Wizara ya Elimu imefichua mipango ya kuondoa hatua kwa hatua matumizi ya mitihani ya karatasi katika mfumo wa elimu nchini Kenya katika miaka ijayo, kupitia mageuzi makubwa yanayolenga kupunguza mabilioni ya shilingi yanayotumika kila mwaka kuchapisha na kusimamia mitihani ya kitaifa. kwa mara. Katika mwaka wa kifedha wa 2024/2025, baraza hilo lilikumbwa na nakisi ya Shilingi bilioni 3.7, hali iliyokaribia kulemaza shughuli zake

kabla ya Bunge kuingilia kati. Makadirio ya mwaka wa kifedha wa 2026/2027 yanaonyesha kuwa usimamizi wa mitihani utagharimu Shilingi bilioni 14.7,

lakini ni Shilingi bilioni 9.9 pekee zilizotengwa, na kuacha pengo la Shilingi bilioni 4.82. Sehemu kubwa ya gharama hizi imekuwa ikitokana na uchapishaji wa mitihani nje ya nchi. Kwa miaka mingi, KNEC imekuwa ikitegemea kampuni za uchapishaji za usalama kutoka mataifa ya kigeni kuzalisha vijitabu vya mitihani na fomu za optical mark recognition (OMR), hatua ambayo imekosolewa na wadau kuwa ya gharama kubwa na yenye changamoto za kiusafirishaji. Waziri wa Hazina ya Kitaifa John Mbadi amehoji sababu ya kuendelea kuchapisha vifaa hivyo jijini London, akisema utaratibu huo unaongeza gharama zisizo za lazima kwa walipa kodi. Afisa Mkuu Mtendaji wa KNEC David Njengere alisema mabadiliko kuelekea tathmini za kidijitali yamechochewa na mafanikio ya utekelezaji wa mitihani ya kidijitali katika vyo vya mafunzo ya walimu. Katika kipindi cha miaka mitatu iliyopita, zaidi ya wanafunzi 37,000 wa mafunzo ya ualimu

wamefanya mitihani ya kidijitali na kuhitimu. Kilichoanza kama mpango wa majaribio uliowahusisha watahiniwa 45 mwaka wa 2021, kilikuwa kimepanuka hadi zaidi ya watahiniwa 50,000 katika taasisi zaidi ya 100 kufikia mwaka wa 2025. Wanafunzi hao sasa hufanya mitihani yote mtandaoni, huku majibu yao yakitumwa kielektroniki kupitia mfumo wa KNEC kwa ajili ya usahihishaji. Kufuatia mafanikio hayo, KNEC inapanga kuanzisha tathmini za kidijitali katika shule za sekondari za juu kuanzia mwaka wa 2027. Baraza hilo linasema mfumo huo utaimarisha ujuzi wa kidijitali, kuwezesha usahihishaji wa mitihani kwa njia

Wizara ya Afya ime-thibitisha tena marufuku ya biashara za pombe na sigara kuendesha shughuli karibu na taasisi za elimu nchini kote. Katibu wa Afya ya Umma na Viwango vya Kitaaluma, Mary Muthoni, alielekeza kuwa hakuna biashara inayouza pombe au sigara inayopaswa kufanya kazi karibu na taasisi za elimu, katika juhudi za kuwalinda wanafunzi dhidi ya matumizi mabaya ya pombe na dawa za kulevya. Muthoni pia alizitaka serikali za kaunti kuhakikisha kuwa wadau wote muhimu katika sekta ya elimu wanatekeleza ipasavyo agizo hilo. “Ikiwa utaona biashara kama hizo karibu na shule katika eneo lako na serikali ya kaunti haichukui hatua, nijulishe nami nitakuja kufunga biashara hiyo,” Bi. Muthoni alisema. PS huyo, ambaye alikuwa akihutubia mkutano katika eneo la Muiri, eneobunge la Ol Kalou katika Kaunti ya Nyandarua,

aliwahimiza wananchi kuzingatia usafi wakati huu wa msimu wa mvua akisema magonjwa mengi huzuka wakati wa hali kama hiyo ya hewa. PS huyo aliwataka wananchi wanaoishi katika maeneo hayo kuhakikisha kuwa nyumba zao zina vyoo, akisema kuwa kuji-

saidia ovyo ni hatari kwa afya. “Wananchi wanapaswa kuondoa maji yaliyotumama na kuhakikisha kuwa kuna vyoo katika makazi yao ili kuepuka kujisaidia ovyo kwa sababu mvua inaponyesha, maji ya mafuriko yanaweza kusambaza kinyesi hadi majumbani na hivyo kusababisha magon-

jwa,” alisema PS huyo. Kuhusu matumizi na uraibu wa dawa za kulevya miongoni mwa vijana, Muthoni aliwahimiza wazazi kuwa waangalifu zaidi akisema dawa hizo zinazua katika mfumo wa sigara za kielektroniki zinazofanana na kalamu. Alisema Wizara ya Afya imeimarisha uangalizi dhidi ya uingizaji wa dawa za kulevya na kemikali hatari kwa kukamata na kuharibu bidhaa hizo kabla hazijitoka katika viwanja vya ndege vya nchi. Kuhusu shughuli za Wahudumu wa Afya ya Jamii (CHPs) katika Kaunti ya Nyandarua, Muthoni alisema kuwa zaidi ya kaya 18,840 zimesajiliwa katika kaunti hiyo. Pia alibainisha kuwa CHPs walifanya kliniki 3,870 za uchunguzi wa kisukari ambapo watu kadhaa walielekezwa hospitalini kwa matibabu zaidi. “Pia wamewachunguza watu 2,400 kwa shinikizo la damu na zaidi ya watu 300 wameelekezwa hospitalini,” aliongeza PS huyo. Alisema serikali ya kitaifa inasaidia serikali za kaunti kuimarisha vifaa katika vituo vya afya ili kuwazuia wananchi kusafiri mbali kutafuta huduma za matibabu.

The Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock Development has implemented the first five years of the Agricultural Sector Transformation and Growth Strategy (ASTGS 2019-2029) guided by the National Agriculture Investment Plan (NAIP) 2019-2024. The ASTGS recommends a review of performance after the first five years of implementation with a view to develop an investment plan for the last phase which match the transformation needed.

Waziri wa Barabara na Uchukuzi, Davis Chirchir, amekagua miradi inayoendelea ya barabara na miundombinu mjini Wajir kuelekea maadhimisho ya mwaka huu ya Madaraka Day yaliyopangwa kufanyika Juni 1. Ukaguzi huo ulilenga barabara muhimu zinazoboreshwa kwa kiwango cha lami ili kuboresha upatikanaji, kurahisisha usafiri ndani ya mji huo na kusaidia maandalizi ya sherehe za kitaifa ambazo zinaandaliwa katika Kaunti ya Wajir kwa mara ya kwanza. Waziri huyo pia alikagua kazi za ukarabati katika barabara ya Airport Gate-Basabra-Shule ya Furaha-Kiunganishi cha Uwanja wa Michezo, kazi za kuboresha mifereji ya maji katika barabara ya B13 Miyale na barabara ya kuelekea Hifadhi ya Viwanda ya Kaunti (CAIPS).

Chirchir alisema miradi kadhaa imepiga hatua kubwa huku baadhi ikiwa karibu kukamilika. Kulingana na Wizara hiyo, barabara za kuelekea makazi ya Kamishna wa Kaunti, eno

la Makazi Nafuu na Jumba la Makumbusho la Wajir zimefikia asilimia 77.7 ya ukamilifu, huku Barabara ya Mzunguko wa Uwanja wa Michezo ikiwa imefikia asilimia 69.7.

Ukarabati wa barabara ya Airport Gate-Basabra-Shule ya Furaha-Kiunganishi cha Uwanja wa Michezo umefikia asilimia 61.5 ya ukamilifu, huku kazi za uwekaji wa kingo za barabara, ujenzi wa mifereji ya maji na kazi za kuimarisha zikiendelea. Mradi wa barabara ya Furaha Girls-Uwanja wa Michezo umefikia asilimia 55.2 ya ukamilifu, huku barabara ya CAIPS ikiwa katika asilimia 55. Kazi za kuboresha mifereji ya maji katika barabara ya B13 Miyale zimefikia asilimia 39.5 ya ukamilifu. Waziri huyo alisema serikali imejitolea kuhakikisha miradi yote muhimu ya miundombinu inakamilika kwa wakati kabla ya maadhimisho hayo. Alibainisha kuwa uboreshaji wa barabara hizo hautasaidia tu shughuli za Madaraka Day bali pia utaimarisha usafiri, biashara na maendeleo ya muda mrefu ya miji katika Kaunti ya Wajir. Wakandarasi katika maeneo mbalimbali ya kazi waliripoti maendeleo mazuri huku kazi zinazoendelea zikijumuisha uwekaji wa lami ya zege, uwekaji wa kingo na mifereji ya barabara, ujenzi wa mifereji ya maji, maandalizi ya njia za watembea kwa miguu na usindikaji wa tabaka la msingi la barabara.

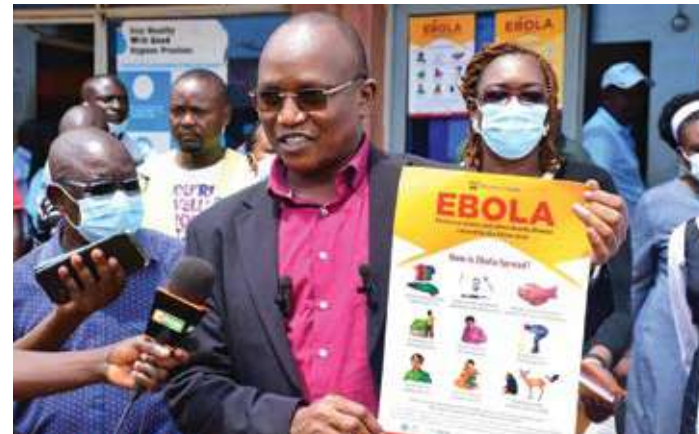

- mitigate the effects of climate change and promote ecosystem and community resilience

The objectives of the Proposed Draft Octopus Fishery Management Plan are: -

Waziri wa Masuala ya Jinsia, Utamaduni na Huduma za Watoto, Hannah Cheptumo, alisema matukio ya hivi karibuni ya ukatili dhidi ya wanawake na watoto yanaonesha haja ya haraka ya kuimarisha mifumo ya ulinzi na kuhamasisha hatua za pamoja katika sekta zote za jamii. Cheptumo, aliyeambatana na Katibu Mkuu katika Wizara ya Utamaduni na Urithi, Ummi Bashir, na mwenzake wa Huduma za Ustawi wa Watoto, Carren Ageng'o, alithibitisha tena dhamira ya serikali ya kulinda watu walio katika mazingira hatarishi na kuimarisha mifumo ya ulinzi na watoto nchini kote. "Wizara imebaini kwa wasiwasi mkubwa ongezeko la visa vya ukatili wa kijinsia na mauaji ya wanawake nchini pamoja na kuongezeka kwa matukio ya

ukatili, unyanyasaji, kutelekezwa, ukatili wa kisaikolojia, unyonyaji na udhalilishaji dhidi ya watoto," alisema Cheptumo. Alitaja matukio kadhaa ya hivi karibuni, yakiwemo madai ya kuuawa kwa Rachel Wandeto, ambaye inadaiwa alimwagiwa petroli na kisha kuchomwa moto kutokana na tofauti za kisiasa, kisha tukio la kuchomwa kisu hadi kufa kwa mwanamke mwenye umri wa miaka 25 huko Kilimani, na kifo cha

mwanafunzi wa Kidato cha Tatu huko Nyamira ambaye inadaiwa alishambuliwa na mpenzi wake, ambaye baadaye alijitua. "Haya si majanga ya pekee, bali ni viashiria vya mgogoro unaokua kitaifa unaohitaji hatua za haraka, zilizoandaliwa kwa pamoja na endelevu kutoka sekta zote za jamii yetu," alisema. Waziri alibainisha kuwa serikali imeendelea kujitolea kwa dhati kulinda watu wote dhidi ya ukatili, unyanyasaji na unyo-

nyaji kwa kuzingatia Katiba ya Kenya ya mwaka 2010, Sheria ya Watoto ya 2022 na sheria na sera nyingine zilizopo. Alisisitiza kuwa watoto ni msingi wa taifa na kwamba ulinzi wao ni wajibu wa kisheria na pia jukumu la pamoja kati ya familia, taasisi, viongozi na jamii. "Ulinzi wa wanawake, wasichana na watu wote walio katika mazingira hatarishi dhidi ya GBV na femicide ni kipaumbele cha kitaifa kinachohitaji hatua madhubuti na za pamoja," aliongeza. Cheptumo alisema Wizara inashirikiana kwa karibu na vyombo vya usalama, serikali za kaunti, washirika wa maeendeleo na miundo ya kijamii ili kuimarisha mifumo ya kinga, kuripoti, uokoaji, ukarabati na msaada kwa waathirika. Miongoni mwa hatua zinazotekelezwa ni kuharakisha mashauri ya wahalifu mahakamani, kuimarisha mifumo ya utekelezaji wa sheria na kuongeza adhabu kwa wahusika wa mauaji ya wanawake, mashambulizi ya tindikali, usafirishaji haramu wa binadamu na visa vya unyanyasaji wa watoto. Alitangaza upanuzi wa makazi salama (safe houses), vituo vya huduma za dharura vya pamoja, huduma za uokoaji na

ukarabati wa watoto, pamoja na kuimarisha kanuni za lazima za kuripoti kwa wahudumu wa afya, wafamasia, walimu, wanahabari na viongozi wa jamii. Wizara pia inaendesha kampeniza uhamasishaji nchi nzima zinazolenga kukabiliana na mila potofu na ukatili wa kimaadili pamoja na kukuza malezi bora na uandishi wa habari wenye maadili. "Kuripoti kwa wakati ni muhimu ili kuwezesha hatua za haraka, uchunguzi, uokoaji, ukarabati na upatikanaji wa haki kwa waathirika," alisema. Kulingana na takwimu kutoka Mfumo wa Taarifa za Ulinzi wa Watoto, jumla ya kesi 10,581 za watoto ziliripotiwa kati ya Januari 1, 2025 na Machi 31, 2026. Eneo ambalo hapo awali lilikuwa limejaa maji na ambapo mazao ya mahindi yaliharibiwa mara kwa mara sasa linang'aa chini ya jua la alasiri, huku mabwawa mengi ya samaki yaliyo-pangwa vizuri kwa umbo la mstatili yakionekana sambamba, wakati mengine mapya yakionekana kujengwa. Watoto wenye udadisi mara nyingi husimama kandokando ya mabwawa hayo wakitazama vifaranga vya samaki vikielea kwa kasi majini. Wakati huo huo, mkulima mmoja huzunguka akiwa amebeba chakula cha samaki kwenye ndoo ya plastiki na kukisambaza kwenye mabwawa hayo. Miongoni mwa ni Pamela Oduor mwenye umri wa miaka 48 ambaye hakuwahi kufikiria kwamba siku moja

angekuwa mfugaji wa samaki baada ya kuwa mkulima wa mahindi na mtama pamoja na kufanya biashara ndogo ya kuuza samaki mara kwa mara. “Kwa miaka mingi tulitegemea kabisa kilimo cha mahindi,” anasema huku akitupa chakula kwenye moja ya mabwawa. “Lakini kila msimu wa mvua mafuriko huharibu kila kitu.” Mafuriko ya mara kwa mara yanayoathiri maeneo ya kaunti ndogo za Bondo na Rarieda yamezidi kuzilazimisha familia zinazoishi karibu na bonde la ziwa kutafuta njia mbadala za kujipatia kipato. Baadhi ya wakazi walihamia mijini huku wengine wakiondoka na shughuli za uvuvi kwa kutumia boti katika Ziwa Victoria. Hata hivyo, kutokana na kupungua kwa samaki katika ziwa hilo pamoja na kuongezeka kwa gharama za uendeshaji, familia nyingi zimeendelea kuwa katika hali ngumu kiuchumi. Hali hiyo ndiyo iliyowahamasisa makundi kadhaa ya wenyeji kujaribu ufugaji wa samaki kwa kiwango kidogo kama njia mbadala ya kujikimu. Mwanzoni, ni wakazi wachache tu walioonyesha nia ya kujiunga na shughuli hiyo. Wengi waliogopa kuwa mabwawa hayo yangefurika wakati wa mvua kubwa huku wengine wakiamini kuwa ufugaji wa samaki unahitaji

fedha nyingi ambazo familia za kawaida haziziwezi kumudu. “Tulidhani ni shughuli inayofanywa na wawekezaji wakubwa,” anasema Oduor. “Watu wengi hapa hawakuwahi hata wamewahi kuona bwawa la samaki kwa karibu.” Kwa msaada wa maafisa wa kilimo na mashirika ya kijamii, wakulima waliovuvi walipewa mafunzo ya msingi kuhusu ujenzi wa mabwawa, usimamizi wa maji na mbinu za kulisha samaki. Leo hii, ardhi ambayo hapo awali ilikuwa haitumiki imebadilika hatua kwa hatua kuwa mtandao mkubwa wa mabwawa yanayozalisha sato na kambare kwa ajili ya masoko ya karibu pamoja na hoteli hata katika maeneo ya mbali ya Siaya yanayotegemea usambazaji wa samaki. Katika makazi ya Pamela, anaonyesha bwawa ambalo liko tayari kwa uvunaji baada ya samaki kufikia uzito unaohita-

jika wa gramu 350 hadi 500. Anasema samaki hao huchukua takribani miezi mitano hadi sita kukua, na kwamba bwawa moja la kawaida lenye ukubwa wa mita za mraba 100 hadi 300 linaweza kumpatia zaidi ya shilingi 70,000 kama mapato ghafi kwa kila mavuno. “Kwa kawaida unaweza kuvuna sato mara moja au mbili kwa mwaka ikiwa utawasimamia vizuri,” anasema. Pamela anafichua kuwa mara nyingi huweka samaki dume pekee katika mabwawa yake mengi. Anaeleza kuwa samaki dume hukua kwa kasi ya takribani asilimia 30 zaidi kuliko jike na hufikia uzito wa soko kwa haraka zaidi, jambo linalowezesha kipindi kifupi cha uvunaji na usambazaji wa uhakika kwa wateja wake. Samaki hao huvutia wanunuzi wa haraka kutoka vituo vya biashara vya karibu, hoteli na wafanyabiashara wa kandokando ya barabara

wanaopendelea samaki wa mabwawani kutokana na upatikanaji wake wa uhakika na uzito unaotabirika mezani. Collins Onyango mwenye umri wa miaka 26 ambaye amefundishwa ufugaji wa samaki na Pamela na sasa ni mmiliki wa bwawa la samaki, anasema shughuli hiyo imewapa vijana wengi sababu ya kubaki kijijini badala ya kuhamia mijini kutafuta kazi za vibarua. “Baadhi ya vijana walikuwa tayari wamepoteza matumaini katika kilimo kwa sababu mazao yalikuwa yakiharibika kila mara,” anasema. “Lakini sasa watu wanaanza kuona kilimo kwa mtazamo tofauti.” Mbali na kuzalisha kipato, wakazi kama Pamela wanasema mabwawa hayo pia yamesaidia kuboresha usalama wa chakula katika familia nyingi.

Mradi wa maji wa Paga katika Wadi ya Southwest Kisumu unatarajiwa kuhudumia takribani kaya 16,000 katika maeneo ya Kanyawega, Kanyawegi na Ojola, ukilenga idadi ya watu wapatao 22,000.

Mjumbe wa Kamati ya Utendaji ya Kaunti ya Kisumu anayehusika na Maji, Mazingira na Mabadiliko ya Tabianchi, Judith Oluoch, alisema kuwa awamu ya kwanza ya mradi huo tayari imekamilika huku awamu ya pili ikitarajiwa kuangazia kazi za usafishaji wa maji, kuunganisha kaya na kusambaza maji safi kwa wakazi.

“Huu ni mradi unaotekelezwa kwa awamu. Awamu ya kwanza ilihusisha ujenzi wa sehemu ya

kuvuta maji kutoka Ziwa Victoria, nyumba ya pampu, uwekaji wa mfumo wa nishati ya sola, uzio na sakafu ambapo mtambo wa kusafisha maji unapaswa kujengwa,” alisema Oluoch wakati wa mkutano wa ushirikishwaji wa wadau katika eneo la mradi huo.

“Wakazi walitarajia kupata maji mara moja lakini uwekaji wa mabomba kuelekea kwenye mifumo mbalimbali ya kuhifadhi maji na vibanda vya maji ulikuwa umepangwa katika awamu ya pili,” alisema.

Wakazi wanaoishi karibu na maeneo ya machimbo ya mawe katika Wadi ya Kasemeni, Kaunti ya Kwale, watanufaika moja kwa moja na shughuli za uchimbaji madini baada ya kuanzishwa kwa mchakato wa kuunda Kamati za Mikataba ya Maendeleo ya Jamii (CDACs), mfumo wa kisheria unaolenga kuhakikisha mgao wa haki wa mapato yatoakanayo na madini. Mpango huo ulijadiliwa katika mkutano wa mashauriano uliowaleta pamoja maafisa kutoka Wizara ya Madini, Ofisi ya Kamishna wa Kaunti, waendeshaji wa machimbo, na wawakilishi wa serikali ya kaunti kujadili uundaji wa kamati hizo katika maeneo ya machimbo ya mawe ndani ya Wadi ya Kasemeni.

Akizungumza katika mkutano huo, Mwakilishi wa Wadi ya Kasemeni katika Bunge la Kaunti, Victor Safari Nyanje, alisema sheria za madini zinawataka waendeshaji wa machimbo

kuchangia asilimia moja ya faida zao kwa jamii zilizoathiriwa na shughuli za uchimbaji.

“Kwa miaka mingi, tume-kuwa tukihimiza waendeshaji

wa machimbo kusaidia jamii za wenyaji, lakini sasa kuna sheria inayohakikisha jamii hazipotezi kabisa kutokana na rasilimali zinazotolewa kutoka ardhi yao,” alisema Nyanje. Alisema wadau walikubaliana kuanza vikao vya ushirikishwaji wa umma ili kuwahamasisha wakazi kuhusu sheria inayoanzisha CDACs, kueleza majukumu ya waendeshaji, na kuzipa jamii nafasi ya kuwasilisha matarajio yao kabla ya kamati kuchaguliwa. Nyanje alibainisha kuwa ndani ya miezi miwili ijayo, wadau wanatarajiwa kukamilisha majadiliano na kusaini makubaliano ya kuziwezesha kamati hizo kuanza kazi rasmi, hatua itakayowezesha waendeshaji wa machimbo kuanza kuchangia mirabaha kufadhili miradi ya maendeleo ya jamii. Pia alieleza wasiwasi wake

kuhusu athari za kimazingira na kijamii za uchimbaji wa mawe, ikiwemo uharibifu wa ardhi, changamoto za kiafya, uharibifu wa miundombinu na nyufa katika majengo na shule. “Jamii zimeumia kwa miaka mingi bila msaada wa maana kutoka kwa waendeshaji hawa. tiba,” alisema. Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi wa Ripoti ya Athari za Kiuchumi ya Meta nchini Kenya, Isaboke alisisitiza kuwa ushirikiano wa kiteknolojia si hiari tena katika maendeleo ya taifa. "Iwe ni maendeleo, teknolojia, au ubunifu, hakuna kinachofanya kazi kivyake. Tunafaulu kupitia ushirikiano," alisema. Katibu huyo alisema Kenya inaendelea kutekeleza sera na mageuzi ya kikanuni yanayolenga kujenga uchumi wa kidijitali unaoaminika, jumuishi na

unaendeshwa na ubunifu. Alibainisha juhudi zinazoundelea kuhusu usimamizi wa Akili Bandia, ulinzi wa data, uwajibikaji wa majukwaa ya kidijitali, na ujumuishaji wa kidijitali. Kulingana na Isaboke, mipango ya serikali ya Digital Master Plan 2032 na mfumo wa Vision 2030 inatilia mkazo upatikanaji wa intaneti kwa wote, miundombinu ya umma ya kidijitali, ukuzaji wa ujuzi wa kidijitali, na uwekezaji katika teknolojia zinazoibuka kama AI. Aliwahimiza vijana kujipanga ili kunufaika na kasi ya ukuaji wa sekta hiyo.

### Wakulima wapokea miche ya kahawa, mbegu za viazi

NA RENNISH OKONG'O (KNA)

Serikali ya Kaunti ya Elgeyo Marakwet inaongoza juhudi za kuimarisha uzalishaji wa kilimo na kipato cha kaya kwa kuwakabidhi wakulima pembejeo muhimu za kilimo. Hii inafanyika kupitia usambazaji wa miche 60,000 ya kahawa na takriban mifuko 900 ya mbegu bora za viazi kwa wakulima katika kata mbalimbali za kaunti hiyo. Zoezi hilo, linalotekelezwa na Idara ya Kilimo chini ya mpango wa uwezesaji wa kilimo wa kaunti, linalenga wakulima wa kata za Cherangany/Chebororwa, Sambirir, Kapyego, Chepkorio, Kamariny, Tambach na Kapchemutwa. Mpango huo unalenga kuimarisha usalama wa chakula, kukuza kilimo cha biashara na kuboresha maisha ya wananchi kwa kuwapatia wakulima pembejeo bora za kilimo. Akizungumza wakati wa zoezi hilo la ugawaji, Afisa

Mkuu wa Kilimo, Edwin Komen, alisema serikali ya kaunti imejizatiti kuwawezesha wakulima kupitia upatikanaji wa mbegu bora zilizoidhinishwa na teknolojia za kisasa za kilimo. "Tunasambaza miche bora ya kahawa na mbegu za viazi ili kuhakikisha wakulima wetu wanaongeza uzalishaji na kuboresha ubora wa mazao yao. Kilimo bado ni uti wa mgongo wa uchumi wetu, na serikali ya kaunti imezamia kuwaunga mkono wakulima kupitia mipango ya uwezesaji wa vitendo," alisema Komen. Alibainisha kuwa kilimo cha kahawa kina uwezo mkubwa wa kiuchumi kwa kaunti hiyo na akawataka wakulima kufuata mbinu bora za kilimo ili kuongeza mavuno na mapato. Komen alisema kaunti hiyo inaweza katika kilimo kama mkakati wa muda mrefu wa kukabiliana na uhaba wa chakula na kuunda fursa endelevu za kiuchumi kwa wakazi.

### Bomet yazindua mpango wa kufufua msitu wa Chepalungu

Serikali ya Kaunti ya Bomet imeongeza juhudi za kurejesha Hifadhi ya Msitu wa Chepalungu iliyoharibiwa, katika hatua kubwa ya kuimarisha uhifadhi wa mazingira. Gavana Prof. Hillary Barchok alisema kuwa mpango huo, unaolenga kupanda zaidi ya miti 100,000 ya asili na ya kigeni katika Msitu wa Chepalungu wakati wa msimu wa upandaji miti wa mwaka 2026, ni juhudi za pamoja za serikali yake, mashirika ya serikali ya kitaifa, pamoja na wadau wengine. Mpango huo unalenga kurejesha mfumo wa ikolojia wa Msitu wa Chepalungu ambao umeathirika vibaya kufuatia uharibifu mkubwa wa kibinadamu tangu mwaka 2007. Akizungumza wakati wa zoezi la upandaji miti katika eneo la Siongiro ndani ya msitu huo, Prof. Barchok alisisitiza kuwa uhai wa muda mrefu wa msitu huo unategemea

sana wanajamii wanaouzunguka. Aliwaomba wakazi wanaoishi karibu na Msitu mkubwa wa Chepalungu kuuchukulia kwa umakini, kuulinda na kuuzuia dhidi ya uvamizi na uharibifu zaidi. Gavana huyo alithibitisha tena dhamira ya Serikali ya Kaunti katika uhifadhi wa mazingira, akibainisha kuwa urejeshaji wa Msitu wa Chepalungu ni mradi wa mfano katika mkakati kabambe wa kuongeza kiwango cha uoto wa misitu katika Kaunti ya Bomet hadi zaidi ya asilimia 30. Aliomba wananchi kukumbatia utamaduni wa kupanda miti na kuhifadhi misitu ya asili kwa ajili ya vizazi vijavyo. Akihudhuria hafla hiyo, Mkuu wa Utumishi wa Umma, Felix Koskei, alisema kuwa kufufua Msitu wa Chepalungu ni muhimu si tu kuongeza uoto wa misitu, bali pia kurejesha bioanuwai kwa kurudisha mimea na wanyama wa asili katika eneo hilo.
