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# Schools to get increased funding in next budget

Schools will receive increased capitation in the next budget in a bid to ease the financial strain facing institutions, Basic Education Principal Secretary Prof. Julius Bitok has said.

Prof. Bitok said the ministry's budget had already been enhanced and submitted to Parliament ahead of the next financial allocations.

The PS said the government was implementing a solarisation project that will see schools transition to solar energy in a bid to reduce electricity costs and ensure an uninterrupted power supply.

Prof. Bitok was speaking in Nakuru County during the Elimu Mashinani Convention, where he engaged stakeholders on practical solutions to improve education standards.

He rallied stakeholders to work together in shaping a more inclusive and quality-driven future for every learner under the hashtag #ElimuThabiti.

The PS urged principals to regularly engage with learners

in a bid to prevent school unrest by addressing issues before they spiral out of control.

Prof. Bitok told stakeholders

that drug abuse and teenage pregnancies remain a major concern and appealed to all parties to work together to

eliminate the challenges in educational institutions.

He added that girls who drop out of school due to pregnancy

should be allowed to return and complete their studies after giving birth.

He added that education officials were working closely with national government administrators to trace any other students who may have dropped out of school for other reasons to ensure they are readmitted.

Prof. Bitok challenged the stakeholders to come together and identify ways of ensuring better performance in the national exams saying that last year's results for the county were unsatisfactory.

He noted that out of the 49000 candidates in the county, only 7200 attained the university cut off mark of a C+.

He assured KNEC examiners that their dues would be paid within the next two weeks saying the delay had been occasioned by lack of finances.

The PS told the stakeholders that the government would in the next few weeks roll out the KEMIS programme to establish the exact number of students in schools saying that some head teachers could be misrepresenting the actual number of students in their institutions.

In his remarks, Nakuru County Commissioner Dr. Loyford Kibaara admitted that drug trafficking in education institutions remains a major challenge.

However, Kibaara said administrators and security agencies were monitoring this across institutions to nip the practice.

He urged school administrators, who may need the help of sniffer dogs to trace for drugs within their institutions to liaise with the national government administrators in their regions.

Kibaara said criminal gangs continue to endanger students by recruiting them and forcing them to drop out of schools. He noted that security agencies had already arrested several suspects and the crackdown will be sustained.

The County Commissioner called on government administrative and security agencies to remain vigilant at all times.

# Employers, universities to benefit from KNEC's real-time certificate verification

The Kenya National Examinations Council (KNEC) has launched a digital verification system that enables employers and universities to instantly validate KCSE certificates. The initiative aims to streamline the authentication process by providing real-time confirmation of academic credentials.

Speaking during the Third Annual Educational Assessment Symposium at Mitihani House, KNEC Deputy Director of ICT Ahmed Mutanga said the council had moved away from slow manual reviews to a faster, secure, and instant verification system.

Starting with the 2023 cohort, KNEC has added a quick response (QR) code to every certificate, effectively turning them into secure digital tokens.

These codes use AES Advanced Encryption Standard, the same high-level security standard trusted by banks and governments worldwide, to lock away sensitive data like student names, index numbers, and grades. This ensures that the information

remains tamper-proof and authentic.

AES encryption works by scrambling sensitive data into a complex code that is unreadable to the naked eye.

This ensures that even if someone takes a photo or intercepts the QR code, the information remains locked and useless without the official digital key. To manage this, the council has

launched TrueCert, a secure electronic platform where all legitimate certificates are pre-loaded for instant, authorized cross-referencing.

Mutanga noted that by equipping certificates from 2023 onwards with QR codes and securing older ones via blockchain, the council has created a fraud-proof ecosystem that saves time and guarantees that only

genuine academic achievements are recognized. To verify a certificate, users can enter their details directly into the portal, pay via eCitizen, and receive an instant authentication report. A certificate is confirmed as authentic when the decrypted data matches official KNEC records. A red flag appears if signatures are invalid, data is altered or serial numbers are flagged as nonexistent.

Additionally, Francis Lekupe, a KNEC ICT officer, explained that the move away from the old manual system was necessary, as physical verification was often slow and unreliable.

According to Lekupe, relying on physical security features like watermarks was no longer enough, as sophisticated forgeries often made it nearly impossible for employers to verify a document's true integrity. He explained that the new system protects the council's institutional credibility.

KNEC Chief Executive Officer Dr. David Njegere explained that all certificates are now pre-loaded onto a secure digital platform emphasizing that this automated process eliminates human intervention, cutting verification times down from several days to just a few minutes.

# Israeli experts to equip Makueni medics with emergency care skills

Doctors and other health workers in Makueni County are set to acquire new procedures and technologies from Hadassah University Medical Centre in Israel to enable them to learn more about treating children during emergency situations. The revelations were made by Israel's Ambassador to Kenya, Gideon Behar, when he launched a Pediatric Emergency Medicine Skills Workshop at the Makueni County Referral Hospital aimed at enhancing healthcare services in the country.

The training is being facilitated by experts from Hadassah University Medical Centre and the Hebrew University to strengthen the ability of local health workers to respond to emergency and stress.

"Doctors and other medical workers will go to Hadassah University medical Centre in Israel, which is one of the best in the world to acquire new procedures, technology and due understanding how to treat children in emergency situations," said Behar, when he opened the two days Pediatric Emergency Medicine Skills Workshop.

The Ambassador added, "We are very thankful and we know that this will save lives by closing the gap of very high mortality, which still exist in Kenya. And I am happy we will see the results in the future." Behar thanked the county for the

warm reception, describing the partnership as the beginning of broader collaborations between Israel and Makueni.

He added that the initiative reflects the growing partnership between Kenya and Israel, emphasizing that the collaboration is about building lasting impact through continuous capacity building among healthcare workers.

On his part, Makueni Governor Mutula Kilonzo Jr challenged local healthcare practitioners

to utilize the opportunity and ensure they acquire the skills that will go a long way in improving healthcare services in the county.

The Governor observed that it was imperative to remove some of the outdated systems in their health sector and instead embrace modern technologies that will ensure the safety of a mother and child. Additionally, Mutula said that his administration plans to pursue virtual training programs for more

health workers with a view to preparing them for accurate emergency response, whenever they attend to patients.

"This partnership places Makueni on the international map in health innovation and capability. The health sector must do away with outdated systems and embrace new emerging technologies that will ensure every mother should safely return home with her baby," he said.

"Beyond the physical train-

ing, the county plans to pursue virtual training programs to reach more practitioners. Also, the training is intended to enhance the county's capacity and improve preparedness for accurate emergency response," he said.

Speaking at the same event, the County Executive for Health Joyce Mutua revealed that doctors from Israel will be in the region for the next one week to oversee adoption of the initiative at the Makueni County Hospital.

## NEMA ordered to inspect polluting firms discharging waste into rivers

Cabinet Secretary for Environment, Climate Change and Forestry, Dr. Deborah Barasa, has directed the National Environmental Management Authority to immediately launch transparent, thorough and uncompromising inspections of all facilities suspected of discharging waste into rivers and tributaries.

Dr. Barasa regretted that for a long-time rivers and other sources of water have suffered the cost of industrial negligence and systemic failure through uncontrol effluence.

"It is estimated that over 70 percent of waste water generated in Nairobi is discharged untreated into the environment, compounding the crisis and extending its impact downstream," said the CS. Speaking in Mlolongo town of Machakos County during an inspection tour of effluent discharges into Nairobi Rivers, the Cabinet Secretary decried

that Nairobi river system has been transformed into a channel of contamination, warning that any facility found operating without a functional effluent treatment plant, will not be allowed to continue operations.

The inspection team accom-

panying the CS included the National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA), Director General, Dr. Mamo B Mamo, where they did an Environmental Impact Assessment at Shreeji Chemicals and Canon Chemicals in Mlolongo on their effluent discharges compliance.

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# Coffee revival gathers pace as production rises

The Government, through the New Kenya Planters' Cooperative Union (New KPCU), has intensified efforts to revive the country's coffee sector, with early results indicating steady progress in production, farmer participation and market performance.

At the centre of the initiative is a nationwide coffee seedling distribution programme targeting more than 20 million certified seedlings.

The ongoing exercise is expected to benefit over 200,000 farmers across the country. So far, more than 1.4 million seedlings have been distributed in 17 counties, reaching over 11,000 registered farmers.

By the end of the current planting season, the number is projected to rise to approximately 1.7 million seedlings.

The distribution forms part of a broader, intensive three-year coffee sector revival programme, aimed at restoring Kenya's position as a leading global coffee producer, while

significantly increasing farmer earnings.

The programme seeks to boost productivity from an average of about 2 kilograms to as much as 20 kilograms per tree.

## BY THE NUMBERS

**1.4m**

So far, more than 1.4 million seedlings have been distributed in 17 counties, reaching over 11,000 registered farmers.

Led by the Ministry of Cooperatives and MSMEs and implemented by New KPCU, the initiative focuses on structural reforms, direct farmer payments and subsidized inputs to enhance productivity and eliminate exploitative intermediaries.

According to the 2026 progress update, New KPCU Managing Director Timothy Mirugi said the programme is firmly on track and already delivering measurable results nationwide.

# Government rolls out 53 electrification projects in Kajiado

The Government has intensified efforts to expand electricity access in Kajiado County through the implementation of 53 electrification projects under the Last Mile Connectivity Programme.

The initiative aims to boost rural development and improve livelihoods.

Appearing before the plenary of the Senate of Kenya, Energy and Petroleum Cabinet Secretary Opiyo Wandayi said the projects are being implemented jointly by Kenya Power and the Rural Electrification and Renewable Energy Corporation (REREC) to enhance power connectivity in underserved areas.

He said that out of the 53 ongoing projects, five are new electrification schemes while 48 are maximization projects targeting approximately 1,750 additional customers at a total cost of Sh165.7 million.

Wandayi noted that the Ministry has adopted several strategies to fast-track implementation, including equitable distribution of resources across constituencies based on electricity access levels and connectivity gaps.

“To further enhance electricity connectivity, REREC is engaging Members of Parliament through the matching funds programme where electrification costs are shared on a shilling-for-shilling basis depending on budget availability,” the CS said.

He added that Kajiado West Constituency has already benefited from the initiative through the installation of solar-powered street lighting worth Sh10 million, aimed at improving security and supporting local businesses.

According to the CS, the Ministry is also providing essential construction materials for ongoing projects while strengthening collaboration between REREC and Kenya Power officers to ensure timely inspection, commissioning and connection of completed works.

He further revealed that weekly coordination meetings have been established with contractors to monitor progress, address challenges and ensure adherence to project timelines.

Wandayi expressed confidence that all ongoing electrification projects in Kajiado County could be completed by the end of 2026 if the current implementation strategies are fully maintained.

Responding to a question by Kajiado Senator Kanar Seki on household electricity connectivity, the CS reported that 365,277 households in the county are currently connected to the national grid.

## State speeds up land valuation to clear way for Wajir road project

Land valuation for the Horn of Africa Gateway Development Project (HOAGDP) in Wajir County is advancing steadily as the government prepares to compensate affected property owners ahead of

the commencement of road construction works.

The exercise, being conducted by the National Land Commission in collaboration with the Kenya National Highways Authority, targets properties located along the proposed road corridor.

Valuation teams are currently on the ground in Wajir town and surrounding areas, including Kutulo, identifying and documenting affected land and structures.

Officials involved in the exercise said a significant number of property owners have already been registered, with more expected as the process extends to other sections of the corridor.

The project, which is part of the Horn of Africa Gateway Development initiative, is expected to improve connectivity in

northern Kenya and facilitate trade and movement of goods. Authorities noted that the valuation exercise is a key step in ensuring fair and timely compensation to affected persons and reducing potential disputes during implementation.

They added that the process also covers informal structures and small-scale traders to ensure inclusivity.

Residents have been urged to cooperate with the valuation teams by providing the required documentation to support the process.

## Child care institutions are not closing down, government clarifies

Charitable Children Institutions (CCIs) will continue to operate despite ongoing reforms aimed at transitioning vulnerable children from institutional care to family- and community-based care systems. Nyeri County Children's Coordinator Joseph Mburu said the reforms are not intended to shut down children's homes, but rather to strengthen child protection services while ensuring that the institutions remain key partners in supporting vulnerable children.



Nyeri County Children's Coordinator Joseph Mburu assured Charitable Children Institutions that they will continue operating as the government rolls out reforms transitioning children from institutional care to family-based care.

Speaking in Nyeri, Mburu said the institutions will continue playing a central role in child welfare by expanding their responsibilities under the new care system.

He explained that the institutions will be expected to recruit additional social workers and staff who will monitor the welfare of children placed under foster care, guardianship, adoption and other family-based arrangements.

According to Mburu, the resources currently being used within institutions will continue supporting vulnerable children even after they transition into family and community settings.

"We are not closing the CCIs. What we are doing is ensuring that the same resources they have been using to support children in institutions continue supporting them while they are within families and communities," he said. He added that the institutions would

also provide support to children living in child-headed households and other vulnerable family setups requiring assistance.

Mburu said the reforms will require charitable homes to seek additional funding and partnerships to sustain expanded programmes under the new system.

"In fact, the CCIs will be required to look for more resources from donors because they will need more social workers who can visit children in various homes. They will also be trained on how to utilize the infrastructure they already have because there is still a lot that can be done within

those institutions to support more children," he added.

The assurance comes as Nyeri County begins implementing the government's 10-year Care Reform Strategy, which seeks to transition children from institutional care into family-based environments by 2032.

Mburu said the strategy is designed to ensure that children living in charitable institutions, separated from their families or at risk of separation are raised safely, happily and sustainably within family and community settings where their best interests are prioritized.

He said the Department of Children Services is currently conducting a situational analysis to establish the exact number of charitable children institutions operating in Nyeri County as well as the number of children requiring reintegration into family settings.

## Kiganjo College to be upgraded to a police university

BY WANGARI MWANGI AND SAMUEL MAINA, KNA

The Government plans to elevate the Kiganjo Police Training College in Nyeri into a fully fledged police university. Making the announcement, Interior Cabinet Secretary (CS) Kipchumba Murkomen said the move is aimed at strengthening police training and enhancing the professional capacity of officers serving in the National Police Service (NPS).

The CS said the proposed upgrade would allow officers to earn degrees from the institutions. In the long-term, Murkomen said the government is hoping that the elevation will transform the police training college into a regional centre of excellence that will also serve as a hub for regional and international collaboration.

“We think it is now time that we upgrade this institution from just a mere training college to become a police university, so that police officers can have an institution where largely we are training them up to the university level to get their degree from this institution,” he said.

“But also it shall be a resource centre for other police officers in the region from other Policing Services in East Africa, Africa and beyond and therefore through this institution we can put in place better exchange programme with other policing institutions globally and training institutions globally, so that we will continue training our police officers to be

the best in the world,” added Murkomen. He also revealed that the government is in the process of revamping the police training curriculum to align it with the best policing practices.

The CS said that the new module will see police recruits receive training in the law, human rights, investigations and emerging trends of crime.

He urged the Inspector General (IG) of police to expedite completion of the National Training Policy for National Police Service, which will act as a guide for the state, even as it moves to revamp police training facilities across the country, as well as equip police officers with the requisite skills to execute their duties.

“I am hoping by the time we come here with President William Ruto for the passing-out parade, we should be able to have launched a new Training Policy Strategy, that will capture the issues that the people of Kenya came-up with during the Jukwaa la Usalama, so that we can be able to move forward as a strong institution,” stated Murkomen.

The CS noted that the government is undertaking serious reforms within the NPS that will focus on improving the institutional and human resource capacity.

He also outlined on-going reforms including the adoption of technology in the police service.

He said the reforms include migration from the Integrated Command Control and Communication Centres to adoption of Integrated Command, Control, Communication and Computation Centres.

Murkomen revealed that the NPS is currently at the tail end of the procurement process, which will see the creation of one national command centre and six regional centres in Nairobi, Nyeri, Mombasa, Kisumu and Eldoret.

# Mwache Dam construction on track despite cash flow challenges

The multi-billion-shilling Mwache Multipurpose Dam Project is nearing completion, with construction now at 83 per cent. However, delayed payments to the contractor and unresolved compensation claims for Project Affected Persons (PAPs) threaten to slow progress.

The Sh20 billion project, which is expected to significantly reduce Mombasa County's chronic water shortage, is projected to be completed in August 2026, six months ahead of the original February 2027 deadline. However, construction works by Sinohydro Corporation Limited have reportedly slowed due to unpaid certificates amounting to

Sh1.9 billion. The delays now risk derailing the timely delivery of the transformative project, which is expected to bridge Mombasa County's water deficit, currently estimated at 75 per cent.

The project is jointly funded by the World Bank and the Government of Kenya under the Kenya Water Security and Climate Resilience Project (KWSCRIP).

It aims to sustainably improve water security, strengthen climate resilience, increase bulk water supply, and expand access to water and sanitation services across the Coastal region.

Part of the dammed water, will also support irrigation, with more than 6,000 acres expected to be put under food production in Kwale County. The project comprises a main dam, a lower

check dam, and an upper check dam. The main dam, standing 84 meters high with a crest length of 526 meters, will have a storage capacity of 127 million cubic meters of water.

It is designed to harness water from the Mwache River Basin for the domestic water supply.


Members of the National Assembly Committee on Water, Irrigation and Blue Economy, during an inspection tour of the project, cautioned that delays in the release of funds by the National Treasury could affect completion of the Water Treatment Plant and installation of distribution pipelines. Committee Chairman, Kangogo Bowen, said that despite the impressive progress, the project could stall if pending payments are not settled.

“Working with the Treasury, we will provide the resources required to make sure this project doesn't stop. As it is, we are told there are close to Sh1.9 billion in

unpaid certificates,” said Bowen. He assured the contractor that the project had been allocated Sh5.8 billion in the 2026/2027 Financial Year to support completion.

# Government hastens land titling drive in colonial-era settlements

The Government has stepped up efforts to address land tenure insecurity in colonial-era villages across the country's settlements. Established during the colonial period, these settlements are now being transitioned from informal occupation to formal land ownership.

Through the Kenya Informal Settlements Improvement Project (KISIP II), supported by the World Bank and the Agence Française de Développement (AFD), and implemented by the national government in collaboration with county departments of Lands, Physical Planning, and Urban Development, authorities are undertaking beaconing and land surveys to facilitate the issuance of title deeds.

The initiative aims not only to grant ownership documents but also to improve living conditions for thousands of residents in informal settlements.

KISIP II includes upgrading of roads, drainage systems, and other essential amenities to transform these areas into planned residential neighborhoods.

In Kirinyaga County, where KISIP is regularizing 11 colonial villages, more than 1,600 residents are expected to benefit. The

upgrades are expected to enhance livelihoods and end decades of land tenure insecurity.

A spot check by KNA in Kerugoya found that many beneficiaries expressed satisfaction with progress, even as they await full implementation of the project's promises. Humphrey Mureithi, a resident of Mukinduri village, one of the 11 colonial villages in Kirinyaga County designated for land tenure regularization, said life had long been uncertain due to

the lack of clear land boundaries. "There were no fences or defined plots, and minor disagreements among neighbors have been easily escalating into disputes," he said.

Mureithi, who is the village chairman, noted that news of the KISIP project and the promise of land ownership brought renewed hope among residents.

"Many people dream of leaving these conditions behind, selling their plots, and building better lives elsewhere," he added.

# Taita Taveta schools benefit from special needs education support

In the quiet hills of Taita Sub-County in Taita Taveta County—where distance and disability have long combined to keep some children on the margins of education—a modest but transformative milestone has unfolded at Werugha Primary School and its Special Unit.

Three newly constructed and fully furnished classrooms: bright, accessible, and purpose-built, were officially handed over, signaling more than just infrastructure. They marked a deliberate shift toward dignity, inclusion, and equal opportunity.

Funded by the National Fund for the Disabled of Kenya (NFDK) at a total cost of Sh3 million, the

project is part of the Fund's flagship programme focused on creating spaces, where limitation is not defined by physical barriers, but by the absence of opportunity for learners with disabilities.

Leading the handover were NFDK Trustees Major (Rtd.) Marsden Madoka and Dr. Mike Kiswili, whose presence underscored the national significance of what might otherwise seem like a local event.

"This is not just about putting up classrooms," said Madoka, adding, "It is about restoring dignity to our children and giving them an environment that tells them they matter, that they belong, and that they can achieve just like any other learner."

On his part, Dr. Kiswili emphasized the broader vision behind the investment, saying, "Inclusive education is not optional; it is a right".

When we invest in infrastructure like this, we are investing in the future productivity and independence of these learners. No society can progress if it leaves part of its population behind, he added.

# Why livestock sector is critical in climate agenda

The livestock sub-sector is responsible for over 90 per cent of agricultural greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and about 20 per cent of Kenya's total GHG emissions, driving further climate change.

According to Nakuru County Chief Officer for Livestock, Fisheries, and Veterinary Services, Dr. Michael Cheruiyot, livestock is a major contributor of methane, which has a relatively short life cycle but a high potential to warm the atmosphere. Livestock emits methane through the rumen's digestive processes, known as enteric fermentation.

Dr. Cheruiyot noted that the devolved unit in its resolve to cut down on greenhouse gas emissions continues to position itself at the forefront of climate-smart livestock development

by hosting the 'Baseline Study Report Validation Workshop,' under the Kenya Livestock Methane Reduction Strategy Project, spearheaded by Solidaridad.

The Chief Officer pointed out that the forum had brought together key stakeholders, researchers and development partners to review and validate findings from a baseline study focusing on methane emissions in smallholder dairy systems.

"We explored social and institutional factors influencing the adoption of mitigation measures across Nakuru County and Nyandarua County. The two-year Kenya Livestock Methane Reduction Strategy Project aims to develop a national methane reduction strategy backed by strong institutional frameworks, enabling the scaling and replication of mitigation

technologies," he stated. Dr. Cheruiyot added, "Through multi-stakeholder engagements, on-farm demonstrations and alignment with existing research such as Kenya's livestock emissions inventory and Food and Agriculture Organizations (FAO's) low-emission dairy solutions, the initiative is set to drive meaningful change in the sector."

The Chief Officer explained that manure management practices also release high amounts of methane and nitrous oxide. He pointed out that addressing methane emissions from livestock is expected to mitigate emissions to achieve the Paris Agreement goal of limiting global temperature increase by 2030.

Dr. Cheruiyot indicated that main emissions from livestock are enteric fermentation through feeding and quality of feed.

## Turkana County partners with GIZ to improve access to sustainable energy

Turkana County Department of Energy and Petroleum has initiated discussions with a development partner, GIZ, aimed at advancing energy access and distribution under a project targeting refugees and host communities.

The meeting focused on the "Supporting the

Implementation of the Shirika Plan to Strengthen the Socio-Economic Inclusion of Refugees and Host Communities (SISI-RH)" project, funded by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and implemented by GIZ in collaboration with the Government of Kenya. The initiative seeks to enhance socio-economic

self-reliance among youth in refugee-hosting areas by strengthening government capacity and improving access to sustainable energy and livelihood opportunities.

Speaking during the meeting, Project Leader Vellary Valerie said collaboration with the county government would be key to aligning the project with local priorities.

## 220 deaf learners benefit from mobile science laboratory

More than 220 learners with hearing and speech impairments at Ngala School for the Deaf in Nakuru can now conduct science practicals after receiving a modern mobile laboratory donated by the Echo Network Africa Foundation (ENAF), aimed at strengthening STEM learning. The donation, led by ENAF President and Chief Executive Officer Dr Jennifer Riria, is intended to bridge the gap in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) education for learners with disabilities, who often rely on theoretical lessons. Dr Riria noted that, unlike stationary laboratories, the mobile unit is portable and can be

moved between classrooms or used outdoors for experiments. She added that mobile laboratories are less expensive than traditional brick-and-mortar labs and help bring scientific tools closer to learners.

Dr. Riria said children with disabilities should not be excluded from science education adding that they require equal opportunities like other learners.

“We are taking a lead in encouraging communities to support inclusive education and help less fortunate learners,” she said.

She further said the Organisation has introduced science clubs to strengthen practical learning among learners at the school.

The CEO said the initiative marks over 40 years of the

organisation’s work in Kenya, having reached over 3 million women through empowerment programmes.

She added that the Organisation plans to expand across East Africa focusing on women’s

leadership financial inclusion and peace initiatives.

Dr. Riria said financial inclusion remains central to their mission describing it as a key entry point to solving other challenges.

The donation is part of the Girls Excel Initiative which has reached 17 schools across 14 counties promoting inclusive STEM education.

Ngala School for the Deaf is the first in Nakuru County to receive the facility and will serve as a benchmarking centre for other institutions. Dr Riria urged stakeholders to support inclusive education initiatives noting that collaboration is key to improving outcomes for learners with disabilities.

The mobile laboratory is expected to significantly enhance access to hands-on science learning for learners with disabilities particularly in subjects such as biology chemistry and physics which often require practical demonstration to fully understand scientific concepts. It is also expected to improve learner engagement and performance in STEM subjects by providing real-life experimentation opportunities within the school environment.

## Jua kali artisans to benefit as MSEA links them to housing projects

The Micro and Small Enterprises Authority (MSEA) is intensifying efforts to integrate Jua Kali artisans into the Affordable Housing Programme (AHP) and ESP markets in Uasin Gishu County, in a move aimed at boosting inclusivity and creating sustainable livelihoods.

Speaking in an interview with KNA during site visits to Jua Kali artisans working on AHP projects, MSEA Northrift Regional Coordinator CPA Alton Kogo emphasized that the initiative seeks to position informal sector players at the heart of construction value chains by linking them directly to contractors and developers undertaking housing projects in the region.

He affirmed the central role played by the authority in formalizing and linking Jua kali MSEs to available jobs at affordable housing projects in Railway City, Kidiwa I, Moiben AMS, Pioneer and Matharu, Ainabkoi and Kapsere ESP markets.

The MSEA Northrift Regional Coordinator indicated that the initiative has created significant local impact noting that over 150 Jua Kali artisans have

been formalized, issued with certificates, and given opportunities to fabricate steel doors, windows, wooden frames, and doors for affordable housing units being developed across the county. The involvement of Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) groups has been even more transformative.

He underscored that the move is not only providing employment opportunities but also opening up new markets for locally produced materials. He specified that the MSEs across the county have benefited from the supply of materials with business value of approximately Sh400 million.

“I have personally witnessed youth in Uasin Gishu who had no jobs and were just idling on the streets. Through business development services and support for group formalization, we helped them organize.

Today, those same youth have successfully completed over 6 Local Purchase Orders (LPOs) worth more than Sh8 million within Uasin Gishu,” observed CPA Kogo.

Kogo commended the government for the transformative initiative which has immensely supported the Jua kali sector, saying “MSMEs have accessed tenders which were very impossible for small enterprises to access. The subcontracting aspect is critical in devolving funds to the local MSMEs, through this the Tax base has

also been expanded to great extent because all of them are required to register for VAT”.

MSEA has also intensified capacity-building efforts to ensure artisans meet industry

standards. Through targeted training and skills development whereby Jua Kali workers are being equipped with technical expertise, quality assurance knowledge, and business management skills to enhance their competitiveness.

He further encouraged artisans to formalize their enterprises and join organized associations. This step is expected to improve their eligibility for government tenders and subcontracting opportunities, while also enhancing access to financing and regulatory support.

Elijah Kiambati one of leaders of Affordable Jua Kali Association, Uasin Gishu narrated that the Jua Kali work to them now is like permanent job since they are working continuously since there is high

demand of their products like windows, doors, wooden frames and doors and furniture from the AHP.



This, he said, is unlike before when they had to wait for clients for long hours under their shades with some artisans sometimes closing their day without earning a shilling due to lack of clients.

“First, I thank the President because he gave us fishing lines to fish rather than giving us fish by ensuring Jua Kali artisans are included in the affordable housing program. This truly aligns with his Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA) to help us in improving our livelihoods through income from the supply of fabricated windows and doors to the affordable housing sites,” he said.

“We were forced to go a day, weeks to even a month without a job, but now I am happy I have a job everyday which is like an office work to me,” added Kiambati.

He revealed that affordable housing job has helped to transform his life remarkably, in terms of earning enough money to pay for his son’s university education, opening a business for his wife and operating a matatu business.

# Maseno School, springboard of country's intellectuals, celebrates 120 years

Pomp and colour as Maseno School, celebrated its 120 years of existence. The ceremony was graced by President William Ruto who was the Chief Guest. Cabinet Secretaries, Julius Migos Ogamba (Education and Opiyo Wandayi (Energy and Petroleum), Broadcasting and Telecommunications Principal Secretary (PS), Mr. Stephen Isaboke who is an old boy at the school and Kisumu county governor Prof. Peter Anyang' Nyong'o were also at hand to receive the President.

Maseno National School was established in 1906 by the Missionaries of the Church Missionary Society (CMS) as a school for the children of African chiefs. The first six students learnt under a tree known in a local language as 'museno', hence 'Maseno' meaning several or many 'museno' trees.

PS Isaboke was a student in the school in 1985 to 1986. During the celebration, a Sh.2 billion master plan was launched to help raise funds for upgrading the aging infrastructure at the school.

Mr. Isaboke is part of the committee tasked with the responsibility of looking for means of raising these funds.

Old boys and friends of the school are now rallying together behind a Sh.2 billion redevelopment master plan aimed at transforming one of Kenya's

oldest and most prestigious learning institutions into a modern hub of academic excellence.

The proposed facelift includes the construction of new classrooms, state-of-the-art laboratories, upgraded sports facilities, expanded student accommodation and enhanced digital learning spaces.

Beneath the towering gum trees of Mabungo Hills in Kisumu County stands the institution whose legacy is now deeply interwoven with the story of Kenya itself.

Founded in 1906 by Missionary, Reverend John Willis, Maseno School started as a modest mission station near the Equator. More than a century later, it has risen to become one of Kenya's most iconic centres of learning, molding generations of leaders who have left their mark in politics, business, academia and sports.

The aging infrastructure is a challenge that has inspired the alumni and friends of Maseno to champion an ambitious Sh.2 billion redevelopment master plan designed at redefining the future of the institution.

But some of its iconic infrastructure will not be pulled down as a way of honouring the school's rich legacy and historical identity. During its 120 years of existence, Maseno National School has churned out various prominent people in the country such as; the First

Vice President late Jaramogi Oginga Odinga, Barack Obama Senior (Father to former US President Barack Obama), and former Prime Minister the late Raila Odinga, former freedom fighter and former Cabinet Minister Achieng Ooneko, Siaya governor James Orengo, Renowned entomologist and environmental

activist; Prof. Thomas R. Odhiambo, First African Archbishop of the Anglican Church of Kenya: Festo Olang' , Bethwell Allan Ogot (Renowned historian), John Obiero Nyagarama: Former Governor of Nyamira Academic and former Deputy Executive Director of UNEP County Reuben Olemba among others.

Kisumu governor Prof. Peter Anyang' Nyong'o in his speech said the county had established Maseno Municipality and initiated the development of a comprehensive spatial plan for the futuristic planning and development of Maseno.

"Through this vision, we envisage a more seamless correlation between the students of this great institution and the others around it, with the residents of Maseno as the town grows into a modern educational and innovation centre," the governor said.

He noted Kisumu County is planning the future of Maseno Municipality with an expanded Maseno School firmly at its heart.

To this end, Prof. Nyong'o said they were working with national government, regional water agencies, and development partners to implement a major water infrastructure project

costing approximately Sh. 10.6 billion.

The Governor noted that Phase Two, Lot One of these works, is expected to be completed by 2027.

Nyong'o said Maseno is one of Kenya's enduring symbols of academic excellence and leadership development.

"While many schools

rise and fall with seasons and circumstances, Maseno has consistently remained among the leading centres of academic excellence in Kenya. That consistency is not accidental. It is the product of culture, discipline, institutional pride and an unwavering commitment to excellence," he added.

## Kenya, U.S. expand partnership on disease outbreak preparedness

The U.S. Government has reaffirmed its commitment to strengthening its partnership with Kenya in the health sector through enhanced health security programmes. Acting U.S. Ambassador to Kenya, Susan Burns, said that health security rarely makes headlines when systems are functioning effectively, and only becomes visible during moments of crisis, when outbreaks spread, systems are overwhelmed, and economies and national stability are threatened.

"But the real work happens long before that moment, through sustained investment,

strong partnerships, and the daily work of building systems that are resilient to withstand shocks," Burns said during the inaugural Kenya Health Security Convention in Mombasa.

The Acting Ambassador disclosed that the US government will spend approximately \$290 million (Sh33.9 billion) on health programmes in Kenya this year.

"The United States is prioritizing health, security, humanitarian assistance, and economic innovation programmes. In health, we continue to support HIV, TB, malaria, influenza, disease outbreak surveillance and response, and keep mothers and children healthy," she added.

The collaboration between the US and the Government of Kenya has ensured that 1.3 million Kenyans living with HIV, have access to lifesaving treatment, while 150,000 children have been born HIV-free. Between 2010 and 2020, malaria prevalence in the country also reduced by 50 per cent. "No other country has devoted so much of its own resources to saving Kenyan lives and to helping build a lasting, durable, effective, and resilient health system here," she said.

The Acting Ambassador affirmed that the United States has not abandoned health programmes and was instead working to roll-out more initiatives.

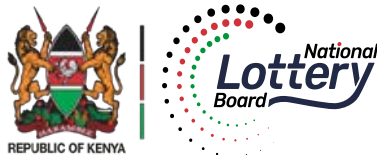

# Taita Taveta emerges as Kenya's new coal frontier

Taita Taveta County has emerged as a potential frontier in Kenya's efforts to reduce its reliance on imported coal, following fresh assessments by the Energy and Petroleum Regulatory Authority (EPRA) wing overseeing coal development.

Kenya currently imports an estimated two million tonnes of coal annually, mainly from Tanzania, South Africa, and Mozambique, at a cost of about Sh4 billion each year. This underscores a growing energy security and industrial cost challenge.

New geological data indicates that four out of the 31 coal exploration blocks identified nationally traverse Taita Taveta County, placing the region at the centre of renewed efforts to tap local coal resources. This comes as the government moves to operationalize its coal policy framework, including the recent April gazette on coal utilization, which opens the door for structured public participation and regulatory oversight of exploration, extraction, and end use.

During a courtesy call on Taita Taveta Deputy Governor, Christine Saru Kilalo, an EPRA delegation led by Victor Ochieng said communities in the county will play a central role in shaping how the resource is developed.

Ochieng noted that the new policy direction is aligned with Kenya's broader industrialization agenda, particularly in supporting energy-intensive sectors such as cement and steel manufacturing.

Manufacturers including Devki Steel Mills in Manga, Taita Taveta are expected to be key stakeholders in the process, as the country seeks to stabilise fuel inputs for heavy industry. At the same time, EPRA emphasised that deployment of clean coal technologies will be critical in addressing environmental and health concerns that have historically slowed coal development in Kenya. The approach mirrors global shifts where coal, though controversial, remains part of transitional energy mixes when paired with emissions control technologies.

Kenya's coal push has gained renewed momentum amid rising energy demand and the need to lower production costs under the government's Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA), which prioritises manufacturing growth.

Kilalo said Taita Taveta's rich natural resource base, including minerals and potential coal deposits, positions the county for accelerated economic transformation if managed sustainably.

# Mau Conservation Marathon registration opens

Kenya's largest water tower, the Mau Forest Complex, is at the heart of a bold conservation movement that blends athletics, environmental restoration and community empowerment.

The Second Edition of the Mau Conservation Marathon has officially opened registration, with Principal Secretary for Environment and Climate Change, Dr. Eng. Festus Ng'eno (pictured), urging athletes, conservation champions, and local communities to rally behind the cause.

Launching the mar-



athon in Nakuru, Principal Secretary for Environment and Climate Change, Dr. Eng. Festus Ng'eno, who also serves as Patron of the Mau Forest Complex Integrated Conservation and Livelihood Improvement Programme (MFC-ICLIP), described the event as a unique blend of athletics, environmental education, and community

empowerment.

"The marathon is more than a race, it's a movement to restore, protect, and celebrate the Mau Forest. Every step helps grow a greener future, empower communities, and safeguard our natural heritage. From elite runners chasing glory to families joining the fun run, there's a place for everyone," said Dr. Ng'eno.

The marathon is anchored within the 10-year MFC-ICLIP programme, which integrates environmental awareness, youth and talent development, forest rehabilitation, and sustainable livelihoods.

Already, the programme has restored over 1,500

hectares of degraded forest and supported more than 3,000 farmers through initiatives such as sustainable agriculture, beekeeping, dairy support, and improved water access projects.

Set against the breathtaking backdrop of Kuresoi North and Kuresoi South in Nakuru County, the race offers one of Africa's most demanding high-altitude courses.

At elevations between 2,559 and 2,793 metres above sea level, runners will navigate rolling forest landscapes, steep gradients, and cool highland terrain; conditions that test endurance, resilience, and

mental stamina.

This year's edition, scheduled for 3rd July 2026, will feature four categories: the 42KM Full Marathon, 21KM Half Marathon, 10KM Race, and 5KM Family Fun Run.

Organizers are targeting 2,500 participants, with increased prize money totalling Sh 7.8 million. Winners of the men's and women's full marathon will each receive Sh 600,000, while half marathon winners will take home Sh 350,000.

The inaugural edition proved the potential of athletics to drive conservation and youth empowerment, awarding over Sh

3.3 million in prize money and drawing strong government and community support. Building on that success, this year's marathon is expected to attract even greater interest from both local and international athletes.

Nakuru County Governor Susan Kihika, represented by Deputy County Governor David Kones, emphasized that conservation and community development can thrive together.

She highlighted the Mau Forest Complex as a critical water tower that sustains livelihoods and biodiversity, stressing that its protection is a shared responsibility.

## Land Surveyors' Board warns public against hiring unqualified Surveyors

The Land Surveyors' Board has warned Kenyans against hiring unqualified individuals to carry out land surveying work, saying the practice is illegal and exposes landowners to fraud, disputes, and financial losses.

In a public notice issued on May 7, 2026, the Board stated that only licensed surveyors are legally allowed to offer land surveying and mapping services in Kenya. It explained that any person conducting surveying work without a valid license is acting unlawfully.

According to the notice, licensed surveyors are responsible for activities such as measuring land boundaries, preparing maps and land registration plans, and handling survey data. The Board warned that engaging unqualified individuals can result in fake survey records, land disputes, financial losses, delays in approvals, and lengthy court cases.

The Board further noted that some individuals falsely present themselves as professional surveyors in order to con unsuspecting members of the public. It cautioned that licensed surveyors who permit unqualified persons to operate under them also risk legal action, fines, imprisonment, or both.

Commenting on the public notice, the Director of Surveys and Chairman of the Land Surveyors' Board, Mr. Weldon Maritim, said land surveying is a regulated profession and urged Kenyans to only engage licensed surveyors to avoid fraud and disputes.

"Very soon, the Board will undertake a post-audit review of the register of licensed land surveyors to identify and eliminate any irregularities in its operations," said Mr. Maritim.

Mr. Maritim further noted that efforts to restore integrity in the surveying profession must go beyond addressing illegal practitioners.

"The fight against graft should not only target quacks and illegal practitioners, but must also focus on strengthening the Board's internal operations," he added.

Members of the public have been advised to confirm whether a surveyor is registered before hiring them. The Board said verification can be done through its online register. It also urged unlicensed surveyors to formally register and comply with the law.

The Board reaffirmed its commitment to taking action against illegal surveying activities in order to protect the public and uphold professionalism in Kenya's land surveying sector.

The warning comes at a time when cases of land fraud and boundary disputes continue to rise in different parts of the country. Many landowners have reportedly fallen victim to fake surveyors who disappear after receiving payment, leaving behind incomplete or inaccurate work that causes conflict and delays in land transactions.

According to the Board, land surveying plays a critical role in land ownership and development, making it important for Kenyans to engage qualified professionals. The Board urged the public to remain vigilant in order to safeguard their investments and avoid unnecessary legal battles.

# Kenya Shipyards courts Zanzibar in strategic maritime push

Kenya Shipyards Limited (KSL) has stepped up its regional expansion drive with a high-level market reconnaissance mission to Zanzibar; a bold move aimed at cementing Kenya's leadership in shipbuilding, vessel maintenance, and maritime logistics across Eastern Africa.

The multidisciplinary delegation, led by Col. Francis Mutiso, General Manager for Maintenance, Repairs and Overhaul,

undertook the strategic visit as part of a broader plan to position KSL ahead of regional competitors in the fast-growing maritime market of Zanzibar and the wider Eastern Seaboard of Africa (ESA).

Zanzibar is increasingly emerging as a critical maritime hub, linking mainland East Africa with the Indian Ocean trade corridor.

Traditionally anchored in spice trade and tourism, its economy is now undergoing a significant transformation, with authorities prioritizing

maritime transport and the blue economy as pillars of sustainable growth.

At the center of the visit was a high-level engagement with Dr. Khalid Salum Mohammed, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport in the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar, who warmly welcomed KSL's entry into the island's maritime ecosystem.

"I did not know about Kenya Shipyards Limited, your presence here is an eye-opener. There is now a government agency within the East African

Community that we can collaborate with on a government-to-government basis to improve the lives of our people," said Dr. Mohammed.

The Minister acknowledged longstanding challenges in maintaining Zanzibar's growing fleet, noting that reliance on distant private shipyards has often led to costly delays.

"We have been experiencing a lot of delays with private entities where we send our vessels for repairs and servicing. From now

on, we will be your ambassadors," he added.

Zanzibar's maritime sector is expanding rapidly, driven by demand for passenger ferries, cargo vessels, fishing fleets, and tourism-related marine services.


According to Dr. Mohammed, the island currently has over 100 vessels registered under the Zanzibar Maritime Authority, underscoring the urgent need for reliable and accessible ship repair and maintenance services.

The government is also



investing heavily in new maritime assets, including vessels under construction abroad.

"We have new ships being built at Goa Shipyard in India, which will be delivered in June. Once they arrive, they will require servicing and repairs, and we will need the services of Kenya Shipyards Limited," Dr. Mohammed noted.

Beyond conventional shipyard services, Zanzibar has expressed interest in KSL's innovative offerings, particularly in safety-focused vessel design.

# State lauds ITACA project for championing higher education

Principal Secretary, State Department of Higher Education and Research, Dr. Beatrice Inyangala, has hailed the internationalization agenda being championed through the EU-funded Italia Academia with Africa (ITACA) project – an initiative of four Italian universities and ten African universities, including Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology (JKUAT).

The PS made the remarks in a speech delivered by the Secretary, State Department of Higher Education and Research, Dr. Caro Hunja, during the final event of the ‘Internationalizing Italia Academia in Africa Project’ in Nairobi on Friday, April 17, 2026 attended by Kenyan and Italian partners.

The PS lauded ‘universities for taking the initiative and engaging with international partners,’ stating, the Government of Kenya ‘was truly grateful for the kind of interactions and relationships that have been nurtured with Italy over time.’

She noted that ‘Kenya and the Italian republic enjoy a robust and multidimensional partnership anchored in decades of cooperation and cultural, scientific and technological development,’ further stating that the cooperation lay on a foundation of shared values and principles aimed at fostering sustained growth and shared prosperity.

The PS recalled a Memorandum of Understanding signed between Kenya and Italy in 2006 on cultural and scientific cooperation and technology cooperation that encourages ‘development of cooperation between the two countries through intensified-inter university academic agreements and engagement in joint research on common interests.’

The PS, added that Kenya-Italy cooperation continues to grow with a strong emphasis on sustainable economic partnership, which remains an important anchor in supporting Kenya’s national economic development priorities while fostering mutual benefits to both countries.

The Permanent Secretary announced that a new project called the ATLANTIS – Advancing Learning and Academic Networks for Transformation, Innovation and Sustainability – is set to be launched and it entails development of professional courses in postgraduate studies, creation of research opportunities and networks for knowledge exchange.

The Deputy Ambassador of the Italian Embassy in Kenya, Macco Scoppa, said, ‘Research and higher education are not just sectors of cooperation, they are among the most strategic sectors of cooperation that Italy follows in its international engagements.’

# Kenya to strengthening Intergovernmental cooperation

As Kenya's devolved system enters its 13th year, attention is increasingly shifting from establishing structures to strengthening institutions that can sustain effective governance, accountability and cooperation between the national and county governments. It is against this

backdrop that a high-level Kenyan delegation is in Arusha, Tanzania, for a strategic study tour and knowledge exchange programme with organs of the East African Community (EAC).

The delegation, led by IGRTC Member John Burugu, brings together officials from the Intergovernmental Relations Technical Committee (IGRTC), the Executive

Office of the President, the State Department for Devolution under the Office of the Deputy President, the Office of the Attorney General, Parliament and the Kenya Law Reform Commission. The mission reflects a coordinated whole-of-government effort to strengthen intergovernmental relations and enhance the effectiveness of Kenya's devolved governance

system.

At the centre of the engagement is a benchmarking exercise aimed at drawing lessons from the EAC's governance architecture, particularly in areas of policy coordination, legislative harmonisation, dispute resolution and institutional collaboration. For Kenya, whose devolved system continues to evolve, the visit represents

a timely opportunity to assess how regional mechanisms can inform and improve domestic inter-governmental processes.

Speaking during the engagements, Burugu said, "The programme is intended to deepen Kenya's understanding of how regional intergovernmental structures operate and how such experiences can be adapted to support devolution."

The delegation began its engagements at the EAC Secretariat, including a courtesy call on the Secretary General, where discussions focused on governance coordination and implementation of regional policies.

During the discussions, Kenyan officials drew significant parallels between the EAC governance model and Kenya's own inter-governmental framework.

## Biometric devices to curb fraud in SHA facilities

The Ministry of Health has announced plans to equip all healthcare facilities contracted under the Social Health Authority (SHA) with biometric verification devices in a bid to curb fraud concerns.

Under the new system, all SHA insurance claim approvals require fingerprint authentication, making it significantly harder to process claims without a patient's physical presence.

Health Cabinet Secretary, Aden Duale, said that more than 5,000 facilities had already been supplied with the machines, with a further 3,000 set to be equipped by next week.

Duale said the roll-out was prompted by numerous documented cases of fraud, including unusual multiple visits by the same individuals, questionable dependant registrations, and suspected collusion between individuals and health facilities, to exploit the scheme.

Duale said every facility contracted under SHA will have biometric gadgets in the next two months that will help address misuse and fraud attempts by a section of individuals.

The CS said the Ministry was rolling-out capacity building trainings of healthcare workers to support the effective deployment of the devices in the healthcare facilities.

Speaking on the sidelines of an engagement with the Kenya National Union of Teachers (KNUT) in Naivasha, Duale committed to

streamline all teachers cover when accessing services under new health system.

He said any facility found demanding out-of-pocket payments from teachers would be suspended from the SHA network after teachers raised concerns over the move to charge them cash. The CS noted that 43,000 teachers had already accessed services at SHA-approved facilities in the past five months.

KNUT Secretary General, Collins Oyuu, said the Union was satisfied with commitments made by SHA officials to resolve teething problems

teachers were facing when accessing services.

Oyuu said a more responsive healthcare system that guaranteed better coverage of teachers, was a critical driver of quality education in the country.

KNUT deal with SHA to address its members concerns on their healthcare coverage follows Kenya Union of Post Primary Education Teachers (KUPPET) deal with the health authority ensuring that all teachers access better care.

The new system replaced the defunct National Health Insurance Fund (NHIF) on

October 2024, following the enactment of the Social Health Insurance Act, 2023, as part of government Universal Health Coverage agenda.

SHA has three components, including Primary Healthcare Fund for preventive and community-based services, Social Health Insurance Fund (SHIF) for inpatient and outpatient care and the Emergency, Chronic, and Critical Illness Fund.

Recent data, from the Health Ministry indicates that more than 30 million Kenyans had registered with SHA.

The Compensation claims offer up to Sh5 million for death and Sh3 million for injury with new digital systems set to be launched to speed up payments with victims required to report incidents to KWS within 24 hours to initiate the process.

## Tana River wildlife victims get Sh172m compensation

At least 225 wildlife attack victims in Tana River County have received Sh172 million from Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS) as monetary compensation.

The compensation scheme administered by the KWS covers for death, injury and property damage as a result of human-wildlife conflict. In Tana River human-wildlife conflict is a recurrent phenomenon where the

animals have become a menace as they stray into villages in search of water and forage where they destroy farmlands.

The money processed between 2024 and 2026 was handed over to the beneficiaries in Hola town by Dr. John Chumo, the Conservation Secretary at the State Department for Wildlife in the Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife.

Dr. Chumo revealed that the Sh172 million to the 225 beneficiaries were claims dating back 10 years with

### Anticipation builds in Wajir ahead of Madaraka Day celebrations

Wajir County is witnessing intensified infrastructural development, even as preparations gather momentum ahead of this year's Madaraka Day celebrations next month, which will be hosted in the region for the first time.

The ongoing works, mainly focusing on road construction and rehabilitation, are part of a joint effort between the national government and the Wajir County Government to upgrade key infrastructure in readiness for the national event.

According to the Kenya Urban Roads Authority (KURA) North Eastern Regional Manager, Eng. Pious Ndege, the projects are aimed at improving connectivity within Wajir town and its environs, while also enhancing economic activities beyond the celebrations.

"For the record, we are building and upgrading roads to meet the required

standards. We are also rehabilitating existing roads and improving drainage systems," said Ndege.

The Regional Manager noted that the upgrading works have been divided into three packages covering approximately 3.2 kilometres, four kilometres, and 1.8 kilometres respectively.

"In addition, we are undertaking rehabilitation works from Wajir Airport to the stadium, covering about 8.8 kilometres of tarmac road. Drainage improvement works are also ongoing from Wajir town up to the County Assembly," he added.

Residents have welcomed the projects, saying they are already transforming transport and business activities in the area.

Some residents noted that the improved roads have eased movement and opened up economic opportunities, particularly for the local youth, who have secured employment in the ongoing construction works.

### Machakos gets modern medical equipment to boost healthcare

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Mau Forest restoration drive starts with launch of conservation marathon

Environment PS Dr Eng. Festus Ng'eno launches the second edition of Mau Conservation Marathon, kicking off phase two activities to restore one of Kenya's critical water tower

The kick off of activities under the second edition of the Mau Forest Complex-Integrated Conservation and Livelihood Improvement Programme (MFC-ICLIP) marks a renewed push to safeguard the country's largest water tower.

The Mau Forest, renowned for its expansiveness, lush biodiversity and ecological importance, spans 400,000 hectares and supports agriculture and hydroelectric power generation and feeds major lakes across the region, sustaining millions of livelihoods.

It is one of Kenya's largest and most important water towers, with the others being the Aberdare Ranges, Mount Kenya, Cherangany Hills and Mount Elgon.

Dr Eng. Festus Ng'eno, the Principal Secretary for Environment and Climate Change and the Patron of MFC-ICLIP, is leading the efforts to restore the Mau ecosystem.

The PS last week launched the second edition of the Mau Conservation Marathon, which will be held on July 3, 2026, ahead of the official tree planting exercise in Nakuru County.

The registration portal for the marathon, whose Ambassador is Athletics Icon Faith Kipyegon, is now open, with athletes and conservation enthusiasts invited to take part in the flagship event.

The marathon is part of the activities to conserve and manage the resource under the 10-year MFC-ICLIP initiative.

The event that will take place in Kuresoi North and Kuresoi South features 10km, 21km and 42km elite men and women races, as well as 5km corporate race. The prize pool has been significantly increased to Sh7.8 million, with top winners in the full marathon set to receive Sh600,000.

"The marathon is more than a race, it's a movement to restore, protect and celebrate the Mau Forest. Every step you take helps grow a greener future, empowers communities and safeguards our natural heritage," Dr Ng'eno said.

"From elite runners chasing glory to families joining the fun run, there's a place for everyone. Lace up, show up and be part of something bigger," he added.

He expressed gratitude to partners and stakeholders for their support in the inaugural edition, which attracted hundreds of participants and successfully blended sport with conservation and youth empowerment.

The PS noted that the marathon has already demonstrated its impact by providing income opportunities to young athletes, with over Sh3.39 million awarded in prizes during the first edition, further boosted by additional support from the National Government.

The marathon course, one of the toughest, stretches across elevations ranging from 2,559 metres to 2,793 metres above sea level, which will push athletes into conditions comparable to some of the world's most demanding training environments. At such altitudes, oxygen levels drop, breathing sharpens and every stride becomes a test of resilience.

For elite runners seeking world-class altitude conditioning, the event will offer a natural training ground as the rolling terrain cuts through dense indigenous forest, open highland landscapes and winding rural roads

framed by breathtaking views of the Mau ecosystem.

The PS observed that for international athletes, the marathon presents authenticity. "There will be no artificial stadium atmosphere, no urban distractions, just runners, mountains, forests and altitude," he said.

Last year, the race attracted over 1,019 participants and this time, the PS said they are targeting 2,500 participants as the marathon expands its profile locally and internationally.

The Mau Forest conservation initiative has already restored over 1,500 hectares of degraded forest. More than 3,150 farmers have received support ranging from dairy equipment and certified potato seeds to beehives aimed at creating sustainable income streams. Communities have also gained improved access to water through boreholes and rehabilitated dams.

Nakuru Governor Susan Kihika noted that MFC-ICLIP has set a solid and inspiring foundation for restoring critical ecosystems while improving livelihoods for people.

"Through the Community Livelihood Improvement Programme, many households have benefited from dairy support, access to certified seeds and the promotion of high-value crops such as avocado, coffee and pyrethrum, as well as beekeeping. These efforts are strengthening

incomes while reducing dependence on forest resources, an approach that is both practical and sustainable," the Governor said.

Adding, "The establishment of tree nurseries, expansion of agroforestry and adoption of sustainable land management practices are also helping communities build resilience. It is especially encouraging to see young people and women stepping into green enterprises, creating livelihoods that are aligned with conservation."

The Mau Forest conservation initiative is part of the Government's 15 billion tree planting programme, a nationwide effort to combat climate change, restore degraded ecosystems and secure water resources.

The campaign seeks to reverse decades of environmental degradation by increasing forest cover to 30 per cent from the current 12 per cent as well as protect critical ecosystems

and promote sustainable livelihoods for communities living around forests.

Since President William Ruto launched the campaign in 2022, over a billion trees have been planted in the different parts of the country, with initiatives like MFC-ICLIP contributing greatly to the number.

Further, MFC-ICLIP is part of the Bottom-up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA), as it is designed to ensure that ordinary citizens benefit directly from national initiatives, the environment is conserved and climate change effects are mitigated.

Environmental conservation is one of the key planks of BETA, with the Government prioritising restoration of critical ecosystems such as forests, wetlands and rangelands to drive inclusive growth and economic transformation. ■

# MSMEs drive job creation as Government sustains programmes in the sector

The economy recorded a significant boost in employment in 2025, with Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) sector, one of the key pillars of the Bottom-up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA), playing a central role in job creation.

The "Economic Survey 2026" indicates that total recorded employment during the period, excluding small-scale agriculture, rose to 21.6 million, up from 20.8 million in 2024.

Out of the 822,100 new jobs generated during the year, an impressive 87.2 per cent were created in the informal sector, underscoring

the critical role of MSMEs in absorbing the country's growing labour force. "The informal sector employment rose by 716,800 jobs in 2025 to stand at 18.1 million," the Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (KNBS) noted in the report released on April 30, 2026.

Under the MSMEs pillar, Government initiatives in the sector

include the Hustler Fund, Nyota Programme and County Aggregation and Industrial Parks (CAIPs), which seek to drive manufacturing and industrialisation, placing small businesses at the heart of BETA.

The Hustler Fund has disbursed over Sh80 billion to over 26 million Kenyans, a majority of them who run small businesses.

And through NYOTA programme, the Government has trained and offered start-up grants of Sh25,000 to over 100,000 youth, equipping them with skills and resources needed to launch and sustain viable enterprises.

# Kindiki, Koskei direct Regulatory Agencies to enhance impact

The directive is a push to transform the regulatory space, ensuring that Agencies have measurable impact that strengthens public trust and drives socio-economic growth

Deputy President Kithure Kindiki and the Chief of Staff and Head of Public Service Felix Koskei have put on notice 127 regulatory authorities and agencies, asking them to shift their focus from procedural compliance to measurable, citizen-centred outcomes that can be seen.

The two made the pronouncement during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Regulatory Authorities and Agencies (RAAs) Conference at the South Eastern Kenya University (SEKU) in Kitui County last week, as they challenged regulators to be accountable, transparent and enhance their socio-economic impact.

Prof Kindiki, who officially opened the conference, reaffirmed the Government's commitment to efficiency in service delivery and the protection of citizens' lives and livelihoods. "The Government is committed to efficiency in delivery of services to citizens, protection of their lives and livelihoods and a fair, predictable and secure environment to access opportunities," Prof Kindiki said.

He called upon the RAAs to exercise their statutory powers in a fair, firm and predictable manner, noting that their work shapes markets, safeguards livelihoods and protects the welfare

of all Kenyans.

"To strengthen and sharpen alignment with the national priorities as outlined in the Bottom-up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA), Regulatory Authorities and Agencies must reduce risks, improve compliance, enhance fairness, lower the cost of doing business and ultimately improve the quality of life for our people," the Deputy President said.

Mr Koskei told the agency Heads that a Government review had found a system that was not functioning optimally, with fragmented mandates and duplication across regulators.

He noted that overlapping Agencies and

weak regulatory systems have eroded public confidence and delayed business approvals.

"Regulatory Authorities and Agencies must move beyond procedural compliance and place greater focus on measurable outcomes that wananchi can see and experience," Mr Koskei said.

Deliberations at the three-day conference underscored the need to ground regulatory action in constitutional principles and focus on accountability and transparency.

Participants noted progress made over the past three years in strengthening governance, clarifying mandates and enhancing

performance. Mr Koskei appreciated the commendable performance of regulatory bodies, saying: "The gains we have made must be protected, strengthened and extended."

Among those in attendance were Principal Secretaries Mr Stephen Isaboke (Broadcasting and Telecommunication), Dr Raymond Omollo (Interior and National Administration), Mr Cyrell Wagunda (Public Investments and Assets Management), Dr Eng. Festus Ng'eno (Environment) and Gitonga Mugambi (Forestry). Others present were Chairpersons and Chief Executive Officers of RAAs, alongside key players in the regulatory space. ■

# Proposed policy to power Huduma Kenya's service expansion

The proposed One Stop Shop Government Services Policy gives Huduma Kenya a strong legal foundation to continue and improve standardised service delivery across all Centres.

The policy, which is currently at the public participation stage (March 2026), targets to expand access to service by decentralising them further, ensuring Huduma Kenya reaches grassroots communities through Mashinani outreaches, digital platforms as well as the establishment of Huduma Centres at the sub county level.

It promises greater convenience to save time, reduce costs and cut

delays. Importantly, it enhances inclusivity so that rural and marginalised citizens are not left behind. And with stronger data protection and transparency measures, Kenyans can trust that their personal information is safe.

For citizens, this means services that are predictable, professional and citizen-centric wherever they go.

The policy is a promise to *mwananchi* that whether you live in Nairobi or a remote village, Government services will be

accessible, affordable and dignified.

For years, Kenyans endured the frustrations of seeking Government services. A simple task could mean hours in long queues, endless paperwork and trips from one office to another. It was a system that drained patience and eroded trust.

That began to change in 2013 when the Government launched the Huduma Kenya Service Delivery Programme, a flagship project under Vision 2030.

For the first time, citizens experienced the One Stop Shop model, where services were brought together under one roof.

No longer did people have to move from office to office, but they could apply for IDs, register businesses

or access HELB services in a single centre. It was a turning point that restored dignity and convenience to public service delivery.

The transformation has been profound. Huduma Kenya has served more than 100 million citizens, consistently achieving 85 per cent customer satisfaction, and earning over 25 awards for innovation and citizen centric delivery.

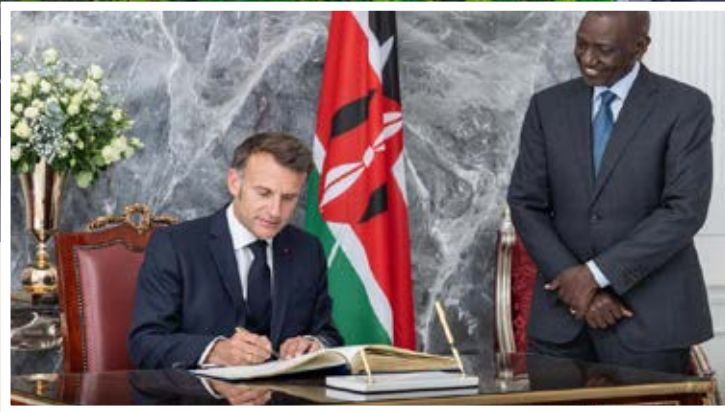
With 59 Huduma Centres established across the country, supported by mobile outreach through Huduma Mashinani and the first all Government Huduma Contact and Tele Counselling Centre, services are now closer, faster and more dignified. ■

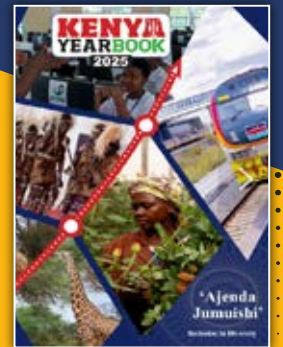


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
