Serikali imeongeza kasi ya kampeni yake ya kitaifa ya kukuza miti kwa kupeleka maafisa wa National Youth Service (NYS) katika vituo vya misitu kote nchini, katika juhudi mpya za

kufikia lengo la Kenya la kupanda miti bilioni moja mwaka huu kama sehemu ya mpango mpana wa kupanda miti bilioni 15. Wakati wa ziara ya ukaguzi katika Kituo cha Misitu cha Ngong Hills, Waziri wa Mazingira, Mabadiliko ya Tabianchi na Misitu, Dkt. Deborah Barasa, alisisitiza haja ya

kuongeza uzalishaji wa miche ya miti ili kuunga mkono lengo hilo la kitaifa. Alieleza kuwa shughuli za vitalu vya miche ni msingi wa kampeni hiyo, zikihusisha moja kwa moja upandaji miti na ustahimilivu dhidi ya mabadiliko ya tabianchi, ukuaji wa uchumi wa kijani na urejeshaji wa mazingira.

“Tukiwa tunarejesha mifumo ya ikolojia na kupanda miti, tunalenga ustahimilivu wa tabianchi, uchumi wa kijani na urejeshaji wa mazingira, pamoja na kuunda ajira za kijani. Kwa sasa nchini Kenya tuna zaidi ya miche milioni 363. Tunawahimiza Wakenya waende wakapande miti,” alisema Dkt. Barasa.

Waziri huyo alibainisha kuwa ingawa uvunaji wa mbegu umeimarika, uwezo wa kuzalisha miche bado ni changamoto kubwa; ili kuziba pengo hilo, Wizara inashirikiana na NYS kutoa nguvu kazi na msaada wa vifaa. “Ili tufikie lengo la miche bilioni moja nchini, tunahitaji rasilimali watu, nafasi, mifuko ya kupandia, mbegu na maji. Ndiyo sababu tunafanya kazi na NYS,” alieleza. Kituo cha Misitu cha Ngong Hills tayari kimeongeza lengo lake la uzalishaji kutoka miche milioni 1.3 hadi milioni mbili, ambapo asilimia 70 ni miti ya asili inayolengwa kwa ajili ya kurejesha misitu. Kituo hicho, kilicho katika eneo la ekari tano na chenye kisima cha maji, kimeteuliwa kuwa kituo cha

mfano kwa maeneo mengine. Mhifadhi wa Misitu wa Kanda, Joyce Nduku, alithibitisha kuwa maandalizi kama hayo yanaendelea katika vituo vya misitu vya Karura, Ngong Road, Loitoktok na Namanga, vyote chini ya Hifadhi ya Nairobi. “Tovuti hii ilichaguliwa kama mfano kwa sababu ina vifaa vingi vinavyohitajika. Kadri uwekaji wa miche kwenye mifuko unavyoendelea, mbegu kutoka KEFRI zinaendelea kusambazwa ili kufikia wakati idadi inayohitajika itakapofikiwa, uotaji uwe tayari umeanza,” alisema. Katika Ngong Hills, jumla ya wafanyakazi 29 wa NYS wanashiriki katika uwekaji wa miche kwenye mifuko na usimamizi wa vitalu. Naibu Msimamizi Hassan Mohammed, anayesimamia kikosi hicho, alieleza faida mbili za mpango huo: kusaidia malengo ya kitaifa ya uhifadhi wa mazingira na kuwapa vijana ujuzi wa vitendo. “Tunamshukuru Rais kwa kutupa fursa ya kufanya kazi

Ikiwa hawataajiriwa na serikali, wanaweza kupata kazi kwingine,” alisema, aki-bainisha kuwa timu hiyo inaweza kuweka hadi miche 10,000 kwenye mifuko kwa siku endapo hali ya hewa itakuwa nzuri. Patrick Mutie, mwanachama wa NYS kutoka Kaunti ya Kitui, alisema mpango huo unawapa vijana fursa ya kupata ajira na kukuza taaluma. “Unatupa nafasi ya kupata kazi na kupandishwa vyeo,” alisema. Dkt. Barasa alihakikishia kuwa wadau wanahusishwa katika juhudi za kuzalisha miche na kufanua kuwa miundombinu ya muda iliyojengwa katika vituo vya misitu inatumika tu kwa shughuli za vitalu vya miche. Aliripoti kuwa mifumo ya ufuatiliaji inaonyesha kiwango cha uhai cha asilimia 80 kwa miche iliopandwa, huku picha za setilaiti zikirekodi uotaji wa asili wa hadi miche milioni 300 katika kipindi cha miaka mitatu iliyopita. Mvua za masika zinapokaribia, Wizara inawahimiza wananchi kupanda angalau miche 10 kila mwezi. Kila mche unauzwa kwa takriban Sh15, jambo linalofanya lengo hilo kufikiwa kwa urahisi na familia kote nchini. “Tunaamini kuwa ikiwa kila kituo cha msitu kitafikia lengo lake na Wakenya watashiriki kikamilifu, tutafikia lengo letu la bilioni moja mwaka huu,” alisisitiza.

Kenya kuongoza mpango wa Ajira kwa Vijana barani Afrika



Waziri wa Masuala ya Vijana, Uchumi Bunifu na Michezo, Salim Mvurya, akihutubia wajumbe wakati wa Mkutano wa Kubadilishana Maarifa kwa Jumuiya ya Ajira kwa Vijana barani Afrika (JfYA) jijini Nairobi.

Kenya imechukua uenyekiti wa Jumuiya ya Utendaji ya Ajira kwa Vijana Barani Afrika (Jobs for Youth in Africa - JfYA) kutoka Rwanda, hatua inayotarajiwa kuimarisha nafasi ya nchi katika kuendeleza ajira kwa vijana na ujumuishaji wa kiuchumi kote barani. Waziri wa Masuala ya Vijana, Uchumi wa Ubunifu na Michezo, Salim Mvurya, alipokea jukumu hilo wakati wa Mkutano wa Kubadilishana Maarifa wa Ajira kwa Vijana

Barani Afrika uliofanyika Nairobi. Mkutano huo uliwakutanisha serikali za Afrika, washirika wa maendeleo, viongozi wa sekta binafsi na wawakilishi wa vijana kujadili mikakati ya vitendo ya kukabiliana na ukosefu wa ajira kwa vijana. “Kwa niaba ya Serikali ya Kenya, ninaheshimiwa sana kukubali rasmi uenyekiti wa Jumuiya ya Utendaji ya Ajira kwa Vijana Barani Afrika. Kenya inachukua jukumu hili kwa unyenyekevu, uwazi wa malengo na kujitolea bila kuyumba. Tunaahidi kuelekeza juhudi zetu katika utekelezaji, uwajibikaji na

matokeo,” alisema Waziri huyo. Jumuiya hiyo ya Utendaji (CoP), inayoungwa mkono na Benki ya Dunia pamoja na washirika wengine wa maendeleo, inatoa jukwaa kwa nchi wanachama 20 za Afrika kubadilishana maarifa, kukuza ujifunzaji wa pamoja na kupanua suluhisho zinazotegemea ushahidi ili kukabiliana na ukosefu au upungufu wa ajira kwa vijana. Mvurya alisisitiza changamoto ya idadi ya watu barani Afrika, akibainisha kuwa zaidi ya asilimia 60 ya wakazi wa bara hilo wana umri wa chini ya miaka 25, huku pengo la ajira kwa vijana likizidi nafasi milioni 10 kila mwaka. “Ukweli huu wa demografia unaleta fursa kubwa lakini pia wajibu mkubwa kwa serikali za Afrika kuunda njia za ajira zenye heshima, hadhi na endelevu kwa vijana,” alisema. Waziri huyo aliongeza kuwa uwekezaji kwa vijana ni msingi muhimu wa ukuaji na uthabiti wa uchumi. “Kuwekeza kwa vijana wa Afrika si mpango wa kijamii tu; ni msingi wa ukuaji wa uchumi, uthabiti na mshikamano katika bara letu. Tunapowawezesha vijana kwa ujuzi, msaada wa ujasiriamali na upatikanaji wa masoko, tunabadilisha faida ya idadi kubwa ya vijana kuwa mtaji

wenye tija,” aliongeza Mvurya. Kwa mujibu wa serikali, uzoefu wa Kenya unatoa mfano wa vitendo wa kupanua suluhisho za ajira kwa vijana kote barani. Programu za kitaifa kama NYOTA, Ajenda ya Ajira za Kidijitali (Kazi Mtandaoni), Nyumba Nafuu na Climate X zimewapa maelfu ya vijana ujuzi na kuwaunganisha na fursa za kazi mtandaoni, huduma za uendeshaji biashara (BPO) na ujasiriamali wa kidijitali. Mipango hiyo imechangia kuundwa kwa takribani ajira milioni 1.8 kupitia upanuzi wa sekta ya umma na programu kuu za serikali. Kama mwenyekiti, Kenya imeahidi kuimarisha ujifunzaji kati ya nchi wanachama, kukuza uwazi na kuhakikisha mbinu zinazotegemea takwimu zinaongoza sera na utekelezaji katika mataifa wanachama. Mvurya alisisitiza kuwa jukwaa hilo linapaswa kwenda zaidi ya mazungumzo na kutoa matokeo yanayopimika kwa vijana. Mkutano huo ulihudhuriwa na Makamu wa Rais wa Kanda wa Benki ya Dunia kwa Afrika Mashariki na Kusini, Ndiame Diop, Katibu wa Masuala ya Vijana na Uchumi wa Ubunifu Fikirini Jacobs, wawakilishi kutoka nchi wanachama, viongozi wa sekta binafsi na wajumbe wa vijana.

Serikali imetenga Shilingi bilioni 3.2 kuunganisha takribani familia 33,000 katika Kaunti ya Nakuru na umeme katika mwaka huu wa kifedha kupitia Mpango wa Last Mile Connectivity, unaolenga kupanua upatikanaji wa umeme vijijini. Akizungumza katika Shule ya St Joseph Comprehensive katika Wadi ya Elburgon, Waziri wa Nishati Opiyo Wandayi alisema miradi hiyo itatekelezwa na Shirika la Umeme Vijijini na Nishati Mbadala (REREC) pamoja na Kampuni ya Kenya Power and Lighting Company (KPLC) kama sehemu ya mpango wa serikali wa kufikia upatikanaji wa umeme kwa wote, ambao ni nguzo muhimu ya ajenda ya maendeleo ya serikali. “Rais William Ruto ndiye Rais wa kwanza katika historia ya Jamhuri ya Kenya kufanya umeme kuwa haki kwa kila mwananchi, akitambua nishati kama huduma ya umma inayopaswa kupatikana kwa



Waziri wa Kawi, Opiyo Wandayi, ajumuika na Gavana wa Kaunti ya Nakuru, Susan Kihika, na Mbunge wa Molo, Kuria Kimani katika Shule ya Msingi ya St. Joseph mjini Elburgon kuzindua Mpango wa Kuunganisha Miili ya Mwisho katika Eneo Bunge la Molo.

“Kama serikali, tumejitititi kuhakikisha kila kaya, biashara na taasisi za umma zinaunganishwa na gridi ya taifa. Hii itafungua fursa za uwekezaji katika maeneo ya vijijini na maeneo yaliyotengwa hivyo kutumia ipasavyo uwezo mkubwa uliopo,” aliongeza. Waziri huyo alisisitiza umuhimu wa awamu hii ya mradi kwa zaidi ya kaya 33,000 katika Kaunti ya Nakuru, akisema kuwa

utawezesha jamii kunu-faika kikamilifu na gridi ya taifa, hatua itakayochochea ukuaji wa uchumi na maendeleo ya kijamii. Wandayi pia aliwaonya wanaopinga miradi ya maendeleo kumpa Rais William Ruto muda wa kutekeleza ajenda yake ya maendeleo, huku akiwataka waepuke siasa za mgawanyiko na matamshi yasiyo na msingi. “Tunapaswa kuepuka siasa katika masuala ya maendeleo. Rais anaendelea kujitolea kikamilifu



kuhakikisha hakuna eneo linaloachwa nyuma katika maendeleo. Nawa-himiza walio upinzani wasiwapotoshe Wakenya kwa kauli mbiu zisizo na maana,” alisema Wandayi. Kauli hiyo iliungwa mkono na Mbunge wa Molo Kuria Kimani, aliyempongeza Rais kwa kusambaza maendeleo kwa usawa.

Wataalamu wa teknolojia ya dawa wametangaza kuwepo kwa mgogoro wa udhibiti katika sekta ya dawa wakionya kuwa maduka ya dawa haramu sasa yanazidi maduka ya dawa yaliyoidhinishwa kwa uwiano wa nne kwa moja, hali inayowaweka mamiloni ya wananchi katika hatari ya kupewa dawa za kuandikiwa bila usalama wala uwajibikaji. Katibu Mkuu wa Chama cha Wataalamu wa Teknolojia ya Dawa nchini (Kenya Pharmaceutical Association - KPA), Eric Gichane, aliwashutumu mamlaka kwa kuruhusu pengo kubwa la utekelezaji wa sheria ambalo limehalalisha uuzaji wa kiholela wa antibiotiki na dawa nyingine zenye nguvu bila maagizo ya daktari. "Tuna mgogoro wa udhibiti unaojitokeza waziwazi kwa sasa. Mgogoro halisi si tukio moja lililonaswa kwenye kamera. Mgogoro halisi ni mfumo unaoruhusu utoaji usio salama wa dawa kuwa jambo la kawaida," alisema. Alisema Kenya ina takribani wafamasia 5,000 na wataalamu wa teknolojia ya dawa 14,000 waliosajiliwa - jumla ya wataalamu 19,000 waliofungwa kuhudumia zaidi ya watu milioni 53. Hata hivyo, maduka ya dawa yasiyosajiliwa yanaendelea kuongezeka katika miji

na mitaa ya makazi, mara nyingi yakiendeshwa na wahudumu wasio na sifa wanaotoa dawa zinazohitaji maagizo ya daktari bila uchunguzi au kumbukumbu sahihi. "Tunakadiria kuwa kwa kila duka moja la dawa lililosajiliwa, kuna manne haramu yanayofanya kazi kila siku bila uwajibikaji wowote. Hili si eneo la utata; ni hatari," alisema. Kauli zake zinakuja wakati sekta ya famasia ikianjaliwa kwa karibu zaidi kufuatia kukiri kwa Katibu Mkuu wa Afya ya Umma na Viwango vya Kitaaluma, Mary Muthoni, kwamba aliuza antibiotiki bila kuombwa maagizo ya daktari, pamoja na video iliyosambaa mtandaoni ikionyesha kosa katika utoaji wa dawa kwa mtoto. Akizungumza na wanahabari mjini Kisumu wakati wa mkutano wa Baraza Kuu la KPA siku ya Jumamosi, Gichane alisisitiza kuwa mjadala unapaswa kuhamia kutoka matukio ya pekee hadi kushughulikia kushindwa kwa mfumo mzima. "Kosa moja katika duka lililosajiliwa huchunguzwa na kuwajibikiwa. Lakini maelfu ya maduka haramu yanafanya kazi kila siku bila kuchunguzwa. Huo ndio usawa usiofaa tunaapaswa kukabiliana nao," alisema. Aliishutumu Bodi ya Famasia na Sumu (Pharmacy and Poisons Board) kwa kushindwa kutekeleza miongozo yake yenyewe, hasa ile inayolenga kuimarisha

udhibiti wa kitaaluma wa ndani, utii wa maadili na nidhamu katika sekta hiyo. "Kushindwa huku si suala la kiufundi; ni la kimuundo. Kanuni muhimu zilizobuniwa kulinda Wakenya zimeachwa zionekane kama hiari," alisema. Aidha, alieleza kuwepo kwa pengo kubwa la uwezo katika taasisi ya udhibiti, ambayo ina wakaguzi wa dawa 40 pekee nchini kote kusimamia zaidi ya maduka 15,000 na kufuatilia dawa zinazolingia nchini kila mwaka. "Msimamizi asiye na wafanyakazi wa kutosha si msimamizi. Ni mtazamaji asiye na nguvu," alisema. Gichane alitaka Wizara ya Afya kuongeza idadi ya wakaguzi, kutekeleza kamilifu mifumo ya udhibiti wa kitaaluma, kuunganisha upya leseni na uzingatiaji wa mashirika ya kitaaluma, kuweka adhabu kali dhidi ya utoaji wa dawa zinazohitaji maagizo ya daktari na kuanzisha operesheni ya kitaifa dhidi ya maduka ya dawa haramu. "Dawasi bidhaa za kawaida. Utaalamu wa famasia si biashara ya kibanda ya kuachwa iendeshwe kwa bahati. Usalama wa wagonjwa ni haki, si upendeleo," alisema. Rais wa KPA Chitechi Amboka aliunga mkono msisitizo wa utekelezaji wa sheria, akisema kuwa kuyawezesha mashirika ya kitaaluma kusimamia wanachama wake kutasaidia kutatua changamoto nyingi katika sekta hiyo.

Serikali, kwa ushirikiano na Mfuko wa Kimataifa wa Maendeleo ya Kilimo (IFAD), imezindua Mpango wa Usimamizi Jumuisi wa Rasilimali Asilia (INReMP) wenye thamani ya takribani Sh34.1 bilioni (dola milioni 262.7). Katibu Mkuu wa Kilimo, Dkt. Kipronoh Ronoh Paul, alihudhuria mkutano huo akifuatana na Katibu Mkuu wa Idara ya Mazingira na Mabadiliko ya Tabianchi, Mhandisi Festus K. Ng'eno. Viongozi hao waliusifu mpango huo wa miaka minane wakisema ni hatua ya mageuzi itakayosaidia kuimarisha kilimo kinachotahimili mabadiliko ya tabianchi na usimamizi endelevu wa rasilimali asilia. Pia walisema mpango huo utaboresha maisha ya jamii za vijijini katika kaunti 10 zinazolengwa magharibi

mwa Kenya, huku Uasin Gishu ikiwa miongoni mwa maeneo muhimu yatakayotekelezwa. Walifuatana pia na Mariatu Kamara, Mkurugenzi wa IFAD nchini Kenya, pamoja na wageni wengine mashuhuri. Mpango huo wa miaka minane unaolenga mageuzi ya muda mrefu katika maeneo ya vijijini unatarajiwa kuimarisha ustahimilivu wa tabianchi kwa kuongeza uwezo wa jamii za vijijini kukabiliana na athari za mabadiliko ya tabianchi, kuimarisha usimamizi wa rasilimali asilia kupitia matumizi

endelevu ya misitu, malisho, mashamba, mabwawa na rasilimali za maji, na kuboresha maisha kwa kuongeza kipato cha wakulima wadogo, wanawake na vijana kupitia maendeleo ya minyororo ya thamani. Ushiriki wa Uasin Gishu katika mpango huo unalenga kuimarisha

Akizungumza mjini Naivasha wakati wa kikao na Maseneta, Waziri wa Afya Aden Duale alisema ingawa Kenya imepiga hatua kubwa katika kupunguza vifo vya akina mama wakati wa uzazi, bado kuna tofauti kubwa hasa katika jamii zilizo nyuma kimaendeleo na katika kaunti za maeneo kame na nusu kame (ASAL). Alisema kiwango cha vifo vya akina mama wakati wa uzazi nchini kimepungua katika muongo uliopita, hatua inayochangiwa na kuongezeka kwa akina mama wanaojifungulia katika vituo vya afya, kumatika kwa huduma za wakunga wenye ujuzi na kupanuka kwa huduma za afya ya uzazi. ukosefu wa huduma za dharura za uzazi, mimba za utotoni na upungufu wa wahudumu wa afya. Duale alisema fedha zinazopendekezwa zitasaidia kuziba pengo la ufadhili katika huduma

za uzazi, kuboresha mifumo ya rufaa na kuhakikisha wanawake walio katika mazingira magumu hawanyimwi huduma kwa sababu ya gharama. Chini ya mpango wa uzazi bure,

Waziri alisema serikali tayari imewezesha zaidi ya akina mama vijana 50,000 kupata huduma za uzazi bila malipo katika vituo vya afya vya umma kote nchini. Duale alibainisha kuwa Kenya imewasajili zaidi ya wananchi milioni 29 chini ya Mamlaka ya Afya ya Jamii (Social Health Authority - SHA) kupitia juhudi za kuhakikisha Wakenya wa makundi yote wanapata huduma za afya nafuu. "Chini ya wanachama milioni 5 kati ya milioni 29.7 waliosajiliwa ndio wanaotoa michango mara kwa mara," alisema, akiongeza kuwa hali hiyo inaweka shinikizo kwa Shilingi bilioni 142.8 zilizokusanywa katika kipindi cha miaka mitatu iliyopita. Waziri huyo alisema SHA hadi sasa imetoa Shilingi bilioni 105 kwa vituo vya afya kwa huduma zilizotolewa, ikiwa na kiwango cha ulipaji wa madai cha asilimia 73. Advancing Regulatory Innovation and Operational Excellence

The Board’s achievements reflect deliberate and sustained efforts to strengthen regulatory systems that assure the quality, safety and efficacy of HPTs in Kenya. They demonstrate our commitment to building a responsive, technology-driven and risk-based regulatory environment that supports timely access to quality health products while safeguarding public health.

In line with the Board’s strategic priorities, we continue to advance regulatory innovation, strengthen institutional capacity and enhance collaboration with national, regional and global partners. These efforts support our progress towards attaining **WHO Global Benchmarking Tool Maturity Level 3**, while reinforcing regulatory efficiency, transparency and public confidence in Kenya’s medicines regulatory system.

Pharmacy and Poisons Board: Mandate and Regulatory Role

The Board is mandated by Cap 244 of the Laws of Kenya to protect and promote public health by regulating the pharmacy profession and ensuring access to quality, safe, and effective (“HPTs”).

The Board assures the quality, safety and efficacy of HPTs through lifecycle oversight that

includes control of clinical trials, inspection of manufacturing, storage and distribution channels, product assessment and registration, laboratory testing, post-market surveillance, regulation of imports and exports, control of promotion and advertising, and consumer education.

Pharmacy and Poisons Board Makes Strides in Product Evaluation and Registration

The Board has made significant progress in strengthening the evaluation and registration of HPTs to ensure that medicines, vaccines, medical devices, herbal products and blood products available in Kenya are safe, effective and of assured quality, in line with its mandate under Cap 244 of the Laws of Kenya.

A key milestone has been the implementation of mandatory Bioequivalence requirements for generic medicines, ensuring that these products demonstrate therapeutic equivalence to innovator medicines. This measure enhances public confidence in generic medicines, improves patient safety and aligns Kenya’s regulatory framework with international best practices.

The Board has also reinforced post-authorization oversight

through enforcement of the mandatory five-year renewal of registered medicines, ensuring that products on the market continue to meet updated standards of quality, safety and effectiveness.

To improve efficiency and consistency in regulatory decision-making, the Board introduced an Artificial Intelligence-powered proof-of-concept tool to support screening of new and renewal applications by verifying dossier completeness and compliance, thereby shortening review timelines and strengthening overall regulatory performance.

The Emergency Use Authorization pathway has been strengthened to facilitate timely access to safe and effective essential HPTs during public health emergencies such as COVID-19 and mpox outbreaks.

In response to emerging digital

health innovations, we have developed comprehensive guidelines for the evaluation of Software in Medical Devices and Software as a Medical Device enhancing oversight of technology-driven medical products.

In addition, the Board has strengthened oversight of medicinal or therapeutic cosmetics by introducing a pre-authorization assessment process that transitions products from simple listing to full registration, ensuring thorough scientific evaluation before market entry.

These milestones highlight ongoing efforts to modernise product evaluation and registration processes, enhance regulatory efficiency and keep the public informed on measures taken to ensure access to quality, safe and effective HPTs in Kenya.

Pharmacy and Poisons Board Records Major Gains in Regulating Professionals and Safeguarding Public Health

The Board has recorded notable progress in regulating pharmacy professionals and safeguarding public health through enhanced licensing systems, transparency measures and workforce development initiatives.

Through the adoption of the Regulatory Human Resource Information System (RHRIS), the Board has upscaled the registration and licensing for pharmacists and pharmaceutical technologists, boosting efficiency, revenue collection and financial accountability as well as reducing licence approval timelines.

To enhance transparency and public trust, all licences now feature QR codes for instant verification via mobile devices, deterring fake licences and protecting patient safety. Real-time licensing data for

practitioners and pharmaceutical outlets is publicly accessible online, and licence suspensions and revocations are displayed on the website- web.pharmacyboardkenya.org

The Board continues to strengthen Kenya’s pharmaceutical workforce through strategic regulatory oversight and professional development initiatives. Annually, over 15,000 pharmacists and pharmaceutical technologists are licensed after fulfilling Continuing Professional Development requirements, ensuring practitioners remain current with evolving healthcare demands. Additionally, more than 2,000 new practitioners are assessed for registration or enrolment each year, reflecting a robust pipeline of talent entering the profession.

To uphold quality training standards, the Board has accredited 26 institutions offering diploma in pharmaceutical technology and nine universities offering pharmacy degrees. In a move to expand advanced patient care, the Board has initiated the recognition of specialist pharmacists, enabling practitioners to deliver specialized services that improve health outcomes across Kenya.

This ensures a well-trained workforce ready to meet evolving healthcare needs, demonstrating our commitment to innovation, transparency, and competence assurance. These efforts directly support the Universal Health Coverage agenda and guarantee that Kenyans receive quality pharmaceutical services.

Pharmacy and Poisons Board Advances Compliance and Quality Assurance Across Pharmaceutical Supply Chain

The Board has enhanced regulatory compliance aimed at safeguarding public health through improved inspection programmes, digital innovation and support for local manufacturing, to reinforce oversight across the entire pharmaceutical supply chain.

A major milestone has been the enhanced on risk-based nationwide inspection of wholesalers for compliance with Good Storage and Distribution Practices (GSDP) framework. Conducted from December 2025 to 15th February 2026, the exercise ensured that storage, handling and distribution conditions for medicines meet established regulatory standards, preserving product quality and pro-

tecting public health.

To improve efficiency and accountability in inspections, the Board has developed a new on-line inspection tool. The digital platform enables real-time data capture, streamlined reporting and improved monitoring of compliance across distribution channels, strengthening transparency and regulatory responsiveness.

The Board has also played a pivotal role in advancing local pharmaceutical production by supporting the establishment of ten new manufacturers of HPTs in Kenya, currently at various stages of set-up, while continuing routine inspections of existing local manufacturers to ensure adherence to

current Good Manufacturing Practice standards.

Further enhancing regulatory agility, the Board has implemented reliance pathways for determining company compliance with current Good Manufacturing Practice requirements. This approach leverages credible regulatory decisions and international benchmarks to expedite assessments while maintaining rigorous quality assurance.

These achievements underscore our commitment to robust regulatory oversight, promotion of local manufacturing and assurance that medicines and health products in the Kenyan market consistently meet the highest standards of quality, safety and efficacy.

Ensuring quality, safe and efficacious health products and technologies in Kenya

Strengthening Quality Control Capacity at Pharmacy and Poisons Board

The Board has considerably enhanced its capacity to ensure that only quality, safe and efficacious health products are available in the Kenyan market. Strategic investments in laboratory infrastructure, rapid screening technologies and international quality assurance programmes have strengthened regulatory oversight and post-market surveillance.

The laboratory has acquired high-end analytical equipment to support full compendial testing in line with international pharmacopoeial standards. These include four High Performance Liquid Chromatography systems, a Gas Chromatography system, dissolution testers, friability, hardness and disintegration testers, Atomic Absorption Spectrometer, UV-Visible spectrometers, automatic titrator, Karl Fischer titrator and high-precision analytical

balances. This equipment enables comprehensive testing of medicines to assure quality, safety and efficacy.

To improve detection of substandard and falsified medical products, the Board has deployed rapid screening technologies including Minilab kits at ports of entry and regional offices, handheld Raman spectrometers and Near Infrared spectrometers for real-time field analysis. These tools have enhanced early detection and timely regulatory response.

Testing coverage remains high, with 98 per cent of all medicines received since 2017 (3,405 out of 3,463 samples) analysed at the laboratory. Identified substandard or falsified products are documented through Certificates of Analysis to guide regulatory action by the Quality, Safety and Efficacy and Committee.

The quality control laboratory also

participates in international and regional quality assurance initiatives, including EDQM proficiency testing, interlaboratory comparisons with WHO-prequalified ISO 17025 laboratories, regional testing of antimalarials and antibiotics, and specialised vaccine quality control training in East Africa. These engagements ensure alignment with global best practices and continuous strengthening of laboratory competence.

Overall, the acquisition of advanced equipment, deployment of rapid screening technologies and sustained international collaboration have significantly strengthened the Board's capacity to safeguard the quality of health products in Kenya. Continued investment in infrastructure, skills and partnerships will remain critical to sustaining regulatory excellence and protecting public health.

Digital Transformation Strengthening Medicines Regulation at PPB

The Board is enhancing medicines regulation through strategic investment in ICT systems that support efficient service delivery, real-time decision-making and public safety. These platforms provide end-user support, digital services for stakeholders and guidance on emerging technologies such as Artificial Intelligence and the Internet of Things.

Key milestones include the Practice System, which enables over 15,000 practitioners to renew licences online, and the Premises and Inspections System that captures GPS-tagged in-

spection data for more than 7,700 premises, improving transparency and regulatory oversight. The Product Retention System, hosting over 9,100 approved products, ensures rigorous review of medicines, while Pharmacovigilance and Clinical Trials systems support safety reporting and monitoring of research protocols.

The Board also utilises the National Electronic Single Window System to streamline import and export approvals and the National Drug System to control licit movement of controlled substances. Public access to regulatory information has

been expanded through mobile applications, USSD short codes, and the EShot alert platform for targeted safety communications.

Document security has been strengthened through QR-coded licences and GPS-based geolocation tagging, enhancing authenticity and compliance monitoring. Internally, enterprise solutions such as the Alfresco Document Management System and ABN GENESIS ERP have improved records management, finance, procurement and administrative efficiency, supported by a secure Data Centre infrastructure.

PPB Strengthens Surveillance and Safety Systems to Protect Public Health

The Board has intensified regulatory oversight across the health products lifecycle, recording notable progress in post-marketing surveillance, pharmacovigilance, clinical trials regulation and medicines information management.

In 2025/26 financial year, the Board conducted two active post-marketing quality surveillance surveys covering antibiotics, analgesics, emergency contraceptives and Maternal, Neonatal and Child Health products. A total of 483 samples underwent compendial testing, achieving over 90 per cent compliance, with all non-compliant products promptly recalled. The Board also received 426 reports of suspected poor-quality medicines nationwide, leading to 45 recalls and demonstrating a strengthened surveillance system capable of rapidly detecting and removing substandard products from the market.

To enhance monitoring, the Board deployed Near Infrared (NIR) screening technology for faster, cost-effective screening of a wider range of medicines. With support from the Global Fund and the Gates Foundation, the Board developed the Post Marketing Surveillance Information Management System, a digital platform that streamlines receipt, evaluation and response to medicine quality complaints, improving efficiency and responsiveness.

Through pharmacovigilance, the Board strengthened medicine and vaccine safety monitoring by piloting the Adverse Events Following Immunization Toolkit across selected facilities increased reporting by 800 per cent, from 10 to 80 reports. Overall, 1,880 Individual Case Safety Reports were received and evaluated, reflecting an active national safety monitoring system. Capacity building remained central, with 436 healthcare providers trained

on pharmacovigilance practices, serious adverse event investigations and reporting obligations. Expert committees – the Pharmacovigilance Experts Review and Advisory and the National Vaccine Safety and Advisory Committee – conducted causality assessments for 46 cases, providing critical recommendations. The Board also partnered with five key institutions, including the National Vaccines and Immunization Programme and KEMRI, to strengthen nationwide safety monitoring.

Clinical trials regulation continued to reflect Kenya's growing research environment. During the year, the Board reviewed 33 new clinical trial applications, ensuring timely approvals while maintaining rigorous ethical and scientific standards. To safeguard participants and uphold data integrity, 22 risk-based Good Clinical Practice inspections were conducted across trial sites and related en-

titles. Additionally, 14 inspectors completed a five-day coached audit programme with World Health Organization experts to enhance inspection capacity and harmonise regulatory standards.

In FY 2025/2026, 467 applications were screened in Q1 and 606 in Q2, while approvals rose from 494 to 615, a notable improved efficiency in the regulatory processes. Queried applications declined from 601 in Q1 to 480 in Q2, indicating better submission quality and compliance. The Board undertook one post-marketing surveillance activity in Q1 to monitor HPTs safety and compliance.

These achievements underscore the Board's strengthened regulatory systems and commitment to ensuring the safety, quality and efficacy of medicines in Kenya through enhanced surveillance, robust safety monitoring and efficient application review processes.

Chuo kikuu chazindua mradi wa utafiti wa kimataifa kugeuza maji taka kuwa

Chuo Kikuu cha Multimedia University of Kenya (MMU) kimezindua mpango mkubwa wa kimataifa wa utafiti unaolenga kubadilisha maji machafu ya mijini kutoka kuwa hatari kwa afya ya umma hadi kuwa rasilimali yenye thamani. Mpango huo, unaoitwa “Pollutant Upcycling and Resource Recovery for Environmentally Sustainable and Climate-Resilient Municipal Wastewater Management (PURE-MW)”, unafadhiliwa chini ya wito wa kikanda wa Belmont Forum barani Afrika na unawakutanisha washirika kutoka Kenya, Uganda, Afrika Kusini, Ujerumani na Uturuki. Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi wa mtandaoni, Kaimu Makamu Mkuu wa chuo hicho, Prof. Livingstone Ngoo, alielezea mradi huo kama “wakati muhimu” kwa chuo hicho na washirika wake wa kimataifa. Alitoa taswira ya changamoto kubwa za mifumo ya mifereji ya maji iliyoziaba

pamoja na vitisho visivyoonekana vya kemikali, akionya kuwa uchafuzi wa kisasa unahitaji suluhisho za kisasa. “Utafiti huu unapaswa kuwa kama mashine ya kusaga yenye matokeo dhahiri—ukitoka suluhisho halisi yatakayoufanya ulimwengu kuwa salama na bora zaidi,” alisema Prof. Ngoo. Aliwahimiza washirika wa mradi huo kwenda zaidi ya kuchapisha tafti za kitaaluma na badala yake kutoa ubunifu unaoweza kutumiwa na manispaa na viwanda. Alisema haki miliki, biashara ya ubunifu na athari zinazoonekana kwa jamii lazima ziwe alama kuu za mradi wa PURE-MW. Kiongozi wa mradi huo na mtafiti mkuu, Dkt. Eric Njogu, alieleza maji machafu kuwa “hazina iliyojificha.” Alisema PURE-MW italenga vipaumbele viwili muhimu: kuondoa vichafuzi hatari na kurejesha rasilimali zinazoweza kutumika ili kusaidia uchumi wa mzunguko (circular economy). Mabaki ya dawa, kemikali zinazoathiri homoni, antibiotiki na kemikali za phenoli zimekuwa zikigunduliwa mara nyingi katika mito,

maji ya ardhini na hata maji ya kunywa. Vichafuzi hivi vinaweza kuhatarisha afya ya binadamu, viumbe wa majini na uthabiti wa kijamii na kiuchumi kwa muda mrefu. Mradi huo wa miaka mitatu utabuni mifumo ya kusafisha maji yenye uwezo wa kuondoa vichafuzi hivyo huku ukibadilisha baadhi ya taka kuwa malighafi ya viwandani. Mkurugenzi wa Utafiti na Ubunifu wa MMU, Dkt. David Wekesa, aliusifu ushirikiano

huo akisema unaendana na mwelekeo wa kisasa wa utafiti duniani. Alisisitiza kuwa matokeo ya utafiti yanapaswa kusaidia kutengeneza sera na sheria, si kubaki katika nadharia pekee. “Matokeo lazima yazibe pengo kati ya utafiti na biashara ya ubunifu, yaongoze ugawaji wa rasilimali na kuboresha maisha ya wananchi,” alisema Dkt. Wekesa. Waziri wa Utalii na Wanyamapori, Rebecca Miano, ametangaza kuwa serikali ya kitaifa imetoa shilingi milioni 205 kwa ajili ya kujenga uzio katika Hifadhi ya Taifa ya Rimoi, hatua inayolenga kuimarisha kuishi kwa amani kati ya binadamu na wanyamapori pamoja na kuimarisha juhudi za uhifadhi. Akizungumza wakati wa maadhimisho ya Siku ya Wanyamapori Duniani yaliyofanyika katika Shule ya Msingi ya Rimoi karibu na hifadhi hiyo, Miano alisema fedha hizo ni mwanzo wa mpango mpana wa kulinda eneo hilo na kupunguza migogoro kati ya binadamu na wanyamapori ambayo kwa muda mrefu imeathiri jamii zinazoishi karibu na hifadhi. “Shilingi milioni 205 zimetolewa kwa ajili ya kuanza ujenzi wa uzio katika Hifadhi ya Taifa ya Rimoi, na kadri mradi utakavyoendelea, fedha zaidi zitaongezwa ili kuukamilisha,” alisema. “Fedha zilizotolewa ni kwa awamu ya kwanza ya ujenzi wa uzio, na katika bajeti inayofuata, fedha zaidi zitatengwa.” Waziri huyo alisisitiza kuwa serikali inabadilisha mkakati wake wa uhifadhi kwa kuimarisha kuishi kwa pamoja kati ya binadamu na wanyamapori kupitia maendeleo ya miundombinu katika maeneo ya hifadhi. “Tunabadilisha mkakati wetu kuelekea kuishi pamoja kwa binadamu na wanyamapori kwa kujenga uzio kuzunguka hifadhi ili kulinda wanyamapori na jamii,” alisema Miano. “Tutarejea hivi karibuni kwa sherehe ya uwekaji wa jiwe la msingi.” Aidha alibainisha kuwa wizara itaendelea kushirikiana kwa karibu na serikali za kaunti kuhakikisha kuwa hifadhi za taifa kote nchini zinafanya kazi kikamilifu na kuwa na manufaa ya kiuchumi. “Wizara itaendelea kufanya kazi na kaunti kuhakikisha hifadhi za taifa zinaendeshwa ipasavyo. Ni chanzo cha mapato na zinaweza kuchangia pakubwa katika uchumi wa maeneo husika,” alisema. Miano alifichua kuwa Kenya ina hifadhi za taifa 29 ambazo bado hazijatumika kikamilifu licha ya kuwa na uwezo mkubwa wa kiuchumi. “Tuna hifadhi za taifa 29 ambazo kwa sasa hazifanyi kazi ipasavyo. Hizi ni hazina zilizojificha ambazo zinaweza kubadilishwa kuwa vyanzo vya mapato kwa wananchi wetu,” alisema.

Gavana Dhadho Godhana na Spika Osman Galole mtawalia. “Tumeitambua Tana River kama kaunti yenye uwezo mkubwa sana. Tukifungua sekta ya uchimbaji madini, hamtalamikia tena nishati na maji. Tukishindwa kuchukua hatua fulani leo, tutajilaumu kesho.

Tukianza kwa njia sahihi, tutapata matokeo sahihi,” alisema Joho. Alihimiza ushirikiano kati ya jamii za wenyeji, Serikali ya Kaunti na Wizara ili kuhakikisha uchimbaji wa madini unafanyika kwa njia endelevu inayochochea ukuaji jumuishi na mabadiliko ya viwanda.

Aliwahimiza waathiriwa kuripoti matukio kwa ukweli na kuwaonya machifu pamoja na maafisa wa kilimo dhidi ya kushirikiana na wakazi kuongeza madai ya fidia kwa njia isiyo halali. “Kunayo mchakato wazi wa kuripoti na kulipwa fidia. Alifichua kuwa kilomita 42 za uzio wa umeme tayari zimejengwa kuzunguka hifadhi hiyo ili kupunguza migogoro hiyo, na kuwahimiza wakazi kudumisha umbali salama na tembo wanaozurura. Machifu pia waliombwa kushirikiana kwa karibu na walinzi wa wanyamapori kuhakikisha wakazi walioathiriwa wanawasilisha taarifa sahihi za akaunti za benki ili kurahisisha malipo ya fidia. Wito wa Uwajibikaji na Ushirikishwaji Mwakilishi wa Wadi ya Antubetwe Kiongo (MCA), Henry Maore, alitaka KWS kuharakisha malipo ya fidia kwa uharibifu wa mazao na kudai uwajibikaji katika ajira, fidia na utekelezaji wa miradi. Alilalamikia kutokuwapa kwa ajira kwa vijana wa eneo hilo ndani ya KWS na kutaka kuwe na ushirikishwaji mkubwa zaidi wa wenyeji. Kwa niaba ya Mbunge wa Igembe North Julius Taitumu, Mugambi Ronald alisisitiza umuhimu wa fidia ya haraka na ushirikiano thabiti kati ya jamii na mashirika ya uhifadhi. Uhifadhi na Jamii Kati-kati ya Maadhimisho Kaulimbiu ya siku hiyo ililenga mimea ya dawa na yenye harufu nzuri. Naibu Mkurugenzi Mkuu Edward Mburu alisisitiza umuhimu wa miti ya dawa

Kuna mchakato wazi katika kuripoti na fidia. Utapokea pesa zako, lakini hakikisha unazitumia kwa busara

katika afya ya binadamu na kutoa wito wa kulindwa kwake kwa vizazi vijavyo. Mkurugenzi Mdogo wa Elimu wa Kaunti Ndogo, Barack Ouri, aliyemwakilisha Mkurugenzi wa Elimu wa Kaunti, aliwasifu washirika wa uhifadhi kwa kusaidia maendeleo ya miundombinu ya shule na kuendesha programu za uhamasishaji kuhusu uhifadhi wa mazingira. Wito wa Suluhu Endelevu Mwakilishi wa jamii Zakayo Gitonga aliomba kujengwa kwa bwawa katika eneo la uzazi wa tembo ili kutoa maji kwa wanyamapori na wakazi wakati wa kiangazi. Alisema ukosefu wa maji na chakula umeongeza migogoro kwani tembo huingia mashambani kutafuta rasilimali. Mchungaji Joel Mutuma Muungania, akizungumza kwa niaba ya viongozi wa dini, aliwakumbusha wakazi kuwa kutunza wanyama na miti ni wajibu wa kimsingi. “Mungu anatarajia tutunze wanyama na miti,” alisema.

miti mara baada ya ukataji. "Hatuaachii maeneo yaliyokatwa wazi. Mara miti inapokatwa, tunaanza mara moja mpango wa upandaji miti kurejesha eneo na kudumisha usawa wa kiikolojia," alisema Musyoka.

Aliongeza kuwa misitu ya mashambani ni kiini muhimu cha sekta ya misitu nchini, ikitoa malighafi kwa viwanda na pia kusaidia malengo ya uhifadhi pale inapozingatiwa kikamilifu. Michael Cheruiyot, alisema kwamba kupitia mradi huu, makundi 16 ya wakulima kutoka Vitongoji vya Mau Narok na Kihingo katika Kaunti Ndogo ya Njoro walipokea kuku 3,842 wa kienyeji walioboreshwa wa umri wa mwezi mmoja chini ya "Mradi wa Kuku wa Kienyeji Ulioboreshwa kwa Ustawi wa Kiuchumi." Dkt. Cheruiyot aliongeza kuwa juhudi hii ni sehemu ya ajenda pana ya uwezeshaji wa kilimo endelevu chini ya utawala wa Gavana Susan Kihika, inayolenga kuboresha usalama wa

chakula, kuongeza mapato ya kaya na kukuza ukuaji unaojumuishwa jamii yote. Afisa Mkuu huyo alifichua kuwa walengwa wote walipokea mafunzo ya msingi katika utunzaji wa kuku na watapata msaada zaidi kutoka kwa maafisa wa mifugo wa vitongoji kwa mwongozo wa kiufundi unaoendelea. "Mradi huu umebuniwa kukuza kilimo mijini huku tukihakikisha matumizi ya nafasi ndogo iliyopo kutosha kulisha idadi inayooongezeka ya watu mijini. Lengo letu kuu ni kufanikisha usalama wa chakula na lishe pamoja na kuunda ajira," alisema afisa huyo. Aliongeza, "Tunataka kuboresha maisha ya watu wa Nakuru hasa kupitia wanawake, watu wenye ulemavu na vijana. Mradi huu utawawezesha kutimiza mahitaji ya familia zao. Pia utasaidia kulipa ada za shule za watoto wao." Dkt. Cheruiyot alisema kuwa mpango unalenga kuwasaidia wakulima kulea aina za kuku wa kienyeji walioboreshwa ambao

huanza kuyaanga mayai baada ya miezi mitano tu tangu kuzaliwa na kutoa wastani wa kilo 1.5 za nyama, huku jogoo akihitajika kuwa na angalau kilo 2. "Wakulima wanatarajiwa kutumia mbegu zenye faida

mbili ili kuboresha kuku wao wa kienyeji pamoja na kuongeza uzalishaji wao. Hii itashughulikia changamoto za mbegu duni, uzalishaji mdogo huku ikitengeneza mapato kwa jamii," alisema Afisa Mkuu.

Ili kuhakikisha wakulima wadogo wanapata uzalishaji wa kiwango cha juu, serikali ya kaunti imeambatanisha maafisa wa mifugo na wakufunzi wa mifugo kwenye mradi huu ambao watawapa wakulima ushauri wa kiufundi unaohitajika, kama vile jinsi ya kulisha kuku na kutoa chanjo. Mwaka uliopita, wakulima wa kuku wa Nakuru walipata zaidi ya Sh875 milioni kutokana na mauzo ya mayai milioni 67. Zaidi ya Sh489 milioni zilipatikana kutokana na mauzo ya tani 825 za nyama ya kuku na tani 340 za nyama ya bata. Wataalamu wa kilimo wamesema kuwa kiasi hiki kitazidi Sh3 bilioni iwapo wakulima watapokea kuku wenye kinga dhidi ya magonjwa na kukomaa haraka. Takwimu kutoka Wizara ya Kilimo zinaonyesha kuwa Kenya ina idadi inayokadiriwa ya kuku milioni 31. Kutoka idadi hii, asilimia 75 ni kuku wa kienyeji, asilimia 22 ni kuku wa broiler na layer, na asilimia 1 ni mbegu za kuzalisha.

Huduma za 'Table Banking' zainua wajane wa Nyeri kimapato

Katika makazi madogo eneo la Karunda, Chaka, Kaunti ya Nyeri, kundi la mayafunzi hukusanyika kwa mduara kwa mkutano wao wa kawaida wa table-banking. Hali ya hewa imejaa mazungumzo na kicheko wanapobadilishana salamu kabla ya kuanza shughuli muhimu ya fedha. Mwanamke mmoja, akiwa na daftari mkononi, anasikiliza kwa makini na kurekodi kila michango kwa usahihi. Kitendo hiki kimekuwa desturi yao ya kila siku. Kwa zaidi ya muongo mmoja, Kikundi cha Kujitolea cha Mayafunzi wa Wirugamie Karundas kimekuwa kikikutana kwa uaminifu, kikiendeshwa na tamaa ya kuendeleza familia zao kupitia miradi ya kuingiza kipato. Hata hivyo, safari yao haikuwa bila changamoto. Mpango wa merry-go-round ulifeli wakati baadhi ya wanachama waliposhindwa kufuatilia michango ya kila mwezi. Baadaye, mradi wa ufugaji kuku na kituo cha mimea kilitoa matumaini lakini hatimaye kilishindwa kutokana na kuongezeka kwa gharama za uendeshaji. Hata hivyo, licha ya kukatishwa tamaa, wanawake hawa hawajawahi kupoteza uthabiti wao. Mkutano wa leo unajitofautisha. Unaleta matumaini mapya, si kwa sababu ya mafanikio ya table banking pekee, bali pia kutokana na kipindi kipya cha mafunzo kinachotara-

jiwa kubadilisha maisha yao.

Baada ya majadiliano ya kifedha, mayafunzi wanakaa kwa warsha kuhusu agri-preneurship—mpango ulioundwa kuwapa ujuzi wa vitendo ili kuboresha lishe na kipato. Programu hii ni ushirikiano kati ya Kituo cha Kenya e-Learning, Eco-Mobilus Technology, na Chuo Kikuu cha Kilimo na Teknolojia cha Jomo Kenyatta (JKUAT). Lengo lake ni rahisi lakini lenye nguvu: kuwafundisha mayafunzi jinsi ya kukuza mimea ya mitishamba na viungo katika bustani zao za jikoni.

Kulingana na Gakiria Nderitu, mwanachama wa Programu ya Ujuzi wa Kiufundi na Maendeleo katika JKUAT, mayafunzi walichaguliwa mahsusi kama walengwa kwa sababu wako miongoni mwa wanajamii walio hatarini zaidi. “Mayafunzi hukabiliana na kutengwa na changamoto za kifedha. Njia moja tunayowawezesha kujitegemea ni kuanzia na uzalishaji wao wa chakula. Wengi wao ni wazee na wanahitaji lishe yenye virutubisho ili kudhibiti changamoto za kiafya zinazohusiana na umri,” anafafanua. Mafunzo yanaanza kwa kuwafahamisha mimea na viungo kama vile minti, majani ya limau, basil, thyme, lavender, na rosemary. Mbegu zitapatiwa, pamoja na huduma za mara kwa mara za ugani ili kuhakikisha mimea inakidhi viwango vya juu. “Lengo letu ni kuanzia na kile wanachoweza kula wenyewe. Wengi wao ni wakulima, lakini mara nyingi wanazingatia mazao ya kibiashara ambayo hayachangii lishe yao wenyewe. Mbinu ya



bustani ya jikoni inahimiza kilimo mchanganyiko—mboga, mimea, mizizi—na kwa wale wenye ardhi kubwa, kilimo hai kwa kiwango kinachowezekana. Kwa muda mrefu, hii itawasaidia kujitegemea,” aniongeza Gakiria. Hali ya hewa isiyotabirika ya Kieni inaleta changamoto, lakini mpango unajumuisha mbinu za kukabiliana na mabadiliko ya tabianchi. Mayafunzi wanapewa mafunzo ya kutumia mbolea hai kuboresha ukuaji na kupambana na wadudu, huku mbinu za uhi-fadhi wa maji kama mulching, umwagiliaji mdogo wa drip, na kilimo mchanganyiko ziki-hakikisha mavuno makubwa kutoka kwa rasilimali chache. “Shukrani kwa mbinu hizi,

Faith Wambui, kwa mfano, amekuwa akianda majani ya limau na rosemary katika kiwanja chake kwa ladha ya chakula na chai. “Sikuwahi kufahamu kuwa mimea ina thamani zaidi ya jikoni. Ninafurahi kuchunguza fursa zinazotokana na kukuza mimea hii kibiashara,” anasema kwa tabasamu. Kwa Gachambi Nderitu mwenye umri wa miaka 86, mimea hii imekuwa mabadiliko ya maisha. Baada ya kugongwa na stroke, alitumia pesa nyingi kwenye dawa hadi madaktari kupendekeza mbadala wa mimea. Watoto wake walianza kutafuta mimea na mapishi ya chai za tiba. Leo, thyme, rosemary, na majani ya limau yanastawi katika bustani yake ya jikoni, na huandaa chai za mimea kila siku. “Yameboresha ustawi wangu na kupunguza kwa kiasi kikubwa gharama za dawa,” anasema. Zaidi ya lishe, mpango huu unalenga kuongeza uhuru wa kifedha. Washiriki watafundishwa kuhusu ukusanyaji na ujuzi wa biashara wa msingi.

Consequently, ANITRAC will be a key component in responding to challenges that hamper livestock production, livestock breeding, animal health, animal welfare, food safety certification and trade in animals and animal products.

The ANITRAC Bill 2026 brings considerable benefits to farmers, livestock keepers, national and county government operations as well as the economy as provided in the Sessional Paper No. 2 and 3 of 2020 on the Veterinary Policy and the National Livestock Policy respectively and the Agricultural Policy of 2021.

In compliance with the provisions of the Statutory Instruments Act No. 23 of 2013, the Ministry announces to public availability of the above Draft Bill on the websites of the Ministries of Agriculture and Livestock Development (www.kilimo.go.ke) and Information, Communication and Technology (www.ict.go.ke), for access and perusal.

Idara yyzindua mpango wa mabwawa 10 kama hatua ya upanuzi wa unyunyiziaji

Idara ya Unyunyiziaji imezindua mpango wa kuweka ekari milioni 1.2 za ziada chini ya umwagiliaji katika mwaka ujao kupitia ujenzi wa mabwawa makubwa 10 nchini. Katibu CPA Ephantus Kimotho alitangaza kuwa ufadhili wa awali kwa mabwawa nane tayari umeidhinishwa na Hazina Kuu ya Taifa, jambo linaloashiria hatua kubwa katika juhudi za serikali za kuongeza usalama wa chakula na kupunguza utegemezi wa kilimo kinachotegemea mvua pekee. Miongoni mwa miradi ya kielelezo ni Bwawa la High Grand Falls katika Kaunti za Kitui, Embu, na Tharaka Nithi, ambalo linatarajiwa kuweka ekari 500,000 chini ya umwagiliaji, na Bwawa la Galana katika Kaunti ya Tana River, linalokadiriwa kuongeza ekari 200,000. Mabwawa mengine yaliyochaguliwa kujengwa ni pamoja na Barsalinga (Isiolo), Daua (Mandera), Lowaat (Turkana), Yatta (Machakos), Soin-Koru (Kisumu), Radat (Baringo), Rumuruti (Laikipia), Muhoya (Nyeri/Kirinyaga), na Thuci (Tharaka Nithi/Embu). Kimotho, ambaye alizungumza katika kikao cha Wakuu wa Idara mjini Nairobi, alisisitiza kuwa miradi hii lazima ilete faida halisi kwa wananchi wa kawaida.

“Lengo letu kuu ni mwananchi na athari tunazozileta katika maisha ya raia. Mwananchi anapaswa kuhisi matokeo ya kazi tunayofanya shambani,” alisema. Alibainisha kuwa umwagiliaji ni kiini katika kupunguza uagizaji wa chakula, kuongeza mapato ya wakulima, na kujenga uimara dhidi ya athari za mabadiliko ya tabianchi. “Sio tu tunajenga mabwawa; tunajenga maisha. Kila mradi lazima uonyeshe jinsi unavyoboresha maisha ya mkulima na kuimarisha usalama wa chakula

kwa taifa,” aliongeza. Ili kufanikisha malengo haya makubwa, Kimotho alitaka jitihada za hali ya juu na uongozi wa karibu kutoka kwa maafisa wake. Aliagiza Wakuu wa Idara kufanya ziara za mara kwa mara shambani ili kufuatilia maendeleo na kushirikiana moja kwa moja na walengwa. “Hii itasaidia kushughulikia masuala ya mwananchi na kuchukua hatua za marekebisha kwa wakati,” alisema. Katibu pia alisisitiza uwajibikaji, akielezea mikataba ya utendaji kama zana muhimu ya kupima utoaji wa huduma.

Alifichua kuwa amesaini mikataba na kila Kiongozi wa Idara na atafuatilia binafsi kuhakikisha malengo yanafikiwa. “Kile kinachopimwa, ndicho kinachotekelezwa. Msamaha waafufua matumaini ya wakulima

Wakulima wa kahawa katika Kaunti ya Embu wamepata msukumo mkubwa baada ya Serikali ya Kitaifa kuondoa deni la Sh171.5 milioni lililokuwa likidaiwa na Mfuko wa Bidhaa na Mill ya Kahawa ya Kaunti ya Embu. Mill ya kaunti ilipata Sh90 milioni kutoka shirika hilo mwaka 2014 kwa ajili ya ujenzi wa kiwanda cha pamoja cha kuchakata na kuuza kahawa yote inayozalishwa katika kaunti hiyo, lakini kiasi hicho kilipanda hadi Sh171.5 milioni kwa muda kutokana na riba na adhabu zilizojumlishwa. Mill hiyo ilikuwa inatarajiwa kumaliza miaka ya unyonyaji wa wakulima na madalali na makundi katika mnyororo wa thamani ya kahawa kwa kuhakikisha kahawa yote inayozalishwa kaunti nzima inachakatwa na kuuza pamoja ili kuongeza mapato yao. Mwenyekiti wa Mill, Wilfensio Njeru, alibainisha kuwa mkopo huo ulisababisha mashirika mengi ya kahawa kutojijhusisha na mill

hiyo kwa hofu ya bidhaa zao kukamatwa ili kulipa deni kubwa. Kwa maendeleo mapya ya kurekebisha deni ambayo yalifanyika mwezi uliopita, mwenyekiti alibainisha kuwa mashirika yameanza kushiriki. “Tumeona hamasa inayoongezeka kutoka kwa mashirika ya ushirika ambao wako tayari kuchakata na kuuza kahawa zao pamoja nasi na tuna matumaini kuwa hivi karibuni mashirika yote yatajiunga,” alisema. Aliongeza kuwa msamaha wa deni umeruhusu kiwanda kurudi kwenye operesheni kamili kwa kuzingatia sana kuongeza thamani na masoko bila hofu ya kukamatwa kwa mali. Njeru alorodhesha faida zinazopatikana kutokana na kuchakata na kuuza kahawa pamoja, ikiwa ni pamoja na kuunganisha kiasi cha kahawa ambacho kitawawezesha kufikia masoko moja kwa moja bila madalali. “Tunatarajia pia kufaidika na uchemu wa kiwango kikubwa kwani tutakuwa na uwezo wa kuuza kahawa yetu kwa pamoja,” alibainisha.

Mbadi azindua miradi ya maji Gwasssi Kusini

NA DAVIS LANGAT (KNA)

Angalau wakazi 6,500 katika maeneo mawili ya Suba Kusini wanatarajiwa kufaidika na miradi ya maji safi iliyoazinduliwa na Waziri wa Hazina ya Kitaifa, John Mbadi. Mradi wa kwanza ni wa maji wa Luwa Chabichabi, utakaohudumia zaidi ya watu 3,500 wanaoishi katika Mji wa Magunga na maeneo yake jirani, huku mradi wa pili, wa Mumisa, ukihudumia zaidi ya wakazi 3,000 ikiwa ni pamoja na Shule ya Msingi ya Mumisa Comprehensive. Miradi hii inahusisha kuchimba visima vya kisima (boreholes) ambavyo maji yanagawanywa kwa wakazi kupitia mtandao wa mabomba na vichocho vya maji. Miradi hiyo inatekelezwa na Shirika la Maendeleo ya Maji la Ziwa Victoria Kusini (LSWVDA) kwa jumla ya gharama ya Sh17 milioni. Akiwa katika uzinduzi wa miradi hiyo, Mbadi alisema miradi iliyoko katika Ki-

tongoji cha Gwasssi Kusini itapunguza uhaba wa maji na inatarajiwa kukamilika ifikapo Juni mwaka huu. Alisema serikali imejizatiti kupunguza uhaba mkali wa maji katika sehemu za mbali za nchi. CS alisema kuwa miradi 11 ya maji zaidi inaendelea kufanyikwa Suba Kusini ili kulinda wakazi dhidi ya uhaba mkali wa maji uliokuwa ukiwakabili. “Maji ni rasilimali muhimu ambayo lazima ipatikane kwa wananchi wote. Hivi sasa, jimbo la Suba Kusini na Ndihiwa lina miradi 11 ya maji inayotekelezwa ili kupunguza uhaba wa maji katika eneo hili,” alisema Mbadi. Aliongeza kuwa serikali ya kitaifa pia inatumia rasilimali nyingi katika utekelezaji wa miradi ya maji katika sehemu nyingine za Mkoa wa Nyanza. Mbadi alisema kuwa hakuna maendeleo ya kiuchumi yanayoweza kufanikishwa ikiwa wakazi hawana maji safi na salama kwa matumizi ya nyumbani na mifugo.

Watengenezaji wa meli wafufua injini 13 zilizozeeka

Kenya Shipyards Limited (KSL) inaendesha mabadiliko makubwa katika mfumo wa usafirishaji nchini, baada ya kurekebisha na kutengeneza upya locomotives 13 za zamani, zote ambazo tayari zinafanya kazi kwenye reli ya kipimo cha mita moja. Katika mradi wa pamoja na Kenya Railways Corporation (KRC), KSL imechukua jukumu la kurekebisha na kutengeneza upya locomotives za kihistoria katika

warsha kuu za KRC. Hatua hii inatarajiwa kubadilisha kwa kiasi kikubwa usafirishaji kwa reli na mabahari ndani ya mfumo wa biashara wa kikanda. “Ushirikiano huu unaonyesha dhamira ya KSL katika kutoa suluhisho za usafirishaji zilizojumuishwa na kuimarisha miundombinu sambamba na Maono 2030,” alisema Warrant Officer II Samwel Nyawara, Mkufunzi wa Mradi katika mpango wa KSL-KRC. Mhandisi David Methu, mshauri wa KSL katika

mradi huo, alielezea kuwa juhudi hii ilikuja baada ya jitihada za awali kukutana na vikwazo vya kiutendaji. “Eneo la awali lilihusisha ukarabati mkubwa wa locomotives 31, kama ilivyo saini mwezi Juni 2021. Hata

hivyo, changamoto zilitokea baada ya uwasilishaji wa locomotives saba kutokana na uhaba wa vipuri na muda mrefu wa utoaji,” alisema. Licha ya changamoto hizo, maendeleo yamekuwa thabiti.
