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Serikali yalenga mabilioni ya mapato kutoka vipande T6, T7

Waziri wa Hazina ya Taifa na Mipango ya Uchumi, John Mbadi, ametetea misingi ya kifedha na ya kiuchumi ya Mpango wa Maendeleo ya Nyanjani (FDP) uliopendekezwa kwa vipande vya ardhi vyenye mafuta vya T6 na T7, akihakikishia Bunge kwamba mradi huo hautaleta mzigo wowote wa deni la umma, wa moja kwa moja, kwa Kenya. Akiwa mbele ya Kamati ya Bunge la Kitaifa kuhusu Nishati na Kamati ya Kudumu ya Seneti kuhusu Nishati, Mbadi alieleza makadirio ya kifedha, athari za kodi, mfumo wa urejeshaji gharama, na hatua za kupunguza hatari zinazohusiana na mpango wa maendeleo ya mafuta unaongozwa na Wizara ya Nishati na Petrol. 'FDP haitoi mzigo wowote wa deni la umma, wa moja kwa moja au wa kificho, kwa Serikali. Ufadhili wa uchimbaji,

maendeleo na uzalishaji unabaki kuwa jukumu la mkandarasi pekee chini ya mfumo wa PSC,' Mbadi aliwaambia wabunge. Hazina inakadiria kwamba Kenya inaweza kupata kati ya dola bilioni 1.05 (Sh136 bilioni) kwa bei ya dola 60 kwa pipa na dola bilioni 2.9 (Sh371 bilioni) kwa bei ya dola 70 kwa pipa katika kipindi chote cha mradi. Mapato ya moja kwa moja yata-tokana na mgao wa mafuta ya faida na ushiriki wa serikali, huku mapato yasiyo ya moja kwa moja yakitarajiwa kunufaisha mashirika muhimu ya serikali. Waziri alitangaza zaidi kwamba Kenya Pipeline Refinery Limited (KPRL) inatarajiwa kupata Sh42.3 bilioni kutokana na ada za hifadhi na usimamizi, huku Mamlaka ya Bandari ya Kenya (KPA) iki-tarajiwa kupata Sh41.9 bilioni kutoka Kipevu Oil Jetty mpya. Aidha, Hazina inakadiria kwamba mradi utazalisha zaidi ya ajira 3,000 za moja kwa moja, zisizo za moja kwa

moja na zilizosababishwa, na kuongeza makusanyo ya PAYE na michango ya hifadhi ya jamii. 'Mapato ya mafuta yanatarajiwa kuchangia vyema katika ukuaji wa Pato la Taifa kupitia shughuli za juu, za kati na za kiuchumi zinazohusiana,' alisema. Mbadi pia alifichua kwamba wakandarasi wameomba msamaha wa kifedha wa jumla ya dola bilioni 1.331 (Sh173 bilioni) chini ya Masharti Maalum ya Kifedha ya Mradi (PSFTs). Kwa bei ya msingi ya dola 60 kwa pipa, Mbadi alibainisha kwamba mtiririko wa fedha taslimu wa serikali ungeshuka kutoka dola bilioni 3.485 chini ya masharti ya PSC yaliyopo hadi dola bilioni 1.047 iwapo msamaha wote wa kodi na marekebisho ya ulinganifu yangetolewa. Kinyume chake, alitaja kwamba mtiririko wa fedha taslimu wa mkandarasi ungefikia dola milioni 497, na hivyo kuongeza uhalali wa kifedha wa mradi. Hata hivyo, Mbadi alisisitiza

kwamba msamaha au upunguzaji wa kodi unaweza kutolewa tu ndani ya mipaka ya kikatiba. 'Kifungu cha 210 cha Katiba kinatoa kwamba hakuna kodi au ada ya leseni inayoweza kusamehewa, kubadilishwa au kuondolewa isipokuwa kama imeelezwa na sheria,' alibainisha. Chini ya mfumo wa PSC wa

Kenya, wakandarasi hurudisha gharama za mafuta kwa kuzingatia viwango vya juu na usimamizi wa kisheria, huku Mbadi akitetea mfumo huo kuwa sambamba na utaratibu wa kimataifa. 'Shughuli za uchimbaji na



Mkandarasi hubeba hatari na gharama zote zinazohusiana na shughuli,' alieleza, akiongeza kuwa kuna ulinzi madhubuti uliowekwa, ikiwemo idhini ya mipango ya kazi ya kila mwaka na bajeti, haki za ukaguzi, kutenganisha gharama na maendeleo ya awamu yanayohusiana na uhalali wa kibiashara. Alisema Serikali inaanza kupata mapato kutoka mafuta ya kwanza, na mapato huongezeka kadri gharama zinazoweza kurejeshwa zinavyopungua, huku akifafanua zaidi kwamba FDP haiongezi moja kwa moja deni la umma la Kenya. Kwa mujibu wa Waziri, ufadhili wa uchimbaji na maendeleo unabaki kuwa jukumu la mkandarasi. Hata hivyo, iwapo Serikali itatumia haki zake za asilimia 20 za 'back-in', itachangia takriban dola bilioni 1.228 kupitia mchakato wa kawaida wa idhini. Zaidi ya hayo, vichocho vinavyofadhiliwa na Serikali – ikiwemo ardhi, ememe, maji, barabara na miundombinu ya kushughulikia mafuta ghafi – vinakadiriwa kufikia dola milioni 433.4 (Sh56.3 bilioni), huku Mbadi akisisitiza kwamba hivi tayari vimepangiwa bajeti au viko katika hatua za upangaji na upembuzi yakinifu. Huduma kama vile ememe, maji na miundombinu ya kushughulikia mafuta ghafi zitapewa mradi kwa viwango vya kibiashara vinavyodhibitiwa na mashirika

husika, huku Waziri akikiri kwamba mapato yanategemea sana bei ya mafuta duniani. 'Kwa dola 50 kwa pipa, mapato ya Serikali yangekuwa dola milioni 411, yakipanda kwa kasi hadi dola bilioni 2.856 kwa dola 70 kwa pipa,' alionyesha, akiongeza kwamba hatua za kupunguza hatari ni pamoja na kudhani bei za kihafidhina na ufuatiliaji wa soko unaoendelea. Kuhusu usafirishaji wa mafuta ghafi, Mbadi alisisitiza kwamba Hazina inaunga mkono mbinu ya awamu ikiwemo; Awamu ya I: Usafirishaji kwa malori kama hatua ya muda ya kupunguza gharama za awali za mtaji na Awamu ya II: Uhamisho kwa reli kwa ufanisi zaidi na udhibiti wa gharama. 'Mbinu hii ya awamu inahakikisha mipango ya usafirishaji inalingana na viwango vya uzalishaji huku ikilinda sehemu ya mapato ya mafuta ya Kenya dhidi ya gharama kubwa za usafirishaji,' alithibitisha Waziri. Alitangaza kwamba gharama ya kufunga mradi iliyokadiriwa kuwa dola milioni 331.8, pamoja na riba husika, itasimamiwa kupitia Mfuko wa Kufunga Mradi kama ilivyoelezwa chini ya Sheria ya Petroli, akisisitiza kwamba wakandarasi watatoa dhamana za kifedha hatua kwa hatua ili kuzuia majukumu kurudi kwa Serikali. 'Mbinu hii inalingana na utaratibu bora wa kimataifa na inahakikisha kwamba rasilimali za kutosha zimetengwa kukidhi majukumu ya mwisho wa maisha ya mradi,' Mbadi alihakikishia.

Serikali yachukua hatua kumaliza ucheleweshaji ujenzi wa Daraja la Mtwapa kwa fidia ya Sh2b

Serikali imetoa Sh2 bilioni kufidia Watu Waliothiriwa na Mradi (PAPs) kando ya barabara ya Mombasa-Mtwapa-Kilifi (A7), hatua ambayo imeondoa kikwazo kikubwa kilichokuwa kimecheleweshaji ujenzi wa Daraja la Mtwapa lenye urefu wa mita 340 pamoja na mradi mzima wa upanuzi wa barabara hiyo kuwa njia mbili, Waziri wa Uchukuzi Davis Chirchir amesema. Akizungumza na wanahabari wakati wa ziara ya kukagua ujenzi katika

Daraja la Mtwapa, Chirchir alisema Tume ya Kitaifa ya Ardhi (NLC) inakamilisha malipo kwa wafanyabiashara na wamiliki wa mali walioathiriwa, huku Sh838 milioni zikiwa zimetolewa kwa tume hiyo kuwezesha uhamishaji wa biashara ndani ya mji wa Mtwapa. “Tumeipatia Tume ya Kitaifa ya Ardhi fedha zote zinazohitajika, na tume iko katika hatua ya kukamilisha malipo. Takriban Sh838 milioni zimetolewa leo kuhakikisha wafanyabiashara kando ya ukanda huu, hususan katika mji wa Mtwapa,

wanahamishwa,” alisema. Waziri huyo alibainisha kuwa watu waliothiriwa na mradi hupewa notisi ya siku 30 kabla ya ubomoaji wowote kufanyika, akiongeza kuwa ujenzi kupitia mji wa Mtwapa ili kufungua barabara ya njia mbili utaanza mara tu muda wa notisi utakapokamilika. Chirchir alisema sehemu ya Mtwapa-Kilifi, ambayo ni kifurushi cha pili cha mradi, imekamilika kwa kiasi kikubwa, huku takriban kilomita 7.7 za upanuzi zikiwa zimekamilishwa upande mmoja. Aliongeza kuwa maagizo ya

Rais yametoewa kupanua barabara hiyo hadi katika Eneo la Uzalishaji wa Bidhaa kwa Mauzo ya Nje (EPZ) huko Vipingo, na kwamba kazi ya usanifu kwa sehemu hiyo inaendelea. Kuhusu sehemu ya Mombasa-Mtwapa (Lot 1), inayokadiriwa kuwa na urefu wa kilomita 13 hadi darajani, Waziri alisema

changamoto za ununuzi wa ardhi zimetatuliwa, huku madaraja manne kati ya saba makuu ya makutano tayari yamejengwa na kufunguliwa kwa matumizi ya umma. Ujenzi wa madaraja matatu yaliyosalia unaendelea. “Kilichokuwa changamoto jana katika fidia ya watu waliothiriwa na mradi si

tatizo leo. Tutaona kasi ya ujenzi ikiongezeka katika ukanda mzima na magari yakitembea kama inavyopaswa,” alisema Chirchir. Ili kupunguza usumbufu kwa watumiaji wa barabara, Waziri alisema mkandarasi ameagizwa kuipa kipaumbele sehemu ya Bamburi, kuanzia kilomita sifuri hadi nne.

Shule za Sekondari Mathioya Junior zakumbatia maabara za sayansi

Shule za Umma za Junior Secondary (JSS) katika Eneo Bunge la Mathioya Constituency zimepata msukumo mkubwa katika elimu ya sayansi kupitia kuanzishwa kwa maabara za kihamishika zilizobuniwa kusaidia masomo ya vitendo chini ya mtaala wa Competency-Based Education (CBE).

Mradi wa Uthabiti wa Mifumo ya Chakula (FSRP), mpango wa miaka sita unaoanzia Januari 2024 hadi Agosti 2029, unafadhiliwa na World Bank kupitia Wizara ya Kilimo na Maendeleo ya Mifumo (MoALD).

Mradi huo unaendana na malengo mapana ya Mpango wa Uthabiti wa Mifumo ya Chakula unaozungwa mkono na Benki ya Dunia, unaotekelezwa katika kaunti 46-47 nchini Kenya kwa lengo la kuboresha kilimo na kuwasaidia wakulima wadogo kuhamia kutoka kilimo cha kujikimu hadi kilimo cha kibiashara kinachozingatia mabadiliko ya tabianchi. Mpango huo unaashiria hatua muhimu katika safari ya kaunti kuwawezesha wakulima, kuimarisha biashara za kilimo na kupanua fursa za kiuchumi kwa vijana na wanawake. Mfumo wa Kuharakisha Biashara za Wajasiriamali wa Kilimo umejengwa juu ya mtazamo wa kilimo kama biashara. Badala ya kutegemea tu mifumo ya jadi ya ugani, mfumo huu unakuza agriprenuers huru wanaofanya



Waziri wa Kilimo Dkt. Paul Rono, mwenzake wa Kazi ya Umma Joel Arumonyang na Naibu Gavana wa Pokot Magharibi Robert Komolle, wakati wa kuwazindua wafanyabiashara 140 wa kilimo katika makazi ya Gavana wa eneo hilo katika kaunti ndogo ya Kapenguria.

kazi kama biashara binafsi endelevu zinazotoa huduma kwa wakulima kwa ada au kamisheni. Kupitia muundo huu, agriprenuers wanakuwa viungo muhimu katika mfumo wa kilimo. Wanatoa huduma za ushauri na mafunzo kuhusu Mbinu Bora za Kilimo (GAP) na teknolojia zinazokabiliana na mabadiliko ya tabianchi, kuwaunganisha wakulima na

pembejeo bora kama mbegu zilizothibitishwa na mbolea, na kuwaunganisha wazalishaji na masoko ya uhakika ili kupunguza hasara baada ya mavuno. Mfumo huo pia unajumuisha suluhisho za kidijitali ikiwemo jukwaa la Know Your Farmer (KYF), linaloweza usajili wa wakulima, uchoraji wa ramani kwa GPS, ukusanyaji wa takwimu

na ufuatiliaji wa uzalishaji. Ujumuishaji huu wa kidijitali unaongeza uwazi, upangaji bora na uwezo wa kukabiliana na changamoto zinazoitabuka kama wadudu na magonjwa. Mpango huu unalenga minyororo muhimu ya thamani ya kilimo inayochangia pakubwa uchumi wa West Pokot, ikiwemo maziwa, kuku, nyama nyekundu, ufugaji wa samaki, mboga za asili, viazi, ufugaji wa nyuki na mazao yanayostahimili ukame kama mtama, dengi za kijani (green grams) na maharagwe. Kwa kuharakisha uongezaji thamani na kuboresha uzalishaji katika minyororo hii, kaunti inaweka kilimo kama kichocheo endelevu cha ukuaji wa uchumi na uthabiti. Katibu wa Uwekezaji wa Umma na Usimamizi wa Mali, Cyrell Odede Wagunda, amesisitiza upya dhamira ya Hazina Kuu ya kudu-misha na kuimarisha viwango vya juu vya utendaji chini ya mzunguko wa sasa wa Mikataba ya Utendaji (Performance Contract). Akizungumza katika mkutano wa mashauriano wa ngazi ya juu kuhusu Mapitio ya Katikati ya Mwaka wa Fedha 2025/2026 wa Hazina ya Taifa na Mipango ya Kiuchumi, uliofanyika katika Kenyatta International Convention Centre jijini Nairobi, Katibu aliwapeza idara na vitengo ndani ya Hazina ya Taifa kwa maandalizi na uwasilishaji kwa wakati wa ripoti ya nusu muhula ya Mkataba wa Utendaji ya mwaka wa fedha 2025/26. Aidha, Wagunda alisisitiza umuhimu wa kudumisha vielelezo madhubuti vya ushahidi kuunga mkono mafanikio yaliyoripotiwa, akieleza kuwa hilo ni jambo muhimu katika tathmini ya utendaji. Katika hotuba iliyowasilishwa kwa niaba yake na Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Ubia kati ya Sekta ya Umma na Binafsi (PPP) Kenya,

kutekeleza malengo ya wizara. “Usimamizi wa Utendaji na Uwasilishaji ni mbinu iliyopangiliwa ya kupanga, kufuatilia, kutathmini na kuripoti matokeo ya taasisi ili kuhakikisha utekelezaji wa malengo ya Mkataba wa Utendaji (PC),” alifanua Wagunda, akiongeza kuwa mfumo huo unatoa mwongozo ambao kupitia kwake Wizara, Idara na Mashirika ya Serikali (MDAs) hubadili vipaumbele vya kitaifa kuwa matokeo yanayopi-

mika, huku ikiimarisha uwajibikaji, uwazi na utoaji wa huduma. Alieleza kuwa msingi wa usimamizi bora wa utendaji ni uwekaji wa malengo wazi na yanayolingana, akibainisha kuwa Mikataba ya Utendaji ya Mwaka hutafarsi vipaumbele vya maendeleo ya kitaifa, maamuzi ya Baraza la Mawaziri na majukumu ya wizara kuwa malengo mahsusi, yanayopimika, yanayoweza kufikiwa, yanayohusiana na yenye muda maalum (SMART). “Malengo haya lazima yawasilishwe kwa uwazi kwa vitengo vyote vinavyotekeleza na maafisa husika ili kuhakikisha uwiano wa kitaasisi na umiliki wa pamoja wa matokeo,” alihimiza Katibu. Vilevile, Wagunda alisisitiza kuwa ufuatiliaji endelevu wa maendeleo ni muhimu katika kudumisha uzingatiji, akieleza kuwa taasisi zinapaswa kuanzisha mifumo ya ndani ya ufuatiliaji ikiwemo mapitio ya mara kwa mara ya utendaji, uthibitishaji wa takwimu na mifumo ya kufuatilia hatua muhimu za utekelezaji. Aliongeza kuwa mapitio ya ndani ya mara kwa mara—ya kila mwezi au kila robo mwaka—husaidia kubaini mapungufu mapema na kuchukua hatua za kurekebisha kabla ya tathmini za katikati ya mwaka na za kila mwaka. Kwa upande mwingine, Katibu alibainisha kuwa utoaji wa

taarifa unaozingatia ushahidi ni hitaji muhimu katika tathmini ya PC, akisisitiza kuwa mafanikio yote yanayoripotiwa lazima yaambatane na ushahidi wa kuaminika, unaoweza kuthibitishwa na uliorekodiwa ipasavyo kulingana na miongozo ya PC. “Utunzaji sahihi wa kumbukumbu, uadilifu wa takwimu na uandikaji wa matokeo, athari na viashiria vya mafanikio ni mambo ya msingi katika kudumisha viwango vya juu vya utendaji. The Children Act, 2022, gives effect to Article 53 of the Constitution that provides for the rights of each child. Every child has a right-

- to a name and nationality from birth;
- to free and compulsory basic education;
- to basic nutrition, shelter, and healthcare;
- to be protected from abuse, neglect, harmful cultural practices, all forms of violence, inhuman treatment and punishment, and hazardous or exploitative labor;
- to parental care and protection, which includes equal responsibility of the mother and father to provide for the child, whether they are married to each other or not; and
- not to be detained.

Section 12 (7) of the Children Act 2022 establishes the Child Welfare Fund to realize the right guaranteed in Article 43(3) of the Constitution with respect to all reasonable expenses incurred in a child's welfare. The State Department for Children's Services shall administer the Fund through coordination with the National Council for Children's Services

Accordingly, a Multi-Agency Taskforce composed of officers drawn from the State Department for Children Services, National Council for Children's Services, the Office of the Attorney General & Department of Justice and the National Treasury has now finalized preparing the draft Public Finance Management (Child Welfare Fund) Regulations, 2026

The draft Public Finance Management (Child Welfare Fund) Regulations, 2026, the Explanatory Memorandum, and the Regulatory Impact Statement have been prepared and posted on the National Treasury website <http://www.treasury.go.ke>.

Now, pursuant to Section 4 (a) and 5 (3) (a) and (b) of the Statutory Instruments Act, 2013, the National Treasury & Economic Planning invites members of the public to submit comments, inputs or memoranda they may have on the said draft Public Finance Management (Child Welfare Fund) Regulations, 2026 in the format provided on the website.

Wakati wa ziara hiyo, serikali hizo mbili zilisaini mikataba 12 ya pande mbili inayohusu biashara na uwekezaji, elimu, TEHAMA, masuala ya baharini, ushirikiano wa anga, makazi, utawala bora, uwezeshaji wa vijana na maendeleo endelevu. “Ninapongeza hatua iliyopigwa na wizara zetu katika kuanzisha vikundi vya kazi vya kissekta vitakavyoongoza utekezaji,” alisema Mudavadi, akiongeza kuwa mapitio ya katikati ya kipindi yamepangwa ili kutathmini maendeleo na kuboresha vipaumbele kabla ya ziara ya kiserikali inayopendekezwa ya Rais el-Sisi nchini Kenya baadaye mwaka huu. Hii haitoshi kulingana na uwezo wa Kenya na Misri. Tungependa kuongeza maradufu kiwango hiki cha biashara katika miaka ijayo,” alisema Abdelatty.

Kenya imezindua rasmi Daftari la Kitaifa la Kaboni, hatua muhimu katika kuimarisha uwazi, uwajibikaji na imani ya wawekezaji katika soko la kaboni la nchi ambalo linaendelea kukua kwa kasi. Daftari hilo lilizinduliwa katika hafla iliyoongozwa na Deborah Barasa, Katibu wa Baraza la Mawaziri anayeshughulikia Mazingira, Mabadiliko ya Tabianchi na Misitu, ambaye alisisitiza umuhimu wake katika kuimarisha nafasi ya Kenya kama mshiriki mwaminifu katika masoko ya kimataifa ya kaboni chini ya Kifungu cha 6 cha Mkataba wa Paris. “Kwa kuzinduliwa kwa Daftari la Kitaifa la Kaboni la Kenya, tunalipa uchumi wa kijani wa Kenya mapigo ya kidijitali. Kuanzia leo, Kenya si mtazamaji tena katika masoko ya kimataifa ya kaboni. Tunajitokeza kama wabunifu wa hatima yetu ya tabianchi,” alisema Dkt. Barasa. Ali Daud, Mjumbe Maalum wa Mabadiliko ya Tabianchi katika Ofisi ya Mtendaji Mkuu wa Rais, alieleza daftari hilo kama msingi muhimu wa kimkakati wa uaminifu na ukuaji ndani ya mfumo wasoko la kaboni la Kenya. “Kadri shughuli za soko la kaboni zinavyokua kwa kasi, daftari hili linakuwa nguzo kuu ya mfumo madhubuti unaofuatilia miradi, vitengo vilivyotolewa, uhamisho na marekebisho,

na kuimarisha imani kwa Kenya kama msimamizi wa soko anayeaminika,” alisema. Balozi Daud alisisitiza umuhimu wa uwiano na viwango vya kimataifa vinavyotambulika, ikiwemo Verra na Gold Standard, ili kuiweka Kenya katika nafasi ya ushindani katika soko la kaboni la dunia. Alitoa wito wa kuwepo kwa taratibu zilizo wazi, muda unaotabirika na ushirikiano endelevu na watengen-

ezaji wa miradi na wawekezaji. Katibu Mkuu wa Mazingira na Mabadiliko ya Tabianchi, Festus Ngeno, alisema Kenya imejenga mfumo mpana wa kisheria na taasisi katika kipindi cha miaka mitatu iliyo-pita ili kusaidia soko la kaboni. Hii inajumuisha marekebisho ya Sheria ya Mabadiliko ya Tabianchi, utekelezaji wa kanuni za soko la kaboni, na kuteuliwa kwa Mamlaka ya

Kitaifa ya Usimamizi wa Mazingira (NEMA) kama Mamlaka ya Kitaifa Iliyoidhinishwa. “Daftari hili ni kiini kinachofanya Sheria ya Mabadiliko ya Tabianchi na mfumo wa udhibiti kuwa hai,” alisema, akiwahimiza watengenezaji wa miradi kushirikiana kwa karibu na NEMA ili kuhakikisha uzingatiaji wa sheria na utekelezaji wenye ufanisi. Katibu wa Misitu, Gitonga Mugambi, alibainisha kuwa mfumo huo mpya unajengwa juu ya daftari la awali la sekta ya misitu la REDD+, kuhakikisha uwiano ndani ya mfumo mpana wa uhasibu wa kaboni wa Kenya. “Mfumo huu unazuia kuhesabu mara mbili, unaimarisha uwiano na Mchango wa Kitaifa Ulio-amuliwa (NDC) wa Kenya, na kuongeza uwazi katika miamala ya Kifungu cha 6 na ile ya soko la hiari la kaboni,” alisema, akiwahimiza wadau kutumia masoko ya kaboni kama fursa endelevu ya kiuchumi kwa jamii na nchi kwa ujumla. Balozi wa Umoja wa Ulaya nchini Kenya, Henriette Geiger, alieleza uzinduzi huo kama hatua muhimu si kwa Kenya pekee bali kwa bara la Afrika, akisisitiza kuwa mfumo imara ya kitaifa ni muhimu katika kujenga imani ya wawekezaji na kulinda uadilifu wa mazingira. “Daftari la kitaifa la kaboni linalofanya kazi ni msingi wa uadilifu. Linahakikisha uwazi, linazuia kuhesabu mara mbili na linaimarisha uzingatiaji wa Kifungu cha 6 cha Mkataba wa Paris,” alisema, akithibitisha uendelevu wa msaada wa Umoja wa Ulaya kwa mpito wa kijani wa Kenya. - This Project was initiated in 2017 under a Contract between NTSA and the National Bank of Kenya (NBK) and Pesa Print Consortium (Contract No. NTSA/ICB/014/2014–2015). funded solely through National Treasury budgetary allocations.

Serikali imeanza kutimiza ahadi yake ya kuwahamisha na kuwapatia makazi mapya familia zilizoathirika na mafuriko makubwa yaliyokumba vijiji vya Mai Mahiu katika Kaunti ya Nakuru tarehe 29 Aprili 2024. Chini ya mpango wa awali, ekari 230 tayari zimenunuliwa katika eneo la Longonot, Kaunti Ndogo ya Naivasha, ambako wamiliki 105 wa ardhi wa awali watahamishiwa na miundombinu muhimu itawekwa. Wakati wa tukio hilo la kusikiti-sha, zaidi ya watu 60 walipoteza maisha, huku wengine wengi wakiachwa na majeraha ya kudumu na athari za kihisia baada ya mafuriko kuharibu nyumba zao kufuatia kupasuka kwa handaki la reli lililoziba katika eneo la Upper Kijabe. Kwa mujibu wa Naibu Rais, Prof. Kithure Kindiki, Serikali pia itatafuta ardhi mbadala kuwahamisha familia 56 zilizokuwa zimepangisha nyumba zao ambazo pia ziliharibiwa na mafuriko, baada ya wasiwasi kuibuliwa kuwa zilikuwa zimeachwa nje ya mpango wa awali. “Wamiliki wote wa ardhi na wapangaji ambao nyumba na biashara zao ziliharibiwa na mafuriko watapatiwa ardhi ili kuhamia na kuanza upya maisha yao,” alisema Kindiki. Kwa upande wake, Waziri wa Ardhi, Alice Wahome, alisema hati miliki zote kwa kundi la kwanza la familia 105 zimekamilika na zitatolewa haraka. kinatarajiwa kuanza kufanya kazi kikamilifu ndani ya miezi mitano. Akizungumza na wana-jamii wakati wa ugawaji wa vifaranga, Imo aliwahimiza wakazi kutumia kituo hicho kwa uwajibikaji, ikiwemo kuleta mayai kwa ajili ya kuatamiwa kwa ghar-ama ya Sh30 kwa yai, ili kuhakikisha uendeleu na kuongeza manufaa. Soko hilo litakuwa na zaidi ya maduka 200 ya kisasa, vitengo vya kuhifadhi baridi kwa bidhaa zinazoharibika haraka, vyumba vya kunyonyesha watoto kwa akina mama, njia rafiki kwa watu wenye ulemavu, maeneo yaliyopangwa kwa makundi mbalimbali ya wafanyabiashara, vyoo vilivyovya vifaa kamili kwa wanaume na wanawake, pamoja na maji safi ya uhakika ndani ya eneo lote la kituo.
