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# Afueni Serikali ikichukua hatua kulipa deni la kahawa

NA SAMUEL WAITITU NA MUTAI KIPNG'ETICH (KNA)

Serikali imeanza kulipa madeni ya kahawa yaliyothibitishwa yenye thamani ya Shilingi bilioni 6.8, kama sehemu ya ajenda pana ya mageuzi yenye lengo la kuimarisha sekta hiyo na kuongeza uzalishaji wa kitaifa. Waziri wa Vyama vya Ushirika na Biashara Ndogo na za Kati (MSMEs), Wycliffe Oparanya, alitangaza kuwa madai yote yatakatolipwa ni yale tu yaliyokaguliwa na kuthibitishwa kuwa halali, akionya kuwa mikopo ya kubuni haitazingatiwa na inaweza kusababisha hatua za kisheria. Akizungumza na wakulima katika kaunti za Embu na Kirinyaga, Oparanya alisisitiza kuwa mifumo madhubuti ya uthibitishaji imetumika, na kuhakikisha kuwa madeni yaliyo na nyaraka sahihi na kumbukumbu zilizo dhinishwa pekee ndiyo yatakatolipwa. "Chama chochote cha ushirika ambacho deni lake halijaonyeshwa katika ripoti ya ukaguzi kitalazimika kushughulikia majukumu hayo ndani ya mfumo wake," alisema, akiongeza kuwa Shilingi bilioni 2 tayari zimetengwa kwa

awamu ya kwanza ya malipo. Katika mabadiliko makubwa ya sera, Oparanya alipiga marufuku vyama vya ushirika kununua mashine zao za kusaga kahawa. Badala yake, huduma za usagaji zitawekwa chini ya usimamizi wa New Kenya Planters Cooperative Union (KPCU).

Alisema hatua hiyo itapunguza gharama, kupunguza vifaa visivyotumika, na kuondoa gharama zinazohusiana na wafanyakazi maalum, matengenezo na ulinzi. "Tunataka hali ambapo chama chochote kinachohitaji huduma za usagaji kitashirikiana na New KPCU kwa ada ndogo," alisema,

akibainisha kuwa huduma za pamoja zitapunguza gharama za uchakataji kwa wakulima. Serikali pia imepiga marufuku vyama vya ushirika kukopa kutoka benki za kibiashara kwa ajili ya pembejeo au malipo ya awali ya kahawa ghafi. Ili kuwasaidia wakulima, Oparanya alieleza kuhusu Mfuko wa Mzunguko wa Malipo ya Awali ya Kahawa (CCARF) na Mfumo wa Malipo ya Moja kwa Moja (DSS). Kupitia CCARF, wakulima wanaweza kupata mikopo nafuu kwa pembejeo na mahitaji ya nyumbani, huku DSS ikihakikisha malipo yanawekwa moja kwa moja katika akaunti za wakulima ndani ya siku tano baada ya mauzo ya kahawa katika Soko la Kahawa la Nairobi. "Kwa kuwepo kwa mikakati hii, hakuna sababu kwa vyama vya ushirika kukopa kutoka kwa wakopeshaji wa kibiashara," alisisitiza. Mbali na kulipa madeni, serikali inalenga kuongeza uzalishaji wa kahawa mara tatu kutoka tani metriki 50,000 hadi 155,000 ifikapo mwaka 2028. Akizungumzia upanuzi katika maeneo mapya na ongezeko la mashamba, Oparanya alisisitiza kuwa kahawa ni chanzo muhimu

cha fedha za kigeni, akisema mageuzi haya yanalenga kurejesha ushindani wa Kenya kimataifa. Katibu katika Idara ya Ushirika, Patrick Kilemi, alisema Kirinyaga inaongoza kwa uzalishaji wa kahawa na kusisitiza kuwa matumizi ya mbinu za kisasa za kilimo yatakuwa muhimu katika kufikia malengo ya kitaifa. Aliongeza kuwa kaunti nyingine kama Kakamega, Uasin Gishu na Trans Nzoia zimeonyesha ongezeko la hamu ya kilimo cha kahawa, hali inayochochewa na mahitaji makubwa ya miche ya kahawa. Alisema hali hiyo inaashiria kurejea kwa imani ya wakulima katika zao hilo kote nchini. Kilemi alibainisha kuwa mpango wa kufufua sekta ya kahawa unahitaji ushirikiano na ushiriki wa karibu wa wakulima. Alieleza kuwa mageuzi katika sekta hiyo yameonyesha kuwa changamoto hazipo tu katika usimamizi wa vyama vya ushirika, bali pia katika mnyororo mzima wa thamani, ikiwemo uzalishaji, uchakataji na masoko. Gavana wa Kaunti ya Kirinyaga, Anne Waiguru, alitaka serikali ya kitaifa kuharakisha msamaha wa deni la Shilingi bilioni 1.06 linalodaiwa na vyama 14 vya

Alisema madeni hayo yanawaathiri pakubwa wakulima na kuchelewesha ufufuaji wa sekta hiyo. "Kutatua mzigo wa madeni kutakamilisha mafanikio yaliyopatikana kupitia mageuzi na uwekezaji katika mnyororo wa thamani wa kahawa," alisema. Waiguru alieleza kufufuka kwa sekta ya kahawa Kirinyaga, ambapo uzalishaji umeongezeka kutoka tani metriki 28,000 mwaka 2017 hadi 48,000, huku mapato ya wakulima yakifikia Shilingi bilioni 7.4. Alitaja juhudi za makusudi za kaunti katika uzalishaji, uchakataji, uhifadhi, masoko na kuongeza thamani. "Kahawa ya Kirinyaga ni fahari yetu na zao la urithi linaloendelea kubadilisha maisha," alisema. Kahawa ya Arabica ya Kirinyaga inaendelea kuheshimika kimataifa, ambapo Waiguru alitaja Kiwanda cha Kahawa cha Kii chini ya Ushirika wa Rung'eto, ambacho kahawa yake ya daraja la AA iliuzwa kwa Shilingi 1,715 kwa kilo mwaka 2023—bei ya juu zaidi nchini Kenya katika kipindi cha miaka mitano. Alieleza mafanikio hayo yanatokana na uwekezaji wa kimkakati katika uzalishaji na ubora.

Serikali imelipa madeni syote ambayo haya-jalipwa katika sekta ya barabara, hatua inayofungua njia kwa ujenzi unaotarajiwa wa zaidi ya kilomita elfu sita za barabara kote nchini. Imebainika kuwa bili hizo, zenye thamani ya shilingi bilioni 177, zilisababisha miradi mingi kusimama miaka sita iliyopita. Akizungumza katika Kaunti ya Trans Nzoia wakati wa ziara ya ukaguzi wa miradi ya serikali ya kitaifa, Naibu Rais Profesa Kithure Kindiki alisema kuwa serikali imetataua tatizo hilo lililosababisha kusimama kwa miradi mingi ya barabara kwa kulipa bili zote zilizokuwa zimesalia. Katika Trans Nzoia, Prof. Kindiki alisema serikali ya kitaifa imetenga shilingi bilioni 38 kwa ajili ya ujenzi wa kilomita 326 za barabara mpya na kuboresha zilizopo kufikia viwango vya lami. Akihutubia umati katika Soko la Maili Saba baada ya kukagua ujenzi unaoendelea wa barabara ya kilomita 73 ya Kitale-Morpus na barabara ya kuunganisha Kitale na West Pokot, Prof. Kindiki alisema serikali imejitolea

kuhakikisha ugawaji sawa wa miradi ya maendeleo kote nchini bila upendeleo wa aina yoyote. Akisifu hatua za serikali katika sekta ya kilimo, kama ruzuku ya mbolea ambayo alisema

imeongeza uzalishaji, Prof. Kindiki aliagiza kampuni za mbegu kupunguza bei ya mbegu bora za mahindi ili kuwasaidia wakulima kukabiliana na gharama kubwa za uzalishaji. Alitoa agizo kutoka kwa Rais

ambalo litashuhudia kilo moja ya mbegu bora za mahindi inayouzwa kwa sasa kwa Sh300 kushuka hadi Sh260, huku pakiti ya kilo mbili inayouzwa kwa Sh600 itauzwa kwa Sh525. "Serikali imejitolea kuhakikisha wakulima wetu wanalindwa dhidi ya gharama kubwa za uzalishaji ili kuongeza uzalishaji na wakati huo huo kuwawezesha kupata faida. Ruzuku ya mbolea tuliyoanzisha imesababisha ongezeko la uzalishaji wa mahindi tangu mwaka 2022 ambapo kilo bilioni 44 zilivunwa hadi kilo bilioni 75 mwaka 2025," alisema. Katika sekta ya sukari, Kindiki alibainisha kuwa hatua mbalimbali za serikali zimesababisha uagizaji wa sukari kutoka nje kupungua kwa asilimia 70, akieleza matumaini kuwa nchi itafikia kujitosheleza kikamilifu katika uzalishaji wa sukari hivi karibuni. Kuhusu uunganishaji wa umeme, Kindiki alisema kuwa shilingi milioni 750 zimetengwa chini ya Mpango wa Last Mile Connectivity ili kuunganisha kaya 9,666 zaidi katika Trans Nzoia. Naibu Rais aliandamana na Waziri wa Mazingira, Mabadiliko ya Tabianchi na Misitu Dkt. Deborah Barasa, Seneta wa Trans Nzoia Allan Chesang, Mwakilishi wa Wanawake wa Trans Nzoia Lillian Siyoi, Mbunge wa Kiminini Kakai Bisau miongoni mwa wengine.



Waziri wa Jinsia, Utamaduni, Sanaa na Urithi, Hannah Wendot, ameibua wasiwasi kuhusu kukaa kwa muda mrefu kwa watoto katika taasisi za serikali, akifichua kuwa baadhi ya watoto waliokinzana na sheria wamezuiliwa kwa zaidi ya miaka miwili—mbali na muda wa kishe-ria uliowekwa wa miezi sita. Akizungumza katika Makao ya Watoto ya Kusubiri Hukumu ya Kisumu wakati wa ziara ya ukaguzi wa nyumba za watoto na vituo vya uokoaji wa manusura wa

### TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR REQUEST FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST FOR COPPER AT KAMACABI IN THARAKA NITHI COUNTY, KENYA

#### Project Background

The government of Kenya, through the Ministry of Mining, Blue Economy and Maritime Affairs, has identified several minerals as Strategic Minerals. Copper is one of the minerals categorised as Strategic. To commercialise this resource, the government intends to award the mineral rights over the area through a public tender process as guided by the Mining Act Cap 306 and the Mining (Award of Mineral Rights by Tender) Regulations, 2017.

Upon issuance of the Mineral Right (Prospecting Licence), the project proponent will be expected to adhere to the provisions of the Mining Act and its attendant regulations.

#### Project Overview

The metamorphic rocks of the area formed in the Neoproterozoic era with mineralogical composition resulting from regional plastic deformation and granitization from pre-existing sedimentary rocks of highly varying classes. Varieties of gabbros, norites, bojites and pyroxenites and their derivatives form the bulk of the basic intrusive rocks documented in the area. The chemical and mineralogical profiles of the basic-ultrabasic rocks are highly varied with hypersthene, olivine, plagioclase and hornblende generally being the dominant constituent minerals. Hornblendite, pyroxenite, peridotites, dolerites and diorites have been documented as common basic intrusive associated with the metamorphic rocks. Both malachite and azurite copper mineralization were observed in the biotite gneiss. The gneisses are coarse grained, composed majorly of quartz, feldspars and biotite. Copper mineralized in pegmatites are also a common occurrence in the area. The pegmatites vary in composition and texture but in general are all granitic, coarse grained with the main mineral constituents being feldspars and quartz. Lastly, copper occur in dykes which are medium to coarse grained with a general composition of quartz, feldspars and biotite. The dykes occur both concordant and discordant to the biotite gneiss that host them.

The Ministry of Mining, Blue Economy and Maritime Affairs recently concluded a nationwide airborne geophysical survey and is in custody of latest radiometric and magnetic data over the project area. The data and resultant grids form primary geophysical information for the winning bidder in undertaking detailed exploration over the area.

#### Project Location, Geological Setting and Estimates

**Location:** The project is situated in Tharaka Nithi County within the following coordinates 0°03' 12"N, 38°02' 05"E to 0°04' 57"S, 38°09' 50"E and covering an area of approximately 196.2800 km<sup>2</sup>.

**Geological Setting:** Copper mineralized in this area is found in three forms namely within the biotite schists, pegmatites and within dykes. Both malachite and azurite copper mineralization are found in the biotite gneiss. The pegmatites that bear copper vary in composition and texture but in general are all granitic, coarse grained with the main mineral constituents being feldspars and quartz. Lastly, copper occur in dykes which are medium to coarse grained with a general composition of quartz, feldspars and biotite. The dykes occur both concordant and discordant to the biotite gneiss that host them.

**Resource Estimates:** XRF results has shown copper concentrations ranging from about 1-31% across the areas covering Kamacabi, Gatue, Kiamiramba and Maragwa. Additionally, AAS results from Maragwa showed a chalcocopyrite copper ore with abundance ranging from 2.6-19.5%. A NW-SE trending low mag anomaly approximately 200meters long and 70meters wide is observed in the far-right section of the area suspected to host the copper mineralization.

**Accessibility:** The area is accessible through Nairobi- Meru road and branching at Embu- Ishiara road. Meru – Marimanti road equally leads to the study area.

## Status of Compliance with Values and Principles in Articles 10 and 232 of the Constitution for the financial year 2024/2025

### MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRPERSON

This Report provides information on the status of compliance with values and principles in Article 10 and 232 of the Constitution in public institutions during the period 2024-2025. The information is on the measures taken to promote the values and principles, progress achieved, challenges faced and recommendations made for the progressive realisation of the cited values and principles.

The Report, the fourteenth since the promulgation of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, was prepared pursuant to Article 234 (2) (c) and (h) and Sections 63 and 64 of the Public Service Commission Act, CAP 185. Additionally, Section 16 of the Public Service

(Values and Principles) Act, CAP 185A, requires each service commission to prepare and submit a report on the status of the promotion of values and principles to the President and Parliament by December 31st of each year.

The evaluation targeted 606 public institutions, which fall under the Jurisdiction of the Commission under Article 234(3) of the Constitution, across six service sectors of Constitutional Commissions and Independent Offices, ministries and state departments, state corporations and SAGAs, Public Universities, Statutory Commissions and Authorities and Technical

and Vocational Training Institutes. The institutions that responded to the survey tool were 511 which was a response rate of 84.3%.

The Commission also administered a second tool targeting 41 oversight institutions which provided secondary data for use in the triangulation of the information received through the crosscutting tool which also had a response rate of 82.9%. All the targeted institutions were however required to respond as this is a constitutional reporting requirement where all eligible institutions were required to comply. The Commission has therefore cited all the non-responsive institutions.

The overall performance index for the period under review was

43.5%, a marginal drop from the 43.8% recorded in the previous year 2023-2024 and an indication that most of the institutions were at medium achiever category. What this implies is that compliance with constitutional values and principles in the public service is at average performance, a situation that should concern all of us as Kenyans, and moreso, public servants as duty bearers.

Based on the findings, much needs to be done to promote compliance with constitutional values and principles. The Commission will continue to engage all institutions under its constitutional jurisdiction to ensure compliance with the values and principles in Article 10 and 232 as required.

## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2024/2025 VALUES AND PRINCIPLES COMPLIANCE EVALUATION REPORT

#### i) Promotion of Values and Principles

Section 11 of the Public Service (Values and Principles) Act, CAP 185A requires the public service to promote public participation in upholding public service values and principles. Further, Sessional Paper No. 8 of 2013 on National Values and Principles of Governance, and the Framework for the Implementation of Values and Principles (2015) guide the promotion of values and principles. During the evaluation period, public institutions undertook various activities to promote the national and public service values and principles.

**Findings:** Most (70.8%) of the evaluated institutions did not train officers on values and principles, 205 (40.3%) of the institutions conducted civic education, 151 (29.5%) used media talk shows to promote the values and principles, 200 (39.1%) utilised social media platforms to advance these values, 98 (19.2%) institutions promoted values through artwork, 188 (36.8%) institutions used performing arts like drama (41.8%), music (36.4%), poetry (12%) and film (9.7%) for promotion of values. A total of 232 (45.4%) institutions utilised sporting activities to promote values. Finally, 95 (18.6%) institutions developed IEC materials on values such as posters (60.1%), brochures (60%), flyers (47.4%) and banners (16.8%).

**Recommendation:** Public institutions should leverage technology and provide online training on values and principles to promote compliance.

#### ii) General information on personnel practices

The evaluation on general information on personnel practices covered several aspects which cut across several thematic areas impacting service delivery, performance management and efficient and economic use of resources. They included establishment and abolition

of offices, appointments, payroll management, leave management, secondments, transfers, authorised establishments and the total number of staff in post.

#### (a) Establishment and abolition of offices

Section 27 of the Public Service Commission Act, CAP 185 and policy guidelines on establishment and abolition of offices issued by the Commission in 2015, require that a workload analysis be conducted before an office is established and this guides the approval of organisational structures.

**Findings:** 86 (27.4%) institutions established new offices, out of which 15 (17.4%) had undertaken workload analysis, while 71 (82.6%) had not.

**Recommendation:** Public institutions to comply with the requirements on establishment and abolition of offices, and that workload analysis reports form part of the annexures when institutions request for the establishment of offices.

#### (b) Staff establishment

**Findings:** Staffing levels - 293 (93.3%) institutions submitted staff establishment reports based on approved organisational structures, 3 institutions had ideal staff establishments, 18 were over-established, while 272 were under-established, leading to overworking some employees where under establishment exists and under utilisation of employees where over establishment exists.

#### (c) Terms and conditions of service

Officers in the public service are engaged on various terms and conditions of service including permanent and pensionable terms and short term contracts. Public institutions may engage casual workers, but they must comply with the requirements of the Employ-

ment Act, CAP 226 on engagement of casuals.

**Findings:** 73.4% officers were serving on permanent and pensionable terms of service, while 13.6% were on fixed-term contracts. 27.8% of the institutions engaged 8,752 (3.6%) staff on temporary terms, a term not defined in the labour laws while 46% engaged 17,386 casuals.

**Recommendation:** Engagement of casuals should be as provided for in the Employment Act.

#### (d) Employee age profile

Employee age profile enables an employer plan for replacement of staff projected to exit through retirements, ensuring there is no disruption in service delivery.

**Findings:** Age distribution in the public service had a normal representation curve, with 30.8% of public officers aged 18-35 years and an average age of 41.8 years across all service sectors. The number of officers aged above 60 was 3,185 (1.3%), out of whom 506 were not eligible to serve beyond 60 years. Representation of the youth was proportionate to their share of the national population, which constitutes 29%.

#### (e) Staff exits

**Findings:** 287 (56.2%) institutions had 9,665 (4%) officers who exited the service during the 2024/2025 FY, out of whom 6,401 (66.2%) were male, 3,264 (33.8%) were female and 140 (1.4%) were PWDs. 55% of the officers exited the service through normal retirement. 79.1% of the institutions conducted exit interviews, however 35.9% did not prepare an exit report. Of the officers who exited, 47.7% had their pension paid out as at 30th June, 2025.

**Recommendation:** Authorised officers in all public institutions to administer exit interviews for all staff exiting service.

In addition, the Pensions Department to fast-track automation of the processing of pensions through digitalisation and business process reengineering to facilitate a seamless transition of officers from monthly salary payments to monthly pension payments.

#### (f) Human resource planning

Human resource planning is critical in ensuring seamless delivery of public services.

**Findings:** Out of the 511 institutions evaluated, 59 (11.5%) had developed HR Plans while 88.5% had not.

**Recommendation:** All public institutions to develop five-year Human Resource Plans by 31st December 2026.

#### (g) Staffing in TVET sector

The 197 TVET institutes evaluated had a total of 17,590 employees, of whom 75.5% were trainers, while 23.6% were non-teaching staff engaged by Boards of Management (BOM). Out of 13,274 trainers, 5,116 (38.5%) were employed by BoM, while 8,157 (61.5%) by PSC and one trainer was still serving under the Teacher's Service Commission.

**Findings:** One-third of trainers in TVET institutions were employees of the Boards of Management. Further, there were more trainers for the general courses than the recommended ratio for the enrolled students and more students per tutor than recommended for the highly technical courses.

**Recommendation:** The State Department for TVETs undertake an evaluation of each of the TVETs to establish the needs of each concerning the highly technical courses, freeze recruitments of trainers for general courses until the ratio stabilises at the recommended 1:50 tutor-student ratio and the Boards/Councils be facilitated to recruit tutors for highly technical courses.

(h) Technical Vs non-technical

staff Public institutions are established to deliver on specified mandates and to be able to do this, they require officers who are technical or non-technical. Technical officers carry out the institution's core mandate, while non-technical staff provide support services.

**Findings:** 42.5% institutions operated at the recommended ratio of 70:30 technical to non-technical staff, while 57.5% were not compliant.

**Recommendation:** Public institutions with non-technical staff exceeding 30% of the total staff complement to give priority to recruitment of technical staff in future recruitments.

#### (i) Payroll management

All public institutions are required to pay their staff through the institutional payroll system. Payment of salaries and allowances through a centralised system reduces the risk of fraud and unauthorised payments.

**Findings:** Majority (98.4%) of the officers were paid using the payroll while 3,868 (1.6%) officers were paid outside the payroll. In addition, 1,566 (0.6%) officers from 56 (11%) institutions were not paid during the FY 2024/2025. Some of the reasons given for non-payment of salaries included officers facing disciplinary action 253 (16.2%), officers on unpaid leave 39 (2.5%), officers on deployment 25 (1.6%) and officers being absent from duty without permission 20 (1.3%).

The government vide Circular REF OP. CAB.3/3/16, dated 9th December, 2024 by the Chief of Staff and Head of Public Service, required public institutions to migrate their HR data to the Human Resource Information System-Kenya (HRIS-Ke) by 30th June 2025. It was established that 93 (18.2%) institutions had migrated their HR Data to the Human Resource Information System (HRIS) Kenya while the majority

(81.8%) had not.

**Recommendation:** All public institutions that had not complied with the directive to comply by 30th June, 2026.

### (j) Secondment

Under Section 42 of the PSC Act, CAP 185, an officer is eligible to be seconded for a period not exceeding 6 years. The Secondment guidelines issued by the Commission provide that for an officer to be seconded, the officer must be in job group M or equivalent or above.

**Findings:** 171 (33.5%) institutions had 888 (0.4%) officers on secondment, of whom 772 (86.9%) were serving within the stipulated six-year secondment period, while 48 (5.4%) exceeded the prescribed period. 19.6% of the officers on secondment were below job group M or equivalent.

**Recommendation:** Public institutions from which officers had remained on secondment for periods exceeding six years to release the officers, as they were in breach of the statutory period allowed for secondment.

### (k) Leaves

The Public Service Commission Regulations 2020, and the Human Resources Policies and Procedures Manual 2016 outline leave entitlements for public officers. The authority to approve and the period which an officer may remain on these leaves is prescribed in the regulations or the policies and procedures manuals of the respective institutions.

**Findings:** 279 officers were granted unpaid leave and 304 were granted leave of absence. 55.6% of the officers who took unpaid leave exceeded the 12 months prescribed under PSC Regulations 2020, while 89.1% officers proceeded on leave of absence without authority from the Commission as required under the regulations.

**Recommendation:** The authorised officers responsible for the officers who exceeded the leave of absence and unpaid leave period to take disciplinary action against the officers.

### iii) Service Delivery Improvement

Under the thematic area for service delivery improvement, the performance indicators evaluated included: Customisation of service charters, maintenance of customer service, complaint and compliment registers and patenting of products developed. Other indicators included, the distribution of Huduma centers, decentralisation of services, Customisation of facilities for access by PWDs, implementation of the knowledge management policy, establishment of lactation stations, registration as data controllers or processors and participation in the public service week.

**Findings:** 74 (14.5%) institutions had customised their service delivery charters, 306 (59.9%) had customer service registers and 307 (60.1%) maintained complaint registers. The counties with the highest number of Huduma Centres were Nairobi with 5, followed by Tharaka Nithi with 4, and Muranga, Kiambu,

Baringo, Laikipia, Kajiado and Kisumu with 2 each. The rest of the counties had one Huduma Centre each.

On decentralisation of services, institutions that reported to have decentralised services to county, sub-county and ward levels were 140 (44.6%) with ministries and state departments having the highest percentage of decentralised offices.

There were 206 (40.3%) institutions which established lactation stations while 59.7% had not, but only 108 (52.4%) institutions were fully equipped and functional. 431 (84.3%) institutions indicated they customised over 30,117 facilities and services for access by PWDs, while 148 (29.0%) implemented the Knowledge Management Policy.

The overall performance index for the thematic area of improvement in service delivery was 32% and 92 (61.0%) institutions were rated as high achievers, 316 (31.8%) as medium achievers and 103 (6.9%) as low achievers.

**Recommendation:** Institutions that had not customised the common service charter, and those without customer service registers, complaint and compliment registers, comply by March 31, 2026. The State Department for Public Service and Human Capital Development to develop fair criteria to ensure equity in the establishment of Huduma Centres and the State Department for Public Health and Professional Standards to audit compliance with Section 71 of the Health Act, 2017, regarding lactation stations.

### iv) High Standards of Professional Ethics

The performance indicators evaluated included the number of institutions that sensitised officers on the revised Public Service Code of Conduct and Ethics of 2016, which guides the conduct of and the professional standards with which all public officers discharge their duties.

**Findings:** 191 (37.4%) institutions reported to have sensitised officers on the Public Service Code of Conduct and Ethics of 2016 while 144 (28.2%) sensitised officers on financial disclosures. Most (62.6%) of the evaluated institutions did not sensitise officers on the Public Service Code of Conduct and Ethics and 71.2% had not sensitised officers on financial disclosures. A total of 393 institutions reported to have 33,579 professionals in different fields out of whom 20,078 (94.6%) underwent CPD training and 99.9% were in good standing with their respective professional bodies. Most (87.8%) of the TVET institutions had officers who had undergone pedagogy training, which is critical in professionalising TVET training.

A total of 175 (34.2%) institutions reported having disciplined 2,259 officers, most (62.8%) of whom were from state corporations and SAGAs. 18 (0.1%) of the officers were disciplined by their professional bodies for different misconducts.

There were 99 institutions which authenticated academic and professional

certificates for their officers. From the authentication, 561 certificates were found to be fake out of which 267 (47.6%) were KCSE certificates. No action was taken by 28 (28.3%) institutions that found officers with fake certificates.

The overall performance index for the thematic area of high standards of professional ethics in public service was 46.5%. 103 institutions were rated as high achievers with a mean score of 88.3%, 341 were medium achievers with a mean of 42.8% and 67 were low achievers with a mean score of 0.9%.

**Recommendation:** The Authorised Officers who had not taken action on the 28.3% of officers found with fake certificates to initiate disciplinary action and conclude the same by 31st March 2026.

Further, the framework for authentication of certificates in the public service be fast-tracked. In view of the repeal of the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003 by the Conflict of Interest Act, 2025, EACC, in collaboration with PSC, to review the Public Service Code of Conduct and Ethics of 2016 and the Administrative Procedures for Declaration of Income, Assets and Liabilities of 2016 to align with the Conflict-of-Interest Act 2025.

### v) Good Governance, Transparency and Accountability

The performance indicators evaluated included: acting appointments, number of officers performing higher duties, constitution of commissions, boards and council members, reported cases of corruption, civil proceedings against public institutions, management of gifts and conflict of interest, adoption of measures to fight corruption, and hearing and determination of appeals from the county government public service.

**Findings:** 262 (51.3%) institutions had 2,642 (1.1%) officers on acting appointment and 152 (29.7%) had 1,637 (0.7%) officers assigned to perform higher duties. 21.8% of the officers appointed in acting capacity had acted beyond the six-month period allowed by law, and that some of the officers appointed to perform higher duties were paid special duty allowance for more than six months.

With regard to institutions ran by Commissions, Boards or Councils, 335 (72.8%) of the 460 institutions had full membership.

**Recommendation:** The authorities responsible for the appointment of commissioners/ board or council members expedite appointment of members to the affected institutions.

**Findings:** On corruption prevention, 80 (15.7%) institutions had functional CPC and IAO Committees and 411 (80.4%) had developed the corruption prevention policies. 98% of the institutions did not maintain a conflict of interest registers despite 10 (2%) institutions reporting 221 conflict of interest cases. 73 institutions reported having gift registers, however, majority (97.3%) of the registers did not conform to the prescribed format. A total of 53 (10.4%)

370 officers from 73 (14.3%) institutions were reported to have received 702 gifts. Most (81.8%) gifts were valued within the Kshs.20,000 amount prescribed by EACC, 3.4% exceeded the prescribed amount while the value for 13.8% of the gifts was not indicated. On gifts given out 416 (75.9%) were below Kshs.20,000, 62 (11.3%) were valued between Kshs.20,000-100,000, 37 (6.8%) between Kshs.100,000-500,000 and 3 (0.5%) between Kshs.500,000-1,000,000. 19 (3.7%) institutions indicated there were reported cases of corruption implicating 151 (0.06%) public officers and 211 (41.3%) reported that civil proceedings were filed against them. The total judgement awards reported by institutions was Kshs 66,432,890,000, an increase from Kshs. 43,851,220,746 reported in the 2023/2024 evaluation.

**Recommendation:** EACC and PSC undertake awareness creation to public officers on management of gifts and conflict-of-interest in accordance with Conflict of Interest Act, 2025 and public institutions to strengthen institutional governance structures. Institutions that had not developed Corruption prevention policies or established Corruption Prevention and Integrity Assurance Officers Committees to do so by 31st March, 2026.

On compliance with the recommendation for preparation of annual reports and the requirement on declaration of incomes assets and liabilities, 53 (10.4%) institutions reported having prepared an annual report, 10,610 (74.1%) of the newly employed public officers submitted their initial declarations within the 30-day, while 4,810 (49.8%) submitted their final declarations within 30 days of exiting the service. It is recommended that the National Treasury and the State Department for Economic Planning to issue policy guidelines to all public institutions to prepare and submit annual reports.

The overall performance index for the thematic area of good governance, transparency and accountability was 37.1%. 93 institutions were rated as high achievers with a mean score of 71.9%, 308 as medium achievers (mean 37.9%) and 110 as low achievers (5.5%).

### vi) Performance Management

The indicators evaluated were the number of institutions that submitted the 5th generation strategic plans under MTP IV to the State Department for Economic Planning; implemented productivity mainstreaming; developed the institutional annual work-plan for 2024/2025 FY; implemented performance contracting; implemented performance improvement plans (PIP); oriented and inducted newly appointed officers; conducted skills and competences audit and trained officers.

**Findings:** 163 (31.9%) institutions submitted their strategic plans to the State Department for Economic Planning for vetting and approval, 403 (78.9%) implemented the Productivity Improvement Strategy, 426 (83.4%) institutions developed an annual work-plan for

2024/2025 FY while 198 (38.7%) institutions signed Performance Contracts. 410 (80.2%) institutions implemented performance contracts and were evaluated while 101 (19.8%) were not. 61.3% of the evaluated institutions had not signed performance contracts as at 30th August 2024.

Regarding target settings, 199,467 (81.7%) employees set targets, 145,488 (59.6%) were appraised while 27.1% of those who set targets were not appraised. On skills and competency audits, 69.5% of the institutions had not undertaken skills and competency audits, 62.5% of the officers projected for training undertook the training. 11.2% of the evaluated institutions facilitated training for officers who were not on the training projections.

**Recommendation:** The State Department for Economic Planning enforces compliance with strategic plan guidelines, and that all public institutions create awareness on productivity improvement by 30th June 2026, prepare annual work-plans to guide the implementation of institutional and individual performance contracts and the government to institutionalise performance management in the public service through providing for a legislative framework which spans the three arms of government and the county governments.

The overall performance index for the performance management thematic area was 50.5%. 64 institutions were rated as high achievers with a mean score of 69.9%, 369 were medium achievers (mean 51.9%) and 78 were low achievers (mean 28.2%).

### vii) Equitable Allocation of Resources and Opportunities

The performance indicators evaluated included availability of diversity management policy; status of diversity representation in the public service generally, TVET Institutes, Commissions, Boards and Councils and top leadership in the public service, gender, ethnic and PWD representation in appointments, training, promotions, internship opportunities and award of procurement opportunities to special groups, among others.

**Findings:** Gender representation was achieved globally at 60.5% male and 38.8% female. Representation at policy positions was however skewed in favour of the male gender at male gender (77%) compared to the female gender (23%). PWD representation was at 1.9%, a marginal increase of 0.1% from the 1.8% recorded in the FY2023/2024 evaluation. In addition, 44 (93.6%) ethnic communities were represented out of which 86.3% had normal representation, one was overrepresented, while another 4 (8.5%) were grossly underrepresented. Some (6.4%) of the communities were not represented in the public service.

**Recommendation:** Institutions to implement the affirmative action programmes (2024/25 – 2026/27) prescribed by the Commission for their institutions to address gender, ethnicity and PWD gaps.

## Status of Compliance with Values and Principles in Articles 10 and 232 of the Constitution for the financial year 2024/2025

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2024/2025 VALUES AND PRINCIPLES COMPLIANCE EVALUATION REPORT

**Findings:** An evaluation on the composition of commissions, boards, committees, councils or members collectively established gender representation was 1,285 (33.4%) female, 2,444 (63.6%) and PWD representation with 71 (1.8%) PWDs. On ethnic representation, eight (17.4%) ethnic communities were not represented, 3 (6.7%) were over-represented, 2 (4.4%) were under-represented and 3 (6.7%) were grossly under-represented. 20 (43.5%) ethnic communities were represented in public universities councils while 26 (56.5%) were not. 19 of the 37 evaluated public universities had representation from one ethnic community, constituting over 50% of the in-post and 14 (30.4%) ethnic communities were not represented in TVETIs' Boards yet there were 1,557 appointive positions to boards/councils of TVETIs, enough to appoint 33 members from each of the 46 ethnic communities.

**Recommendation:** Appointments to membership of Constitutional Commissions and Independent Offices be proportionately distributed among the 46 ethnic communities as provided for in Article 250 (4) of the Constitution. Appointments to public universities councils and boards and councils be made in a manner that promotes a representative and inclusive public service.

**Findings:** The Access to Government Procurement Opportunities (AGPO) programme is an affirmative action measure giving life to the values and principles of non-discrimination and protection of the marginalised. It supports empowerment youth, women and PWDs by ring fencing 30% of the procurement budget. It was established that 442 (86.5%) institutions awarded tenders under AGPO. The number of institutions increased by 47 from the 395 reported in FY 2023/2024. The highest number of tenders and value of tenders were awarded to women, with 37,025 (58.8%) valued at Ksh.38.65 B, followed by youth with 17,607 (28%) valued at Ksh.18.38 B and PWDs with 4,896 (7.9%) valued at Kshs 5.1B. However, none of the sectors complied with the 30% AGPO requirement.

**Recommendation:** The National Treasury to enforce compliance with AGPO Policy.

On distribution of scholarships by the State Department for Higher Education, 457 scholarships were distributed to students out of which 277 (60.6%) were male and 180 (39.4%) were female.

**Recommendation:** The State Department for Higher Education publicise available scholarships through print and electronic media with wide circulation and also maintain a database of scholarship recipients disaggregated by gender, ethnicity and PWD status. The State Department for Basic Education administers Elimu Scholarship for the needy and vulnerable learners in secondary schools in all the 47 counties through the Jomo Kenyatta Foundation and Equity Group Foundation. It was established that under this Programme KSh. 1.6B was disbursed to

19,866 (0.48%) beneficiaries of whom 9,903 (49.8%) were female and 9,963 (50.2%) were male. The bulk of the Elimu scholarship allocation was disbursed to Turkana, Garissa and Nairobi counties.

**Findings:** On support for vulnerable children, 15,242 special needs students benefitted from NG-CDF bursaries worth Ksh.95,459,974, out of whom 7,268 (47.7%) were female and 7,974 (52.3%) were male. 14,965 (98.2%) of the beneficiaries were PWDs while 277 (1.8%) were Non-PWDs.

**Recommendation:** The NGCDF to ensure bursary beneficiaries in this category are learners with special needs as per bursary guidelines

On social protection programmes, Kshs. 9.7B was disbursed to 1.09M Orphans and Vulnerable Children across the 47 counties. The amounts received by the beneficiaries ranged between Kshs, 5,493.96 in Samburu County and Kshs. 12,592.84 in Kirinyaga County. The average amount per beneficiary was Kshs. 8,874.98.

**Recommendation:** The State Department for Social Protection to develop a policy framework providing a criterion for equitable distribution of social protection funds.

On implementation of the Equalisation Fund, there were 84 projects reported by the State Department for Medical Services, spread across 8 counties which were reported to have commenced in 2017. 21(25%) of the projects were completed, 48 (57.1%) were ongoing while 15 (17.9%) had stalled. It was also established that there is low electricity connectivity and bitumen road networks in the marginalised areas. Only three Equalisation Fund Appropriation Acts have been enacted since 2010 (2017, 2018 and 2023) and the Funds life is for 20 years from promulgation of the Constitution.

**Recommendation:** The Auditor General undertakes a special audit on the stalled projects and the Equalisation Fund Advisory Board to develop a criteria to facilitate equitable distribution of funds for development of projects in marginalised areas.

The Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) disbursed KSh.46,926,680,377 to 726,628 loan beneficiaries during the evaluation period. The number of loan beneficiaries increased by 121,192 from the 605,436 reported in the 2023/2024 FY. The amount disbursed also increased by 14.04B from the KSh.32.9B reported in the previous evaluation period. Of the beneficiaries, 301,949 (42%) were female, 424,679 (58%) were male and 396 (0.054%) were PWDs. It was however noted that ethnicity details for the beneficiaries were not provided. It is therefore recommended that HELB maintains a database of loan disbursements to students disaggregated by gender, ethnicity and PWD status.

Studio Mashinani is an empowerment program targeting talented youths. The project aims to increase the availabil-

ity of recording studios and expand self-employment opportunities for young artists in the creative music industry.

**Findings:** Studio Mashinani recording studios were established in 2 (4.3%) out of the 47 counties. There were no project beneficiaries in 89.4% of the counties, while 10.1% of the beneficiaries were 35 years and above and therefore not eligible for this youth project. It was also noted that there were no project beneficiaries from 73.9% of the ethnic communities.

**Recommendation:** KBC to establish Studio Mashinani in the 47 counties, with priority on rural counties, as recommended in the 2023/2024 Evaluation Report.

The overall performance index for the thematic area of equitable allocation of opportunities and resources was 41.1%. 82 institutions were rated as high achievers, with a mean score of 62%; 355 were rated as medium achievers (mean 41.9%); and 74 were rated as low achievers (mean 13.95%).

### viii) Public Participation

The performance indicators evaluated were the number of institutions with the public participation policy, mode of communication during the public participation process, stakeholder validation on developed policies or legislations and number of institutions that engaged services of a sign language interpreter in the public participation. Findings: 116 (22.7%) institutions had a public participation policy and 276 (54%) developed 230 policies or legislation, of which 162 (70.4%) were subjected to validation after public participation. 64 (12.5%) institutions engaged the services of 228 sign language interpreters during public participation. Seven (3%) institutions developed policies or legislations which were transcribed into Braille.

**Recommendation:** All public organisations to develop a public participation policy and guidelines and also engage sign language interpreters during public participation fora.

The overall performance index for the thematic area of public participation in policy-making was 33.2%. 110 institutions were rated as high achievers, with a mean score of 88.6%; 86 were rated as medium achievers (mean 50%); and 315 were rated as low achievers (mean 9.2%).

### ix) Efficiency, Effectiveness and Economic use of Resources and Sustainable Development

The performance indicators evaluated were the status of budget utilisation and revenue collection, budget implementation in the public service, collection of Appropriation in Aid (A-in-A) by public institutions, implementation of development projects, implementation of development projects in TVET Institutes, implementation of the Kenya Vision 2030 Programmes, implementation of programmes to support the

realisation of BETA, Compliance with Public Procurement and Assets Disposal Act, 2015, Implementation of Public Accounts Committee (PAC) Recommendations, implementation of Public Investments Committee (PIC) Recommendations, audit by the Office of the Auditor General.

**Findings:** 375 (73.4%) institutions collected Kshs 601.8 billion Appropriations-in-Aid (A-in-A) against a total target of Kshs 636.34 billion. Further 244 (47.7%) institutions implemented 3,780 projects, of which 1,101 (29.1%) and 1,011 (26.7%) had feasibility studies and Environmental Impact Assessment undertaken respectively. 1,413 (37.4%) of the projects were completed, 2,064 (54.6%) were ongoing while 63 had stalled.

**Recommendation:** The Office of the Auditor General to conduct a special audit on stalled projects.

**Findings:** On implementation of the Kenya Vision 2030 projects, 36 (36.1%) of the projects were completed while 63.9% were ongoing. The Kenya Vision 2030 Board had not assessed progress towards attaining Kenya's industrialisation and middle-income status.

**Recommendation:** The Board to conduct periodic monitoring and evaluation of the Vision 2030 programmes to establish the level of progress towards realisation of the vision.

On implementation of the Buy Kenya – Build Kenya Strategy which requires public institutions to allocate at least 40% of their procurement budgets for the purchase of locally produced goods and services which creates employment and promotes sustainable development, it was established that 430 (84.2%) institutions implemented the strategy while 15.8% did not.

**Recommendation:** The State Department for Industry to undertake continuous awareness creation on the provisions of the Buy Kenya-build Kenya policy to enhance compliance level across the public service.

**Findings:** The opinion of the Auditor General is an indicator of how a public institution utilised resources allocated to it. It was established that (66.5%) institutions received qualified audit opinion, 26.8% received unqualified opinion, 2.9% received adverse opinion, and 0.2% received a disclaimer of opinion.

**Recommendation:** The Chief of Staff and Head of Public Service to enforce the implementation of the recommendations in the Auditor General's report by the institutions which had qualified, adverse and disclaimer opinions.

Regarding the requirement to pre-qualify suppliers for goods, services and works and uploading their particulars on the Public Procurement Information Portal (PIIP), 30.9% of the institutions reported having maintained an approved list of prequalified suppliers.

**Recommendation:** PPRA undertakes an audit of the 353 institutions that did not have a list of prequalified suppliers

and those that did not provide information on the same.

**Findings:** On implementation of the Parliamentary Public Accounts Committee (PAC) and the Public Investment Committee (PIC) recommendations, 41 (8%) institutions received 356 recommendations from PAC, of which 211 (59.3%) were fully implemented, 120 (33.7%) were partially implemented and 18 (5.1%) were not implemented. Separately, 49 institutions received 389 PIC recommendations, out of which 183 (47%) were fully implemented, 129 (33.2%) were partially implemented and 77 (19.8%) were not implemented.

**Recommendation:** The Office of the Chief of Staff and Head of Public Service to establish the circumstances of partial or non-implementation of PIC and PAC recommendations by the affected institutions.

The overall performance index for the thematic area of efficiency, effectiveness and economic use of resources and sustainable development was 41%. 82 institutions were rated as high achievers, with a mean score of 69.94%; 333 were rated as medium achievers (mean 41.6%); and 96 were rated as low achievers (mean 14.4%).

## Overall Compliance Index

The overall compliance index for all the 511 institutions evaluated was 43.5% compared to 43.8% in the previous year's evaluation (2023/2024). This was a moderate score, indicating room for improvement in adherence to the values and principles set out in Articles 10 and 232 of the Constitution. The moderate compliance levels once again suggest gaps in the implementation of values and principles across the evaluated institutions.

2. Konza Technopolis Development Authority - 79.82%

5. Kibabii University - 75.84%
6. Competition Authority of Kenya - 74.42%
7. Ewaso Nyiro North Development Authority - 73.37%
8. Water Sector Trust Fund (WSTF) - 71.3%
9. Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (KNBS) - 70.85%
10. Rangwe Technical and Vocational College - 70.56%

Serikali inapanga kupanua Mpango wake wa Kui-marisha Ustahimilivu wa Ukame Kaskazini mwa Kenya (DRPNK) baada ya kupendekeza makubaliano ya mkopo wa ziada na Benki ya Maendeleo ya KfW, ukiolenga kuboresha hatua za kukabiliana na mabadiliko ya tabianchi na kuimarisha msaada wa maisha kwa jamii katika maeneo kame na nusu kame ya nchi. Ufadhili wa ziada wa milioni tisa za Euro (9,000,000 EUR) utaongeza jumla ya fedha za mpango kutoka milioni nane za Euro (8,000,000 EUR) zilizopatikana mwaka 2018 hadi milioni 17 za Euro (17,000,000 EUR) ili kusaidia hatua zinazolenga kui-marisha ustahimilivu wa jamii, kupunguza athari za hali mbaya za tabianchi na kuendeleza fursa endelevu za maisha katika maeneo yanayokabiliwa na ukame. Mkutano wa ukaguzi uliojadili makubaliano hayo ulileta pamoja maafisa kutoka Hazina ya Kitaifa, Idara ya Jimbo ya Umwagiliaji na Ofisi ya Wakili Mkuu wa Serikali, na ulionyesha jitihada za pamoja za serikali katika kuen-deleza mpango na kuhakikisha mifumo yote ya kisheria, kifedha,

na ya utekelezaji inalingana. Akizungumza katika mkutano huo, Mhandisi Mkuu/Mkurugenzi anayesimamia Unyunyiziaji na Mito, Eng. Bernard Onyango, aliyezungumza kwa niaba ya Idara ya Umwagiliaji, alisema kuwa mpango huo unahamishiwa hatua kwa hatua kwa Serikali za Kaunti ili kukuza umiliki wa kienyeji na uendelevu wa muda mrefu. "Mpango huu umebuniwa kusaidia jamii kujenga ustahimilivu dhidi ya dharura zinazohusiana na tabianchi huku ukikabiliana

na uharibifu wa mazingira kupitia uwekezaji katika uhifadhi wa maji na miundombinu inayostahimili tabianchi, na tunahimiza zaidi jamii zinazonufaika kuchukua umiliki wa mpango huu," alisema Mha. Onyango. Utekelezaji wa mpango huu unafanywa kwa msaada wa Ushirikiano wa Maendeleo wa Ujerumani, ukiangazia kuimarisha ustahimilivu wa ukame, kuboresha kukabiliana na mabadiliko ya tabianchi, na kusaidia maisha ya wafugaji na

wakulima-wafugaji ili kuongeza usalama wa chakula katika kaunti za Marsabit na Turkana. Katika Kaunti ya Marsabit, shughuli zitazingatia maeneo ya Laisamis, Loiyangalani, Saku, Moyale, na North Horr, huku katika Kaunti ya Turkana mpango huo ukizingatia Kakuma, Lodwar, Loima, na Kalokol. Timu pia ilipitia mahitaji ya usimamizi wa fedha na utoaji ripoti ili kuimarisha uwazi na uwajibikaji katika utekelezaji wa mpango. Maafisa walisisitiza umuhimu wa kutoa ripoti za kifedha kwa

wakati kwa kutumia fomati za kisasa za miradi ili kusaidia ufuatiliaji wa shughuli za mpango na matumizi ya rasilimali. Mkutano huo pia uliangazia umuhimu wa kutumia Mfumo wa Taarifa ya Usimamizi wa Fedha unaojumisha (IFMIS) ili kuongeza uangalizi wa kifedha kupitia ufuatiliaji wa moja kwa moja wa matumizi na kuzingatia kanuni za usimamizi wa fedha za umma. Majadiliano pia yalisisitiza haja ya mashirika ya ushauri kufuata sera na taratibu zilizowekwa na serikali. Maafisa kutoka Hazina ya Kitaifa walisisitiza umuhimu wa kuhakikisha kuwa makubaliano ya ufadhili yanaendana na Mfumo wa Usimamizi wa Fedha wa Serikali Kuu na za Kaunti. "Matumizi bora ya rasilimali na utoaji sahihi wa ripoti za kifedha yatakuwa muhimu kuonyesha athari ya mpango na kudumisha msaada kutoka kwa washirika wa maendeleo," alisema Collins Aseka, Afisa kutoka Hazina ya Kitaifa. Chini ya mpangilio huo uli-ropendekezwa, mkopo utatolewa kama ruzuku yenye masharti, ambapo Serikali ya Kaunti ya Marsabit itapokea sehemu kubwa zaidi ya ruzuku hiyo. Serikali ya Kitaifa italipa mkopo huo, ambao utaambatana na riba ya punguzo kati ya 0.75 hadi 1.20 asilimia, na malipo kuanza mwaka 2028 na kuendelea hadi 2058. Maafisa walisisitiza haja ya kuharakisha mchakato ulio baki, ikiwa ni pamoja na idhini za ununuzi, ili kuepuka kucheleweshwa kwa utekelezaji wa mpango.

kuwa kituo hicho kitakuwa alama ya mabadiliko makubwa kuelekea tathmini ya ubora wa chai kwa kutumia sayansi, na kuimarisha ushindani

wa Kenya kimataifa. Katibu pia alitangaza uwekezaji wa Sh 3.5 bilioni kwa ajili ya kuboresha viwanda 19 vya chai nchini, kwa lengo la kuendelea

teknolojia ya usindikaji na kuongeza ufanisi. Kwa mfano, Kiwanda cha Chai cha Chebut kitatunukiwa Sh 89 milioni kwa ajili ya kuboresha

miundombinu, huku Kiwanda cha Chai cha Kaptumo kikipata Sh 77 milioni kuboresha mistari yake ya usindikaji na mashine za kukausha chai. Alitoa onyo kali kwa Bodi ya Shirika la Maeendeleo ya Chai Kenya (KTDA) kuhusu tuhuma za ufisadi na usimamizi mbaya wa fedha zilizokusudiwa viwanda vya chai, akionya kuwa serikali

itachukua hatua madhubuti dhidi ya wahusika. “Wakulima hawawezi kuharibu mashamba yao ya chai. Badala yake, tutaondoa makundi ya wahalifu,” alisema Rono, akithibitisha dhamira ya serikali ya kulinda maslahi ya wakulima na kurejesha uadilifu katika sekta hiyo. Alibainisha kuwa hatua za serikali zinazendeleva tayari zimeongeza malipo ya kila mwezi kwa wakulima kutoka Sh16 hadi Sh26 kwa kilo katika mwaka uliopita, ikiwapa faraja wakulima waliokuwa wakikabiliana na mapato madogo kwa muda mrefu. Katibu alieleza kuwa kutokuwa na utulivu kwa bei za chai na bonasi za hivi karibuni kunatokana na sababu za kimataifa ikiwa ni pamoja na mzozi unaoendelea Mashariki ya Kati, ambao umeathiri masoko muhimu ya kuuza nje kama Iran, mmoja wa walaji wakubwa wa chai ya Kenya.

Tunategemea KPLC ili kupeleka nyuzi hizi hadi ngazi za chini za jamii,” aliongeza. Tuna miradi muhimu inayoendelea nchini kote; miongoni mwao ni Mpango Mkuu wa Dijitali wa Kenya unaolenga kufanika nchi nzima,” alisema. “Pia tunataka kuona kama maoni yetu kuhusu WiFi za jamii yanaanza kutekelezwa katika kaunti kwa manufaa ya watumiaji kwa biashara na elimu. Pia tutataka kuona jinsi eneo zima la mtandao linavyohusiana na usalama, elimu, utawala na hata biashara na ujasiriamali,” aliongeza.

# Kenya mbioni kuandaa Kombe la Mataifa ya Afrika licha ya ufadhili kucheleweshwa

NA BERNARD MUNYAO (KNA)

Katibu katika Idara ya Michezo, Elijah Mwangi, amewahakikishia Wakenya kuwa maandalizi ya kuandaa Kombe la Mataifa ya Afrika (AFCON) yanaendelea vizuri, licha ya wasiwasi kuhusu ratiba ya upatikanaji wa fedha. Akizungumza katika Msikiti wa Mjini, Murang'a, Mwangi alisema kuwa nchi iko tayari kwa tukio hilo na tayari imepata ada ya uenyeji ya Shilingi bilioni 3.9, huku changamoto pekee ikiwa ni muda wa kutolewa kwa fedha hizo. Mwangi, aliyekuwa ameandamana na Kamishna wa Kaunti ya Murang'a Hassan Bule, alibainisha kuwa takribani Shilingi bilioni 3.9 zinahitajika kama ada ya uenyeji ambayo lazima ilipwe kufikia tarehe 30 Juni. "Suala si ukosefu wa fedha, bali ni kwamba fedha hizo hazijajumuishwa katika bajeti ya sasa. Shughuli za serikali zinafuata mfumo wa kifedha uliopangwa, na fedha hizo zilitengwa katika bajeti ya mwaka ujao wa kifedha," alisema Mwangi. Aliongeza kuwa Idara ya Michezo kwa sasa inashirikiana na Bunge la Kitaifa kuhakikisha kiasi hicho kinaingizwa katika bajeti ya ziada badala ya kusubiri mwaka ujao wa kifedha, jambo ambalo lingechelewesha ratiba muhimu. Hata hivyo, Katibu alisisitiza kuwa Kenya bado ina muda wa kutosha kukidhi mahitaji yote ya kuandaa mashindano hayo ya bara, akitaja taarifa zilizochapishwa na baadhi ya vyombo vya habari kuhusu ukosefu wa ada ya uenyeji kuwa si sahihi. "Wakenya wasiwe na hofu. Bado kuna muda wa kutosha kujiandaa na kuandaa AFCON yenye

mafanikio. Tuliwasilisha ombi letu kwa kamati ya michezo ya bunge, na walituhakikishia kuwa fedha hizo zitaingizwa katika bajeti ya ziada," alibainisha. Kenya, Uganda na Tanzania zimepangwa kuandaa kwa pamoja AFCON 2027, huku nchi hizo tatu zikitakiwa kulipa ada ya uenyeji kabla ya mwisho wa mwaka huu wa kifedha. Kuhusu miundombinu, Mwangi alifichua kuwa mipango ya Uwanja wa Gakoigo katika Kaunti ya Murang'a huenda

ikarekebisha kutokana na ukosefu wa nafasi ya kutosha. Eneo lililopendekezwa haliwezi kubeba uwezo unaohitajika wa viti 10,000, jambo lililobababisha mazungumzo na Serikali ya Kaunti ya Murang'a kuhamisha mradi huo kutoka Gakoigo kwenda eneo karibu na ofisi ya Naibu Kamishna wa Kaunti Ndogo ya Maragua. "Eneo la sasa la Gakoigo halitoshi kwa ukubwa wa uwanja unaohitajika. Kwa ushirikiano na serikali ya kaunti, tunachunguza maeneo

makubwa zaidi karibu na mji wa Maragua," alisema Mwangi. Wakati huo huo, ujenzi wa Uwanja wa Mumbi unaendelea vyema. Mwangi alisema kuwa sehemu muhimu kama uwanja wa kuchezea na njia ya mbio tayari zimekamili, huku kazi sasa zikielekezwa kwenye majukwaa ya watazamaji. Zaidi ya miundombinu ya michezo, Katibu Mkuu aliwahimiza vijana kuchangamkia fursa zinazotolewa na serikali, hasa kupitia Mpango wa Nyumba Nafuu, kwa kutafuta

ajira katika miradi hiyo. Pia aliwataka wafanyabiashara kutumia nafasi katika masoko mapya ya kisasa, hasa wakati huu wa msimu wa mvua, ili kuhakikisha biashara zinaendelea bila kukatizwa. Mwangi alihitimisha kwa kusema kuwa serikali ina matumaini kuwa changamoto zote za kifedha na miundombinu zitashughulikiwa kwa wakati, na kuiwezesha Kenya kuwa mwenyeji bora wa mashindano hayo makubwa ya bara.

Hii itakuwa mara ya pili kwa Kenya kuandaa mashindano ya kimataifa ya rafting baada ya kuandaa Mashindano ya Afrika ya Rafting mwezi Julai mwaka jana. Kinuthia alisema maandalizi yote yanaendelea kuhakikisha

kuwa hakutakuwa na hitilafu zozote katika siku saba ambazo mashindano hayo yataendeshwa.

"Tunatarajia kupokea timu kutoka zaidi ya nchi 40 na hili litakuwa tukio kubwa, kubwa zaidi kuwahi kufany-

ika nchini," alisema Kinuthia. "Shughuli hii itafanyika katika Mto Sagana ambao umetambuliwa kuwa na njia bora zaidi za rafting duniani," aliongeza. Katibu Mkuu huyo alisema mbali na kukuza utalii wa michezo na uchumi wa nchi, tukio hilo pia litachochea uhamishaji wa ujuzi kwa timu za humu nchini kwani timu mashuhuri zitashiriki. "Timu yetu itashindana na wataalamu wa rafting ya maji na hii itakuwa fursa kwao kupata ujuzi zaidi," alisema. Aliongeza kuwa mashindano ya Kombe la Dunia yatafanyika sambamba na Mashindano ya Afrika ambapo nchi 18 za Afrika zimejiandikisha kushiriki. Alibainisha kuwa ingawa michezo ya maji bado ni mipya nchini, inaendelea kukua kwa kasi, akiongeza kuwa Kenya itakuwa ikiandaa mashindano ya kimataifa kila baada ya miaka miwili. "Tumepokea msaada mkubwa kutoka kwa serikali na kutokana na kujitolea kwake, tutaweza kuandaa tukio hili

kubwa," alisema Kinuthia. Alifafanua kuwa mashindano ya Kombe la Dunia ya rafting yatafanyika kwa mfumo wa mfululizo katika nchi nne tofauti. "Tunahitaji washiriki zaidi na ninawahimiza vijana kujiunga nasi. Tunatoa mafunzo bila malipo kwa wanaopenda mchezo huu," alisema Kanyuira. Kanyuira alisisitiza kuwa michezo ya maji ina uwezo mkubwa na ni njia mojawapo ya kujipatia kipato hasa kwa vijana.

Akizungumza wakati wa maadhimisho ya Siku ya Kifua Kikuu Duniani ya 2026 katika Uwanja wa Mahafali wa Chuo Kikuu cha Nairobi, Waziri wa Afya, Aden Duale, alifichua kuwa watu 90,900 waligunduliwa na kuanza matibabu mwaka 2025—sawa na asilimia 81 ya mzigo unaokadiriwa wa TB. “Pengo hili linawakilisha maisha yaliyokosa kufikiwa, familia zilizoathirika, na maambukizi yanayoendelea katika jamii zetu. Kama serikali, tumejitolea kuziba pengo hili,” alisema. Hafla hiyo, iliyofanyika chini ya kaulimbiu ‘Ndiyo! Tunaweza Kutokomeza TB - Ikiingozwa na Serikali, Ikiendeshwa na Jamii’, ilisisitiza umuhimu wa mbinu ya pamoja ya serikali nzima, huku jamii zikiwa na nafasi kuu katika kinga, ugunduzi na matibabu. Waziri huyo alibainisha kuwa Kenya imepiga hatua kubwa, ikirekodi kupungua kwa asilimia 45 ya visa vya TB na kupungua kwa asilimia 58 ya vifo vinavyohusiana na TB tangu mwaka 2015, kutokana na uwekezaji endelevu wa serikali, ushirikiano wa kaunti, na ubia mbalimbali. Ili kuimarisha ugunduzi wa mapema na upatikanaji wa huduma, Wizara ya Afya kwa kushirikiana na serikali za kaunti imepanua huduma za TB katika kaunti zote 47, ikiwa ni pamoja na matumizi ya teknolojia za uchunguzi wa kisasa na mashine za eksirei za kidijitali zinazotumia akili bandia na zinazobebeka kwa urahisi. “Ubunifu huu unawezesha ugunduzi wa mapema na

sahahi, hata katika maeneo ya mbali, tunapoteleka huduma karibu zaidi na wananchi kulingana na Mpango wa Afya kwa Wote,” alieleza Duale. Hata hivyo, alisisitiza kuwa kutokomeza TB kunahitaji zaidi ya hatua za kitabibu pekee, akibainisha kuwa ugonjwa huu unahusishwa kwa karibu na umaskini, msongamano wa watu, lishe duni, na mazingira. Kwa hivyo, alitangaza kuwa serikali inatekeleza mkakati jumishi wa sekta mbalimbali kushughulikia visababishi hivi, ikiwa ni pamoja na kuboresha hali ya maisha, kuimarisha lishe, na kupanua upatikanaji wa uchunguzi na matibabu katika maeneo hatarishi na mahali pa kazi. Kwa kuwa asilimia 63 ya visa

vya TB vinahusisha wanaume, Duale alitoa wito wa mikakati inayozingatia jinsia ili kuboresha tabia ya kutafuta huduma za afya, ikiwemo programu za mahali pa kazi, uhamasishaji wa jamii, na matumizi ya zana za kidijitali za kujipima ili kuhimiza utambuzi na matibabu ya mapema. Pia alisisitiza umuhimu wa kampeni endelevu za uhamasishaji wa umma ili kuhamasisha ufuasi wa matibabu,

Ubunifu huu unawezesha utambuzi wa mapema na sahihi, hata katika maeneo ya mbali

kupunguza unyanyapaa, na kuhimiza uchunguzi wa kaya. “TB inatibika, na huduma zinapatikana kote nchini. Hakuna anayepaswa kuchelewa kutafuta matibabu kwa sababu ya hofu au ubaguzi,” alisisitiza. Aidha, Waziri huyo alitambua mchango muhimu wa wahudumu wa afya ya jamii, mashirika ya kiraia, viongozi wa dini, na waliopona TB katika kutambua visa vilivyokosa kugunduliwa, kusaidia ufuasi wa matibabu, na kuleta mabadiliko ya tabia katika jamii. Vilevile, Duale alithibitisha dhamira ya serikali ya kutokomeza TB, akieleza kuwa ni kipaumbele cha afya ya umma na pia ni hitaji la maendeleo ya kitaifa.

## Mombasa yapambana na kupanda kwa joto kwa kupanda miti

NA SITATI REAGAN (KNA)

Serikali ya Kaunti ya Mombasa kwa ushirikiano na makundi ya mazingira, mashirika ya vijana na wadau wa jamii, imezindua mpango wa kijani ili kukabiliana na ongezeko la joto mijini kwa kupanda miti asilia 40 yenye spishi 11 tofauti katika eneo la biashara la kati (CBD). Jiji hilo la pwani limekuwa likishuhudia viwango vya juu visivyovy vya kawaida vya joto katika miezi ya hivi karibuni, huku wakazi wakihangaika na joto kali ndani na nje ya nyumba. Hata baada ya kuanza kwa mvua, hali ya joto kali imeendelea, ikionyesha changamoto ya tabianchi inayozidi kuwa kubwa na isiyoweza kupuuzwa. Basil Angaga, Mkuu wa Uendeleu katika Idara ya Mazingira ya kaunti na mwanzilishi wa Together 4 Climate, alieleza mpango huo kama matokeo ya miezi kadhaa ya mipango, majadiliano na ushirikiano. “Tuliweza kuwahusisha vijana wengine kushughulikia changamoto zinazokumba jiji letu na kuhakikisha mazingira bora ya tabianchi, si kwa ajili yetu tu bali pia kwa vijazi vijavyo,” alisema Angaga. Mpango huo, uliotekelezwa chini ya Mradi wa People for Urban Resilience, umehusisha uteuzi makini wa miti kwa kuzingatia uimara wake na faida za kiikolojia. Inatarajiwa kutoa kivuli, kupunguza joto la uso na hewa, na kusaidia bioanuwai katika jiji. Tofauti na juhudi za awali za upandaji miti zilizolenga zaidi mapambo na spishi za kigeni kama mitende, mpango huu unaashiria mabadiliko kuelekea misitu ya mijini inayotegemea sayansi. Wataalamu kutoka Huduma ya Misitu ya Kenya na wataalamu huru wa mimea walihusika katika kutambua spishi asilia zinazoweza kustawi katika hali ya hewa ya pwani ya Mombasa. “Kwa muda mrefu, juhudi za upandaji miti jijini zilizingatia urembo badala ya matumizi. Lakini mitende, ingawa ni mizuri, haitoi kivuli wala kupunguza joto. Miti asilia, kwa upande mwingine, hutoa huduma halisi za mifumo ya ikolojia,” alisema Angaga. Miti hiyo ilikuzwa kwa zaidi ya mwaka mmoja katika kitalu cha miti asilia kilichopo Kilifi kabla ya kuhamishiwa Mombasa. Mchakato wa upandaji ulifuata viwango madhubuti vya kisayansi, huku mashimo ya ukubwa wa mita moja yakichimbwa ili kuhakikisha ukuaji bora wa mizizi na uhai wa miti. Mbali na upandaji, mpango huu pia unaweka msisitizo mkubwa katika utunzaji wa miti na umiliki wa jamii.

na Uwezeshaji wa Makundi Maalum, pamoja na wadau wengine wa kitaifa, umeimarisha ujumuishaji wa takwimu za kijinsia katika serikali. Juhudi hizi zimechochea mageuzi ya sera yanayotegemea ushahidi na kuiweka Kenya katika nafasi ya uongozi wa kikanda katika takwimu za kijinsia, jambo linalodhihirishwa na nafasi yake ya juu katika Fahirisi ya Gender Data Outlook na uongozi wake barani Afrika. Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi huo mjini Nairobi, Mwakilishi wa UN Women Kenya, Antonia NGabala-Sodonon, alisema kuwa muongo wa uwekezaji katika takwimu bora za kijinsia umebadilisha mjadala wa sera nchini Kenya. “Ushirikiano si nyongeza tu; ndio injini ya maendeleo. Wanawake na wasichana wanapohesabiwa katika takwimu,

Pia itazindua toleo la pili la nyaraka mbili muhimu za kitaifa, ambazo ni Karatasi za Takwimu za Kijinsia za Kaunti 47 na Mpango Mkakati wa Takwimu za Kijinsia (GSSP), ili kuimarisha mipango katika ngazi

ya kaunti na uratibu wa muda mrefu wa takwimu za kijinsia. Zaidi ya wakulima vijana 200 katika mnyororo wa thamani wa parachichi kutoka kaunti za Kisii na Nyamira wamefaidika na mafunzo kuhusu namna ya kudhibiti wadudu aina ya Persea mite, wadudu wadogo wanaosambaa haraka na kupunguza kwa kiasi kikubwa uzalishaji na ubora wa matunda. Akizungumza baada ya mafunzo yaliyofanyika katika Kituo cha Mafunzo ya Kilimo cha Kisii, mwakilishi wa Tupande kutoka One Acre Fund Kenya, Clyvon Ambaa, alisema mafunzo hayo yatawapa wakulima ujuzi wa kutambua na kudhibiti wadudu hao wanaoshambulia majani ya parachichi na kunyonya virutubisho muhimu. "Wakulima wanafundishwa kutambua mdudu huyu mpya ambaye ni hatari sana kwa mazao yao, na kama Tupande tunaendelea kujitolea kusaidia

vijana katika sekta ya kilimo," alisema Ambaa. Mpango huo uliungwa mkono na washirika muhimu wakiwemo Huduma ya Ukaguzi wa Afya ya Mimea Kenya (KEPHIS) na Mamlaka ya Chakula na Kilimo (AFA), ambazo zina jukumu la kulinda afya ya mimea, kudhibiti wadudu na kusimamia pembejeo za kilimo, pamoja na serikali za kaunti za Kisii na Nyamira. Kila wadi katika kaunti hizo mbili ilichagua wawakilishi wawili wa vijana kushiriki katika mafunzo hayo, ili kuhakikisha uhamishaji wa maarifa unafika hadi ngazi ya chini ya jamii. Naibu Mkurugenzi wa Wizara ya Kilimo katika Kaunti ya Kisii, Nicholas Manyisa, alisema mafunzo hayo yanalenga kuwaelimisha wakulima vijana kuhusu mdudu huyu na kuwapa ujuzi wa vitendo wa namna ya kudhibiti ili kuboresha uzalishaji wa parachichi.

### Miti 8.8m yapandwa Vihiga inafikia kiwango cha juu cha misitu

Kaunti ya Vihiga imepanda zaidi ya miti milioni 8.8, na kufikia asilimia 35 ya ufunikaji wa misitu katika juhudi za kukabiliana na uharibifu wa mifumo ya ikolojia na athari za mabadiliko ya tabianchi. Waziri wa Mazingira, Mabadiliko ya Tabianchi na Misitu, Dkt. Deborah Barasa, alitoa kauli hizi katika eneo la Inyanza baada ya kuongoza wakazi wa Vihiga kupanda zaidi ya miti 250,000 katika Milima ya Maragoli, Kaunti ya Vihiga, kuadhimisha Siku ya Kimataifa ya Misitu. Dkt. Barasa aliipongeza Kaunti ya Vihiga kwa kupanda zaidi ya miti milioni 8.8 na kufikia asilimia 35 ya ufunikaji wa miti, huku ikichangia wito wa kitaifa wa Rais wa kupanda miti bilioni 15 ifikapo mwaka 2032. Waziri huyo alisema ufunikaji wa miti kitaifa umefikia asilimia 30, huku miti bilioni 1.4 ikiwa tayari imepandwa, na akawahimiza Wakenya

zaidi kushiriki katika zoezi la upandaji miti ili kufikia lengo la kitaifa la miti bilioni 15. Aliongeza kuwa zaidi ya miti milioni moja inatarajiwa kupandwa katika Milima ya Maragoli msimu huu wa mvua, kwa lengo la kurejesha ekari 465 za mfumo wa ikolojia, huku akiwataka wakazi wa Vihiga kuhifadhi milima hiyo na kutunza miti iliyopandwa. Dkt. Barasa pia alibainisha kuwa Milima ya Maragoli ina matunda mengi ya quiver ambayo yanaweza kuchakatwa kuwa juisi au kuuzwa katika masoko ya ndani na kimataifa, akisema eneo hilo lina udongo wenye rutuba unaoweza kuhimili pia kilimo cha miti mingine ya matunda. Alisema kaulimbiu ya mwaka huu ya kimataifa ya "Misitu na Uchumi" inaendana na Ajenda ya Kiuchumi ya Bottom-Up Transformation (BETA) ya Kenya, ambayo inalenga kuwawezesha wananchi katika ngazi ya chini na kuunda fursa endelevu za kiuchumi.

na kuruhusu mfumo wa ikolojia wa msitu kupona kikamilifu na kuwa imara. Wakati wa uzinduzi, miti zaidi ya 10,000 ilipandwa, na hadi sasa KDF imepandwa miche ya miti zaidi ya milioni 100 kote nchini, ikiwa ni pamoja na idadi kubwa ya miti ya matunda kusaidia endelevu ya maz-

ingira na maisha ya jamii. Zaidi ya hayo, KDF imesisitiza juhudi zinazoelekea za maendeleo zinazohusiana na mazingira na miundombinu. Hizi ni pamoja na kuanzishwa kwa shule za KDF katika maeneo yaliyo hatarini kwa uhalifu na maendeleo ya ujenzi wa miundombinu ya usalama.
