill and submit a declaration of income, assets and liabilities of themselves, their spouse/s and dependent children below the age of 18 years, the Act also requires declaration of information on any material change in, or changes affecting any of the categories of income, assets and liabilities. For clarity, “material change” is defined in section 31(4) of the Act, which declarants must familiarize themselves with prior to filling and submitting their declarations.

The Commission is responsible for:

- Principal Secretaries;
- Ambassadors, High Commissioners, diplomatic and Consular representatives;
- Public officers who are officers, employees or members of state corporations that are public bodies; and
- Public officers in respect of which the Commission exercises appointive and disciplinary control, including advisors and personal staff.

All the specified state and public officers in Ministries, State Departments and State Corporations for which Public Service Commission is the Responsible Commission are required to fill and submit declaration of income, assets and liabilities of themselves, their spouse/s and dependent children below the age of 18 years on or before the 31st December, 2025.

The prescribed declaration form will be availed by the respective authorized officers to individual public officers and

The Authorized Officer will submit the declaration returns to the Public Service Commission in the format prescribed under the Administrative Procedures for the Declaration of Income, Assets and Liabilities (legal notice no. 53 of 2016 and Guidelines on the declaration of income assets and liabilities, 2009). The returns to the Commission will be submitted as per the schedule that will be issued to the authorized officer by the Commission through a circular letter by 1st December 2025 and which will also be available in the Commission's website.

Each state and public officer takes personal responsibility for the completeness and accuracy of the information submitted to the Commission.

Public institutions are advised to commence and conclude disciplinary action against public officers who would have failed to comply from **2nd January, 2026** in accordance with applicable human resource policies and procedures manual and inform the Commission on sanctions taken by **31st March, 2026**. Mudavadi aangazia mafanikio ya Kenya katika sera za kigeni na diplomasia ya diaspora

Kenya imethibitisha tena nafasi yake kama mshirika mkuu wa kidiplomasia na kiuchumi katika ulingo wa kimataifa, kupitia ufunguzi wa balozi mpya, upanuzi wa biashara za kimataifa, na kuimarisha ulinzi kwa raia wake wanaoishi nje ya nchi.

Mkuu wa Mawaziri na Waziri wa Mambo ya Nje na Masuala ya Diaspora, Dkt. Musalia Mudavadi, alisema kuwa katika miaka ya hivi karibuni, Kenya imepiga hatua kubwa katika mahusiano ya kidiplomasia, diplomasia ya diaspora na juhudi za kuimarisha amani kikanda.

Akizungumza wakati wa mkutano wa tatu wa robo mwaka wa wizara na wanahabari jijini Nairobi, Mudavadi alisema: “Lengo letu, kupitia Sera mpya ya Mambo ya Nje na mpango wa Foreign Policy Mashinani, ni kuwa na mawasiliano ya wazi na wananchi na vyombo vya habari ili tuweze kushirikiana taarifa mara kwa mara.”

Alisisitiza dhamira ya serikali katika uwazi wa mawasiliano ya kidiplomasia.

Mudavadi alifichua kuwa Kenya inaendelea kupanua uwepo wake kidiplomasia, huku konseli mpya zikifunguliwa Guangzhou, China, na Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, na pia serikali ikiidhinisha kufunguliwa kwa balozi mpya Copenhagen, Denmark; Hanoi, Vietnam; na Vatican City.

“Hatua hii inaimarisha diplomasia ya maadili na maendeleo ya Kenya na kuongeza ushirikiano na

mashirika ya maendeleo ya Katoliki yanayosimamia zaidi ya shule 7,700 na vituo vya afya 500 nchini,” Mudavadi alisema. Aliongeza kuwa ushiriki wa Kenya katika mikutano mikubwa ya kimataifa—ikiwemo Mkutano wa Tokyo kuhusu Maendeleo ya Afrika (TICAD 9), Jukwaa la Ushirikiano kati ya China na Afrika (FOCAC) na Mkutano Mkuu wa Umoja wa Mataifa—umezaa matunda makubwa.

Kenya ilipata ufadhili wa Samurai wa Sh22 bilioni kusaidia uendeleo wa viwanda, na kupitia FOCAC, sasa itafurahia upendeleo wa ushuru wa sifuri kwa mauzo ya bidhaa kama kahawa, chai na parachichi kwenda China.

Mudavadi alisema kuwa mpango wa wizara wa For-

eign Policy Mashinani, uliozinduliwa Kisumu Oktoba, unalenga kuondoa pengo kati ya sera za kitaifa na uelewa wa wananchi. Jukwaa hilo liliwaleta pamoja viongozi kutoka kaunti zote sita za Nyanza kujadili jinsi sera za nje zinavyounganishwa na maendeleo ya ngazi ya chini.

“Tumekuwa na hali ambapo sera za kaunti zimesababisha migogoro na kuathiri wajibu wetu wa kimataifa,” alibainisha. “Mpango huu unahakikisha kwamba wote tunafuata mkondo mmoja.”

Mikutano kama hiyo inapangwa pia kwa kaunti za Pwani kabla ya mwisho wa mwaka.

Diaspora ya Kenya inaendelea kuwa nguzo muhimu katika maendeleo ya taifa, huku Mudavadi akisema zaidi ya Wakenya 430 wamepata ajira nje ya nchi kupitia makubaliano ya ajira ya pande mbili tangu 2023, na melfu wakipata kazi kupitia programu ya Ajira (Ajira Digital).

Kwa mujibu wa Benki Kuu ya Kenya, kiasi cha fedha zinaz-

otumwa na Wakenya wa diaspora kiliongezeka kwa asilimia 18 hadi Sh651.7 bilioni mwaka 2024, na kufikia Novemba 2025, kiasi hicho kilikuwa kimevuka kiwango cha shilingi trilion moja.

“Hichi ni kiasi kikubwa sana kwa uchumi wetu na katika kuimarisha shilingi yetu,” alisema Waziri Mkuu huyo.

Alisema wizara inaendelea kujadiliana kuhusu makubaliano mapya ya ajira na Saudi Arabia, Umoja wa Falme za Kiarabu (UAE), Qatar na Jordan ili kufungua nafasi zaidi za ajira zenye ujuzi.

Mudavadi alionya kuwa ingawa ajira za diaspora zimeleta fursa nyingi, pia kuna hatari kutoka kwa mawakala walaghai wanaoawadanganya watafutaji kazi. Alifichua kuwa serikali imeawaokoa zaidi ya Wakenya 500 waliokuwa wameuzwa au kusafirishwa kinyume cha sheria kwenda mataifa ya kigeni tangu 2022, na kufuta usajili wa mawakala 600 wenye rekodi mbaya.

“Balozi zetu zimewaokoa mamia ya Wakenya waliodan-

ganywa kwenda Mashariki ya Mbali kwa ahadi za kazi zenye mishahara mikubwa, lakini wakajikuta katika ajira za kulazimishwa, uhalifu mtandaoni, na hata ulanguzi wa viungo vya mwili,” alisema.

Alisema serikali inaendelea kushirikiana na Mamlaka ya Ajira Nchini kuhakikisha ni mawakala waliopigwa msasa pekee wanaoshughulikia ajira za nje. Kampeni za uhamasishaji pia zinaongezwa ili kuzuia biashara ya usafirishaji haramu wa watu, huku wahanga wakipatiwa msaada wa kibalozi na kurejeshwa nyumbani salama.

Mudavadi alisema uhusiano wa Kenya na majirani wa Afrika Mashariki unaendelea kuwa thabiti, huku Uganda, Tanzania na Sudan Kusini wakiwa washirika muhimu wa kiuchumi na kimkakati. Biashara ndani ya Jumuiya ya Afrika Mashariki (EAC) ilifikia Sh321 bilioni mwaka 2024, zaidi ya mara mbili ya kiwango cha mwaka 2020. Uganda bado ni soko kubwa zaidi la bidhaa za Kenya, iki-chukua asilimia 11 ya mauzo yote nje.

Alithibitisha kuwa wanaharakati wawili wa Kenya, Nicholas Oyo na Bob Njagi, waliokuwa wametoweka Uganda Oktoba, wameachiwa huru kufuatia mazungumzo ya kiwango cha juu kati ya Rais William Ruto na Rais Yoweri Museveni.

Mudavadi pia alisema Kenya inaendelea kutetea amani katika Jamhuri ya Kidemokrasia ya Kongo, Sudan na Sudan Kusini, ambako hali ya kisiasa bado ni tete.

“Kenya inasimamia Sudan moja na Sudan yenye amani,” alisisitiza, akibainisha kuwa Rais Ruto, kama Mwenyekiti wa EAC, amekuwa akijihusisha kikamilifu katika mchakato wa amani wa kikanda.

Alisema Kenya itaendelea kuunga mkono upatanisho kupitia Umoja wa Afrika, IGAD na mifumo mingine ya kimataifa ili kurejesha utulivu katika Pembe ya Afrika.

Mradi wa nishati ya jua kupunguza bili za maji katika Kilifi

NA EMMANUEL MASHA (KNA)

Serikali inajenga kituo cha kuzalisha umeme wa jua chenye thamani ya Sh600 milioni katika Bwawa la Maji la Baricho, Kaunti ya Kilifi. Mradi huu unalenga kupunguza gharama kubwa ya kusukuma maji, ambayo kwa sasa inakadiriwa kuwa kati ya Sh60 milioni na Sh70 milioni kwa mwezi. Waziri wa Maji na Umwagiliaji, Mhandisi Eric Mugaa, alisema mkandarasi ameanza kazi katika eneo la mradi na kwamba mradi ukikamilika, kituo hicho kitasaidia kupunguza gharama za umeme. Hii pia itaondoa kukatika kwa umeme mara kwa mara kutoka kwa Kampuni ya Kenya Power. “Tuna mkataba wenye thamani ya zaidi ya Sh600 milioni, na mkandarasi yuko kazini kwa sasa,” alisema. “Lengo letu ni kukamilisha mradi huu haraka iwezekanavyo ili tuweze kupunguza gharama kubwa za umeme ambazo kwa sasa ni kati ya Sh60 milioni na Sh70 milioni kila mwezi,” aliongeza. Alifafanua kuwa bili kubwa za umeme zinazolipwa na Mamlaka ya Maendeleo ya Kazi za Maji Kanda ya Pwani zimekuwa zikilibwa na Serikali za Kaunti za Kilifi na Mombasa kupitia kampuni zao za maji. Mhandisi Mugaa alitembelea Bwawa la Maji la Baricho katika Kaunti Ndogo ya Malindi, ku- fuatia uhaba mkubwa wa maji uliolikumba eneo la Kilifi kwa kipindi cha wiki tatu zilizopita. Alihusisha janga hilo na kuvunjika kwa visima viwili kati ya kumi katika eneo la visima la Baricho. “Eneo hili lina uwezo wa kuzalisha lita milioni 90 za maji kwa siku, lakini kwa sasa tunazalisha lita milioni 80 pekee kwa sababu kisima kimoja na kisima cha dharura viko nje ya matumizi,” alisema.

“Visima vinahitaji kusafishwa, na hili ni zoezi la kawaida la matengenezo. Kila kisima huzalisha lita milioni 10 kwa siku,” aliongeza. Alisema kwamba wakati mvua inanyesha eneo hilo, visima huwa vinapanda juu, jambolinalofanya kuwa vigumu kwa vifaa vya kawaida kuviosha. Vifaa maalumu vya kusafishia vinatengenezwa jijini Nairobi na vinatarajiwa kuanza kazi kufikia mwisho wa Novemba. “Akiwa na uwezo wa kuzalisha lita milioni 90 kwa siku, mtambo wa Baricho hauwezi kukidhi kikamilifu mahitaji ya maji ya Kaunti ya Kilifi pekee, ambayo sasa yamefikia lita milioni 110 kwa siku,” alisema. Waziri huyo alisema Mamlaka ya Maendeleo ya Kazi za Maji Kanda ya Pwani pamoja na Serikali za Kaunti za Kilifi na Mombasa wamekubaliana kuan- daa ratiba ya mgao wa maji iliyo sahihi na inayotabirika ili kushughulikia upungufu uliopo. Ratiba hiyo itaadaliwa ndani ya wiki moja na kuwafahamisha watumiaji wa maji. Mradi wa Bwawa la Mwache uliopo Kaunti ya Kwale, ambao umefikia asilimia 55 ya ujenzi, unatarajiwa kutatua tatizo la maji katika Kaunti za Kilifi, Kwale na Mombasa. “Mara tu Bwawa la Mwache litakapokamilika, litaweza kusambaza maji kwa Kaunti ya Kwale na maeneo mengi ya Kaunti ya Mombasa, na kutoa nafasi kwa mtambo wa Baricho kuhudumia Kilifi pekee,” alisema. Aliwahimiza watumiaji wa maji kulipia huduma hiyo ili kufanya kampuni za maji ziweze kutimiza majukumu yao ya kifedha.

ADVISORY ON DETAINING BODIES OF DECEASED PERSONS FOR UNPAID HOSPITAL BILLS

The Kenya Medical Practitioners and Dentists Council is a body corporate established under Section 3 of the Medical Practitioners and Dentists Act (CAP 253) with the mandate to regulate the training and practice of medicine, dentistry and community oral health within the Republic of Kenya. The Council is also mandated by CAP 253 to regulate health facilities within the country.

The right to dignity does not end at death. Article 28 of the Constitution of Kenya guarantees every person the inherent right to dignity and to have that dignity respected and protected.

Consistent with this, Section 137 of the Penal Code makes it a criminal offence (a misdemeanour) to hinder the burial of a deceased person without lawful authority.

Kenyan courts have reinforced this principle. In *Mary Nyang'ayi Nyaigero & Another v Karen Hospital Limited* (2016) and *Ludindi Venant & Another v Pandya Memorial Hospital* (1998), the courts held: ***“There is no property in a dead body. It cannot be offered or held as security for payment of a debt. It cannot be auctioned if there is a default. It cannot be used to earn rental income in a cold room. In sum, there is no legal basis for detaining it.”***

While health facilities are entitled to pursue payment for services rendered, the law does not permit them to detain a deceased person's body as collateral for unpaid bills. Such actions breach constitutional rights and amount to a criminal offence.

Hospitals and mortuaries/funeral homes are therefore advised to engage families of deceased persons in payment plans or other alternative arrangements for settling outstanding bills, rather than detaining bodies.

Affected families are reminded of their obligation and encouraged to agree with hospitals on bills payment plans to enable timely release of their loved ones for burial. This approach upholds the law and preserves the dignity of the deceased.

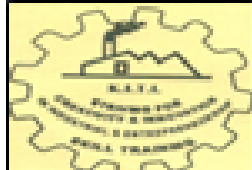
Serikali imetangaza upanuzi wa mpango wa National Youth Opportunities Towards Advancement (NYOTA) hadi kaunti zingine 25, hatua kubwa katika kuwawezesha maelfu ya vijana wajasiriamali nchini. Katibu wa Wizara (PS) ya Maen-

deleo ya Biashara Ndogo, Ndogo Sana na za Kati (MSMEs), Susan Mang'eni, alisema hatua hiyo inafuatia utekelezaji wenye mafanikio wa awamu ya kwanza ya mradi huo katika nguzo ya Magharibi inayojumuisha kaunti za Kakamega, Vihiga, Bungoma na Busia. "Rasmi tulizindua NYOTA na kuanza kutoa mtaji wa kuanzisha

biashara kwa walionufaika katika Uwanja wa Michezo wa Mumias, Kakamega. Jumla ya wanufaika 12,155 walipokea zaidi ya Sh303.8 milioni, kila mmoja akipata Sh22,000 kupitia Pochi La Biashara, huku Sh3,000 zikitengwa kama akiba ya lazima," alisema. Alifafanua kuwa akiba hiyo inalenga kujenga utamaduni wa nidhamu ya kifedha miongoni

mwa wanufaika na pia kuwakinga dhidi ya misukosuko ya kiuchumi. "Huu ni utaratibu wa usimamizi wa rasilimali na mfumo wa kumimarisha biashara unaowaruhusu wanufaika kutumia akiba yao kama dhamana wanapotafuta ufadhili zaidi kutoka kwa taasisi rasmi za kifedha," alisema. Akizungumza jijini Nairobi, PS alisema mradi huo wa miaka mitano unalenga kuwawezesha zaidi ya vijana 100,000 walio katika mazingira magumu katika maeneo yote 1,450 ya wadhi nchini, kila wadi ikitarajiwa kuwa na angalau wanufaika 70. Zaidi ya hayo, wakimbizi 5,000 katika kambi za Kakuma na Dadaab pamoja na wanajamii 5,000 wa maeneo yanayowapokea wanatarajiwa kunufaika. Mang'eni alisema maandalizi ya ushiriki wa wakimbizi yanaendelea, huku shughuli za uthibitishaji na urasimishaji zikiritibiwa kwa ushirikiano na mashirika husika ya serikali. "Mchakato huu huchukua muda mrefu zaidi kwa sababu lazima tushirikiane kwa karibu na idara zinazoshughulikia masuala ya wakimbizi ili kuhakikisha wanapata vibali sahihi," alieleza. PS alitangaza kuwa awamu ya pili ya mafunzo itaanza kwa wakati mmoja katika kaunti 25, zikiwemo Kitui, Machakos, Makueni, Uasin Gishu, Trans Nzoia, West Pokot, Turkana, Baringo, Laikipia, Meru, Tharaka Nithi, Embu, Isiolo, Nakuru, Narok, Kajiado, Nandi, Siaya, Kisumu, Homa Bay, Migori, Kisi, Nyamira, Kericho na Bomet. "Awamu hii itahusisha wanu-

faika 63,231 ambao watapokea mafunzo katika vituo 222 kwenye maeneo 151 ya uwakilishi kwa siku nne. Kila mshiriki lazima ahudhurie angalau siku tatu ili kufuzu kupata mtaji wa kuanzisha biashara. Mafunzo yatafanyika katika maeneo yao ya uwakilishi, na wale walio mbali na maeneo yao wanatakiwa kupanga jinsi ya kuhudhuria," alisema. Kaunti 18 zilizosalia, ikiwemo Nairobi, Kiambu na Elgeyo Marakwet, zitashughulikiwa katika awamu inayofuata mara tu masuala ya kiusalama na lojistiki yatakaposuluhishwa. "Tulilazimika kuchelewesha utekelezaji katika Elgeyo Marakwet kutokana na mkasa wa maporomoko ya ardhi. Tutarejea huko pindi hali itakapotengemaa," alisema PS. Mang'eni alisema kuwa baada ya mafunzo ya darasani, wanufaika wataingia katika programu ya uongozi (mentorship) ya miezi miwili, ikifuatiwa na mafunzo ya siku tatu ya kuwaunganisha na fursa za biashara na programu nyingine ya uongozi ya miezi miwili kabla ya kupokea nusu ya pili ya ufadhili wao. Alisema uongozi huo umeundwa ili kutoa mwongozo wa vitendo katika hatua ya awali ya ukuaji wa biashara, ambayo ndiyo hatari zaidi. "Tunawashika mkono hawa vijana wajasiriamali kwa umakini mkubwa kwa sababu tunafahamu mwaka wa kwanza wa biashara ni mgumu zaidi. Kupitia ushauri, uongozi na kuwaunganisha na masoko, tunataka kuwapatia mwanzo bora kabisa," alisema.

Rais William Ruto amerejelea dhamira ya Kenya kuimarisha biashara ndogo, za kati na za kati (MSMEs) kama motor kuu ya mageuzi ya kiuchumi na ujumuishaji wa kikanda. msingi ya MSMEs kama nguzo za uchumi wetu. Ustahimilivu wao, ubunifu na ubunifu wao unaendelea kuendelea ukuaji wa viwanda na ajira katika Afrika Mashariki,” alisema Rais. Akizungumza wakati wa ufunguzi rasmi wa Maonesho ya Biashara ya MSME ya Jumuiya ya Afrika Mashariki (EAC) ya 25 katika Uwanja wa

Uhuru, Nairobi, Rais Ruto alisema kuwa EAC imekua na kuwa umoja wenye nguvu wa mataifa washirika wanane unaowakilisha zaidi ya wananchi milioni 300, na kuifanya kuwa mwanachama wa masoko yanayokua kwa kasi duniani. Akizungumzia mageuzi ya Kenya chini ya Ajenda ya Mageuzi ya Kiuchumi kutoka Chini kwenda

Juu (BETA), alisema kuwa MSMEs zimo kina cha vipaumbele vya taifa sambamba na kilimo, makazi nafuu, afya na uchumi wa kidijitali. “Tulichagua kutoa ru-zuku kwa uzalishaji badala ya matumizi, na matokeo yanaonekana wazi. Maeneo yetu ya uzalishaji katika mazao muhimu yameongezeka kwa kiwango

kikubwa,” alisema. Ruto alitaja Hazina ya Hustler kama mpango mahsusi wa kuongeza ujumuishaji wa kifedha, akibainisha kuwa zaidi ya Sh80 bilioni zimetoa tangu 2022 kwa mamilion ya Wakenya ambao hapo awali hawakuwa na fursa ya kupata mikopo rasmi. “Leo, zaidi ya Wakenya milioni mbili wanakopa mara kwa mara kutoka kwa Hazina ya Hustler, baadhi wakipata hadi Sh150,000 bila dhama—isi-pokuwa tu uaminifu wao wa kifedha,” alisema na kuongeza kwamba serikali inafanya kazi ya kuhalalisha alama za mikopo kama dhama mpya kwa vijana na wanawake wajasiriamali. Alitangaza mipango ya kuanzisha Hifadhi za Uchanganuzi na Viwanda za Kaunti (CAIPs) katika kaunti zote 47 ili kukuza uongezaji thamani na uhusiano wa viwanda kwa biashara ndogo, sambamba na Mpango wa Nyota ambao utatoa ruzuku ya Sh50,000 kwa zaidi ya vijana 110,000 na biashara zinazoongozwa na watu wenye ul-emavu, na kutoa mafunzo ya biashara kwa zaidi ya wajasiriamali 600,000. “Wanawake ni wafanyabiashara mahiri, na mpango huu uta hakikisha kwamba si chini

ya asilimia 50 ya wal-ionufaika watakuwa wanawake,” alisisitiza. Ruto aliusifu sekta ya Jua Kali kwa mchango wake unaoongezeka katika mpango wa makazi nafuu, akibainisha kwamba mafundi wame-pata kandarasi za zaidi ya Sh15 bilioni za kusambaza milango, madi-risha na vifaa vingine. “Sekta ya Jua Kali ime-thibitisha kwamba biashara ndogo zinaweza kutekeleza miradi mikubwa, wakati mwingine hata bora kuliko kam-puni kubwa,” alisema. Kupitia uzalishaji wa malisho kwa kiwango hiki, Turkana inaweza kunufaika na mnyororo wa thamani wa mifugo na malisho ili kufikia lengo hili,” alisema Dkt. Erus. Naibu Gavana alisifu kipengele cha uhamishaji wa maarifa kilichojumuishwa katika pendekezo hilo ili kuimarisha taasisi za elimu ya juu za eneo hilo, na akasisitiza kuwa vituo vya mafunzo ya ufundi pia vinapaswa kujumuishwa katika mfumo wa kujenga uwezo unaopendekezwa. “Gavana mara zote amewahimiza wadau kuwekeza katika sekta ya mifugo na uchumi wa wafugaji kutokana na idadi kubwa ya mifugo katika kaunti. Kenya yalenga tani milioni 80 za malisho ya mifugo kw uwekezaji wa hekta milioni 40

NA ERASTUS GICHOHI (KNA)

Nchi inahitaji kuwekeza na kuwekeza kibiashara zaidi ya ekari milioni 40 za ardhi zinazoweza kutoa hadi tani milioni 80 za malisho ya mifugo kila mwaka ili kukabiliana na upungufu wa muda mrefu. Hivi sasa, Kenya inazalisha tani milioni 15 tu za malisho kila mwaka, huku idadi ya mifugo ikipanda, ikiwa na zaidi ya ng'ombe milioni 22 na kondoo na mbuzi zaidi ya milioni 58. Ili kukabiliana na upungufu huu, nchi imekuwa ikitegemea kuagiza virutubisho muhimu vya malisho, jambo ambalo limeongeza gharama za uzalishaji kwa wakulima wa ndani. Alisema nchi hizi tatu zinachangia asilimia 55 ya rasilimali za mifugo zaidi ya milioni 300 katika kanda ya IGAD.

Utafiti kwa athari za kijamii Ushirikiano/ushirikiano ni muhimu kwa utafiti wenye athari. Idara ya Serikali inapendekeza taasisi za utafiti kuchukua hatua za utafiti wa kisasa na wenye athari kwa kushirikiana ili kushughulikia masuala ya kijamii na kuunda ubunifu unaochochea uchumi. Wakati wa hotuba yangu katika mkutano na taasisi za utafiti zilizosajiliwa Nairobi, Kenya - uliohudhuriwa na

maafisa wa Idara ya Sayansi, Utafiti na Ubunifu, Wakurugenzi Wakuu na wafanyakazi wa NACOSTI, NRF, KENIA pamoja na Wakurugenzi wa Taasisi za Utafiti Zilizoorodheshwa na Wageni wengine waliotembelewa - ujumbe ulikuwa wazi kuwa taasisi za utafiti lazima zichangie katika kuunda suluhisho mpya zinazolea ubunifu katika viwanda na kuunda ajira, kushughulikia changamoto za kijamii kwa kutoa uelewewa wa msingi wa matatizo ya jamii kama ukosefu wa chakula, masuala ya afya, ukosefu wa usawa, ukosefu wa ajira, na umasikini. Majadiliano yaliangazia ukujaji wa uchumi kwa kukuza ubunifu na kuongeza thamani kama vichocheo vya ukuaji wa uchumi wa muda mrefu.

Ng’ang’a, Rais wa Bodi ya AMCHAM Kenya, alisema kumalizika kwa AGOA hakutakiwa kuonekana kama kushindwa bali kama fursa kwa Kenya na Marekani kutafafanua upya ushirikiano wao kwa masharti ya ushirikiano wa pande zote na mtazamo wa mbele. “Biashara ya kimataifa inabadi- lika, na sisi pia lazima tubadilike. Kenya na Marekani sasa zina nafasi ya kuunda jukwaa la uwekezaji linalojenga ushirikiano wa pande zote zinazotegemea ukweli wa uchumi wa kidijitali na ulio tofauti,” alisema. Bi. Ng’ang’a aliwahimiza wawekezaji wa Marekani kuongeza uwekezaji katika minyororo ya thamani ya nguo na kilimo nchini Kenya na kuthibitisha dhamira ya sekta binafsi katika mazungumzo ya sera endelevu na maendeleo ya biashara ya kikanda. Aliongeza kuwa wawekezaji wa Marekani wanaendelea kuona Kenya kama nchi thabiti na yenye mkakati wa kuingia katika soko la Afrika Mashariki. Mtaalamu wa biashara kati ya Marekani na Afrika, Gavin van der Burg, alielezea kumalizika kwa AGOA kama kichocheo cha ubunifu badala ya kurudi nyuma, akihimiza pande zote mbili kutumia fursa hii kuunda mfano jumishi na endelevu wa siku za usoni. “AGOA haikukusudiwa kudumu milele. Sasa ni wakati wa kuunda mfano wa siku za usoni unaoundwa Nairobi na vipaji vya Kiafrika na ushirikiano wa Marekani,” alisema.

NOTICE TO IMPORTERS OF USED / SECOND-HAND MOTOR VEHICLES

Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS) is a statutory body established under the Standards Act, Cap. 496, Laws of Kenya and it is mandated to offer among other services, quality inspection of imports based on Kenya Standards or approved specifications.

Pursuant to the provision of KS 1515:2000 - Kenya Standard Code of Practice for Inspection of Road Vehicles, and Legal Notice No.78 of 28th April 2020 - The Verification of Conformity to Kenya Standards of Imports Order, we wish to notify all importers of used / second-hand motor vehicles including returning residents, diplomatic staff and the general public that in observance of clause 2.5 of KS 1515:2000 on the eight (8) year age limit requirement, only Right Hand Drive (RHD) motor vehicles whose year of first registration is from 1st January 2019 and later shall be allowed into the country effective 1st January 2026.

Vehicles exported to Kenya shall be expected to comply with KS 1515:2000 — Kenya Code of Practice for Inspection of Road Vehicles while vehicles from countries where KEBS has an inspection agency (i.e. Japan, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, Thailand, Singapore, and South Africa) shall be accompanied with a Certificate of Roadworthiness (CoR) issued by Quality Inspection Services Inc. Japan (QISJ) which is an inspection company contracted by KEBS.

Further, the Certificates of Roadworthiness for vehicles whose year of first registration is 2018 will not be valid after 31st December 2025. All vehicles issued with such certificates must arrive at the Port of Destination / Entry by 31st December 2025. Any vehicle registered in 2018 or earlier, arriving after 31st December 2025 will be deemed not compliant with KS 1515:2000 and shall be rejected at the importer's expense.

Dkt. Bendera alibainisha kuwa Hospitali ya Rufaa ya Kaunti ya Malindi inahudumia eneo pana linalozidi Kaunti ya Kilifi liki-jumuisha Tana River, Lamu, na sehemu za Garissa, jambo linalofanya kituo hiki kuwa kitovu muhimu cha afya kanda nzima.

Serikali yatenga pesa kufungua barabara katika Kerio Valley

Akizungumza Chesongoch, Kaunti ya Elgeyo Marakwet, Waziri wa Mambo ya Ndani, Kipchumba Murkomen, alisema kuwa hatua hii itawawezesha maafisa wa usalama kufikia maeneo ya mbali na yenye milima ambayo kwa muda mrefu yametumika kama hifadhi za majambazi na makundi ya wahalifu. “Tutapanga rasilimali zitakazotusaidia kufika kwenye baadhi ya maeneo ambapo tunatekeleza operesheni za usalama,” Murkomen alisema, akiongeza, “Hii haitaboreshi tu usafiri kwa vyombo vyetu vya usalama bali pia itafungua maeneo haya kwa maendeleo.” Waziri huyo alibainisha kuwa juhudi hii inalingana na mpango mpana wa Rais William Ruto wa kubadilisha maeneo yaliyoko pembezoni. “Rais ana Mpango wa Marshall wa kuendeleza maeneo yote ya

kaskazini na nusu-mpya yaliyoko pembezoni,” alisema. “Tunataka kuhakikisha kuwa jamii katika maeneo haya haziaichwi nyuma kwa upande wa miundombinu, usalama, na maendeleo mengine.” Murkomen alithibitisha kuwa serikali ina dhamira ya kumaliza uhalifu wa majambazi katika Bonde la Kerio mara moja kwa wote, akipongeza wakazi kwa kushirikiana na mamlaka katika kuwasilisha silaha zao. “Tuko makini, tutamaliza uhalifu wa majambazi katika Bonde la Kerio,” alisema. “Nawashukuru wote walio-wasilisha silaha. Hii ni hatua nzuri mbele, na jambo pekee lililobaki ni kuendesha programu za uwezeshaji zitakazosaidia majambazi waliorekebishwa kujihusisha na shughuli za kiuchumi zinazotoa faida,” CS aliongeza. Alibainisha kuwa silaha 10 zilisalimishwa hivi karibuni Tiaty, na kuongeza jumla ya silaha zilizopatikana kuwa zaidi ya 300 tangu kuanza kampeni ya kukomesha silaha. Murkomen alisisitiza kuwa lengo la serikali ni kuhakikisha kuwa hakuna silaha haramu zinazobaki mikononi mwa raia, akisema, “Tunataka kuhakikisha kuwa silaha zote zimeondolewa mikononi mwa raia.”

Kirinyaga sets aside Sh100 million to expand Mwea water supply

Serikali ya Kaunti ya Kirinyaga imepanga Sh100 milioni kwa ajili ya upanuzi wa mfumo wa usambazaji wa maji makubwa, ambao utawanufaisha zaidi ya kaya 30,000 katika Halmashauri Ndogo ya Mwea. Rasilimali hiyo itatumika kugharamia awamu ya kwanza ya upanuzi wa bomba kuu la maji Kutus-Kimbimbi na mabomba yake ya tanzu, yenye lengo la kutoa maji safi na salama kwa makazi ya kaya katika kata za Gathigiriri, Tebere, na Thiba. Gavana Anne Waiguru alisema mradi huu ni hatua muhimu katika jitihada za utawala wake kuhakikisha kila kaya katika kaunti inapata maji ya bomba yanayoweza kutegemewa. Alibainisha kwamba upanuzi huu utapunguza kwa kiasi kikubwa utegemezi wa vyanzo vya maji visivyo salama na kupunguza mzigo kwa wanawake na watoto ambao huenda umbali mrefu kutafuta maji. Akizungumza katika Hotuba ya Hali ya Kaunti (SOCA) katika Bunge la Kaunti ya Kirinyaga, Waiguru alisema kaunti imefanya maendeleo makubwa katika maendeleo ya miundombinu ya maji, ambapo Mwea sasa inapata kipaumbele kutokana na kiwango chake cha chini cha upatikanaji wa maji ikilinganishwa na hal-

mashauri ndogo nyingine. “Ukilinganisha na halmashauri ndogo nyingine, Mwea ilikuwa nyuma katika upatikanaji wa maji, kwa matumizi ya nyumbani na umwagiliaji. Hii ndio sababu tunapoingiza rasilimali kubwa kuhakikisha maji ya bomba yanawafikia wakazi wote,” alisema Gavana. Waiguru alifafanua kwamba upanuzi unaoendelea utafanywa kwa awamu. Kata za Mutithi na Wamumu zitatolewa maji kupitia upanuzi wa bomba kuu la Kandongu-Mutithi. Ukarabati wa chanzo cha Nyamindi utawahudumia wakazi wa Nyangati na sehemu za Gathigiriri na Tebere, huku kata ya Kangai ikinufaika na upanuzi wa mabomba yaliyopo hadi maeneo kama Kombuini, Kangai, na Karii. Alisema wakazi wa kata ya Murinduko watapata maji safi mara baada ya kukamilika kwa Mradi wa Maji wa Mugaro, ambao kwa sasa unaendelea kujengwa. Gavana Waiguru pia alibainisha kwamba kaunti imeipa kipaumbele uwekezaji katika miradi midogo ya maji katika kata mbalimbali ili kuimarisha mifumo mikubwa. Alisema miradi 33 ikihusisha kuchimba visima vya kina, ujenzi wa vyanzo vya maji, na ufungaji wa vifaa vya maji inaendelea kwa gharama ya Sh44.8 milioni. Miradi hii inatarajiwa kuongeza idadi ya wakazi wanaopata maji safi hadi 78% katika kaunti nzima.



Gavana wa Kirinyaga Anne Waiguru akiwa na MCA wa Wamumu, Peter Njiru wakati wa ziara ya maendeleo Mwea, ambapo alitoa mabomba ya maji kusaia wakazi kupata maji safi kwa kilimo na matumizi ya nyumbani.

Gavana aliongeza kwamba tangu mwaka 2017, utawala wake umeanzisha miradi mipya zaidi ya 200 ya maji kupitia ufadhili wa moja kwa moja wa serikali na ushirikiano wa jamii, na kuongeza jumla ya miradi inayofanya kazi kutoka 170 hadi 370. Mikakati hii imesambaza maji salama na ya kuaminika kwa zaidi ya kaya 100,000 katika kaunti. “Uwekezaji huu wa miradi ya maji umeongeza idadi ya kaya zilizoka muunganiko wa maji kutoka 67,790 mwaka 2017 hadi 139,596 sasa. Hii imepunguza mzigo wa kutafuta maji kutoka vyanzo vya mbali au visivyo salama, kuboresha usafi, kupunguza magonjwa yanayosababishwa na maji, na kuongeza tija,” alisema Waiguru.

Alieleza kwamba upatikanaji wa maji pia umeongeza umwagiliaji mdogo, ufugaji wa mifugo, shughuli za ujenzi, na ukuaji wa viwanda vidogo kama vituo vya kuosha magari na biashara ndogo za huduma. Upatikanaji wa maji wa kuaminika, alisema, pia unapunguza migogoro kuhusu rasilimali chache za maji na kuendeleza mshikamano miongoni mwa jamii. Ili kuhakikisha uimara wa mifumo ya maji, Waiguru alisema kaunti imeanza marekebisho ili kupunguza upotevu wa maji na kuongeza ufanisi katika Kampuni ya Maji na Usafi wa Mazingira ya Kaunti ya Kirinyaga (KICOWASCO). Kupitia marekebisho haya, maji yasiyo na mapato (NRW) yameshuka kutoka 59% hadi 47%, na

kaunti inalenga kushuka chini ya 35% ifikapo mwaka ujao. Alitaja maendeleo haya kutokana na ufuatiliaji ulioimarishwa, ikiwa ni pamoja na ufungaji wa mita kuu katika Kituo cha Matibabu ya Maji cha Muratiri, ambayo sasa inaruhusu kufuatilia kwa usahihi uzalishaji wa maji dhidi ya matumizi. Aidha, kaunti inaweka mita 27 za kielektroniki kwa maeneo maalum na mifumo ya DMA (District Metering Area) ili kuimarisha usimamizi wa mtiririko na usahihi wa malipo katika maeneo tofauti ya huduma. Mifumo hii imebuniwa kuhakikisha kila tone la maji linahesabiwa na kupunguza hasara kutokana na uvujaji, kuvunjika, na muunganiko haramu.

Jiji la Kisumu lashirikiana na Ujerumani kuboresha huduma za kuzima moto

Jiji la Kisumu limeandaa mpango mkubwa wa kuboresha huduma za dharura baada ya kusaini Makubaliano ya Kulewana (MoU) na mji wa Ujerumani wa Gertshofen, jambo litakaloweza upatikanaji wa magari ya kisasa ya zima moto, vifaa vya kinga, na mafunzo maalum kwa wahudumu wa zima moto wa eneo hilo. Makubaliano hayo, yaliyosainiwa na Meya wa Gertshofen Michael Wörle, Meneja wa Jiji la Kisumu Abala Wanga, na Mwanachama wa Kamati ya Hali ya Hali za Maeneo (CEC) wa Mazingira Judy Oluoch, yatarajiwa kuhuisha mfumo wa majibu ya dharura wa jiji. Wanga alisema ushirikiano huu utaongeza maandalizi ya jiji katika kukabiliana na majanga, ambayo kwa muda mrefu yamekumbwa na vifaa vya zamani, uhaba wa wafanyakazi,

na uwezo mdogo wa kiufundi. “Wahudumu wetu wa zima moto sasa watapatiwa mafunzo ya juu nchini Ujerumani na hapa nyumbani. Kisumu pia itapokea vifaa vya kinga binafsi (PPE) vya ubora wa juu na magari ya kisasa ya zima moto ili kuboresha usalama na ufanisi wa majibu,” alisema. Ingawa Kisumu inahudumia idadi kubwa ya wakazi wa miji inayokua haraka na ina vituo vikubwa ikiwa ni pamoja na viwanda, maduka makubwa, makazi, maghala ya mafuta na bandari, jiji linategemea magari ya zima moto ya zamani na idadi ndogo ya wafanyakazi. Katika matukio kadhaa yaliyopita, ikiwa ni pamoja na moto wa viwanda Nyamasaria, moto kwenye masoko na nyumba za makazi Kondele, timu za zima moto zilikum-bana na changamoto za kufikia barabara nyembamba, kutumia mashine za zamani,

au kupata maji ya kutosha. Baadhi ya wahudumu bado wanafanya kazi wakiwa na viatu, glovu, na helmeti zilizo-chakaa, jambo linaloongeza hatari zao wakati wa dharura.

Wazima moto wetu sasa watapatia mafunzo ya hali ya juu nchini Ujerumani na ndani ya nchi

“Mpango huu si tu kuhusu vifaa. Tunaingiza maarifa, teknolojia na viwango vipya vya uendeshaji. Mwishoni mwa mwaka huu, Kisumu itakuwa tayari zaidi kulinda maisha, mali na uwekezaji,” Wanga alisema. Kulingana na makubaliano hayo, wataalamu kutoka Gertshofen watafunza maafisa wa zima moto wa Kisumu katika majibu ya haraka, uendeshaji wa magari ya moto, mbinu za uokoaji na uratibu wa majanga. Makubaliano hayo pia yatatoa fursa kwa wahudumu wa Kisumu kupata mafunzo Bavaria, wakipata uzoefu wa mifumo ya kisasa inayotumika katika miji ya Ulaya. Ushirikiano huu unatarajiwa kuongeza uthabiti wa jiji hili kando ya mteremko wa kibiashara na viwanda unaokua kwa kasi, hasa kwa kuongezeka kwa shughuli za bandari, uwekezaji mpya katika mali isiyohamishika, na kuongezeka kwa usafirishaji wa mafuta na mizigo. Wanga alisema awamu ya kwanza ya utekelezaji itaanza mwishoni mwa mwaka huu, ikihusisha utoaji wa vifaa na kuanza kwa vipindi vya mafunzo.

Mfumo kuongeza ufanisi katika miradi ya uwekezaji wa umma, asema Katibu

Serikali inaendelea kuwa na dhamira thabiti ya kuboresha utekelezaji na usimamizi wa miradi ya uwekezaji wa umma nchini kote. Dhamira hii imeimarishwa na Hazina ya Taifa kupitia kuanzishwa kwa Mfumo wa Usimamizi wa Uwekezaji wa Umma (Public Investment Management - PIM), ambao unalenga kuboresha mzunguko mzima wa miradi, kuanzia upangaji hadi ukamilisho. Kulingana na dhamira hii, Kanuni za Usimamizi wa Fedha za Umma (Usimamizi wa Uwekezaji wa Umma), 2022, zilitolewa ili kuendesha Mfumo wa PIM na kutoa miongozo wazi kuhusu maandalizi, tathmini, uteuzi, bajeti, utekelezaji, ufuatiliaji, tathmini, na kufungwa kwa miradi ya uwekezaji wa umma. Kauli hizi zilitolewa na Katibu Mkuu, Idara ya Uwekezaji wa Umma na Usimamizi wa Mali, Bw. Cyrell Wagunda, wakati wa uzinduzi wa warsha ya wiki moja katika Nairobi, Kaunti ya Nakuru, iliyoanzisha tathmini ya Mfumo wa Taarifa wa Usimamizi wa Uwekezaji wa Umma (PIMIS). Warsha hiyo ilitoa jukwaa la kutathmini maendeleo ya mfumo huo, utendaji wake na jinsi unavyofanya kazi,



kubaini maeneo yanayohitaji maboresho, na kufikia makubaliano ya njia wazi ya awamu inayofuata ya uboreshaji wake. Alibainisha kuwa Hazina ya Taifa imefanikiwa kutengeneza, kuendeleza, na kuanzisha PIMIS, ambao unaendesha mchakato mzima wa PIM kiotomatiki. Kulingana na Katibu Mkuu, Mfumo huo utarahisisha na kudigitalisha hatua zote muhimu za mzunguko wa miradi, ikiwemo utambuzi wa mradi na upangaji, uchambuzi wa awali na wa kina wa uwezekano (pre-feasibility na feasibility), uteuzi kwa ajili ya bajeti, utekelezaji, ufuatiliaji, tathmini, kuripoti, pamoja na kufungwa kwa

mradi, kudumisha miradi, na tathmini ya baadaye (ex-post evaluation). "PIMIS inawakilisha hatua kubwa katika safari yetu ya mabadiliko ya kidijitali katika Usimamizi wa Uwekezaji wa Umma, kulingana na kanuni za utawala bora na malengo ya Ajenda ya Maendeleo ya Taifa 2030. Inatumika kama jukwaa kuu la serikali kusimamia mzunguko mzima wa uwekezaji wa umma, kuanzia utambuzi na tathmini ya miradi hadi bajeti, utekelezaji, na tathmini," alisema Katibu Mkuu Wagunda. Tangu kuanzishwa kwake, PIMIS imeonyesha maendeleo yanayoshangaza, ambapo zaidi ya hoja 600

za miradi mipya zimeingizwa kupitia Mfumo huu na miradi zaidi ya 2,000 ya zamani imehamishwa kwa mafanikio. "Wizara, Idara na Mashirika (MDAs) sasa wanatumia mtiririko wa kazi uliosanifiwa na kunufaika na hifadhidata ya kati ya taarifa za uwekezaji. PIMIS imeongeza uwazi kwa kutoa muonekano wa wakati halisi wa miradi ya uwekezaji wa umma, imeimarisha uwajibikaji, kuboresha mgawanyo wa rasilimali, na kuhakikisha kila shilingi iliyowekezwa inaleta faida kubwa kwa wananchi wa Kenya," Katibu Mkuu alisisitiza. Bw. Wagunda alisema kuwa kuwepo kwa Mfumo huu kunaonyesha dhamira ya serikali ya kutumia teknolojia kuboresha jinsi inavyopanga, kutekeleza, na kutathmini uwekezaji wa umma. "Tunaposherehekea mafanikio haya, lazima pia tukubali kuwa tunaingia katika awamu muhimu ya mabadiliko, tukitoka kwenye maendeleo yanayoongozwa na washauri hadi umiliki kamili na usimamizi wa PIMIS na serikali. Kazi yetu sasa ni kuimarisha maendeleo yaliyofanikishwa na kushughulikia michakato iliyosalia, ikiwemo kumaliza ujumuishaji na mifumo muhimu ya serikali kama IFMIS," alifafanua.

Mradi huo unaofadhiliwa kupitia mkopo wa Sh38.7 bilioni kutoka Benki ya EXIM ya China, utatekelezwa chini ya mkataba wa Uhandisi, Ununuzi na



Msongamano mkubwa wa magari unaongezeka asubuhi kwenye Barabara ya Kiambu huku waendeshaji magari wakielekea Nairobi, pambano la kila siku ambalo mradi mpya wa njia mbili za magari unalenga kutatua.

Ujenzi (EPC) kwa muda wa miezi 36, ukifuatiwa na kipindi cha dhima ya kasoro cha miezi 24. Barabara iliyosanifiwa upya itajumuisha sehemu tatu za Muthaiga hadi Kirigiti Junction, Kirigiti Junction kupitia Mji wa Kiambu hadi Ofisi ya Gavana, na Ofisi ya

Wakazi 70,000 wa Maralal kunufaika na mradi mpya wa maji

Rais William Ruto ameizindua miradi saba mikuu ya kitaifa ya serikali yenye thamani ya zaidi ya Sh7.4 bilioni katika Kaunti ya Samburu wakati wa ziara rasmi ya siku mbili katika eneo hilo. Akihutubia wakazi wa Maralal, Rais alisema kuwa Kaunti ya Samburu imekuwa imepuuzwa kwa muda mrefu na serikali zilizopita, akisisitiza kuwa serikali yake inaahidi kuwekeza katika miradi ya maendeleo katika miundombinu, elimu, maji, usafi wa mazingira, na uwezeshaji wa kiuchumi. Alionesha matumaini kuwa Kaunti ya Samburu itaendelea kuendelea na sehemu zingine za nchi na kumpungeza viongozi wa eneo hilo kwa kuweka kando tofauti za kisiasa na kushirikiana kwa pamoja ili kuinua maendeleo ya kaunti. Miongoni mwa miradi iliyozinduliwa ni Mradi wa Upatikanaji wa Maji Maralal

Awamu ya Kwanza katika Bwawa la Yamo lililo tayari kukamilika kwenye mipaka ya mji wa Maralal, ambalo lina uwezo wa kuhifadhi maji mita za ujazo milioni 1.2. "Baada ya mabomba kumalizika kufungwa mnamo Aprili 2026, zaidi ya wakazi 70,000 wa mji wa Maralal na maeneo yake watapata upatikanaji wa maji wa uhakika na endelevu," alisema Rais Ruto. Miradi mingine iliyozinduliwa ni pamoja na kuwekwa jiwe la msingi la Mradi wa Makazi Nafuu Archers Post, kuboresha sehemu ya kilomita 20 ya barabara ya Kisima-Sura Adoru hadi kiwango cha bati, kuwekwa jiwe la msingi la hosteli za Chuo cha Ufundi na Stadi Samburu Magharibi na Awamu ya Pili ya Mradi wa Makazi Nafuu Maralal. Ruto pia alizindua kuboresha sehemu ya kilomita 30 ya barabara ya Maralal-Baragoi hadi kiwango cha bati na aliongoza pia ziara ya ukaguzi katika Chuo cha Mafunzo ya Tiba cha Kenya (KMTC) - tawi la Maralal.

Chuo kikuu kuanzisha shule ya uuguzi inayotegemea utafiti

JChuo Kikuu cha Sayansi na Teknolojia cha Jaramogi Oginga Odinga (JOOUST) kimepanga kuanzisha shule ya uuguzi inayojikita katika utafiti ili kushughulikia changamoto za afya katika Bonde la Ziwa Victoria. Taasisi hiyo, ambayo ipo katika hatua za mwisho za kupata kibali, imepangwa kufungua milango yake kwa wanafunzi wa kwanza wa uuguzi mnamo Mei 2026, ambapo wanafunzi 30 wa awali wanatarajiwa kuingizwa. Shule ya Uuguzi, iliyoundwa kupitia ufadhili wa Serikali ya Ubelgiji kupitia mpango wa Vli-ous, tayari imeruhusiwa na Tume ya Elimu ya Vyuo Vikuu Kenya (CUE). Shule ya Uuguzi, ambayo ni sehemu ya mradi mdogo wa Afya, ni matokeo ya mpango wa ushirikiano wa miaka kumi kati ya JOOUST na vyuo vikuu vya Ubelgiji vinavyoratibiwa na Chuo Kikuu cha Vrije cha Brussels (VUB).

Kulingana na Profesa Denis Ochuodho wa JOOUST, jukumu kuu la shule ya uuguzi, mbali na mafunzo, litakuwa utafiti wa afya, tofauti na shule za uuguzi za kawaida ambazo zinazingatia tu kufundisha wafanyakazi wa afya. "Kwa sasa tayari tuna maabara ya ujuzi iliyo na vifaa vyote kupitia mpango wa ushirikiano wa JOOUST na vyuo vya Ubelgiji uliofadhiliwa na serikali ya Ubelgiji. Tuko tayari kuanza kuingiza wanafunzi semesta ijayo ambayo itaanza katikati ya 2026," alisema Ochuodho. Profesa Ochuodho, ambaye ni mratibu wa miradi inayofadhiliwa na Vliir katika JOOUST, alibainisha kuwa wauguzi watakaofundishwa katika taasisi hiyo watakuwa na ujuzi bora. "Kuwa na chuo kikuu kilichoundwa ndani ya jamii, kuwa na wauguzi waliobobea hapa nchini kutarajishwa kushughulikia changamoto za afya zinazowaathiri wanajamii," alisema Profesa Ochuodho.
