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Afueni kwa wasambazaji serikali ikitoa Sh255b malipo ya madeni

Serikali imethibitisha malipo ya Sh255 bilioni kwa bili zilizokuwa zinasubiriwa, hatua ambayo inachukuliwa kama hatua muhimu katika kushughulikia deni la muda mrefu linalomilikiwa wasambazaji na wakandarasi. Taarifa hiyo ilitolewa na Dkt. Chris Kiptoo, Katibu Mkuu wa Hazina na Mipango ya Uchumi, wakati wa Mkutano wa Kisheria wa 2026 uliofanyika Naivasha. Malipo hayo ni sehemu ya Sh606 bilioni zilizokusanywa katika bili zinazokuwa zinasubiriwa na yanakuja baada ya mchakato mkali wa ukaguzi uliofanywa na Kamati ya Ukaguzi wa Bili Zinazokuwa Zinasubiriwa. Dkt. Kiptoo alithibitisha kuwa Sh80 bilioni katika sekta ya barabara tayari zimekwisha kulipwa, huku Sh175 bilioni zilizobaki zikitakamilishwa hatua kwa hatua katika miezi ijayo. Alihakikishia wasambazaji kuwa bili zote zilizothibitishwa zitalipwa ndani ya miaka miwili ya fedha ijayo, huku akibainisha kuwa idhini ya Baraza la Mawaziri itahitajika kwa baki.

Tatizo la bili zinazokuwa zinasubiriwa limekuwa likikumba shughuli za serikali kwa karibu miongo miwili. Kati ya Julai 1, 2005, na Juni 30, 2022, wasambazaji na wakandarasi waliripoti mara kwa mara kuhusu ucheleweshaji wa malipo, jambo lililosababisha biashara kushuka, mtiririko wa fedha

kuvurugika, na kupoteza uaminifu kwa shughuli za serikali. Kama jibu, serikali iliunda Kamati ya Ukaguzi wa Bili Zinazokuwa Zinasubiriwa ili kuchambua na kuthibitisha madai, kuhakikisha kuwa ni madeni halisi tu yanayolipwa. Dkt. Kiptoo alikiri kuwa ucheleweshaji wa malipo haya

ulikuwa hasa kutokana na mapungufu ya kifedha, huku serikali ikikabiliana na mapato yanayopungua na ukusanyaji mdogo wa kodi. Alisisitiza kuwa idhini ya Sh255 bilioni siyo tu kama hatua ya kifedha bali pia ni hatua ya kuimarisha uaminifu kati ya serikali na sekta binafsi.

Kutokana na bajeti ya Sh4.6 trilioni iliyopangwa kwa mwaka wa fedha 2026/2027, Sh1.8 trilioni—ikihesabiwa kama asilimia 48 ya mapato yaliyokusanywa—imewekwa kwa malipo ya riba ya mikopo, jambo linalopunguza kiasi kilichobaki kwa matumizi ya maendeleo. Kutokana na Sh2.8 trilioni zilizotengwa kwa bajeti za wizara, sekta ya elimu itapokea sehemu kubwa zaidi ya Sh767 bilioni, ikifuatiwa na sekta za nishati, miundombinu, na TE-HAMA kwa Sh595 bilioni, na usalama wa taifa kwa Sh300 bilioni. Dkt. Kiptoo alionya kuwa deni la umma la nchi, lililokuwa Sh12 trilioni kufikia Septemba 30, 2025, haliwezi kudumishwa na linaendelea kupunguza bajeti inayopatikana kwa miradi muhimu ya maendeleo. Ili kushughulikia changamoto hizi, Hazina inatekeleza mfululizo wa marekebisho. Hii ni pamoja na kuimarisha utawala wa kodi, kuipa kipaumbele miradi isiyo kamili, kupunguza matumizi yasiyo ya lazima,

MULTI-VENDOR, USER OWNED ELECTRONIC CARGO TRACKING SEALS

Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) has made progress in its cargo monitoring journey, transitioning from physical Customs escorts to tamper-proof Customs seals, then to multi-vendor seals, and ultimately to the Regional Electronic Cargo Tracking System (RECTS).

RECTS is a web-based cargo tracking and monitoring solution integrated with Customs management systems across the East African Community. Under this system, export and transit cargo moving through Kenya is fitted with electronic seals and monitored centrally. RECTS has significantly reduced cargo clearance times, enhanced cargo security, and improved accountability in transit operations.

To further enhance service delivery under RECTS, and in response to evolving business dynamics, technological advancements, and increased demand, KRA is aligning its cargo monitoring processes with current operational realities. In this regard, KRA wishes to notify stakeholders that it is transitioning to a Multi-Vendor, User-Owned Seals model for both dry cargo (e-seals) and wet cargo (e-fuel) electronic seals. The proposed model is intended to provide a secure, tamper-proof, and auditable cargo monitoring solution, while addressing existing challenges such as seal availability and turnaround times.

KRA therefore invites members of the public and electronic tracking seal vendors to participate in a public engagement process on this transition.

A sensitization and public engagement meeting will be held virtually on Wednesday, 4th February, 2026. Requests for the virtual meeting link, as well as enquiries, petitions, or memoranda, may be submitted via email to cmu@kra.go.ke or delivered physically, addressed to the Commissioner of Customs and Border Control, within two (2) weeks from the date of this notice.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Kenya Civil Aviation Authority (Authority) is a State Corporation mandated to plan, develop, manage, regulate, and operate a safe, secure, economically sustainable, and efficient civil aviation system in Kenya.

Pursuant to Section 57 of the Civil Aviation Act (Cap. 394) and the Civil Aviation (Aerodromes) Regulations, 2013, the public is hereby notified as follows:

1. No person shall construct, erect, or alter any building or structure within the vicinity of an aerodrome, defined as a radius of fifteen (15) kilometres from the aerodrome, without prior written authorization from the Authority.
2. Applications for authorization shall be submitted to the Authority for review and approval of the acceptable height prior to commencement of any construction. Relevant guidance is available on the KCAA website at www.kcaa.or.ke or may be obtained by writing via email: gops@kcaa.or.ke.
3. All developments, including buildings and other structures, located in the vicinity of any aerodrome shall be fitted with Class B medium-intensity aeronautical obstacle lights. Such lights shall be installed at the tip of aerial masts or at the four upper extremities of buildings, in accordance with Regulation 72 of the Civil Aviation (Aerodromes) Regulations, 2013. Further guidance is provided in Advisory Circular CAA-AC-AGA-032 on the Lighting and Marking of Obstacles, available on the KCAA website.
4. These requirements apply to developments in the vicinity of all international and domestic aerodromes. For illustration purposes, developments around Wilson Airport include, but are not limited to, the following areas within a fifteen (15) kilometre radius: Nairobi West, Madaraka, South B, South C, Nairobi Dam, Ngummo, Highview, Magiwa, Golf Course, Lang'ata Estates, Karen, Southlands, Otiende, Ngei 1 & 2, Onyonka, Masai, Uhuru Gardens, Jonathan Ngeno, Deliverance, Dam Estate, Ngong Road, Kibera, Highrise, Ongata Rongai, Kabete.
5. All owners, lessors, and lessees of affected developments are hereby given thirty (30) days' notice from the date of this publication to install the prescribed Class B medium-intensity obstacle lights. Failure to comply shall attract enforcement action by the Authority in accordance with the law.

Waziri wa Afya, Aden Duale, amewaonya kuwa Mamlaka ya Huduma za Afya ya Jamii (SHA) haitalipa madai ya kubuniwa kwa huduma ambazo Wakenya hawajakupata. Akizungumza katika jiji la Garissa wakati wa sherehe ya kuhitimu ya Madarasa Munawar, ambapo alikuwa mgeni rasmi, Duale alikanusha madai kuwa

serikali inachelewesha malipo ya bili za hospitali. Alisema SHA inafuata sheria kwa kufanya ukaguzi wa kijasusi, mapitio ya kliniki, na uthibitisho wa madai kabla ya kutoa fedha. “Tutalipa tu baada ya kufanya uchunguzi wa kina. SHA pia imelipa karibu Sh75 bilioni chini ya Mfuko wa Bima ya Afya ya Jamii (SHIF), Sh3.5 bilioni chini ya Mpango wa Huduma za Afya kwa Watumishi wa Umma, na takriban Sh1 bilioni

kwa fedha za dharura, magonjwa sugu na hatari. “Mwezi huu pekee, SHA imelipa karibu Sh6 bilioni. Sheria inaturuhusu dirisha la siku 90 kulipa baada ya ukaguzi, uthibitisho na ukaguzi wa kijasusi. Tunalipa kila tarehe 14 ya mwezi, na SHA ina fedha za kutosha kwenye akaunti zake za benki,” alisema. Tume ya Taifa ya Ardhi (NLC), chini ya Mradi wa Uboreshaji wa Makazi Yasiyo Rasmi nchini Kenya (KISIP2), inaendelea zoezi la uhakiki wa ardhi katika Kaunti ya Tana River. Bandari ya Mombasa ilipata mafanikio makubwa mwaka 2025, ikirekodi kiwango cha juu zaidi cha shughuli zake, huku ukuaji zaidi ukitarajiwa mwaka 2026, jambo linalochochea kwa kiasi kikubwa upanuzi wa uchumi. Jumla ya mizigo iliyohudumiwa katika bandari hiyo ilifikia tani milioni 45.45 mwaka 2025, ikilinganishwa na tani milioni 40.99 mwaka 2024, hali inayoonyesha mwelekeo thabiti wa ukuaji. Hii ni ongezeko kubwa la tani milioni 4.46, sawa na ukuaji wa asilimia 10.9 katika usafirishaji na upakuaji wa mizigo. Bandari hiyo imeunganishwa na eneo kubwa la bara (hinterland) linalojumuisha Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, Mashariki mwa Jamhuri ya Kidemokrasia ya Congo, Kaskazini mwa Tanzania, Sudan Kusini na Ethiopia, kupitia mfumo wa usafiri wa njia nyingi (multi-modal). Mamlaka ya bandari ilieleza kuwa utendaji mzuri kwa ujumla umetokana na mageuzi yanayoendelea yanayolenga kukuza uagizaji na usafirishaji wa bidhaa, pamoja na uboreshaji wa miundombinu, usanifishaji wa kisasa, kidijitali cha mifumo, na msaada kutoka kwa serikali ya kitaifa. Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Mamlaka ya Bandari Kenya (KPA), Kapteni William Ruto, alifichua kuwa ukuaji mkubwa pia ulirekodiwa katika shughuli za makontena, ambapo bandari ilihudumia TEUs milioni 2.11 (kontena za futi ishirini), ikilinganishwa na TEUs milioni 2.00 mwaka 2024. Hii ni ongezeko la TEUs 109,797, sawa na ukuaji wa asilimia 5.5. Kapteni Ruto alisema kuwa viwango vya uagizaji na usafirishaji wa bidhaa vilifanyika vyema kwa jumla, huku mizigo ya uagizaji ikiongezeka hadi tani milioni 36, ikilinganishwa na tani milioni 30 mwaka 2024, sawa na ukuaji wa asilimia 20.1. “Usafirishaji wa bidhaa nje ya nchi pia uliongezeka kwa kiasi cha tani milioni 5.03, kutoka tani milioni 4.96 mwaka 2024, ikiwa ni ongezeko la tani 64,000,” alisema.

RE: ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT STUDY REPORT FOR THE PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION / INSTALLATION & OPERATION OF AN OPTIC FIBER CABLE (OFC) & RELATED SERVICES ALONG ISIOLO-MANDERA ROAD

Pursuant to Section 59 of the Environmental Management and Coordination Act (CAP 387), the National Environment Management Authority (NEMA) has received an Environmental Impact Assessment Study Report for the above proposed project.

The proponent, ICT Authority, proposes to install and operate a high-speed optic fiber cable including 741.75 km backbone network (main route), 62.018 km metro networks (urban areas), and 194.517 km access network connecting a total of 341 institutions consisting of Government institutions, health facilities, schools, Technical Vocational Education and Training (TVETs) and community centres along the Isiolo-Mandera Road.

The route corridor extends in a northerly-easterly direction from Isiolo Town (Isiolo County), passing through Meru, Garissa, Wajir and Mandera Counties in North Eastern Kenya.

The following are the anticipated impacts and proposed mitigation measures:

IMPACTS	MITIGATION MEASURES
Terrestrial Habitat Alteration	- Use existing utility and transport corridors (road reserves) to avoid critical habitats. - Avoid construction activities during breeding seasons and sensitive periods. - Develop a Biodiversity Management Plan (BMP) where required. - Re-vegetate disturbed areas using native plant species.
Waste and effluent	- Use returnable glass water bottles to reduce plastic waste. - Train workers on proper waste handling/segregation. - Provide labeled hazardous/non-hazardous waste containers. - Engage only NEMA-licensed waste handlers for hazardous/oil waste. - Prohibit waste discharge into drains, natural areas, or watercourses. - Store fuels/oils in secure, banded, lined areas to prevent spills. - Ensure adequate toilet facilities to prevent open defecation.
Emissions to Air	- Conduct regular air quality monitoring. - Wet or chemically treat exposed earthworks; stabilize surfaces post-construction (e.g., vegetation/ground cover). - Regularly wet construction access routes to reduce dust and improve safety. - Minimize material drop heights where feasible. - Maintain construction equipment and generators to reduce emissions. - Provide workers with PPE (including dust masks as needed). - Inform the community of construction schedules.
Noise and Vibration	- Enforce best driving practices (drivers to avoid unnecessary acceleration/braking). - Restrict work to authorized hours (no night work; limit work near offices/schools to weekends). - Reduce noise/vibrations (soundproofing, use low-noise equipment, mufflers, enclosures). - Provide workers with PPE (including earmuffs where needed).
Sexual Exploitation and Abuse, and Sexual Harassment and Gender-Based Violence (SEA/SH/GBV)	- Maintain a lean, trained, and well-supervised workforce to minimize risks. - Enforce worker code of conduct. - Conduct pre-construction gender-sensitive subproject site mapping (to identify high-risk zones). - Include strict SEA/SH/GBV clauses in contracts (e.g. mandatory training, zero tolerance, etc.). - Engage non-state actors e.g. Caritas Isiolo, Wajir Peace, and FCDC, etc. as independent monitors for remote sites. - Train contractors/supervisors on complaint response and escalation protocols. - Publish annual SEA/SH reports (e.g. case statistics, resolution rates, etc.) for transparency. - Promote social inclusion (prioritize vulnerable and marginalized groups recruitment).
Labour and Working Conditions Including Occupational Health and Safety	- Implement fair and transparent hiring processes. - Provide contracts in local languages outlining rights, fair terms, and working conditions. - Conduct regular health and safety training and toolbox talks. - Supply and maintain PPE (e.g. gloves, masks, helmets, boots, goggles, etc.). - Enforce good housekeeping (e.g. clean worksites, safe tools, debris removal, etc.). - Ban alcohol/drug use. - Provide adequate toilets, drinking water, and first-aid kits. - Secure WIBA and Contractor All-Risks insurance. - Maintain worker grievance mechanisms.

Eneo kubwa la ardhi katika Dajo Sub-Scheme, Kijiji cha Kabonyo Kanyagwal pia limeorodheshwa kwa ukarabati na kilimo. Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa LBDA, Wyckliffe Ochiaga, alisema mpango huu, unotarajiwa kumalizika ndani ya wiki mbili, utashughulikia upungufu wa maji ambao kwa muda mrefu ume-kuwa ukikwamisha kilimo cha mpunga katika eneo hilo. "Kuchimba mifereji na kujenga mabonde ya maji kutahakikisha mtiririko wa maji unaoaminika, kuboresha mazao, na kupunguza changamoto za mafuriko ya mara kwa mara

Mbunge wa Nyando, Jared Okello, aliye-ungana na maafisa wa LBDA wakati wa uzinduzi, alimpongeza mpango huo, akibainisha kuwa kuchimba mifereji kutafungua njia zilizoziba na kuweka ardhi zaidi isiyotumika katika matumizi ya kilimo. "Hii itawawezesha wakulima kupata mazao makubwa zaidi, hatimaye kuboresha maisha yao," alisema Okello. Alibainisha kuwa South West Kano Irrigation Scheme ina zaidi ya hekta 10 za ardhi.

Uboreshaji wa miundombinu wa KISIP2 wabadilisha jumuiya zisizo rasmi kuwa makazi ya mijini yanayong'aa

Mradi wa Kenya Informal Settlements Improvement Project Awamu ya Pili (KISIP2) umeanza kubadilisha maeneo ya makazi yasiyo rasmi mijini kote nchini, ukileta heshima, usalama, na ustawi kwa jamii ambazo hapo awali zilikumbwa na hali ya kutozingatiwa. Kupitia uboreshaji wa barabara za ndani (feeder roads) na usakinishaji wa taa za mitaani, mradi huu umeleta mabadiliko dhahiri katika Lamu, Malindi, Kilifi, Kwale, Mombasa, na Voi, huku uki-chochea ukuaji wa uchumi, kuboresha afya, na kuanzisha mwelekeo wa ongezeko la thamani za mali. Kwa miongo kadhaa, wakazi wa makazi yasiyo rasmi walikabiliwa na njia zenye vumbi, zisizo sawia ambazo zilikuwa kikwazo kwa biashara na usafiri, pamoja na giza lililopunguza shughuli baada ya machweo. Leo, kutokana na KISIP2, barabara zilizoboreshwa zinawaunganisha familia na shule, vituo vya afya, na masoko, huku taa za kisasa za mitaani zikiendeleza muda wa biashara, kuongeza usalama, na kukuza maisha ya kijamii yenye nguvu. Katika Makazi Yasiyo Rasmi ya Muyeye, Malindi, mfan-yabiashara Jonathan Katana anaeleza mabadiliko haya kama ya ajabu: “Kabla, wateja waliho-fia kuja dukani kwangu jioni kwa sababu barabara zilikuwa mbovu na eneo lilikuwa giza. Sasa, kwa barabara laini na taa za mwanga mkali, biashara imenongezeka. Mauzo yangu yamepindishwa mara mbili, na sasa naweza hata kuajiri vijana wawili kusaidia,”



alieleza. Katika Makazi ya Kombani, Kwale, mfanyabiashara wa ku-oshia magari, Salim Ramadhan, ameona hali yake kubadilika: “Barabara zilizoboreshwa zina-maanisha magari zaidi yanapita hapa, na taa za mitaani zina-niwezesha kufanya kazi hadi usiku. Napata kipato zaidi, na sihofia usalama. Biashara yangu sasa ni thabiti,” alisema. Mfanyabiashara mwenzake Abdalla Ali kutoka Kombani alikubaliana, akibainisha kuwa

maboresho yameongeza thamani za mali: “Viwanja vilivyokuwa havitiwi sasa vina mahitaji. Wafadhili wanaingia kwa sababu wanaona eneo ni salama na linaweza kufikika. Bei za ardhi zimeongezeka, na hilo ni nzuri kwa wote,” alisema. Katika eneo la Maweni, Likoni, mfanyabiashara Mwanaisha Suleiman alibainisha faida za kiafya za mradi: “Kwa barabara safi na zilizob-oreshwa, magonjwa yanayohu-

siana na vumbi kama kikohozi na pumu yamepungua. Watoto wanaweza kwenda shule kwa usalama, na familia zinahisi kuwa na afya bora. Taa pia zinatwezesha kuchukua maji au kwenda kliniki usiku bila hofu,” alisema. Katika Kisumu Ndogo Settlement Scheme, Nyali, Mwenyekiti Clement Wasike alieleza kuwa mabadiliko haya ni hatua muhimu kwa jamii: “Tulikuwa tukisahaulika, lakini sasa wafadhili wanaingia. Maduka yanafunguliwa, kodi za nyumba zinaongezeka, na familia zinajivunia kuishi hapa. Taa za mitaani zimepunguza uhalifu, na watu wanahisi salama kutembea nyumbani hata usiku wa manane,” alisema. Wasike alibainisha kuwa athari

za KISIP2 zinaonekana katika makazi haya kwani muda mrefu wa biashara umewau-zia nafasi za ajira, hasa kwa vijana: “Barabara zilizoboreshwa zimeongeza biashara za eneo hilo, huku taa zikiimarisha mshikamano wa kijamii kwa kuwezesha mikutano ya jioni, sherehe za kitamaduni, na shughuli za kijamii,” alisema. Kenya, EU zaafikiana kuimarisha usalama wa mtandao

Kenya imeshirikiana na Jumuiya ya Ulaya (EU) kuzindua Mradi wa Uhimilivu wa Mtandao wa Kenya (Kenya Cyber Resilience – KCR), mpango unao-lenga kuimarisha mfumo wa usalama wa mtandao nchini. Mradi huo unalenga kuimarisha ulinzi dhidi ya vitisho vina-vyoendelea kubadilika katika ulimwengu wa kidijitali, ili kuhakikisha wananchi, taasisi za umma na biashara zinaweza kufanya kazi katika mazingira ya mtandaoni yaliyo salama na yenye kuaminika. Kwa kuimarisha uimara katika mandhari ya kidijitali ya Kenya, Mradi wa KCR unaonesha dhamira ya nchi kulinda kasi ya mageuzi yake ya kiteknolojia. Mpango huu umebuniwa kuimarisha utawala, kuboresha uratibu wa taasisi, na kuongeza uelewa wa umma kuhusu usafi wa mtandao (cyber hygiene), hatua itakayoweka msingi wa anga la mtandao lililo salama, shirikishi na lenye kutegemewa. Mradi huo wa miaka mitatu, unaofadhiliwa na EU kwa euro milioni 3 (EUR 3 million), unalenga kushughulikia mapengo muhimu katika utawala, uwezo wa utekelezaji, na uhamasishaji wa umma kuhusu usalama wa mtandao. Unatekelezwa wakati

ambapo mabadiliko ya haraka ya kidijitali nchini Kenya—ikiwemo kupanuka kwa huduma za kielektroniki, malipo ya simu na majukwaa ya mtandaoni—yameongeza pia hatari ya mashambulizi ya mtandao. Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi wa ngazi ya juu na kikao cha kwanza cha Kamati ya Uongozi (Steering Committee) jijini Nairobi, Katibu Mkuu wa Utangazaji na Mawasiliano, Stephen Isaboke, alisema kuwa uhimilivu wa mtandao sasa ni kipaumbele cha kitaifa. Alitaja uongozi wa Kenya kimataifa katika ubunifu wa kidijitali, akirejelea mafanikio kama pesa za simu, ujanibishaji wa zaidi ya huduma 20,000 za serikali, na ukuaji wa Silicon Savannah huko Konza. “Uhimilivu wa mtandao si tuzo la teknolojia pekee—ni kipaumbele cha kitaifa. Ni sharti la ukuaji wa uchumi wetu na mlinzi wa maadili yetu ya kidemokrasia,” alisema Isaboke, akisisitiza kuwa anga la mtandao halina mipaka na uimara lazima ujengwe kwa ushirikiano. ngeza kuwa mradi huo utaboresha sera ya kitaifa ya usalama wa mtandao, kuunga mkono ulinzi wa Miundombinu Muhimu ya Taarifa (Critical Information Infrastructure), na kuwezesha kuanzishwa kwa Wakala wa Kitaifa wa Usalama wa Mtandao ili kutoa uongozi wa kimbakati wakati wa matukio

na migogoro ya mtandao.

Katibu wa ICT na Uchumi wa Kidijitali, Mhandisi John Tanui, alithibitisha kuwa usalama wa mtandao sasa ni msingi wa ukuaji wa uchumi wa Kenya, imani ya umma na uthabiti wa taifa. Alibainisha kuwa huduma za umma za kidijitali, mifumo ya kifedha na mitandao ya mawasiliano ni sehemu ya miundombinu muhimu ya nchi, hivyo kuwepo kwa mifumo iliyosanifiwa na iliyoratibiwa ni jambo la lazima. Tanui alieleza kuwa mradi huo

unaendana na Mkakati wa Kitaifa wa Usalama wa Mtandao na Mpango Mkuu wa Kidijitali, na uliundwa kupitia mashauriano mapana ya wadau ili kukidhi mahitaji ya taasisi. Aliongeza kuwa kampeni za kitaifa za uhamasishaji kuhusu usafi wa mtandao zitatekelezwa, zikiwalenga hasa wanawake, vijana na watumiaji wa huduma za umma za kidijitali, zikisaidiwa na jukwaa la mtandaoni lenye mafunzo, ithabiti na zana za uhamasishaji. Akimwakilisha Ujumbe wa EU nchini Kenya, Mkuu wa Ush-

irikiano, Jorge Pereiro, alithibitisha dhamira ya muda mrefu ya EU kuunga mkono mabadiliko ya kidijitali ya Kenya kwa njia salama na shirikishi. “Usalama wa mtandao ndio msingi wa imani katika uchumi wa kidijitali na utoaji wa huduma za umma. Kwa kupanuka kwa haraka kwa huduma za serikali mtandaoni, malipo ya kidijitali na majukwaa ya mtandaoni nchini Kenya, uimara thabiti wa mtandao ni muhimu kulinda miundombinu muhimu ya taarifa, kudumisha mwendelezo wa huduma, na kulinda haki za raia,” alisema Pereiro. Mradi wa KCR unatekelezwa na Expertise France, kwa ushirikiano na Kituo cha Maendeleo ya Kimataifa cha Estonia (ESTDEV), na kwa uratibu wa karibu na mamlaka za Kenya ili kuhakikisha umiliki wa kitaifa na uendelevu. Mradi huo umejengwa juu ya nguzo tatu kuu zinazolenga kuimarisha mifumo ya kishe-ria, kikanuni na taasisi katika usalama wa mtandao.

Vyoo vilivyoboreshwa vyaleta afya na utu kwa familia kijiji cha Malindi

Katika makazi ya Muyeye, Malindi, vyoo vilikuwa anasambwa ambayo wachache tu wangeweza kuifikiria. Kwa miongo kadhaa, familia ziliishi katika hali ya kudhalilishwa ya kujisaidia waziwazi, zikilazimika kutembea hadi msituni karibu na Shule ya Sekondari ya Malindi kujisitiri. Ilikuwa ni changamoto ya kila siku iliyowanyima afya, heshima na amani ya akili. Leo, kutokana na Mradi wa Kenya Informal Settlements Improvement Project Awamu ya Pili (KISIP 2), unaofadhiliwa na Benki ya Dunia kupitia Benki ya Maendeleo ya Afrika (AfDB) na kutekelezwa na Idara ya Serikali ya Makazi,

huduma za kisasa za usafi wa mazingira zimeanza kuandika upya simulizi ya wakazi hawa. Kwa Sidi Kadenge, mama wa watoto saba mwenye umri wa miaka 50, ukosefu wa vyoo haukuwa tu usumbufu—ulikuwa janga. Mmoja wa watoto wake alikuwa na ulemavu (ingawa alifariki mwaka 2025), na kumhudumia katika mazingira hayo kulikuwa jambo la kusikitisha sana. “Hakukuwa na chaguo jingine ila kwenda msituni,” anakumbuka. “Haikuwa salama, na mtoto wangu ndiye aliyeteseka zaidi. Kila mwezi nilitumia Sh5,000 kununua dawa za magonjwa yatokanayo na maji machafu ambayo yangeweza kuzuilika.” Mzigo wa kifedha ulikuwa mzito mno. Badala ya kuwekeza katika chakula, ada za shule au biashara ndogo ndogo, fedha zake zilime-



zwa na gharama za matibabu. Lakini leo, baada ya kujengwa kwa vyoo vya kisasa chini ya KISIP 2, maisha yake yamebadilika kwa kiasi kikubwa. “Sasa natumia chini ya Sh150 kwa dawa,” anasema kwa unfuu. “Watoto wangu wana afya

bora, na hatimaye ninaweza kupumua. Najihisi kana kwamba mzigo mkubwa umeondolewa mabegani mwangu.” Sidi anasema vyoo hivyo si miundombinu tu—ni njia ya kuokoa maisha, vinavyoipa fa-

milia yake nafasi ya kustawi. Stella Kadzo, mwanamke kipofu mwenye umri wa miaka 49, anasema mateso hayo yalikuwa ya binafsi sana. Kila alipohitaji kujisitiri, ilimbidi kumuomba mtu amwongoze hadi msituni. Aibu ya kutegemea wengine, pamoja na hatari ya kukanyaga kinyesi kili-chokuwa kimetapakaa katika eneo la makazi, ilikuwa sehemu ya maisha yake ya kila siku. “Nilikuwa nikijihisi nimefedheshwa sana,” Stella anasema kwa sauti ya chini. “Wakati mwingine nilikuwa nakan-yaga kinyesi nikitembea. Ilikuwa ni hali ya kudhalilisha.” Leo, Stella ana choo cha kisasa ndani ya boma lake. Mabadiliko hayo ni makubwa. “Sihitaji tena kumuomba mtu anishike mkono kwa safari ile ndefu,” anasema kwa fahari. “Sasa ninaishi maisha yenye heshima. Najihisi kuthaminiwa.” Furaha yake inaonekana wazi. Kwa Stella, choo si tu huduma—ni uhuru, kujitegemea, na kurejeshewa hadhi ya kibinadamu.

Wakulima 15,000 wapata mafunzo kuhusu maharagwe yenye mavuno

Shirika la Utafiti wa Kilimo na Mifugo nchini Kenya (KALRO) linashirikiana na Kituo cha Kimataifa cha Kilimo cha Kitropiki (CIAT) kuwafunza zaidi ya wakulima 15,000 kuhusu mbinu bora za kilimo cha aina ya maharagwe ya Nyota. Mpango huu unalenga kuongeza uzalishaji, kukua kilimo kinachozingatia mabadiliko ya tabianchi, na kuwasaidia wakulima kukabiliana na athari za mabadiliko ya hali ya hewa. Mpango huo unaongwa mkono na Muungano wa Utafiti wa Maharagwe Afrika (PABRA) unawalenga wakulima kutoka Kaunti Ndogo za Njoro, Subukia, Rongai, Bahati na Gilgil. Unazingatia kuwapa wakulima mafunzo ya uzalishaji wa maharagwe ya Nyota yenye mavuno mengi na yanayostahimili magonjwa, usimamizi wa mazao baada ya kuvuna, uunganishaji na masoko pamoja na viwango vya mauzo ya nje. Bw. Justin Mabeya Machini, Mtafiti Mkuu Mshiriki katika Alliance for Biodiversity-CIAT, alisema kuwa mabadiliko ya tabianchi yamesababisha kuongezeka kwa wadudu na magonjwa ambayo hapo awali hayakuwa ya kawaida, hali iliyopunguza mavuno ya maharagwe na mapato ya wakulima.



Afisa Mkuu wa Kilimo wa Kaunti, Mhandisi Margaret Kinyanjui, anatangaza rasmi tani tisa za maharagwe zinazozalishwa na Ushirikiano Women Group katika Kituo cha Kiambogo katika Kaunti Ndogo ya Gilgil.

“Mpango huu unahakikisha wakulima hawaongezi tu uzalishaji bali pia wanapata masoko yenye faida. Tunahimiza ukusanyaji wa mazao kupitia vyama vya ushirika ili kuongeza uwezo wa kujadiliana bei na kupata mauzo ya jumla kwa wasindikaji na wanunuzi,” alisema Machini. Alieleza kuwa KALRO inaangalia uwezekano wa kuanzisha mnyororo wa thamani wa maharagwe, ambapo wakulima watawauzia wasindikaji wanaobadilisha maharagwe kuwa bidhaa zinazotumika moja kwa moja kama unga wa maharagwe na tambu, hivyo kuongeza thamani na kupa

puka unyonyaji wa madalali. Mafunzo hayo pia yana-jumuisha kuwafahamisha wakulima kuhusu viwango vya lazima vya masoko ya ndani, kikanda na ya Umoja wa Ulaya (EU). Machini alisema hili ni muhimu ili wakulima waweze kunufaika na masoko ya kimataifa. Alizungumza katika Kituo cha Kiambogo, Kaunti Ndogo ya Gilgil, wakati wa hafla ya kuzindua rasmi usafirishaji wa tani tisa za maharagwe yaliyolimwa na Kikundi cha Wanawake cha Ushirikiano, chama cha ushirika chenye zaidi ya wanawake 100 wanaojishughulisha na biashara ya kilimo. Kikundi

hicho kimeunganishwa moja kwa moja na wanunuzi, kuhakikisha ongezeko la thamani na bei ya haki. Kwa mujibu wa Machini, matumizi ya aina ya maharagwe ya Nyota ni muhimu katika kuongeza mavuno na ubora. Maharagwe haya ya rangi nyekundu yaliyochanganyika hukomaa ndani ya siku 60 hadi 70, yanastahimili ukame na magonjwa, na hutoa magunia 6 hadi 10 ya kilo 90 kwa ekari. Hupikwa ndani ya dakika 15 hadi 27, ikilinganishwa na hadi saa tatu kwa aina za jadi, na yana virutubisho vingi.

Kazi yaanza kwenye uwanja wa kisasa wenye viti 10,000 mjini Kabarnet

Wapenzi na wadau wa michezo kutoka Kaunti ya Baringo wana sababu ya kutabasamu baada ya serikali ya kitaifa kuanza ujenzi wa uwanja wa michezo wa Kabarnet wenye uwezo wa kuchukua watazamaji 10,000. Kwa muda mrefu, wanariadha kutoka kaunti hiyo wamekuwa wakitegemea viwanja vilivyoko katika kaunti jirani za Elgeyo Marakwet na Uasin Gishu, huku wachezaji wa soka wakikosa viwanja vya viwango vinavyohitajika kwa mashindano. Akizungumza wakati wa hafla ya kuweka jiwe la msingi katika viwanja vya ASK tawi la Baringo mjini Kabarnet, Katibu Mkuu wa Ulinzi, Dkt. Patrick Mariru, alisema kuwa ujenzi wa uwanja huo wa kisasa wa matumizi mbalimbali unaoagharimu Shilingi milioni 900 utakamilika ndani ya kipindi cha miezi tisa. Dkt. Mariru alibainisha kuwa uwanja huo utajengwa na kampuni ya China Roads and Bridges Corporation (CRBC) chini ya usimamizi wa jeshi, na kwa ushirikiano na

wizara ya michezo pamoja na serikali ya Kaunti ya Baringo, ili kuhakikisha mradi unakamilika kwa wakati na kwa viwango vinavyotakiwa. “Ningependa kuwahakikishia wakazi wa mji wa Kabarnet na maeneo ya jirani kwamba uwanja huu utakuwa na uwezo wa kuchukua watazamaji 10,000 na utatumika kwa michezo mbalimbali kama soka, raga na riadha, na utakamilika ndani ya muda uliokubaliwa,” alisema. Katibu huyo, aliyeandamana na mwenzake wa Michezo Elijah Mwangi pamoja na viongozi wengine, aliwahimiza wakazi wa eneo hilo kujiandaa kunufaika na fursa zitakazotokana na ujenzi wa kituo hicho cha kisasa cha michezo ambacho pia kitakuwa na huduma mbalimbali za kibiashara. Kwa upande wake, Katibu Mkuu wa Michezo Mwangi, aliunga mkono kauli ya mwenzake wa Ulinzi akisema kuwa ujenzi wa uwanja huo ulitekelezwa kufuatia agizo la Rais Dkt. William Ruto mwaka jana, baada ya maombi ya muda mrefu kutoka kwa viongozi wa eneo hilo.

Serikali yahimiza ushirikiano kati ya vyuo na viwanda

Serikali imeimarisha juhudi zake za kuhimiza ushirikiano wa karibu kati ya vyuo vikuu na sekta ya viwanda ili kuhakikisha wahitimu wanakuwa na ujuzi unaohitajika na unaoendana na mahitaji ya soko la ajira, huku Chuo Kikuu cha Kenyatta (KU) kikizindua Wiki ya 19 ya Kila Mwaka ya Ajira (Career Week). Akizungumza wakati wa hafla ya ufunguzi iliyo-fanyika katika kampasi kuu ya chuo hicho, Katibu Mkuu wa Viwanda, Dkt.

Juma Mukhwana, alisema kuwa kuimarishwa kwa uhusiano kati ya vyuo vikuu na viwanda ni muhimu katika kulinganisha mafunzo ya kitaaluma na uhalisia wa soko la ajira pamoja na ajenda ya taifa ya kuendeleza viwanda. Dkt. Wakfu wa M-Pesa watoa Sh30m kuboresha Shule ya Kakamega High

Safaricom M-PESA Foundation imetoa Shilingi milioni 30 kwa ajili ya kuboresha miundombinu katika Shule ya Lumakanda Township Comprehensive, iliyopo Kaunti Ndogo ya Lugari, Kaunti ya Kakamega. Mradi huo, ambao ni sehemu ya juhudi za mfuko huo kusaidia shule kote nchini kuboresha miundombinu, unatarajiwa kupunguza msongamano unaosababishwa na upungufu wa vifaa katika shule hiyo ambayo ndiyo yenye idadi kubwa zaidi ya wanafunzi eneo la Lugari. Kulingana na Mwalimu Mkuu wa shule hiyo, Paul Simiyu, mradi huo unahusisha ujenzi wa madarasa ya kisasa, maabara na vitalu kadhaa vya vyoo. Alisema: “Chini ya ufadhili huu wa mamilioni ya shilingi, Foundation inajenga na kupipa samani

madarasa mapya manane. “Pia inajenga maabara mbili; maabara ya sayansi itakayokuwa na vifaa kamili, na maabara ya kompyuta itakayowahudumia wanafunzi wetu, wale wa shule jirani pamoja na jamii inayotuzunguka. “Zaidi ya hayo, Foundation pia inajenga vitalu viwili vya vyoo kwa ajili ya shule ya msingi ya chini (junior school) na kitalu kimoja cha vyoo kwa walimu.” Simiyu, ambaye alikuwa akizungumza wakati wa ziara ya timu kutoka ofisi ya Mshauri wa Rais kuhusu Haki za Wanawake, Harriet Chigai, alisema kuwa ujenzi wa madarasa, vitalu vya vyoo na maabara hizo mbili uko katika hatua za mwisho za kukamilika. Aliongeza kuwa kilichosalia katika mpango wa maboresho ni jengo la utawala, lango la shule na kituo cha taarifa, ambavyo mkandarasi anatarajiwa kuanza kuvijenga hivi karibuni.
