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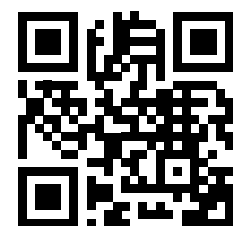

# Kenya bets on new seed plant to reduce rice imports

The Government has unveiled a state-of-the-art certified rice seed processing facility in Mwea, Kirinyaga County, as part of efforts to reduce reliance

on imports and strengthen the country's food security.

The facility, located at Kirogo Farm, is expected to transform rice farming by supplying affordable, high-quality certified seeds to thousands of farmers

across the country. Speaking during the launch, Agriculture Principal Secretary Dr. Kipronoh Ronoh described the facility as a major milestone in Kenya's efforts to increase rice production.

He noted that Kenya currently

produces only 23 per cent of the rice consumed locally, forcing the country to depend heavily on imports to meet demand.

Dr. Ronoh expressed optimism that the new facility will significantly reduce the import burden while enabling farmers to increase productivity through access to quality seeds.

The project is jointly funded by the Governments of Kenya and South Korea through the Korea Programme on International Agriculture (KOPIA).

Equipped with advanced processing technology and modern storage systems, the facility has the capacity to produce 40 tonnes of certified rice seed daily, translating to approximately 700 tonnes annually.

According to Dr. Ronoh, the increased availability of certified seeds will ensure farmers have reliable access to quality planting materials, leading to higher yields and improved incomes.

"This facility will not only enhance productivity but also attract young people and investors to agriculture while supporting the Government's food security agenda," he said.

South Korean Ambassador to Kenya, Kang Hyung-shik, underscored the importance of agriculture to Kenya's economy, noting that the sector contributes 23 per cent of the country's Gross Domestic Product and provides employment to more than half of the workforce.

He emphasized that South Korea highly values its

long-standing partnership with Kenya, which dates back to 1964, and highlighted ongoing cooperation in agricultural technology transfer, innovation, and mechanization.

The Ambassador revealed that South Korea already imports Kenyan tea and coffee and is working towards importing avocados once the process is finalized.

"We are seeking to expand cooperation in agricultural technology and mechanization to improve food production and farmers' incomes," he said.

He noted that the Korean government is supporting humanitarian programmes in Kakuma and Dadaab refugee camps while also investing in agricultural projects aimed at enhancing food security.

Kenya Agricultural and Livestock Research Organization (KALRO) Director General Dr. Patrick Ketiemi said the facility's modern technology will directly benefit farmers by improving access to certified seeds.

He explained that KALRO has developed five rice varieties including Komboka, Mkombozi, and Tongil that are high-yielding

and disease-resistant.

Some of these varieties can produce up to seven tonnes per acre. Dr. Ketiemi assured farmers that KALRO will work closely with cooperatives and farmers' organizations to ensure wide-spread distribution of certified seeds.

"The future of rice farming in Kenya is promising. We shall do everything possible to ensure farmers get quality certified seeds," he said, while thanking the South Korean government for supporting training programmes for Kenyan agricultural experts.

KOPIA Kenya Country Director Ji Gang Kim added that the project, which began in 2024, will not only serve Kenyan farmers but also train farmers from across East Africa in modern rice farming technologies.

This regional approach, he said, will help spread innovation and strengthen food security beyond Kenya's borders.

Kirinyaga County Executive Committee Member for Agriculture Dr. John Gachara praised both governments for supporting agricultural transformation in the county.

Meanwhile, Mwea Rice Growers Multipurpose Cooperative Society Agronomist, Michael Mwangi, said the region has long struggled with seed production challenges but expressed confidence that the new facility will resolve the problem.

# CS Kabogo champions inclusive digital transformation for PLWDs

The Cabinet Secretary for Information, Communications and the Digital Economy, William Kabogo, has called for a people-centered digital transformation agenda that guarantees equal access to technology for all citizens, particularly persons with disabilities.

He warned that Africa's digital future cannot be fully realized if sections of society remain excluded.

Speaking during the opening of the 7th Inclusive Africa Conference in Nairobi, Kabogo said accessibility must be treated as a core component of digital development rather than an afterthought. He emphasized that as governments increasingly digitize services and economies become more technology-driven, access to digital technologies has become essential for participation in education, healthcare, business, public services and civic engagement.

"The measure of digital transformation is not the sophistication of the technology we deploy, but whether every citizen can benefit from it," Kabogo said.

The Cabinet Secretary noted that Kenya's digital transfor-

mation agenda is anchored on inclusivity and can only succeed if no citizen is left behind. He said the government remains committed to creating an enabling digital environment where persons with disabilities can fully participate and benefit from emerging opportunities.

Kabogo also highlighted the growing role of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in advancing accessibility and inclusion, citing Kenya's National Artificial Intelligence Strategy, which places equity and accessibility at its

core. He said the strategy seeks to ensure that technological innovations expand opportunities for persons with disabilities instead of creating new barriers.

At the continental level, the Cabinet Secretary called for stronger collaboration among African countries in developing and harmonizing digital accessibility standards. He observed that an inclusive digital economy will be critical in unlocking opportunities under the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA).

He commended stakeholders

involved in the development of KS 2952:2022, Kenya's Standard for Accessibility of ICT Products and Services, describing it as a major milestone in promoting digital inclusion. He further welcomed ongoing efforts to align accessibility standards across Africa.

Kabogo urged governments, development partners, private sector players and organizations representing persons with disabilities to work together in mainstreaming accessibility in public procurement, digital infrastructure, online services and future technology investments.

The CS said Kenya has made significant progress in expanding digital access through the government's Digital Superhighway Programme, which has seen the deployment of more than 30,000 kilometres of public fibre-optic infrastructure across the country. The project has enhanced connectivity for schools, healthcare facilities, government institutions and communities.

He also highlighted the success of the Jitume Digital Hubs Programme, which has established more than 270 operational hubs equipped with over 17,700 digital devices.

# NYOTA beneficiaries to receive second grant tranche by June 30

The Government has assured beneficiaries of the National Youth Opportunities Towards Advancement (NYOTA) project that the second tranche of business start-up grants will be disbursed by June 30, 2026, following delays caused by budgetary adjustments.

Speaking during a press briefing in Nairobi, Principal Secretary for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) Development Susan Mang'eni said all eligible beneficiaries would receive the funds before the end of the current financial year.

She said the grants would be released simultaneously to beneficiaries across the country.

"To this extent, we wish to announce and confirm that the disbursement for the second

tranche of business start-up capital will happen by June 30th, 2026. All beneficiaries will receive the grants at the same time, unlike the first tranche disbursement which was phased out in clus-

ters," said Mang'eni. The World Bank-supported NYOTA project seeks to empower vulnerable and marginalized youth through business training, mentorship, entrepreneurship support,

apprenticeship, recognition of prior learning, job placement and access to market opportunities. The five-year programme, which commenced implementation on March 2025, attracted about two million applicants under its Business Support Component, demonstrating strong entrepreneurial interest among Kenyan youth.

Mang'eni said 122,147 young people from all the country's 1,450 Wards had successfully undergone entrepreneurial aptitude assessments and business development support training and had received the first start-up grant of Sh25,000, with Sh3,000 retained as savings under the National Social Security Fund (NSSF).

She noted that monitoring conducted after the first disbursement showed encouraging results, with more than 99 per cent of beneficiaries having established

businesses. "The outcome of the first mentorship nationwide hand-holding session and the second business development support classroom training show that over 99 per cent of the beneficiaries of the start-up grant had already established their businesses," she said.

According to the PS, the Government revised the project's original phased implementation model following the overwhelming response from applicants and interventions by President William Ruto and the World Bank. The move allowed all targeted beneficiaries to be enrolled at once instead of being spread across three separate intakes.

She explained that the adjustment compressed project activities into a single financial year, creating budgetary pressure that delayed the second disbursement.

"We regret the delay, but it was necessitated by the need for budgetary enhancements after the project design was adjusted to accommodate all selected beneficiaries at once," she said, adding that the National Treasury was working to resolve fiscal constraints.

# International Financial Intelligence Units Day

*Theme: Renewed Impetus for Combating Illicit Financial Flows*

### MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL

The Financial Reporting Centre (FRC) today joins the global community in celebrating International Financial Intelligence Units (FIU) Day, a moment dedicated to recognising the essential role that FIUs play in protecting financial systems and supporting the fight against money laundering, terrorism financing, and related financial crimes.

International FIU Day provides an opportunity to highlight the work of Financial Intelligence Units worldwide and to honour the professionals who ensure compliance, analyse financial intelligence, support investigations, and help disrupt illicit financial flows. FIUs operate at the intersection of the financial sector and law enforcement, transforming raw financial data into actionable intelligence.

“Financial Intelligence Units play a critical role in safeguarding financial integrity,” said Naphtaly Rono, Director General of the FRC. “Every day, FIU analysts and specialists work behind the scenes to identify suspicious financial activity, support investigations, and contribute to the protection of our economy and society.”

Within Kenya, the FRC serves as the national centre for the receipt, analysis, and dissemination of financial intelligence. By working closely with reporting entities majority of which are in the private sector, law enforcement authorities, prosecutors, supervisors, and other competent authorities, the FIU supports effective responses to financial crime and strengthens the national anti-money laundering and counter financing of terrorism (AML/CFT) framework.

### Cooperation as the Cornerstone

International FIU Day also underscores the importance of cooperation. Financial crime increasingly operates across borders, requiring timely and trusted information sharing among FIUs and their domestic partners. No single agency, and no single country, can stem the tide of illicit finance alone. “In today’s financial threat environment, cooperation and infor-

mation sharing are essential,” said Mr. Rono. “The international FIU Day highlights the value of collaboration, innovation, and strong analytical capacity in responding to evolving financial crime risks.”

The FRC has therefore intensified its domestic partnerships with the reporting entities, regulatory bodies, law enforcement and prosecutorial agencies and other competent authorities. Beyond Kenya’s borders, the FRC exchanges intelligence with over 170 FIUs through the Egmont Group’s secure network, the global standard for trusted financial information exchange.

### Innovation and the Fight against Emerging Threats

As financial crime becomes more complex and technology enabled, FIUs continue to adapt by enhancing analytical tools, leveraging data driven approaches, and investing in skills and expertise. The FRC is no exception. It is currently upgrading its internal capacity through acquisition of advanced tools and upskilling of its staff to unmask complex money laundering schemes and prioritise high risk Suspicious Transaction Reports (STRs) and Cash Transaction Reports (CTRs). The aim is to achieve excellence in the delivery of its mandate.

The FRC has also launched targeted training programmes for sectors identified as vulnerable to exploitation for money laundering and terrorism financing, in addition to the routine AML/CFT capacity building of all the sectors.

### Brief Update on FATF Grey List

Kenya remains under increased monitoring by the Financial Action Task Force (FATF), commonly referred to as the “Grey List”. The FRC, as the designated coordinating agency, has overseen substantial progress in addressing the strategic deficiencies in the AML/CFT framework. According to the FRC, the vast majority of the remaining action items agreed upon with the FATF International Cooperation Review Group (ICRG) have been largely addressed. The FRC is work-

ing with the National Treasury and all relevant stakeholders to address the remaining action items. Kenya is committed to addressing all the pending action items, and an exit from the “Grey-List” in the near term is achievable with sustained collective effort from all of us.

### Aligning with National Priorities: BETA Agenda

Beyond international compliance, the FRC has explicitly linked its work to Kenya’s Bottom Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA). His Excellency President William Ruto’s flagship economic plan depends in a large part, on expanding affordable credit to Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME), widening the tax base, and protecting formal financial channels from criminal abuse. Money laundering directly undermines those goals.

“When a digital lender is used to launder drug money, the cost of credit for an honest borrower rises. When proceeds of corruption are hidden in real estate, housing becomes less affordable for young professionals,” says DG Rono. According to Mr. Rono, “The FRC is an economic security agency,” In his

view, “when we strip criminals of their access to the financial system and deny them the ability to launder illicit wealth, we are creating fiscal space for BETA. We are ensuring that credit flows to the hustlers and not the kingpins.”

### Linkage to Sustainable Development Goals 2030

Under the Sustainable Development Goals Target 16.4, the global community committed to significantly reduce illicit financial flows, strengthen recovery and return of stolen assets, and combat all forms of organised crime by 2030. This commitment frames illicit financial flows reduction not only as a compliance exercise but also as a development imperative for any nation.

### A Call to Action for All

On this International FIU Day, the FRC joins FIUs around the world in recognising the contribution of FIUs and reaffirming a shared commitment to protecting financial systems, supporting justice, and promoting international cooperation.

Reporting institutions are urged to file Suspicious Transaction Reports

that are timely, detailed, and risk-based. On the other hand, government agencies are called upon to timeously respond to FRC intelligence requests and reports. Parliament is also encouraged to expedite any amendments brought before them to ensure we strengthen our AML/CFT framework.

Likewise, members of the public are encouraged to use the FRC’s anonymous reporting channels when they encounter suspicious activity, whether in a Bank, SACCO, Insurance Company a digital lending app, or any other channel.

“Let us partner together or the criminals will pull our economy apart,” Mr. Rono said. “The Grey List is not a life sentence. It is a mirror. It shows us where we must improve, and with every sector working as one, we will exit that list and build a financial system that Kenyans and the global community trust.

The international FIU Day is therefore a reminder that financial integrity is a collective good and as important as national security or public health. The FRC continues to do its part. At this critical juncture, it is imperative for every business, every Kenyan and every government office to do the same.

The Financial Reporting Centre is Kenya’s Financial Intelligence Unit, established under Section 21 of the Proceeds of Crime and Anti Money Laundering Act (POCAMLA), 2009. # KR targets 5,000 tonnes cargo on revived Gilgil-Nyahururu line

The Kenya Railways Corporation now targets to transport over 5,000 tonnes of cargo and 1,000 passengers each transit through the revamped Gilgil-Ol Kalou-Nyahururu railway line that has remained dormant for the last 46 years.

The corporation said that the revival is expected to improve access to markets for the agricultural rich farmers and provide affordable transportation which will stimulate trade and investment along the corridor.

It added that the key railway route will also ease cargo movement between production areas and the Naivasha Inland Container Depot and strengthen Kenya's integrated transport and logistics network.

According to the corporation, 1,000 tonnes of government-subsidized fertilizer have already been delivered to National Cereals and Produce Board depots in Ol Kalou and Nyahururu, directly supporting farmers in Nyandarua and Laikipia counties growing potatoes, carrots, wheat and other crops.

According to the Corporation Director, Philip Mainga, they target to transport

over 1,000 passengers each transit three times a week and ship 5,000 tonnes of cargo thanks to new trains and cabins.

Speaking to the press in Gilgil station after a brief stopover, Mainga noted the government had revamped over 80 railway routes driven by rising demand mostly in Nairobi and its outskirt towns.

Mainga said the new route will help revive and ease the transport of agricultural materials such as potatoes, cabbages and avocados from the region to the market, offering farmers access to markets.

He noted that the Corporation has reduced the cost of transport on their new trains, charging Sh 600 from Nairobi to Nyahururu, Nairobi to Ol Kalou Sh 550 and Nairobi to Gilgil Sh 450.

He said the organisation was on plan to tap green energy and transition to electric trains especially in Nairobi and would add more Electric Multiple Units to their fleet.

Mainga said the

government move to revive and operationalise the railway routes was driven by rising demand for cargo and passenger movement.

The Director sent a warning against individuals involved in theft and vandalism of railway infrastructure noting that criminal charges have been slapped to such perpetrators and were serving lengthy jail terms.

He said major players including OCP Kenya, Bamburi Cement, New KCC and Freight Terminals limited have expressed interest, with additional opportunities in construction materials, livestock and agricultural products to ship cargo through the line.

Mainga added that the line will see communities along the corridor gain a safe, affordable and environmentally friendly transport option, improving mobility and access to social services.

The Director noted that the revival supports Kenya Vision 2030, leveraging rail to connect production centres, markets and communities at both micro and macro economic levels.

The Gilgil-Nyahururu line was initiated by the colonial government in the 1920s and operationalised in 1929.

**IT IS NOTIFIED** for information of the general public that the Cabinet Secretary for Roads and Transport, in consultation with the Kenya Engineering Technology Registration Board, has developed draft Engineering Technology (Registration, Licensing and Compliance) Rules, 2026.

**The object of these Rules is to:**

- establish a structured framework for registration, licensing, compliance and enforcement; and
- promote professional competence, ethics and public safety.

**FURTHER** in compliance with section 6 of the Statutory Instruments Act (Cap. 2A) which require the regulation making authority to, prepare a regulatory impact statement about the proposed Rules, the Cabinet Secretary for Roads and Transport has, in consultation with the Board, prepared a Regulatory Impact Statement for the proposed Rules.

**FURTHER AWARE THAT** Article 10 of the Constitution as read with section 5 of the Statutory Instruments Act (Cap. 2A) require a regulation making authority to undertake public participation and make appropriate consultations with persons who are likely to be affected by proposed rules. The provisions of section 5 further provide that the consultations envisaged under the Statutory Instruments Act shall involve notification, by advertisement, of persons who are likely to be affected by the proposed instrument.

# Homa Bay fast-tracks school land titles to guard against encroachment

The Government has intensified efforts to secure land ownership for public schools in Homa Bay County through an accelerated land titling program aimed at protecting educational institutions from encroachment and boundary disputes.

"We wanted them to interact directly with land officials because many people have been complaining that obtaining title deeds is a tedious process and that accessing land offices can be a challenge. That is the reason why most

schools lack that crucial document," said Mwiwawi.

He added that bringing onboard officers from the Ministry of Lands, the National Land Commission and other government agencies was aimed at improving service delivery and ensuring that accurate information reaches schools across the county. "As government, we are committed to bringing services closer to the people. Today, land officials explained the procedures involved, the offices that need to be visited and the documents required. School heads can now engage directly with the responsible officers and even invite them to their areas for further assistance," he added.

## 350 Homa Bay beekeepers get training to improve honey production and marketing

# County intensifies fight against tropical diseases through clean water projects

The County Government of Trans Nzoia has applauded the contribution of partners in the mitigation of Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs).

Speaking on the matter, County Executive Com-

mittee Member for Health and Sanitation Christopher Lorot said the county has intensified efforts to eliminate NTDs through the implementation of safe and clean water projects. He noted that the significant contribution of partners in the fight against the diseases

Lorot was speaking at the county headquarters while unveiling a presentation on the interventions

the government has taken to deal with NTDs while collaborating with partners.

He said that safe water

supply and sanitation projects in the region more so in Keiyo Ward have largely helped to eradicate NTDs like bilharzia, jiggers and intestinal worms.



“Keiyo Ward had a prevalence rate of 2% for bilharzia. Through boreholes and rehabilitation of Asegam Dam, the community now has clean water and the bilharzia cases have reduced,” he said.

Lorot said, the County has set aside Sh3 million to boost water and sanitation strategies, Lorot added that the allocation will to a greater extent give a lift

to the intervention efforts.

Besides prevention strategies, the county has also considered curative aspect where enough praziquantel tablets have been ordered and efforts to upgrade our laboratories to enable testing of bilharzia are underway.

Present was Trans Nzoia County NTD Coordinator Dr. Norbert Musundi who said the county government is preparing key documents including the NTD WASH coordination framework, an anti jigger strategic plan, and a school water and sanitation plan.

# Copyright Board moves to review Act to protect content creators

The Government, through Kenya Copyright Board, is reviewing the country's copyright laws to keep up with the demands of the current online environment, Kenya

Copyright Board (KECOBO) Deputy Director, Sharon Chahale Wata has said.

Speaking in Siaya town, Wata said the Kenya Copyright Bill (amendment), 2026 seeks to align the protection of intellectual property with the 2010 constitution and ensure

that the country's creatives are properly protected against exploitation.

Wata, who is the Deputy Executive Director in

charge of Training and Research said the bill, which is currently undergoing public participation, provides a wide protection

on the online environment and seeks to, among other things, expand the mandate of the copyright tribunal.

"The 2010 Constitution specifically provides for protection of intellectual property and so we also want to keep up with the laws of the land," she said and urged Kenyans to visit KECOBO website and give their comments on the bill.

The Director said the Board was committed to enforcing copyright laws so that Kenyan innovators can get value for their work and urged anybody whose

work has been infringed upon to contact the organization for redress.

Addressing the occasion, KECOBO's head of human resource, Ketty Arucy challenged Kenyan content creators to observe national values while generating content.

Arucy stressed the need for the content creators to come up with materials that would promote peace and unity instead of content that glorifies social ills. She called on the content creators to manage their incomes well and invest wisely.

# State injects Sh31 billion into affordable housing projects in Mombasa

The Government, through the Ministry of Lands, Housing and Urban Development, has invested heavily in affordable housing projects in the Port City of Mombasa as part of efforts to spur social and economic transformation. The ambitious projects aim to strengthen Mombasa's position as the country's second capital after Nairobi and a key gateway to East Africa through the port, amid rapid urbanisation.

A total of 10,000 housing units are expected to be constructed in Nyali, Mvita, Likoni, Kisauni, Changamwe and Jomvu sub-counties under the Affordable Housing Programme.

The latest project to be launched is the Makupa Modern Mixed-Use Urban Development and associated infrastructure in Mvita Sub-County, costing Sh685 million. It involves the redevelopment of the historic 106-year-old Majengo

Market. The contractor is already on site, and the old structure has been demolished to pave the way for the redevelopment.

President William Ruto laid the foundation stone during his recent development tour of the Coast region. The project is expected to be completed within 12 months.

The re-development will transform the old market into a 13-floor mixed-use development comprising a modern market, residential units, offices, restaurants, food courts, conference and meeting rooms, a guard house, waste management facilities and a power house.

The project is a testa-

ment to the government's commitment to dignifying trading areas and promoting businesses. Similar mixed-use developments are set to be implemented at Sega and the Old Town Fish Market, both in Mvita Sub-County.

Residents were also assured that the Sh20 billion Mwache Multi purpose Dam Project will be completed within the next six months. The project is currently 83 per cent complete and is expected to significantly reduce Mombasa County's chronic water shortage.

The project aims to sustainably improve water security and build climate resilience by increasing bulk water supply and expanding access to water and sanitation services in the Coastal region.

The project is designed to include a main dam, a lower check dam and an upper check dam. The main dam, with a height of 84 metres and a crest length of 526 metres, will have a storage capacity of 127 million cubic metres of water.

# Makonde community seek government intervention over ID registration hurdles

Some members of the Makonde community in Kwale County are appealing to the government to ease requirements for acquiring National Identity Cards, saying many who were left-out during the community's registration and recognition process in 2016 and 2017 continue to face difficulties proving their citizenship.

The affected individuals, most of whom were minors during the historic registration exercise that culminated in the recognition of the Makonde as Kenya's 43rd tribe, say they are now unable to obtain Identity Cards due to the requirement for citizenship certificates.

Without Identity Cards, many are unable to access employment opportunities, government services, financial institutions services and higher education opportunities.

Among those affected is 27-year-old, Anna Zacharia Mushiiri, who missed the registration exercise because she was



living in Malindi at the time and was unaware of the process.

"During the registration period, I was not in Kwale. I was born in Makongeni but grew up in Malindi. By the time I learnt that members

of the community were being registered and issued documents, the exercise had already ended," she stressed adding repeated attempts to obtain a national identity card have been unsuccessful.

**Kwale County, faces difficulties accessing opportunities due to lack of a national identity card.**

3. **Makonde Community Chairman, Thomas Nguli, notes there are many community members who were left out during the registration process and are unable to obtain national identity cards.**

"Whenever registration officers come to the area, I try to apply but I am always asked to produce a citizenship certificate, which I do not have," she said. According to Mushiiri, even presenting documents belonging to her parents has not helped resolve the issue.

Her predicament mirrors that of many young people from the community who were underage during the registration exercise and were therefore not issued citizenship certificates.

According to County Executive Committee Member (CECM), Dr. Elias Maina, the Proximie platform facilitates seamless collaboration among surgeons and medical practitioners by combining high-definition video technology with interactive digital tools.

# Health agency steps up Ebola response training in Trans Nzoia, Turkana

The Kenya National Public Health Institute has intensified national Ebola preparedness efforts through a week-long Integrated Rapid Response Team (RRT) training programme conducted in Trans Nzoia County and Turkana County.

The initiative, supported by the U.S. Government-funded Strengthening Infectious Disease Detection Systems (STRIDES) programme, is part of a broader national effort to fortify frontline defenses against Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) and other public health emergencies.

The training targets counties classified as high-risk, sharpening their ability to prevent, detect and respond to outbreaks.

It brings together a multidisciplinary mix of epidemiologists, clinicians, laboratory experts, logisticians, risk communication specialists and psychosocial support professionals. The goal is

to build a skilled workforce capable of mounting rapid, coordinated responses when disease threats emerge.

Participants are immersed in both theory and practice in a bid to gain expertise in surveillance, screening, case investigation, contact tracing, infection prevention and control, risk communication and outbreak coordination.

Practical sessions simulate real-world emergencies, covering the safe use of personal protective equipment, patient triage, sample collection, isolation procedures, dignified burials and the safe transportation of suspected Ebola cases. These exercises are designed to

ensure that responders can act swiftly and safely under pressure. Speaking during the training, Trans Nzoia County Executive Committee Member for Health and Sanitation, Christopher Kerio Lorot, underscored the county's commitment to strengthening preparedness.

Lorot highlighted investments in workforce development, rapid response capacity, and sustainable emergency systems as critical pillars of resilience.

Dr. Babu Kisiangani, Trans Nzoia County Director of Health, praised KNPHI for spearheading a proactive campaign that aligns with global best practices while keeping communities at the center of disease prevention and response.

Trans Nzoia's proximity to Uganda, coupled with significant cross-border movement, places it among the counties most vulnerable to Ebola. While Kenya has not recorded any confirmed Ebola case, vigilance remains high.

# Migori farmers receive 42,000 Hass avocado seedlings to boost incomes

The National Government, in collaboration with the Migori County Government, has distributed 42,000 grafted Hass avocado seedlings to farmers across Migori County.

The initiative is aimed at boosting household incomes, expanding export-oriented agriculture, and supporting the government's 15 billion trees growing programme.

Speaking during the distribution held at the Migori County Commissioner's residence, County Commissioner, Kisilu Mutua, said the county had received 42,000 avocado seedlings and 100,000 coffee seedlings from the Ministry of Agriculture, with additional macadamia seedlings expected in the near future.

Mutua noted that each farmer would receive ten grafted avocado seedlings and that farmers had already undergone training by crop officers on proper planting, management and access to extension services.

"Every farmer has been taught how to plant these seedlings and how to reach extension officers who can assist them in managing the crop," said Mutua.

He added that each seedling costs approximately Sh444, translating to nearly Sh20 million invested by the government in the project.

The administrator assured farmers that if properly managed, each avocado tree could generate up to Sh10,000 annually after five years, significantly improving

household livelihoods.

The County Commissioner further revealed that two farmer groups had also received milk coolers worth Sh4.5 million to support dairy farming and value addition.

Migori County Executive Committee (CEC) Member for Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Blue Economy, Lucas Mosenda, said avocado farming had become one of Kenya's major export opportunities and the county was keen

on ensuring local farmers benefit from the growing international demand.

"We are looking at crop diversification so that farmers from Migori can tap into export opportunities and improve their incomes," said Mosenda.

He observed that Migori currently has about 300 acres under avocado farming, with an estimated 600 to 700 farmers actively practicing the crop across the county.

The official regretted that most farmers still grow traditional avocado varieties which fetch lower returns and have limited export value.

"Unfortunately, most farmers have been growing the local varieties which are important but have low market value internationally. Hass avocado targets the export market and offers better returns to farmers," he explained.

# How telecommunications engineer turned traditional weaving into a thriving cultural enterprise

When Sheila Atieno Onyango trained as a telecommunications engineer, she never imagined her career would eventually centre on traditional weaving, artisan networks and cultural preservation. Today, however, the founder of Okapu is at the helm of a growing cultural enterprise that blends heritage, craftsmanship and community empowerment—demonstrating that traditional skills can be transformed into viable, modern livelihoods.

Her journey began in the renewable energy

sector, where she worked on infrastructure projects across rural Kenya.

Part of her role involved engaging communities affected by transmission lines and energy developments, helping them understand technical projects in practical terms.

Looking back, Sheila says those experiences laid the foundation for her current work.

“That job prepared me for what I’m doing now. We were constantly interacting with rural communities, and that experience shaped how I connect with people today,” she says.

The idea for Okapu, she says emerged unexpectedly.

While working in Nairobi,

Sheila bought a kiondo bag from a roadside vendor near her office in Karen and shortly afterwards, a friend admired the bag and asked to buy it.

“I didn’t even think about making a profit. I just gave it to her and bought another one for myself,” she recalls.

Soon, more friends began requesting similar bags prompting her to start posting them on Instagram.

“I realized people loved them—not just the bags themselves, but how they were styled and presented,” she says.

What began as casual reselling soon evolved into something deeper.

Curious about the origins of the products, she started asking who actually made them.

The answer took her beyond Nairobi’s retail markets and into rural artisan communities. A turning point came when

a colleague revealed that her aunt was one of the women weaving the bags Sheila had been selling. “That changed everything. I had been searching for the people who actually make them. In Nairobi, you mostly meet the sellers, not the source,” she says.

# Mau Forest restoration gains momentum as marathon is launched

The Government has intensified efforts to restore the Mau Forest Complex, Kenya’s largest water tower, with the launch of the Second Edition of the Mau Conservation Marathon. The race is scheduled for July 3, 2026, and will be held under the Mau Forest Complex Integrated Conservation and Livelihood Improvement Programme (MFC-ICLIP), a ten-year initiative aimed at reversing decades of degradation in the country’s most important forest ecosystem.

The Marathon is a flagship initiative spearheaded by the Ministry of Environment, Climate Change and Forestry, aimed at mobilizing resources, creating environmental awareness, and supporting community livelihoods through conservation efforts.

Approximately 500 athletes so far have registered for the event dubbed; “Linda Mau, Boresha Maisha”, with organizers targeting 2,500 participants before registration closes on June 25, 2026.

Speaking during a media briefing in Nairobi, Environment and Climate Change Principal Sec-

retary, Dr Eng. Festus Ng’eno, urged Kenyans, institutions, and corporate organizations to support the initiative by participating in the race.

The PS said the race will be flagged-off in Olen-guruone, Kuresoi South, and traverse the scenic Mau landscape before finishing at Baringo Senior Secondary School grounds in Kuresoi North.

“The Mau Forest Complex supports millions of livelihoods, sustains agriculture, provides water for hydro-power generation, and is the source of 12 major rivers including Sondu, Mara, Ewaso- Ng’iro, Nzoia among others and also supports major lakes including; Turkana, Baringo, Nakuru, Natron

and Victoria,” highlighted Dr. Ng’eno.

He regretted that the ecosystem continues to face threats from illegal logging, land-use changes, and overreliance on forest resources driven largely by poverty.

“The ecosystem has faced significant degradation and remains threatened by changes of land use” said PS.

As a native of the Mau region, the PS said, he has personally witnessed the degradation of the ecosystem and has since joined forces with local communities, development partners, the private sector, and government agencies, to establish the MFC-ICLIP programme.

# Kenya takes leadership of Sub-Saharan Africa skills network

Kenya has been elected to chair the Sub-Saharan Africa Skills and Apprenticeship Stakeholders Network (SASASNET), following a unanimous vote that saw Principal Secretary for Labour and Skills Development Shadrack Mwadime selected as Continental Chair during the network's Annual General Meeting held in Abuja, Nigeria.

The election reflects growing recognition of Kenya's leadership in skills development and apprenticeship reforms across the continent.

Delegates from member countries endorsed Mwadime to steer the regional body as it advances quality apprenticeship systems and workforce development initiatives across Sub-Saharan Africa.

Kenya's delegation to the conference was led by Dr. Wanjiru Kariuki, Secretary for Skills Development in the Ministry of Labour and Social Protection, and included Wambua Nyamai, Chief Executive Officer of the Kenya National Federation of Jua Kali Associations.

As Continental Chair, Mwadime is expected to champion stronger collaboration among Sub-Saharan African countries in advancing quality apprenticeships in line with International Labour Organization Recommendation 208, which provides a global framework for apprenticeship systems that are inclusive, demand-driven and anchored in decent work.

Further, his election signals renewed momentum toward strengthening apprenticeship programmes across Africa, ensuring that skills development remains industry-responsive and aligned with the continent's broader socio-economic transformation agenda. It also positions Kenya at the forefront of efforts to promote structured apprenticeships and accelerate the formalization of the informal economy.

Speaking on the significance of the election, Dr. Kariuki noted that Kenya's elevation to the continental leadership role is underpinned by several key policy achievements.

These include the National Work-Based Learning Policy, which promotes the transition from informal apprenticeships to quality apprenticeship systems; the National Policy on Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL), through which 48,383 individuals have already been certified by formally recognizing skills acquired through informal learning and apprenticeship pathways; and the National Strategy for Transformation of the Informal Economy, aimed at progressively integrating the informal sector where nearly 84 percent of Kenya's labour force is engaged into a sustainable formal economy that supports decent work, improved livelihoods and inclusive economic growth.

The Annual General Meeting coincided with SASASNET's Third Regional Conference, which brought together ministers responsible for labour, senior government officials, representatives of the informal sector, development partners, and international governmental and non-governmental organizations from across the continent.

According to Dr. Kariuki, the conference built on the momentum generated by the Second Regional Conference held in Mombasa in 2025, which attracted participants from 24 countries and culminated in the landmark Mombasa Declaration, a key framework for advancing apprenticeship and skills development reforms across Africa.

# Ministry steps up fight against teenage pregnancies, HIV among youth

The Ministry of Health has reiterated its commitment to addressing the rising cases of teenage pregnancies and HIV infections among young people by strengthening investment in comprehensive sexuality education and reviving community-based prevention programmes that have been weakened by cuts in donor funding.

Speaking in Mombasa during the opening of the 9th RHNK Pan-African Adolescent and Youth SRHR Scientific Conference, the Ministry of Health Head of Family Health Department, Dr Bishar Issak, said healthcare workers will be trained to provide adolescent-friendly services and ensure young people have access to medicines, commodities and essential health tools at nearby health facilities.

In 2025, Dr Issak disclosed that 41 per cent of new HIV infections in Kenya were among adolescents aged between 15 and 24 years, while mother-to-child transmission rose from 7.3 per cent to 9 per cent.

“In Garissa, just 15 per cent of adolescent girls have comprehensive HIV knowledge. Only 26 per cent of adolescent girls nationally have known that a condom prevents HIV transmission. These are not gaps in statistics; there are gaps in survival,” said Dr Isaak.

He disclosed that teenage pregnancies remain one of the country’s most pressing public health challenges, noting that nationally, 15 per cent of girls aged between 15 and 19 years are either pregnant or already mothers.

“In counties like Samburu, that figure rises to 50 per cent. This is a show of inequality and equity. In West Pokot, that number represents 36 per cent. This number represents girls whose dreams have been interrupted, shattered, whose bodies have been asked to carry responsibilities they were not ready for and whose future depends entirely on whether the systems around them are strong enough to hold them,” he noted.

In Kenya, he said, young women have access to free maternal healthcare under Taifa Care, which is being administered through the Social Health Authority (SHA), but emphasised the need to prioritise the prevention of teenage pregnancies.

Dr Issak highlighted that more than 30 million Kenyans have been registered under SHA to access free primary healthcare.

# Health advocates warn of tobacco industry tactics amid push for new law

Public health advocates and government officials have intensified calls for the urgent enactment of the Tobacco Control Amendment Bill, 2024. They have also raised concern over aggressive tactics by the tobacco industry aimed at derailing the proposed law.

Speaking during the national celebrations for World No Tobacco Day 2026 held at Umuu Grounds in Mbeere South Sub-County, Embu County, stakeholders warned that the industry is actively mobilising submissions through front groups to oppose the public health Bill.

The stakeholders were led by the Chairperson of the Kenya Tobacco Control Alliance (KETCA), Joel Gitali. They cautioned that such efforts threaten progress in tobacco control and public health protection.



For many caught in the web of dependency, the vulnerability begins long before a child ever sets foot in a retail shop. Sharing a poignant personal story, Ann Mathu, the former vice chair of the NACADA Board, highlighted the profound power of parental influence at home.

“My very first exposure to tobacco and nicotine products came directly through my father. Parents play a pivotal key role in either protecting children from addictive substances or inadvertently exposing them, making awareness and responsibility within the household abso-

lutely critical. When parents set the right example and actively guide their children, they serve as the first line of defense, helping to prevent early exposure and significantly reducing the long-term risk of addiction,” she said.

Ms. Mathu said even when homes are safe, the battlefield outside has fundamentally transformed. This year’s global campaign theme, “Unmasking the Appeal: Exposing Industry Tactics on Tobacco and Nicotine Products,” highlights a coordinated resistance from business associations, social media campaigns,

and third-party “experts” trying to paint lifesaving reforms as anti-business.

Tobacco control advocates note that they will now need to organize and mobilize just as strongly on their side to ensure public health voices are equally well represented.

“Unmasking these commercial appeals is critical to preventing the next generation from falling into addiction. Advocates must remain vigilant in exposing the tactics used to make nicotine and tobacco products seem acceptable, particularly to children and young people, while ensuring communities understand the real risks of addiction and harm,” Gitali stated.

He further noted that devolved units continue to be a critical arm in this work, as closer collaboration with county governments and community structures will bring tobacco control efforts directly to the grassroots.

He called upon the Ministry of Health to prioritize the Tobacco Control Fund and strengthen support to counties, noting that adequate and sustainable financing is essential to expand prevention programs, enforce tobacco control laws, support cessation services, and protect local communities.

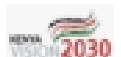

# State unveils plan to expand irrigation, boost farm output

The State Department for Irrigation has launched the National Irrigation Sector Investment Plan (NISIP), a transformative roadmap aimed at accelerating Kenya's food security agenda, boosting agricultural productivity, and enhancing climate resilience through expanded irrigation development.

The plan targets an increase in the area under irrigation from 664,000 acres in FY 2021/2022 to 1,289,142 acres by FY 2027/2028.

This expansion is expected to enhance agricultural output, create employment, raise household incomes and support the Government's Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA).

Water available for irrigation is projected to grow from 55.4 million cubic metres (MCM) in FY 2021/2022 to 2,379.2 MCM by FY 2027/2028, ensuring year-round water supply for farming. Speaking during the Head of Public Service Monthly Meeting with Accounting Officers at Konza Technopolis, Principal Secretary for Irrigation, CPA Ephantus Kimotho, presented the status of irrigation development and highlighted key achievements and priorities in advancing national food security.

"Through strategic investments in irrigation infrastructure and enhanced water access, irrigated maize production is projected to rise from 0.2 million bags to 5.075 million bags," said Kimotho.

"This expansion will cushion the country against climate shocks, strengthen food reserves and bolster national food

security."

Under the maize value chain, he pointed out that the Department is providing reliable irrigation water to smallholder farmers while operationalizing the Galana Kulalu Food Security Project, which aims to produce over 14 million bags of maize annually from 200,000 acres under irrigation.

Key milestones include the construction of a major intake and reservoir with a capacity of 450,000 cubic metres. Additionally, Project Nafaka is progressing in three phases, with the third phase targeting 20,000 acres within 30 months.

"The Galana Kulalu initiative will not only contribute significantly to food security but also attract foreign investment, create jobs, increase government revenue, and stimulate growth in agro-processing and manufacturing industries," he emphasized.

On the rice value chain, the PS disclosed that the Department has committed to raising paddy rice production to 700,000 metric tonnes by 2027 through strategic irrigation investments and modernization of public schemes.

Interventions, he said, include converting schemes to gravity-fed systems, solarizing infrastructure to cut energy costs, rehabilitating 78,341 acres under existing schemes, and expanding an additional 27,500 acres for rice.

"Our goal is to increase rice production in public irrigation schemes from 305,000 metric tonnes to 570,000 metric tonnes, while commercialization of 35,000 acres will add

another 420,000 metric tonnes annually," noted Kimotho.

"Combined, these efforts will raise total rice production to about 990,000 metric tonnes, bridging the national deficit and reducing reliance on imports," he said.

The Principal Secretary also highlighted progress in horticulture, where the Department is connecting over 100,000 farmers to irrigation water through community schemes and another 10,000 through farmer-led initiatives.

So far, he said that 50 community schemes have been completed, enabling irrigation on 60,000 acres, while 86 projects are ongoing. "These schemes empower smallholder farmers by boosting productivity, diversifying crops, improving incomes, and creating jobs, particularly for youth and women," he remarked.

Kimotho noted that further achievements include 143 completed community water pans and small dams, with 65 ongoing projects.

"Under the household water pans programme, 8,724 units have been completed and 160 are under construction." "The Micro-Irrigation for Schools Programme has also made strides, with 66 projects completed and 31 ongoing, enhancing food production, nutrition, and agricultural learning in schools," he added.

The PS said that other flagship initiatives include the Smallholder Irrigation Programme for the Mt. Kenya Region, expanded community irrigation schemes, and irrigation-supported fodder production programmes to strengthen livestock value chains and support feedlot development.

**Kiambu County records historic first telemedicine-assisted surgery**

Kiambu County has achieved a major milestone in healthcare innovation following the successful conduct of its first telemedicine-assisted surgery.

The breakthrough is expected to strengthen specialized medical care, training, and collaboration among health professionals across the County.

The landmark procedure, a live Caesarean section performed at Kiambu Level 5 Hospital using the Proximie digital platform, brought together healthcare professionals from Kiambu Level 5 Hospital, Kihara Level 4 Hospital, Thika Level 5 Hospital, alongside medical experts based in the United Kingdom.

The surgery was conducted and monitored in real time through advanced digital surgical technology, enabling specialists in different locations to observe, guide and support the procedure remotely.

According to County Executive Committee Member (CECM), Dr. Elias Maina, the Proximie platform facilitates seamless collaboration among surgeons and medical practitioners by combining high-definition video technology with interactive digital tools.

The system allows healthcare professionals to share expertise, mentor one another, and provide clinical support regardless of geographical location.

Kihara Level 4 Hospital, whose medical team participated in the exercise, described the event as a historic achievement in the county's healthcare transformation journey.

This technology will reportedly enhance access to specialist knowledge, improve clinical decision-making, and provide healthcare workers with valuable opportunities for continuous learning and professional development.

"The telemedicine-assisted surgery is also expected to strengthen collaboration among hospitals within the County by creating a digital network through which medical practitioners can consult, audit procedures, and exchange knowledge in real time," Dr. Maina added.

The adoption of telemedicine solutions is increasingly becoming an important component of modern healthcare systems, particularly in improving access to specialized care and reducing the need for patient referrals.

This initiative aligns with Kiambu County's ongoing efforts to modernize healthcare services through investment in medical infrastructure, advanced equipment, and digital health technologies.

Munala urged the contractor to ensure quality workmanship and complete the project within the stipulated timelines and standards.



Vihiga County Director of Agriculture Daniel Oketch said the hatchery would play a key role in boosting fish production in the county and encouraging more farmers to venture into aquaculture.

According to Oketch, the facility will serve as a practical training centre for students pursuing fisheries and marine technology courses, providing them

with hands-on experience and technical skills in fish farming.

He expressed confidence that excavation works would be completed within a short period and called on the contractor to ensure the project is finalized before the end of the current financial year.

The hatchery project, which includes two fish ponds and a counting shade, is expected to enhance fish farming, improve the availability of quality fingerlings and strengthen vocational training opportunities at the institution.

# Marigat, Chemolingot hospitals to support campaign against Hepatitis B

The Kenya Medical Research Institute (KEMRI) has identified Marigat and Chemolingot Sub County hospitals

in Tiaty and Baringo South Constituencies, respectively, for support in the fight against the deadly Hepatitis B virus and Kala-azar disease.

Speaking to the press outside Baringo governor's

office in Kabarnet town, KEMRI Chief Executive Officer Prof. Elijah Songok said the move to establish the two model health facilities was geared towards eradicating the endemic diseases in the region.

The vast county, according to Prof. Songok, is rated among the top three in Kenya for the highest prevalence of Hepatitis B and position five in Kala-azar disease.

He stated that his organization was collaborating with the county administration of Governor Benjamin Cheboi in the establishment of dedicated centres for testing and management of patients from within the county

and beyond.

"We are going to jointly lobby for Hepatitis B vaccines so that every household which is facing the risk is vaccinated and set up clinic for all those who have been infected," he said.

The CEO noted that vaccines against Kala-azar in Chemolingot are going to be introduced for the first time in the country with similar tests to be administered concurrently to

patients in Brazil and the United States of America.

Cheboi, in his remarks thanked KEMRI for the noble course that he said will greatly transform healthcare services in the county.

He revealed that through the partnership, the County was also going to benefit from the research of anti-venom in order to address the persistent threat of snakebites in the region.

# Egerton turns to mechanisation to attract more youth to farming

BY ESTHER MWANGI (KNA)

Egerton University has launched an initiative aimed at promoting the adoption of mechanised farming among young small-holder farmers to enhance food production and improve the quality of agricultural produce in the country.

The university has partnered with the Corporation for Africa and Overseas (CFAO) Kenya to strengthen training in mechanised agriculture, foster innovation and facilitate technology transfer through its Department of Agricultural Engineering.

Egerton University Vice Chancellor Prof. Isaac Kibwage said the institution is also developing public-private partnerships aimed at establishing mechanisation hubs that will link providers of mechanised farm services with smallholder farmers who lack access to agricultural machinery.

Prof. Kibwage said the partnership with CFAO-Kenya, formalised through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), is expected to boost agricultural productivity,

enhance practical training for students and improve farmers' access to efficient farming solutions.

He described the deal as a significant step towards strengthening innovation and research in agriculture, noting that it will help bridge the gap between academic training and industry needs. CFAO-Kenya, a subsidiary of the French-based CFAO Group owned by Japan's Toyota Tsusho Corporation, is one of the

largest automotive distributors and service providers in Kenya.

Prof. Kibwage further disclosed that the firm has donated two tractor engines to the Faculty of Agricultural Engineering to enhance practical training and boost students' technical capacity. He added that the partnership aligns with the Competency-Based Curriculum.

He said CFAO has so far facilitated the training of more than 700 tractor operators in the

region, noting that the initiative aims to equip young farmers with mechanised farming skills, increase productivity and make agriculture more attractive to the youth.

"We envision a situation where small holder youth farmers have access to subsidized mechanization, which will in turn help reduce over reliance on human labor, which is not economical," stated the Vice Chancellor.

Professor Kibwage indicated that the initiative aligns with BETA's commitment to increasing agricultural productivity and expanding economic opportunities for grassroots communities.

He added that by empowering youth and women in small-scale farming with access to mechanized farming techniques, Egerton University was working to bolster Kenya's food security and stimulate rural economies through practical skill development.

The collaboration will include joint training programs, a three (3) year- apprenticeship program for students, Internship and attachments to graduates, research projects and pilot initiatives by students aimed at demonstrating the benefits of mechanized farming.

## IPOA use community engagement to strengthen relations

## Over 400 residents of Turkana South receive eye treatment

Over 400 residents from Lokichar and Kalapata wards have received specialized eye care services, including cataract surgeries and screening, following conclusion of a four-day free eye medical camp conducted by the County Government in partnership with the Fred Hollows Foundation.

Speaking during the camp, Turkana South Sub-County Eye Coordinator, Anne Louyei, said the initiative aimed at reaching underserved populations in the two wards through enhanced outreach, screening, and sensitization efforts.

The camp attracted patients from various remote areas including Loperot, Napusmoru, Lochwaa, Locheremoit, Lodwar and Lokori in Turkana Central and East respectively.

“Our target was to attend to at least 300 patients, and I am proud to say we achieved and surpassed that. We recorded over 100 successful cataract surgeries,” said Louyei.

Among the beneficiaries was 80-year-old Akuwom Margaret from Lokori, who had previously missed a similar medical camp conducted in her area a few months earlier. Akuwom said she completely lost her sight in March 2025 and had depended entirely on relatives for support.

“I was brought here by my granddaughter while visiting her. My first operated eye has regained sight clearly, and now the second one is also improving. Both eyes had gone completely dark. I can now even walk to the toilet by myself,” she said.

The county government continues to record high prevalence rates of avoidable blindness at 6.2 percent compared to the national average of 2.85 percent.

Decentralization of eye care services remains a critical strategy to improving access with eye care services now accessible at the facility.

Oscar Montana, an Ophthalmic Clinical Officer, attributed the high prevalence of eye problems to environmental and climatic conditions.

“Eye complications in Turkana remain high due to prolonged exposure to dust from an early age, harsh climatic conditions, solar effects, and old age,” he explained.

For 60-year-old bead worker Lomongin Ipalio from Tonyoutu village in Lokichar, the surgery marked the beginning of a new chapter after living in darkness for three years.

“My eyesight gradually reduced until I could no longer see or continue with my beadwork. I lost both my sight and livelihood,” she recounted.

“Three days after surgery, I can now clearly see the Kalong’ot Hills from where I am seated. I can fetch my own water again because I am not too old to depend entirely on others,” she added with a smile.

Another beneficiary, 74-year-old pastoralist Loriongoreng Epuu from Nakwakitela village within Lokichar, said regaining his sight restored not only his independence but also his dignity.

## Universities enlisted in push to demystify GMOs for public

The Government has stepped up efforts to build public understanding and acceptance of genetically modified organisms (GMOs), amid concerns that misinformation and disinformation could derail Kenya's biotechnology agenda.

The initiative, led by the National Biosafety Authority (NBA), aims to improve public awareness of modern biotechnology and its potential to address food insecurity, climate change, pest and disease control, and low agricultural productivity.

Speaking during a Science Café held at Bukura Agricultural College, NBA Acting Chief Executive Officer Dr. Ann Karimi said misinformation continues to fuel public scepticism, making scientific literacy and accurate communication central to the adoption of biotechnology in the country.

"Public awareness, scientific literacy and evidence-based communication remain critical in ensuring that Kenyans appreciate the role of biotechnology in food security, environmental sustainability and economic development," Dr. Karimi said. She said the Authority is working with institutions of higher learning to strengthen biosafety education and

equip students with skills needed for the responsible use of biotechnology.

Dr. Karimi added that the NBA is also pursuing partnerships with universities and colleges through Memoranda of Understanding to sustain training programmes in biotechnology and biosafety.

"As an Authority, we recognize that the future of safe and responsible biotechnology lies in empowering institutions of learning, researchers, lecturers and students with the necessary knowledge, skills and practical exposure in biosafety and biotechnology," she said.

She noted that modern biotechnology remains key in addressing Kenya's agri-

cultural challenges, citing the approval of genetically modified crops such as Bt Cotton as evidence of the country's science-driven approach. Dr. Karimi further urged the public to rely on scientific evidence rather than myths and misconceptions when forming opinions on GMOs.

#### Vihiga farmers to benefit from new fish project

Residents of Upper Vihiga are set to benefit from improved access to fish fingerlings following the launch of a new fish hatchery project.

The project seeks to bring fish fingerling production closer to local farmers and reduce reliance on the Mwitoko Fish Hatchery, which serves a wider area.

Speaking during the launch, Kaimosi Vocational Training College Principal Zaddock Munala welcomed the initiative, describing it as transformative for both the institution and the surrounding community.

"We fully support this project because it will benefit our students and the community at large. We look forward to establishing a fisheries and marine training centre in the future," he said.

He noted that students pursuing carpentry courses would gain practical skills by participating in the construction of the facility, which will consist of two fish ponds and a counting shed.

Munala urged the contractor to ensure quality workmanship and to complete the project within the stipulated timelines and standards.

Vihiga County Director of Agriculture Daniel Oketch said the hatchery would play a key role in boosting fish production in the county and encouraging more farmers to venture into aquaculture.

According to Oketch, the facility will serve as a practical training centre for students pursuing fisheries and marine technology courses, providing them with hands-on experience and technical skills in fish farming.

He expressed confidence that excavation works would be completed within a short period and called on the contractor to ensure the project is finalized before the end of the current financial year.

The hatchery project, which includes two fish ponds and a counting shed, is expected to enhance fish farming, improve the availability of quality fingerlings and strengthen vocational training opportunities at the institution.

#### Milk coolers handed to Kajiado cooperatives

The government through the State Department for Livestock Development has distributed four milk coolers to dairy farmers' cooperatives in Kajiado County under the Livestock Value Chain Support Project.

She said the four cooperatives were selected after a thorough assessment to ensure fair distribution across Kajiado County.

Sankaire said her office will continue supporting dairy cooperatives through milk production, marketing and value addition initiatives aimed at improving livelihoods and promoting economic growth.
