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Mpango wa Sh3.5 bilioni kufufua viwanda vya chai, kuongeza malipo ya wakulima

Wakulima chai wamepata sababu mpya ya matumaini kufuatia utekezaji wa marekebisho makubwa na serikali, yaliyoungwa mkono na uwekezaji wa Sh3.5 bilioni unaolenga kuboresha viwanda vya chai, kuongeza thamani ya bidhaa, na kuongeza mapato ya wakulima. Mpango huu mkubwa, uliozinduliwa katika Kiwanda cha Chai cha Olunguruone katika Kaunti ya Nakuru, unaashiria mabadiliko makubwa kutoka kuuza chai ghafi kwenda kwenye sekta ya chai yenye thamani kubwa na inayokidhi viwango vya kimataifa. Akiwazindua cheti cha kampuni kwa kiwanda hicho, Katibu Mkuu wa Kilimo, Dkt. Kiprono Rono, alisisitiza dhamira ya serikali ya kuwalinda wakulima. Alitangaza bei mpya ya Sh26 kwa kilo ya majani mabichi, kutoka Sh16, na kuweka lengo la Sh100 kwa kilo ifikapo 2027. “Tunaweka marekebisho kukabiliana na bei za chini kwenye soko la mnada, gharama kubwa za uzalishaji, na ukosefu wa kuongeza thamani. Wakulima wetu wanastahili kupata



kile wanachostahili,” Dkt. Rono alitangaza, akiwaonya Bodi ya Shirika la Maendeleo ya Chai Kenya (KTDA) dhidi ya ufisadi na misimamizi mibaya ya fedha za viwanda. Uwekezaji wa Sh3.5 bilioni utarekebisha viwanda 19 vya kuchakata chai, kuvikarabati na kuviweka kwenye teknolojia ya kisasa ili kuongeza ufanisi, kuboresha ubora, na kupunguza gharama za uzalishaji. Dkt. Rono aliwapa changamoto viwandani kuchukua fursa ya

kuongeza thamani na kuboresha bidhaa, hasa uzalishaji wa chai ya Orthodox, ambayo hupewa bei ya juu kimataifa. “Tunahitaji kuhamia kutoka kuuza chai ghafi kwenda kuzalisha bidhaa zenye thamani inayokidhi mahitaji ya kimataifa,” alisema. Chini ya marekebisho haya, viwanda vya KTDA vitasaini makubaliano ya kiwango cha huduma kuhakikisha wakulima wanapata huduma bora. Viwanda pia vitapata uhuru wa kufanya mauzo moja

Akithibitisha hoja hizi, Willy Mutai wa Bodi ya Chai Kenya aliwahi-miza viwanda kuwekeza katika utafiti wa kisayansi na kuboresha viwango vya uchakataji. Alibainisha kwamba marekebisho yanayolenga ubora, utofauti wa soko, na uhuishaji wa sekta yataimarisha nafasi ya Kenya katika Mnada wa Chai wa Mombasa. Mutai alieleza kwamba kanuni mpya zitalazimisha muda wa malipo, ambapo 50% ya deni linalolipwa awali na baki ndani ya miezi mitatu, kuboresha mtririko wa fedha na kuhakikisha wakulima wanapokea malipo kwa wakati. Aliongeza kwamba serikali inalenga kuhakikisha angalau 40% ya chai ya Kenya inapata thamani ndani ya nchi. “Kwa sasa, 95% ya chai yetu inasafirishwa ghafi. Tunaweka marekebisho kuhakikisha karibu nusu ya uzalishaji wetu unaongezwa thamani hapa nchini,” alisema. Angalau wanafunzi wapatao 12,000 wa mafunzo kutoka kote nchini tayari wamepitia mpango wa Elimu ya Ufundi na Mafunzo ya Kiufundi (TVET) wa aina mbili, ikionyesha kasi inayoongezeka katika jiti-hada za kuoanisha elimu ya ufundi na mahitaji ya viwanda. Mfumo huu wa mafunzo ya aina mbili unaruhusu wapatao wa mafunzo kugawanya muda wao kati ya mafunzo darasani na mafunzo ya vitendo katika viwanda, kuhakikisha kuwa wahitimu wanapata ujuzi wa vitendo unaohitajika katika soko la ajira. Utekelezaji wake unafanywa kupitia ushirikiano kati ya taasisi za mafunzo na makampuni, na mpango huu hadi sasa umevutia viwanda takriban 3,700 kote nchini, kulingana na maafisa wa TVET. Mkurugenzi wa TVET wa Kisumu na Siaya, Audrey Monica, alisema mpango huu unabadilisha hatua kwa hatua mafunzo ya ujuzi kwa kuwaweka wapatao wa mafunzo kwenye mazingira halisi ya kazi huku bado wakiwa shuleni. Aliongeza Kisumu wakati wa Western Region Dual TVET

Week katika Ramogi Institute of Advanced Technology, ambapo taasisi na makampuni yalionesha programu za kiufundi na uvumbuzi kwa wanafunzi, wadau wa viwanda na elimu. “Tumejikita katika kutoa wafanyakazi wenye ujuzi wa kiwango cha juu ambao sio tu unaohitajika hapa nchini na kitaifa, bali pia kimataifa,” Monica alisema. Monica alisema ushirikiano unaongezeka wa wadau wa

viwanda umeimarisha mpango huu, akibainisha kwamba makampuni yanapata faida moja kwa moja kwa kushiriki katika mchakato wa mafunzo. “Wakati viwanda vinapochukua wapatao wa mafunzo, vinapunguza gharama za ajira na pia vina fursa ya kuwaandaa kulingana na ujuzi wanahitaji. Wajibu wengi hatimaye wanabaki nao mara mafunzo yatakapokamilika,” alisema.

Aliongeza kuwa mpango huu pia unaunga mkono mpango wa serikali wa Kazi Majuu kwa kutoa wahitimu wenye ujuzi wa kiufundi wanaoweza kushindana katika soko la ajira la kimataifa. Mkurugenzi wa kanda alisema Western Region Dual TVET Week pia ilivutia wanafunzi wa shule za msingi na sekondari, ikiwapa fursa ya kuchunguza njia za taaluma za kiufundi kabla ya kufanya maamuzi ya elimu. Kulingana na Monica, kufahamishwa mapema kwa wanafunzi kuhusu taaluma za kiufundi kunasaidia kufanya maamuzi sahihi na kuepuka makosa ya gharama kubwa yanayohusiana na kuchagua kozi zisizofaa. Washiriki wa tukio hilo walitembelea maonyesho yanayoonyesha programu katika uhandisi wa mitambo, uhandisi wa umeme, ujenzi na uhandisi wa kiraia, mabomba, ICT, urembo, kupamba nywele na sekta ya chakula na vinywaji, kati ya taaluma nyingine. Akizungumza katika tukio hilo, Mkurugenzi wa Shamberere National Polytechnic, Dr. Elisha Nyamu, alisema ushirikiano kati ya taasisi za TVET na washirika wa viwanda umewezesha kuziba pengo lililokuwepo kwa muda mrefu kati ya mafunzo na mahitaji ya soko la ajira.

Naibu Gavana wa kaunti ya Turkana, Dkt. John Erus, anasisitiza uwekaji wa mikakati ya dharura ya maendeleo ya ujuzi ili kuandaa vijana wa eneo hilo kwa ajira zinazotarajiwa kutokana na kuhushwa kwa uchunguzi wa mafuta na gesi katika Bonde la South Lokichar.

Akizungumza alipokuwa mwenyeji wa wajumbe kutoka Swisscontact, Dkt. Erus alisema kuwa kaunti

Uwezo Fund yaimarisha Biashara Ndogo katika maeneobunge sita Turkana

Katika mandhari mapana ya Kaunti ya Turkana, makazi ya Ziwa Turkana, jamii zinaanza kukumbatia biashara kama njia ya uwezesaji wa kiuchumi. Kutoka kwenye masoko yenye shughuli nyingi ya Lodwar hadi vijiji vya uvuvi kando ya fukwe za ziwa, wakazi wanachunguza fursa mpya katika biashara, uvuvi, na aina mbalimbali za miradi midogo ya kibiashara.

Katikati ya mabadiliko haya ni Mfuko wa Uwezo, mpango wa serikali ya kitaifa unaotoa ufadhili kwa urahisi kupitia mikopo isiyo na riba, sambamba na mafunzo ya uelewa wa kifedha kwa wanawake, vijana, na watu wenye ulemavu (PWDs). Mpango huu unasaidia kuanzisha biashara mpya pamoja na kupanua zile zilizopo, hivyo kuwawezesha wananchi katika ngazi za kijamii. Mfuko huu unafanya kazi katika kaunti yote sita za Turkana—Turkana Central, Turkana West, Turkana South, Turkana East, Turkana North, na Loima. Kupitia usambazaji huu, umefanya maendeleo makubwa katika upatikanaji wa ufadhili wa gharama nafuu. Hadi sasa, takriban Sh 113 milioni zimegawanywa kwa vikundi vya kijamii vilivyopangwa katika Kaunti ya Turkana. Msaada huu umewafikia wanufaika 1,299, huku Sh 71,298,617 zikiwa bado ziko tayari kwa ajili ya kukopesha—ikitoa fursa kwa vikundi zaidi kupata ufadhili na kupanua shughuli zao za kiuchumi ndani ya kaunti.

Mgawanyo wa vikundi vinavyopatiwa fedha unaonyesha dhamira thabiti ya ujumuishi na ushiriki wa jamii. Kutoka kwenye jumla ya vikundi vilivyopatiwa, 556 ni vikundi vya wanawake, 721 ni vikundi vya vijana, na 22 ni vikundi vya watu wenye ulemavu, ikionyesha mtazamo wa Mfuko kuhakikisha vikundi dhafu na vilivyo kando vinashiriki kikamilifu katika maendeleo ya kiuchumi. Juhudi za hivi karibuni za kuhusha mpango huu zinaanza kuzaa

matunda. Katika Turkana West, jumla ya Sh 2.2 milioni hivi karibuni imetolewa kwa vikundi 29, ikiwa ni pamoja na vikundi 19 vipya na vikundi 10 vya kurejesha mikopo. Hatua hii inaashiria dhamira mpya ya kuwawezesha wajasiriamali wa ngazi za kijamii na kufungua fursa za kiuchumi katika eneo hilo. Kaunti zingine pia zinatarajiwa kuanza tena usambazaji baada ya ushirikiano mpya na kuhushwa kwa mpango. Kupitia mikopo hii, mamia ya vikundi vimeanzisha biashara kama vile biashara ya rejareja, uvuvi, minyororo ya thamani ya mifugo, ufundi, kilimo-biashara, na huduma za usafirishaji wa bodaboda. Idadi kubwa ya vikundi vinavyonufaika vinaongozwa na wanawake, ikionyesha nafasi muhimu ya wanawake katika kudumisha maisha ya kaya na kuimarisha uchumi wa jamii. Vikundi vya vijana pia vimefaidika na Mfuko huu kuunda ajira katika sekta kama usafirishaji, biashara ndogo ndogo za rejareja, na utoaji wa huduma mbalimbali.



Mjadala ulihusu usimamizi wa miundombinu muhimu, ikiwa ni pamoja na mitandao ya 5G, wigo wa intaneti, na nyaya za chini ya bahari, huku pia ukikabiliana

na ongezeko la taarifa zisizo sahihi zinazotokana na AI na umuhimu wa kuhakikisha mazingira salama mtandaoni kwa watoto na vijana.

waa yanayotumia algoriti yanapopanga kile watu wanaona na kuamini. Kuhakikisha upatikanaji wa taarifa za kuaminika lazima ibaki kipaumbele katika mazungumzo ya kidijitali," alisema Bi. Nikolay. Isaboke alisisitiza azma ya Kenya ya kwenda mbali zaidi ya kuwa mtumiaji wa teknolojia, bali kuwa mshiriki hai katika uchumi wa kidijitali duniani. "EU inaleta utaalumu wa kiufundi na mifano iliyothibitishwa ambayo itasaidia Kenya kufanya maamuzi ya kimkakati juu ya mgawanyo wa wigo, upanuzi wa 5G, na usimamizi wa AI. Ushirikiano wao ni muhimu kuhakikisha mabadiliko yetu ya kidijitali ni salama, jumuishi, na endelevu," alisema PS Isaboke. Waliohudhuria pia ni Temesi Mukani, Katibu wa Habari na Utangazaji, na Patricia Terer Ondeng, Katibu wa Mawasiliano kwa Umma.

Kaunti ya Vihiga yazindua mpango wa chanjo ya mifugo wa e-Vocha

Kaunti ya Vihiga imezindua rasmi mpango wa kinga na utambulisho wa mifugo kwa njia ya kielektroniki (e-voucher) unaolenga kuzuia magonjwa ya mifugo, kuboresha uzalishaji, na kuongeza ufuatiliaji wa bidhaa za wanyama sokoni. Mpango huo ulizinduliwa katika shamba la Leah Iminza katika Kijiji cha Budaywa, Wilaya Ndogo ya Sabatia, na Gavana wa Vihiga, Dkt. Wilber Ottichilo, pamoja na Kamishna wa Kaunti ya Vihiga, Peter Maina. Mpango huu unalenga kutoa chanjo na utambulisho wa kidijitali kwa ng'ombe kote kaunti ili kudhibiti magonjwa kama Ugonjwa wa Mdomo na Mkojo (FMD), Anthrax, na Ugonjwa wa Ngozi yenye Vimbe (Lumpy Skin Disease). Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi, Mkurugenzi wa Huduma za Mifugo wa Kaunti ya Vihiga, Dkt. Darlington Kadenge, alisema kuwa kaunti tayari imechanja takriban ng'ombe 11,000 kati ya malengo ya ng'ombe 80,000. Alibainisha kuwa ingawa mpango huo mwanzoni ulikumbwa na changamoto za kiufundi zina-zohusiana na mfumo wa usajili wa kidijitali, changamoto hizo tayari zimepatiwa ufumbuzi na idara ya Teknolojia ya Habari (IT). Kadenge alimpongeza Kamishna wa Kaunti na timu yake kwa kusaidia kuhamasisha wakulima kote kaunti, hasa katika Wadi ya Walodeya, ambapo wakulima walipatiwa elimu juu ya umuhimu wa chanjo na utambulisho wa mifugo. "Ningependa kutoa shukrani kwa Kamishna wa Kaunti na timu yake kwa kutusaidia kuhamasisha

sha wakulima na kuwaelimisha juu ya umuhimu wa chanjo ya FMD na utambulisho wa mifugo," alisema Kadenge. Mjumbe wa Kamati Tendaji wa Kaunti wa Kilimo, Mifugo na Uvuvi, Nicholas Kitungulu, alieleza kuridhishwa na maendeleo yaliyopatikana hadi sasa, akibainisha kuwa idadi ya ng'ombe waliyochanjwa inaongezeka kwa kasi. Hata hivyo, alibainisha kuwa kaunti ina muda mdogo kufikia lengo la chanjo na kuwaasa wakulima kusajili mifugo yao na kushiriki katika mpango huu kabla ya muda kuisha. "Tunaendelea vizuri na tunakaribia kufikia ng'ombe

12,000 waliyochanjwa, lakini bado tuna kazi ya kufanya kufikia lengo la ng'ombe 80,000," alisema Kitungulu. Alisisitiza kuwa chanjo na utambulisho wa mifugo ni hatua muhimu katika kulinda uwekezaji wa wakulima na kuimarisha sekta ya mifugo ya kaunti. Naibu Gavana wa Vihiga, Wilberforce Kitiezo, alisema mpango huo utasaidia kulinda mifugo dhidi ya magonjwa yanayoathiri kwa kiasi kikubwa uzalishaji na maisha ya wakulima. Alibainisha kuwa kudhibiti magonjwa ya mifugo kutasababisha mifugo kuwa na afya nzuri, ongezeko la uzalishaji wa maziwa na kuboresha ubora wa nyama

kwa matumizi ya binadamu. Kitiezo pia alikiri juhudi za wakulima wanawake katika Wadi ya Busali ambao wamekuwa wakishiriki kikamilifu katika shughuli za kilimo. Aliwahimiza vijana na wanaume wa kaunti pia kuzingatia kilimo na ufugaji kama shughuli za kiuchumi zinazolipa. "Utajiri wetu uko katika kuweka juhudi zaidi kwenye mashamba yetu na kufanya kilimo kiwe biashara," alisema Kitiezo. Kamishna Maina alithibitisha kuwa serikali ya kitaifa inashirikiana kwa karibu na serikali ya kaunti kutekeleza mpango wa e-chanjo kote nchini. Kamishna wa Kaunti

alieleza kuwa mpango huu, unaoendeshwa na serikali ya kitaifa, unalenga kuhakikisha mifugo kote nchini inachanjwa na kusajiliwa kidijitali. Maina alisema mpango huo utasaidia kufuatilia asili ya nyama inayouzwa katika hoteli, vibanda vya kuuza nyama na masoko mengine, hivyo kuboresha usalama wa chakula na kuongezeka kwa imani ya walaji. "Nchini zilizoendelea, mifugo inachanjwa na kusajiliwa ili nyama inayotumika katika hoteli au kuuza kwenye vibanda vya nyama iweze kufuatiliwa kutoka chanzo chake," alisema. Alihimiza wakulima katika Wadi ya Busali na sehemu nyingine za kaunti kusajili mifugo yao na kuhakikisha inachanjwa ndani ya wiki nne zinazobaki za mpango huu. Gavana Wilber Ottichilo alisema serikali ya kaunti imekubali mpango wa e-chanjo ili kuboresha ubora na usalama wa bidhaa za wanyama sokoni. Alibainisha kuwa mpango wa chanjo utazua magonjwa makubwa ya mifugo ikiwa ni pamoja na FMD, Anthrax na Lumpy Skin Disease. Kulingana na Gavana, mpango huo pia unajumuisha utambulisho wa kidijitali wa ng'ombe, unaosaidia kuthibitisha umiliki na kufuatilia mifugo iwapo itapotea au kuibiwa. Alieleza kuwa utambulisho wa ng'ombe unafanywa kupitia mchakato wa usajili wa kidijitali unaorekodi sifa za kipekee za kila mnyama. Gavana Ottichilo aliongeza kuwa serikali ya kitaifa na ya kaunti zitalipia pamoja gharama ya mpango huu. Chini ya mpangilio huo, serikali itachangia Sh110 kwa ajili ya mchakato wa chanjo na usajili, huku wakulima wakilipia Sh50 tu kwa kila mnyama.

Ministry charts bold path to decarbonize the building sector

Kenya has unveiled a roadmap to cut emissions from its building and construction sector responsible for nearly a third of the nation's greenhouse gases as the country races to balance urgent housing needs with climate resilience.

Climate shocks are intensifying, with floods in late 2025 displacing more than 55,000 households and destroying over 1,000 homes.

The economic toll is staggering, climate-related disasters already cost the country an estimated 3% of GDP each year.

Recognizing this urgency, the State Department for Public Works has unveiled the Kenya National Buildings and Construction Decarbonization Roadmap (2026–2040).

Developed in collaboration with the Architectural Association of Kenya and sector partners, the roadmap provides a comprehensive strategy to align the building sector with the Paris Agreement and Kenya's Building Breakthrough commitment.

Speaking at the launch, Works Secretary Nicholas Mutua emphasized that the legacy being built is one of resilient infrastructure and a new paradigm for Kenya's built environment.

According to Mutua, the building and construction sector accounts for nearly 32% of Kenya's greenhouse gas emissions, or about 7.2 million tonnes of CO₂ annually.

He pointed out that much of this comes not only from energy use in buildings but also from the extraction, production, and transportation of materials.

Cement and steel, in particular, are carbon-intensive, with cement alone responsible for 8% of global emissions.

Without intervention, Kenya's rising demand for these materials will drive emissions even higher.

Alternative binders such as fly ash, slag, and natural pozzolans can reduce reliance on Portland cement, while sustainable timber, bamboo, stabilized earth blocks, and recycled steel offer greener alternatives.

Design practices that enable deconstruction and reuse of components are encouraged, reducing demand for virgin resources and minimizing waste.

Innovation in material manufacturing creating products that are durable, recyclable, and energy-efficient will further cut embodied carbon.

Commenting on waste management is another critical focus, Eng. Maurice Akech, Executive Director of the National Construction Authority, highlighted the challenge of construction and demolition waste, which often ends up in landfills or informal

dumps.

The roadmap advocates for a circular economy approach, beginning with on-site waste reduction and segregation.

Recycling facilities to crush concrete, repurpose metals, and reprocess plastics are vital, supported by policy incentives and regulatory frameworks that enforce waste minimization targets.

This not only reduces emissions but also creates new economic opportunities in recycling and materials recovery.

The roadmap sets ambitious targets: by 2030, emissions from the sector are to be reduced from 10 metric tonnes of carbon equivalent to 6.8 metric tonnes a 3.2 million-tonne cut.

These reductions will come from both operational emissions (energy used in heating, cooling, and lighting) and embodied carbon from materials and waste.

This integrated lifecycle approach makes the roadmap one of the first comprehensive strategies in the region to address the full carbon footprint of buildings.

To achieve these goals, six transformation pillars have been identified, they include: mobilizing finance through innovative mechanisms such as green bonds and blended finance; strengthening policy and regulatory frameworks with updated building codes; enhancing water and energy efficiency through technologies like solar heating and rainwater harvesting; promoting sustainable construction practices; building technical capacity among architects, engineers, and artisans; and investing in research, data, and innovation to guide evidence-based planning.

Recognizing that financing is crucial, the government has also launched the Kenya Buildings Decarbonization Funding Accelerator.

This initiative brings together leaders from finance, insurance, construction, and development to fast-track investment into sustainable projects. By de-risking ventures and mobilizing capital, the accelerator aims to turn strategy into action.

Arch. George Arabbu, President of the Architectural Association of Kenya, reminded stakeholders that buildings last for decades.

He said that poorly constructed facilities lock communities into high energy costs and vulnerability, while sustainable buildings create jobs, boost manufacturing, and improve public health. The roadmap, he stressed, is not just about climate—it is a development intervention for all Kenyans.

Ultimately, the roadmap is about more than emissions. It is about affordable, comfortable homes with lower energy bills, healthier living conditions, and a construction sector that supports economic growth while safeguarding the environment.

Kenya iko tayari kuandaa Kongamano la Kimataifa la Afya ya Mama, Mtoto Mchanga na Mtoto (IMNHC 2026), hatua inayoiweka nchi katikati ya juhudi za kimataifa za kuharakisha hatua za kupunguza vifo vinavyoweza kuzuilika vya akina mama na watoto wachanga. Kongamano hilo la ngazi ya juu litakalofanyika kuanzia tarehe 23 hadi 26 Machi 2026 katika Kituo cha Mikutano cha Edge jijini Nairobi, linatarajiwa kuvutia washiriki zaidi ya 1,800 kutoka zaidi ya nchi 100, wakiwemo watunga sera, wataalamu wa afya, watafiti, washirika wa maendeleo, mashirika ya kiraia na wadau wa sekta binafsi. Mkutano huo wa siku nne unakuja katika kipindi nyeti kwa afya ya kimataifa, ambapo maendeleo katika kupunguza vifo vya akina mama na watoto wachanga yamepungua kwa kiasi kikubwa tangu mwaka 2016, na kuziacha nchi nyingi zikiwa mbali kufikia Malengo ya Maendeleo Endelevu ya mwaka 2030. Kila mwaka, mamiloni ya wanawake na watoto wachanga bado hufariki kutokana na sababu zinazoweza kuzuilika, huku mafanikio yaliyopatikana katika muongo uliopita yakiwa hatarini kutokana na

mabadiliko ya ufadhili wa afya duniani na changamoto zinazoenenda katika mifumo ya afya. Akizungumza wakati wa mkutano na wanahabari jijini Nairobi kabla ya kongamano hilo, Mkuu wa Afya ya Uzazi, Mama, Mtoto Mchanga na Mtoto, Dkt. Edward Serem, alisema mkutano huo unatoa fursa muhimu kwa nchi kukabiliana na hali halisi na kuharakisha hatua. “Kongamano hili si la majadiliano pekee. Ni kuhusu kutathmini tulipo, kubaini kinachofanya kazi, na kuku-baliana juu ya hatua za vitendo zitakazookoa maisha,” alisema. Kama nchi mwenyeji, Kenya



Shughuli mpya ya kupambana na ufisadi yalenga Hifadhi za Viwanda katika kaunti

Idara ya Serikali ya Viwanda imeshirikiana na Tume ya Maadili na Kupambana na Ufisadi (EACC) kufanya zoezi la kitaifa la ufuatiliaji wa uzingatiaji wa sheria katika utekelezaji wa Mpango wa Mbuga za Ukusanyaji na Viwanda za Kaunti (CAIPs). Katibu wa Viwanda, Dkt. Juma Mukhwana, alisema zoezi hilo linalenga kuimarisha uwazi, uwajibikaji na uzingatiaji wa mifumo ya kisheria katika usimamizi wa mpango huo unaotekelezwa kwa ushirikiano kati ya serikali ya kitaifa na zile za kaunti. Akizungumza wakati wa kutangaza mpango huo katika makao makuu ya wizara jijini Nairobi, Dkt. Mukhwana alisema timu ya wataalamu kutoka tume ya kupambana na ufisadi itatathmini mifumo na taratibu zinaoongoza utekelezaji wa mpango huo ili kuhakikisha matumizi bora ya rasilimali za umma. “Zoezi la ufuatiliaji wa uzingatiaji wa sheria litafanywa na timu ya wataalamu kutoka Tume ya Maadili na Kupambana na Ufisadi ili kupitia mifumo, taratibu na mbinu zinazohusiana na utekelezaji wa mpango huu,” alisisitiza Mukhwana. Zoezi hilo litaangazia maeneo muhimu yakiwemo michakato ya ununuzi, mifumo ya usimamizi wa fedha, miundo ya uongozi, na mfumo mzima wa utekelezaji wa mbuga hizo za viwanda. za umma zilizotengwa kwa ajili ya mradi huu,” alieleza. Dkt. Mukhwana aliongeza kuwa mchakato huo pia utasaidia kubaini udhaifu unaoweza kufanya mpango huo kuwa katika hatari ya ufisadi na kupendekeza hatua za kurekebisha ili kuimarisha mifumo ya taasisi. “Tunatarajia zoezi hili litabaini mapungufu katika mfumo wa utekelezaji na kutoa map-

endekezo yatakayosaidia kuimarisha uadilifu na uwajibikaji katika mpango huu,” alisema. Mpango wa Mbuga za Ukusanyaji na Viwanda za Kaunti ni mpango muhimu wa serikali unaolenga kukuza uchakataji wa mazao ya kilimo na kuongeza thamani katika ngazi ya kaunti. Kupitia mpango huu, serikali inalenga kuanzisha vituo vitavyosaidia ukusanyaji, uhifadhi, uchakataji na uuzaji wa mazao

ya kilimo karibu na maeneo ya uzalishaji. Pia unatarajiwa kuimarisha minyororo ya thamani ya kilimo, kupunguza hasara baada ya mavuno na kuboresha upatikanaji wa masoko kwa wakulima. Kwa muktadha huo, Dkt. Mukhwana alithibitisha kuwa mpango huo unaendana na ajenda pana ya serikali ya kukuza viwanda na kusaidia uzalishaji wa ndani. “Mpango wa Mbuga za Ukus-

anyaji na Viwanda za Kaunti ni sehemu muhimu ya juhudi za serikali za kuimarisha maendeleo ya viwanda vinavyohusiana na kilimo na kuongeza thamani katika sekta ya kilimo,” alisisitiza. Chini ya mfumo wa ufadhili wa mpango huo, serikali ya kitaifa imejitolea kutoa shilingi milioni 250 kwa kila kaunti kusaidia ujenzi wa mbuga hizo za viwanda, huku serikali za kaunti zikitakiwa kuchangia fedha sawia. Kwa mujibu wa Idara ya Serikali ya Viwanda, serikali ya kitaifa tayari imetoa shilingi bilioni 4.052 kwa ajili ya mpango huo, huku kaunti kumi tayari zikipokea mgao kamili wa shilingi milioni 250 kila moja, hatua iliyowaweza kuanza ujenzi wa mbuga hizo. Katika mwaka wa fedha 2025/2026, serikali ilitenga shilingi bilioni 4.448 zaidi ili kuharakisha utekelezaji wa mpango huo. Kati ya fedha hizo, awamu ya kwanza ya shilingi bilioni 2.224 tayari imetolewa kwa kaunti 24 kusaidia maendeleo yanayoendelea ya miradi hiyo. Pindi zitakapoanza kufanya kazi, mbuga hizo za viwanda zinataraajiwa kusaidia viwanda vya uchakataji wa mazao ya kilimo, kuongeza thamani na kuchochea shughuli za kiuchumi katika kaunti mbalimbali nchini.

alisema.

Katibu Mkuu huyo pia alieleza kuwa mbinu ya kimoduli chini ya CBET inatoa unyumbufu na uwezekano wa kujikita katika utaalumu maalum, hivyo kuwawezesha wanafunzi kupata ujuzi mahususi katika maeneo tofauti.

“Lazima tujenge ushirikiano imara zaidi na sekta ya viwanda ili kuhakikisha programu zetu za mafunzo zinaendana na mahitaji halisi ya sehemu za kazi. Hili litaongeza ajira kwa wahitimu na pia kuchochea ubunifu na tija katika uchumi,” aliongeza.

Majadiliano hayo pia yalichunguza mikakati ya kuhakikisha programu za mafunzo zinasisishwa mara kwa mara ili kuakisi maeneo ya utaalumu yanayohitajika katika sekta mbalimbali za uchumi. Mpango wa kilimo Kirinyaga walenga wanawake 5,000, vijana kwa mapato

Takriban wanawake na vijana 5,000 katika kaunti za Kirinyaga na Embu wanatarajiwa kunufaika na mpango mpya wa ufadhili na kujikimu kimaisha unaolenga kuongeza mapato ya kaya kupitia kilimo himilivu kwa mabadiliko ya tabianchi na kilimo rejelevu. Mpango huo, unaoitwa Mradi wa Flourish, unatekelezwa na shirika la Rainforest Alliance kwa ufadhili kutoka Coca-Cola Foundation. Mpango huu unalenga kuwawezesha wanawake wa vijijini na wakulima vijana ambao kwa muda mrefu wamekumbwa na vikwazo vya upatikanaji wa rasilimali za kifedha na fursa za kilimo. Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi wa mradi huo mjini Kagio, kaunti ya Kirinyaga, Mkurugenzi wa Nchi wa Rainforest Alliance, Marion Ng'anga, alisema mpango huo unalenga kusaidia makundi yaliyotengwa, hasa wanawake wa vijijini, ambao mara nyingi hutengwa kutokana na mitazamo ya kijinsia na mifumo dume katika sekta ya kilimo. Ng'anga alibainisha kuwa ukosefu wa ufikiaji wa msaada wa kifedha na suluhisho bunifu za ufadhili umefanya iwe vigumu kwa wanawake wengi wakulima kutumia teknolojia za kisasa za kilimo na zana za kidijitali ambazo zingeboresha uzalishaji na ufikiaji wa mikopo nafuu. Alisema mradi wa Flourish utawatambulisha wanufaika katika mafunzo ya ujuzi wa kifedha, vikundi vya akiba na mikopo vya kijamii (VSLAs), pamoja na majukwaa ya kifedha ya kidijitali, hatua itakayowawezesha kupata ufadhili nafuu kutoka kwa kampuni za teknolojia ya kifedha na taasisi za fedha ndogo.

“Kupitia mradi huu, tunatarajia kujumuisha makundi yaliyotengwa, hasa wanawake na vijana, na kuwaunga mkono zaidi ya mazao yaliyoidhinishwa ambayo Rainforest Alliance kawaida huzingatia kama chai na kahawa,” alisema Ng'anga. Mpango huo wa miezi 18, ulioanza mwishoni mwa mwaka jana na unaotarajiwa kukamilika Aprili 2027, pia utahamasisha mseto wa mazao yenye thamani ya juu na kilimo mseto cha miti (agroforestry), huku ukiwapa wakulima ujuzi wa kilimo rejelevu na kinachozingatia mabadiliko ya tabianchi. Mchumi wa Kilimo wa Kaunti ya Kirinyaga, Mercy Mwangi, aliukaribisha mpango huo akibainisha kuwa Rainforest Alliance imewahi kuwasaidia

wakulima katika minyororo ya thamani ya kahawa na chai, hasa katika uthibitishaji na mbinu endelevu za kilimo. Alisema mradi huo mpya utawawezesha wakulima, hasa wanawake na vijana, kupata ufadhili wa kijani na msaada wa kujikimu kimaisha, hivyo kuimarisha uwezo wao wa kukabiliana na mabadiliko ya tabianchi huku wakiongeza mapato ya kaya. “Kama kaunti, tunathamini kazi ambayo Rainforest Alliance imekuwa ikifanya kusaidia wakulima wetu katika masuala ya kilimo endelevu na mabadiliko ya tabianchi,” alisema, akiongeza kuwa serikali ya kaunti itashirikiana kwa karibu na shirika hilo kuhakikisha wakulima wanunufaika na mpango huo. Mkurugenzi wa Kilimo wa

Kaunti ya Embu, Patrick Njeru, pia aliusifu ushirikiano huo akisema kuwa ushirikiano kati ya serikali za kaunti na washirika wa maendeleo ni muhimu katika kuimarisha uzalishaji wa kilimo na ustahimilivu wa tabianchi. Njeru alisema mradi huo utahamasisha kukabiliana na mabadiliko ya tabianchi kupitia teknolojia za kilimo rejelevu. “Mabadiliko ya tabianchi ni halisi na lazima tuyakabili au tutaangamia. Ushirikiano kama huu utawasaidia wakulima wetu kuongeza uzalishaji huku wakikumbatia mbinu endelevu za kilimo,” alisema. Alihakikishia Rainforest Alliance kuwa kaunti za Embu na Kirinyaga zitatoa mazingira bora kwa ushirikiano huo.

Bandari ya Lamu yaibuka kitovu cha usafirishaji na kuwasili kwa meli kubwa

Bandari ya Lamu Seaport Binaendelea kujijengea nafasi kwa kasi kama kitovu kikuu cha usafirishaji na usambazaji (transshipment na logistics), kufuatia maboresho makubwa ya miundombinu. Hivi karibuni, bandari hiyo ilipokea meli kubwa ya kubeba magari ya MV Grande Florida Parlemo, iliyokuwa imebeba magari ya kifahari 3,800 pamoja na vipuri kutoka Japan, ambayo awali yalikuwa yakielekea Dubai lakini yakageuzwa na kuelekwa Lamu kutokana na mgogoro unaoendelea Mashariki ya Kati. Hii inaleta jumla ya magari yaliyopokelewa katika bandari hiyo ya kina kirefu kufikia zaidi ya 4,200, huku shughuli za bandari zikitarajiwa kuongezeka kadri mwaka unavyoendelea.

Maendeleo haya yanaashiria hatua muhimu kwa sekta ya bandari nchini Kenya, kwani ni mara ya kwanza kwa Lamu kupokea idadi kubwa hivyo ya magari mapya yaliyoshushwa na meli moja. Bandari hiyo inatarajiwa kuendelea kufanya vizuri zaidi kadri kampuni nyingi za kimataifa za usafirishaji zinavyoanzisha huduma za mara kwa mara. Wadau wa sekta ya baharini wanasema bandari ya Lamu inaweza kunufaika pakubwa na mabadiliko ya njia za kimataifa za usafirishaji, hasa wakati vita katika Mashariki ya Kati vina vyovuruga biashara ya baharini. Hali hii inachangiwa na ukweli kwamba kampuni nyingi za kimataifa zinatafuta njia mbadala zilizo salama na tulivu zaidi badala ya maeneo yenye migogoro. Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Kenya

Ports Authority, Kapteni William Ruto, amesema kuwa Lamu inaibuka kama kitovu muhimu cha usafirishaji kutokana na eneo lake la kimkakati, maboresho ya miundombinu na mabadiliko ya njia za biashara za kimataifa. Amesema kuwa jumla ya meli 74 zimetia nanga katika bandari hiyo tangu Januari 2026, jambo linaloonyesha kuongezeka kwa imani katika ufanisi wake na nafasi yake ya kimkakati katika njia ya usafirishaji wa Bahari ya Hindi. “Bandari ya Lamu inaendelea

kukua na kuwa moja ya vituo vikubwa vya usafirishaji na upokeaji mizigo katika eneo hili, ikiwa na miundombinu ya kisasa inayoweza kuhudumia baadhi ya meli kubwa zaidi duniani,” alisema.
